## Stein on choppers: Buy now-fly later

"What if I brought up this idea six months ago? They'd really have thought I was nuts. Now they say I'm half nuts. Pretty soon, if I keep at it, they'll only think I'm one-quarter or one-eighth nuts."

The speaker is Canton Supervisor Harold Stein and his subject is the recently authorized move to purchase three surplus helicopters from the military when they become available. Stein says he and Barney Stutesman, owner of Canton's Hi-Lift Helicopter Co., will travel to Tucson, Ariz., when he receives notice that the copters are available for purchase.

The helicopters are being offered to local governments for \$500 each through a joint program of the Pentagon and the federal Civil Defense department.

But three of Canton's seven board members oppose adding an air force to Canton's one-year-old police department. Trustee Eugene Daley for one, believes the cost of training pilots and helicopter maintenance outweighs any potential benefit in terms of police protection. Daley also works as a lieutenant in the Wayne County Sheriff's Department—which already has a helicopter unit—but says that has nothing to do with his decision.

"IF YOU'RE on welfare and somebody offers you a Cadillac, that still doesn't mean you can afford it," Daley has said.

Trustee Lynne Goldsmith said she didn't think helicopters were a pressing priority in the police department when she voted with Daley against the proposal. Stein received authorization for the \$1,500 purchase from Clerk John Flodin, Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Brian Schwall.

Trustee Robert Myers, who was absent when the 4-2 vote was taken, says he thinks "Canton should buy them but not fly them."

"If we're going to fly them with a special aviation unit, then I'd say we have bigger priorities. But if Stein

wants to buy them now and store them, I'd say it's a good idea. We can sell them in five years at a profit if we don't use them. And we could store them at a building we own at Lilley and Van Born."

In response to questions about whether Canton can support an aviation unit, Supervisor Stein said the copters could patrol five communities in the Central Dispatch System which includes Belleville, Van Buren, Sumpster, Huron and Canton townships.

NONE OF THE other communities in the system have been notified of Canton's copter plans, Stein said.

"But people are making cost a topic when we're not even certain we'll get these helicopters."

Stein has enlisted the aid of Stutesman of Hi-Lift Helicopters to evaluate the condition of the helicopters before any purchase is made. Stutesman, a Canton businessman, thinks the idea has merit.

"This way we use helicopters again rather than selling them for so many cents a pound as scrap," Stutesman said.

In his business, Stutesman said, he has had the opportunity to observe recycled surplus military copters.

"They can be in all kinds of shape," Stutesman said. "That's why anyone contemplating something of this nature should go and inspect the available equipment. Otherwise, you're buying a pig in a poke. And you don't buy helicopters by looking at a spec sheet. Some arrive at the boneyard in flying condition, some have major components missing."

STUTESMAN SAID he has made "no commitments" for helicopter maintenance or storage with the township but Stein has indicated that the township would probably store the helicopters at Stutesman's Mettetal Airport headquarters until the police department is ready to use the equipment.

Helicopter pilots employed by the

cities of Warren, Flint and Detroit have been trained by Stutesman at Hi-Lift. Stutesman said it is too early to put a price on what he would charge Canton to train some of its police officers as pilots.

Pt. Mike Geldmacher, a helicopter pilot with the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, said at the present time Canton doesn't have a crime problem which warrants buying three helicopters.

"I don't want to sound vindictive, and if they get their program off the ground I wish them best of luck; but right now we can handle all they need in the way of helicopter observation."

"The call for helicopters is not that great in Canton. It wouldn't be cost-effective to operate a helicopter patrol in Canton. To make helicopters cost-effective, you should be making a felony arrest every 10 to 15 hours or recover maybe two or three stolen cars a day."

GELDMACHER ADMITTED that the aviation unit of the county sheriff's department faces a tough going when the next budget is prepared.

"We could be going down here shortly," he said. "We're trying to get contracts with the various communities to stay alive."

Geldmacher said it cost the county \$13,000 to train each of its four pilots who carry a commercial license. Mechanical costs average \$57 an hour, he added.

The sheriff's department rents two helicopters from Hughes Tool Co. for \$1,200 per month.

This year's budget allocated \$252,000 for the county aviation unit. Canton's proposed budget for the entire police department in 1978 is \$420,000.

## Farmers protest 2 mills for police

The average taxpayer in Canton Township will pay an additional \$50 in taxes this year to support a fulltime police department.

Township board members Tuesday set the police tax levy at two mills (\$2 per \$1,000 state equalized value)—which means a \$450,000 budget for the Canton Police Department and \$50 in additional taxes for owners of \$50,000 homes.

Although board members pledged some months ago to levy a maximum two mills for police in 1977, Trustees Lynne Goldsmith and Robert Myers voted against the two-mill tax levy.

Myers refused to approve any millage for police until a line item budget for the department is approved. Goldsmith moved to set the tax rate at 1½ mills and allocate \$113,000 in the township's general fund for police. The combination would bring revenues for the police department up to \$450,000—the same amount generated by two mills.

GOLDSMITH'S MOTION failed for lack of support after deputy treasurer Mike Gorman said the move would leave other township departments shortchanged.

Although the township's 1977 operating budget sets \$113,000 aside for the new part-time Canton Police Department, Gorman says the proposed 1978 operating budget does not address itself to police needs.

The \$113,000 allocated for police last year has been disbursed among other departments in the proposed \$1.2 million budget, Gorman said. Those funds are needed, Gorman said, for other departments to finance the salaries of additional employees and offset the increased costs of existing salaries and supplies.

Under Goldsmith's proposal, the only \$37.50 for police next year instead of the \$50 necessitated by a two-mill tax levy.

In Police Chief Walter MacGregor's proposed \$450,000 police budget, the two mills will finance salaries of a full-time police chief, detective, three sergeants, 10 patrolmen and secretary. The proposed budget also covers salaries for part-time reserves, supplies, transportation costs, utilities and other items.

According to Gorman, \$75,000 may

be taken from the general fund to convert the present township hall on Geddes to a police station once the new township hall is complete. Gorman expects federal revenue sharing funds to cover the estimated \$25,000 needed to purchase five new police cars.

Township board members are expected to review MacGregor's proposed budget for the police department within the next few weeks.

ALTHOUGH CANTON voters narrowly approved a special assessment for full-time police on Aug. 27, most residents who attended a two-hour public hearing on the police millage Tuesday objected to the additional tax.

Residents of the township's rural areas said a fulltime Canton Police Department would not benefit them.

"Am I not paying triple indemnity?" asked Alfred (Fritz) Lobbestael, a farmer who lives on Geddes Road. "I'm paying for the State Police, the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and now for a full-time Canton Police Department."

"I don't think the Canton police will be available any more quickly than the state police or the sheriff. I think people in the western half of the township are being saddled with this."

Trustee Brian Schwall compared the need to finance police protection with the need to finance education.

"I agree that some people receive more benefits from public education and likewise from police protection," he said. "But we still have to pay for both of them."

But another resident echoed Lobbestael's point of view.

"People moved into subdivisions here, and they want police protection. I don't see why people in the western half of the township have to foot the bill."

Although most of the residents at Tuesday's meeting took a stand against the police millage, Clerk John Flodin noted past township board meetings when residents demanded a full-time police department.

"Other nights, this room was filled with people very serious about their demands for a full-time department," Flodin said. "Now that it's down to the nitty-gritty and questions of money are before us, these people have chosen not to show up."

## Minimum graduation requirements raised

New minimum requirements for graduation from high school were approved 6-0 Monday night by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Although the vote was unanimous, the new standards weren't welcomed enthusiastically by all trustees.

Trustees Steve Harper, Joe Gray and Dick Arlen felt the standards were inadequate, but voted to approve because they represented a "starting point" towards more meaningful requirements.

Marda Benson, former trustee speaking as a citizen, urged the board to delay action on new standards until the district's curriculum goals were

## Air Force cancels the search for lost plane

The missing airplane that flew out of Mettetal Airport in Canton Township with four auto executives aboard on Sept. 17 is believed to have crashed into Lake Michigan.

"We've exhausted all our resources in making a thorough check of the land between Plymouth and Kenosha, Wis.," said a spokesman for the U.S. Air Force Search and Rescue Center at Scott Air Force Base, Ill.

"Although some of the forest land is difficult to search, we suspect the plane may have landed in the lake."

It is not recommended for a pilot to fly a single-engine plane over Lake Michigan but it is strictly "the pilot's decision," according to Ted Lepkowski, owner of the Plymouth Aero Co., which rented the plane.

The normal flight pattern calls for the airplane to fly around Lake Michigan, Lepkowski said.

The pilot, Jerry Moore of Ypsilanti, has a valid license, and an exceptional background in flying, Lepkowski said.

The airplane, a white Cessna 177, was purchased by Lepkowski one year ago for \$50,000. It was in good shape and had been inspected by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) two days prior to being rented, Lepkowski said.

understood. She said the new requirements will simply increase the number of students who'll be forced to drop out of school because of restrictive standards.

THE NEW MINIMUM requirements for seniors to complete before graduating include:

One credit (two semesters) of mathematics; three credits in language arts; two credits in health-physical education; one credit in U.S. history; one-half credit in U.S. government; and one credit in science.

The science credit takes effect with the class of 1982 and the health-physical education credits take effect with the class of 1981. The three credits in language arts includes ninth grade English, a course in composition, and one literature course.

Students are limited to five credits towards graduation for classes from these areas: community service; cooperative education; work experience; student assistant; independent study. This five-credit limit takes effect for the class of 1979.

MS. BENSON, speaking from the audience, urged rejection of the new standards because they "would increase the graduation requirements in academic areas, and at the same time restrict the opportunity for students to receive credit for graduation through community-based education."

"These proposed changes are curriculum additions and restrictions determined in isolation of total curriculum needs."

She asked: "Who will benefit, if anyone, from these proposed changes? More importantly, who will be discriminated against? Will it be those students who are low achievers already?"

"It is expected that those students who cannot read will suddenly be able to read because of increased graduation requirements? Will those students who cannot compute, suddenly be able to compute?"

She argued community-based education experiences may, for low achievers, be the most relevant curriculum experience for them "in a curriculum filled with irrelevances."

"There is a myth being perpetuated in America that this is a land of equal educational opportunity. What you, as a board, are proposing to do tonight is to demonstrate that it is just that—a myth. Equal educational opportunity does not exist. The students who are able to achieve academically will continue to do so and those who cannot will continue to drop out, but in increasing numbers because of your arbitrary decision to increase gradu-

ation requirements while restricting curriculum."

She urged the board to reject the policy change and devote its energy and the energy of the community "to the development of a total curriculum which would insure, to a greater extent than now exists, equal educational opportunity."

GRAY STATED the policy was a "step forward" but said he'd like to see one which went beyond meeting the needs of college-bound students.

"We should consider vocational-type graduation requirements for the vocational bound student. And, also, we should be looking at different types of diplomas. We need to come back with requirements which cover the needs of all students," he said.

