New 45-15 tracks place Miller in bind

An attempt to determine a logical schedule for the buildings going on year-round school this July has run into a snag which could reduce the district's state aid money.

School Supt. John Hoben is looking closely at a schedule which would allow the schools going on 45-15 in July to finish their academic year at the same time as buildings on the traditional nine-month calendar.

The snag, however, is Miller Elementary which has been on 45-15 for two years in a pilot program. Re-aligning Miller's schedule with the five additional year-round schools could result in Miller students not meeting the state requirement for 180 instructional days per year.

Hoben is currently searching for a way to avoid the loss of class time at Miller and still begin year-round schedules in the five other schools in July.

HOBEN HAS ASKED the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education to consider a change in the present staggered tracking system used at Miller when the other schools in the district start classes on a year-round basis.

Under the Miller system, there are four tracks (groups) of students who attend classes for 45 school days (nine weeks) and then have a break for 15 days (three weeks). Each group of students begins and ends its school year at a different time. During the year, the groups are staggered in such a way that three groups are in school at any given time. One group is always on break.

Hoben has proposed that all classes for all 45-15 schools begin on July 11. But two of Miller's groups will still be finishing the current school year on that date. One of them won't finish until the first week in August and the other group won't be done until the last week in August.

If Miller and the other five schools, started the 1977-78 academic year on July 11, these two groups of students would lose between three and seven weeks of instruction in the current year. And it would have to be made up.

STATE LAW REQUIRES that schools provide a full 180 class days or 900 instructional hours. If they don't, they are not eligible for state money.

Although Hoben admits he doesn't have any answers yet, he said there are several possible solutions. One would be to petition the state board of education to waive the 180-day requirement.

A second approach would be to require the students to make up the lost time by going longer hours each day or by attending class on weekends.

Neither alternative is particularly attractive. School officials say the chances of the state board granting the waiver are extremely thin. And Miller parents are upset by the situation their children are in.

"I'm very pleased with the 45-15 schedule," said Cindy Monks, "but I'm afraid the switch is going to cause some real problems for the kids. I don't see how they can lose or make up that much time."

Gerri Guzik, also a Miller parent is a little stronger in her criticism of the proposal. "I can't take my child out of school for two months, but the school board can consider doing it. Who do they think they are?"

"I don't think they know what they are doing or where they are going.

They are trying to do too much too fast."

Hoben acknowledges the problem is a thorny one but defends the plan because he says it has some advantages. Primarily, it would provide more flexibility for students. With all the groups starting at the same time, the separation between groups would be eliminated. A child could move from one group to another, if necessary, with a minimal amount of lost instruction.

With the staggered groups at Miller, students are locked in with the group they start with, Hoben said. In addition, the proposed change would enable the schools to have a more uni-

Stein wants cost of sheriff patrol

Township officials continue to hammer away at members of a Wayne County Board of Commissioners subcommittee, hoping to convince them to change their minds on funding for the Sheriff's road patrol in seven out-county townships.

Faced with a projected \$12 million deficit for the year, the full board of commissioners voted to terminate the money for the 28-man patrol on June 30, which amounts to about \$1 million. Many of the townships affected by the decision, including Plymouth Township, have no other form of police protection.

In the second meeting in two weeks with the public safety and judiciary committee Wednesday, representatives of the municipalities argued against the termination of the patrol. The committee has the responsibility of advising the full board on the matter.

"I think we got their attention this time, and they are giving some second thoughts to our problems," said Plymouth Township Supervisor Thomas Notebaert. "But we still have a long way to go."

Since the decision was made to end the funds for the patrol, the commissioners' position has remained essentially unchanged. At a meeting two weeks ago, one commissioner said it was time the townships "grew up" and got their own police departments.

However, Notebaert and Canton Township Supervisor Harold Stein believe that the introduction of some new information might have softened the committee's attitude.

Retired Michigan State Police Direc-

tor Fred David, a Plymouth Township resident, attended the meeting at Notebaert's request. He furnished statistics to the commissioners which indicated that much of the crime in the townships was related to the metropolitan parks.

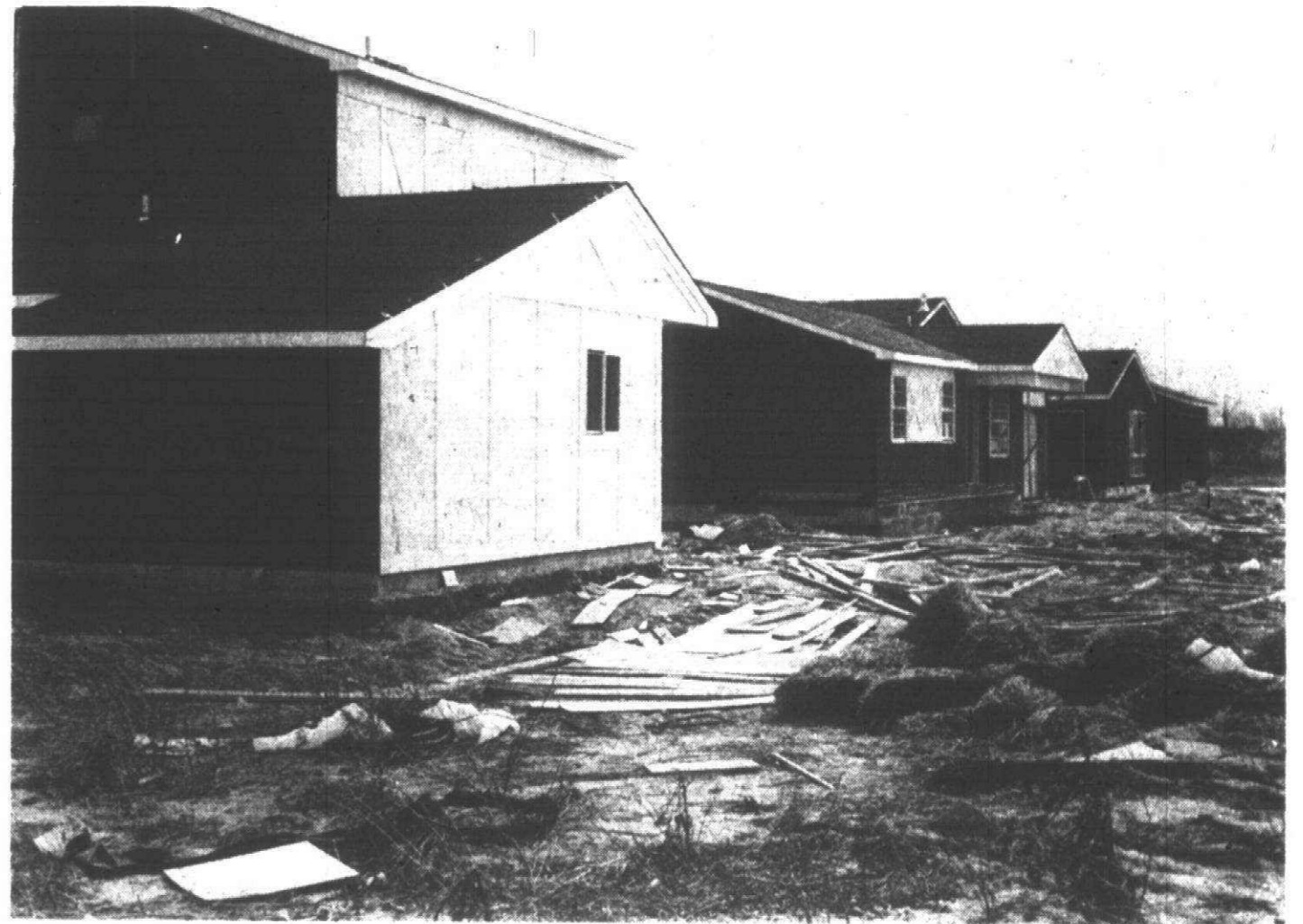
"**WE GET A LOT** of people from Detroit who come out to Hines Park and then commit crimes," said Stein. "They're not even our own residents, and the county still wants us to pay for the road patrol. Does that sound right to you?"

