Year-round class may be coming to 4 schools

The Plymouth Board of Education held another discussion workshop Tuesday night, to air suggestions about a three-year growth projection of 3,400 students in the Plymouth Community School District.

The board appears ready to officially propose a \$30 million bond issue that would provide for five new elementary and two middle schools, at its Feb. 28 meeting, according to Raymond K. Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business.

The \$30 million figure, which would give the school district the distinction of seeking the highest bond issue in the state, represents an approximate increase of 1.26 mills.

The additional mills would mean an extra \$25.20 annually for a homeowner with an assessed property value of \$40,000; and an increase of \$37.80 for a \$60,000 piece of property.

THE PROPOSED 1977 bond issue would add roughly 5,700 seats to the present capacity, which would handle the estimated five-year growth of 5,400 students, according to the board's preliminary projections.

Because no new buildings could be completed or opened for at least two years even if voters approved the bond issue, the board must implement interim measures to meet pressing needs, Hoedel said.

Some alternatives suggested were to place Eriksson, Field, Hulsing, Pioneer and Bird elementary schools on a 45-15 program, intensify busing efforts, and add six self-contained portables to Eriksson, Field and Hulsing. All these actions were proposed for either July 1977 or '78.

Other options discussed included implementing a 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. school day at the high school level, shifting ninth graders to middle schools and converting Central Middle School to an alternate high school.

Board president Joe Gray raised objections to transferring Central. "I hate to see Central go to a high school," he said. "With its present facilities, Central serves as an excellent middle school. I'd rather see East go that route."

Marcia Borowski agreed. "The purpose of an alternate high school is to offer the student body smallness and closeness," she said. "Central's too big—the kids would feel lost and faceless."

REPRESENTATIVES from Lakepoint subdivision fear that if Central is converted, it will become Lakepoint High School, one board member reported.

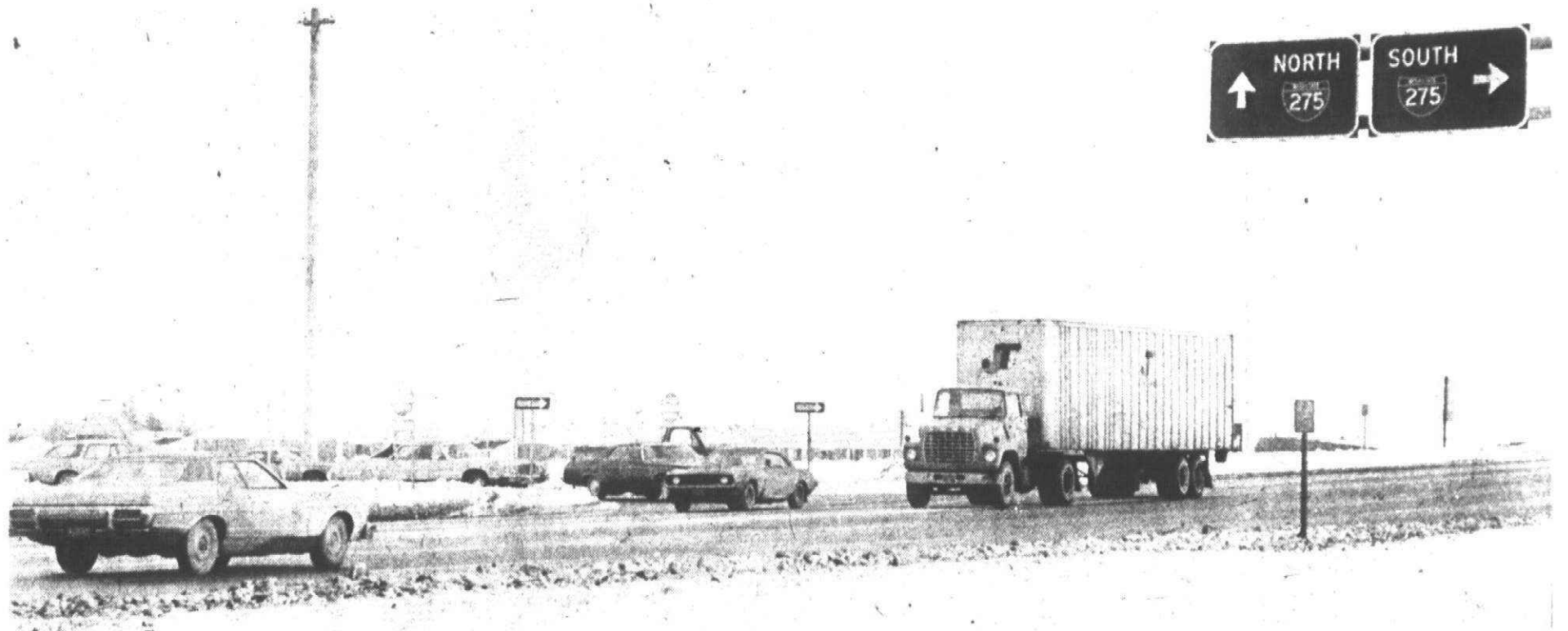
Supt. John M. Hoben confirmed it would never happen, saying "there's no way Central would become an area high school. If anything, it would be an annex."

Ms. Borowski added: "We shouldn't commit ourselves to converting Central. Instead, let's keep East open as an option and remain flexible on this."

Hoben reiterated how costly it would be to the district if the bond issue fails the first time out. "With conservative estimates placing increased building costs at six per cent annually, it's imperative that the bond issue passes in April," he said.

In addition to convincing voters to support the record bond issue, the board faces possible rejection from the state's municipal finance commission, which may feel a proposed five-year bond would be too lengthy, Hoben warned.

If the proposed five-year plan was not accepted, the board would have the option of selling the bond issue in two series, Hoben said.

'Forget study—just try turnin'

A little plain, old, country-boy talk helped Plymouth and Canton Townships avoid a bureaucratic state highway department delay in some new traffic lights at off-ramps of I-275. Plymouth Township had requested Wane County Commissioner Royce Smith to speak to the highway department about having traffic control signals put up on Ann Arbor Road at the new I-275 exit ramps. Canton Town-

ship wanted the lights at the exit ramps on Michigan Avenue.

Smith said he talked to Jerald McCarthy, the deputy director of highways, and was told the highway department would study the traffic patterns to see if signals were necessary. However, Smith was unwilling to accept that answer.

"I just talked to McCarthy like one

country-boy to the other," Smith stated. "I told him, 'You don't need to study any traffic patterns. All you have to do is get off I-275 at either of those two roads and try to make a left-hand turn.'"

According to Smith, McCarthy took his advice and experienced some difficulty in making the turn.

"The next thing I heard from

McCarthy," laughed Smith, "was that there was a definite need for lights on both roads, and they would be put up within 90 days."

Smith said that if the highway department would have gone through the process of studying the traffic patterns, there was no telling how long it would have been before the lights were in operation.

Curley finds shear joy

After being a barber for nearly 60 years and trimming "damn near a million heads," Donald L. Gray says it's about time he hung up the old scissors.

"I really want to quit," said the owner of Curley's Barber Shop on 137 W. Liberty in Plymouth's Old Village. "I hope to retire the shop to my son and go on social security."

Gray's barber shop is a landmark in Plymouth. Born in 1904, he opened the little shop in 1927 when haircuts went for two bits. "There was some kind of competition going on then," Gray recalled.

Me and another barber set the price at 25 cents, but a couple of guys at the Mayflower Hotel charged 15 cents. That was during the depression days and ever since the cost of a haircut has never stopped climbing."

Gray still considers his shop pretty competitive. "A \$7 haircut here will get you the same thing some shops charge \$12 and \$15 for," he said.

GRAY WAS BORN into a family of 16 where his nickname Curley originated.

"When I was a youngster I had real curly hair, so we decided to name the shop Curley's. Today, I'm the only one in the family who isn't bald. Most of my regular customers don't call me by anything but Curley."

Gray says he's ready to retire to the good life. His son Don has been working in the shop for the last 25 years and has had the operator's permit in his name since 1973.

The elder Gray is hoping his son will quit his job at Ford and take over the shop full-time. "He could modernize the place and start from scratch," the shop owner said of his son. "Nowadays, you have to go to a training school and learn all that new jazz, but I'd like to see him take over the shop."

As of late, Curley's business has relied on old customers he's been serving for years. Gray even offers door-to-door service for oldtimers who have been placed in convalescent homes or can't get out of the house.

"A lot of guys who've been getting haircuts here since the place opened can't move around as much, so they give me a call and I work them into my schedule," Gray said.

CURLEY'S BARBER shop still gives shaves upon request, but the demand isn't anything like it was several years ago. "I used to give 20 shaves on a Saturday," Donald said. "Now I'm lucky if I give 20 in a year."

Gray realizes the day of a barber having more customers than he knows what to do with is over. "There used to be five barbers on this end of the street alone, but not anymore," he said.

