

Board preparing 'prayer circle' policy

ORANGE PARK – Clay County schools officials say they are within weeks of adopting new guidelines for handle "prayer circles" at four elementary schools. Hanlin has gratitude for supporters

ORANGE PARK – After showing two inquisitive youngsters the scar where a bullet entered his left bicep, Clay County Sheriff's Office Det. Matt Hanlin rolled his arm over to reveal a much bigger mark left by surgeons who replaced a severely damaged section of artery with a piece taken from his leg.

Below the 6-inch surgical scar is the mark of an exit wound left by the bullet that nearly ended Hanlin's life, a permanent reminder of what can go terribly wrong even with the best of training.

Another bullet, fired by a suspected meth lab operator either a split second before or after Hanlin was shot during a drug raid, took the life of Det. David White, Hanlin's narcotics team partner of five years.

Hanlin shrugged off any notion that he's a hero during a fundraiser held for him at

Magnolia Springs had one of the first golf courses

At the Magnolia Springs Hotel just south of Governors Creek and on the bank of the St. Johns River was Clay County's biggest and best of the 1800s tourist hotels. Built in 1881, Bostonian Isaac Crufts' hostelry had all the latest bells and whistles including one of the nation's earliest nine-hole golf courses.

The hotel's extensive brochure touted it as "probably the best golf course in Florida" and claimed it "closely resembled the best Scottish links". The course was approximately a mile and a half long and was supervised by professional golfer and instructor Philip H. Honeyman.

The sport of golf was just catching on in the United States but the game had been around since at least the middle 1400s because it was then that James II of Scotland banned both golf and football. It seems they were interfering with archery practice necessary to defend the realm. The guests at Magnolia were mightily enthusiastic about the sport too.

They teed off swinging hickory shafted clubs with heads of iron or other various exotic woods. These were a big improvement over the crooks that bored shepherds near St. Andrews in Scotland are supposed to have used to hit rocks into rabbit holes and start the whole thing.

The Sears and Roebuck catalog sold gutta percha balls, manufactured from the hardened gum of a tree in Malaya, for \$3.50 a dozen. Putters, mashy and niblick clubs and lofting irons were \$1.25 each from the catalog giants in the 1800s.

Golfers at the Magnolia Resort Hotel faced the challenge of rolling terrain and fairways that wouldn't pass for roughs these days. There was more than likely no call for sand traps as the whole course was more sand than grass. The main hazard to overcome was the railroad track which split the course with the first two holes and the last three holes on the east side tracks and the middle four holes on the west side.

The hotel's charming Victorian train station for guests arriving by rail was perched right in the middle of the course. Play stopped when the train pulled into the station and players waited while baggage and new arrivals were loaded onto the hotel's mule drawn railcar for the short trip

through the pine woods to the hotel.

Golf has changed a lot since those days. Balls go farther and last longer, the assortment of clubs is endless, and courses are lush and difficulty is intentionally designed. But in the old days you could buy all the clubs and balls you needed for under \$10 and at the Magnolia Hotel they might let you drive the mule cart on the way back to the hotel.

Fertilizer best applied in April, not March, study finds

Perhaps you have heard that recent results from a seven-year experiment conducted by University of Florida turf research scientists has demonstrated that our Northeast Florida grasses go through a spring "root renewal" period each year. During this time, old roots decline in number as new roots come on to replace them. There is a period each spring when grass roots are just not there in

sufficient numbers to take up the fertilizer that is applied then. As a result, rather than being used by the lawn (which is what we intend) the fertilizer just sits there or (more likely) is leached through rain or irrigation out of the reach of the roots and then enters our surface waters as a pollutant. This is not a good thing because this impacts water quality causing problems for fish and often leads to massive algae blooms. It certainly encourages rapid growth of some of our more invasive aquatic weeds such as Duckweed. Hydrilla and Water Hyacinth.



In our area this all happens in March so as a result, the UF is now advising that we should not fertilizer our lawns during the month of March but instead wait until mid April. This will help protect the quality of our ponds, rivers and other water bodies. Why apply fertilizer if the grass does not have enough roots to even take it up? It is

a waste of money and environmentally destructive.