In addition, Stein argued that the involved townships paid \$9 million to the county in taxes. "They should be able to tell us how much of that goes for the road patrol. No one is taking exception to paying, but you have to know what you're paying for."

Although the commissioners had said they would have a detailed breakdown of what the patrol cost was for the townships, Stein was not pleased with the figures they supplied. Committee members had previously suggested the townships contract with the sheriff's department for the amount of protection they needed.

"I still don't know how much of our money goes to the sheriff," commented Stein hotly. "I have to be able to go to my constituents and say it costs so much and ask them if they want it, not. Until I can do that, I'm not making any decisions."

Notebaert, too, shared some of Stein's perceptions. "It seems things get less clear everytime we meet." No date has been set, but another meeting is scheduled.

Smaller homes built

Bank, builder picketed

People often cite "incompatibility" as their reason for seeking divorce. Homeowners in Canton's Willow Trail subdivision cite incompatibility as their reason for fighting construction of new homes with smaller square footage and one-car garages.

Michigan National Bank, owner of 120 remaining lots in the subdivision, is the main target of the residents' criticism. A Michigan National Bank branch office under construction at Ford and Sheldon was picketed Wednesday afternoon by about 50 people who want the bank to build compatible homes on remaining lots in the subdivision.

Thirty-seven homes in the \$50,000 price range were built and sold in Willow Trail subdivision by David Nelson of Phoenix Homes who went into bankruptcy last year. But before he went bankrupt, Nelson signed a covenant with the homeowners promising "to assure the beauty, betterment, protection and harmony of external design and appearance of the residences to be built on lots in the subdivision" in the future.

An architectural control committee established under the covenant expired Dec. 31, 1976 and neither Michigan National nor B.L. Smokler and Co. developers have agreed to renew the agreement.

Willow Trail residents became concerned, said Tom McNamara, president of the subdivision homeowner association, when they saw an 1,100-square-foot model open. Then Smokler began building the small house with one-car garage and brick on the front only, on one of three lots purchased from the bank.

Smokler spokesman Manny Bush said the company has an arrangement with the bank to buy more homes if desired.

"But even if Smokler builds all 50 of the homes they have an option on, the bank is the one who has the responsibility to uphold the original covenant," says Peter Bundarin, attorney for the Willow Trail Homeowner Assoc. "The bank is trying to pass the buck to Smokler."

Bundarin argues that because the bank has become the major property holder in the subdivision, it must reinstate the architectural control committee and live up to the terms of the original covenant.

And, because the 37 homes already built range between 1,500-2,000 square feet, and feature two-car garages, anything substantially less than that is illegal, Bundarin said.

Michigan Bank officials state that all comments on the dispute would come from their attorney, Peter Alter. He could not be reached for comment Friday.

The head of the homeowner group, McNamara, said the association is not attempting to ban homes that cost less than \$50,000 from Canton "we're just saying we want our subdivision finished with like-sized homes and construction materials."

McNamara said future Canton subdivisions could accommodate less expensive or less expansive homes.

He said the association is ready to fight the case in court if necessary. But the association's attorney, Bundarin, says he would like to avoid the

lengthy and uncertain legal route.

"The best way to go about it is bring this to the attention of the bank so they'll become aware of the problems the Willow Trail people are having with these smaller, incompatible homes."

"I understand that after Wednesday's picketing, officials of the bank wanted to know what was going on," Bundarin said. "They don't want all those potential customers to be pick-

eting their soon-to-open bank."

The homeowner group also scheduled a picket yesterday at Smokler's model homes on Saltz, south of Ford and east of Lilley.

"That's what I like about Canton," McNamara said. "People want it to be developed right and they're not about to be pushed around. We've got a new township and people are interested and involved. They don't just sit back and gripe."

Carter's Blue Cross cap could nudge teacher talks

Jimmy Carter may be the latest facilitator in the teacher contract talks in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

President Carter unwittingly entered the local contract talks when he addressed the nation Friday morning and proposed a 10 per cent price lid on hospital cost increases.

The timing for the local contract talks, was especially significant because there is a chance both sides might meet at the table today (Monday).

Carter's hospital price lid proposal might be a catalyst locally because the major issue now preventing a settlement appears to be whether there should be a "cap" on medical insurance premiums.

The school board is asking teachers to accept a proposal to share any increase the costs of medical insurance premiums if they exceed \$100 per month for family coverage.

Carter's proposal, if approved by Congress, would limit Blue Cross-Blue Shield premiums to an increase of no more than nine per cent a year.

The proposed economic controls on medical costs might break the current deadlock at the bargaining table.

ALTHOUGH BOTH sides are actually in disagreement on four issues, the key difference is on a proposal to "cap" health insurance premiums.

The board's offer is that once family membership premiums exceed \$100 per month, the added amount will be shared 50-50 by the board and the individual teacher. For example, if medical premiums for families climbed to \$110 a month in 1979, the school district would pay \$5 and the individual teacher would contribute \$5.

The Plymouth Education Association (PEA) has rejected the proposal, arguing it would cause problems for future bargaining teams and represents a rollback from agreements of previous years.

The school board argues premiums won't exceed the \$100 level until at least the third year of the three-year contract presently being negotiated, and then would be a nominal amount for teachers to pay. The board would like the teacher contribution to be deducted from cost-of-living payments.

On April 1, 1977, Blue Cross-Blue Shield premiums increased by about 34 per cent to raise the cost of family coverage from \$72 to \$94.

WHEN ASKED about the local impact of Carter's proposal on the stalemated talks, Supt. John M. Hoben was noncommittal.

"We'll have to look at the details of the President's proposal. But it might be significant. Right now we can't even get to the bargaining table, so maybe this will help."

