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## Police dispute over authority bubbling

There's no Capt. Bligh-type in the picture, but mutterings of mutiny are being whispered among Canton's part-time police reservists.

Last week's police commission meeting touched upon one of the conflicts existing in the department. A group of certified officers who hold the rank of patrolman are balking at taking orders from uncertified sergeants.

Fourteen officers on the force received police officer certification diplo-

mas Nov. 19 from the Criminal Justice Institute (CJI).

Although certified reservists receive more pay than uncertified officers—\$3.83 an hour, rather than \$2.30—there is no special rank for certified officers. The only stipulation is that a certified officer must always accompany an uncertified officer in a patrol car.

None of the officers are willing to publicly state that they resent taking orders from older men who have been appointed sergeants. But "off the record," many of them state that they

feel it is unfair and makes a mockery of their academy training.

Sergeants presently receive the same pay as patrolmen.

Police Commander Carl Silvers has recommended to the township board that certified sergeants be paid \$4.25 an hour and that uncertified sergeants be paid \$4 an hour.

Silvers sees no problem in having uncertified sergeants supervising certified patrolmen (and women).

"Some of these people think they walk on water just because they've got that little piece of paper that says they completed certification training," Silvers said. "The uncertified sergeants hold that position because I feel they're more mature."

Don Tillman, one of three uncertified sergeants, worked with the Livonia Police Reserves before joining Canton's force.

Silvers admits that everything isn't rosy in the police department but be-

lives the "discipline problems" will be ironed out.

"There's about three or four individuals making all the noise," Silvers said. "But by and large we've got ourselves a damn good bunch of people."

Silvers is one of the people applying for the advertised open position as full-time Canton police chief. Applications for the job were due May 1. In the next few months applicants will first be screened by the local police commission. Those who pass the review will be referred to the Michigan Municipal League for final selection.

BUT MANY OFFICERS say it is not clear at the present time who has final authority in matters such as employee dismissals. Building Supt. Chuck Thompson still holds the non-uniform post of "director of police" until the new chief is hired. Thompson resigned the post last month but promised to stay on and help "in a coordi-

nating role" until a chief is picked.

In the meantime, some disgruntled officers state privately that they feel "like indians without a chief," and complain that the department lacks a forward direction.

Will the department go full time when the new chief arrives?

Will there be a police millage to expand the hours and number of cops?

Board members are undecided on these questions and that is causing some officers to become uneasy.

One officer accuses Silvers of conveniently weeding out people who challenge his decisions. Criticism of the commander often results in less scheduled patrol hours, is the officer's claim.

SILVERS MAINTAINS that the squawks can be traced to a recent ruling that said certified officers will work the same amount of hours as uncertified officers. This directive was not popular with some officers, Silvers said.

"We have a force of 14 certified officers and about seven active non-certified officers," he said. "The certified

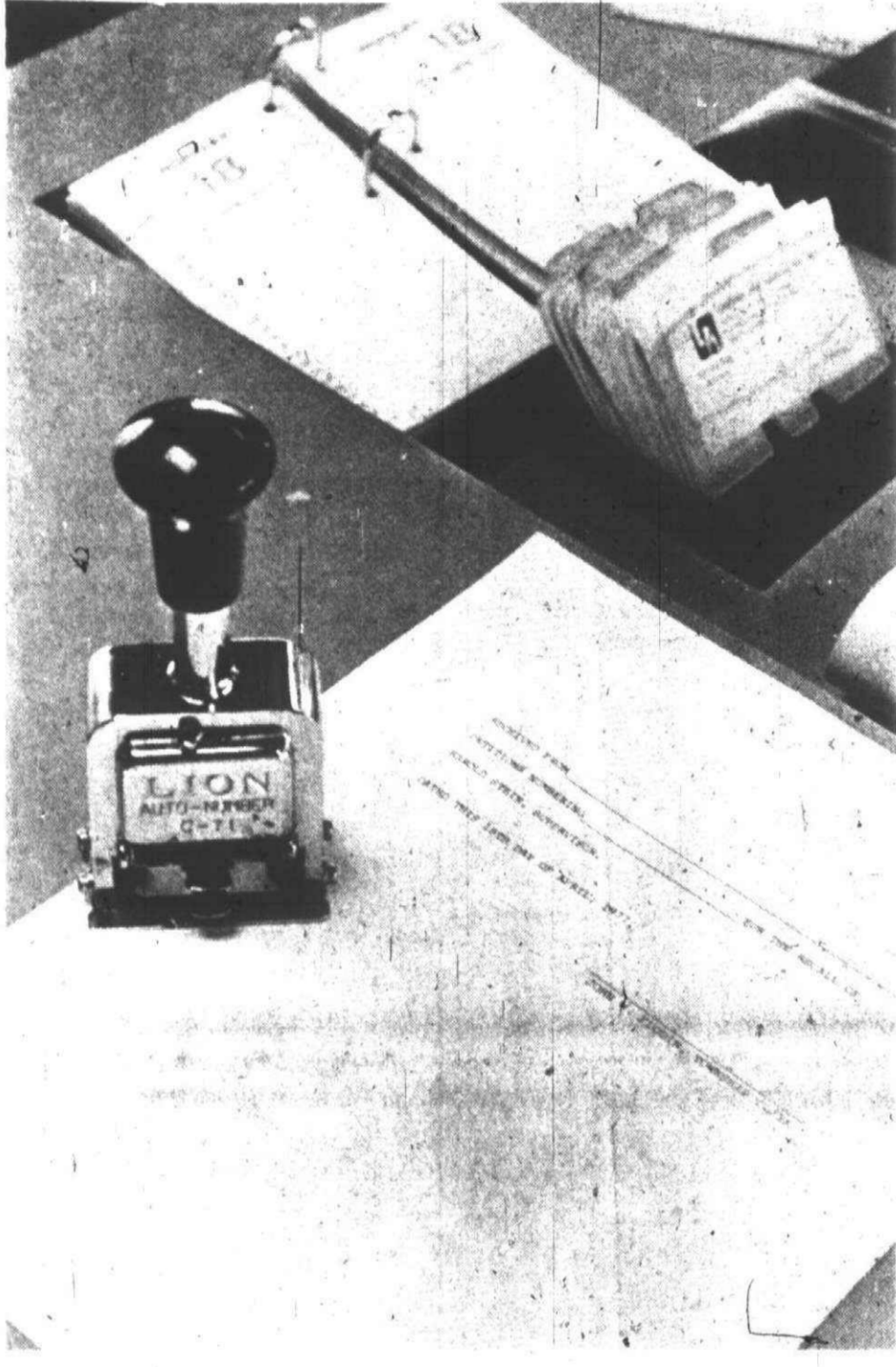
people get about 75 per cent of the assignments because they make up about 75 per cent of our force. The uncertified officers work 25 per cent of the time.

"If I can get this new class of reservists approved by the board I'm hopeful we can work it 50-50. Half of the force will be certified and the other half will be uncertified. And we can work within the budget."

Canton's board of trustees hasn't approved sending any more reserves to CJI to receive full police training even though the cost is underwritten by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. Members of the board state that they cannot guarantee the people jobs.

A new 10-member contingent from Canton will graduate from Schoolcraft College's reserve training council May 3. But the Canton board has not indicated whether these new people will be sworn in as Canton uncertified police reservists.

"They'll probably be the only group at the graduation ceremony who'll graduate in civilian clothes," Silvers said.

## Daley, Bradley recall is started

Linda LaBell has announced that she and her husband Richard are spearheading a drive to add Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Eugene Daley to the recall roster in Canton.

Ms. LaBell explains that because Bradley and Daley ran on Supervisor Harold Stein's political slate, she believes they will carry out the same "pro-growth policy."

Ms. LaBell emphasized that she is not affiliated with any one political faction in the township "but I'd like any support I can get from the (Peter) Bundarin forces, the (Robert) Greenstein forces and even people who worked to elect Stein."