There are other ways we can help to protect our surface waters from unnecessary pollution and as lawn owners, it is our responsibility to do so because it is we who are doing the most polluting – not farmers as many would have us believe. Here are some suggested "Florida-Friendly" practices when it comes to fertilizing:

Use fertilizers where the middle number (phosphorus) is no longer larger than two – we have so much phosphorus in our soils it is rarely needed in Northeast Florida.

Use slow release nitrogen fertilizers (at least 30% of content) so that the fertilizer resists leaching until it can be more efficiently taken up.

If you fertilizer near a driveway, roadway, or waters edge use a deflector plate on one side so the fertilizer cannot go over into that adjacent area – after all you want it on the grass – not on hard surfaces or in to water.

If fertilizer does get thrown over to a hard surface, sweep it up and spread it back on the lawn where it belongs. On the hard surface it can only be picked up by rain and travel to a nearby water body through storm water collection systems – not good!

If you live near water, do not fertilizer within 10 feet of the water's edge. Let grass in that area serve as a buffer to take up the fertilizer before it can get to the water. Even better – plant some alternative-to-grass ground cover along the water's edge such as low growing Juniper, Mondo (Liriope) Lilyturf or Asiatic Jasmine which do not need to be fertilized. This is even more critical if your lawn slopes toward the water.

So there are some of the tips to help preserve Florida's water quality. It is in our best interest that we do this. Water is too critical to Florida to ignore how we are polluting it.

Council formally abolishes town's sanitation dept.

ORANGE PARK – Despite opposition from scores of residents during the past year, town council members have abolished the town's sanitation department by approving a contract with a private company that lowers residential and commercial rates for garbage, trash and recycling pickup.

The council voted 3-2 to enter into a contract with Advanced Disposal during a council meeting Tuesday, March 20, ending months of often emotional debate that included protests from groups of residents who said they were willing to pay higher collection fees in order to keep about 13 sanitation department workers who they have come to know and trust.

Council members Margaret "Marge" Hutton, Jim "J.B." Renninger and Steve Howard voted in favor of the seven-year contract, which carries a five-year option and an estimated annual value of \$829,000. Mayor Pete Morgan and Councilman Gary Meeks voted no.

Residents will begin paying lower monthly sanitation fees -- from \$29.52 to \$25—when the contract begins on June 1. Commercial rates per cubic yard will drop from \$9.19 to \$4.06.

The contract calls for the same twicea-week garbage and weekly trash and recycling service, but perhaps more importantly, guarantees that all sanitation department employees will be offered jobs by Advanced Disposal. Should any of the affected employees not be eligible to work for the company, they will be retained by the town, according to Town Manager Cindy Hall.

"There is no employee who won't have



a job unless they desire not to have a job," she said.

Workers who choose to retire or quit their jobs will receive severance packages that include cash payouts for unused vacation time and sick leave. The council voted 3-2 to include those terms as part of a "separation assistance" addendum to the contract during Tuesday's meeting. Morgan and Howard voted against the package.

Council members also voted unanimously to place into escrow a total of \$1 million from the sanitation department's unused transition costs and the \$553,000 Advanced Disposal has agreed to pay the town for its sanitation vehicles. That measure came after six residents expressed concern about the town's ability to provide its own sanitation services in the future if privatization doesn't work.

Advanced Disposal, which is headquartered in Jacksonville, has 1,400 employees who provide services in 162 cities and counties throughout six states, including Clay County. Spokeswoman Tammy Wilson said after Tuesday's meeting that her company serves 36,000 households in Clay County but averages only three customer complaints per day.

She also said she is looking forward to starting a new contract with Orange Park. "We'll work very hard to meet or exceed

their current services," Wilson said.

Hall said Advanced Disposal was "very receptive" to ideas and concerns presented by the town throughout the negotiation



Marine Corps League helps community

By a resolution of the Second Continental Congress came the birth of the United States Marine Corps on November 10, 1775, at Tuns Tavern in Philadelphia. Marine's first engagement in the American Revolution-

ary War began a history of a disciplined, elite fighting force. The annals of warfare include Marine engagements



in the War of 1812, The Civil War, World Wars I and II, Korea, Vietnam, Global War on Terrorism, Persian Gulf War, Iraq War, and ongoing Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan). When the Marine warrior ends his service to his country he returns home. There he has many opportunities to further his service; to his community.

