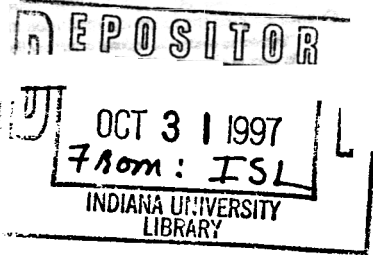


# Indiana Plan for Depository Library Services

## A Component of the Indiana Long-Range Plan for Library Services & Development: 1985-1990

Thousands of publications containing information useful to government, business, and citizens are produced every year by federal, state and local government. The information that is found in these documents can be crucial for research, information gathering, and decision making on many levels, and is available on a broad range of subjects:

- **INFORMATION ABOUT GOVERNMENT**, its laws and regulations, policies, people, and activities
- **STATISTICS** on population, business activity, economic indicators, agriculture, crime and other important decision-making data
- **REFERENCE MATERIALS** such as indexes, directories, handbooks, guides, bibliographies, and special directories
- **MAPS** that are demographic, topographic, and subject oriented
- **CURRENT EVENTS AND TOPICS** such as drug abuse, environment, energy, space exploration
- **SPECIAL STUDIES** such as television and children, toxic waste, causes and prevention of violence, education, tax reform

Both Indiana and the U.S. federal government have systems for making these materials available to people and business. State and federal documents are provided, through these systems, to selected public, academic and law libraries around Indiana, providing people with free and open access to government publications.

### The Federal Depository Library System

The U.S. government is the world's largest publisher. Each year agencies of the government report their activities, publish results of their research, and instruct the public in thousands of books, pamphlets, microforms and audiovisuals.

The national depository library system was established in 1895 as a means of making these government publications more easily and widely available to citizens of the United States. Each state was allocated two depository libraries per representative district and an additional two depositories could be named by each U.S. Senator. Amendments to the law have added law school libraries and some court libraries.

Of the nearly 1400 depository libraries now active in the country, 35 are in Indiana. Included are eight public libraries, 22 college and university libraries, and four law libraries. The Indiana State Library has been designated as the regional depository and as such has special responsibilities. All of these libraries make federal documents available for the free use of the public.

These libraries receive newly published documents on a daily basis, but not all of them receive the same ones. Over 5,000 categories of publications are offered and each library selects those categories which would best meet the needs of their clientele or communities. The regional depository and a few others receive all that are available. Depository libraries are required by law to make these publications available to the general public.

### The Indiana Document Depository System

The State of Indiana also recognizes the importance of making its publications available to the citizens of the state. The Document Depository Act (Public Law 27, 1973) requires that an official Indiana department, division, bureau, board, commission, educational institution or other agency of state government provide the Indiana State Library with copies of its public documents.

The State Library distributes copies of materials of general use and interest to the 13 designated Indiana documents depository libraries across the state. These include five universities, seven public libraries, and the Indiana State Library. In this way, people in Indiana have access to publications of the state through their local library which may be a depository, or through interlibrary loan.

### Your Depository Library

#### The Government Information Connection

"Contact your local library for information" is a familiar phrase. But "contact your local depository library" may not be as familiar.

Indiana has 35 depository libraries, of the more than 1,375 throughout the country, which are designated to receive government publications. The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) sends these libraries pamphlets, books, journals, posters and maps in return for free access by the public to these publications. The program was begun in 1814 to give citizens free access to government publications.

A Depository is a library within a library — that is, a collection of publications within a currently existing college or university library, a public or state library, or a law library.

Three categories

There are three main categories:

selectives, full and regionals. Selectives receive only the publications chosen by the individual depository librarian as appropriate to their collections. Full depositories receive all government materials distributed through the Depository Library program. Regionals, which includes the Indiana State Library also receive all available materials, but they must also permanently retain all publications and provide reference and inter-library loan services within their region.

#### Information available

Libraries and librarians are asked to help publicize the depository libraries in their area as part of a national campaign sponsored by the GPO and Federal Depository Library Program. ## Rationale of Plan Began at the National Level

The concept for state plans for federal depository library service originated at the Spring 1981 meeting of the Depository Library Council to the U.S. Public Printer. The results of a survey of regional depository libraries were reported, and problems of space, staffing, and finance seemed to be reaching crisis proportions in many states. Recognizing that no single solution could serve the varying needs of all states, the Council adopted the following resolution in the fall of 1981:

"In order to bolster the regional depository libraries' capabilities to serve their state missions and in order to assure that Federal documents are available throughout the United States on an equal and expeditious basis, the Depository Library Council recommended that the Public Printer investigate the feasibility of requiring each state to prepare a plan to coordinate the Federal documents depository program within that state. The plan should be developed through consultation with all designated Federal depository libraries within the state and should address all depository responsibilities outlined in the *Instructions to Depository Libraries* as well as the concerns expressed through the Regional Depository Survey presented to the Depository Library Council at the first afternoon session of the spring 1981 meeting." The Public Printer subsequently endorsed that resolution as a way to improve public access to government documents and encouraged states to prepare such plans. The Public Printer also stated that such plans might provide a cost-effective way of enabling states to share the responsibility for the development of collections and the provision of service.