Arlen noted a committee is working on competency-based graduation requirements and different types of diplomas. "But even under this policy, those students who aren't college bound don't have to take college prep math. A student can choose elementary math or calculus, depending on where they are at."

Ms. Benson objected that there is no statement in the graduation policy which guarantees that any student deficient in skills will acquire those skills. "You are making it tougher to graduate, but aren't doing anything to make sure all the needs are met."

Harper said problems still existed but "we won't find the solutions tonight. I expect the CEP committee and policy committee will get to work on this. We seem to be saying we want standards of accomplishments and achievement rather than standards of attendance and exposure. I hope a suggested change comes back in six months or so."

Dr. Michael Home, assistant superintendent for instruction, commented, "We have a long way to go philosophically before we can determine what a high school diploma means in this district."

"These are only minimum requirements. The policy doesn't define what math or science courses will be taken. If we don't now have the classes to meet the needs of students, then we must find those classes."

"But we need stability in our graduation requirements," added Home, "and cannot continue to change them every six months to a year."

Mrs. Irvin Rozian, speaking from the audience, suggested community-board seminars be held to get input on the total curriculum and address the needs of children at all levels rather than just at the end of their educational experience.

"I know there's been some talk town around dis down dat Rocky's a wet hen. Dat he's too old, and his wings are giving out on him. But dat's de bunk. He's ready."

Cooper said that Rocky has been running 10 miles every morning, hitting the light bag, and polishing his left jab. He claims the world famous

Muhamad a la King has been hired as one of Rocky's sparring partners.

The champ took some time out from his ring work and posed for photographers and newsmen while repeating his training motto: "I fly like a goose, and I'm sharp as a razor. If I don't win this race, it's into the brazier."

TALK, HOWEVER, is cheap. And from the sounds of things, Rocky's going to have his wings full come race time. As last minute entries pour into the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce office, it appears the competition for the throne (and cash prize) will be keen, indeed.

High on the list of chickens to watch is Cpl. Quick Chick, "a feathered patriot" entered by the 300th Military Police Command (U.S. Army Reserve) on Schoolcraft.

According to Tom Peters, deputy recruiting officer, Cpl. Chick enlisted under the Army Reserve's Civilian

Acquired Skills Program. He will now undergo intensive training in aerial navigation and map reading, Peters said.

Another up and coming young chicken is Ms. Natural, entered by Lee Hosey of the Plymouth Health Shoppe. Mrs. Hosey said her chicken is "100 per cent organic, watches absolutely no television, and doesn't eat junk food."

John Vos, a local attorney, said F. Lee Chicken will represent his legal firm again this year. During last year's race, F. Lee delivered a brilliant summation to the judges but didn't finish in the money.

Rumor has it that the legal chicken has been going over last year's transcripts to see where his logic broke down. He's also been involved in long hours of title searching just to keep in top physical shape.

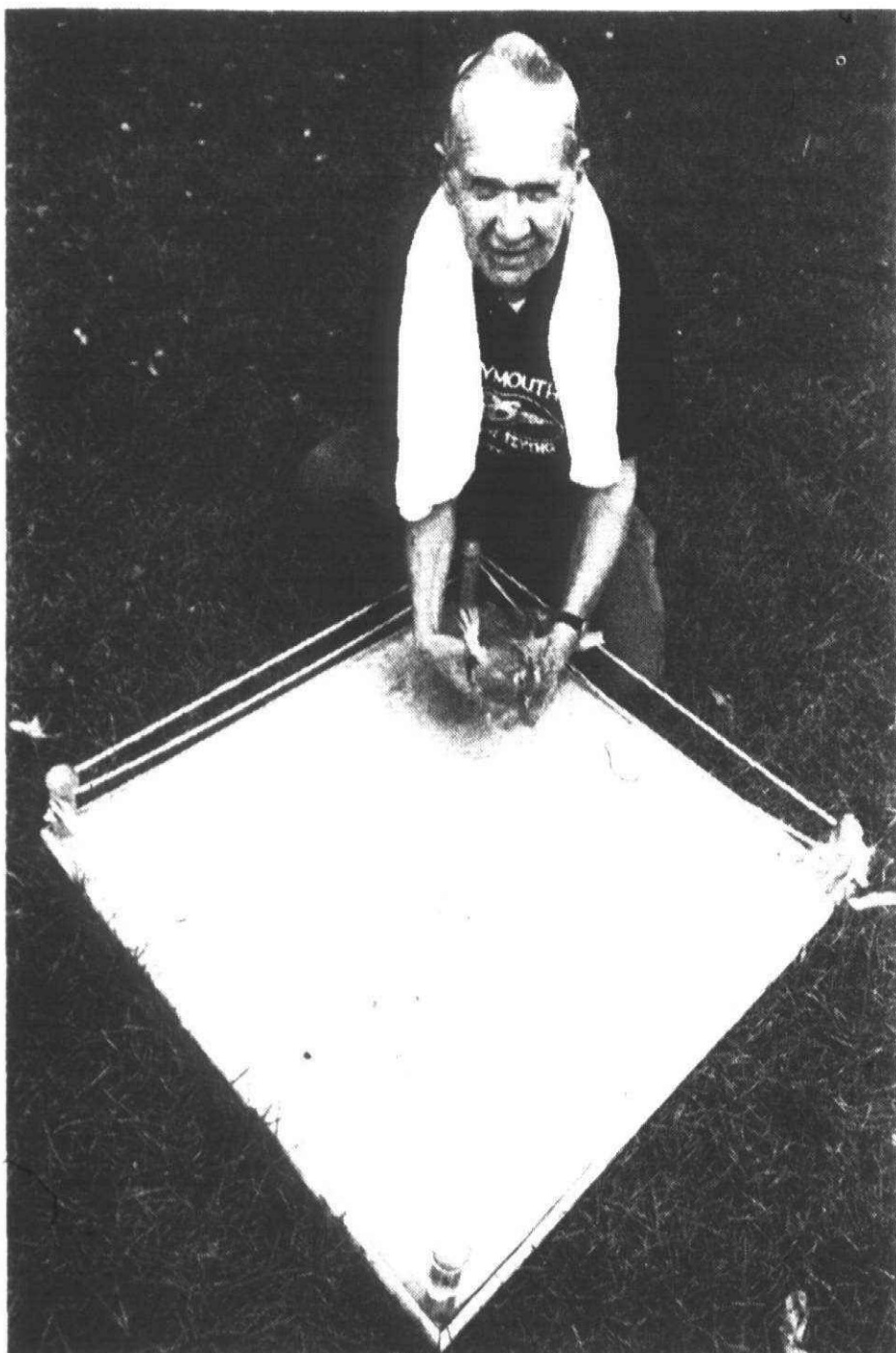
The General Motors plant in Livonia has been putting its entry, Chev-Ro-

## A captive crowd in district court speaks candidly

Unless they are obligated to appear in court, most persons are not interested in learning much about the local judicial system.

But there is a select group of Plymouth and Canton residents who, like it or not, have become very familiar with Judge Dunbar Davis and his 35th District courtroom.

That's because they have been convicted of various petty crimes and part of their sentences include court observation time in lieu of a jail stint.

By the time they've finished, however, the court observers are self-proclaimed experts on judicial matters. And most find the experience beneficial.

"I was nervous and very uncomfortable the first time I went to court," said Jeff, 18. "But after spending time there, it ain't nothing I'll be more relaxed and know what to expect if I ever have to go back again."

While most observers thought sitting in court was helpful, some were not bashful in pointing out what they perceived to be flaws.

"THERE AREN'T ENOUGH public defenders in Plymouth," said Richard, 19. "A lot of people don't know a thing about the law and attorneys don't have time to sit down and explain things."

"They just like to get the basic facts and tell you the best route to go. They're too swamped—I was in court one day when the public defender had 20-30 cases."

Several observers were impressed with the role of the defense attorney. "If you don't have a lawyer, the balgame's over," said Roger, 22. "Things are pretty cut and dry in court and if you want to beat your rap, hire a lawyer."

"I saw so many people go in there honestly thinking they're not guilty and wind up paying the fine. They try and pull a Perry Mason from watching TV and everyone ends up getting ticked off."

"A lawyer knows what he's doing. Nine time out of 10 he'll get you a lesser charge."

Jeff, who was charged with stealing auto tires, claimed he was treated unfairly by Judge Davis. "Another guy got caught with the same rap and was given one-year probation. I get probation, a \$55 fine and 10 days in court. I thought I got ripped off."

Most observers felt Davis was extremely fair on the bench. "The guy's really got it together," said Terry, 20. "He's one of the best judges I've ever seen. Unless he knows you're lying, he tries to give you a break."

"HE'S REALLY ROUGH on drunk drivers," said Joan. "And sometimes the case load is real heavy and he clears them out in unbelievable time."

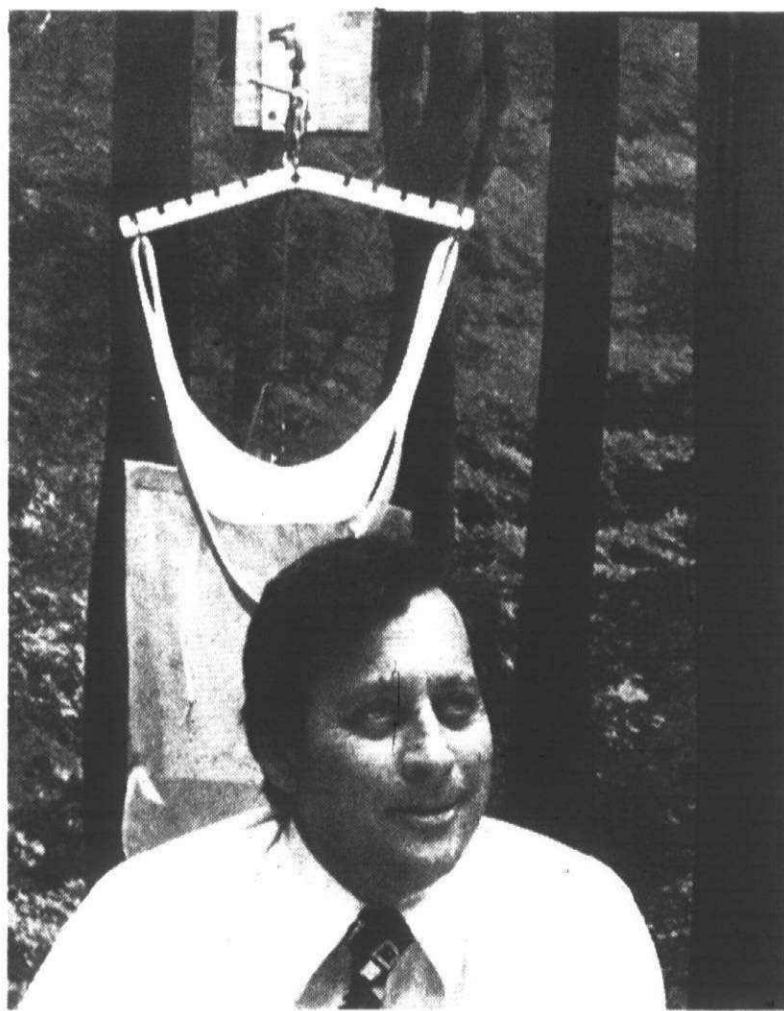
One observer thought highly of his probation officer. "This guy was great. He taught me how to rip off tires without even touching the lug nuts. And he showed me how to break into the front door of a house and make it look like you went through the window," said Jeff.