Bundarin, like Greenstein, was an unsuccessful candidate for Stein's supervisor job. He is serving as "legal advisor" for Peter Gabbert's on-going petition drive to recall only Stein and force an election for the supervisor's job.

Gabbert claims he's "doing Stein a favor by trying to get out when he's

over his head." He also disavows any association with Ms. LaBell and her attempt to include Daley and Bradley in a recall.

Gabbert submitted six more recall petitions, in addition to the original 81, Friday afternoon. The Stein recall petitions now carry a total of 1,398 signatures which are being checked for validity by Canton Clerk John Flodin.

A total of 1,251 valid signatures of registered voters must be obtained before a recall election is scheduled.

Both groups have 90 days from the date of the first signature to submit petitions to the clerk. The clerk has 15 days to check each batch of petitions.

If the recall group doesn't have enough signatures when the 90-day period expires and the clerk has checked all the signatures, recall law allows petitioner an additional 10 days to collect signatures for recall.

If a recall election is held and fails, the official may not be the subject of a recall again during that term of office.

## Court orders school to pay and rehire Marts

Attorneys for the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education plan to appeal a court decision ordering the school district to reinstate and award back pay to a special education teacher dismissed three years ago.

Jack Marts, 2350 Denton, Canton Township, was dismissed in May 1973 from Plymouth High School on general grounds of incompetence.

Marts appealed to the state tenure commission in Lansing, which upheld the school board's dismissal action. An appeal was then made to Ingham County Circuit Court, which recently

handed down its decision that the school board erred in firing Marts.

The circuit court ordered Marts reinstated with back pay, but hasn't yet set the amount due.

Attorneys for the school board have asked for a rehearing. If the rehearing request is denied, school attorneys plan to file an appeal with the Michigan Court of Appeals.

A school spokesman estimates that should the appeal be lost, the district would have to pay \$100,000—including

## Who will run Super Sewer?

Supervisors and mayors from western Wayne County, including Westland, Canton, Plymouth and Redford townships, plan to develop a sewer authority as an alternative to a county public works board, which they believe is unrepresentative and threatens future development.

Last month the Wayne County Board of Commissioners removed control of sewers from the Wayne County Road Commission Public Works Department and created the county public works board. The seven-member board is composed of one road commissioner, one drain commissioner and five Wayne county commissioners. Two of the county commissioners are from Detroit, a third is from Hamtramck and a fourth has strong sympathies for Detroit, according to Westland's Mayor Tom Taylor.

"RATES AND COSTS are being determined by a body from Detroit that will turn around and contract with the city on sewer and water," commented Patrick McDonald, Redford Township supervisor. "We are at the whim of a body that in essence represents the City of Detroit."

"Those sewers out here are built with our money and administered through the Wayne County Board of Commissioners. There's no control from the suburbs. We are paying for a system in which we have little voice, if we don't have a majority on that board, then we won't have effective representation, especially since most of the customers live in the suburbs."

"They have a strangle hold on us to pass on increased rates to our people and either accept it or do without," McDonald said.

Sewer rates are expected to triple because Detroit is asking for an emergency increase to meet Environmental Protection Agency requirements which originally were mandated in 1966.

"We don't want Detroit setting the rates for sewer charges in the same way the water rates have been set," said Harold Stein. The Canton Township supervisor is a member of an operating committee which will investigate how the proposed sewer authority should run as well as the legality of the county commissioners' actions. He has a background in private industry as president of a construction firm that handled municipal sewer and water projects.

"We made the decision today (Friday). We're going to proceed on our own. We're contacting bonding attorneys to help us sell bonds," Stein said.

He added that the new authority still will use the county as a lead agent in applying for sewer funds. The authority also would use county engineering, research and technical assistance.

"But we would be the controlling force in construction and have control over rates," Stein continued. "We've got a vehicle now, and we're going to proceed on it."

Redford's McDonald believes the authority may face some problems. "I think consideration of the authority has the possibility for some drawbacks. The most prominent is its ability to bond for construction at the same interest rate as the county. Unless it gets the same rating as the county, it could run into some problems," he explained.

## They were there on Dec. 7, 1941

"We saw the planes at about 8 a.m. They came in stretched out so each one of them had a ship. I saw the Arizona blow up, then there was noise and screams and explosions. Us and the St. Louis were the only ones to get out of the harbor that day."

It was a day that John Luiz will never forget—December 7, 1941. The day Japan attacked Pearl Harbor. He was a crewman aboard the light cruiser, the U.S.S. Detroit.

Luiz said he still thinks about it. But for the most part, it doesn't bother him too much anymore.

Russ Davenport, however, can't make the same claim. More than 35 years later, he still has nightmares.

"I can still see the flames, the explosions, and the guys flying all over the place. I haven't forgotten a single bit of it."

Davenport was one of the 32 men—out of a crew of 1,297—who got off the U.S.S. Oklahoma alive.

"After we got hit, the ship capsized and filled up with water. There were about 600 of us trapped in different parts of the ship. Six other guys were with me, and we swam around in that icy water for 26 hours before they cut us out of the compartment we were in."

EVEN THOUGH BOTH MEN were on different ships and have different

memories to live with, they have at least one thing in common. They are survivors.

They, and more than 200 others from all over the country, spent the weekend at the Plymouth Hilton Hotel "swapping stories, boozing it up and having a good time."

The Hilton was chosen as the scene for the 11th annual convention of the Michigan State Pearl Harbor Survivors Association. This is the first time the group has met in Plymouth.

Although the reunion was sponsored by the Michigan chapter, survivors and their wives came from Ohio, Pennsylvania, Illinois, and California, as well as the Detroit metropolitan area.

"We don't have any set schedule of events," said Hervey Spencer. "The guys come to talk, relax, and see the other guys who were with them. Spencer is the chairman of the Michigan State Survivors."

"On Sunday morning, after breakfast, we have a formal meeting and elect new officers. Other than that everyone is pretty much on their own."

According to Spencer, there are about 7,000 Pearl Harbor survivors in the entire country; 180 of them are in the Michigan chapter.

"Of course not everyone who is a survivor is a member of the association. And not all the members can make it to the reunion. But we always

get a pretty good turnout." Spencer, who lives in Warren, said he chose the Hilton for this year's get-together because he liked the location

## Vote could be June 13

# Smaller bond attempt debated

A slimmed-down version of the \$30 million bond issue defeated by voters April 23 could appear on the Plymouth-Canton Schools' June 13 ballot.

School board members have scheduled a special workshop tonight (Monday) at 7:30 p.m. in the administration building to discuss reducing the amount and scope of the defeated bond issue slated for a possible repeat appearance at the polls.

To place the issue on the June 13 ballot, school board members must approve a revised bonding package by

May 9, submit the issue to the Michigan Board of Education for its approval by May 10, and approve the issue's placement on the ballot by May 16, if the state board give its OK.

**SCHOOL SUPT.** John Hoben said administrators will present four or five revisions of the original bonding package to board members at tonight's workshop.

The proposals could trim the original bond issue's \$30 million price tag to as little as \$6 million and limit its scope to major renovation projects: outfitting schools for start of the year-round school program and con-

struction of one or two elementary schools or a combination of one of the three.

The bond issue which just failed would have cost taxpayers an additional one mill (\$1 per \$1,000 state equalized value). Hoben estimates the cost of a reduced \$6 million issue at about one-third mill.

The revised bond issue, Hoben explained, must show a "40 to 50 per cent change" from the original proposal.

**CONTRARY TO EARLIER** reports that the school board could not place

another bond issue on the ballot within 180 days of the April 23 election. Hoben said he received word from the district's bonding attorney that "a substantially changed" bond issue could be placed on the ballot of the regular June 13 election held to fill one open spot on the school board.

After the landslide defeat of the \$30 million bond package, school board members directed Hoben and other administrators to formulate several revisions of the original bonding proposal. And some board members wondered whether any bond issue should be placed on the June 13 ballot.

# Turn off ignition when idling

Ever since the federal government described the nation's energy situation as a crisis, car owners have become more conscious about following regular auto maintenance procedures.

