City records first murder of year

Kissimmee Police Department detectives are looking for details and clues into the city's first homicide case of 2013.

Police said 17-year-old David Guerrero, of Kissimmee, was shot just prior to sunrise Wednesday along North Central Avenue between Columbia and Donegan Avenue. He had been walking to a bus stop to go to work.

At approximately 6 a.m., officers responded to the area across Central Avenue from the Kissimmee Surgical Center and found Guerrero lying by the side of the road,

police spokesperson Stacie Miller said.

A witness who was headed into the medical center for a procedure called 911 after he heard a gun go off.

"A guy was walking down the sidewalk and a car went by and then it sounded like a gunshot, and the guy's laying here along the road," the witness said in the 911 call, adding that he was still alive after being shot and was "just moaning."

Guerrero was taken to a

hospital where he later died from his injuries.

Detectives were on the scene much of the day Wednesday, including well into the evening, but had no additional updates to report as of press time Friday. Police are urging anyone with information about the incident to contact the Kissimmee Police Department's Major Crimes Unit at 407-846-3333, by e-mail at seeitsayit@kissimmee.org or Crimeline at 1-800-423-TIPS (8477).

The homicide is one of a number of cases involving shootings being investigated within the last three days by KPD, the Osceola

County Sheriff's Office and the St. Cloud Police Department. On Tuesday, KPD officers responded to the Donegan Townhomes, about two miles away from the homicide scene, in reference to bullet holes found in five townhomes on Temple Grove Lane, and on Wednesday they investigated bullet holes that were found in homes on Smith Street and Lesesne Street in north Kissimmee.

Miller said detectives have not linked the incidents.

City proposes to lower rental fees

With major renovations complete on Kissimmee Lakefront Park, city commissioners and the Department of Parks and Recreation met to renew rental prices on pavilions, parks and meeting rooms, fees that haven't been touched since 2003.

The plan that Dan Loubier, director of Parks and Recreation, laid out at the June 21 workshop meeting set the downward trend for these new prices, with rental fees for civic center meeting rooms reduced by 15 percent and the community house by 40 percent. They also changed the prices to be all-inclusive, wrapping staff, utilities and space fees into one price.

But even with these changes, city commissioners said the fees for park space and pavilions should be lowered even further to ensure that everyone would have the chance to rent them. Commissioner Jose Alvarez compared Kissimmee rental prices to prices of parks in other counties, citing that many of them only climb as high as a hundred dollars.

"Kissimmee will have to think of everyone. Not just middle class and high class, we have to think of everyone. Everyone has the same right to be able to use the park," Alvarez said.

Other commissioners agreed, requesting a list of additional fees for anyone interested in renting park space for large events. Along with the base rental fee, Loubier also stated that additional fees apply to other departments, such as to police department for crowd control.

Park renting policies also were a concern, especially on consuming alcohol in the parks. According to city ordinance, alcohol

United Methodist church celebrating its 100th year in Kissimmee July 4

As a fourth generation Kissimmee resident and member of the First United Methodist Church, Kelly Trace draws a lot from her roots.

Her great-grandfather, Lee Rogers, laid the outside bricks of the of the church building in 1913, just a hundred years ago. Her grandparents have attended the church for 53 years, and Trace has been a part of it her whole life.

Now in 2013, Trace, along with her church, will celebrate the sanctuary's 100th anni-

versary July 4. It was the day that the cornerstone of the church was laid and the building completed, making it one of the oldest buildings in Kissimmee.

Like the July 4 celebration that happened with the completion of the building in 1913, the centennial celebration goes back to the church's beginnings with a southern barbecue, outdoor games and a pie judging as well as a pie-eating contest. Dwight Oaks, youth pastor and organizer for the celebration, says that it will commemorate the

church's history as well as look to its future, with a focus on the community that it has thrived on.

"It's not our church, it's their church - the people. They take a vested interest in the church," Oaks said.

For Trace, it is this sense of community that has kept her family going for the past 100 years, even as the church changed with the times. She is part of one of the three founding families that still attend the church, making this anni-

Community activist closing shop after 28 years

A person who may have had the biggest influence on one of Kissimmee's toughest neighborhoods never lived in the city as a resident.