Hoben did some quick calculations and estimated that if Carter's proposal goes into effect, family coverage will cost \$103.40 per teacher in the third year of the contract. "If the PEA would accept the board's proposal, that would mean the added cost to teachers would be a maximum of \$7.60 for 1979. That's not much money. Maybe a clamp on rising medical costs would give enough assurance to teachers that premiums won't get out of hand that we can reach agreement on this issue."

The board doesn't describe its proposal on medical premiums as being a cap.

"The board isn't asking to have health insurance capped, but merely

asking that if costs continue to rise at the current rate that the board and the PEA share the responsibility," Norm Kee, chief negotiator for the board, said.

NO TALKS OCCURRED last week because teachers were on vacation for Easter break.

Kee and Derald McKinley, PEA chief negotiator, however, left town with expectations that a meeting might be arranged for today.

If the sides don't meet, a critical stage could be reached as the PEA has called for a general membership meeting for 5 a.m. tomorrow (Tuesday) in the Penn Theatre.

McKinley says the purpose of the meeting will be to inform teachers of the status of negotiations. Administrators, however, are worried a strike vote might be taken because the meeting is being held in the morning. The usual practice has been for the teachers to hold meetings in the afternoon, after the school day has ended.

Late last week, reports were also spreading that other teacher unions which don't have contracts yet are calling general membership meetings early this week. There are some 19 school districts in the metropolitan Detroit area currently negotiating contracts with teachers.

CARTER'S PROPOSED lid on medical costs is seen as a key part to the administration's anti-inflation program.

The lid is expected to save the federal government and private insurance firms about \$2.6 billion a year. The controls also will lower costs for Medicare and Medicaid.

Hospital costs have been rising about 15 per cent a year with patient rates now between \$150 to \$200 a day.

All 3 candidates back tax, bond

All three candidates for the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education support the millage renewal and bond issue on the April 23 ballot.

Although the candidates won't be running for the school board until the June 13 annual election, all three urge residents to vote "yes" on both the renewal and the bond issue.

Those who have filed for the school board are Arlene Calahan of Canton, Steve Harper of Plymouth Township, and Mary Jane Mulaski of Canton.

MRS. CALLAHAN says she "strongly supports both ballot issues and really hope they pass."

"I support the millage renewal simply because the school district needs the money. To defeat the millage would only take money, which cannot be replaced, away from our programs. Teachers would get laid off and class sizes would increase."

The bond issue is needed, she said, "so we can keep up with growth in Canton. And it's wise to pass the bond issue now. With inflation, construction costs are going up. If we wait one or two years it will cost us much more to build what we need and is provided for in this bond program. It's just wise financially to pass the bond issue

now. It's like buying a home—if you have the money, you would buy now and not wait for costs to go up."

The renewal proposal is to approve five mills for operating, which are now being levied, for another six years. The bond issue is to borrow \$29.75 million for new buildings and renovations to existing buildings. To pay off the loan, one mill would be levied. Some \$19.75 million would be borrowed in August, 1977, if the issue is approved and the other \$10 million would be borrowed in two years—if the state board of education approves the sale.

MRS. MULASKI says she supports both ballot issues.

"The five mills we've been paying all along and aren't going to miss it by renewing. It's not an additional tax. But we need those five mills to cover existing operation expenses."

"The one mill for new schools also is needed. More and more people are moving into Canton which means more children, and we must be prepared to educate them."

"The school district has looked into other options, such as renting empty buildings but the closest space available is in Garden City. So we've no choice but to vote yes."

"Nobody wants taxes to go up but the additional children are coming and we have to educate them. The school administrators are being flexible in the construction program and bond planning to avoid over-building. This is important to remember."

HARPER, WHO IS chairman of the

citizens election committee, predictably endorsed both ballot proposals.

On the renewal, he commented: "Those five mills amounts to 10 per cent of the operating budget. When you consider 85 per cent of the budget goes for salaries, we must lay off a lot of people if the renewal fails—some 75 to 90 employees. With 800 to 1,200 new students coming in the fall, class sizes will go to unreasonable levels if we have to lay off faculty. And there would be substantial reductions in all types of programs."

"Defeat of the renewal also would have serious impact on the resale values of homes in this community."

On the bond issue, Harper pointed out that 5,000 additional students are expected by 1980. "If we put every single building in the school district on year-round school, we could handle 8,000 students with existing classrooms. But by 1979, we'd reach the point where more buildings are needed. The problem is that we aren't sure now we can—even if we wanted to—put every building on 45-15."

"So we must get the bonds now. By going for a large amount, we qualify for the state bond fund and obtain a lower interest rate and the ability to pay off the loan over a longer period of time. And so we can borrow \$30 million for one mill. Without the state bond fund, it would cost us one mill to borrow \$15 million. So we can get twice the money for the same millage rate and have the opportunity to do some long-range planning but yet build only what we must to meet the growth up to 1981."

Police get boy, lose handcuff

The Michigan State Police have a runaway juvenile with poetic tendencies in custody but are still missing half a handcuff.

Last week, Trooper John McAllen, of the Northville post, picked up a young man who had run away from home. While he was in the process of taking the youth back to the station, he got a radio message to check on a possible burglary at a nearby building.

"We knew he had the kid with him," said Sgt. Gary Sauer of the Northville post, "but he was the nearest man within seven miles. So we told him to check it out."

According to Sauer, McAllen opened the trunk of the patrol car and handcuffed the youth to the latch to keep him from escaping while the officer investigated the building. However, when he came back to the car, the

youngster—and the handcuffs—were gone.

"Apparently, McAllen didn't realize the boy could reach the tire iron," Sauer said. "But he could, and used it to bash the handcuffs open."

Several hours later, the youngster called the police post and told them half their handcuff was in a certain mailbox. When officers arrived on the scene, they found the cuff—and a poem explaining how the youthful offender had made good his escape.

"No doubt, the kid is very creative," commented Sauer. "But we've got him in custody again, and he's going to stay there until he tells us where the other half of the handcuff is."

The youth, who is being held at the juvenile detention center, has thus refused to give the police that information.