The Marine Corps League was founded in 1923 by World War I hero Marine Lieutenant General John A. Lejeune and subsequently chartered by an act of the Seventy Fifth Congress of the United States and approved and signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt on August 4, 1937. General Roy S. Geiger Detachment #1047, Marine Corps League of Clay County was formed in May 2002 by ten community service oriented Marines. Today that number has grown to eighty-seven Marines and Fleet Marine Force Navy Corpsmen. The Marine Corps League of Clay County is a 501 C 3, non-profit veterans service organization that supports Marines, FMF Navy Corpsmen and their families, other veterans and promotes community involvement.

Major projects include the nationally recognized Toys 4 Tots program, locally instituted Soles 4 Tots, monthly visits to the Robert H. Jenkins veterans domiciliary in Lake City, and scholarship awards to two graduating students from each of the seven Clay County high schools. The Marines provide color guards and participate in community parades. Each year they present certificates of achievement to Boy Scouts earning the distinction of Eagle Scout. Supporting the Wounded Warrior/ Injured Marine Semper Fi Fund is an ongoing project. Marines and FMF Navy Corpsmen provide military funeral honor guard services for fallen comrades. These are merelya token of the community projects engaged by the members.

Coalition urges Sunday liquor sales change

It is time for a change in Clay County. For decades, we have been losing out on tax revenue, business revenue and convenience because of an old rule that doesn't allow those in Clay County to sell or serve alcohol before 2 p.m. on Sundays.

Our restaurants, bars, liquor stores, golf courses, convenience stores and grocery stores have been put at a major disadvantage to businesses in surrounding towns and counties. I am a lifelong Clay County resident and my family has been the proud owner of Whitey's Fish Camp since the early 1960s. I love owning a business in Clay County, but now I would love for my County to be on a level playing field when it comes to Sunday alcohol sales. This rule was put in place more than 20 years ago, before the Jaguars came to Northeast Florida and before many of our neighborhoods were built. We need this to change.

After talking with my fellow business owners and managers, we decided we needed to take the initiative. Dale Eggers of The Roadhouse/Foremost Liquors, Troy Albers of Fleming Island Golf Club and I got together to craft our plan on how we can make the change and allow Sunday alcohol sales to be the same as every other day of the week. We crafted an initiated ordinance with the help of others and after a few times back and forth, our petition was approved by the Supervisor of Elections.

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

City ordinance sets limits on Internet cafes'

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – So-called "Internet cafés" that feature on-line gambling came under final regulation of a city ordinance Tuesday, March 20.

The new law, drafted to comply with new Clay County regulations, says that the establishments must be 1,000 feet away from any church, school, child-care center or military installation and 5,000 feet away from each other.

The city's three existing cafés do not comply with the second provision and one of them fails the first test, but the new ordinance declares them to be "non-conforming" establishments, granting them permission to stay in business.

In other business, the council:

* Signed an agreement with United States Media TV, Inc. of Coral Springs for the city to participate in a "Today in America" video series with former Pittsburgh Steelers quarterback Terry Bradshaw, who is a Fox TV commentator.

The show is proposed to air on Fox or Discovery Channel, after which the city



will own its own segment of the series.

* Witnessed the promotion of police Officer Derek Asdot to sergeant. His wife, Angela, pinned his new badge on him.

* Presented a commendation certificate to employees Tim Hughes, Mike Le Blanc, Mike Williams and Huey James for their enterprising development over two years of new processes at the city's two wastewater treatment plants.

Their work placed the city in compliance with Florida Department of Environment Protection orders that were expected to require construction of a \$6 million new treatment plant.

Mayor Debbie Ricks declared, "Every citizen of Green Cove Springs owes you men a vote of thanks."

The next City Council meeting will be at 7 p.m. April 3 in City Hall.



Episcopal Diocese closes historic St. Margaret's Church

FLEMING ISLAND -- With a dwindling congregation of about 40 members and a shortage of funds, St. Margaret's Episcopal Church, Hibernia, on Fleming Island officially closed its doors after holding its last worship service March 4.

The closing left some members surprised and upset, one parishioner said.

"The congregation is very upset about this -- they were doing everything they


could, but it wasn't enough ... People were crying," said Anna Grass, who attended the final service. "Some of these people had been there for 30 years."