While Gwendolyn Hill's modest business, Gwendolyn's Beauty and Barber Shop, may have been her work, career and income since 1984, her biggest challenges have come with making the neighborhood around her shop at the corner of Cypress

and Palmway Streets, just a block back from Orange Blossom Trail, less blighted by crime, drugs and the influences that come with that illegal activity.

When she closes up the shop today, that part of her life will end, as she will be giving up cutting and styling hair in order to start a new job working with the disabled closer to her Orange County home, where she "can be their eyes and ears."

While she put this move off for about six months, Hill said it's

come time for her to write her life's next chapter.

"Folks have been coming all week about me leaving, and I tell them, 'It's not goodbye. I will see you again,'" she said. "I have so much heritage here."

Much in the same way that she struggled and grappled to make the neighborhood around her shop a better place, the way Hill got the shop was a struggle. Already a young barber back home near Orlando, she stopped

Police, deputies working shootings across county

The Osceola County Sheriff's Office and both the Kissimmee and St. Cloud police departments have received numerous cases of gunshots fired this week, some which sent bullets into homes.

Law enforcement officials are now trying to find the suspects responsible for the countywide shootings.

According to a Sheriff's Office press release, detectives were investigating incidents where several shots were fired in the county over the last few days.

"At this time they are not connected to other active investigations within the Sheriff's Office or with active cases other law enforcement agencies are working, but detectives are sharing information and working with other law enforcement agencies to determine if there might be a link," said Sheriff's Office spokeswoman Twis Lizasuain in the press release.

On Tuesday at approximately 2:15 a.m., deputies responded to a Sugar Mill Lane home in St. Cloud. Deputies spoke with the homeowner who said that he was asleep when he heard a loud "bang." He observed damage to the outside of his home from what appeared to be a gunshot. Deputies discovered several casings and found additional damage to the homeowner's vehicle, which was parked in front of his home.

A vehicle parked nearby at 26 Brown Chapel Road had also been damaged from what appeared to be gunshots.

"This incident is similar to several cases the St. Cloud Police Department is investigating," Lizasuain said.

On June 27 at about 6:10 a.m. deputies responded to a North Lyndell Drive home in Kissimmee. The homeowner who said he was asleep when he heard a loud noise. He observed damage to the inside and outside of his residence from what appeared to be gunshots.

Kissimmee police were searching for shooting suspects Tuesday after bullet holes were found in eight different homes.

At about 10 a.m., Kissimmee police detectives responded to the Donegan Townhomes on Temple Grove Lane.

Bullet holes were found in five of the town houses, Kissimmee police reports stated, which appeared to have occurred during the overnight hours.

Neighbors said they did not report hearing gunshots and no one was injured during the incident.

At the same time, Kissimmee police detectives were investigating bullet holes that were found in two homes on Smith Street in north Kissimmee. While investigating those two homes, officers learned of additional bullet holes found in a home on Lesesne Street.

The victim, an adult female, stayed at the hotel, 4107 W. Vine St., for a few days. During her stay, she met Segar, who was also staying at the same hotel, said police spokesman Stacie Miller in a press release. Early Thursday morning, Segar bludgeoned the victim in an attempt to sexually batter her. When officers arrived, they airlifted the victim to the hospital. She was listed in stable condition.

Kissimmee shooter at large

Osceola County Sheriff's detectives are asking for the public's help in identifying an attempted robbery suspect who shot at a Kissimmee man.

Deputies responded Wednesday at approximately 9:13 a.m. to a home on Adriane Park Circle off of Neptune Road in Kissimmee. Deputies spoke with a victim who said he was walking to his front door after returning home from work when an unknown black male approached him at gunpoint. The suspect said something the victim couldn't understand. The victim retrieved his handgun and when he did, the suspect fired a shot at the victim, hitting him in the leg, Sheriff's Office spokesperson Twis Lizasuain said.

The victim reportedly fired several shots at the suspect before he fled the area. The Aviation Unit and K-9 Unit assisted with search but were unable to locate the suspect.

Anyone with information is asked to call the Osceola County Sheriff's Office at 407-348-2222 or Crimeline at 800-423-TIPS (8477). Calls made to Crimeline remain anonymous, and

tips that lead to the felony arrest of suspects and/or the recovery of stolen property and drugs are eligible for cash rewards of up to \$1,000.