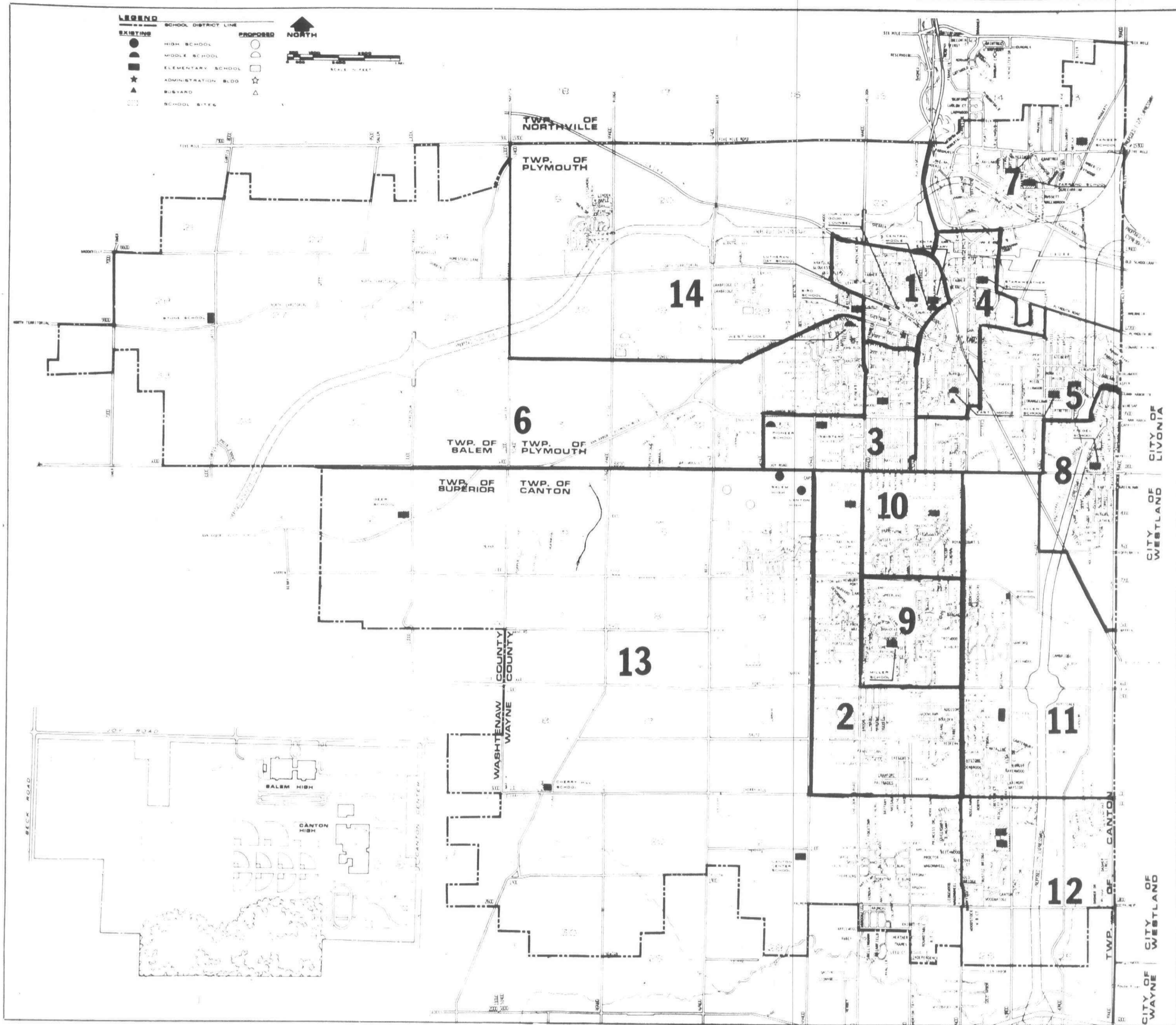

He supports the June 13 property tax proposal to raise the limitation by 0.8 mills.

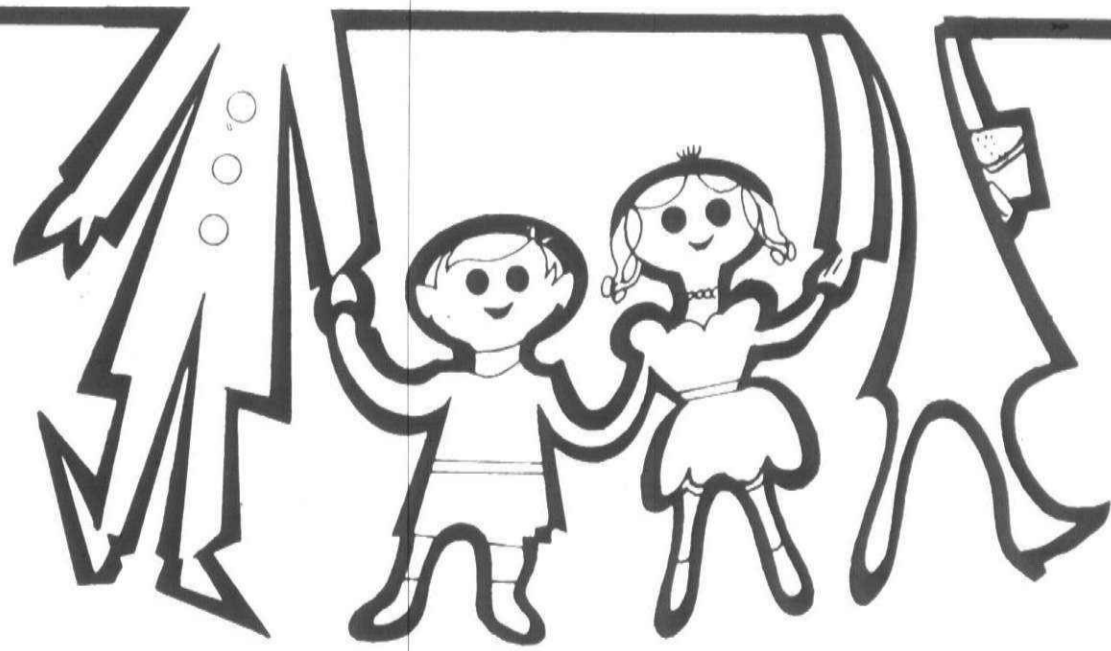

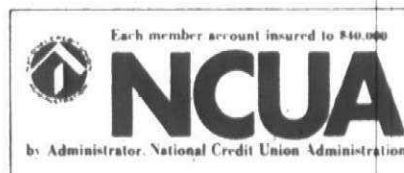

Use a little horse sense; schools must cut frills

Editor: With the school millage coming up for a vote, I feel I must have my say.

First of all, on 30 acres of vacant land, our state equalized value is about \$30,000, making our taxes for 1976 on this property \$1,764. The state value was raised from 1975, so therefore, the schools got more money. In subdivisions, there are about two houses per acre with assessed values of about \$15,000 on each, to make a total of \$30,000 per acre. Some homes have no children, so why is there a need for more millage?

The high-rise apartments for senior citizens are built as such, because they are cheaper to maintain as well

as to build. Why then can't we have at least three-story schools, where the same roof would cover three floors, the same foundation would just have to be changed a little, the heating problems would be greatly reduced, and the maintenance would be far cheaper than for one-story buildings spread over 30 or more acres of land. Are our children too good to climb stairs, as I, my father and mother did in Central Middle School which was the high school we graduated from? My children also graduated from there. Do we think so much less of our senior citizens that we make them go up in a high-rise building and make young children, who are able to

climb stairs and need the exercise, stay at ground level?

We would like to have many things different, but, if we cannot afford it, we have to live within our means. We cannot go and say to our employer, 'I want a new Cadillac, so give me a raise big enough that I can get it.' Why then should the schools not be made to live within their means? I went into Canton High School last June for a graduation. I was sick to see the wasted taxpayers' money in that building. They have what is called a "bull pen" in one area. I don't know what this is for, unless, as the name implies, teachers go there to "talk." Or maybe it's the students.