But few conservation tips have been publicized, other than advising people to tune-up their cars.

One way of conserving fuel, which affects area residents dearly, is turning off the engine when stopped. Driving a car through Plymouth demands several delays at railroad crossings, traffic lights, and even drive-in banks and shopping marts.

While waiting at these stops, many motorists let their engines idle. This wastes fuel.

Bill McNulty, manager of vehicle performance at Chrysler's proving

grounds in Chelsea, says turning off an idling engine is "a definite conservation measure."

"If you want one figure to cover all cars, we say turning off a motor idling for more than 15 seconds saves gasoline," McNulty said. "The time varies depending on the size of the engine—about 5-10 seconds for bigger cars, and 20-25 seconds for smaller cars."

The implications of McNulty's statement are profound. Recognizing the substantial savings, motorists who used to spend up to 10 minutes waiting, with engines running, for a train to pass or to proceed to the drive-in banking window, should now turn their engines off.

**UNFORTUNATELY,** few motorists

follow such a rule of thumb. The only exception should be with the older cars on the road, whose owners fear their cars will not restart.

Train crossings offer an example of consumer neglect of fuel conservation. State laws subject railroad companies to fines when holding up a crossing for more than five minutes. The Chessie System nearly violates the regulation daily, as evidenced by the number of fines assessed by 35th District Court Judge Dunbar Davis.

Despite the long delays, no more than two car engines were turned off during three railroad crossing delays at the Main Street crossing Thursday afternoon.

At the First National Bank of Plymouth on Main, none of the 21 drivers monitored turned off their cars while waiting at the drive-in windows. The average delay at the window was 25 minutes, excluding the wait in line beforehand.

At Cloverdale Farm Dairy on Forest Street, none of the four motorists pulling up at lunchtime on Thursday shut off his engine. The average wait for merchandise was five minutes.

Unlike Ann Arbor and Livonia, traffic signals do not pose a waiting prob-

lem in Plymouth. "Most of our lights are reasonably timed," said Tim Ford, Plymouth chief of police. He added that there was no law against turning off an engine in traffic; should a motorist run into a lengthy stop.

**ONE WAY** to remind motorists to conserve by shutting off their engines would be to post road signs saying so, especially at railroad crossings, where the delay can run as long as 20 minutes.

Chief Ford said no such signs are available to the community from the state; they would have to be made locally. He added that the signs may come about as a result of a severe energy crisis.

If Congress passes the portion of President Carter's energy plan calling for higher taxes on gasoline, car owners will be more willing to conserve because of simple economics, said Paul Nowak, University of Michigan professor in the school of natural resources.

"It has been proven that consumers will begin to seriously conserve when their pocketbooks are affected," Nowak said. "The only answer to insure conservation is a rise in prices."

superintendent. I have an obligation to residents of this school district and will not knowingly throw a thousand dollars out the window."

Hoben added that the school district is merely following state law and board policy. "Our board policy allows students to attend on a tuition-paying basis only on two conditions—if they are moving into the district and their home isn't completed yet, or if the family has moved out and want the student to finish the semester here."

A SPOKESMAN FOR the state board of education has said arrangements could be made for David to attend school in Plymouth without a loss of funds.

Hoben said Tuesday he hoped that could be done. "The problem so far is that Lansing hasn't given us a commitment that the penalty will be waived."

Livonia is willing to give us a

special dispensation on the headcount to accommodate David's desires, but the state hasn't said yet it will allow that. State law is quite clear on this matter and unless Lansing waives the penalty, our school district will lose a full membership or \$1.115 this year.

"All I need is word from the state that David will be accepted as a legal resident of the school district and he can stay here to graduate."

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools is only one of three or four school districts in the tri-county area offering the Indian studies program. The nearest other school district is Detroit. "The only reason the issue has arisen," Hoben added, "is because we offer the program in the first place."

Hoben said the administration's position had been made clear in the past to the American Civil Liberties Union and the American Council of Indian Affairs. "We told them we aren't discriminating, just following state law and board policy."

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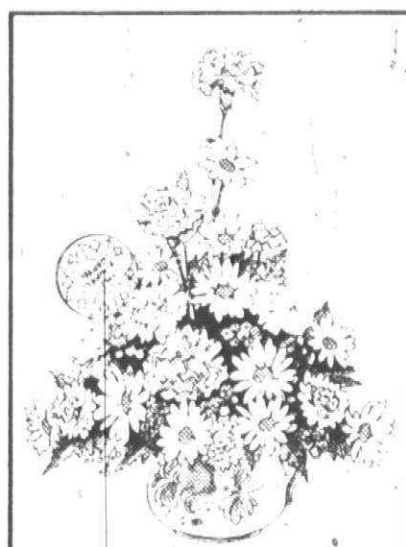
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# Ford doubts worth of gas conservation

President Carter's proposed energy plan has widespread support among Democrats in Congress, but the two gasoline conservation measures—a gasoline tax, and a system of taxes and rebates on the purchase of new cars—are likely to run into trouble on the Hill, said U. S. Rep. William D. Ford.

Congress, however, has no alternatives to offer in its place of those two proposals. Ford, (D-Taylor) whose district includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, and a small part of Livonia.

Ford, who expressed concern about the impact the two Carter-proposed gas-saving measures would have on the local job market, also questioned the benefits of any measures to limit automobile use of gasoline.

"Even if you saved 50 per cent of the gasoline used in private automobiles, it wouldn't make a dent in (total petroleum use)," Ford said.

"Autos account for 30 per cent of the petroleum used in this country, and if you cut that in half it's not very much."

Carter's energy proposal plans to stimulate gas conservation by the dual measures of an extra federal gasoline tax and a system of taxes and rebates on the purchase of new cars.

The extra gasoline tax would be at least five cents a gallon. If gas consumption increases, the tax would be increased. After 1980, the tax would be increased if gasoline consumption does not fall. The tax could reach a maximum of 50 cents a gallon.

Large cars would be subject to a new federal purchase tax under the Carter plan. Supposedly, all the taxes collected from big car purchases would be paid out to the owners of new small cars. The size of the rebate on small cars would be based on how good their mileage performance is. The gas guzzlers would be hit with a bigger tax according to how much gas they used. The big car tax could be as much as \$2,488 by 1985.

If the rebate-extra tax plan doesn't work out and an imbalance occurs between the amount of money taken in and the amount paid out, the Carter plan would be subject to Congressional realignment.

The plan would raise domestic oil

prices to the same figure as foreign oil, as well. Natural gas would rise in price to \$1.75 per thousand cubic feet, and federal price controls would be expanded to include gas, used in the same state where it was produced.

Insulation of existing homes and businesses would be stimulated under the plan by an additional system of tax rebates.

Carter's plan to tax big car buyers and give rebates to purchasers of small cars will face congressional opposition, Ford said, because it makes no allowance for "multiple passenger use."

Previous Congressional considerations of gas saving measures, Ford said, have shown "how unfair it is to use weight to try to determine how fuel efficient a car is. A Ford nine-passenger station wagon weighs the same as a Cadillac Coupe de Ville, but if it's being used in a family with a lot of kids, it's not the same as an insurance salesman driving alone in his Cadillac."

Extra taxes on luxury cars may actually make them more attractive, Ford said, "because they're already luxury items, and now the insurance

salesman's neighbors will know he paid even more for it."

Ford said one of the reasons the gasoline conservation measures proposed by Carter are unfair is that dependency on auto transportation is heavier in some areas of the country than in others.

"My people are totally dependent on the automobile for transportation. There isn't any reliable public transportation system in metro-Detroit."

"It is a matter of necessity. Ownership of a car in New York is a luxury. Garaging it can cost more than your rent. And a worker in Manhattan, especially somebody working at a fixed site like a garment plant, can take the subway. But there aren't any buses going to an automobile plant for our workers."