Green laser light lands North Carolina man in jail

An Osceola County Sheriff's Office search for a pair of missing boaters on Shingle Creek was interrupted when a green laser light was pointed at an agency helicopter three times.

Ryan Lucas, 20, of North Carolina, was arrested Tuesday night and charged with pointing a laser device at a driver/pilot.

The incident began around 11 p.m. Tuesday, when deputies were in the middle of a search for a missing couple on Shingle Creek between Poinciana Boulevard and Bass Road. While the helicopter was searching the area, both pilot and observer reported that a green laser light blinded them three times. They located where the light was coming from and noticed several individuals in a swimming pool.

When deputies arrived at the location, a vacation rental property on Hideaway Beach Lane, Lucas went directly inside the house. Deputies were invited inside and asked to speak to Lucas. He gave deputies the laser light, saying that he "messed up and should not have shined the light at the helicopter," according to Sheriff's Office spokesperson Twis Lizasuain. He gave no explanation as to why he did it.

Based on his statement and evidence, deputies arrested Lucas and booked him in the Osceola County Jail.

The missing couple also was safely located.

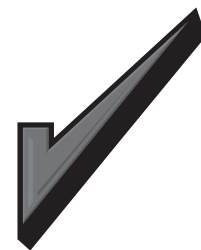

School District budget deficit will not lead to layoffs, school closings

While the students of the Osceola County School District are off enjoying their summer vacations, district officials have been hard at work tackling the budget for next the 2013-14 school year.

Chief Business and Finance Officer Todd Seis brought a preliminary budget that, while carrying a \$6.3 million deficit, would feature no school closings or reduction in employees. While the district has reserves in savings to shore up the deficit amount, its long-range plan is to be operating

in the black by the 2015-16 school year.

"We are controlling costs to make sure we adhere to that plan with the anticipation the state will continue to rebound from the economic downturn that will lead to additional funding for the district," Seis said.

At a budget workshop with Superintendent Melba Luciano and School Board members, he said the new budget is centered heavily on curriculum needs and professional development.

"We came up with something that will really get this district moving next year," he

said. The final numbers will likely change after July 30 when the Osceola County Property Appraiser's office will certify the final tax rolls, but the total funding from property taxes available to the district will be around \$375 million. That is \$6,542 per student. That figure is up from \$6,183 last year, but Seis said it is down from \$7,205 per student in the 2007-08 school year, before the economic downturn began.

"We still need to control our spending and appropriate our funds wisely," Seis said. "We were effective this

past year and we've gotten through some hard times, but we're still not to our levels from 2007-08."

He said the district needs to be operating in the black by 2015-16. Board Member Tim Weisheyer, a Realtor, gave a bit of optimistic news in that the county's total reported taxable value is \$17.75 billion as of May 30 and does not reflect the improving real estate market and property values that will continue to rise through the start of the new school year in the fall.

The new budget includes \$203,000 for school security

spending, including a driver's license-based visitor check-in system for all schools, new identification card-activated locks and new fencing to help direct traffic through main access points at schools that need it.

The final vote on the budget will come at the board's Sept. 3 meeting.

District staff reported that facilities are in good shape and are managing growth well. Two schools that ended this past school year over capacity, Kissimmee Elementary School and Celebration High School, have additions being built this summer that

will be ready to go when school bells ring again in August.

The district currently has three applications for charter schools open, and one of those schools will come online in August.

Avant Garde Academy of Osceola will open next school year, serving up to 300 students in grades six through nine in a storefront location on Michigan Avenue until its permanent location at 2880 N. Orange Blossom Trail, just south of Osceola Parkway at a former car dealership, is ready.

versary a more personal one to her.

Thinking about the legacy that her great-grandfather left has steered Trace to focus on her own. She was baptized at First United Methodist when she was 2-months-old, confirmed there when she was in the sixth grade and spent several years involved with the youth group until she attended college five years ago. Personally, the church community has become one that she has relied on, watching her grow up in the sanctuary.

Now in her mid-20s, she and some members that stayed in touch from youth group are giving back to the church by starting a new group called GenYsis, which is aimed at church members between the ages of 18 to 34 or 35. Coming back from college, Trace noticed that there wasn't an outlet for members her age to become involved again with the church. For many, that's because they don't become interested again until they start a family, but Trace saw members her age that wanted to stay involved more than just attending church every Sunday.