I do not have a college degree, nor do I need one, to use a little common sense to see that our school system has become a Frankenstein monster. We can no longer control it. It controls us. I hope that every voter will think before he marks his ballot.

They do not have to close schools, lay off teachers, shut down buses or

use a lot more scare tactics to get people to pass the millage. All they have to do is use a little "horse sense," as we farmers say, cut down on their expenses and live within their means as we the people have to. Then they would not need the millage.

Let us not make taxes so high that our children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren will not be able to enjoy life. Let us not be like the ostrich, who buries his head in the sand and thinks he's hidden, while all but his head is in plain view. Let us leave something to our loved ones besides taxes they cannot pay. Let us leave them a school system that lives within its means.

If necessary, weed out the school system the same as we weed a garden. Cull out the non-producers, the same as farmers cull cows that don't produce enough. Again, I ask each and every voter, think before you mark your ballot.

Canton can't waste time by just studying growth

Editor:

It was recently reported by the news media that Canton Township had received initial approval from the Wayne County Community Development Block Grant Program for \$23,000 to catalog innovative growth management techniques.

On March 17, the Canton Growth Committee, appointed by Harold Stein to study growth control alternatives, authorized its chairperson to write a letter to the board of trustees outlining its position on the township's application for block grant funding.

Let me share with you some of the portions of that letter. . . . such a study could delay action for an extended period of time and press Canton near a crisis stage in terms of inability to maintain adequate services.

. . . we question if it (the study) is truly needed as desperately as is immediate citizen input. . . and a specific growth plan and ordinance for Canton.

. . . we are somewhat reticent to endorse your proposal unless some interim growth control technique was activated during the time the study was being completed.

I AM OPPOSED to the study for

two reasons. First, the information to be gathered already exists in three 1,500 page volumes, "Management and Control of Growth," funded in 1975 by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. How can a \$23,000 study match this in scope and detail?

Second, Canton Township can ill afford to waste more time studying the growth problem. There exists numerous growth management techniques. What we are short of in Canton is commitment on the part of our elected officials to respond to the growth problem with boldness and decisiveness.

The \$23,000 could be better spent on hiring a nationally-known growth management advocate expert to articulate a growth management program for Canton and a law firm capable of defending the program in court.

Canton residents, if you too are convinced something decisive must be done about uncontrolled growth, make your feelings known by contacting Supervisor Harold Stein and the board of trustees.

The Stroller

World's worst cynic

Sorting through the bird baths, flower boxes and other garden ornaments the other afternoon while getting ready to dress up the spacious lawn. The Stroller came upon an old familiar piece that caused him to chuckle. It was the popular ornament many folks stick into the middle of the flower gardens and reads:

The kiss of the sun for pardon

The song of the bird for mirth

One is nearer God's heart in a garden

Than anywhere else on earth

Reading the words again he was reminded of one of the world's worst cynics—an elderly chap named Old Jim Daugherty, whom the Stroller met during his early days in the suburbs.

Old Jim owned a piece of property not far from the plot on which the Stroller built his home, and Jim spent every weekend on the bank of the tiny stream that flowed through his "home."

No week-end was complete without a visit to Old Jim just to hear him unleash many of his cynicisms, and he protected no one. He was quite a character.

On this particular weekend during The Stroller's visit, Old Jim had an unexpected caller. It was a gentleman of the cloth—the minister of the Presbyterian church.

He had come to make the acquaintance of Old Jim as he relaxed along the bank of the tiny stream and to invite him to church services.

WITH THE pomp and dignity of his station in life the minister told Jim that he would find enjoyment at the services, meet a lot of nice people,

and it would do his soul some good. "Not me," Old Jim countered. "You won't get me to church and leave my haven here even for only a few hours."

Stunned by the flat refusal, the minister asked Jim why he was so adamant.

"I just think it is a waste of time," Old Jim said, "and I'll tell you why." The minister threw back his shoulders as if to ward off a blow and stood mute as Old Jim continued. "I've been to church, and it was far from being enjoyable."

Then he explained the entire hour of service. "We were asked to sing a hymn," he explained. "None of us could sing. We were like a bunch of cattle at meal time. We were off-key and I couldn't wait until we finished."

"Then the choir sang—or attempted to—and it wasn't much better. It certainly wasn't enjoyable."

Old Jim was just getting started. The minister uttered nary a word.

"In the midst of the hour a girl got up and sang a solo. She was off-key, too."

"I guess her father made a donation to the church. I don't know any other reason why she was invited to sing—just to keep the old man happy. I guess."

Old Jim really struck home when

he continued his explanation of his church experience.

"Finally, the minister got up." Old Jim recalled, "and started telling us stories that I have heard many times before. I heard them when I was a kid—and there was no reason for me to sit there and listen to them again."

"When he was finished we were asked to sing another hymn. This was worse than the first time. I guess everyone was anxious to leave. I know I was and now I'd rather spend my Sunday mornings right here."

"I am close enough to the church to hear the bells chime, and the music sounds fine in the summer air. Meanwhile, I am down on my knees working in God's good earth. I will be rewarded later on."

"As a fact Rev., I am one of God's helpers and I am doing a job I like to do. Sometimes I hum along with the music of the church bells. I am out here on many a Sunday morning alone. And I am having a joyous time."

"I don't have to get up and mumble through a hymn and be off-key with all the others. And I don't have to listen to a fellow telling me a lot of old stories. I'm closer to God out here than I would be in church." With that the minister walked away.

He had met one of the world's worst cynics.

