BOOST applications solicited

WASHINGTON — Applications are now being solicited for the 1982 Broadened Opportunity For Office Selection and Training Program.

and Training Program.

BOOST is primarily intended to provide a basic educational foundation for enlisted personnel who would otherwise be ineligible for Navy ROTC scholarship programs and entry into the U.S. Naval Academy.

The program prepares selected enlisted personnel to compete for entry into those programs.

Applicants must be U.S. citizens enlisted on active duty with at least 36 months obligated service remaining as of June 1, 1982. Prospective NROTC candidates must not have reached their 21st birthday as of March 31, 1982.

reached their 21st birthday as of March 31, 1982. NROTC candidates with active service in the rmed Forces prior to entering the BOOST Program may be granted a waiver on a month for month basis up to 27 months. All prospective USNA candidates must not have passed their 21st birthday on July 1, 1982. Age criteria for USNA is not waiverable.

Details of application procedures and eligibility are contained in BUPERSMAN 102036 and OPNAVNOTE 1500 of Aug. 21, 1981. Application deadline for the Fiscal Year 82 BOOST is Dec. 1, 1981. Applications must be forwarded to The Chief of Naval Education and Training (N-14). Candidates will be notified of selection status by letter. Selectees will be issued orders for the BOOST class convening June 1982.

U.S. Navy purchases ships

WASHINGTON — Six of the largest and fastest containerships in the U.S. Flag Merchant Fleet have been purchased by the Merchant shipping companies for use by the Military Senhit Command to improve the Department of Defense strategic mobility postures.

The Naval Sea Systems command awarded a \$207.5 million contract for six SL-7 containerships. The price includes 4,000 containers and 800 container chassis and spare parts. Included in the contract is the option to purchase two additional SL-7a.

Title of the ships will be transferred to the government following a five-day survey and a 45-day inspection. The ships are being delivered to the Military Sealift Commands at San Francisco and Elizabeth, N.J., and delivery should be completed by early November.

The 33-knot ships will provide fast logistic capability and improve the strategic sealift to quickly deploy supplies located within the United States to potential danger areas throughout the world. The ships later will be converted to full self-sustaining roll-on, roll-off vessels with sufficient crance, booms, hatches and sideports to permit rapid loading and unloading.

After acceptance by the Navy, the SL-7s will be re-named following the Navy practice of naming dry cargo-type ships for celestial-bodies and phenomena.

Airlines extend discount

WASHINGTON — Efforts to get all carriers participating in the 50 percent Reserved-seat Furlough Fare Discount Program who had set expiration dates to extend them beyond Sept. 30, 1981 have been more than successful.

All carriers have extended at least to March 31, 1982, three more carriers (American, United, and Continental) removed their expiration dates altogether, and one more carrier (Continental) decided to offer this fare on all its domestic routes.

National problem plagues Americans

Fire Prevention Week Oct. 4 through 10, 1981, marks the 71st year that fire safety has been the subject of a national observance

subject of a national observance. It all started Oct. 9, 1911 when Fire Prevention Day was inaugurated. The date was chosen because it marks the anniversary of the so-called "Great Chicago Fire of 1871" — the conflagration which killed 250 people and destroyed 17,430 people and conflagration of \$168 million buildings at a cost of \$168 million, and the fire which started people thinking interms of fire prevention rather than only of fire fighting.

FIRE IS A national problem which kills more than 8,000 Americans annually. At least 100,000 people are injured and billions of dollars in property is destroyed. A significant factor contributing to this unfavorable trend is human failure to recognize hazards and to take adequate preventive measures. Failure to act intelligently at the outbreak of fire. Failure to take appropriate actions to limit dangers

A large percentage of the dead were children, elderly persons and invalids who had been left alone

for just a few minutes."

The chief causes of fires are: smoking; heating and cooking equipment; electrical wiring; children playing with matches; open flames and sparks; flammable liquids; suspected arson; and spontaneous ignition.

FIRE SAFETY and prevention are not solely the responsibility of the fire inspectors or safety inspectors. They are jobs that must be performed every day by everyone. In most cases, when the alarm goes off, someone has failed to do his or her job of fire

During the week all Federal Fire Stations will hold open houses. People are encouraged to visit the fire station within their areas. Get to know your firefighters and give them your support. Practice fire prevention year-round. Tours of Air Station fire station

 Store oily rags and paints in a cool place in tightly sealed metal containers.

• Never use flammable liquids for dry cleaning indoors.

 Have a fire drill in your home to be sure everyone knows what to do in case of fire. Designate a specific meeting place outside so you will all know who's outside of the house. • Remember: Fire extinguishers put out 97 percent of all fires on which they were used, and most large fires start as small fires. (So invest in a compact, easy -use fire extinguisher.) Keep it handy in your kitchen, or be prudent and buy one for your cottage, car, boat and the back bedrooms.