"We don't get the number of kids that we used to. Now an aunt, a mother or a sister will do it. And with all these styling shops opening up and advertising hair care—it's driving us right out of the business."

Gray says some customers are a lot fussier about their hair than others. "We get these old guys that come in with a lot of hair on the side but none

on top. They want it cut so you can comb it across the bald part. It looks so silly—we just sit back and laugh."

Gray started his career in the early

1920s when he went to a training school in Davenport, Ohio. After graduation, he moved around the country, cutting hair in Illinois, Missouri and Detroit, before coming to Plymouth.

Morality course starts in Observer

Clark, professor emeritus in psychology at City University of New York and research director of the Northside Center for Child Development; Lon Fuller, the Carter professor of general jurisprudence at Harvard University (now emeritus); Hans Jonas, the Alvin Johnson professor of philosophy at the New School for Social Research.

Philip Rieff, the Benjamin Franklin professor of sociology at the University of Pennsylvania; Christopher Lasch, professor of history at the University of Rochester; Jean Lipman-Blumen, director of the women's research project at the National Institute of Education; Martin E. Marty, professor of the history of mod-

ern Christianity and dean of the Divinity School at the University of Chicago.

Robert W. Tucker, professor of political science at Johns Hopkins University who holds a joint position with the School of advanced International Studies; Ernest van den Haag, a psychoanalyst who is adjunct professor of social philosophy at New York University and a lecturer at the New School for Social Research; and John P. Sisk, professor of English literature at Gonzaga University.

CIVIC GROUPS, service clubs, unions, religious and youth organizations and local libraries are encouraged to form their own discussion groups based on the Courses by Newspaper series.

Stein doubts sincerity

Is politics in growth fight?

It was almost a year ago that the Canton Township Planning Commission adopted a new master land use plan.

Today, the elected officials who supported that plan are gone, and so presumably is the plan itself.

But the taint of politics concerning growth and land use continues.

Unlike the hot and heavy words that followed November's election, talk of recalling supervisor Harold Stein is muffled these days, although backers of former supervisor Robert Greenstein, and Peter Bundarin, the Republican candidate for supervisor in November admit they are "keeping a close eye" on the new supervisor. That eye is focused directly at growth control.

Although Stein, under the pressure of a newly formed citizen's group agreed to set up a subcommittee to study growth control options, it was done with reservations.

The supervisor suspects the citizen's group demanding a curb on residential building is a thinly-disguised recall committee.

Not so, say the co-chairpersons of the group, Sue Koch and Stan Bucher. But Stein remains unmoved by their protestations.

The day after Stein held a press conference to respond to the "Citizen for Growth Control" petition drive press conference demands, he referred to his press conference as "real" and the citizen's group as "phony."

Koch and Bucher, say "the biggest obstacle" confronting the citizen's group is convincing people that it is not politically affiliated.

"First he tried to talk me out of continuing this committee of ours, saying that since he formed the township growth committee we didn't need ours. But we don't intend to let our committee die."

"I don't pretend to be an expert on growth control. That's why I've been spending my time calling the National Research Committee and studying pamphlets on growth patterns from

timidate them into doing something."

Carman and Donahue headed the nearly-successful "Committee to Reelect the Greenstein Team" during the last election.

Donahue did not deny that he helped Bucher arrange the press conference, but said that while he often disagrees with Stein, he doesn't think Stein has done "anything yet" that warrants recall.

Wayne State's library. We're not ready to make a final ultimatum. We're studying and researching."

Mrs. Koch has applied for a spot on the township's growth control study, which is a new subcommittee under the land use committee. Stein set up the growth subcommittee the Monday after Ms. Koch held her press conference.

Part of the reason behind suspicion that the growth control group is politically-manipulated, is that Koch was a campaign worker for Bundarin. Bucher was an avid Greenstein supporter. Their prior affiliations have caused some people to suspect that the two unsuccessful candidates have formed a coalition to unseat Stein.

Bundarin said he is aware that people suspect him of pulling strings behind the scene and he denies it.

"This committee (growth control) will never have anything to do with recall," Bundarin said Thursday. "Because of those suspicions (Jim) Donahue, (Tom) Carman, and myself will not attend the public meeting at the high school. It's a conscious attempt to keep this growth committee exactly what it is. I would never show up at the meeting and try to in-

"Let's just say we're keeping our eyes and ears wide open," Donahue said. "I'm not pleased with some of the stunts he's pulled with the police chief, but I can't see in either issue where he's done something that would call for a recall."

"But I'd be lying to myself if I didn't say that if Stein does do something that a majority of us feel is illegal he'd better be prepared to stand charges. He's being watched."

Bundarin said that he thinks Stein is smart enough to avoid any direct confrontation with his political opposition.

"Right now the ball's on his side of the field," Bundarin said. "The facts have been laid out on the rate of growth and the impending \$30 million bond issue to pay for the schools we're going to have to build. If Mr. Stein doesn't heed the interests of the people then he'll let people know that he doesn't pay attention to what they want."

"If Harold Stein passed a workable growth control ordinance he'd be re-elected for the rest of his life," Bundarin continued. "If I was intent on recalling him, I wouldn't push the growth issue."

With federal funds

Expanded sewer, water planned

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees tomorrow night will consider recommendations to expand water and sewer facilities using funds from the federal 1977 Community Development program.

The board will be asked to approve recommendations from Supervisor Thomas Notebaert and Clerk Helen Richardson at Tuesday's regular meeting which begins 8 p.m. in the township hall at Lilley and Ann Arbor Roads.

At the Dec. 21 meeting, the board approved an expenditure of approximately \$88,000 for sanitary sewer crossings on Ann Arbor Road. Notebaert and Mrs. Richardson are going to ask the trustees to approve using the township's share of the fed-

eral block grant to pay for those sewer improvements.

Under the stipulations of the grant, application for funds can only be made under certain categories. They are: urban renewal and neighborhood development; model cities; water and sewer facilities; neighborhood facilities; public facilities loans; open space; and rehabilitation loans.

"I think we stand the best chance of getting the money if we apply under sewer and water," said Mrs. Richardson. "Some of the categories don't apply to us. And of the ones that do, our sewer and water needs are the most pressing. She added that the township's share of the federal funds would be about \$80,000.

In 1975 the township received

\$32,000 under the grant and used the money to improve the recreation site on Ann Arbor Trail for the improvement of neighborhood parks. Under the 1976 community development program, the township applied for funds for storm sewers on Haggerty and Ann Arbor Roads. Mrs. Richardson said she has verbal approval for \$66,000 for those improvements.

ALSO DURING Tuesday's meeting, the board will hear a report on the status of the Evans Products land split request. The issue had been tabled at the meeting of Oct. 26 to allow the board time to study certain problems with the sewer facilities on the property along Eckles Road.

At that meeting the attorney for Evans had wanted the township to accept dedication of the sewer, so Evans could sell a portion of the land. However, the trustees were reluc-

tant to take on the sewer because it was 40 years old and in need of repair. They did not want to commit the township to heavy repair and maintenance expenses.

The question of the land split has all the elements of a prolonged struggle because Evans has to have the sewers accepted by the township before the land can be sold.

TRUSTEE RICHARD GORNICK is expected to give a verbal progress report on his committee's study of the charter township question. Since Supervisor Thomas Notebaert took office, he has made no secret of his desire to see Plymouth Township move toward becoming a charter township. And he appointed Gornick to chair a committee formed to look into the advantages and disadvantages of charter townships. The committee's final report is due in February.

Metric workshop scheduled

Metric Workshop, a two credit hour class scheduled for five Friday-Saturday blocks of time, will be offered at Madonna College, Livonia, during the winter term. Classes will meet from 6:30-9:30 Friday evenings and 9 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

Distance and speed will be discussed Feb. 4-5, size, weight, and mass of objects on Feb. 25-26, and temperature, work, and power on March 18-19.

The sessions April 1-2 will be devoted to review and practice in conversion to metric.

Instructor for the workshop will be Sister John Francis Moore, professor of physics and mathematics at Madonna.

Enrollment is open to those who do not wish college credit as well as to Madonna students. The non-credit fee is \$20. Registration may be completed at the Student Services Center, Madonna College, 36600 Schoolcraft, Livonia.

Schools may create more voting polls in Canton Township

Four more voting precincts may be established in Canton Township for school elections to avoid some of the unusually long lines in past elections.

The Plymouth Board of Education tonight (Monday) will be asked to increase the number of school voting precincts in Canton from nine to 14.

Canton Clerk John Flodin has worked closely with Florence Beier, community relations director for the school district, in making plans to split school precincts. The expense for the splitting of precincts is being shared by the township and school district.

The meeting Monday will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High, 8415 Canton Center Road.

THE SCHOOL BOARD also will be asked to appoint a financial consultant and an architect for the 1977 bond issue.