When asked if the probation officer was still in Plymouth, Jeff said: "I don't think so. One day he called in sick and I haven't seen him around since."

Joan recalled a peculiar case when 30 teenagers were prosecuted for swimming in gravel pits. "Judge Davis gave the kids their choice of sentence—two days of work detail and no public record or a fine and a record. They all chose to pay the fine and have it on their record," she said.

A couple of observers were impressed with the revenue the court collects for the city of Plymouth. "Everything was so routine. Davis listens to the people, then lays down a fine and it's all over," said Troy, 19.

Said Jeff: "I'd say Davis is fair but he loves slapping on those fines."

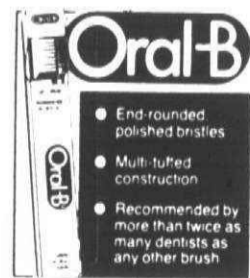


### Fire drives family into tents

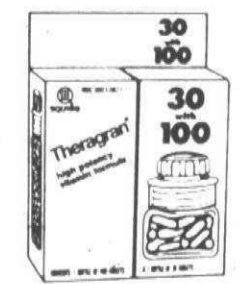

## Canton pilot puts kibosh on helicopter purchase

Open letter to Supervisor Harold Stein:

It is not my intention to become one of your antagonists since I am convinced you are trying to promote ideas and concepts in the best interest of the township. The issue of helicopters, however, I feel I must object to rather strongly.

If I may digress for a moment, you know I am a member of the Commercial and Industry Committee and sincerely interested in growth, commercial growth that is. I have and will continue to support your efforts for the golf course, the sports complex and other commercial-industrial projects so necessary for the balanced growth

of Canton.

I am very concerned about the approval to purchase helicopters. I feel that this is ill-advised and not practical. There is no way that these machines could be cost-effective. The cost to operate and maintain them would quickly bleed off tax dollars from far more valued projects.

### PLEASE NOTE

Wayne County:  
•Budget \$252,000 per year (half of this is salary).

•6 men, two helicopters.  
•Cost of operation—\$60 to \$70 per hour.  
•Cost to train pilots—(4½ years ago) \$13,000 per man.

City of Detroit:  
•Budget unknown—34 men, 10 helicopters.

•Cost of operation (excluding wages) \$35 per hour

•Training of pilots \$100 per hour (could train in 40 hours but City of Detroit demands 200 hours minimum).

•Maintenance—every 1,200 hours an engine overhaul is required at a cost of \$5,000 per overhaul.

•Transmission overhaul is another \$5,000 to \$6,000.

•The rotor head another approximate \$1,800.

The following information is from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) will deteriorate unless rigid procedures are followed to protect them.

•They will definitely NOT be cost effective for Canton Township.

•Helicopters are practical only in high crime areas.

•Pilots must fly 25 hours per month to remain proficient. 25 hours times \$35 per hour times two pilots equals \$1,750 per month.

•Insurance—(Lloyds of London) \$500 per month per helicopter liability (insurance alone).

•Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) will not fund helicopters.

•Wayne County helicopter service is in jeopardy due to funding problems.

The following information is from the FAA:

•If these helicopters are used in the Public Use Category then no air worthiness certificate is required. They do not have to be maintained per FAA rules.

•Many insurance companies won't insure in this category.

•There are limited life components in the gear boxes that require mandatory retirement.

•If these helicopters could receive air worthiness certificates (and some can not) the cost ranges \$5,000 to \$15,000 with some estimates as high as \$40,000.

•For every one hour of flying, there is two-three hours of maintenance.

•Regarding storage, these "birds" will deteriorate unless rigid procedures are followed to protect them.

•They will definitely depreciate in value.

## Pay raise for school board likely

A final vote is expected Oct. 10 on whether to raise the pay for trustees on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The school board was prepared to vote on the increase Monday night, but deferred action when it was decided to make the change by amending the board's bylaws.

So the board voted 6-0, with trustee George Lawton absent, to approve the first reading of the bylaw change with final approval slated for Monday, Oct. 10.

THE INCREASE is being considered because of a change in the state school code which sets a new maximum for paying trustees of \$30 per meeting for 52 meetings.

At first the school board was going to vote on the \$30 per meeting, 53-meeting maximum. But trustee Dick Arlen Monday night introduced a resolution to set remuneration at the maximum allowed by the state school code.

For the coming year, if approved, school trustees would receive \$30 per meeting. But that salary could increase in the future, without a vote of trustees, if the school code is amended.

"I think there is some need for this," commented Arlen. "We all serve for reasons other than financial gain through stipend compensation. But I have seen cases where the expenses of a trustee haven't been met, and expenses can get up to the \$30 per meeting level."

"If we don't at least meet expenses, than only certain people from certain income levels can afford to serve on the school board. We shouldn't be ruling out a number of people on that basis."

Trustees now receive about \$286 a year apiece. Under the proposed change, a trustee attending 52 meetings a year would receive \$1,820, although the actual remuneration per trustee probably will be closer to \$1,500.

Trustee Flossie Tonda noted that Canton trustees receive about \$1,620 per year and Plymouth Township trustees about \$1,500 each annually.

TOM YACK, board president, said the two public hearings held on the issue brought little public reaction.

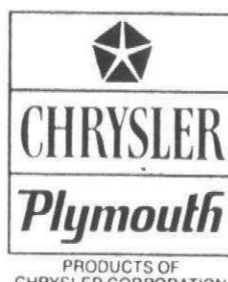

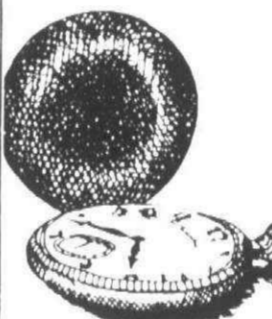

# Too little time is available for students' learning

"Teachers can teach more than there is time for children to learn," curriculum consultant Charles Blondino told Plymouth-Canton educators here at a district-wide workshop last week.

The purpose of the two days of concentrated effort was to learn methods of organizing instruction in order to spend time on what is most significant for the students and community.

**GOAL-BASED** curriculum, a concept developed by the Portland, Ore., school system was presented as a possible model for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Dr. Michael Home, assistant superintendent for instruction, has had experience in implementing goal-based curriculum in another school district.

Principals, directors, teachers, school board members and parents participated in the workshop at Central Middle School all day Wednesday

and Thursday. They not only heard an overview of goal-based curriculum, but had the opportunity to examine collections of program goals and course goals from the Oregon project.

Program goals are established for 12 instructional areas: art, biological and physical sciences, business, health, home economics, industrial arts, language arts, mathematics, music, physical education, second language, and social education. Career education is a common thread throughout all 12.

Course goals are identified within each of these broad areas. Through a detailed system of cross-reference numbering, teachers can find goals for teaching which fit best the program goals for their district. The three major types of course goals are knowledge ("the student knows"), process ("the student is able to"), and value ("the student values").

On Oct. 3, at their regular Monday evening workshop at the board office,

the board of education will discuss the ramifications of the goal-based curriculum. The board has been working all fall on establishing priorities for the school district, so that program goals can be tied in with the district goals.

A **CORE** committee is involved in planning workshops, inservice, and communications on the goal-based

curriculum.

Its members are Dr. Home, Barbara Bowman, John Telford, Kent Buikema, Pat Gibbons, Shirley Spaniel, P.C.C.S. administrators and teachers Sam Daas, Ray DVUMONT, Caroline Keller, Dolly McMaster, Terry Secord, Camille Wimsatt, and Bill Bartlett. Janet Campbell, Betty Sonnega, and Kari Miller are parent members.

The next step in implementation of

the goal-based curriculum is establishment of committees to define program goals for each of the 12 subject matter areas. These committees will consist of teachers, administrators, citizens, and a core committee member.

"Look for a sense of simplicity, as you develop your curriculum," Blondino told the P.C.C.S. group. "Not everything we do has to be docu-

mented, just what is most significant for children. The community wants to know that there is commitment to what it considers significant."

Goal-based curriculum clarifies the purpose of education in the local district, according to Home. It can provide a yardstick of program adequacy. On the other hand, it doesn't limit teacher freedom or learning opportunities, he said.