The plan for Indiana deals with both federal and state depositories. Depository libraries of both types recognize that the acceptance of this status carries with it responsibility for considering the needs of, and providing services to, a group which is broader than its primary clientele. Through the goals and objectives of this plan, it is hoped that government documents and information will be integrated into the mainstream of library information service and that there will be increasing awareness of the availability and usefulness of this unique source of information to all citizens.

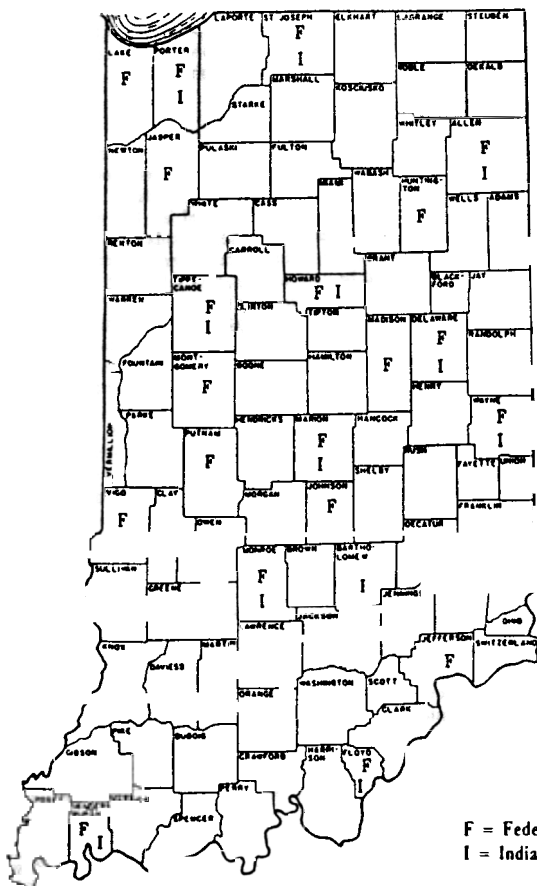
Another aim is greater cooperation among all types of libraries and limiting duplication of efforts among groups with similar goals. All of this should lead to what is really the most important aim: that Indiana's citizens have the best possible access to government information and resources.

### Development of the Plan

The responsibility for development of the plan has been shared by the Indiana State Library and the Indiana Library Association Government Documents Division. A task force of twenty documents librarians met in Indianapolis in the summer of 1982 to discuss problems and needs of the present system and to suggest goals and objectives for a plan to address those needs.

The Task Force determined that the most important issues concerning the current system were: 1) the need for coordination and direction; 2) better communication among depository libraries and also between depository and non-depository libraries; 3) the need for overall collection development policies; and 4) a need to increase knowledge and awareness on the part of the public and libraries about government documents and depository libraries. These issues form the basis of this state plan.

Depository Libraries are located in all regions of our state.



## Implementation

The Indiana Plan for Depository Library Services is a component, although separately printed and distributed, part of the *Indiana Long-Range Plan for Library Services and Development, 1985-1990*. The Government Documents and Information Subcommittee has been formed to advise and assist the Indiana State Library in the implementation, review and revision of this plan and on matters of concern to depository libraries. This subcommittee is part of the Indiana State Library Advisory Council and its Network Coordinating Committee. The Government Documents and Information Subcommittee will provide periodic reports to depository libraries on the progress of the committee, and the Indiana State Library will visit depository libraries on a periodic basis to discuss issues and assist with concerns.

## Goals and Objectives

### Goal One

To assure high quality reference service for government documents for all Indiana citizens.

#### Objectives:

- 1.1 Depository libraries should make reference services for documents available at all hours that the libraries' usual reference service is available.
- 1.2 Reference librarians in depository libraries should have working knowledge of their documents collection and familiarity with documents sources throughout Indiana.
- 1.3 Depository libraries should assist non-depository libraries in the area by providing reference and referral services for their patrons.
- 1.4 Documents interlibrary loan service that is equal to interlibrary service for other materials will be provided by depository libraries.
- 1.5 The Indiana State Library, the Government Documents and Information Subcommittee, the ILA Government Documents Division and other related groups will provide ongoing programs of continuing education on the subject of government documents and information for depository and non-depository librarians.