· Some excellent smoke, heat, fire-detection systems available to homeowners. Shop around and buy the one that suits your needs. In case of fire

 If you suspect fire, alert the rest of the household. But first feel the top of the door. If it's hot, don't open it. Escape through the window.

. If you can't open the window, break it with a chair. Cover the rough edges with a blanket, sit on the window ledge with one leg hanging outside and one inside, and wait for help.

 The phone number to report a fire should be taped on or posted near every telephone. If it isn't, don't fumble around trying to find Get out and call from a

neighbor's house.

• If you live in an apartment building, use the stairway. Don't take a chance on the elevator. If it fails, you're trapped.

· Once out, stay out. No treasure is worth risking you life.



Federal laws outline job restrictions

Marines seeking off-duty, part-time civilian employment should make themselves aware of Federal laws and DoD regulations dealing

laws and DoD regularity with the subject.

Judge Advocate officials here recently highlighted these Federal laws and DoD directives in Corps Order 5330.3B.

laws and DoD directives in Marine Corps Order 5330.3B; Civilian Employment of Marine Corps Personnel.

"The Marine Corps is not encouraging Marines to seek off-duty civilian employment," stated judge advocate officials here. "But at the same time, the Corps recognizes that many people find it necessary to have a part-time, of-duty job to make 'ends' meet financially."

Marines can be employed in most types of occupations.
According to the order, there are only three major restrictions dealing with civilian off-duty, parttime employment. The job cannot interfere with the individual's Marine Corps duties, Marines cannot hold jobs which would bring discredit on the U.S. Government or the Marine Corps, and Marines should not accept employment which could create the appearance of a conflict of interest. An example of service-discrediting activity is posing either in the nude or partially unclothed. unclothed.

These are general rules Marines should follow whenever they seek off-duty employment. Marines should also keep in mind that they cannot wear a Marine Corps uniform while working at a part-

uniform while working at a part-time, off-duty job.

Regular Marine officers are prohibited by law from holding public office. However, serving as church or private organizational officers does not violate the law. In addition, officers cannot be

employed by someone furnishing Naval supplies or war materials to the United States. If an officer is the United States. It an orficer is employed by an organization selling such supplies, he or she forfeits all pay and entitlements paid by the U.S. Government. While aboard military installa-

tions, Marines cannot represent commerical company any commerical company soliciting or selling insurance, mutual funds, and other investment plans, commodities, and services. In addition, Marines engaged in off-duty, part-time employment cannot solicit or sell to Marines junior in rank, according to the order. This applies to "activities on and off base, in or out of uniform, on or off duty and includes personal solicitation and sale of life and automobile insurance, stocks, mutual funds, real estate or other commodities

The purpose of the Marine

Corps order is to eliminate finstances where coercion, intimidation or pressure based on rank, grade or position could be used," explained officials.

However, marines who make one-time sales of property, such as homes or automobiles, are not violating the law. Also, Marines working in restaurants, service stations or department stores are not in violation of the law. Working in off-duty civilian employment is a privilege all Marines have the opportunity to

pursue. However, those who do must make sure their off-duty employment does not interfere with their Marine Corps duties, that they are not associating themselves with the Marine Corps while working for the civilian job, and that the job does not bring and that the job does not come discredit on the Marine Corps.






What do you think happens to the money taken for fines from office hours and courts-martial?



Women's Weightlifting

Bodybuilding
I was curious. I wanted to supplement
my daily exercise routine by
strengthening my upper body. Anxiety
brought me to the Mini-Gym one
Monday evening a few weeks ago to
begin my new discipline of weight lifting.
A women's free weight lifting program so
widely advertised was a service to
explore.

Upon arrival, I immediately began wondering how it was at all possible for approximately 70 women to use the weight apparatus with proper education and instruction from one individual, within one quick hour. It became clear shortly thereafter, such was not the case.

The majority of participants were sandwiched on the hard rubber slab, barely qualifying as a "mat." The few real mats there were accommodating only a handful of bodies. If one wasn't fortunate enough to get a space on either area, she won her position on the wooden floor!

Class commenced. Cpl Jones stood amidst the crowd and began shouting his commands. "Fifteen four-count jumping jacks." Everyone was highly urged (threatened?!) to count. If not, Cpl Jones presented himself face-to-face with the silent soul and proceeded to antagonize the individual with piercing

stares and possibly a quick comment.

After the initial sets of calisthenics, the thought of what Parris Island must be like crossed my mind. It was actually a combination of such regiment and a spot on the "Howdy Doody Show" with the high pitched counts emitting from the women in unison, almost deafening. Many parents utilize such services to get away from the noise at home!

A summarized statement on the exercises is that many were not performed safely or correctly. In a few instances, Cpl Jones demanded that we bounce on our stretches. Anyone with the least bit of knowledge in healthy exercise knows that it is a cardinal sin. No one's groin muscles or ligaments will withstand such abuse, particularly if one is not in shape regarding flexibility. I made certain those near me heard me discourage such an order.