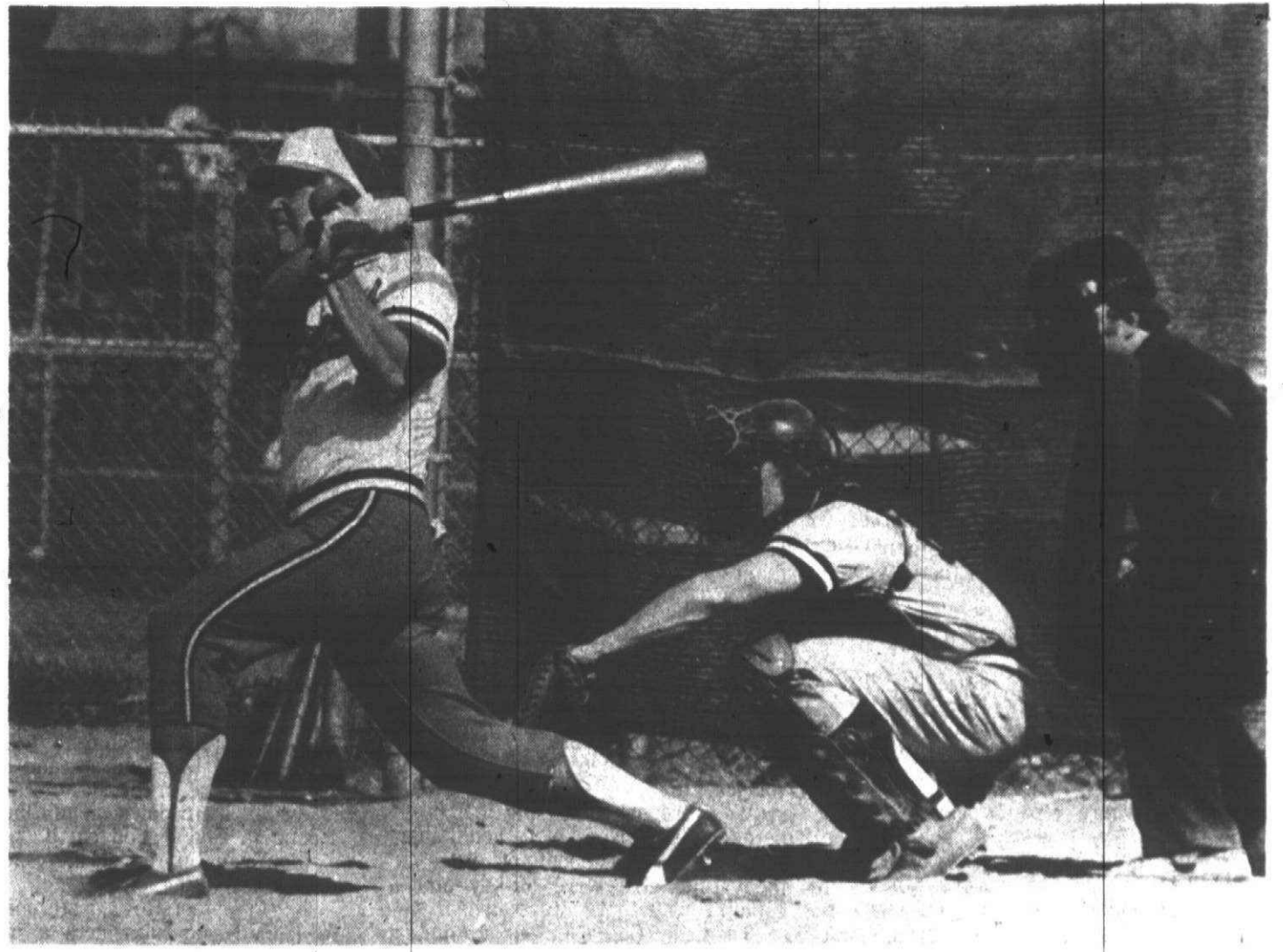
walked to force in another.

A motion was made by Schwall and supported by Flodin and carried that the township purchase the Dimension PBX electronic communications system from the Michigan Bell Telephone Co. with federal grant money if possible, and further that the money be paid at time of installation in the amount of \$36,283.97.

A motion was made by Stein and supported by Bradley to purchase 4 new typewriters and service maintenance agreement.

A motion was made by Schwall and supported by Flodin and unanimously carried to table the motion.

A motion was made by Schwall and supported by Flodin and carried to waive the bidding procedure.

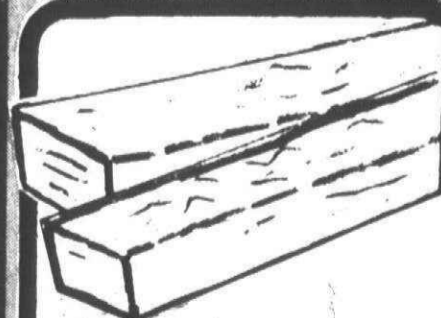

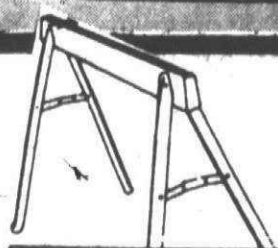

Lackluster efforts combined with shoddy fielding plays resulted in Plymouth Salem's doubleheader baseball loss to Westland John Glenn Friday afternoon.

The double setback dropped the Rocks' overall record to 2-5 for the season.

Salem opens its Suburban Eight League play Tuesday against Allen Park. And if tomorrow's game resembles anything like Friday's action, the Rocks are surely in for a tough time in defending their conference title.

Salem junior Doug Holloway was one pitch away from hurling his first varsity victory in the first game when the roof fell in.

On the relay, Borke attempted to take second. Salem's third baseman Dave Nidsgorski tried to throw Borke out, but the throw went into rightfield, scoring the tying run.

The score remained deadlocked until the second extra inning when Glenn scored the deciding run off Salem reliever Tom Chiatialis.

In the second game, more Rocks errors, both mentally and physically, wasted an outstanding pitching performance by Barry Brueckner.

With the score tied at 1-1, Glenn capitalized on

two bad throws by reserve catchers Doug Rowe and John Lewelling to score twice in both the sixth and seventh innings to sweep the doubleheader.

Rowe and Lewelling were forced into duty when starting catcher Mike Stevens injured his thumb late in the first game.

A FRUSTRATED Salem coach Brian Gilles just didn't know what to think after both losses.

"This is typical of what's been happening this year," Gilles said.

"We are inconsistent. First we get the hitting and then we get the pitching. That was the sad part. We had two good pitching performances out there."

"This club just doesn't have a leader. They're not hungry out there. They play like individuals and have no pride."

"It's a matter of pride—and we just don't have it. I don't know what to do. I can't go out and catch the ball for them."

Gilles went onto to say that he hopes for a turnaround with the league schedule starting soon.

"I still think this is a good ballclub," Gilles said. "We have to turn it around. Maybe these losses will help."

Brueckner threw a five hitter in the second game, striking out nine and walking only one batter in going the distance.

Holloway yielded to Chiatialis in the seventh of the first game but gave six and one-third innings of fine pitching.

Joe Goodsir and Benny Wilcox led the Rocks' hitting attack in the first contest. Goodsir collected three hits while Wilcox adeed two.

Barry Owens got the decision in both Salem games. Owens relieved John Holdsworth in the first contest and gave up the winning hit in the bottom of the seventh inning.

