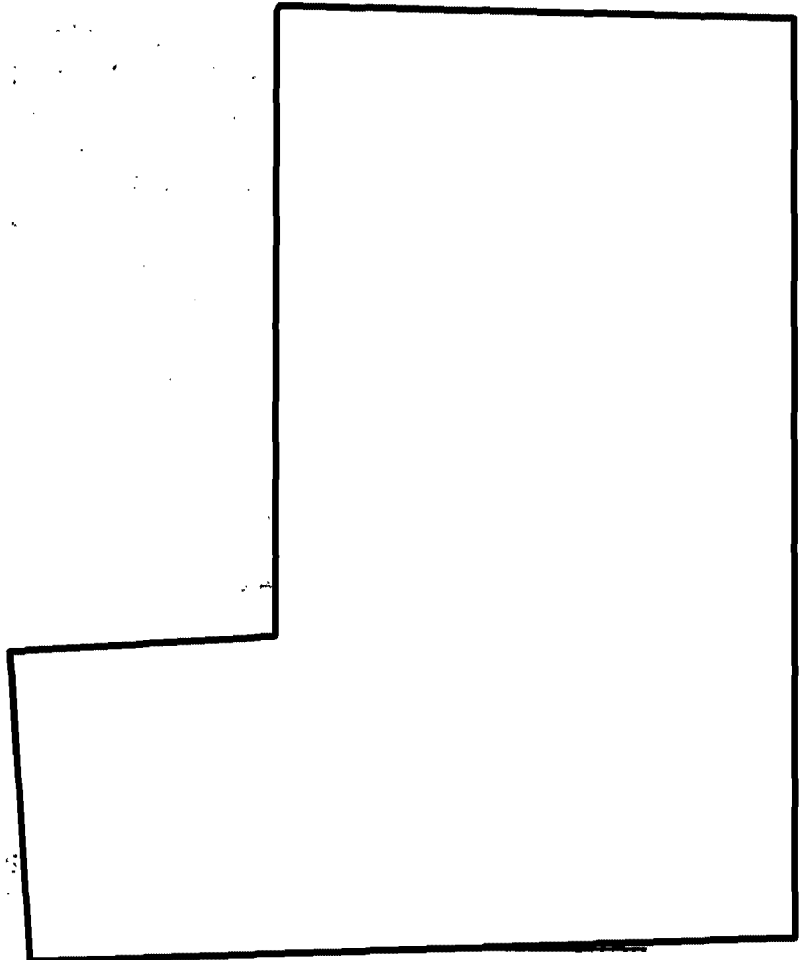

Extradition To Russia Refused

By The Canadian Press

Canada has rejected Russia's demand for the extradition of Harold Puntilis, of Willowdale, Ont., on war criminal charges, an External Affairs Depart-

ment spokesman said Tuesday.

The Soviet request was turned down on at least two grounds, officials said. Canada has no extradition treaty with Russia and the Soviet charges against Puntilis were not substantiated.

The Soviet news agency Tass said June 11 that Puntilis led

a Nazi-collaborating detachment which shot 47 persons in a Latvian village in 1942. Puntilis went to Sweden in 1943 from his native Latvia and came to Canada in 1948.