LOCAL JOBS may suffer as a result of extra taxes on big cars, Ford said, because "if you're saying to a family, 'We're going to charge you another \$1,000 for that car, what you're saying to them is 'Don't buy that car until you absolutely are forced to,' and that's not going to help the new car market."

Rebates used to stimulate small car

buying could hurt the local job market because they could spark renewed imports of foreign cars, "and they don't make Toyotas in my district," Ford said.

Ford said Carter has promised both to make proposals to limit small car importations, and has said to our trade partners, Germany and Japan, that he's not going to do anything to hurt their economies.

"If he can balance all those areas at one time, Bill Ford's going to be the biggest supporter he (Carter's) ever had," Ford said.

ON PETROLEUM CONSERVATION, Ford said, "If you're going to make people drive 55 mph then quit making hula hoops, rubber duckies and women's pantyhose out of petrochemicals."

Carter's credibility will have an impact on the general acceptance of his program, Ford said.

"If the American people believe that a system is fair, it will work. If it's not fair, it won't work."

Ford cited the Vietnam-era opposition to the Selective Service system as an example.

INDUSTRY USE of petroleum should be cut back, Ford said. "I've seen enough to convince me that the unholy kind of relationship between the producers of petroleum and the industry users is wasteful."

Ford said six of the largest coal companies are owned by major oil companies, and "it's to their advantage to substitute their high profit petroleum products for their small profit coal."

"Detroit Edison switched from coal to natural gas when you could already see this problem (energy crisis) coming up," Ford said.

"There isn't any question that (oil companies) do a lot of rigging," Ford said.

CARTER'S SPEECH was impressive, Ford said.

"I think he did a great job. As a matter of fact, at one stage when he came out in this long abstraction on the different ways nuclear fuel is used, I can't even imagine Jerry Ford reading a sentence like that, let alone saying it without notes."

Congressional approval of Carter's package, Ford said, "will be largely a matter of accommodation."

# Canton shopping for Dial-a-Ride authority

The feasibility of establishing a transportation authority to implement a communitywide dial-a-ride program may be undertaken by the Intergovernmental Committee.

The committee meeting Thursday night, decided there was enough merit in the idea to contact each governing body in Plymouth-Canton to determine if there is sufficient interest to proceed to the study stage.

Canton Supervisor Harold Stein plans to forward a letter to the governmental units to ask if there is sufficient initial support of the concept.

The decision to sound out the City of Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth township elected officials was made Thursday night at the Intergovernmental Committee meeting attended by Stein, representing Canton; Lee Fidge, representing Plymouth Township; Norb Battermann, representing the City of Plymouth; Flossie

Tonda, Plymouth-Canton Board of Education; and Kay Williams, Superior Township.

The committee also discussed bicycle pathways and increased community use of school buildings.

THE CITY OF Plymouth earlier had investigated starting a dial-a-ride service but concluded it was economically unfeasible to operate such a system only within the city boundaries.

The city commission, thus, is receptive to exploring the possibility of a shared venture in Plymouth-Canton to establish dial-a-ride.

Stein also is receptive to the idea because Canton has been unsuccessful in working with the Nankin Transit Authority and Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMATA) on establishing the type of transportation system the supervisor wants to institute in the township.

Canton already has bought vans to transport senior citizens, using money from the Federal Community Development Act. But the township would like to see a transit system serve more residents.

"We found it would be cheaper to participate in the Nankin Transportation Authority (NTA) than to form our own," said Stein. "But the NTA voted against letting Canton join. We then contacted the NTA and SEMATA about us contracting with them for service, but neither is interested in that kind of arrangement."

"Maybe what ought to be done is to form a transportation authority for the Plymouth-Canton area, and maybe include such communities as Van Buren and Belleville. That way we'd control the system, but still realize the economic advantages of a transit authority."

Battermann suggested if the governmental units give the green light to explore the idea, the Intergovernmental Committee could then organize a subcommittee or task force to investigate all the steps that would be involved,

the pros and cons, costs, etc.

MRS. FIDGE suggested the committee, at a future meeting look into the idea of building bikeways to run through the communities.

She believes there is a need for bikeways that students could use to ride bicycles to and from school buildings, and added that paths could be built to connect with existing bikeways along Edward Hines Drive and the I-275 expressway.

Mrs. Fidge said SEMATA is receptive to bikeways and federal money might become available in a year or two.

"If we explore the idea now, we could have a jump on other communities when the funds become available."

She also said the committee could, in the future, discuss an idea for greater community use of school buildings. Mrs. Fidge discussed a concept now being considered in Livonia, which is experiencing a declining enrollment and facing a future surplus of school buildings.

An official township proclamation signed by Stein proclaims the week of May 1-7 as "Be Kind to Animal Week" in Canton Township.

"Whereas: The people of Canton are deeply indebted to the Michigan Humane Society for the invaluable contribution they make each year in education our children in humane principles and in promoting a true working spirit of kindness and consideration for animals in the minds and hearts of all our people, and

"Whereas: We recognize the timeless value of the teaching of kindness to our young people through humane education and realize that out of kindness to dumb creatures grow kindness and love for both man and God, and

"Whereas: The week of May 1-7, 1977, has been set aside as the national week observing the philosophy of kindness to animals

NOW, THEREFORE: I, Harold Stein, by virtue of the power vested in me as supervisor of Canton Township, do proclaim and pronounce the week of May 1-7, 1977, as "Be Kind to Animals

Week" and heartily commend to all of our citizens a full participation in all the events related thereto.

back pay, court costs and legal fees for both sides.

ACTION AGAINST Marts began in 1972, and, after eight months' consideration, the school board voted to dismiss Marts.

Since the dismissal, Marts has been operating a farm and riding school in Canton Township where he runs a summer camp program for deaf, spe-

cial education and normal youngsters. During his time off, Marts became an unsuccessful candidate for Canton Township supervisor, running against Robert Greenstein.

Attorneys for the school district had until today (Monday) to file a formal appeal, but the court was expected to grant them an extension on the filing deadline.

The back pay award, to be set by the court, may be \$30,000-\$40,000 including interest.

lems," he explained. "If this authority is established, the rates will not necessarily go down. The way the system is set up now, we are somewhat dependent on the City of Detroit."

The Western Wayne County Supervisors and Mayors group decided to form the sewer authority after an appeal Thursday by Westland's Taylor asking the board of commissioners to change the membership of the public works board was rejected by a 14-10 vote.

"The first time a motion was made

to reconsider, there were only four votes for it," he said. "There also are legal questions about what the board of commissioners did because they didn't hold any public hearings before they made the decision."

"THEY MAY HAVE violated the consumer laws, and there's a good likelihood they violated the state's sunshine laws because there was no input ahead of the decision," added Taylor. "I was allowed to speak only on the process of making appointments to the board, not on the decision (to create the public works board) itself."

Plymouth City Commissioner Norb Batterman also has proposed that

the mayors and supervisors association have each governmental unit approve a resolution stating their positions and forward them to the state.

The state allowed Washtenaw County to pull out of the super sew project because of political pressure, and might force Wayne County to improve representation on its public works board.

Stein, Batterman and Lee Fidge of Plymouth Township all agreed at a recent Intergovernmental Committee meeting that western Wayne suburbs are being treated like "second class citizens."

"We're absolutely paranoid," said Westland's Taylor. "The county board of commissioners never has demonstrated the ability to run anything—look at the jail and Wayne County General Hospital

open, and that growth is projected to continue.

The City of Plymouth will endorse the super sewer concept for other communities, but will in no way participate financially because the city has adequate sewer capacity for years to come.

"In essence, the water and sewer board has a monopoly on service in this area now. You could almost call it more of utility control than anything else because we all need water and sewers to live, and they are controlling our supply of it," said McDonald.

## Court orders school to pay and rehire Marts

Attorneys for the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education plan to appeal a court decision ordering the school district to reinstate and award back pay to a special education teacher dismissed three years ago.

Jack Marts, 2350 Denton, Canton Township, was dismissed in May 1973 from Plymouth High School on general grounds of incompetence.