The church's Pine Avenue campus includes an original Carpenter Gothic chapel, built in 1878 with its adjoining cemetery. The chapel is one of the five oldest wooden church buildings still in use in Florida.

St. Margaret's Episcopal Church and the cemetery are on the National Register of Historic Places. As part of the restructuring, the Diocese said it will take into account the historical significance of the chapel.

"I don't think that a part of the plan is to do anything to disturb the historical nature of that space," said Doug Walker, the Bishop's deputy for advancement/executive director of Episcopal Foundation. "It is our intent to keep it as a worship space."

In the meantime, the Diocese will maintain the church grounds and pay the bills for the church. "Typically, that is the case



for churches that are unable to fund any of their current operating expenses -- the Diocese will pick those up," said Walker.

The remaining members of St. Margaret's have been welcomed into the parish community at other area Episcopal churches. In addition, neighboring Episcopal clergy members have offered to work with the bishop to hold worship services in the historic chapel during the restructuring.

The Rev. Kimberly Still conducted the final service at the church that has struggled financially in recent years. The Episcopal Diocese of Florida said in a news release that it was "restructuring" the church.

In late February, the Right Rev. Samuel Johnson Howard, Bishop of Florida, received a request from St. Margaret's vestry - its parish governing board - which had decided that the church as presently managed and configured was no longer sustainable as a parish. The request included the vestry's desire to hold final worship services on March 4.

"God willing, this will not mark the end of the ministry of St. Margaret's, but will, rather, provide an opportunity for prayer, conversation and the seeking of Divine guidance with regard to the future of this wonderful and historic parish," Bishop Howard said in the release.

The Diocese said that the remaining members of St. Margaret's have been welcomed into the parish community at other area Episcopal churches.

In addition, neighboring Episcopal clergy members have offered to work with the bishop to establish an alternative worship schedule for services to be held in the historic chapel.

Is there is a possibility that the church will reopen? "It is our desire to hold occasional and special services at St. Margaret's after some period of discernment for the space, which will encompass a study of the needs of the surrounding community and the Diocese," said Walker.

Bishop Howard said, "I remain committed to the future of St. Margaret's, while mindful that this parish must change in order to meet the challenges before it."

Board chairman's spouse blasts wife's critic

FLEMING ISLAND – The husband of the Clay County School chairman lambasted a frequent critic of the School Board on Thursday, March 15, reciting up the man's criminal history and offering his version of a December confrontation with the man.

James Studdard, the husband of Chairman Carol Studdard, also used the time granted during a 10-minute citizen's presentation near the end of Thursday's meeting to accuse School Board member Charlie Van Zant Jr. of not offering a public apology to him over what happened at the prior board meeting.

Reading from a prepared statement, James Studdard focused on a confrontation he and his wife had with Stanley Pfenning of Clay Hill at the December meeting. Pfenning, upset that the board chairman hadn't allowed him to speak, walked up to the Studdards during a break at the December meeting. Told by "I asked him not to do it, but he is a citizen who has a right to defend himself. He was defamed ... and no public apology was given."

deputies to get away, Pfenning turned but then "walked aggressively toward my wife," James Studdard said.

James Studdard said he told Pfenning to stay back, using a profanity in his command. Pfenning had a digital camera to capture the incident and posted it on YouTube.

Clearly upset by the incident and Pfenning's comments and subsequent emailed references about his wife as "Mao Tse Studdard", James Studdard said Thursday he wanted to set the record straight. He also chastised Van Zant for using Pfenning to personally attack him. Van Zant later offered a private apology but not a public one, he said. "That is unacceptable," James Studdard said.

Hearing James Studdard's comments – including reading verbatim from a felony arrest report narrative – was too much for Board member Lisa Graham, who got up and left Thursday's meeting without comment. It was also too much for Pfenning, who began saying "liar" as Studdard read from the report.

When Pfenning refused to be quiet, board Chairman Studdard asked two sheriff's deputies at the meeting to escort him out. Pfenning left without incident, but not before James Studdard walked past him, glared and tapped a handful of police reports he had taken with him to the podium.