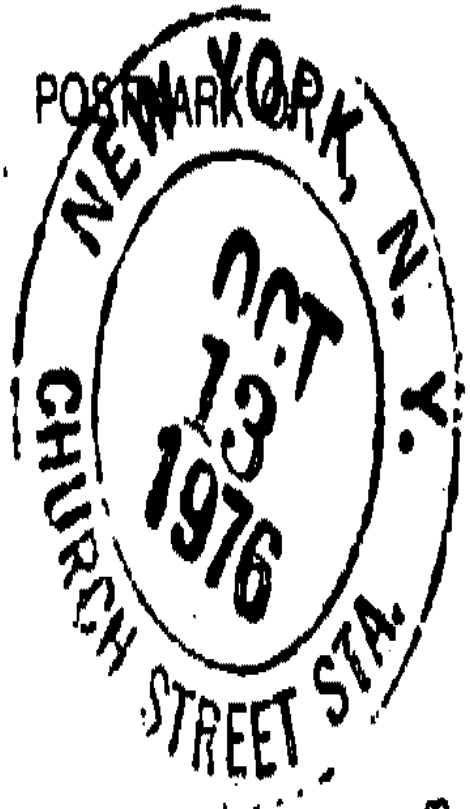

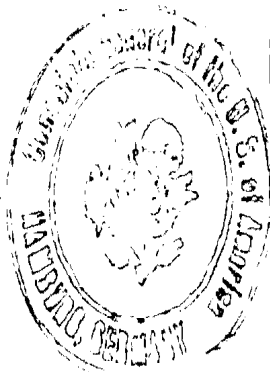

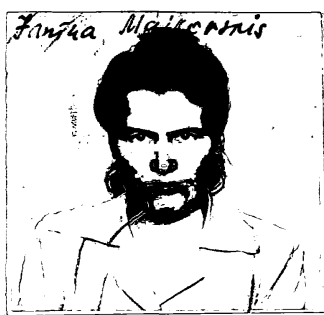

Extradition To Russia Refused

By The Canadian Press
Canada has rejected Russia's demand for the extradition of Harold Puntilis, of Willowdale, Ont., on war criminal charges, an External Affairs Depart-

ment spokesman said Tuesday.

The Soviet request was turned down on at least two grounds, officials said. Canada has no extradition treaty with Russia and the Soviet charges against Puntilis were not substantiated.

The Soviet news agency Tass said June 11 that Puntilis led

a Nazi-collaborating detachment which shot 47 persons in a Latvian village in 1942. Puntilis went to Sweden in 1943 from his native Latvia and came to Canada in 1948.

Latvia Opens War Crimes Trial

(Moscow Bureau of The Sun)

Riga, Latvia, Oct. 11—Six men, three present and three absent, were brought to trial today for collaborating with Nazi invaders in the extermination of 15,000 residents of a district of Latvia during World War II.

The trial before live television cameras was opened on the stage of the House of Culture of Riga's electric factory.

It is one of the largest war crime trials in the Soviet Union since the war. Authorities expect it to last more than two weeks.

3 Empty Chairs

Three defendants guarded by two soldiers with tommy guns solemnly sat in the prisoners dock on the stage before 800 invited guests in the audience.

There were also three empty chairs in the dock.

They were set aside for the absent defendants now living in Toronto, Mineola, N.Y., and Karlsruhe, West Germany. Each empty chair had above it the names of the missing men.

Lawyers were appointed from the republic's College of Lawyers to represent all those present as well as those present.

Judge Valfred Kauke complained to the courtroom that the countries involved refused to extradite the three missing defendants so they could be tried.

"Sent Special Messages"

"Our Government sent special messages to the United States, Canada and West Germany but in spite of our requests those Governments did not give up those men," Judge Kauke said.

May we proceed without the three men? he asked.

All three of the defendants present rose separately and nodded assent.

Are you all satisfied with the lawyers appointed? he asked them.

The three middle-aged defendants indicated satisfaction again.

Much of the trial was conducted in the glare of klieg lights provided for the television and movies. Thirty places had been reserved in the auditorium for the Soviet and foreign press.

Like Broadway Melodrama

The stage setting and the smooth flow of the action made the proceedings appear like a Broadway melodrama. It was difficult to grasp that a court trial was unfolding with capital punishment a possible result for the three defendants present.

Judge Kauke, silver-haired with hornrimmed glasses, sat in the deep center of the stage in a high-backed chair marked with a hammer and sickle. He was flanked by two peoples assessors who will help him determine the sentences.

The prosecutor in a blue uniform and four witnesses also sat on the stage. One witness was unavailable for the trial.

May we proceed without that witness? Judge Kauke asked.

220-Page Indictment

All three defendants rose and nodded assent.

Today's session was devoted to reading of the 220-page indictment by a team of men and women court employees. It referred to events of more than 20 years ago in grim detail.

According to the document the six men were directly involved in

the killing of 15,199 persons in the Rezekne district of Latvia, a farm area about 200 miles east of here.

The district had been a center of partisan activity and the German occupants accused the residents of hiding guerrillas.

The dead included 2,000 children, 5,000 Jews and 360 gypsies, the indictment said.

According to a key part of the charge two defendants directed the execution of 170 residents of the village of Audrini by a firing squad.

The 30 surviving villagers were marched to a nearby town and executed in the market place "to intimidate the local population".

The village of Audrini was then burned to the ground.

Fled Overseas

According to the charges the three men not present today were appointed leaders in the Rezekne district by the Nazis. They fled overseas with the retreat of the German forces in 1944—Albert Eichelis going to West Germany, Bokesslav Maikovskis to Mineola, and Harald Puntulis to Toronto.

Those present at the trial held less important posts in the district during the war.

The indictment shed no light on why it took twenty years to bring all six to trial. Judge Kauke refused to discuss this question with reporters. He said that any such conversations might influence his judgment.

However, those familiar with the case said that the material had been in the process of being gathered through all these years.

Recognized In Yalta

One of the men, Jasep Basankovich, who had moved to Siberia to work as a miner, was recognized in Yalta a year ago. Apparently with this arrest the court authorities decided to proceed.