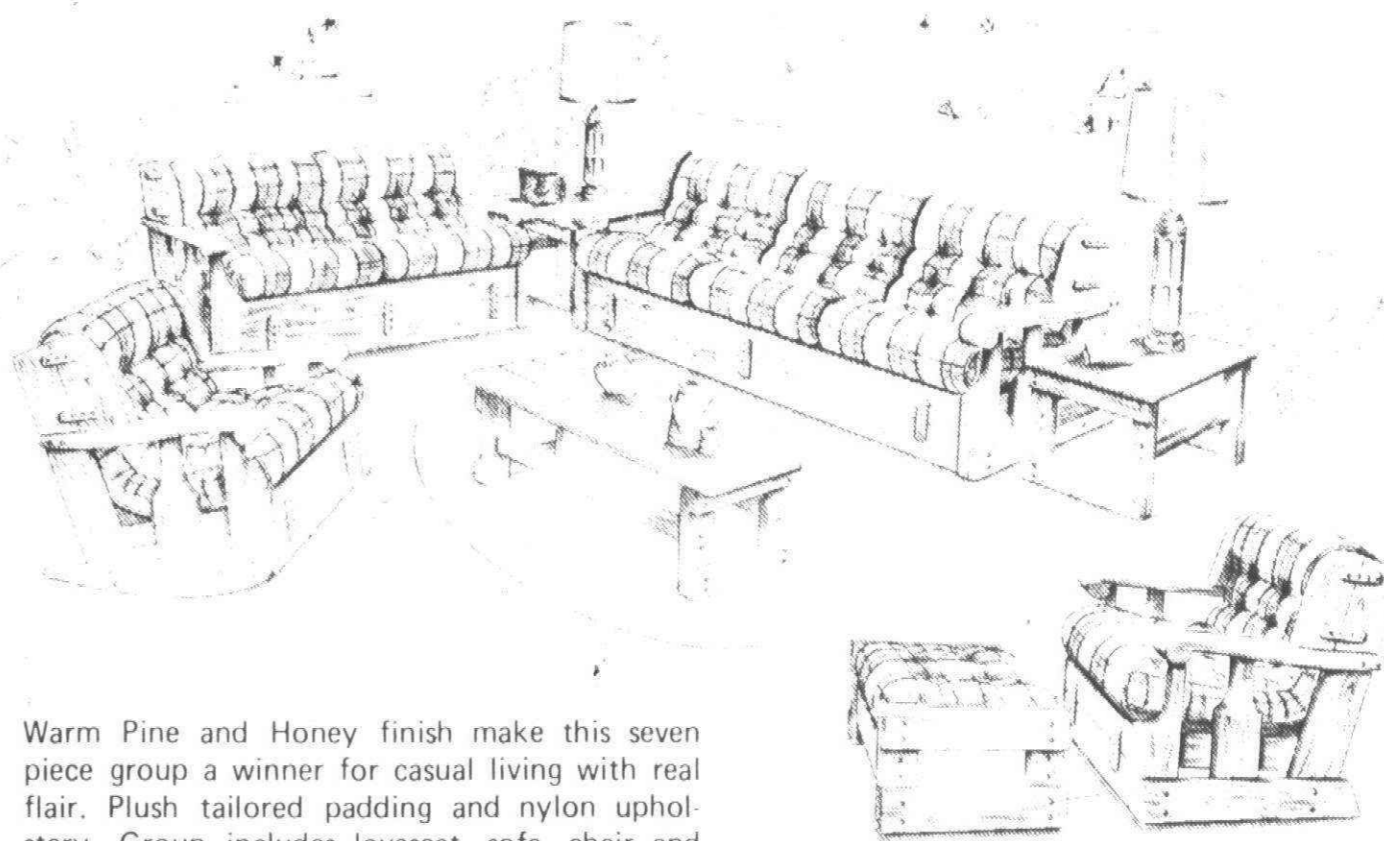

about the lovable rodent, once she paid to have it put in book form it was a different tale entirely.

The Frederick Warne publishing company picked it up, and the book became a world-wide classic. It has appeared in Spanish, Welsh, German, Italian, Dutch, Japanese, Norwegian, Danish, and Latin. Peter's adventures can also be read in Braille.

The staff and students of Fiegel put on a Peter Rabbit skit and decorated the school with balloons, streamers, and posters. And for a special treat, everybody got to chow down a piece of, you guessed it, carrot cake.

# 'Walkless' subs plague schools

Plymouth-Canton school trustees are concerned that residential subdivisions built without sidewalks may increase transportation needs in years to come.

The issue was raised when Plymouth Township trustees were asked to waive a sidewalk requirement for Beacon Estates. The township board granted the waiver, contingent upon the consent of the school district.

The school board is considering going along with the waiver, providing buyers of homes also agree they won't ask that their children be bused in the future. School trustees are considering asking a "waiver of transportation" being made part of the deed restriction which also has purchasers waiving the right to petition the township for sidewalks.

Developer Loren Gould appeared at Monday night's meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education to tell trustees that purchasers of homes in Beacon Hills don't want sidewalks. Tom Yaek, school board president, answered that trustees were concerned Beacon Estates residents will be requesting busing for safety reasons once their children begin walking through snow and mud.

TRUSTEE STEVE HARPER had introduced a resolution urging local governmental units having ordinances requiring sidewalks to deny all requests for waivers.

Harper explained the board is con-

cerned about the safety of children in areas where there are no sidewalks, problems inherent in establishing properly placed pickup points when busing is offered and rapidly rising costs of transportation—made more serious by subdivisions without sidewalks.

Harper asked the administration to supply the City of Plymouth and Canton and Plymouth townships with a list of present bus routes required solely for safety reasons because of the lack of sidewalks, and to include the cost of this "excess" transportation. The term "excess" refers to busing which has to be provided only because sidewalks are missing.

Harper proposed that the school district not provide such excess transportation in the future to any area where the municipal unit has granted a waiver to the sidewalk requirement.

Because governmental units have granted sidewalk waivers, Harper suggested, they should engage in a cooperative effort to build pedestrian walkways to eliminate excess transportation costs to the schools.

TRUSTEE FLOSSIE TONDA, a former member of the safety committee, commented: "The cost of transportation is so high we cannot afford to transport every child who should be bused unless the townships begin to help us by providing sidewalks."

Trustee Dick Arlen remarked:

"Today, Beacon Estates and other subdivision residents say they don't want sidewalks. But what's going to happen when the snow and mud come, and there's no bus because the children are within walking distance? Are people going to change their minds?"

"I'd be the last person in the world to prevent people from allowing their kids to be splashed with snow and mud if that's what they really want."

Mrs. Tonda added that the school district could be in a weak legal position if it denied busing for safety reasons for subdivisions without sidewalks and granted safety busing to other areas. (Safety busing, by policy, is provided to children who live within 1 1/2 miles of their school when hazardous conditions exist.)

Harper noted Woodlore Subdivision in Plymouth Township is an example where children are now being bused, not because of distance but because the subdivision has no sidewalks.

GOULD REPORTED that thus far 60 homes have been sold in Beacon

Estates and all 60 buyers signed a petition that sidewalks are unwanted.

"When you have large lots, 100 feet and wider, sidewalks are not aesthetic. And, also, a lot of people don't want the maintenance problem of shoveling snow off a walk five feet by 130 feet long."

Gould noted he did install sidewalks along Ann Arbor Trail which children can walk on to school, and paid for widening of the road up to the school. He also has provided for a school site within the subdivision in case the district wants to build in the future.

"There are a lot of homes in Birmingham-Bloomfield school district without sidewalks, and studies conducted there shows there are fewer accidents in areas without sidewalks," Gould added.

The homes in Beacon Estates are selling for \$100,000 and up, Gould said, and most buyers are middle-aged or older.

Yack suggested the school board could agree to the sidewalk waiver if all of the buyers agreed.

## Sunflower school site purchase OK'd

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has approved the purchase for \$120,000 of 16-acres on Warren Road as a future site for an elementary school.

The board voted 6-0 Monday night, with trustee George Lawton absent, to approve a land contract to buy the land from Richard Lewiston of Practical Homes, developer of Sunflower Subdivision near Warren and Canton Center Roads.

The land is within walking distance of some 1,700 homes to be built in the Canton subdivision. Plans are to construct a 900-pupil elementary building, if bond monies are available, which could be used later as a middle school.

Trustee Steve Harper noted selection of the site seemed to go against

previous school practice of building elementary schools in the interior of a subdivision, instead of locating them on a primary road. He also noted the school district now owns three sites within one mile of the Sunflower site.

Trustee Flossie Tonda answered that a nearby 10-acre site the district owns is too far removed from parts of Sunflower and would require greater expenditure of funds to bus students to school.

The site is located south of Warren Road halfway between Beck and Canton Center Road. Because of growth in Sunflower, the school administration anticipates a new school will be needed there within two to four years.

# Change suggested

## New censorship plan discussed

A policy defining the proper method of censoring high school newspapers will be considered for final action Oct. 10 by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The policy change received a first reading Monday night, with a change suggested, and was approved 6-0. Final adoption is expected Oct. 10.

The policy provides that the newspaper advisor will have authority to screen articles, editorials, photographs and advertisements before publication. If the advisor has questions on any item, an advisory panel may be called into session to review the material and make a decision.

The change Monday night, discussed by Flossie Tonda, was that two citizens be added as members of the review panel. She asked that those citizens be parents with a child in high school and a child in elementary school.

"Often, a high school student will

bring a paper home and it will be read by an elementary youngster. That's why I think it's important for the citizen representatives to have a youngster in elementary schools as well as a high school student."

The policy was generated by the central administration because a controversy last year over an editorial published in the Plymouth Canton High newspaper. The anti-pornography editorial was first censored by the principal because of some of the explicit language it contained. But after an appeal to the school board, the paper was allowed to publish the editorial in question.

When faced with that controversy last year, the school board contended the existing policy didn't provide sufficient guidelines for making decisions. At that point, the administration was instructed to rewrite the policy.

The policy isn't formally referred to as a censorship policy, but bears the

title "Community Relations—Communications Boards and School to Community—Publications."

TRUSTEE CAROL DAVIS asked if there was any particular reason why the two faculty representatives on the review panel should be English teachers.

Florence Beier, community relations director, agreed it didn't matter and said the English teacher requirement would be dropped.

Trustee Steve Harper asked if the policy had been submitted to an expert in constitutional law to see if it was legal.

Mrs. Beier answered it hadn't been submitted to an attorney because the courts have made a number of rulings, some conflicting, and there's no clear-cut legal position. "The one thing that is clear, though, is there must be a proper appeals procedure provided." Mrs. Beier added that she attended a

workshop at Eastern Michigan University in which the topic was discussed by a number of experts, and relied on that knowledge when drafting the new policy.

Under the policy, the primary responsibility to review material rests with the advisor. If the advisor or high school principal, however, "anticipates" material "will be disruptive," or "borders of decency will be violated," the ad hoc review committee will be convened. The review committee would be vested with final authority to determine whether the material is published.

Members of the review committee would consist of the principal, area coordinator for English, two teachers, two students and two citizens.

The review committee's decision may be appealed to the superintendent of schools, and then to the board of education. The board's decision is final.

## Education courses offered

Persons interested in constructively influencing educational policy will benefit from a new master's program of Wayne State University's College of Education. The program starts this fall with two courses being offered at the Birmingham Center for Continuing Education, 746 Purdy, and one at Oak Park High School, 13701 Oak Park Boulevard.

Starting Sept. 29, "Moral Judgment and Moral Education" is scheduled in Oak Park on Thursdays, 4:30-7 p.m. "Adult Education in a Changing Society" on Mondays, 4:30-8 p.m.

and "Current Controversies in Education" on Wednesdays, 4:30-7 p.m. will be given in Birmingham.

Dealing with the political and social role of the school, courses in the program will examine such questions as: Who ought to control education? What are the causes of low scholastic

achievement? What are the rights and responsibilities of students, teachers and the public?

All of the courses in the program will be scheduled in Oakland County during the next two years.

# Amend constitution, not rewrite, argues O'Neil

(Second of four articles)

By TIM RICHARD

Why rewrite the Michigan Constitution when it's so easy to amend? James F. O'Neil, a man who often proposes major changes in governmental structures, sees no need to hold a new constitutional convention, even though the convention proposal is automatically on the 1978 state ballot.

"With the ease of amending, there is no need to rewrite the constitution—not after just 16 years," said O'Neil, 53, a Livonian and twice a Republican member of the state board of education.

Since the 1964 constitution went into effect, O'Neil said, there have been 15 proposed amendments on the ballot.

and voters have approved seven and defeated eight.

Among the eight rejected were two to lower the voting age to 18 (the same goal was later accomplished by amending the U.S. Constitution) and two others to allow a graduated income tax.

**AMONG CHANGES** that a Democratic party commission is advocating are the abolition of the state board of education, the election of the state superintendent of public instruction and a graduated income tax.

"That would make education political," said O'Neil. "The state board, with staggered terms of office, has become bipartisan and remains a buf-

fer against the political parties who at times want to dictate educational policy."