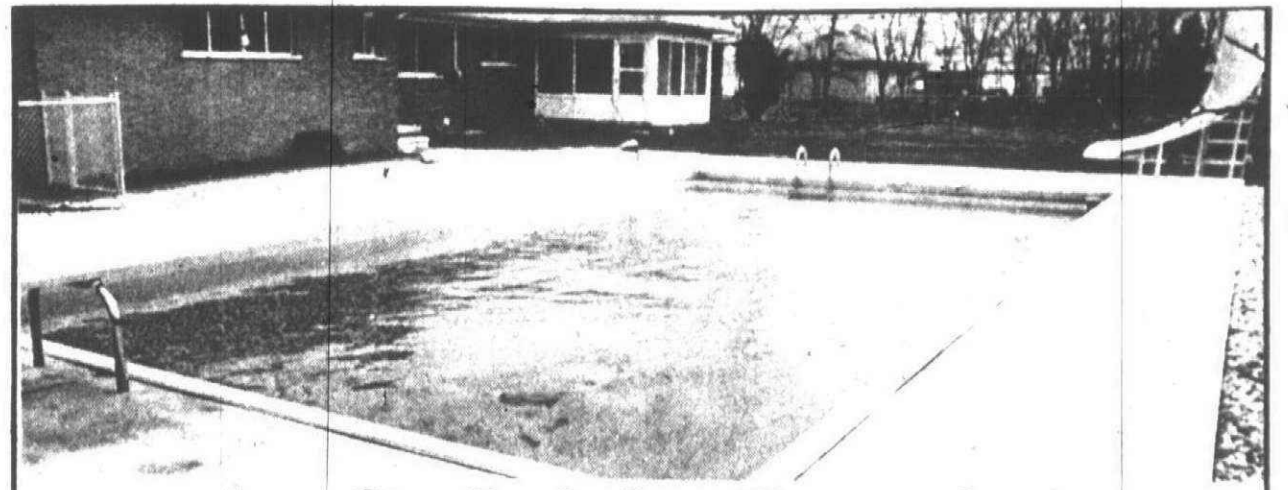
The Rocks held a 5-3 lead going into the final inning of play.

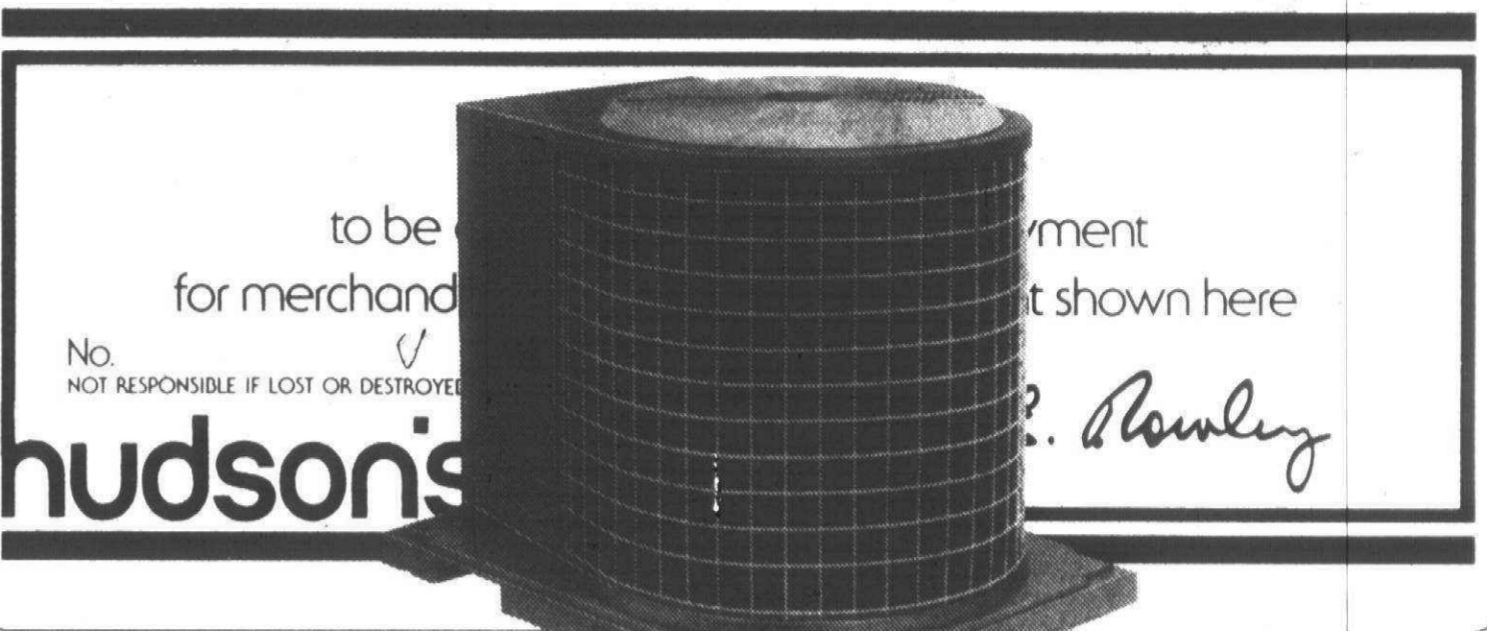
In the ladies league, Sandy Marsh had a 614 that included games of 203 and 220. And Dolly Young had a 234.

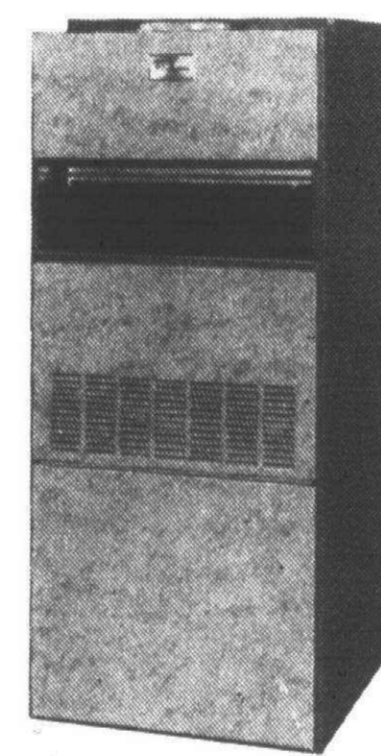
In the Tuesday men's league, Dave Lynch registered a 250 to set the pace with a 669.