Pfenning has been a monthly speaker at the School Board meetings since October when he demanded time to speak at workshop where public comments aren't allowed. At the February meeting he addressed the board at least five

* Heard Board member Janice Kerekes and Van Zant continue their dispute from last month over whether Van Zant sufficiently attended a January legislative workshop enough to be reimbursed nearly \$1,000 by the district. At Thursday's meeting Kerekes asked for board time to address board reimbursement policies, noting that "travel expenses are for official business only" and that board members must provide an agenda, dates, times and fees of what they attended.

"I was outraged when I saw that Mr. Van Zant was seeking reimbursement for a conference he barely attended," she said.

Van Zant responded that he went directly from a school event in Orange Park to Tallahassee, arriving there after midnight. He said he met the next morning with a state senator working on a bill affecting students' First Amendment rights and had other meetings throughout the day.

The legislative workshop is for "new" School board members and influence legislation, he said. "We don't go to Tallahassee to sit around with other School Board members," he said. "I'm pretty up to date on things ... I came in the back (of the meeting room) while you all were sitting up there all nicely together."

Van Zant said he refunded the conference registration fee. But that didn't quell Kerekes.

"You did the right thing in reimbursing the registration fee," she said. "It's a shame you had to be called out about it in the first place."

times, including giving a 10-minute power point presentation on what he believes are questionable copying fees for School Board documents. On Thursday he gave yet another 10-minute presentation on "A More Open and Transparent Clay County School Board."

But Pfenning's ongoing demands for information – and alleged verbal mistreatment of district employees – led to his emails being blocked and his phone calls not being answered. In February, Superintendent Ben Wortham said Pfenning's called the district office nearly 30 times in less than three hours in a single day.

She also urged board members to stop attacking one another and work together.

"Just this week Rev. Baker has gone to

two schools and asked for sign in sheets and told them that he planned to resume the prayer circles after spring break," Wortham said. "This would break a 'gentleman's agreement' we had with him to suspended the prayer circles."

Clay schools are on spring break this week. In December, Baker agreed to suspend the prayers circles at Clay Hill, Lake Asbury, Shadowlawn and Charles E. Bennett elementary schools until the district held a workshop and created a policy. Board members held the workshop Feb. 29 with two attorneys considered experts on constitutional law involving prayer in public schools.

Board member Charlie Van Zant Jr., who wants Baker to continue to have access to the schools, urged board Chairman Carol Studdard and Wortham to contact Baker.

Studdard held out hope that Baker, pastor of the Russell Road Baptist church, would give the board more time.

"I will talk to Rev. Baker," she said. "We are moving in the right direction ... It may take a little more patience. I am sure Rev. Baker has the patience."

Board attorney Bruce Bickner outlined a proposed "facilities use agreement" on Thursday that would provide Baker and his supporters with guidelines while also helping the district avoid a potential legal challenge from organizations wanting to keep prayer out of public schools.

All groups wanting access to school grounds:

Must begin their activity no later than 35 minutes before classes start and can meet for only 10 minutes in a designated area, creating a "buffer zone" for children who would not want to participate.

Must fill out a facilities use form and provide the district with proof of liability insurance.

Must receive a facilities use "license" good for only five months subject to approve by the superintendent and must reapply each time.

No group would have "seniority" status or any privileges above others and only one adult who does not have a child in the school can represent the group. No additional "outside adults" can attend the gathering, the policy states.

Bickner said the policy adequately addresses the concerns of both sides and takes into account the recommendations of the expert attorneys from the workshop.

"This is not going to make everybody happy but you're not going to be miserable either," said Bickner, who later added, "I think the approach we have here is correct."

Bickner said this is district first policy controlling before-school events at elementary schools.

Van Zant challenged the policy, maintaining the workshop attorneys agreed that Baker could come onto the school grounds now for the prayer circle.

"No they did not," Bickner said. "There is no right of anyone to come onto the school grounds and do whatever he wants."

The board will received the proposed policy in April. If approved, it would be published in a legal notice and could be formally adopted in May just before the end of the school year.

Studdard noted that while a delay in

Business Developer wants to build indoor gun range

ORANGE PARK -- Things look to be on target for the construction of an indoor shooting range in Clay County.

Franklin Dickinson, developer of the Jefferson Crossings strip mall at 179 College Drive, said he has plans to build an indoor shooting range and gun store in the back section of the mall.