He cites the case in the mid-1960s when a Democratic state board split 4-4 on whether to hire Ira Polley as superintendent of public instruction. Under great political pressure, one Democratic board member changed his vote to support Polley.

Another board member was denied renomination at the next Democratic state convention because of his refusal to knuckle under to partisan pressures, O'Neil said.

**AFTER POLLEY** resigned, O'Neil continued, a bipartisan board hired a pair of men who have made Michigan

nationally famous.

One is Dr. John Porter, who is now also chairman of the association of state school officers. Another, Bill Pierce, went on to become a deputy for career education under the U.S. commissioner of education.

"If you went to an elected superintendent," he said, "you'd get the most political person elected—not the most capable."

An eight-member board brings in many perspectives from a cross-section of the state that are helpful to professional educators, he said.

**ONE CHANGE** O'Neil would like to make is to elect the state board of education on a nonpartisan ballot, at the June election when local K-12 school

board members and community college trustees are elected.

"Partisanship has hurt the board in the past," O'Neil said, again citing the Polley case.

"The board can be made nonpartisan by legislative action. The present constitution only says the state board of education members must be nominated at party conventions and elected as provided by law. The law could be amended by the legislature to do that."

Even if partisan elections weren't eliminated, O'Neil would like to see state school officials (including the boards of the University of Michigan, Michigan State University and Wayne State University) elected in June.

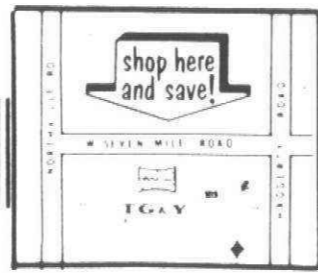
That way, voters could concentrate on education at all levels, with no presidential, congressional, gubernatorial, legislative and judicial issues to distract them.

O'Neil notes somewhat ruefully that state education posts, now filled in November elections, tend to be won by all Republicans or all Democrats, depending on which party is riding the tide of popularity. But under the 1968 constitution, when education posts were filled in an April election, voters often split their tickets.

O'Neil was elected to the state board once under the old constitution and re-elected under the present constitution in 1966. He was washed out by the 1974 Democratic tide.

# Twp. to limit hunting

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees is taking immediate steps to severely restrict open hunting in the township.

By a unanimous vote Tuesday, the board instructed its attorney to draft an ordinance requiring hunters to obtain written permission from the owner before hunting on private property.

"We've got to act quickly on this," said Trustee Richard Gornick. "The hunters will be out very shortly."

In April, a similar state law went into effect, but board members felt that law was vague and that the township constable would have more power to enforce a local ordinance.

In a later vote, the trustees approved placing a question on the next primary ballot asking voters if they wanted to ban hunting completely in the township.

"We are postponing the inevitable," argued Gornick. "The western section of the township is getting more populous. We are becoming more urbanized. It's time to close off the whole township to hunters."

The issue of hunting came before the board at the request of Trustee Lee Fidge. She said she had received numerous complaints about guns being fired and hunters going on private property.

A RESIDENT told board members that the problem of hunting was getting serious. "The hunters are getting ready for their annual kill, and the bullets are flying. I agree with Gornick. We should

do something to stop it."

The question of what to do about hunters is not new to the township. According to Clerk Helen Richardson, the board petitioned the state Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to prohibit hunting three years ago. But not everybody was in favor of the move.

"We've gone around on this before," she said. "And not everybody feels that hunting should be prohibited." She said that a number of people who owned land and were hunters didn't feel the board had a right to tell them they couldn't hunt on their own property.

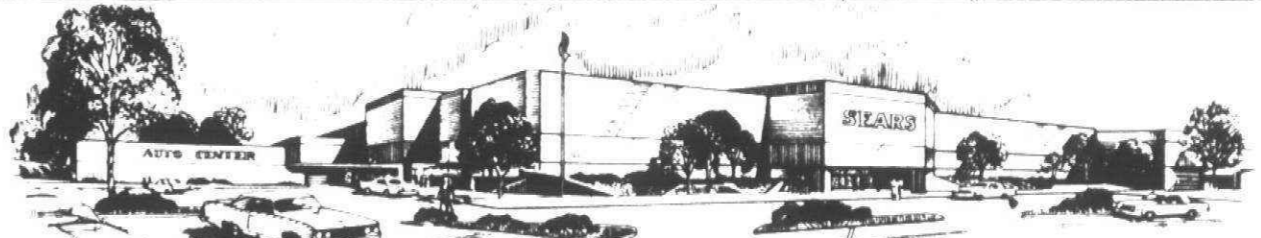
## School budget hearing is set

Had the legendary author who delighted in taking a young lad and guiding him through the pitfalls of life to a place of prominence been there, he would have had the time of his life and the script would have been just to his liking.

He would have seen people who came from many points of the globe pay tribute to an immigrant boy who made good. He would have seen friends from as far away as Plymouth, England; and from the sunny slopes of California he would see an old golf coach pay his respects to a member of the best team he ever coached.

These folks from far away had come to honor Ralph Lorenz, owner of the Mayflower Hotel, and what a tribute they paid.

THE EVENING took on the aspect of the old TV series, "This Is Your Life," and one by one the guests stepped to the podium and lauded the man who had taken over the management of the hotel when it was floundering and made of it an institution that now is synonymous with the City of Plymouth.

One of the finest tributes came from Tom Collins, manager of the Mayflower Post House in Plymouth, England, who not only paid a verbal tribute but honored Ralph with a picture of Queen Elizabeth, and a replica of The Hoe, one of the most famous areas in southwest England.

Tom had crossed the ocean along with former alderman Harold Pattison, who presented Ralph with a fancy resolution from the Lord Mayor proclaiming his place in the bonds of friendship that have been welded during the past few years.

And from California came Lloyd Olds, former golf and track coach at Eastern Michigan University who proclaimed Ralph as one of the best golfers he ever had coached.

And so it went on into the evening with plaques and gifts from all manner of associations, clubs, and a college president being presented to be kept as mementoes of the various steps in his life.

Nothing like the evening ever had been seen before in Plymouth, and it is hardly likely that the evening ever will be duplicated for no one has lived a more wholesome life or contributed more to his hometown than Ralph Lorenz.

During the evening, he was hailed as a man with imagination and many are the tales told of his quick thinking and constant search for items which will bring more attention to Plymouth.

It was Ralph who some years ago decided on taking a group to Plymouth, Mass., to help celebrate an anniversary of the arrival of the Mayflower. It wasn't an ordinary trip—all of the guests wore Pilgrim and Indian costumes.

And well The Stroller recalls the visit to Plymouth, England, back in 1970 when the Michigan group helped to celebrate the 35th anniversary of the sailing of the Mayflower. Ralph inspected every hostelry thoroughly and kept an eye open for anything that would bring prestige to the Mayflower back home.

The results of that trip can be seen in most every room in the Mayflower today—all the result of Ralph's imagination.

His fertile mind also has helped build up a reputation for the kitchen. The story is told of th morning he was asked to prepare 100 orders of poached eggs for a football team's breakfast. This would have stamped most chefs. But not Ralph. He quickly got out the biscuit tins, filled them with hot water and dropped an egg in each one. The poached eggs were served on time and many hotels across the land have since inquired just how it was done.

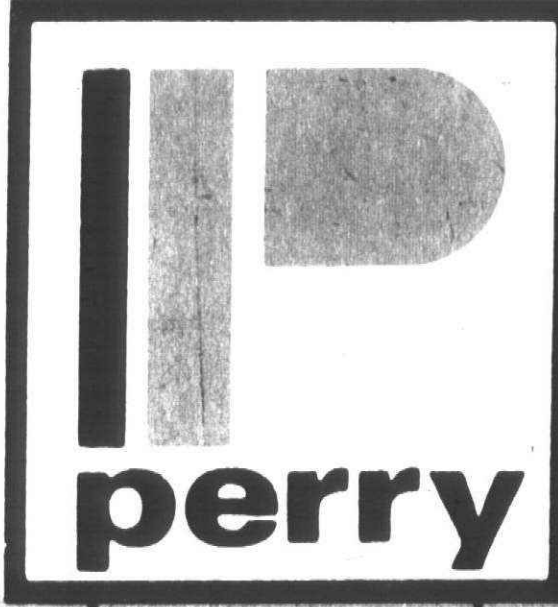
ONLY RECENTLY on a morning when the chef was late, Ralph took it upon himself to make the soup for the day.

He decided on chicken. After one look into the pot he decided it was too thin. What to do? He emptied a can of corn into it and today the chicken-corn soup is one of the favorites.

His imagination is endless. One need only to look around his office to see plans for all sorts of things that would make Plymouth more attractive.

He and his family have left a mark in Plymouth—all signs that the immigrant boy from Austria had made good.

### Livonia offers school building

Although the Livonia school district has offered Plymouth-Canton the use of a vacant building, Supt. John M. Hoben said the offer isn't a ready-made solution to the district's space problems.

"It seems like it might answer some of our needs," Hoben said. "But it also raises an awful lot of questions."

In a letter to Hoben, Livonia School Supt. George Garver said that because of declining enrollment, Whitman Junior High School will be closed in June 1978. He asked if the Plymouth-Canton school district would be interested in submitting a proposal for using the building.

According to Garver, the building is 21 years old, in good shape, and has a capacity of 1,000 students. The school is located at Hubbard and West Chicago.

"I haven't taken the offer before the

trustees will receive it," Hoben said.

Hoben said one of the main problems in using the building would be money. He said the district has no money budgeted to either lease or buy it.

In addition, he felt the district was in need of elementary classroom space, and questioned whether a junior high building would be suitable.

He also said he would anticipate strong opposition from parents to using their children to Livonia.

"As far as I can see, it has some drawbacks. Besides, I haven't talked to Garver to find out exactly what kind of offer they would consider," Hoben said.

Whitman is a half-mile east of Farmington Road and a half-mile south of Plymouth.

# Lien laws archaic and unworkable

The mechanic's liens that have come back to haunt at least 14 buyers of Pyramid Homes in Canton are a throwback to our country's revolutionary times. They protected the colonial bricklayer from being stiffed by a neighbor for work performed.

However, in 1977 the mechanic's lien is an unsatisfactory and unfair lever used by subcontractors who haven't been paid by a builder. Mechanics' liens penalize the home buyer who is quietly paying off his mortgage and suddenly learns he faces the possibility of having his home put on the auction block or paying twice for work or materials.

The 14 Pyramid homeowners have hired a lawyer to fight foreclosure proceedings against them after the liens started arriving. These people learned too late that present laws covering the construction field often encourage falsified records by builders at the time of closing.

Building companies can go bankrupt, default on loans or overextend their credit. And for these reasons, unpaid subcontractors claim their only recourse is to slap a mechanic's lien on homes until they receive payment from the builder, the title company or homeowner.

**IN WHAT OTHER** industry is there an automatic lien in the event of bad credit? Why can't the construction industry operate like all other businesses that extend credit?