Marts appealed to the state tenure commission in Lansing, which upheld the school board's dismissal action. An appeal was then made to Ingham County Circuit Court, which recently handed down its decision that the school board erred in firing Marts.

The circuit court ordered Marts reinstated with back pay, but hasn't yet set the amount due.

Attorneys for the school board have asked for a rehearing. If the rehearing request is denied, school attorneys plan to file an appeal with the Michigan Court of Appeals.

A school spokesman estimates that

should the appeal be lost, the district would have to pay \$100,000—including back pay, court costs and legal fees for both sides.

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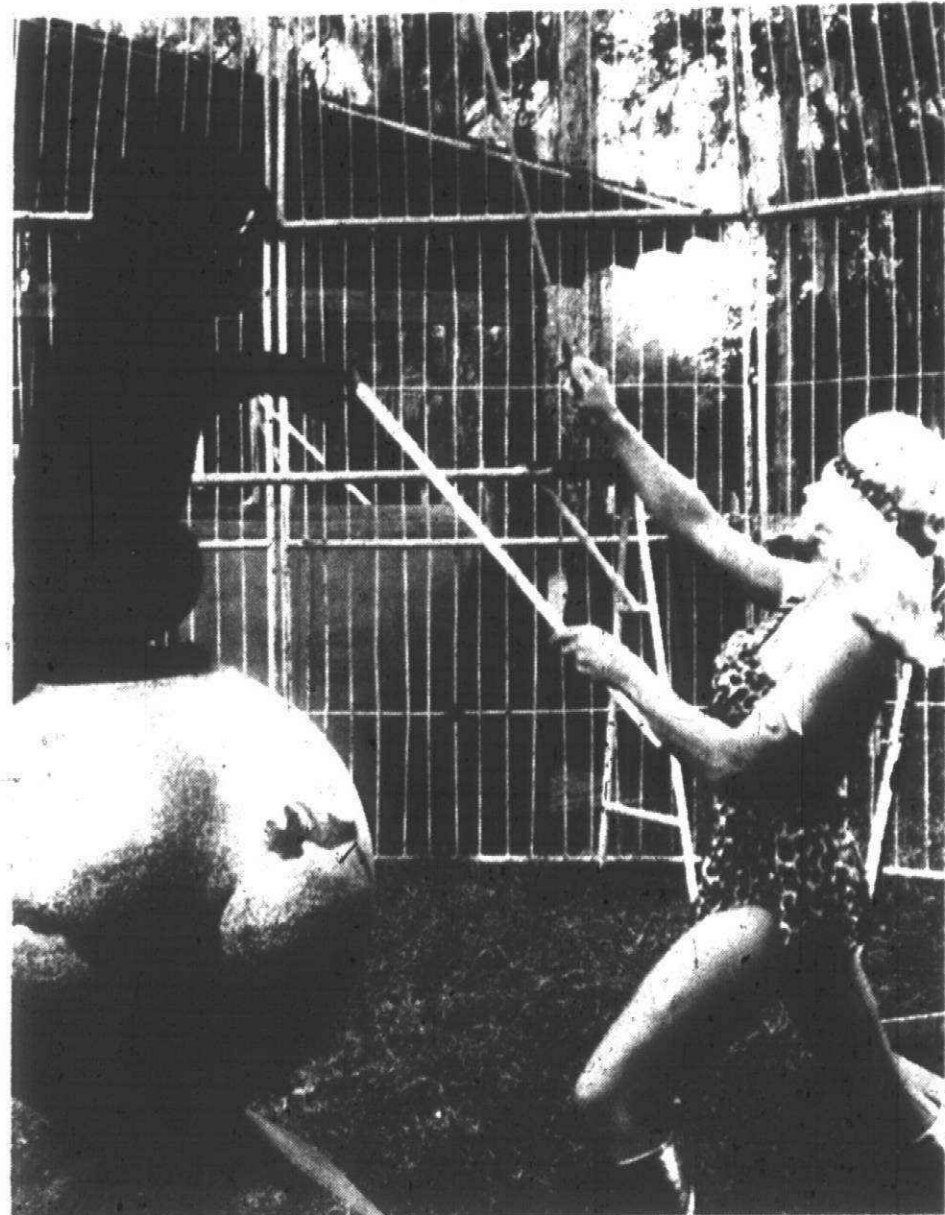

est Street, none of the four motorists pulling up at lunchtime on Thursday shut off his engine. The average wait for merchandise was five minutes.

Unlike Ann Arbor and Livonia, traffic signals do not pose a waiting problem in Plymouth. "Most of our lights are reasonably timed," said Tim Ford, Plymouth chief of police. He added that there was no law against turning off an engine in traffic, should a motorist run into a lengthy stop.

**ONE WAY** to remind motorists to conserve by shutting off their engines would be to post road signs saying so, especially at railroad crossings, where the delay can run as long as 20 minutes.

## Open forum on rentals

The Plymouth Housing Commission has scheduled an open forum at 7:30 p.m. May 4 in the community room of Tonquish Creek Manor, 116 Sheridan, Plymouth, to discuss with landlords the Section 8 existing housing assistance payment program.

The housing commission has made application for 35 units of rent subsidy. While the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approval hasn't been received yet, the housing commission felt it is important to explain the program to area landlords in order to encourage their participation.

A HUD representative will be available to explain the program and answer questions. All City of Plymouth landlords are urged to attend.

If Congress passes the portion of President Carter's energy plan calling for higher taxes on gasoline, car owners will be more willing to conserve because of simple economics, said Paul Nowak, University of Michigan professor in the school of natural resources.

"It has been proven that consumers will begin to seriously conserve when their pocketbooks are affected," Nowak said. "The only answer to insure conservation is a rise in prices."

It may not be too long ago before the "Seven Sisters" the famous smoke stacks of the Detroit Edison Company on Detroit's east side will come back on the scene.

The ecologists claimed they were one of the worst health hazards in Detroit. But with the return of coal as fuel, who knows? Maybe there will be a change of feeling. But it is enough to confuse anyone.

Confusing? If long hair was so dangerous and one had to wear a net a short time ago, why isn't it just as unhealthy today? No wonder the old gent is confused.

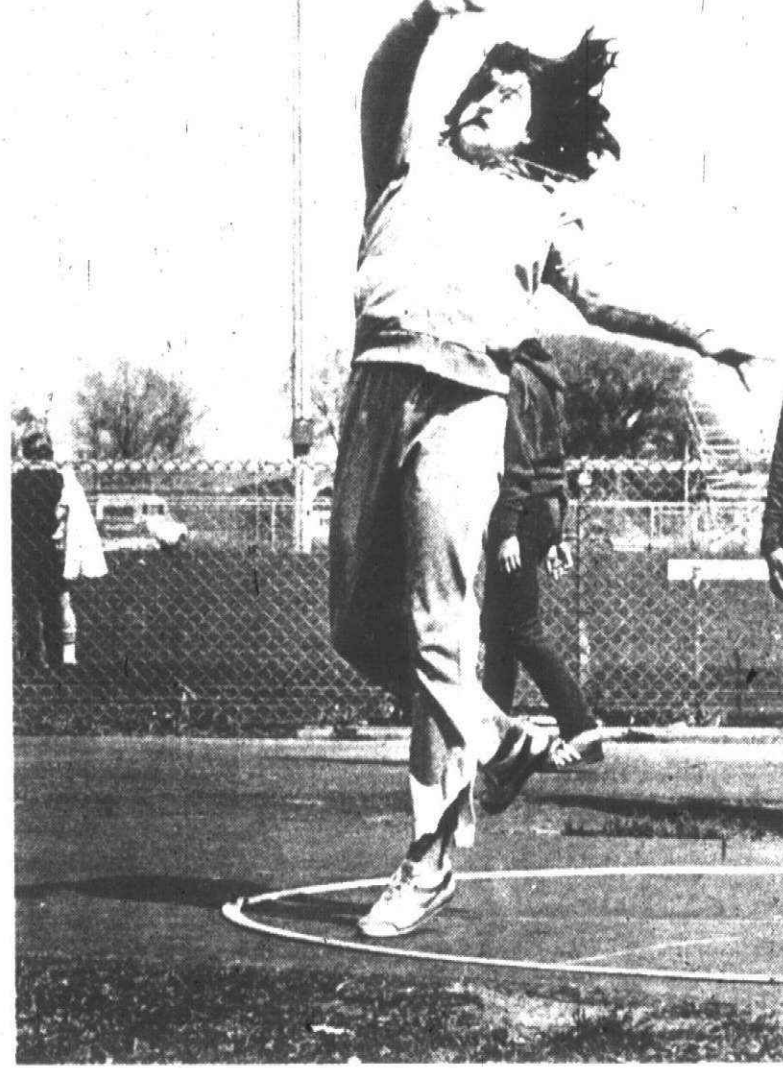
Nidsgorski, Tom Chiatialis and Bradburn also added two hits. Chiatialis punched a solo homer to lead off the third inning.