Janis Krasovskis, a lumberman who had fled to Poland, was tracked down through letters he wrote to Latvians. The third defendant present, Peteris Vaichiks, was arrested in Riga.

Pictures purported to be of all the men were displayed in the lobby outside the courtroom. Two were wearing Nazi uniforms.

There is no exemption from this requirement, and you will therefore be examined on these subjects when you appear before the examiner with your witnesses.

You will also be examined on your ability to read, write, and speak simple English. An exemption from this part of the examination is allowed only for persons who are physically unable to meet these requirements, and for persons who had lived in the United States for as much as 20 years before December 24, 1952, and had already reached 50 years of age by that date.

APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED BY RELATIVES.—If you desire to be called for examination at the same time as another member of your family who is also submitting an application to file a petition for naturalization, please indicate this desire on a separate sheet of paper, attached to this application, showing the name and file number of the relative(s).

OATH OF ALLEGIANCE.—You will be required to take the following oath or affirmation of allegiance to the United States in order to become a citizen including, unless you are excepted by law because of religious training and belief, the promises shown relating to bearing arms and performing noncombatant service when required by law:

I hereby declare, on oath, that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty, of whom or which I have heretofore been a subject or citizen; that I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States of America against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I will bear arms on behalf of the United States when required by the law; that I will perform noncombatant service in the armed forces of the United States when required by the law; that I will perform work of national importance under civilian direction when required by the law; and that I take this obligation freely without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; so help me God.

“Religious training and belief” means a person’s belief in a relation to a Supreme Being involving duties superior to those arising from any human relation, but does not include essentially political, sociological, or philosophical views or a merely personal moral code.

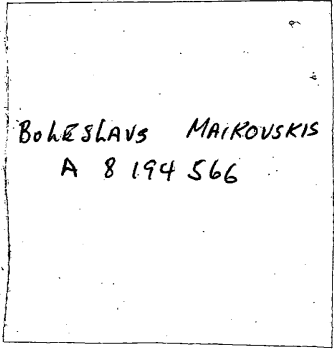

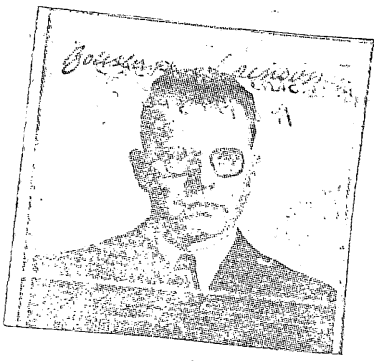

This is in further response to your pending administrative appeal on behalf of your client, Boleslavs Maikovskis from the partial denial by District Director Maurice F. Kiley, Immigration and Naturalization Service, of your request for access to certain information from the files of the Department of Justice.

After careful consideration of this appeal, I have decided to affirm the action of Mr. Kiley, with one exception. You may, if you desire to do so, obtain copies of public source materials [newspaper clippings and similar publication etc.] contained in the file maintained on your client by the Service, by contacting Mr. James W. Grable, Trial Attorney, U.S. Immigration Service, 68 Court Street, Buffalo, New York, 14224. All remaining materials to which access was denied your client are, in my judgment, exempt from the access provisions of both the Privacy Act and the Freedom of Information Act. Under the former Act, the provisions of 5 U.S.C. 552a (d) (5) permit denial of access to information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action or proceeding. With regard to the Freedom of Information Act, the provisions of 5 U.S.C. 552(b) (7) (A), (7) (C) and (7) (D) permit the withholding of investigatory records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which would, respectively, interfere with enforcement proceedings, constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, or disclose the identities of and/or confidential information obtained only from confidential sources. In addition, certain of the materials pertaining to your client are classified and I am affirming the denial of access to them at this time on the basis of 5 U.S.C. 552(b) (1). They are, however, in the process of being reviewed within the Department to determine whether they warrant continued classification. You will be advised of the results of this process, but my action on this material is nonetheless final because all of it is also exempt from mandatory release pursuant to one or more of the other exemptions I have cited.

Neither the Freedom of Information Act nor the Privacy Act was intended to serve as an ancillary means of conducting discovery in pending cases. In fact, the Supreme Court has indicated that an important purpose of the exemptions is to prevent the premature disclosure of the Government's case in such circumstances. Recent decisions by various Courts of Appeals have agreed with my view that these statutes were not intended by Congress to repeal or even amend existing, duly-promulgated discovery procedures. In my opinion, the statutes are not a vehicle for collateral attacks on such procedures and any alleged deficiencies should be allowed to be raised only directly, in the course of proceedings governed by those procedures. I am satisfied that further release of records in this case would constitute premature disclosure of the Government's case in the pending matter affecting your client and that any such release would interfere with enforcement proceedings within the meaning of 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7)(A). Accordingly, none of the materials to which access will continue to be denied are, in my judgment, appropriate for discretionary release.