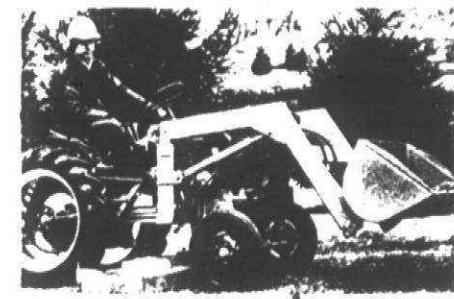
In another item related to population growth, the school board will be asked to approve a resolution which would be the first scheduling at other schools besides Miller Elementary where it now is operating as a pilot project.

The board is considering the necessity of year-round school for Eriksson, Field and Hulsing elementaries in Canton, Bird Elementary and Pioneer Middle schools in Plymouth. The expansion of the year-round program is being eyed as a means of meeting growth demands for the next two years until new school buildings can be constructed—if the proposed \$30 million bond issue is approved by voters in April.

"It is apparent to us that alternatives will be necessary in the next two years to accommodate the very substantive growth that is anticipated," says Supt. John M. Hoben. "It also is the feeling of the central administrative staff and of a select group of building administrators that the 45-15 concept does provide the optimum of educational opportunities with the least amount of disruption to the educational program."

INTRODUCTION OF AN intramural program at the Centennial Educational Park also will be before the board with an administrative record to budget \$1,800 for the first year, pilot program effort.

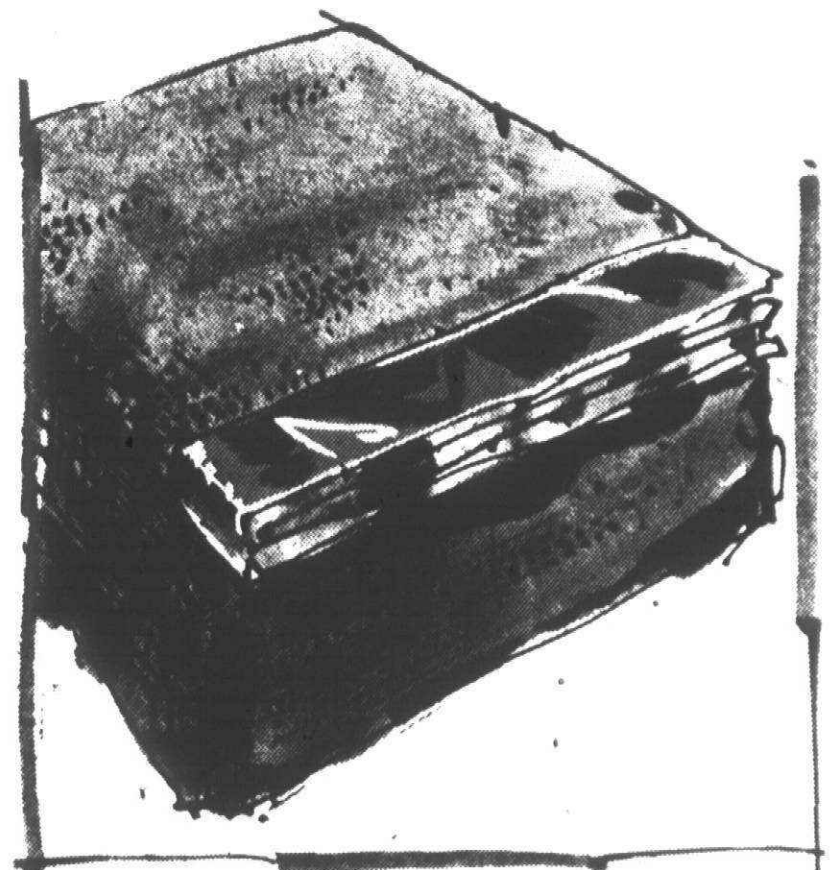

Local clergy can't justify death order

In an opinion survey of law enforcement officials published in the last issue, a majority of those questioned favored a state constitutional amendment to provide for the death penalty.

Although a few expressed doubts about the wisdom of granting the state the right to take a life, in the end, the moral question was placed in a practical, legal framework of how best to deal with certain types of crime and criminals.

But the question is only partially a legal one. It is also a moral question.

WHEN THE Observer asked local clergy members whether they would be in favor of capital punishment, the overwhelming response was the exact opposite of that of the legal profession.

"I would not be in favor of the death sentence," said Rev. Sam Stout of the First United Methodist Church. "The taking of a human life, under any circumstances, is an awesome responsibility, and it can never be completely justified, not even in war."

Stout said a society that resorts to executing those people who violate its laws, is only expressing failure to find better alternatives.

"There seems to be a need on the part of the society in general to dramatize a justice it doesn't have. There is a need to select a few here and a few there and punish them," he remarked.

"I think we have to find better ways and more humane ways to deal with people who don't fit into society."

FR. ROBERT KELLER of Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church, also felt society had to take more responsibility for the individual failings of its members.

"Capital punishment is not necessarily the only answer," he com-

mented. "We should ask ourselves how we are helping to assimilate people into society in a productive manner." He said the death penalty did not serve the purpose of true justice.

"In the Christian tradition, I would say it is not the kind of justice we are seeking. Execution is treating the symptom rather than the cause. I am not in favor of it, nor will I ever be."

The Rev. Philip McGee, of the First United Presbyterian Church of Plymouth, felt capital punishment violated the nature of the human spirit.

"I realize people have very real fears," he said, "but I also realize

fear can cause over-reaction. There is always the hope that a person can and will change. For us to take judgment into our own hands—even judges—and say whether a man should live or die is a frightening thing. I do not think it is wise to set ourselves up as the judges of the worth of a human life."

The Rev. Jeff Goldsmith, pastor of Geneva Presbyterian Church in Canton, was in the process of doing research for a sermon he was planning to give on capital punishment when contacted and said that although he hadn't worked his position out as thoroughly as he wanted to, his gut reaction was one of strong opposition.

"There is no way around it," he stated, "when we execute a person we are committing murder. It's brutal and repulsive to me."

He said he was aware that providing for the protection of society was important, but felt there were better ways than the death penalty for providing it.

"How can we kill a person outright?" he asked. "We are talking about someone created by God, just like we all are. The thought of it disturbs and saddens me greatly."

The one dissenting view was presented by Rev. Leonard Koeninger of St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church. He spoke to the issue of capital punishment from the official church position and as an individual.

"We believe capital punishment is not morally wrong. God has given the state the right to impose the sentence of death. It is a duty and a responsibility of the government."

Patterson hits parole abuse

Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson has a lot to say about the state parole laws, and none of it is good. He claims that by releasing dangerous criminals prematurely, the parole system is working against the best interest of the people.

Patterson made his remarks in an after-dinner speech at the annual Plymouth Jaycees Distinguished Service Awards banquet. He told those present that the parole system was a failure.

"We are being raped, robbed, and murdered by the same people over and over again," he said. "The parole system is an abysmal failure."

His main complaint was criminals who had been convicted of violent crimes were being released from prison by the parole board to rape, rob, and kill again.

To substantiate his claim, he cited 16 pages of documented cases of crimes committed by criminals who

had been paroled before they had served their minimum sentence.

PATTERSON TOLD the audience that his interest in parole abuse started when he was working on a case involving a murdered policeman.

As the circumstances surrounding the killing unfolded, Patterson said, it was discovered that the murderers were parolees. One of them had been sentenced to 15 to 25 years for murder and was released after serving only seven and one-half years.

"If those men had been made to serve just their minimum sentence, that police officer would still be alive today," he said.

According to Patterson he started keeping a record of all violent crimes that were committed by convicted criminals who were out on parole. He said there have been 11 in Oakland County alone since 1973.

The fault, Patterson alleges, lies in the parole laws, which allow prisoners

to accumulate "good time"—a certain number of days taken off their sentence for each month they serve.

To document this, Patterson produced statistics which showed that a man sentenced to 20 to 35 years in jail could, by receiving maximum good time, only serve 10 years—or 50 per cent less than the minimum number of years. A man sentenced to 30 to 45 years could be released after 13, 63 per cent less time than the minimum stipulation.

"The system defeats itself," he stated. "The longer the sentence, the higher the per cent of reduction."

Patterson's solution is to change the parole laws so people convicted of violent crimes—rape, murder, and armed robbery—are required to serve their full minimum sentence. He said in 1973 he introduced just such a bill into the state legislature. But it has yet to be reported out of committee.

"The bill I introduced four years ago has died in committee twice," he said. "The legislature has refused to act. And I don't think it is too much to ask. Just make the violent criminal serve his minimum sentence."

Two female felons flee DeHoCo Friday

Two inmates of the Women's Division of the Detroit House of Corrections (DEHOCo) leaped over a fence to freedom Friday. One of the escapees was serving a life sentence for two first degree murders.

According to Martha Wheeler, director of the prison, Constance Hanes, 37, of Flint, a white female, and Sharon Halferty, 35, of Quincy, also white, left their cottages to visit the residence store on the prison grounds. They reportedly jumped over a fence and hopped into a dark green van driven by an unidentified white male.