Lynne Bigelow placed second in the hurdles with a run of 16.2.

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
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# In The Pocket

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO REFERENDUM ON BECOMING A CHARTER TOWNSHIP

Official information has been received from the Secretary of State of the State of Michigan, indicating that the Township of Plymouth, has attained a population of 5,000 or more. This being the case, the Township Board has the right to exercise one of three options concerning township status as a charter township under the provisions of Act 90 of 1976.

- (1) Adopt, by majority vote, a resolution opposed to incorporation.
- (2) Adopt, by majority vote, a resolution of intent to approve incorporation.
- (3) Adopt, by majority vote, a resolution to place before electorate the question of incorporation at the next regular or special township election.

In the event option (2) is adopted by the township board, the citizens of the township have the option to file a "Right to Referendum Petition." This petition must be filed within the 60 days which must lapse between the passage of a resolution of intent to incorporate and the final passage of the resolution to incorporate as a charter township.

The petition will follow, in general form, the nominating petition form as prescribed in the Michigan Election Law, Section 168.544(c), and in the heading will indicate "disagreement of intent to incorporate as a charter township." The petition must be signed by not less than 10% of the registered voters of the township based on the vote cast for all candidates for supervisor at the last election at which a supervisor was elected.

If the petition is successful, the question of incorporation will be placed on the ballot at the next general township or special township election.

**CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON DANGEROUS BUILDINGS ORDINANCE**

An Ordinance to secure the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents and property owners of the Charter Township of Canton, County of Wayne, Michigan, by regulations of dangerous buildings injurious to life or health; to provide for the means by way of hearings for the making safe or demolition of such dangerous buildings; to provide for the appointment of a hearing officer; to provide penalties for the violation of said Ordinance; to provide for assessment of the cost of said making safe or demolition of dangerous buildings; and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON ORDAINS:

SECTION NO. 1

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Charter Township of Canton Dangerous Buildings Ordinance.

SECTION NO. 2

As used in this Ordinance, the term "dangerous building" means any building or structure, residential or otherwise, which has any of the following defects or is in any of the following conditions:

(A) Whenever any door, aisle, passageway, stairway or other means of ingress or egress does not conform to the approved fire code of the Charter Township of Canton it shall be considered that such building does not meet the requirements of this Ordinance.

(B) Whenever any portion has been damaged by fire, wind, flood, or by any other cause in such a manner that the structural strength or stability is appreciably less than it was before such catastrophe and is less than the minimum requirements of the Building Code of the Charter Township of Canton for a new building or similar structure, propose or location.

(C) Whenever any portion or member or appurtenance is likely to fall or to become detached or dislodged, or to collapse and thereby injure persons or damage property.

(D) Whenever any portion has settled to such an extent that walls or other structural portions have materially less resistance to winds than is required in the case of new construction by the Building Code of the Charter Township of Canton.

(E) Whenever the building or structure or any part, because of dilapidation, deterioration, decay, faulty construction, or because of the removal or movement of some portion of the ground necessary for the purpose of supporting such building or portion thereof, or for other reason, is likely to partially or completely collapse or some portion of the foundation or underpinning is likely to fall or give way.

(F) Whenever for any reason whatsoever the building or structure or any portion is manifestly unsafe for the purpose for which it is used.

(G) When the building or structure has been so damaged by fire, wind, or flood, or has become so dilapidated or deteriorated as to become an attractive nuisance to children who might play therein to their danger, or as to afford a harbor for vagrants, criminals or immoral persons, or as to enable persons to resort thereto for the purpose of committing a nuisance or unlawful or immoral acts.

(H) Whenever a building or structure, because of dilapidation, decay, damage, or faulty construction or arrangement or otherwise, is unsanitary or unfit for human habitation or is in a condition that is likely to cause sickness or disease when so determined by the health officer, or is likely to work injury to the health, safety or general welfare of those living or working within.

(I) Whenever any building becomes vacant, dilapidated and open at door or window, leaving the interior of the building exposed to the elements or accessible to entrance by trespassers.

SECTION NO. 3

It shall be unlawful for any owner or agent thereof to keep or maintain any building or part thereof which is a dangerous building as defined in this Ordinance.

SECTION NO. 4

When the whole or any part of any building or structure is found to be in dangerous condition the Township Building Inspector shall issue a notice of the dangerous condition. The notice shall specify the time and place of a hearing on the condition of the building or structure at which time and place the person to whom the notice is directed shall have the opportunity to show cause, if any there be, why the said building or structure should not be ordered demolished or otherwise made safe. All such notices shall be in writing and at least ten days prior to the date of said hearing notified by certified mail, return receipt requested, to any party in interest as shown by the most recent tax roll, and to the title holder of record according to the Register of Deeds for the County of Wayne, and in addition thereto, shall be posted conspicuously upon the building or structure.

SECTION NO. 5

(A) A hearing officer shall be appointed by the Township Supervisor to serve at the pleasure of the Supervisor.

(B) The Building Inspector shall file a copy of the notice of the dangerous condition of any building with the hearing officer.

(C) At any hearing held, the hearing officer shall take testimony of the Building Inspector, the owner of the property, and any other interested party. Upon the taking of such testimony, the hearing officer shall render his decision either closing the proceedings or ordering the building to be demolished or otherwise made safe.

(D) If it is determined by the hearing officer that the building or structure should be demolished or otherwise made safe, he shall so order, fixing a time in the order for the owner or party in interest to comply therewith.

(E) If the owner or party in interest fails to appear or neglects or refuses to comply with the order, the hearing officer shall file a report of his findings and a copy of his order with the Charter Township of Canton Board of Trustees and request that the necessary action be taken to demolish or otherwise make safe the building or structure. A copy of such findings and order of the hearing officer shall be served on the owner or party in interest in the manner prescribed in Section No. 4.

SECTION NO. 6

Upon receiving the findings and order of the hearing officer the Charter Township of Canton Board of Trustees shall fix a date for hearing, reviewing the findings and order of the hearing officer and shall give notice to the owner or party in interest in the manner prescribed in Section No. 4 of the time and place of the hearing. At the hearing, the owner or party in interest shall be given the opportunity to show cause why the building should not be demolished or otherwise made safe and the Township Board of Trustees shall either approve, disapprove or modify the order for demolition or making safe of the building or structure.

SECTION NO. 7

In the event of the failure or refusal of the owner or party in interest to comply with the decision of the Charter Township of Canton Board of Trustees, the Township Board may, in its discretion, contract for the demolition or making safe of the dangerous building. The cost of the demolition or making the building safe shall be a lien against the real property and shall be reported to the assessing officer of the Township who shall assess the cost against the property on which the building or structure is located. The owner or party in interest in whose name the property appears upon the last local tax assessment records of the Township shall be notified of the amount of such cost by first class mail at the address shown on the records. If he fails to pay the same within thirty days after mailing by the assessor of the notice of the amount thereof, the assessor shall add the same to the next tax roll of the Charter Township of Canton and the same shall be collected in the same manner in all respects as provided by law for the collection of taxes by the Township.