Well, if a bill drawn up by Jason Honigman of the respected Detroit law firm of Honigman, Miller, Schwartz and Cohn makes it through the State Affairs Committee in the Michigan Senate, the archaic mechanic's lien could become extinct.

In place of the complicated process of filing a notice of intent to file lien, filing a lien and then serving foreclosure papers on the home buyer, Honigman's bill proposes a system of "construction debt certificates."

These certificates would be arranged through the builder's bank and issued to the general contractor or the subcontractor or both.

By rights of assignment, subcontractors would draw money from the builder's account to pay for materials and work they supply. An unpaid contractor would look to the bank for payment, not tie up a homeowner caught in the middle of a financial affair he had nothing to do with. And the common practice of overextending loans to builders would undoubtedly be reduced with the new scrutiny.

**EVEN THE PEOPLE** who oppose the proposed legislation the strongest are not being served well by the present mechanic's liens. Subcontractors know that legal requirements for securing mechanic's liens are very costly, incredibly technical and that the filing period for filing such liens expires 90 days after the work or material is in.

Still, the subcontractors squawk that the "new risk" would cause them to hike construction costs. What it would do is stop a builder from building homes on shoestring finances and then trying to recoup his losses by building still more houses. Before a builder can get a construction loan from a bank, he must have collateral. The construction subcontractors would be forced to depend on the good credit of a building company. And that in itself would be a refreshing change.

It's a reasonable position, although we would have preferred to see SEMCOG itself step into the role instead of setting up a new body.

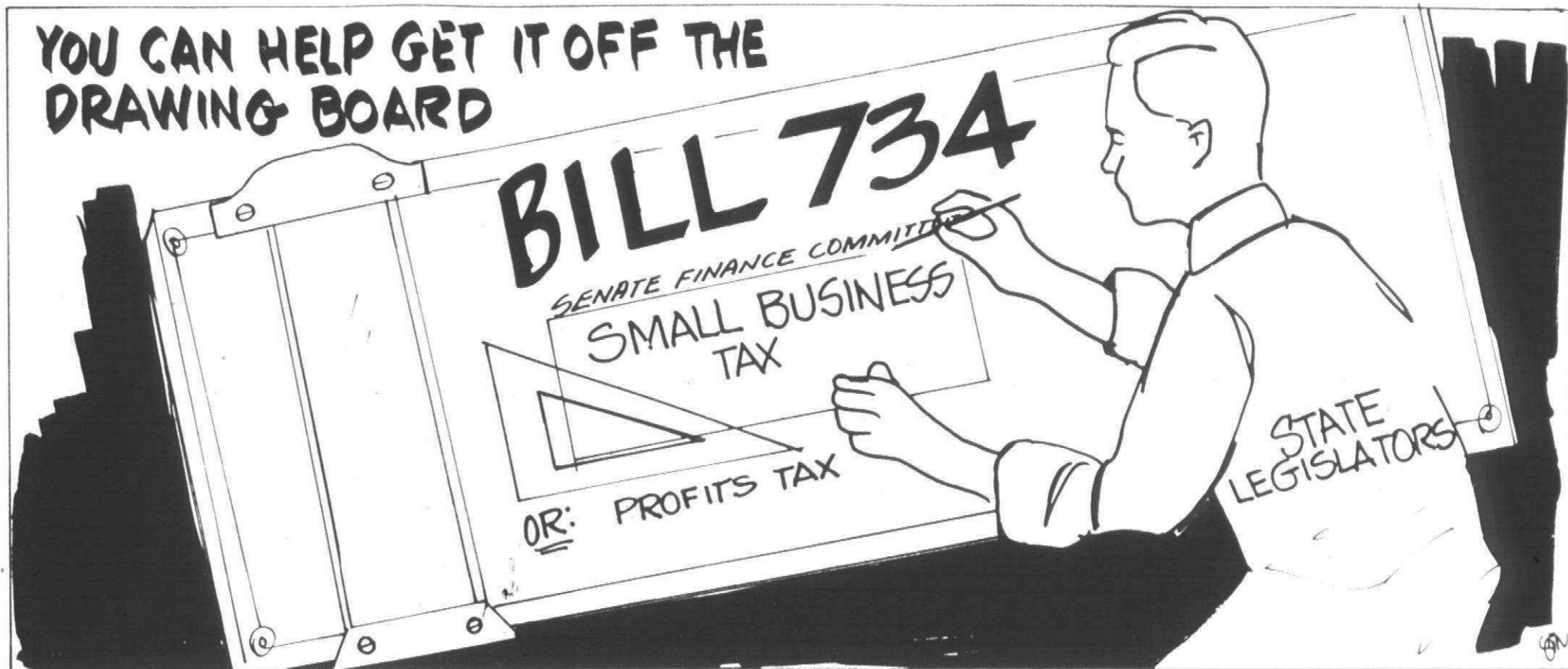
The issue is now heading for the SEMCOG General Assembly meeting of Oct. 20 after passing the executive committee last week.

At this point, SEMCOG leaders and members must beware of a plan of obstruction and amendment aimed at derailing the entire project. Washtenaw County's representatives to SEMCOG are positively fanatical, if not hysterical, in their opposition. They are making a bizarre alliance with a few hard-shell conservatives from Oakland County—the kind of people who see any regional structure as some kind of hobgoblin.

SEMCOG leaders who have drafted the plan have given the voluntary regional planning agency about half the appointments to the 27-member water quality board. The obstructionists are likely to want to reduce that number by flapping the red herring of "local control."

The plain logic of the matter is that it's senseless for SEMCOG to be a planning agency, but for its water quality plan to be carried out by another body that lacks heavy SEMCOG input.

## SBT reform faces crucial senate vote

"The Single Business Tax is the rape of the small businessmen of this world. It's the single most horrendous tax they ever stuck us with."

Those are harsh words. They come from a small businessman here in the suburbs, Larry Troy, who runs the South-Eight Shell service station at Southfield and Eight Mile roads.

When the SBT took effect at the end of 1976, Larry (and countless other small businessmen like him) discovered he was in deep trouble. His accountant told him the SBT replaced a set of state business taxes based essentially on profits with one tax based essentially on payroll.

Larry's business is labor-intensive; that is, a high percentage of his total costs are in employee payroll. Compared with his previous tax bill, SBT would have doubled Larry's taxes.

Larry Troy then did the only thing he could do. He cut 10 men from his staff of 25, cut back on service, and dropped the AAA work which he had been doing for 10 years.

**BECAUSE OF THE** Single Business Tax, Larry Troy today is doing less business than he wants to (in a state whose basic economic problem is lack of business growth) and employing 10 fewer persons than he used to (in a state whose greatest human problem is lack of jobs).

Larry Troy's experience is an ideal example of

why the SBT, as presently written, is dumb-headed and should be amended.

Gov. Milliken and the Michigan Legislature began to get that message late last year, when the bureaucrats finally got around to telling folks what the new SBT really meant. The storm of protest eventually resulted in a commission chaired by Lt. Gov. James Damman which held hearings all over the state.

Lots of people (including yours truly) testified SBT was unfair (because it is not based on ability to pay), regressive (because it is based on payroll, not profit), and misdirected (because it offers a disincentive for businesses to employ people).

The commission deliberated and concluded that the SBT needed amendment, but couldn't agree on what kinds of changes were needed.

**AT LAST**, legislation to amend the SBT is on the floor of the legislature.

## Will we ever see a rapid transit system?

The metropolitan Detroit area has been the last major metropolitan area in the country to face up to the need of a regional mass rapid transportation system.

Because it is the car capital, it has always placed its transportation emphasis on expressways and downtown parking lots.

It has had rail transportation from Pontiac to Detroit and Ann Arbor to Detroit but only at peak time—rush hour. Anyone working in Detroit other than 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. has serious difficulty trying to use this transportation.

Over the years we have had several bus lines serving the suburbs, but the use has been so minimal that private enterprise was unable to earn enough to stay in business.

In 1967 the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMATA) was created to tie together existing modes of transportation and plan a regional system to serve the needs of all the citizens of a six-county area of Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw, St. Clair, and Monroe. Livingston County was added in 1974.

This authority didn't really become operational until 1973 when the state provided funds to match federal grants which had been unavailable since 1964 for capital assistance.

In 1975 the federal government began making operational funds available on a matching basis.

This relatively new authority started its regional operation by acquiring a series of private bus companies that had been serving the suburbs.

The bus system won't be complete until the old Detroit Department of Street Railways (DSR) now called the Detroit Department of Transportation (DOT), is merged into the operation.

This has taken quite a lot of time because of the political and financial problems of merging two large segments together. This merger should occur within the next two years.

SEMATA has also acquired the rolling stock of the Grand Trunk Western commuter train service and operates a commuter train service on weekdays from the northern suburbs to Detroit.

Thus far, all SEMATA has accomplished in its 10 years' existence, is the tying together of what already existed, plus a small bus system for

elderly and handicapped persons and local travel service where regular bus lines don't exist.

The small bus systems are mostly "demand-responsive" which the public calls "Dial-a-Ride."

The main chore facing SEMATA is what to do about the future.

Detroit would line a subway system plus a people-mover downtown. A people mover would be a monorail system similar to that in use at Disneyland. It would circle the downtown Detroit business district above the streets.

The suburbs want a rapid transit system to get their residents not only to Detroit quickly but also east and west in the metropolitan area.

To build such a system is beyond the present financial capabilities of the authority, so there will be compromises.

Because the present use of regional transportation is not heavy, SEMATA faces the problem of how much to build. Will a full-blown system attract new users, making a larger plan desirable? Will the energy shortage push more people to public transportation and hence create a greater need? Can the authority do such an outstanding service and promotion job that more people can be attracted to public transportation?

All these problems should be solved in the next 15 years, but compromises never satisfy everybody.

## Secret court sessions — a history of evil

It has been doubly surprising—and disappointing—for us to receive letters and some public response defending a court-imposed gag rule on coverage of the morals cases against the Rev. Gary Berthiaume in Farmington.

One source of disappointment is that some persons support the alien notion of secret court proceedings. The second source of disappointment is that this occurs only a year after the United States of America observed, with patriotic fanfare and much commercialism, its 200th anniversary as a nation.

Those who would fail to learn the lessons of history are doomed to repeat them.

**THE LESSON** of history is that, wherever there are abuses of a person's right to a fair trial, secrecy is frequently a key ingredient.

The Declaration of Independence indicted King George III of Great Britain "for transporting us beyond the Seas, to be tried for pretended offenses."

Not only was it an abuse of a free people's rights to be tried by non-local judges, but the oceanic distance between the people and the court constituted an effective "gag rule." The people were denied the opportunity to observe the court at work, and so the court could abuse their rights.

That's how the Founding Fathers saw it.

**THE ENGLAND** which the Pilgrims and Puritans left in the 1620s had a procedure known as "star chamber" proceedings. Just the name should make any literate person shudder.