"It appears they had made prior arrangements to be met," stated Ms. Wheeler, "but I don't know how or when." She added this was the fourth escape for Ms. Hanes and the second for Ms. Halferty.

Ms. Wheeler said Ms. Hanes first came to the prison in 1969 to serve three life sentences and one 50-60 year

sentence. She was convicted of two first degree murders, assault with intent to murder, and armed robbery.

Her fellow escapee, according to Ms. Wheeler, had been in prison "off and on" since 1967. She was serving her sentence for receiving stolen property, attempted breaking and entering and attempted check passing.

The Michigan State Police were notified of the escape, but late Friday, the women were still at large.



Vets not veterans

New sewer rate higher April 1st

To go with your 39 per cent water increase last year is an upcoming 20 per cent sewer rate increase coming April 1, 1977.

And that's no April Fool's joke. The public works committee announced the rate hike in a meeting Tuesday afternoon in the City-County Building in Detroit.

Using an explanation similar to the reason given for the water increase, the director of the department of public works, George Bingham, said there are two reasons for the rate hike in wastewater disposal.

Bingham told the people at the hearing a "cost-plus factor" is needed in the sewer budget to eliminate the deficit to pay for operating expenses. Once the "revolving fund" is established in the next two years, Bingham said rates may be lowered or stabilized. He said it is hoped the department will have enough money on hand, with the revolving fund, to pay a quarter's worth of bills at one time.

The rate increase will be \$159.48 per million gallons used; up from the present \$140.96 per million gallons of wastewater disposal.

Measured in "per thousand cubic feet," the new rate is \$1.193—raised from the current rate of \$1.0545 per thousand cubic feet.

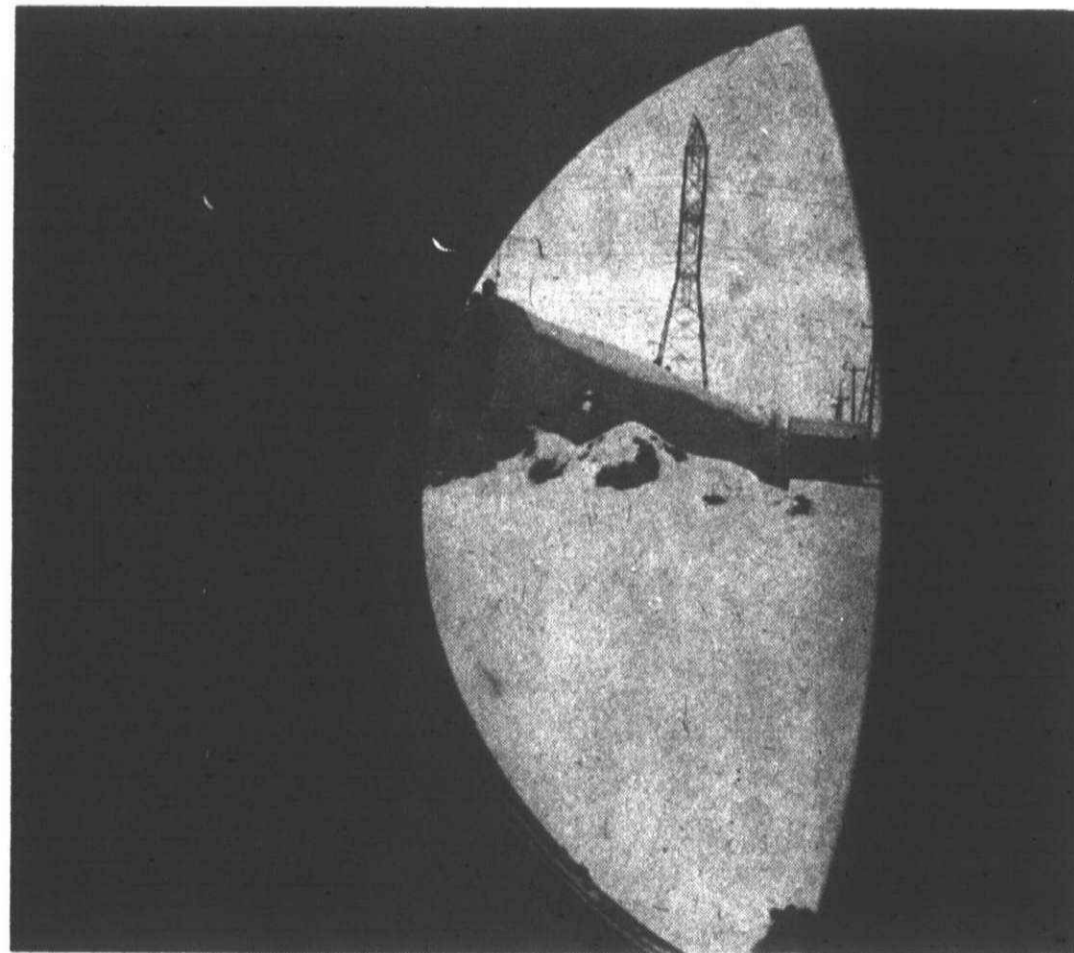
Canton's deputy treasurer Mike Gorman was at the public hearing Tuesday to tell the board of public works that Canton officials aren't convinced the hike is necessary.

Gorman said many neighboring communities also oppose the hike.

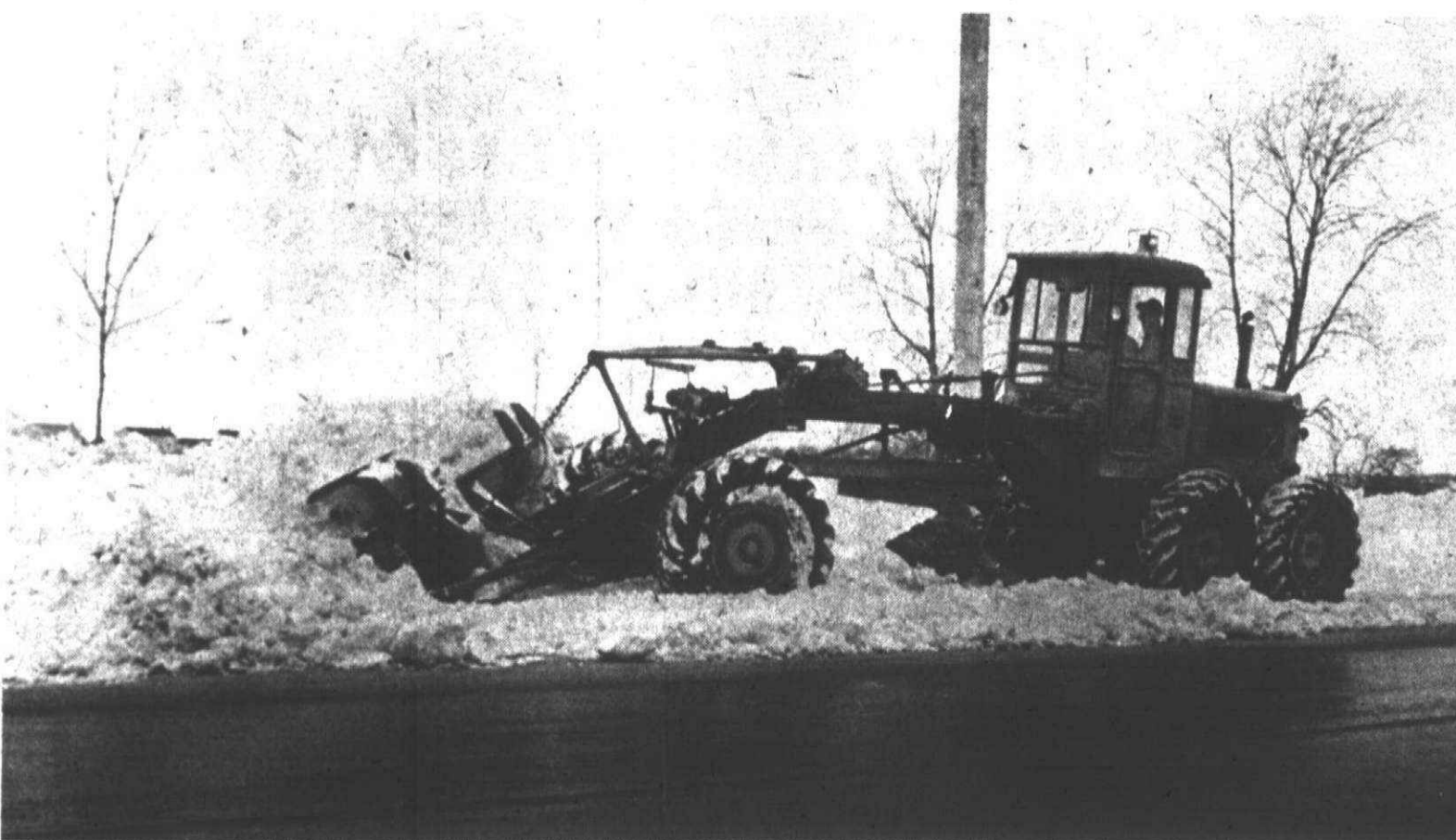
"If they could show us a similar community that needed a 15 per cent overcharge to meet its water needs, then we might not have such a problem with it," Gorman said. "But they

hired a big consultant firm that compiled a fancy, thick report which may impress a lot of people, but, in my mind, still doesn't justify the amount of increase imposed."