I do wish to advise you that records which originated with other agencies have been referred to those agencies either for consultation or for decision and direct response to you. You will be advised by the Service of the results of the consultation process as soon as it is completed.

You have specifically requested access to a copy of the proceedings of the "trial in absentia" in which Mr. Maikovskis was convicted in Riga, Latvia, in 1965. For your information, a search of the files of the Immigration Service has failed to locate a copy of this material.

If your client is dissatisfied with my action on this appeal, judicial review thereof is available to him in the United States District Court for the judicial district in which he resides, or in which he has his principal place of business, or in the Western District of New York, which is where the records you seek are located, or in the District of Columbia.

Gentlemen:

This is a request for identifiable records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5. U.S.C. §552. I am writing on behalf of my clients, the Society of Survivors of the Riga Ghetto, Inc. and Mrs. Lore Oppenheimer, its President. As survivors of the Nazi holocaust and American citizens, my clients have a vital interest in the presence of Nazi war criminals within the United States and the apparent failure of the United States Government to take any action against these individuals.

Of particular interest are the actions or, more properly, inactions of the United States Government concerning Boleslav Maikovski, also known as Boleslavs Maikovskis, who presently lives at 232 Grant Street, Mineola, New York. Maikovski was born in Latvia in 1909 and entered the United States in 1949 from West Germany. He was sentenced to death in absentia by a Latvian court on October 31, 1965 for his role in the massacre of the citizens of Audrini, Latvia.

My clients request any and all documents which refer, in whole or in part, to Boleslav Maikovski. The documents sought include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Letter from David G. Trager, United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York, to Henry A. Kissinger, dated January 13, 1976, with regard to past and/or pending deportation proceedings against Boleslav Maikovski or otherwise relating to Maikovski, the response to that letter on January 30, 1976 by the Administrator of the Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs of the Department of State, and any documents relating to those letters.

2. Visa papers or other documents relating to the entry of Maikovski into the United States.

3. Deportation proceedings and/or investigations held in the past or currently pending with regard to Maikovski or which reflect or refer to, in whole or in part, the advisability or legal basis of such proceedings.

4. The results of any internal investigations made by any officer of the Department of State, the Department of Justice or the Immigration and Naturalization Service with regard to lost files of deportation proceedings and/or related investigations of Maikovski.

In addition, my clients are interested in obtaining any and all documents which refer in whole or in part to the following:

5. A list of forty witnesses supplied to the Department of Justice and/or the Immigration and Naturalization Service by the Israeli government in connection with forty-seven alleged Nazi war criminals currently under investigation. Attached as Exhibit A to this request is an article from the June 23, 1976 edition of Newsday describing the transmittal of this list. Also desired are any and all documents which relate to current or possible investigations by any party of the presence of alleged Nazis within the United States.

6. Any documents relating to a trip taken to Israel by an Immigration and Naturalization Service investigatory team on or about August 31, 1976 to talk to potential witnesses against alleged Nazi war criminals currently in the United States; any documents relating to plans to fly these witnesses to the United States; and any documents relating to hearings which were held or are planned as a result of this trip. Attached to this request as Exhibit B is an article from the August 31, 1976 edition of the New York Post referring to this investigatory team.

7. A request sent by the Immigration and Naturalization Service to the Department of State asking the Department of State for a list of names of witnesses in Russia against alleged Nazi war criminals in the United States and for permission to interrogate these witnesses, as well as all related correspondence.

8. A request sent by the Immigration and Naturalization Service to the Department of State asking for names of witnesses in West Germany against alleged Nazi war criminals in the United States, as well as all related correspondence.

Since none of the statutory exceptions from the Freedom of Information Act's mandatory disclosure provisions apply to the above requests, I would expect access to the requested records to be granted within the mandated ten working days. If, however, access is denied to any part of the requested records, please describe such material in detail and specify the statutory basis for the denial as well as your reasons for believing that the alleged statutory justification is applicable. Please separately state your reasons for not invoking your discretionary powers to release the requested documents in the public interest. Such statements will be helpful to my clients in deciding whether to appeal an adverse determination, and might also help to avoid unnecessary litigation. If you deem some parts of a file or document to be "reasonably segregable" from non-exempt parts, I request that you provide me with a copy of the remainder, regardless of your judgment as to its intelligibility.