The star chamber was a judicial committee of the king's governing council. Its original purpose was to hear cases involving private armies of the nobility, but in time it began to lean on the common people, too.

The star chamber's abuses of power were made possible by only one thing—secrecy. It was abolished in 1640.

The Holy Office in 14th and 15th century France and Spain has contributed another term that makes readers of history shudder—Inquisition.

The Inquisition forced persons to testify against themselves. The Inquisition decided what to charge persons with at the end of the proceedings, not the beginning. The Inquisition failed to let the defendant confront and cross-examine his accusers. The Inquisition tortured its victims into confessing.

And the Inquisition operated in secrecy. Such an office couldn't maltreat people unless it operated in secrecy.

**SECRECY IN COURT** proceedings isn't just in the history books.

James Michener, in "Iberia" (1968), tells the story of an American working in a bar who got drunk and slugged a member of the Civil Guard. That's like tangling with the FBI, the Secret Service and a university registration system, all rolled into one.

"He was hauled off to a military jail, where he was held incommunicado for six weeks. . . Finally, he was brought to secret trial and sentenced to seven years in military prison."

The evil of secrecy in court proceedings cuts two ways. Not only can a court abuse the accused in a secret proceeding, but it can abuse society by being too lenient. You'll never know unless you can watch.

**IT'S HARD** to convince a person facing criminal charges that his interest is best served by all court proceedings being public, as this newspaper, WXYZ and the Detroit Free Press have maintained. But such is the lesson of history.

The accused's friends can't know where he is, whether he needs a defense fund, whether he's being maltreated unless the proceedings are public. Moreover, a lack of news about the accused inevitably feeds the rumor mill. Gossip can damn a man far worse than printed or broadcast facts about the charges he faces.

Finally, our staff agrees that it's an extremely unpleasant duty to report about the morals charge against a priest. It's unpleasant, but it has to be done. The interests of society and of the accused demand it.

Another highlight of the program will be a special presentation to U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth).

Those wishing to have lunch should be present at noon in the Mayflower Meeting House. Those who wish to attend the program without eating should be present by 12:30 p.m. Geake is scheduled to begin his talk at 12:45 p.m.

SEN. GEAKE is proposing amend-

ments to the barrier-free design act, legislation which requires elevators, ramps, curb cuts, wider bathroom stalls and other accommodations for handicapped persons.

The requirements must be met for any new construction or for existing buildings which undergo a change in use.

Among the changes Geake has proposed is a local appeal board which could make decisions on cases where hardships exist, particularly for existing buildings which change use.

That particular provision is of special interest in Plymouth because of its effects on owners of existing buildings undergoing use changes.

After his talk, Sen. Geake will answer questions from the audience.

THE PRESENTATION to Pursell is

a special memento of Plymouth to hang in his office in Washington, D.C.

When Pursell was elected to Congress, a group of civic leaders began making plans to give him a special memento of his hometown. When approached, Pursell said he'd like a historical scene of Plymouth to hang

in his office. He selected one from the Plymouth Historical Museum and Eric Carne made a reproduction.

Arrangements have been made for Rep. Pursell to be at the Oct. 7 meeting to accept the memento of Plymouth. Friends of Pursell also are invited to the meeting.

## Friends, family throw surprise party for Lorenz

They came from England, Spain, California, Florida and New York. But, most of all, they came from Plymouth—300 strong—to pay tribute to "This Fellow Lorenz."

Almost 300 persons gathered Saturday night in the Mayflower Meeting House for a special "This Is Your Life" testimonial to Ralph G. Lorenz, proprietor of the Mayflower Hotel, Meeting House and motel and landlord of the Mayflower Square.

The testimonial was one of the best-kept secrets of the year as the Lorenz family, Mayflower employees and 300 guests made plans for the big event without dropping the slightest hint to Lorenz of what was to come about.

The stage was set when Mabel Lorenz informed husband Ralph that a surprise testimonial was being planned for Plymouth attorney George Bowles. She assigned her husband the task of keeping Bowles out-of-town all day and bringing him to the Meeting House at the correct time for the surprise.

But, as Lorenz stood in the background edging Bowles forward, emcee Nat Sibbold announced in the microphone: "This Is Your Life, Ralph Lorenz." At that moment, and only then, did Lorenz receive his first hint the testimonial had been planned for him.

BESIDES THE TELLING of the Lorenz life-story, the testimonial included presentations of gifts and mementos from acquaintances who travelled to Plymouth from Spain, England, California, Florida and New York.

Also: W. W. Edgar, representing Plymouth Rotary; Tom Collins of the Mayflower Post Hotel in Plymouth, Devon, England; Harold Pattison, former lord mayor of Plymouth, England; Charles Buscher from Spain, Chuck Heath of New York, both representing Shenley Imports; Loyd Olds of California, Lorenz's former golf coach at Eastern Michigan University; and Bernie Stadtmiller of Florida, a former golf teammate at EMU.

**THE THEME FOR** the testimonial was "This Fellow Lorenz."

Sharing emcee duties with Sibbold, executive secretary of the Plymouth Chamber when Lorenz was president in 1954, was Plymouth attorney John Thomas. Daughter Sheila wrote the biography included in the program and Sliger helped with the script.

Creon Smith and Kirk Lorenz handled the planning for meals and invitations, while Mabel coordinated much of the pre-planning. Staton Lorenz provided a explanatory narrative for the Mayflower specialties while guests were being served Saturday night.

And the youngest son, Randy, helped cap the evening by presenting an oil portrait of Lorenz as a gift from the family.

**AS THE GUESTS** arrived Saturday, each was handed a copy of the September 1977 edition of Detroit Food &

Beverage News which contained an extensive article with color photos on the Mayflower success story in Plymouth.

The story of Lorenz's life began Aug. 11, 1910, with his birth in Austria but starts locally with his arrival at age 11 with his parents in Plymouth.

The tale retold his days at EMU as a star member of the college golf team and assistant manager of Charles McKenny Hall—the men's union.

Guests heard of how young Lorenz once earned wages picking tomatoes and cucumbers for Czar Penny, who operated a vegetable farm where the Mayflower now stands. Other highlights of the Lorenz story include:

• March 14, 1939 Lorenz and Mabel take over as managers of the Mayflower Hotel, hired by Charles Bennett, Fred Schrader, Paul Wiedman and Ernest Allison (the latter present Saturday night to wish Lorenz well).

• In 1941, World War II breaks out and Lorenz joins the Navy as a supply and commissary officer in the Solomon Islands.

• In 1953, Lorenz leases the hotel from the stockholder and begins renovations. In 1960 Round Table Club began operation and five years later the Mayflower Meeting House. In 1964, Lorenz purchases the hotel from the stockholders and later adds the Mayflower Room, lobby, Steak House, including the Johnny Billington Room. More recent expansions have been the Mayflower Motor Inn and the Mayflower Square.

Lorenz is a Rotarian, member of St. Andrews Episcopal Church, a chancellor of Fenice De la Chames Des Routsseurs, former president of the Michigan Hotel Association, member of National Restaurant Association, and a director of the Milner Hotel Corporation.

## Faith schedules double installation

Members of Faith Lutheran Church of Livonia will participate Sunday in a double installation service as the church formally adds the Rev. Paul Jaster and Fred Eichberger to its staff as associate pastor and director of Christian education.

"Studying at St. Louis University, which is where Seminec is located, also gave me a good ecumenical contact with the Roman church," he added, "and I met an exciting bunch of Christian people who are concerned about getting the church to speak to the needs of today."

Eichberger, who was last year-time youth leader at Faith last year while teaching English at Lutheran West, is taking over from Arnold Witt the job that includes directing the weekday school, Sunday school, vacation Bible school and the church's confirmation class as well as leading junior and senior high youth groups.

"My aim in the whole program," he said, "is to help teens feel confident as members of the church."

# 'We realize now we don't turn out finished products'

The new rector of St. John Provincial Seminary in Plymouth can remember well the days when he studied for the priesthood there—in a cloistered institution set in peaceful surroundings far from the busy world.

But the secluded site is now just a hub and skip from busy expressways, and the students are as involved with the world as those on any college campus. The Rev. Kenneth Untener finds the change a good one.

In the institution he has headed since June, Fr. Untener guides a program that involves about 80 students for the priesthood and also 30 others in full and part time study programs leading to a graduate degree in theology.

Classes, faculty, student mix and all programs at St. John are geared now to wider and more extended education for the people who lead Catholic parishes.

"We're more and more aware of this place as being a center for continuing growth in ministry," Fr. Untener explained.

"We realize we don't turn out finished products. The day is past when you can turn out a priest like a finished car because the problem with

that was he would go out and get some dents and bumps.

"We're realizing now that graduation is the beginning of a long process of education for ministry."

A MAJOR move toward study that will push continuing education is the composition of the student corps. The number of young candidates for the priesthood is about what it has been in the last couple of years, but the addition of such students as housewives, sisters and laymen has increased the enrollment and made for a different sort of class than Fr. Untener remembers.

"It is healthy to have this mix," the rector said. "The housewife is bound to have different kinds of questions, and that makes for a more interesting class."

The means of conducting studies are changed too, as befitting a faculty quite different from the one of Fr. Untener's student days. Instead of a group of priests more trained to parish work, the teaching corps of 12 full-time and 12 part-time educators includes sisters, a monk and two non-Catholics as well as priests.

"And most are doctoral-level people," the rector went on. "This is extraordinary, and it's my job to keep them here."

Classes now follow the format of group work, discussions and independent study along with the lectures.

In addition, St. John is offering special short term studies. There will be a seminar in October on oriental religious cults, which is to be ecumenical because of the great impact these groups have had on young people of all religions.

Also scheduled is a seminar on labor with Doug Fraser, president of the United Auto Workers, and a seminar in December on black Catholics.

"One of the big things we must do is reach out to minorities, and we're finding ways to do this," Fr. Untener commented.

ST. JOHN, established in 1949 to train priests from all over the state, was accredited for the first time this year by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

It was the first time the institution had applied for this seal. "Now we want to go back and bring this to our alumni, mostly priests," the rector said.

"We want to make available the possibility of coming back, taking some work and getting an accredited degree."

Also planned for alumni, as well as other priests in this area, are special seminars like an upcoming one on celebrating the liturgy.

"Most of the priests in the metropolitan area trained before Vatican II, when mass was said facing a wall," Fr. Untener pointed out. "They have indicated they would like help in this area."

Another visitor to come soon is a Trappist monk who will lead a seminar on prayer.

Fr. Untener also sees the seminary developing programs for the entire state.

"We could take a conference type meeting to a city like Marquette, for example," he said, "or consider offering courses off campus."

THE NEW LEADER of the seminary founded by Cardinal Edward Mooney grew up in a large family that lived on Belle Isle, where his father was in charge of canoe rentals.

After graduating from St. John, he was ordained in 1963 and served as an associate parish priest before being named an assistant in the Detroit Archdiocese Chancery.