Gorman said while he and representatives from surrounding communities made their objections known, "I felt like we were banging our heads against a brick wall." The only effect their protest might have, Gorman said, was that the county can't say they were unaware of dissent in the communities serviced by sewers.

From our readers Hedging by Stein evident in articles

Editor:
Subject: Police Chief-Supervisor Harold Stein?

According to your recent front page article entitled "Police Suggest a Pay Cut," you indicate that Mr. (Harold) Stein said at the meeting of 12-28-76, that he is the chief of police. Also, when questioned at length at the 1-10-77 township board meeting I attended as to this statement, he didn't really deny it, but implied that since he is supervisor he is chief law enforcement officer of the township and that these two jobs go hand-in-hand.

He didn't seem to feel that way when Robert Greenstein held these two positions, so there seems to be two sets of rules.

Under the charter township act, the township board has the ultimate authority in determining who should be police chief (Crier: 10-27-76). Mr. Stein has never been appointed to this position by the board of trustees to my knowledge. Former supervisor Robert Greenstein, and founder of the Canton Police Department, was named to the position of police chief by a unanimous vote of the board (Canton Observer: 5-25-75).

Mr. Stein hasn't the experience, training, educational background or legal right to issue police chief directives.

Prior to the November 2, 1976 election:

Mr. Stein stated (Observer 9-2-76) that if he won the supervisor's spot he would not assume the role of police chief and supervisor.

Stein's position paper says, "If we are to have quality police protection, I want well-qualified professional people, as well as a police chief." (Detroit News 7-23-76).

Many Stein supporters sent letters to all the local papers objecting to Greenstein's supervisor-police chief position. The local papers objected in editorials, etc., to same.

Attorney Noel Culbert and Carrie Young, objected so strongly to the supervisor-police chief roles that they wrote to Attorney General Frank Kelley for an action to remove Greenstein from the office of supervisor.

AFTER THE November election:

Stein, Canton Chamber push for name change

Canton's Chamber of Commerce unanimously agreed on a resolution to go on record as being in favor of a name change for the Plymouth Community School District—namely, Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

In a letter to the Plymouth Community School Board, chamber of commerce president Al Daly said: "We hope our input will have a direct impression on the board when this decision is brought before them in the near future."

The decision to revive support for

Trustee Lynne Goldsmith made the motion to fire Mr. Greenstein from office of police chief with the statement: "I would consider the office of chief of police to be one held by a man with experience. In order to get politics out of the police department, I feel that the most political person in the township should not be chief." (Eagle 11-25-76).

A police study was formed to study the police department and advise the board on any changes or improvements that might be made. Results will not be ready for several months.

Mr. Stein said (Observer 12-9-76) that he would not include members of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department on the police study group. At board meeting (1-10-77) Stein said there would be a Wayne County officer assigned to this group.

Mr. Stein said the reserve unit would continue functioning "as is" until the police study is completed. He also said Mr. Carl Silvers, who had been coordinator of the reserves unit, would direct its operation until the study was completed (Detroit News 11-26-76).

SINCE HE MADE those statements, Mr. Stein has:

Fired Greenstein from police chief position. Promoted Carl Silvers to interim police chief on 11-24-76. Gives directives (police chief?) to the police department. Cut road patrols from four to two; cutting the number of officers in half (Eagle 12-9-76). Has under consideration a one-car patrol (Observer 1-10-77). Demoted interim Police Chief Carl Silvers to commander on 1-10-77.

My conclusion from the above events would be that Mr. Stein is slowly terminating the Canton Police Department, even before the board-appointed police study group presents its results.

It seems like the Stein Slate is so indebted to the Wayne County Sheriff's union, since they were the largest monetary and physical campaign supporters they had prior to the election, that they are obligated to contract for their (the sheriff's) services.

the name change was made at a recent board of directors meeting, so that Canton may officially become a part of the school district's name.

CANTON SUPERVISOR Harold Stein also supports the name change. He suggested, half-in-jest, that the school district's name be switched to "Canton-Plymouth School District." The reaction by Plymouthites to Stein's suggestion was not immediately known, but one can be certain they were not moved by the advice.

Academy praises police

Orville H. Kappen, school coordinator of the Criminal Justice Institute, cited 14 Canton police officers for their outstanding performances in the school's last basic police recruit class.

Although written scores alone do not make a police officer, Kappen noted the overall high scores achieved by the Canton force as a group.

The written exam scores showed Canton cops on top with 88 per cent, followed by State police (75 per cent) and other state academies (74 per cent).

"The Canton police officers were significantly above all other regional and Michigan State Police academies.

I must congratulate the township administration for the screening process that is bringing high caliber people into the service," he said.

Kappen said he was so impressed with the performance of the Canton recruits that he felt a special need to inform former police chief Carl Silvers about the achievements. Silvers is now a command officer.

The letter of commendation from Kappen represents a slight twist of irony, since a request by the Canton Police Officers Association (CPOA) to send seven more reserves for full training was denied two weeks ago by the Canton board.

Liquor license of lounge in limbo

A three-year-old plan to build a motel and restaurant complex at the corner of Ford and Lotz may be revitalized, if the developers can assure township officials of their good intentions and overcome ill will generated by the developers' failure to use a liquor license previously granted to them.

Canton board members last meeting unanimously agreed to table a request from Wilbert M. Tucker and Ronald J. Makino of Tucker Realty Co. for site plan approval of a proposed \$600,000 restaurant and lounge.

The developers say they plan to construct a 101-unit motel, after the 54,000-square-foot restaurant and lounge are completed.

Township officials agreed to reconsider the developers' site plan request, after they determine the status of a liquor license granted to Tucker in April 1974, when the township had only two liquor licenses to grant.

Board members had granted the license, provided the entire motel and restaurant complex be constructed at one time.

But Tucker never constructed the complex. The liquor license was never used, and site plans approved for the original complex expired.

A representative of Tucker Realty Co., who knew little about the fate of

the original construction plans, showed board members different plans for the motel and restaurant complex than those approved by a previous board some years ago.

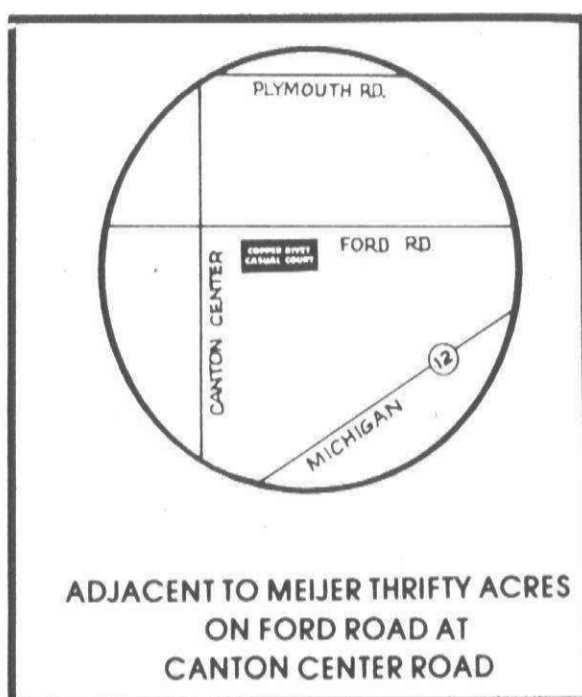
Although township officials appeared pleased with the proposed site plans, several board members noted Tucker's plans to construct the complex some years ago—plans which never materialized.

Although the township now has about nine liquor licenses to grant, it had only two when officials granted a license to Tucker. The number of liquor licenses available to a municipality is based on its population.

"The reaction after (granting the license) was that we had been had," recalled Trustee Brian Schwall, who noted the developers' current plans to construct the restaurant, lounge and motel in two phases.

"I think we have a legal problem here. Granting the liquor license in 1974 was dependent on building the whole thing. What are you going to do with a lounge without a liquor license?"

Trustee Eugene Daley moved to table the matter in order to determine the legal status of Tucker's liquor license.

"The damn snow—what a mess it makes. Just take a look at it along the curbs of the city streets. It is nothing but an eyesore and I'll be glad when we can get rid of it."

"Look at that snow. Isn't it beautiful as it stretches out across the vacant land and sparkles in the morning sunlight."

"This heavy snow is just what we need. It is the best thing for our plants, roses and the like. It is a cover that keeps them warm and we'll let the real benefit of it next spring and summer."