"I realized these last few years after I graduated that I will always be doing some-

thing that involves making my community better. While there are opportunities to do that through the city or the county or through non-profit groups, there's a lot of work that can be done through your church," Trace said.

It is this sense of community and outreach that both Oaks and Trace believe has kept the church thriving for the past 100 years. Not only people who just regularly attend church, but also part of a church community service group, either through prayer, donating time or donating items.

The First United Methodist Church's 100th anniversary celebration will start at 2 p.m. July 4 and end at 5 p.m. It is open to the public.

"Detectives have not been able to link this incident to the incidents on Temple Grove Lane," said police department spokeswoman Stacie Miller in a press release.

Anyone with information about these incidents is asked to contact the Kissimmee Police Department's Major Crimes Unit at 407-846-3333, by email at seeitsayit@kissimmee.org. Between Tuesday and Wednesday, St. Cloud police responded to three separate incidents in the

area of California Avenue and Lakeshore Boulevard after shots were reportedly fired.

"The St. Cloud Police Department wants the public to know that we have increased the neighborhood patrols and will continue to proactively patrol and maintain the safety of our neighborhoods," said Sgt. Denise Roberts in a press release. "At this time, we have no evidence that links incidents with the Kissimmee Police Department or the Osceola County Sheriff's Office together.

However, we are actively working and sharing information with both agencies."

in one day when visiting her Kissimmee family and asked about working there.

The comment, coming from a woman, got resistance from the male owner. After taking note of that — and an illegal dice game going on in the back room — she told him that she'd own that shop one day, which got even more resistance.

Turns out, all she had to do was wait him out. He was arrested soon after, and Hill arranged with the landlord to take over the shop. The 28 years between that and today have been a time when she's had no problem bringing attention to the neighborhood.

"This community is part of the city, just like anybody else. I would never want this to be a forgotten community," she said. "I hear the Pledge of Allegiance and the line, 'And justice for all' sticks with me. When will we be 'all'?"

By being the area's squeaky wheel, she's pointed out abandoned houses where drug activity clearly took place, pestered code enforcement to the point that the city demolished them to the sounds of bulldozers — and her applause.

"I've always been stressed about this neighborhood, and been begging for a light pole, brighter lights, sidewalks and signs," she said. "I like to say there were hard times that led to good times. It hasn't been easy; I've made lots of friends and a few

enemies. I'll look out the window one last time Saturday and I'll say my work is done."

The work keeping the drug and prostitution trades off her corner was constant and tireless, she said. She was instrumental in having signs installed reminding passers-by of the enhanced penalties for selling drugs within 1,000 feet of the church that's across the street from her shop. Eventually, she said, nobody would stand around the corner of Cypress and Palmway when she was there. She began taking her fight to the city of Kissimmee and attended its commission meetings to bring attention to the neighborhood's plight, to which again she met with a bit of resistance because she lived in Orlando.

"I told them, 'My business is in the 'hood, but the 'hood is not in me,'" she said. "I told the commissioners that prostitutes can't be out in front of my shop, and that their clientele is white. If they think it isn't their problem, whatever those johns bring back as far as arrests and disease will touch their families and neighborhood."

For the good of the block, Hill would reach out to whom-ever she thought could help, even imploring the Osceola County Sheriff's Office to help.

"Gwendolyn was active and involved in her community and always seeking ways to improve

cannot be consumed in the parks, unless gaining permission from the sheriff, in the case of private parties, or going through a certified city vendor for bigger events.

But, it is this one city vendor that has commissioners concerned. Both Commissioners Cheryl Grieb and Alvarez expressed worry of vendors taking their events elsewhere with such a restrictive choice of alcohol vendors, and especially one tied to the city. Loubier stated that the reason behind this restriction is so the Department of Parks and Recreation can regulate the consumption of alcohol in Osceola parks and prevent any liabilities due to alcohol-related incidents on park grounds.

Going forward, Loubier

and others at the Department of Parks and Recreation are evaluating other community's fees and charges, sending a comparison list to the city commissioners in a few weeks. The department is for working with the city, and supports the lower fee change.

"Potentially, it could increase the usage, and that could potentially, even with lesser fees, if the usage is higher we might be able to generate as much or more revenue," Loubier said.