SECTION NO. 8

An owner or party in interest aggrieved by any final decision of the Charter Township of Canton Board of Trustees may appeal the decision or order to the Circuit Court for the County of Wayne by filing a petition for an order of superintending control within twenty days from the date of such decision.

SECTION NO. 9

This Ordinance repeals all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith.

SECTION NO. 10

This Ordinance shall take effect on the 5th day of April, 1977.

WHEREAS, the defense of the Employer and of the League to any such litigation can most economically and feasibly be carried out as a unitary defense,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Employer does hereby agree with the Michigan Municipal League as follows:

(1) If it utilizes the personnel selection or other personnel services of the League such utilization shall be subject to the provisions of this resolution:

(2) If a complaint, proceeding or suit is brought or claim is made based on a charge of unfair or illegal employment practices against the Employer or the League or both, or against any employee of the League by one or more persons, which complaints, proceeding, suit or claim is in any way related to the testing contemplated by or carried out under this agreement, the Employer will defend the League and its employees at no expense to the League or its employees and in the event damages or costs are awarded against the League or any employee of the League, the Employer will pay the same when award or judgment become final. The League will cooperate with the Employer as the Employer may require in its defense of any proceeding or suit. League expenses, including employee time necessarily expended in connection therewith or in attending any court or tribunal or administrative agency at the request of the Employer, shall be paid by the Employer to the League upon submission of a bill for such expenses. Reimbursement for staff time shall only be that time required over that normally required in processing an uncontested examination. If any such litigation does not name the League as a party to the action but the employees of the League are required to expend time in assisting the Employer in the defense of the litigation or in answering official interrogatories or depositions duly served upon it by other parties to such action, the Employer will pay the same rates to the League for employees' time expended in connection therewith as are agreed to by the Employer for the personnel services of the League. This clause shall be applicable even if such proceeding or suit is groundless, false or fraudulent, but the Employer may make such investigation, negotiation and settlement of any claim or suit as is deemed expedient.

## Rocks improve against Dearborn

# 'Everyone who finishes is a winner'

Five winners of the Boston Marathon run more often in the environs of the Livonia Family Y.

If that statement seems extravagant, it's explained in a comment by Charlene Vetterello, who ran the famed course along with her husband, Sangelo, Dave Richards of Plymouth, George Lemieux of Livonia and Phyllis Braun of Livonia.

"Everyone who finishes is a winner," she said. "You know you can't come in first, but you try to better your own time. And even if you don't do that, if you get to the end of the course, you're still a winner."

Finish this quintet did, all 26 miles, 385 yards of the course, a mecca for all runners in the world.

"The 26 miles isn't too bad, it's those 385 yards that get you," quipped Richards.

"Not me," came back Vetterello. "I run those first."

The banter was typical of the spirit of the "Boston Five"—two women who teach physical fitness classes at the Y and three engineers employed by the Ford Motor Co.

They all decided to run the marathon, they said, but they didn't do it

as a group. "It's a very individual thing," they agreed.

Still, laughed Vetterello, "with all those runners, when I stopped, I heard my name called, and there was George right behind me."

**THE BOSTON** Marathon, these dedicated runners said, takes tremendous preparation and is a source of tremendous enjoyment and lifelong pride.

For one thing, only those who qualify by running another marathon can enter. Richards, running for the fourth time, LeMieux, on his second marathon, and the other three going for the first time, qualified by running either the Motor City Marathon—five times around Belle Isle or the Heart Watchers at Toledo.

"They are flat courses; they don't compare at all with the hills around Boston," Mrs. Vetterello said.

And these races in themselves take preparations.

"You start first by jogging," Richards said. "When you get to the point where you are jogging 30 or 40 miles a week, you can consider training for a marathon."

The next step is to increase the time—Richards was putting in up to

100 miles a week just before Boston. This means two or three workouts a day, the five said, and by this time, it's running rather than jogging. The difference is that runners do a mile in eight minutes or less.

"When you start training for a marathon, at first you hardly even admit it to yourself," Richards said. "You're always afraid you won't make it."

Richards doesn't mind admitting that he didn't make it the first time he ran a marathon, but he's completed eight in a row since then.

**WITH THE TRAINING** completed, the running at Boston is like no other experience in the world, this group agreed.

Each runner entered has a number, they explained, and the list of numbers is published in Boston newspapers. Those who line the marathon course have checked numbers and names.

"So as you run, you hear people on both sides cheering for you, pulling you on, calling your name," Charlene Vetterello said.

"And there's a great satisfaction in doing the running if there has been the right kind of training," added Lemieux. "You just go cruising along, like perpetual motion."

The Boston Marathon is "the big high" to runners, the five said, and Mrs. Vetterello added, "You hear people talking about the year they ran the Boston—if they do it once and then something happens so they can't run again, they've had that big experience."

All five agreed they would not favor proposals that have been made to limit the field. "That would take away the incentive for so many who dream of some day running the Boston," Vetterello said.

**THESE MARATHON** runners train all year. "In the winter, you go a little slower and you have to be careful not to slip on the ice and fall," and they also participate regularly in races.