"I'll take the cold any time. Just get rid of the snow and slush and the slippery sidewalks."

These are just a few of the remarks The Stroller has heard in recent days and they offer real proof that winter is the most controversial of the four seasons.

Sure, one hears complaints about the spring rains, and at times the floods that raise havoc. And there are times when folks shake their heads in distress with the hot sun in the summer months.

In the fall when Mother Nature turns autumn leaves to gold and paints the scenery in a fashion the greatest artists and painters couldn't duplicate, you might hear a few complaints.

HERE AND THERE you will hear complaints when the leaves start to fall and the squirrels gad about in search of nuts to fill their storehouses for the winter. But now, with the coming of the mechanical helper—the leaf blower—there no longer is ground for complaint at this most colorful season of the year.

That brings us back to winter and the howls that go up about the grime and slush on the sidewalks; the piles of dirty snow along the curbs and the danger it brings to motorists who of-times have trouble starting their cars, or even in driving.

One of the strange things about winter—and the controversy is that there are bitter complaints on both sides. People damn the winter when there is no snow just as they did out in Colorado when the ski slopes were bare—even for the president's vacation.

They also damn conditions when there is snow. First, it is the trouble of snow removal from the sidewalks and driveways of our homes; then removal from the streets so that the motorists can go and come from their daily occupations.

Once the way is cleared and conditions would seem to be returned to normal, then comes the complaint of the eyesore of the dirty snow and slush.

Strangely, there is one day and night when the complainants keep quiet and wish for snow. That's Christmas Eve, when every one is quiet and wish for a white Christmas.

YEARS AGO, when The Stroller arrived in Detroit, in the middle of winter, he had his first sight of snow in a metropolitan area and, like many others, he didn't like what he saw.

Then came a turning point. Being a "rookie" on the sports staff he was given the "Odd" assignments, among them covering the ski contests out at Rochester, Michigan.

He had never seen any one skiing back in his hometown—not even in the foothills of the mountains. The chief activity was sledding down the hillsides.

Ski contests? They were something else. So out he went to Rochester and the first sight of the skiers coming down the long slides and taking off into the air amazed him. It wasn't long until he looked forward to Sunday afternoons and the trip to the ski slides to watch the Hall boys, natives of Ishpeming, take their turn and vie for jumping honors.

And, despite the complaints, The Stroller enjoys the winter and longs for another sight of the Hall boys coming down the slide on a Sunday afternoon in Rochester. It was a sight to behold.

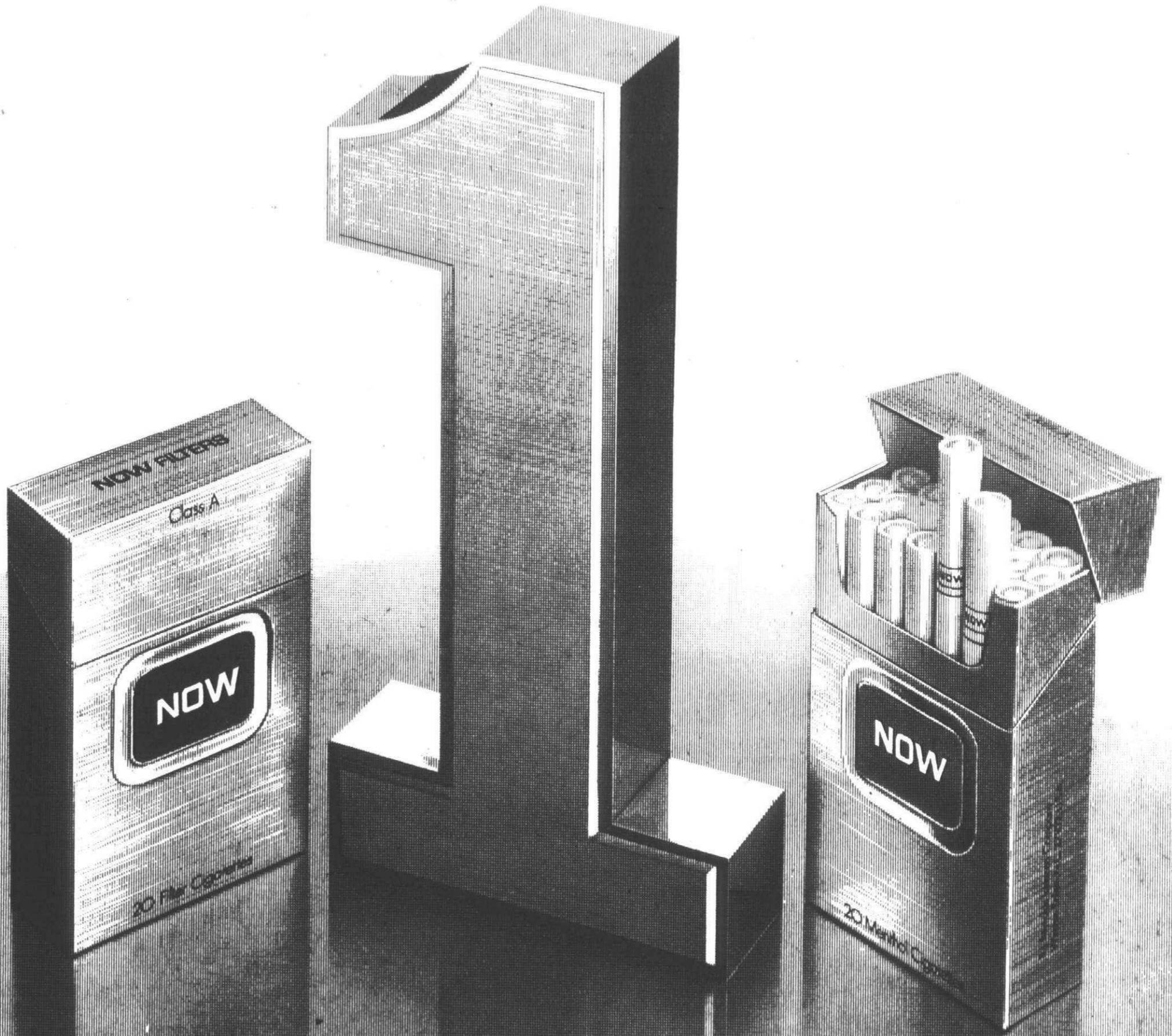

Jeff Fidge replaced an injured Tom Chaitalis at 157 but the three forfeits at the end turned the match into a rout.