Along with this comparison list, the city officials will talk with City Attorney Don Smallwood and police about any possible changes in the alcohol ordinance to give potential vendors a wider choice of alcohol sellers.

The city will review the fees again next month.

'Matriarch' of OHS softball team succumbs to cancer

The family-oriented Osceola High softball program lost its matriarch early Thursday morning when Victoria Coffey, the wife of Coach George Coffey, succumbed after a two-year battle with ovarian cancer.

Victoria Coffey, 54, was a fixture at OHS softball games the past 15 years as the team's scorekeeper and the its "mom".

"The kids just love her, and she loves being with them," George Coffey said during the softball season, which ended in early May.

Coffey paid homage to his wife shortly after her death with this Facebook entry:

"God received another angel in heaven this morning...I will truly miss this wonderful wife, mother, partner and friend. For all of you who were touched by her kindred spirit and kind heart, you know exactly what I mean.

My love goes out to this lady who has been such a big part of my life for the last 15 years. Rest in Peace, my love."

Victoria's struggle with the disease took a turn for the worse early this year, but she still attended games before the effects of her illness no longer allowed it.

Roger Jones, a close friend of the family, said Victoria Coffey, a successful hair stylist, proved to be a tremendous influence on the many young women who played in Coffey's softball program and especially so after she was diagnosed with cancer.

"The girls always had a special bond with her, and this year's team was especially close to her because of what she was going through. They were going through it with her," Jones said. "George has never been about wins and losses with his softball program, it's always been about life lessons. Victoria could not have been a better role model

for those girls with the way she handled his. Despite what she was going through, she always kept a positive attitude and she set an example that those of us who were fortunate enough to know her will never forget."

Even though she was seriously ill, Victoria Coffey insisted on having a birthday celebration in April.

"There were probably more than 100 people there, and Victoria welcomed them all and she had a great time with it," Jones said.

Students in George Coffey's grounds keeping class at OHS honored Victoria in April by creating a garden for her behind the team's dugout at the OHS softball field.

The students raised the money and completed the job in just four days.

"I still have a hard time talking about that," George Coffey said recently. "That just is an indication of what (Victoria) means to our kids and how

Bass fishing slows

Soon I'll be fishing farm ponds in northeast Iowa. I might even walk some small streams to see if I can catch some smallmouth bass.

Our granddaughter is getting married so we'll be heading north when the time comes.

This past week bass fishing has been a little slower than it's been recently. Some fishermen will tell you it's because of the full moon.

The bass feed all night during that time. They might be right; I know I've been going out at first light and catching a few bass, but when that sun gets up a little, it gets slow in a hurry.

Lately I've had my best fishing out in open water hydrilla. If you go out and watch your depth finder, eventually you'll see some grass on the bottom. Try to locate an edge and you

should catch some fish.

I'm still catching the bass early on top water baits. After the sun is up, I switch to a speed worm on a 10-inch June bug worm and just cover some water.

I've had some success on a swim jig if there are schoolers around.

There is still a lot of water flowing into Toho. The water is pouring out of the East Lake canal and out of Shingle Creek. Usually you will see some schoolers around running water, so that should be a good place to check.

Pan fishing is still good. Specs, bluegills and shell crackers are hitting. Marker 26 and the open water east of Makinson Island are your best bet.

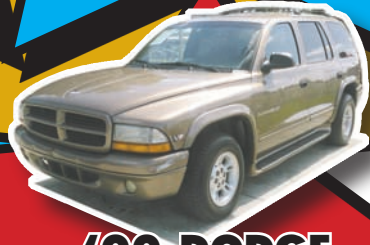

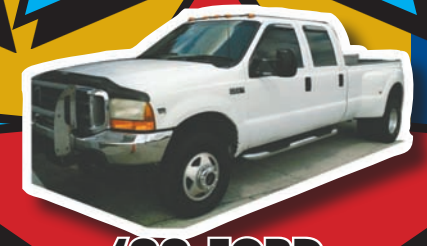

Atlantis soars again in space

Space Center has stellar attraction with the opening of Atlantis shuttle exhibit

The Kennedy Space Center has got itself an "E" ticket attraction.