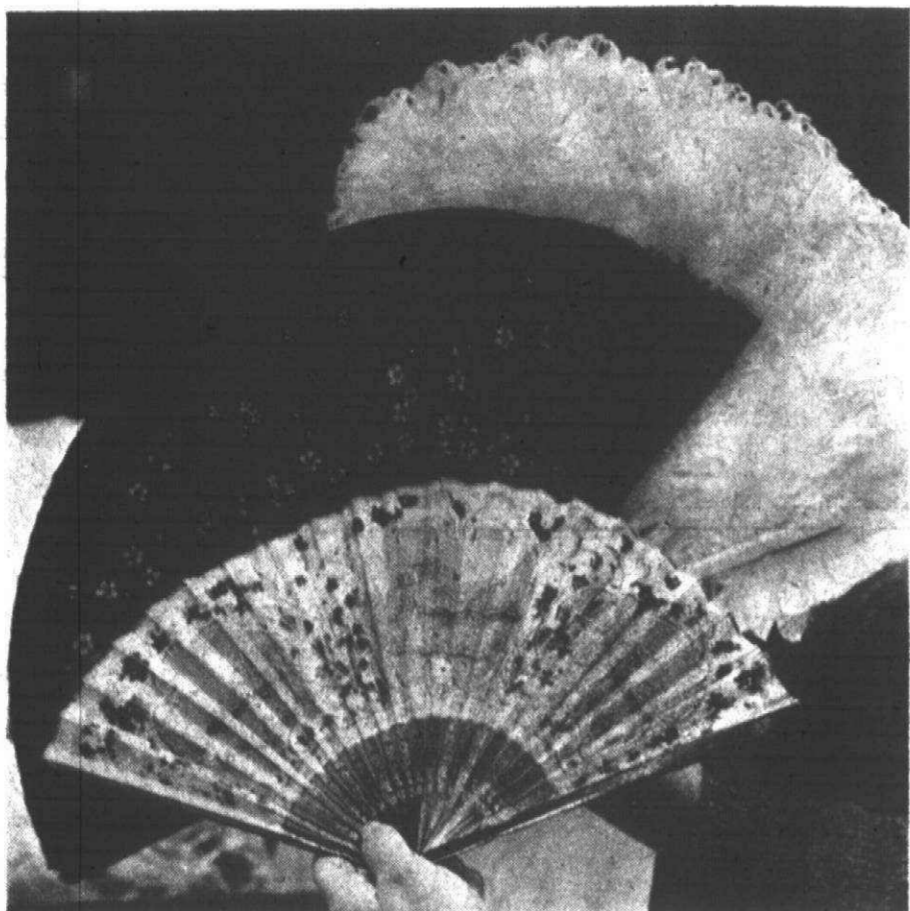

GS leaders vote to boycott meeting

Girl Scout leaders representing 60 area troops have voted to boycott the April 20 general meeting of the Detroit Girl Scouts Council at Cobo Hall.

The move is in protest over the recent endorsement of the Equal Right Amendment by the Girl Scouts national board of directors and the Detroit council.

As part of the protest, the leaders will use the April 20 date to signal the start of a petition drive to give parents of registered Girl Scouts the opportunity to speak up on the endorsement issue.

Claiming that the endorsement is unprecedented in Girl Scout history, they said they feel it is in direct violation of the organization's national charter.

Fathers as well as mothers will be encouraged to join the protest, according to Marie McGee, chairman of the newly-formed Keep Girl Scouts Nonpolitical committee, which will coordinate the petition drive.

KGSN was formed as the result of a meeting called two weeks ago by Mrs. McGee and three other scouting volunteers in Livonia—Carolyn Rogman, Rita Dahn and Carol Skamiera. They acted after learning the Detroit council had joined the national board in endorsing ERA.

NEIGHBORHOOD CHAIRMEN have been informed of the Detroit council action, but an official announcement to the general membership is still forthcoming.

According to Jan Griffis, public relations representative, the announcement was to be published in the April issue of the council's monthly newsletter, which leaders in this area have not yet received.

"We felt we had to speak up because of the principle involved," a

KGSN statement said.

"We feel that by endorsing one side of a highly-controversial issue, the national board and the Detroit council board have violated the Girl Scout congressional charter which specifically states that the Girl Scout movement shall be nonpolitical."

The decision to boycott the April 20 meeting was done regretfully, the committee added, because 40 Girl Scouts from this area are among those who will be honored that night for having achieved first class rank.

"It is not our intention to detract in any way from the high honor due these girls," the statement said. "Rather, we congratulate them, because to be a first class scout is to be a first class person."

"However, the seriousness of the endorsement action made the boycott necessary. It was the best way we know to effectively inform both boards that many of us are not in agreement with the action or the rationale used in making the decision that ultimately allows politicians to

use the good name of the Girl Scouts to further outside political interests.

"WE ARE CONCERNED about the future. Statements made by several national board members indicate it is their belief that Girl Scouts can no longer be nonpolitical, but must speak up on public issues which the national board's political issues committee feels 'will have impact on the lives of our girls as they mature into womanhood.'"

"We respect this point of view, and if they feel this course is vital to the growth of this organization, we suggest they initiate steps to amend the charter accordingly."

"In the meantime they, like the rest of us in Girl Scouting, are bound by the same charter, laws and promise that have been in effect for the past 62 years. No amount of legal finagling alters that fact."

But even in this "family" dispute, the Girl Scout sense of humor prevails, Mrs. McGee said.

"When this is all over," she smiled, "I'm going to recommend that a public speaking badge be added. The only requirement will be to make an endorsement or position statement without appearing to be political."

Cinderella story—delightful film

"The Slipper and the Rose" (G) is a generously endowed film: Lush costumes and settings, exterior scenes shot on location in Austria, pleasing (if not immortal) music, smart choreography and a wealth of talent.

Richard Chamberlain sings and dances as The Prince, newcomer Gemma Craven is an appealing, fresh-as-the-dew Cinderella, and a host of excellent British stars including Kenneth More, Dame Edith Evans and Margaret Lockwood, comprise the supporting cast.

This is a delightful family movie. Lest anyone think the Cinderella story too soppy and sentimental, be assured this version has been enlivened with considerable humor and even wit.

Michael Hordern is the candid King who forever is reminding his Chamberlain to speak plain English and stop being such a flatterer. When the King needs to raise money to pay for a great ball, he says he will institute a new tax, "a tax on snobbery."

The effusive Chamberlain quickly begins praising the King's genius, till the King retorts that the new tax will most certainly apply to him.

MARGARET LOCKWOOD is the Stepmother, so mean you just want to hiss every time she appears. In contrast, Annette Crosbie is an atypical Fairy Godmother. She's a very practical, efficient person who frets that she is being run ragged because there are so many people in the world who need her help.

Moreover, she works in ordinary, everyday clothes, no gossamer and sparkles and wands. After all, she insists, that's "a ridiculous way" for a grown woman to dress.

Almost everyone in this movie has a chance to poke fun at some stereotype and play a role for a few laughs. I was a little concerned that my 10-year-old movie companion, who watches plenty of fast-paced television programs, might be bored with some of the longer song and dance routines, but she wasn't. She found them delightful.

"The Slipper and the Rose" is a welcome change of pace for viewers of any age.

'Raggedy Ann' too saccharine

"Raggedy Ann and Andy" (G) is mostly an animated movie with some live acting interspersed. The individual characters and sequences were drawn by different artists resulting in wide variations in style and effect.

Many of the animated sequences, especially at the beginning, have a soft, watercolor-like quality which is just too sweetie-poo. Indeed the first half-hour is slow and saccharine. It lacks the crispness that many children have become accustomed to from television, whether watching commercials or "Sesame Street."

Called a "musical adventure," there is lots of singing in the movie but nothing really memorable or toe-tapping. The story develops around a collection of dolls in a child's room. When a new French doll, Babette, is added, trouble starts.

The pirate doll, who is entranced by Babette, captures her and sails away. Raggedy Ann and Andy pursue in an attempt to rescue Babette. The pace picks up as we follow their adventures. Preschoolers and children in the early primary grades probably will enjoy these episodes.

THEY MEET a gluttonous Greedy in a Taffy Pit and King Koo Koo in Looney Land. But the most endearing character they encounter is a baggy-kneed camel who chases visions of a dazzling camel caravan in the sky.

When they finally overtake the pirate ship, the movie throws its one bold punch. Instead of a weeping Babette and a barbarous Captain, we find the Captain in irons and a fiery Babette driving the crew like Captain Bligh.

You know that can't last. Eventually, everyone returns home and the status quo is restored.