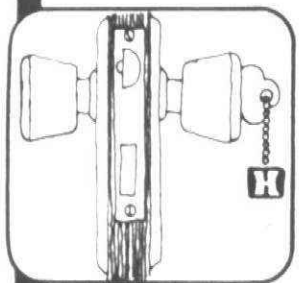

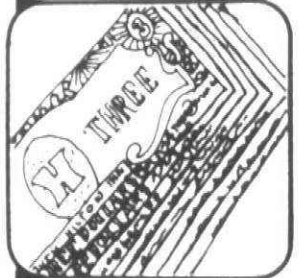

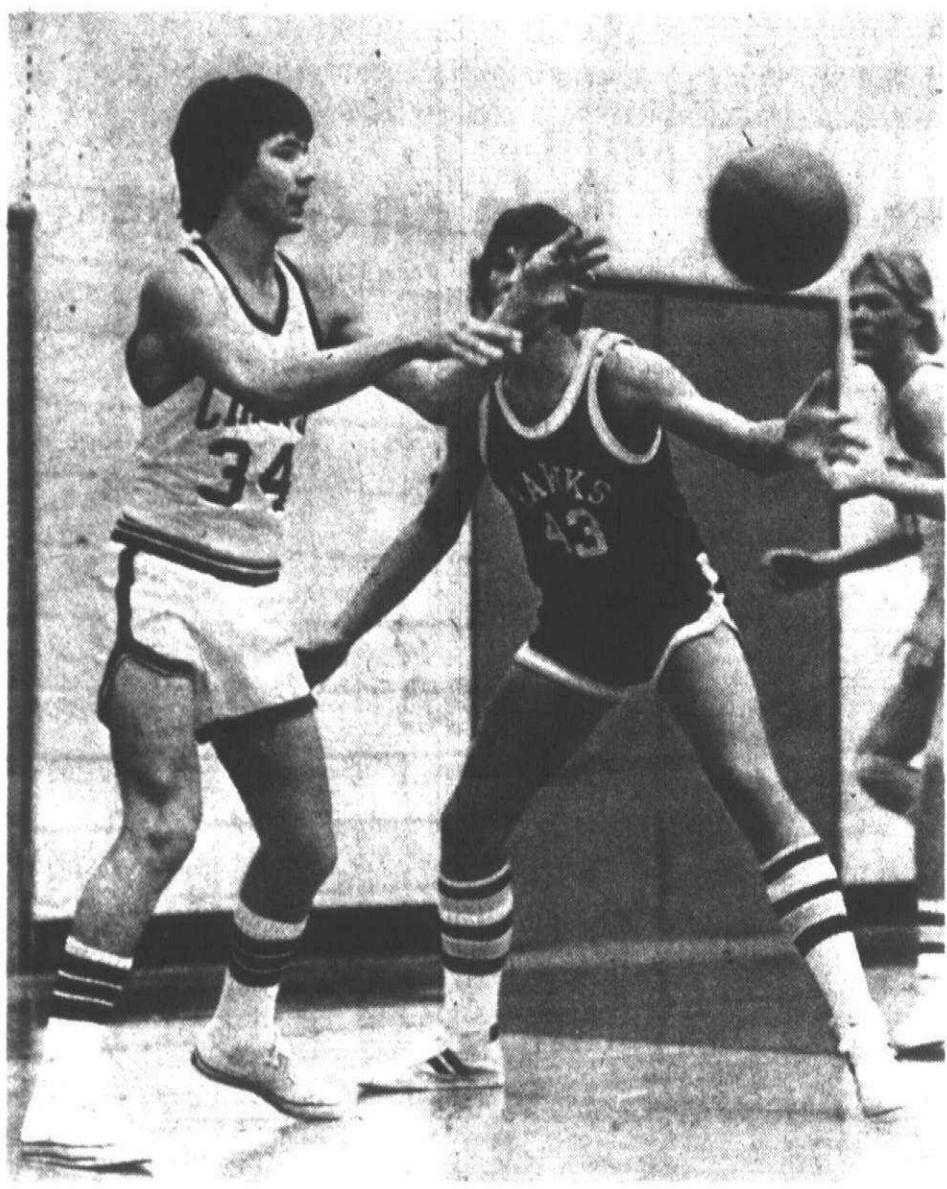

Canton can't handle zone; Harrison breezes, 74-62

Farmington Harrison's stingy 1-2-2 zone defense proved to be the deciding factor in its 74-62 victory over Plymouth Canton in a crucial Western Six League basketball contest played at the Centennial Park gym Friday night.

This contest was important for the Hawks because the road victory helped them keep pace with league-leading Livonia Churchill which easily beat Walled Lake Western.

The Chargers hold a perfect 5-0 record after the first half of the league season while Harrison maintains the second spot at 4-1.

The loss to the Chiefs spelled equal importance to their chances for the Western Six title. This setback on Canton's home court not only cost the Plymouth squad a chance to tie for second place in the standings, but now it all but ends any hopes for a league crown.

Canton holds a 5-7 overall record and a mediocre 2-3 mark in conference play. Harrison is 6-5 overall.

THE CHIEFS started the game quickly wearing down the Hawks' man-to-man defense. Canton raced to a 17-12 lead after the first quarter and maintained that margin for the first four minutes of the second period.

Harrison then switched to its 1-2-2 zone defense and riddled the Chiefs the rest of the way. The Hawks finally grabbed the lead for good with one minute left in the half and took a 28-27 advantage at intermission.

Harrison nearly doubled its total offensive output of the first half in the third quarter alone as the Hawks blew

Canton off the court with a 27-14 spurt.

The Hawks built its margin in as many as 20 points midway in the final quarter as the game was never in doubt.

"WE'VE HAD some trouble on the road and I knew we had to have this one. The kids knew it too," said Harrison coach Bob Suttef.

"We were afraid to try a zone because we thought Canton had a good shooting team. But they hurt us on their drives to the basket when we were in the man-to-man."

"We had a hard time penetrating and couldn't use the baseline because they were so big," said Canton coach Casey Cavell. "Harrison played the zone well—I can't take anything away from them. The only good thing about it was that we forced them to go to it."

"I can't blame our kids," the Canton mentor said. "They worked their butts off trying to penetrate the zone but Harrison played a good defensive game. I didn't think they would be that powerful."

In sloppy game Rock cagers destroy AP

Winless Allen Park was strictly no match for unbeaten Plymouth Salem Friday night as the Rocks hit on 58 per cent of their shots from the floor in rolling to an easy 64-42 Suburban Eight basketball triumph.

This road victory on the Jaguars' floor brought Plymouth to an 11-0 mark for the season, whereas Allen Park is 0-11.

The game completed the first round of Sub 8 action and at the halfway point the Rocks have a two-game bulge over Livonia Bentley at 7-0 to second place Bentley's 5-2. Not in any of the last three title winning seasons has Salem enjoyed that much of a lead in turning the corner for home.

Although the win over hapless Allen Park added no particular luster to the record, the Rocks now have a chance to impress the state's prep pollsters when they invade Dearborn Fordson for an important non-league test Tuesday night.

The perennially powerful Tractors again are in the running for the Great Lakes Conference title, and on their own court will be particularly difficult to subdue.

TOM ELLINGHAUSEN and Chris DeBear led Salem's offensive barrage at Allen Park with 20 and 14 points respectively, but actually their shooting percentages were more important than the point totals.

Ellinghausen canned eight of his 12 shots and DeBear pumped in seven out of 10. Ellinghausen also grabbed 11 rebounds as the Rocks dominated that department, 32-16.

From the floor, Salem made good on 28 of 48 attempts for its impressive 58 per cent team mark, but there were two statistics which detracted from the Plymouth performance and which—if repeated at Fordson—could spell doom.

These included the fact that the Rocks were guilty of an atrocious 25 turnovers and could make good on only eight of 19 chances at the free throw line. Those are not the hallmarks of an unbeaten team that would like to think of itself as a contender for state honors.

THE PLYMOUTH starters found themselves frustrated in the first quarter by an Allen Park quintet which disdained to attack. The Jaguars didn't take their first shot at the bucket until there was only 3:13 left and it was another half-minute before Gene Vacca got their first two-pointer.

The result was a misleading 10-5 Salem edge after eight minutes, but in the second quarter the Rocks blitzed their way to 20 points with hard, intense basketball that foretold the romp it was to become.

From a 30-21 edge at halftime the Rocks stretched their margin to 45-31 for three periods and outscored the Jaguars, 19-11, in the final quarter.

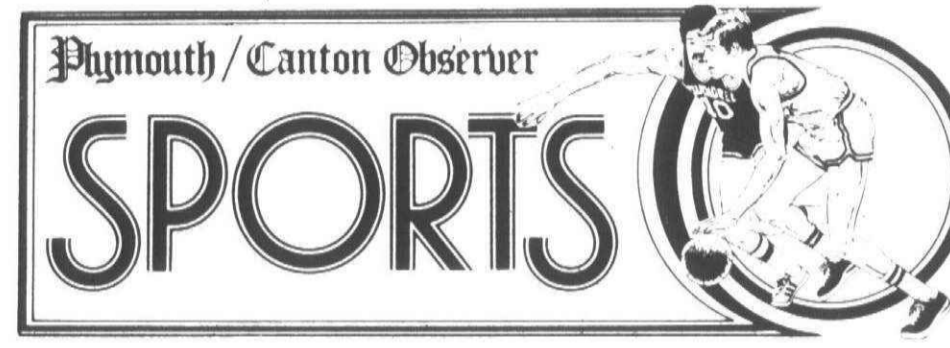
"We went at it low-key and used all 13 men in trying out a variety of personnel combinations," said coach Fred Thomann. "Our starters didn't play more than five minutes of the third period and not more than four of the last one."

The preliminary game wasn't that easy. Salem's Jayvees won, 53-51, to run their record to 9-2.

Fasching party set for Feb. 5

The third annual fasching party sponsored by the German-American Club of Plymouth is scheduled for 8 p.m. Feb. 5 in the Plymouth Cultural Center, 525 Farmer Street, Plymouth.

"Persons of all ethnic backgrounds are invited to enjoy the fun of the pre-Lenten celebration," said Gus Oesterle, president of the club. "There will be all-German wine, beer and food—sausage, pickles, potato salad, sauerkraut and rolls."

Music for dancing will be supplied by the "Melodias." According to club members Maria Mulzer and Helen Oesterle, the band can be heard every day on the German Hour on radio. It also played for the Vienna Ball in Cobo Hall, Detroit.

For Maria Mulzer of Canton Township, the fasching party and stories of fasnacht brought back memories of her childhood in the Black Forest area of Germany. She said the fasching celebration actually begins the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. It is then that the prince and princess and their attendants are chosen.

"THINGS QUIET down over Christmas but start up again after the new year," said Maria. The prince and princess and their court must be unmarried.

"They visit all the local clubs and are greeted with great ceremony. Their arrival is announced by trumpeters."

Mrs. Mulzer has been in this country for seven years. She said the beginnings of the fasching parties go back to the early 18th century in Germany.

"In the north it is called a festival. In the south—Bavaria and the Black Forest—it is fasching.

"It is a time for spoofing politicians," she said. "Television comedians, and people in the parades and at parties tell jokes and make fun of government officials. The Monday before Ash Wednesday is a holiday. The big parades are carried on television.

"There are floats and tons of candy and pretzels are thrown to the children lining the parade route. It all ends Tuesday night, fasnacht with the big parties."