In the competitive world of theme parks, with Harry Potter at Universal, and Disney's New Fantasyland grabbing all the headlines, how does the home to America's space program compete? They bring in the Space Shuttle Atlantis.

Years in the making, this new "theater" setting for Atlantis is as dramatic as it is breathtaking. And as of this weekend, it is open to everyone.

Atlantis is the focal point of a \$100 million, 90,000-square-foot attraction containing four multimedia and cinematic productions and more than 60 interactive experiences. But the thing you will remember, is that first view of Atlantis, floating in the sky, so close, you can almost touch it.

Central Floridians are fortunate. There are only three space shuttles on exhibit in the world and the Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex is one of those places.

Shimmering in orange and gold, just like the fiery glow of Atlantis' reentry into the atmosphere, the giant building housing Atlantis can be seen looming in the distance, long before you reach the gate to the space center.

At the entrance, guests are greeted by a full-scale, 184-foot-tall vertical replica of the space shuttle's external tank and two solid rocket boosters.

Inside, there is, as every theme park fan expects, the preshow. This one is an informative look at the 30-year space shuttle program and the thousands who made the five space-flown shuttles — Columbia, Challenger, Discovery, Atlantis and Endeavour possible.

Finally, the screen disappears and in one of the most dramatic reveals you will ever see, the

Atlantis appears, and it is the real thing.

Even former NASA Astronaut James Reilly, who flew in Atlantis and has logged more than 853 hours in space, including 5 spacewalks was amazed at the dramatic setting. Reilly and other astronauts will also be on hand Saturday for the public grand-opening of the new attraction.

"It is really impressive," said Reilly.

The astronaut said he was particularly moved when he first looked up and saw the sun rise across a giant screen that helps with the illusion that Atlantis is still up there, flying in space.

"It really brought back memories," of an Atlantis spacewalk where Reilly

said he actually had the time to look up at the Earth as Atlantis orbited around the slowly spinning planet.

The actual orbital experience takes about every 90 minutes in space, but in the Atlantis theater, is recreated every 12 minutes of the 20-by-110-foot LED backdrop to the spacecraft.

It is almost a 360-degree look at Atlantis as visitors can view the shuttle from above and winding downward, from below as well.

The view of Atlantis is one that only an astronaut in space would have had, Atlantis tilted on its side, its payload bay doors open and robotic

arm extended as if it had just undocked from the International Space Station.

Walking down the ramp, the underside view shows in detail, the burned tiles from Atlantis' reentry into the atmosphere.

Earlier this week, when some center visitors were surprised with a sneak preview of Atlantis, it was already mission accomplished for Tim Macy, the director of development and construction for the massive project.

"I knew what we did was working when I heard a kid say

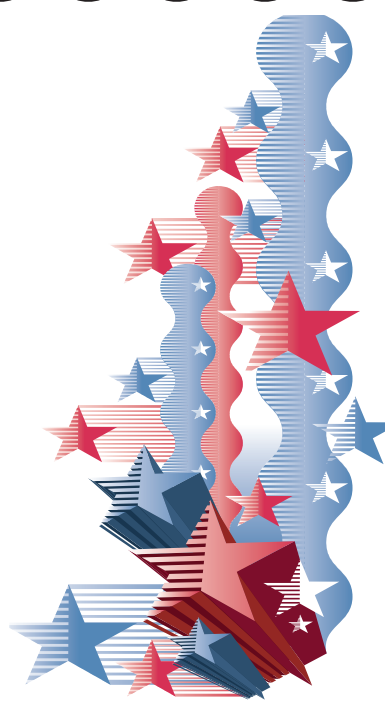
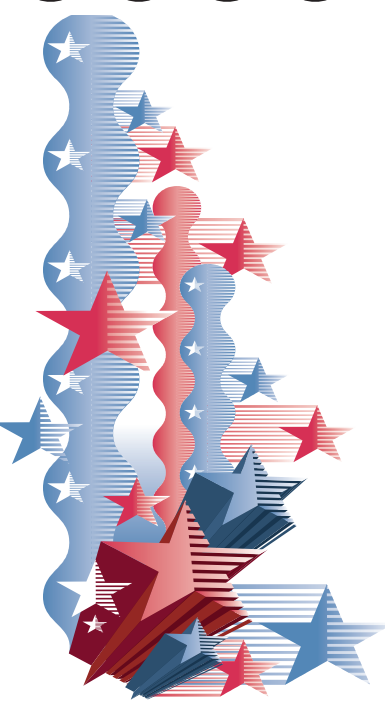

But Reilly is hopefully the Atlantis exhibit will be an inspiration for all Americans to go back to space, particularly youngsters.