The path toward building the range and store came a step closer to reality at the Feb. 28 County Commission meeting when the commissioners voted 5-0 to approve an amendment to the county's Land Development Code that would add indoor shooting ranges as a conditional use in the business zoning BB-2.

While Dickinson still needs to submit final plans to the county for its approval, he said he is taking great care in his plans to make sure the range and store will be quiet, safe and an asset to the community. With that in mind, the plans call for a unique design by architect Thor Heinrichs.

"We will literally be building a building within a building," Dickinson said.

the 5,000-square-foot shooting range with 10 lanes, while the adjacent Unit 5 will be the 1,250-square-foot store and office. All of the units will be gutted to complete the construction, which will include a second roof and solid concrete walls three feet inside the original building. On the back side, where the bullets hit, there will be a stateof-the art bullet trap, called a "snail trap," Dickinson said.

"The bullets fired will enter the trap and be forced into a large cylinder where it will decelerate until it stops moving," he said. The gun store will offer pistols, rifles and shot guns for sale as well as educational material. There will also be a gunsmith on site as well as a custom holstermaker.

Dickinson said he plans to start with three full-time employees and four parttime, and will be hiring "expert instructors." Patrons will be able to receive basic live fire instruction and take the steps to receive their concealed weapon license.

The range and store will be called "Basics: Range and Gun," with the basics being "God, family and community," Dickinson said, adding, "Basics are what made our country great."

Special attention will be paid to members of the military and law enforcement at Basics.

"I really want to be a blessing to our law enforcement and our military and therefore active duty, retired and disabled members of the military, fire and police departments and their spouses will get deep discounts," Dickinson said.

Dickinson said he hopes to open the range by August.

Skate Station on Monday, March 19 -- one month after his partner was laid to rest at a funeral attended by thousands of police and mourners.

"I'm not a hero," he said in front of TV cameras set up outside the rink, where CCSO deputies often work off-duty. "My [narcotics] team is a hero, and the people who saved my life that night, they're the heroes."

The man suspected of shooting White and Hanlin was shot and killed moments later by other members of the narcotics team investigating a suspected meth lab inside a Middleburg home.

Details of the Feb. 16 incident aren't available because the Florida Department of Law Enforcement is continuing its investigation.

Hanlin said he has been "overwhelmed" by the attention he and David White's family have received as he talked to reporters, fellow deputies and the general public during the three-hour fundraiser held jointly by Skate Station management, the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 104 and the CCSO.

"I want to thank the community," he said. "I want them to know how overwhelming the support has been, and how much it's appreciated."

Hanlin recently returned to work, but has been assigned light duty until he completes another six to eight months of physical therapy.

The \$2,500 raised at Skate Station will help him, his wife and their two teenage children pay living expenses until the 37-year-old detective can again augment

his income by working overtime and offduty jobs. Though he isn't physically ready to return to the narcotics team or similar duty, Hanlin says he is mentally and emotionally prepared despite the tragedy of losing "a good friend" whose family members – including White's wife and their two young children -- have requested as much privacy as possible.

"Obviously you're going to think about

things a little differently – do things a little bit differently every time you have a similar situation," Hanlin said. "But I'm proud of my team. They saved my life. They stayed calm and did their job."






Two-base hits flavor of the month for area baseball

Area tracksters take on two meets in two days

Creekside Knight Relays on Friday/Bob Hayes on Saturday

CLAY COUNTY- Clay County track athletes, highlighted by a double sprint win by Oakleaf's Audreana Bussey and hurdle wins by teammates Amia Carter and Raven Mimms, took a second place finish at the Creekside High School Knight Relays track meet held Friday, March 16.

At Creekside, Oakleaf's girls squad picked up 86 team points to finish second behind Creekside's 123 with Fleming Island third with 35, Ridgeview 11th with 22.5 and Middleburg 16th with 10.

In the boys competition, Ridgeview's Rvean Mastin continued his assault on a possible 24 foot long jump with a winning 23-foot, 6-inch leap to win that event. The state's best jump as of March 19 is 23'-7", according to FLRunners.com.

In two other field events, Fleming Island shotputter David May won at 45'-8" and Middleburg's Derek Freigtag won the discus at 167'-8". Freigtag holds the state's best throw with a 169'-7" toss earlier in the season. Ridgeview's Jordan Steinmetz won the girls discus with a 117'-8.5" toss with teammate Skyler Humphrey winning the boys 100 meter hurdles with a 15.15 split.