### Goal Two

To assure access to government documents and information for all Indiana citizens.

#### Objectives:

- 2.1 Depository libraries should circulate as many documents as feasible and should have clear, written collection development and circulation policies.
- 2.2 Depository libraries should provide adequate and accessible space for government publications, and in a manner that will encourage use.
- 2.3 Depository libraries should provide a comparable level of access to the documents collection as is provided for other collections.
- 2.4 Microform readers, reader/printers, and other appropriate equipment should be provided by depository libraries to ensure that format is not a barrier to use of the collection.
- 2.6 Depository libraries should abide by the procedures prescribed by the Government Printing Office's *Instructions to Depository Libraries*.

## Depository Libraries Your Source for Government Information



### Goal Three

To increase awareness of government documents and information that are available through depository libraries.

#### Objectives:

- 3.1 Depository libraries should promote documents through displays, promotional brochures, guides, news releases and in other ways that inform the public and other libraries of their availability and usefulness.
- 3.2 Depository libraries should share their promotional materials and ideas with other depository libraries. The Government Documents and Information Subcommittee will investigate the feasibility of a clearinghouse for such materials.
- 3.3 The ILA Government Documents Division will designate a reporter to *Focus on Indiana Libraries* (the joint newspaper of ILA and the State Library) to communicate depository library news, notices of meetings, and information on government publications of interest to libraries.
- 3.4 The Indiana State Library will improve and modify the *Checklist of Indiana Documents* so that it reflects the needs and requests of the users.
- 3.5 The Indiana State Library will maintain a current directory of all Indiana depository libraries, with areas of responsibility and contact people, which will be distributed to libraries on an annual basis.

## Goal Four

To provide government documents and information services in the most cost-effective manner.

### Objectives:

- 4.1 The Government Documents and Information Subcommittee will investigate methods of cooperative collection development for use by depository libraries interested in establishing such programs regionally or statewide.
- 4.2 Depository libraries with facilities for special formats, such as maps and computer tapes, should inform other depository libraries of their capabilities for resource sharing in these areas.
- 4.3 The Government Documents and Information Subcommittee will assist the State Library in revising instructions on the disposal and transfer of federal documents.
- 4.4 The Government Documents and Information Subcommittee will assist the State Library in determining the feasibility of simple disposal and transfer guidelines for Indiana documents.

## The Role of the Regional Library

The Indiana State Library receives and maintains permanently all federal and state depository publications in print or microform. It also subscribes to major commercial documents reference publications, and when feasible, to non-depository, commercially published microfiche documents.

The Indiana State Library assists Indiana's libraries and citizens in many ways:

- taking a leadership role in coordination with and communication among depository libraries within the state
- providing a back-up depository collection
- assisting with documents reference and referral, interlibrary loan, and duplication
- helping to solve depository processing problems, such as missing shipping lists
- providing assistance in the disposal and transfer of documents
- supporting the Government Documents and Information Subcommittee
- sponsoring workshops and training sessions and providing consultation and guidance.

Final authority for the management and control of the Library is vested in the five people comprising the Indiana Library and Historical Board. The members of this board are recommended by various historical and library organizations in Indiana, and are appointed by the Governor.

The State Library also depends on the advice and assistance of the 28 member Advisory Council, a broad-based council with representatives from all types and sizes of libraries, associations, and users of libraries. This Council consists of eight standing committees and subcommittees.

The advice of this Council and its committees is vital to the planning, development and evaluation of current problems and future needs.

## The Role of the Selective Depository Libraries

Both federal and state depository libraries are responsible for providing access to government documents and information to the people and organizations in their areas. Depository libraries establish collection development and circulation policies that meet the needs of their clientele. It is through these libraries that the goals and objectives of this plan will be met.

## The Role of the Indiana Library Association's Government Documents Division

The professional association's division acts as a forum for discussing and promoting documents and provides programs for continuing education for documents librarians, as well as programs about documents for all libraries. Division representatives prepare articles about documents for *Focus on Indiana Librarians*.

## The Role of the Government Documents and Information Subcommittee

This Subcommittee assists and advises the State Library on the implementation, review and revision of this plan. It also brings forward matters of concern to depository libraries, investigating and recommending solutions, and assists in the development of guidelines and procedures for depository libraries. The Subcommittee is part of the Indiana State Library Advisory Council's Network Coordinating Committee, and there are nine members representing both federal and state depository libraries as well as non-depository libraries. Members serve two-year, staggered terms and recommendations for membership are made by the Indiana Library Association Government Documents Division and the State Library. Administrative support for this Subcommittee is provided by the State Library.