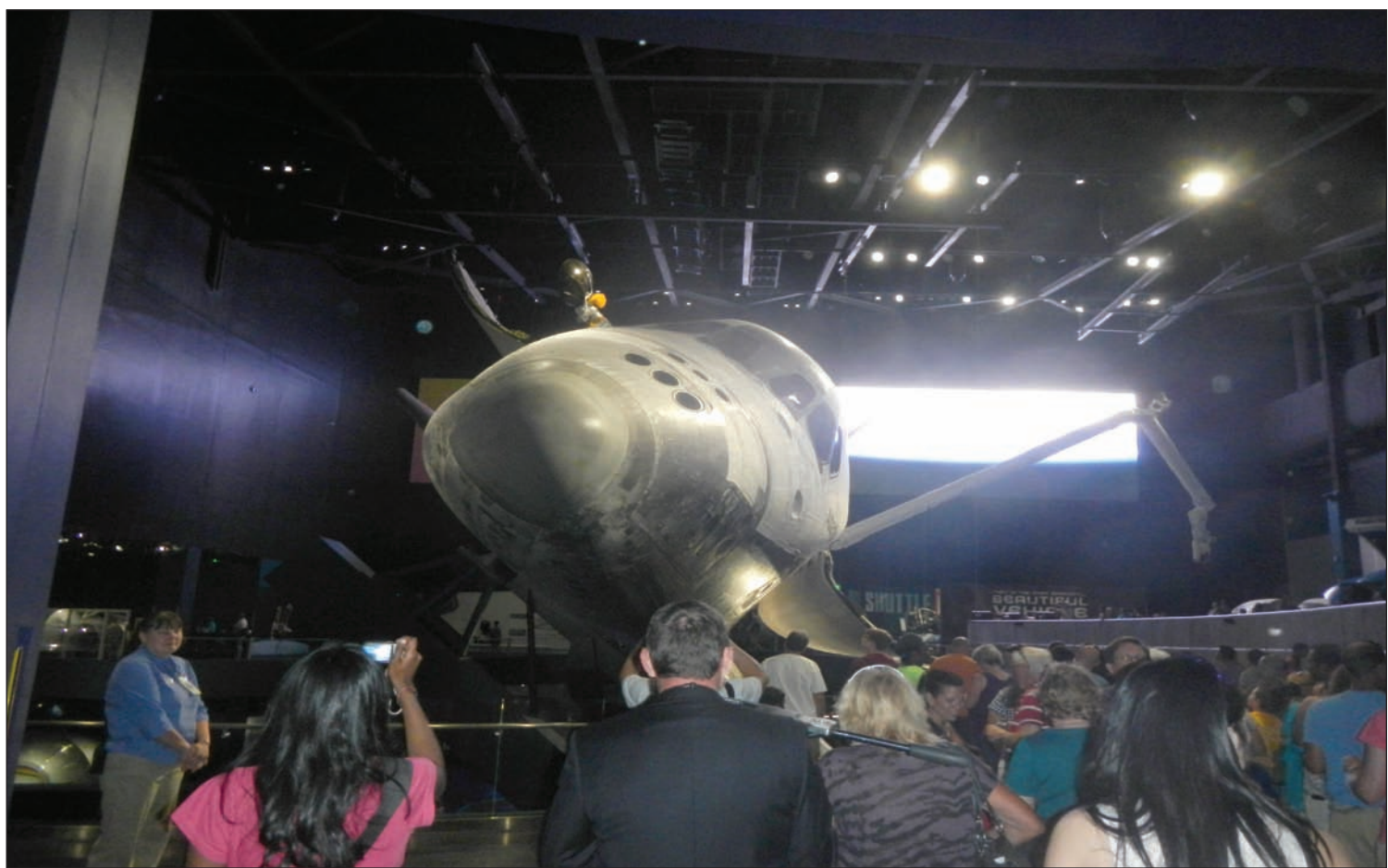