In the boys 100 and 200 dashes, Ridgeview's Stanley Dye got two second place finishes with a 10.89 100 and a 22.41 200.

"He ran fast for Creekside, but we did not go to Bob Hayes because that's crazy fast and he's just a sophomore," said Paul Grybb, Panther coach. "Bob Hayes was won in 10.55 and 21.12 and that would have been a tough double. He had never broken 11 seconds prior to Creekside. In team points at Creekside, Ridgeview finished fifth with 63 behind team champion Mandarin's 111 points with Fleming Island seventh with 55.50, Oakleaf 11th with 26 and Middleburg 12th with 17.

With just one night's rest, area tracksters headed to the Bob Hayes High School Invitational at Raines High School on Saturday to battle with the southeast's top athletes.

Top performances at the Bob Hayes meet came from Mastin who finished third in the long jump at 22'-8.25, Ridgeview pole vaulter Shane Altizer who finished third with a 12-foot leap and St. Johns Country Day School's Kelsey Stern taking third in the girls pole vault with a 9'-6" iump

Grybb did note that 800 meter ace Robert Brashear, who has run two sub-two minute races this year. ran a personal best 1:58.83 to take sixth at Bob Hayes. The state's best time is 1:54.15.

"His time is just .83 off the school record and he ran most of the race in lane two because of the congestion," said Grybb. "It was a phenomenal race."

Mastin jumped a disappointing 22'-8.25 with two scratches.

"He fell back onto his hands on that jump or he would have been over 23 feet." said Grybb. Others in the top 10 at Bob Hayes were Ramsey Meyers, RHS shotputter, eighth at 45'-7", Andrew Vargas, OPHS shotputter, ninth at 45'-4.5", Antonio Ferguson, OPHS high jumper, fifth at six feet, Jordan Steinmetz, RHs discus, 110'-4" and Middleburg pole vaulter Meridith Groves who finished sixth at nine feet. Ridgeview's 4 x 800 boys relay team finished 10th.



Woman dies in apartment fire

There was no one else in the apartment at the time of the fire, which was reported by neighbors, Silcox said. One resident of the adjoining apartment was evacuated until officials could ventilate the residence and check for hazards.

The state Fire Marshal's Office is investigating the cause of the fire along with the OPFD fire marshal and Orange Park police.

Fake money leads to assault



Clarke Day draws praise from attendees, organizers

ORANGE PARK – The farmer's market town officials hoped to unveil during this year's Carrie Clarke Day history festival didn't materialize, but no one seemed to notice as the ninth annual event was held under sunny skies at picturesque Clarke House Park.

"I think everyone had a really good time," said Alaina Ray, Orange Park's director of economic and community development. "The weather was beautiful; people were there all day long." Ray got involved with planning this year's event for the first time since she was hired by the town a year ago. She said that overall, she was pleased with the festival, held on Saturday, March 17 in honor of town pioneers William and Carrie Clarke.

"We're looking at multiple ways to play off the history of the town ... to make it an even more enjoyable day next year," she said.

Future festivals likely will include the farmer's market Ray and other organizers hoped to stage at the popular, 15-acre park this year. Unfortunately, Ray said, the lo-

cal growers who planned to sell produce on Saturday travelled to Tennessee to help friends and family affected by recent tornadoes.

"We certainly understand that," Ray said. "Family comes first. But we've also got a list of farmers for next year who are very interested" in expanding the open-air market idea.

Free bus tours of nearby Magnolia Cemetery and other local points of interest again proved to be popular, as well as free hay rides and guided tours of the fully furnished Clarke House that has stood on the Kingsley Avenue site for the past 100 years, according to Cheryl Cheatwood, president of the co-sponsoring Historical Society of Orange Park.

Simon, a member of the Brothers of the Coasts re-enactment group, explains about muskets and cutlasses – smaller versions of sabers designed by pirates that allowed them to swing the blades more effectively in tight quarters aboard ships.

"This is great," Hottes says. "This is a beautiful park. I'm learning a lot."

And that, organizers say, is what Carrie Clarke Day is all about.

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
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