The sit-ups were very unimpressive: straddle position, keeping legs straight, bringing the arms overhead and down to the feet. Straight-leg types are not beneficial to the abdominal area, and a continuation of this form will result in muscle shortening of the lower back and thighs. (Complete Guide to Figure Shaping by Charles T. Kuntzleman and Editors of Consumer Guide.)

Following 45 minutes of "Women's Weightlifting and Bodybuilding Class" the crowd was let loose on the weights. Much to my chagrin, I was unaware of any direction from Cpl Jones or anyone else. I did not stay because there clearly wasn't enough apparatus for the number of participants and no apparent instruction was available. In essense it was a composite of a three-ring circus and a child care center at its peak.

I resented this "free" service for the reason that it attracted myself and others under false advertising. It should be re-worded as "a Free Hour of Marine Corps Calisthenics for Women" with optional access to weight lifting equipment following class. "Women's Weightlifting and Bodybuilding" is

extremely misleading.

Women who are serious about toning and comprehensive exercise should try

Body Dynamics, a professionally monitored class offered on base, by women, for women. Although not free, an incredibly nominal fee covers one hard core hour all done to music on safe, comfortable wrestling mats, six days a week. Participants are urged to progress at their own pace. Showers, sauna and a weight machine are available and included in the fee.

I plead with the many women being mislead by the routine at the mini-gym to look into this other, more professional and qualified program. It's your body, respect it.



ALL ABOUT HAIR . . .

Shampoolng your hair with a good protein acid balanced shampoo often times isn't enough to keep it in really good condition. But when do you use an instant conditioner and when do you need more deep penetrating reconditioning? There is a simple test you can do to determine if your hair is in competent structural condition. Remove a strand of hair from the head above the ears and place it between your thumb and forefinger, now with the thumbnail and index fingernail of the other hand, run the distance of the hair strand rapidly (as you would curl ribbon with the blades of a: pair of scissors). This will create a series of small curls. Then take the same strand and apply tension (pull straight) for ten seconds and release. To analyze the results look for the following:

1. If the hair completely returns to the curl pattern, it is in good condition and does not need additional reconditioning.
2. If the hair only partially returns (50 percent or less) it is structurally week. In this case the hair needs both protein and molsturizing treatments.
3. If the hair falls limp, it is very weak structurally, and it could also be a sign of too much moisture. If the heir has been chemically damaged from perme or hair coloring or bleaching you will need intensive reconditioning. If there is just too much moisture and the hair is over elastic protein treatments will correct this condition.

The elasticity and strength of the hair are very noortant factors in determining what type of onditioning program you need but the ondition of the cuttele or outer layer of the hair

DURING THE Vietnam conflict GySgt Stephens served with the Marine Corps Composite Reconnaissance Squadron, VMCJ-1, from December 1972 through December 1973. His decorations include three awards of the Good Conduct Medal, the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, the Navy Unit Commendation and the Meritorious Unit

Commendation.

Mugu, Calif. "I was involved in
the ground work of an electronics

New tax bill expands RAS is limited to people not covered by employer-sponsored retirement plans. Individuals retirement accounts

HQMC, WASHINGTON Marines and government employees will be eligible for tax-protected Individual Retirement Accounts, beginning Jan. 1, 1982 by President Ronald Reagan, Aug. 10.

without employer-sponsored retirement plans have been able to contribute as much as 15 percent of their income, up to an annual maximum amount of \$1,500.

THE NEW BILL WILL allow individuals already covered by an employer-sponsored retirement plan to participate in IRA, plus it

removes the 15 percent limitation and increases to \$2,000 the total amount individuals can contri-

bute annually.

Monies placed in IRA are nontaxable and the interest earned in the account is also non-taxable. This results in the interest rates for an IRA being compounded on a higher money base. Funds contributed to IRAs are

tax-exempt until used. Individuals can elect to continue placing money in the program for as long as they wish. However, they must begin withdrawing money by the time they reach 70 and one-half years old

INDIVIDUALS CAN begin withdrawing money when they are 59 and one-half years old

without paying any penalty tax for early withdrawal. People who withdraw money before they reach that age must pay income tax on the money they withdraw, plus an additional 10 percent early withdrawal penalty tax.

Those participating in the program should note that IRAs are tax-exempt while the money remains in an account; however, once it is withdrawn, considered taxable income. withdrawn, it is

According to officials, many people using IRAs are over 65 when they withdraw money. Therefore, the tax laws allow them extra tax credit, simply because of

their age.
A person eligible for IRA could open accounts for their

spouses. In the past, persons opting for spousal contributions were required to divide their contributions equally and there was a maximum ceiling of \$1,750, or \$875 in each account. or \$875 in each account.

THE CEILING FOR comhined accounts will be increased to bined accounts will be increased to \$2,250 beginning Jan. 1, and the requirement for evenly dividing contributions will be dropped. For example, a husband could deposit \$2,000 in his account and \$250 (or