Sent to Rome to earn a doctorate in theology, he then was appointed head of the Archdiocese clergy office, which

works with bishops in the continuing education of priests.

"What's happened is that after working with the end product I'm getting back to the formation," he said.

Fr. Untener finds St. John an "adventurous" place to be.

"This place was tailor-made for the kind of priest who used to be educated here," he said, "but now it's to be part of the new design in the education of the religious."

He thinks enrollment is going up both with the non-priest students and because he expects the number of candidates for the priesthood to grow a bit, too.

"There's a direct relationship between how people feel about this seminary and the number of vocations," he stated. "If this is a vibrant place giving a solid foundation to the people in the parishes, then they will send good people there."

Actually, he pointed out, while in the last decade the number of young men choosing the priesthood has declined, "there has been an unprecedented upsurge in vocations if you take it across the board and include all those in education and parish work."

"What appeared to be a disastrous collapse is giving new life to the Catholic church," he added. "It's an example of God writing straight with crooked lines."

way back, although he is a young man, originated the idea for the show, which he describes as a play with music.

Formerly a guitarist with Mel Ball and Colours and then leader of the group Friendship, Lashlee had written several songs about Detroit and recorded some of them on his own label, Life.

"I WANTED to develop a play about a band in a bar in Detroit," he said. Lashlee went to his friend, Francis (Frank) Dattilo Jr. of Campbell Ewald, who wrote the script.

The scene is set in 1972 in a riverfront bar in downtown Detroit. Lashlee said they actually found a bar later that looked almost like the bar dreamed up for the play.

In "Detroit!" Lashlee plays a bandleader, naturally. Other characters are Alfio Most, an ex-boxer

appears in the show as a black man who is the ultimate hope of Detroit.

"The show closes at the point of inception of Renaissance," Lashlee said. "A Detroit" (pronounced "a De-twa") which is "To Detroit" in French) is a song written by Lashlee. "It will be our curtain call. Hopefully, there will be one."

Zolton calls the production "a concert-drama, a new form. The

# Pucker up: It's apple-picking time and the cider is awaitin'

Leaves are falling, footballs are flying and kids are trudging back to school. It could only mean one thing.

Cider season! This year, as in past autumn seasons, tangy, mouth-watering cider and fresh donuts will prompt thousands of Michiganders to hop in the car and cruise out into the country to one of the 69 southern Michigan cider mills.

Also as in past years, the Automobile Club of Michigan is ready and waiting at the first drop of a leaf to help out thirsty cider seekers.

"Although the sweet cider is available all year in many areas, it's in the fall, when freshly picked apples are turned into the pure juice, that this delicious drink is most popular."

Auto club touring manager Joe Ratke says that. Ratke is somewhat of an expert on the tangy stuff, and this year, he says, should be a banner year for the juice.

Ratke says the best time for picking apples or for visiting cider mills

is from early September to the end of October. This is also the peak time for cider mill operations, although some mills extend the season through the winter.

IF YOU have never made the cider mill scene, a first visit can be a real treat, especially for the kids.

Ratke says folks can enjoy such neat things as horse-drawn wagon rides, flea markets, gift shops, country-western shows and even pumpkin patches in which kids can search out the great one.

Of course, the most interesting happening at the mills is the actual pressing of apples. Many mills operate their pressing machines on an irregular schedule, so the Auto Club advises a call ahead so the family won't be disappointed.

Some mills have their own apple orchards and invite visitors to pick the ripe fruit. No, they don't pay you for it, but you can watch them press your pickings' into cider after the work is done. Some mills allow visitors to bring their own apples for pressing.

What is the outlook for the little red fruits this year? Ratke says the prices will range from \$1.60-\$2.50 per gallon, with donuts going for \$1.20-\$1.70 a dozen. The taste, as always, will be in the lip-smacking range. Actually, cider brands are fairly similar in taste, but differ a little according to the types of apples used.

Cider and donuts. As Ratke says: "This delectable combination is certainly an exhilarating way to put yourself into the spirit of the fall season."

The opportunity to observe uncaged lions and elephants is not restricted to Africa. It also exists at the African Lion Safari in Rockton, Ont., a little town 20 miles northwest of Hamilton and an hour away from Toronto.

Its wide-open spaces are home to many other types of wildlife as well. Animals such as camels, cheetahs, timber wolves and rhinoceroses are all uncaged and allowed to roam unhindered. Instead, the people who come to see them are confined to cages (automobiles) as they drive 450 acres of lake-dotted fields, altered to resemble the animal's natural habitat.

Wardens are constantly on patrol and are ready to offer assistance to visitors wary of driving through the park themselves.

The people who run the African Safari are concerned not only with displaying their wildlife to the public. They also carry out research and studies on breeding rare animals, in order to prevent their becoming extinct.

INCLUDED IN the park is a Water Safari. Pets' Corner, Souvenir Shop, Native Bazaar, cafeteria and Safari Campground. A tour boat takes visitors for a ride on the Water Safari Lake where they can observe seals and primates such as chimpanzees. There are also scenic railway and safari rides.

Grant and Emily's offspring, Debra, resides at the Pets' Corner, a favorite with children. Grant is a zebra, Emily a donkey, and Debra—what else, a "zonkey." She has long donkey ears and muted brown and beige zebra-like stripes on her legs and ears. Many smaller birds and animals are featured along with Debra.

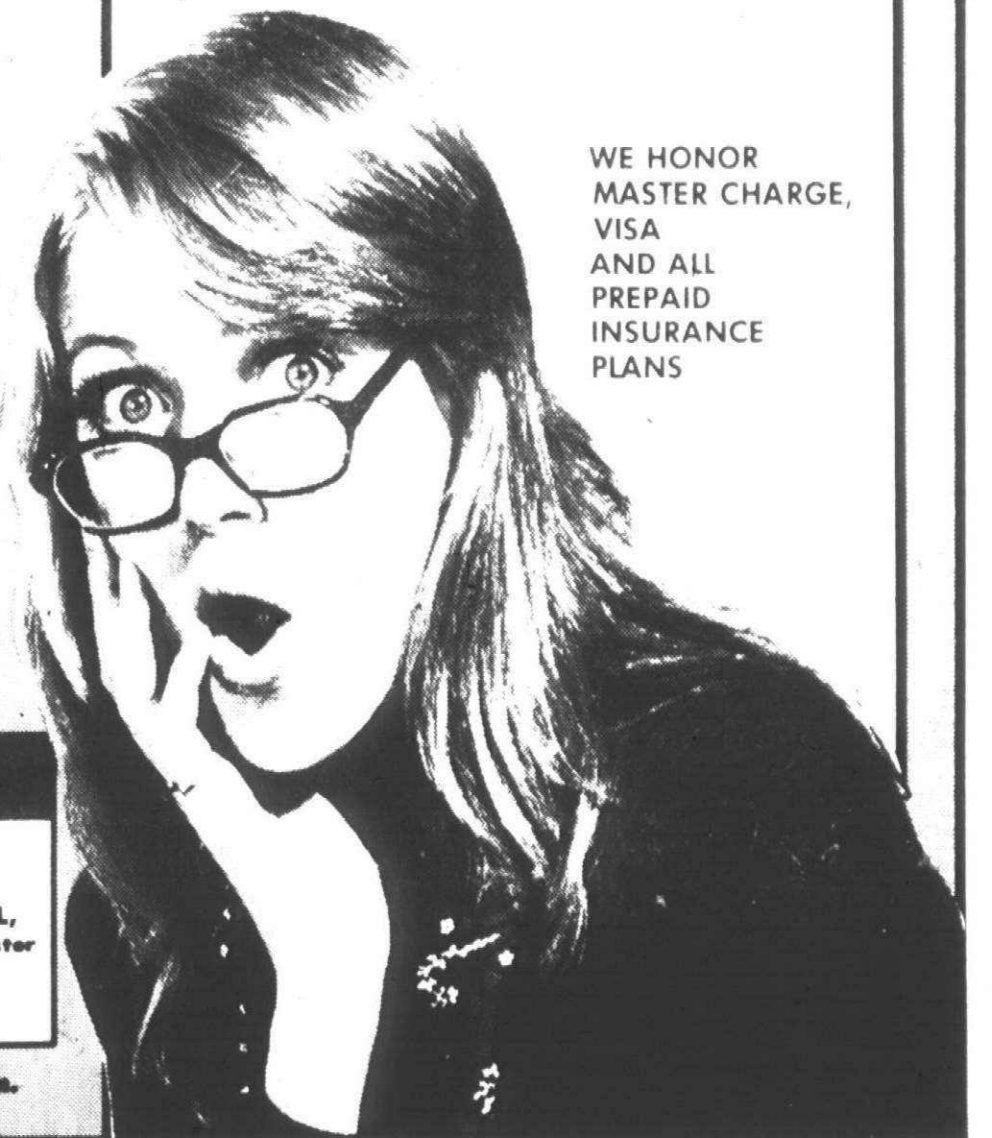

# State-ranked Salem tops in Observerland

Which football team is the best in Observerland after the first three weeks of the season?

Let this reporter give you a hint. It's the same team which also happens to be the only undefeated squad in the 14-team area.

Yes, Plymouth Salem is the number one team in Observerland with its sparkling 3-0 record. And to add to the honors, the Rocks were also named

the ninth best team in the entire state last week by the Detroit News.

**Jr. basketball starts**

The Plymouth-Canton Junior Basketball League opens its 13th season next month with registration on the first three Saturdays in October. All boys and girls, grades three through 12 living in the school district, are eligible to participate. All interested players should bring \$8 and be accompanied by a parent at the registration.

The three registration sessions take place between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Oct. 1, 8 and 15 at West Middle School on the corner of Sheldon Road and Ann Arbor Trail.

A new AAA league, grades 11 and 12, for boys and girls will be added to this year's activities. Registration fee is \$12. Each boy and girl who registers will be placed on a team and play a minimum of one-quarter (eight minutes) of a game and no more than three-quarters of a contest, according to league rules.

Tryouts will only be used to distribute and balance the playing abilities.

This year an expected 850 boys and girls will play and be directed by 200 adults who volunteer as coaches and

work on the board of directors.

This year's league president is Jack Carpenter who brings nine years of experience to the office, as a coach and many board of directors positions. "The most important part of the junior basketball philosophy is sportsmanship and knowledge of the game," Carpenter said.

"We encourage all children's participation in our association but must remind people that our rules clearly state that any boy or girl participating with any non-eligible basketball program is not eligible in our league," Carpenter said.

For those who wish to tryout for the school team, grades 7-12, a final registration will be held on Dec. 3.

Practice sessions consist of 1 1/2 hours, once or twice a week during evening hours. Games are scheduled on Saturdays, except for certain AA and AAA league contests.

The season starts in late October and ends in early March.

The association is still looking for interested high school graduates and current students who wish to referee. Any adults who are interested in coaching also are encouraged to join. Interested referees and coaches should come to one of the registration sessions to sign up.

Complete details of the junior basketball program will be provided in the information handbook received at registration.