MARIA MULZER said everyone wears costumes and masks to the

fasching balls. At midnight, they take off their masks.

"If you don't want to unmask, you just leave."

She said that in some places they put a person in clown costume in a casket and carry him out, marking the end of the festivities.

"The children have their own balls on the Sunday afternoon before the parade. I remember after the war," she reminisced. "They threw oranges to the children at the parade. We would collect whole bags full of things. They carried the pretzels on long sticks."

Some of the costumes are very expensive and are handed down in families. Mrs. Mulzer said her brother's costume is worth about \$200.

"It has a wooden mask which distorts your voice when you speak. Some people rent costumes for the ball."

Most of those attending the local fasching party wear costumes but it is not necessary. "I still don't know if I can persuade Gus to go in costume," said Helen Oesterle.

Maria and Horst Mulzer won second place for their costumes at last year's party. Maria made the costumes—they were dressed as Mr. and Mrs. Ladybug.

"I still haven't an idea for this year," she said.

THE GERMAN-AMERICAN Club of Plymouth has members from the surrounding communities, Livonia, Plymouth, Northville, and Westland. It is a social and cultural club which meets the third Thursday of each month in the Plymouth Oddfellows Hall on Elizabeth Street at Ann Arbor Trail.

They are seeking new members and anyone wishing more information can call the president, 455-7789.

Oesterle, the president lives in Canton Township. Roger Feller, vice president is from Northville; Joe Gates of Plymouth is treasurer; Mary Ploughman of Plymouth is secretary; Maria Mulzer and Fritz Sanders of Livonia are the auditors.

Tickets for the fasching party are \$6.50 per couple. They may be purchased from members of the club or from Finlan Insurance on Main Street.

"It's a good idea to buy them early," warned Helen Oesterle. "We've had a sellout each year."

The gift to the museum was tapes of conversations with 12 longtime Plymouth residents. The oral history of the community contained on the tapes is a valuable addition to the

archives department of the museum. Evelyn Edgar, head of the department, and Archie Stobie, museum director, accepted the gift with the promise to carry on the project.

The taping was done during the spring and summer months.

Beth Simescu and Joan Healy spoke of the research that went into an interview before the actual taping began. Once the project was endorsed by the Community Bicentennial Commission, a resource group was established and several persons attended a class in-

structed by Patricia Pilling to learn the art of interviewing and taping.

Originally, several high school students were involved, but Mrs. Simescu and Mrs. Healy were responsible for all the recordings.

THE 12 PERSONS whose memories now are a permanent record of the history of the area are Roy Fisher, George Burr, Perry Richwine, Roswell and Nancy Tanger, Ernest Allison, Margaret Dunning, Frank Henderson, Jack Wilcox, Ruth Garlett and Clara Alexander.

"We have a long list of others we'd

like to tape," said Mrs. Simescu. It should be done. I was shocked to hear Roy Fisher had died but grateful we had his interesting recollections on tape. These things can't wait."

The gift to the museum included the original tapes and a set of copies. Another set will be kept in the library.

There is a tape player in the museum's archives for listening, and the library has four cassette players for in-library listening.

Students and researchers can use the tapes for study at both the library and the museum.

Thomases wed 60 years

Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Thomas of 356 Roe Street, Plymouth, will celebrate their 60th anniversary Jan. 31. They were married Jan. 31, 1917 in Plymouth.

When they were first married, Thomas worked for the Daisy Company.

"My pay was \$9 a week," he said, "for 55 hours a week. We worked 10 hours a day, five days a week, and five hours on Saturday. Some weeks we'd get paid by the piece and I'd get as much as \$13." He still has some of his pay envelopes from 1916 and 1917 with the amounts on the envelopes.

He recalled that he bought his wedding cigars from George Springer, the only policeman in town.

"George rolled the cigars in a little shop behind his house on Mill Street," he said. "They were called Plymouth Mails."

He pointed out the spot on Main Street where the livery stable once stood. Young men could rent a horse

and buggy for \$1 an evening when they were courting.

"You could take a drive into the country but you couldn't stay late. You usually had to get home by 10 o'clock."

He recalled the day a 7-year-old boy drowned in Tonquish Creek. "It was just about where the alley is now, back of Cloverdale. He was washed down to Wing Street."

In a lighter vein he told of the gala days on the site where the Mayflower Hotel now stands, and the medicine shows that set up shop there every year.

The Thomases have four sons and a daughter. Their family includes Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Thomas of Plymouth, Mr. and Mrs. Leland Thomas of Belleville, Mr. and Mrs. Morris Thomas of Plymouth, Mr. and Mrs. Doyle (Eunice) Maddock of Westland, and Sidney Thomas of Plymouth. They have 10 grandchildren and 22 great-grandchildren.

From Your House

The Plymouth Community Arts Council is looking for assistance in the continuance of its school art program.
Many parents new to the Canton area may not be familiar with the eight-year-old series of art exhibits in the schools carried on by the "Picture Ladies." But your children are aware of the program and are becoming more proficient in visual media appreciation.
The PCAC's goal is to help the elementary students in the Plymouth-Canton schools know and enjoy art. Once a month, volunteers take portfolios of reproductions and visit four or five classrooms in each school. Each presentation is based on a theme such as animals, sports, Van Gogh, women artists, etc.
In the first grade, the children are primarily aware of color and what they can find in a picture. When the students have reached the fifth grade, they are ready to learn more about the artist's life and why and how the picture was painted.
APPROXIMATELY 20 minutes is spent discussing five or six paintings. At the end of the sessions, a picture is left in each classroom for the students to "live with." The pictures are rotated each week.
A month later, the picture lady returns with a new portfolio.
Nancy Hayes, chairperson of the project, said, "Our volunteers are not required to have a vast knowledge of art history. It is a learning experience for us as well as the children."
Biographical information and notes concerning the pictures are included with each set of paintings.
The scope of the picture ladies' territory has been increased by the opening of the three new schools in Canton.

Awareness theater at EMU

The Theatre Company of Ann Arbor will give a free performance on the campus of Eastern Michigan University at 8 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 27 in the Roosevelt Auditorium.

The company, which focuses on women, will perform a potpourri of their own original material in repertory, including excerpts from their two recent productions of "Mad Madonnas" and "Bitch, You Crazy!"

The Theatre Company of Ann Arbor has been described as a kaleidoscope, a statement about women today; theatre that recognizes the need to examine women in social, political and economic institutions. The company is known as being entertaining and funny while being serious and moving.

Its most recent production, "Bitch, You Crazy!" is a collection of experimental and improvisational pieces developed or adapted by the company. Getting Around

Dinner Theatre again at old Botsford Inn

The Coach House of the cozy old Botsford Inn in Farmington Hills is the setting for the R G Production of "I Do! I Do!" which opens in dinner theater format Wednesday.

Over lunch in the dining room of the inn—dating back to 1836, director Edgar A. Guest III of Birmingham talked about the show produced by Michael Goodman.

"It's a comfortable show," he said. "People recognize themselves or moments in their lives. That is the charm of this play."

Guest continued, "It's kind of a gentle play—very, very rich and full of humor. It's a difficult challenge for the actors, since there are only two of them, and they are on stage virtually all the time."

The stars are Nancy Gurwin and Phil Marcus Esser. Guest has the highest praise for both Ms. Gurwin, who has appeared in several dinner theater productions at the Botsford, and Esser, who starred in "Jacques Brel" and "Personals" at Mercy College dinner theater.

Guest describes Esser as "a very strong performer, which you have to be to work with Nancy. She has a tendency to want to take over on stage."

"I DO! I DO!" containing more than 20 musical and dance numbers is written by Tom Jones and Harvey Schmit, who wrote the longest-running play in the American theater. "The Fantasticks."

Mary Martin and Robert Preston starred in the original Broadway production of "I Do! I Do!"

The musical in two acts takes a couple from the ages of 20 to 60 or 65. Guest explained, "It goes from their marriage day to the day they move out of the house after their children are grown up, retirement age."

Guest said Ms. Gurwin is only offstage to change clothes and Esser does his dressing on or offstage. "He's always taking his pants off."

One of the fascinating aspects of the show is that the characters literally age before your eyes, he said. How do the actors do this?

"ONE IS A TRICK of the actors' trade. They just think older. In the second act, the authors have written a very interesting theatrical trick. The show pauses and the actors step down to make-up tables and in front of the audience age."

"There is no age make-up in the show until this time."

"The authors are saying, 'Isn't love wonderful?'" Guest pointed out. "It's a show about love in its many manifestations."

A song in the first act says love is what makes it sort of fun, what makes all the hardships worthwhile.

"The theme is: With enough love, you can survive almost any disaster."

"Similarities between 'Fantasticks' and 'I Do! I Do!' are that both are romantic shows. The audiences identify like crazy," Guest said.

"The authors understand the human heart, and that's what makes their shows successful," he said.