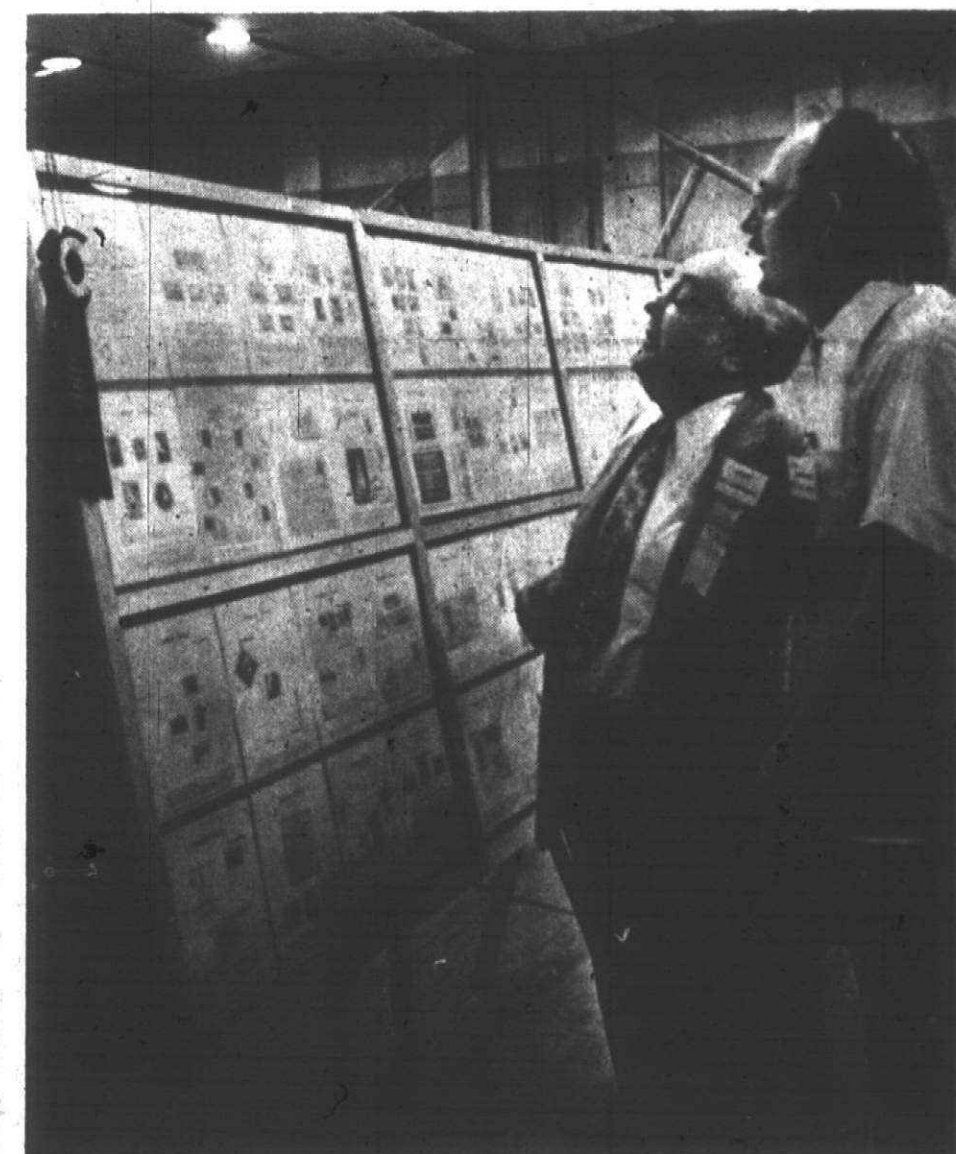

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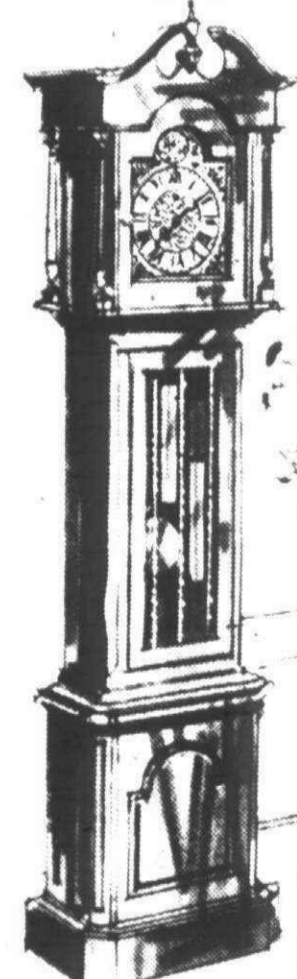
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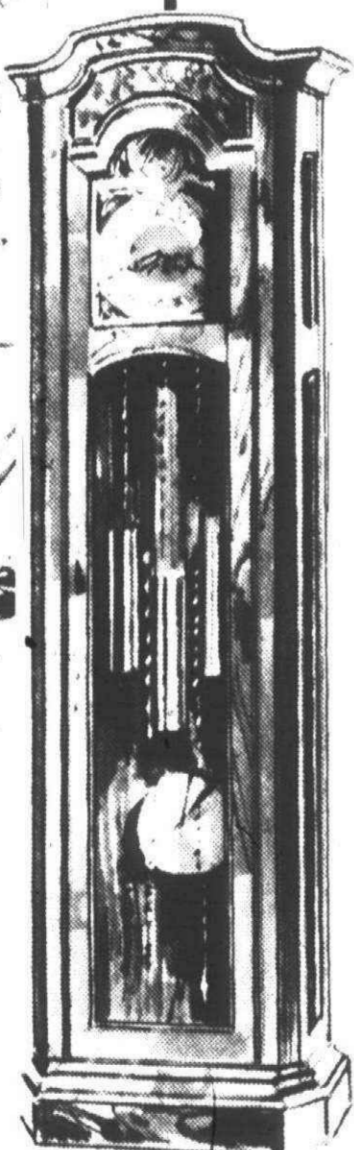
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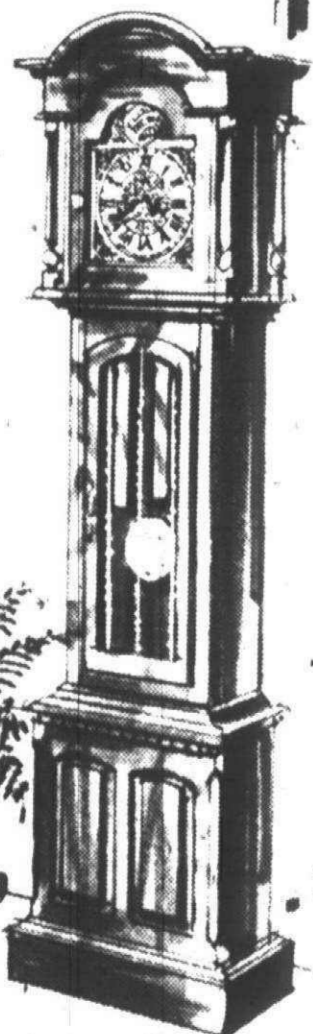


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## Laura Hastings earns tennis honor

## 'Late Show' worth viewing

The media has given us all manner of detectives: Thin, fat, cerebral, muscular, seedy, slick. In "The Late Show" (PG), we have yet another variant of the type—the over-the-hill private eye.

Art Carney plays Ira Wells. He's so far over the hill he can't remember what the top looks like. He's got an active ulcer, a gimpy leg and a hearing aid. He wears cheap, shiny suits; lives in a shabby rented room and is fiercely independent.

Ira Wells is Philip Marlowe on Social Security. Still using the old lingo, Ira calls women "dollies." He wonders why they don't wear dresses anymore, and he clings to his unfashionable but straight code of ethics.

Ira is prodded out of his dreary retirement when an old buddy, Harry Regan, checks out of his life and a kooky woman, Margo, checks in. Loyal Ira wants to find out who killed Harry (played by Howard Duff in a quick, blood-spurting appearance).

MARGO (LILY TOMLIN) wants to recover her stolen cat. Bill Macy (Walter of the "Maude" show) is the seedy intermediary who brings Ira and Margo together. What does the missing cat have to do with Harry's murder? A lot.

Don't bother trying to figure it out though. The plot has more twists and turns than a giant slalom run. Just when you think you're on the right track, there's another change of direction.

The plot may be confusing, but it doesn't matter. One thing you don't lose sight of is the Los Angeles setting. The vulgar, stuccoed elegance and sleazy stores on the strip are all part of the same L.A. decadence.

The creativity in the selection of settings and props reaches new heights in the choice of wardrobe. If Ira takes the prize for the shiniest suits, Bill Macy gets it for the loudest, baggiest pants and Margo gets it for the weirdest assemblage of clothes. Margo looks like a gypsy fortune teller who inherited \$150 worth of remnants from a cut-rate upholstery shop.

Tomlin, as Margo, not only wears the most outrageous clothes, but she delivers all the best lines—dozens of dead pan zingers that cut over, under and through the conversations.

"THE LATE SHOW" is a fun movie. Director Robert Benton has been able to meld suspense and comedy in a manner not usually found outside the Hitchcock films.

A subjective camera tracks through blood-spattered rooms to a closed shower curtain while the viewers bite their nails. Margo eludes a vicious killer in a zany car chase over suburban lawns. A big-time fence sounds like a TV commercial as he tries to bribe Ira with shirts, electronic gadgets and a car.

He lives among his stolen property like a 20th century King Midas. Everything he touches turns into a brand name. Harry does get surprisingly physical in one scene when he beats up a thoroughly deserving person, the fence's handyman-bodyguard, John Considine plays the part, and if they gave Academy Awards for smirking, he would get the honors.

The movie has its flaws. Maybe Ira wouldn't be that muscular or foolhardy and maybe the comedy sometimes pulls against the melodrama. But it all has that shadowy charm of something seen through an old lamp with a fringed, yellow shade.

In the light of day, it's gum under the table, cracked walls, peeling paint and an old guy with a bad ulcer.

**TAX TIP IF YOU SELL FOR A PROFIT**

Normally, taxpayers who sell their homes for a substantial profit face a heavy tax load, but this burden can be avoided. If you buy another home that costs as much or more than the sales price of the old one, within a specified time, the profit from the sale is not included in your taxable income.

The second home must be bought and occupied within a period ending 18 months after the sale. (This is a new change, previous time period was one year). A 2-year period is permitted when building a new home. This tax deferral applies only to the sale of a residence which is the family's main residence.

When figuring the amount of gain for which tax may be postponed you may deduct for "fix-up" expenses if they were accomplished within 90 days prior to the sale, and paid for no later than 30 days after the sale. Check with your accountant or the IRS on details if this matter affects you. It could be well worth your while.
