THE CITY of Westland will double the availability of its recycling center to every Saturday, instead of two Saturdays a month.

The expansion will begin next Saturday. Hours will be 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Westland Recyclable Materials Drop-off Center, 37137 Marquette, east of Newburgh, near the department of public services yard.

The DPS also reminds residents of the guidelines on what will be accepted:

● **GLASS:** All jars and bottles made of clear, green or brown glass. Remove labels and wash thoroughly. The center does not accept window glass, white glass or pyrex-type cookware.

● **CANS:** All tin (steel) and non-deposit aluminum cans are accepted. Clean thoroughly, remove labels and flatten if possible. The center does not accept aluminum foil, paint cans, aerosol cans, scrap iron and scrap building materials.

● **PLASTICS:** All clear or colored plastics with the No. 1 or 2 on the bottom (indicating they are recyclable). Clean thoroughly and remove tops.

● **MOTOR OIL:** The center accepts used motor oil only. Bring in sturdy containers that can be used again.

● **BATTERIES:** The center only accepts flashlight-type dry cell batteries. It does not accept automotive batteries, watch batteries, camera batteries, etc.

The center also reminds that since this summer Westland has begun to pick up yard waste at the curbside, a container will no longer be at the recycling center.

LARRY MCCONNELL

FLU VACCINATIONS

will be offered at the Westland Senior Resources Department Friendship Center, 1119 N. Newburgh, from 10 a.m. to noon on Thursday, Sept. 18. The project is being coordinated in cooperation with Ann Arbor Hospital. The vaccine will be for influenza strains anticipated for the 1991-92 season.

Participants will sign a waiver (provided by Ann Arbor Hospital) and submit to a blood pressure check prior to vaccination. The fee for the vaccine is \$6 per person.

Trial ordered in sibling killing

A Westland man charged with first-degree murder in the shotgun killing of his older brother has been ordered to stand trial in Detroit Recorder's Court.

Samih Saleh, 37, shot his 46-year-old brother, Sami Saleh, in the stomach on Aug. 4 after the Lebanese brothers had finished looking at photographs of their father's funeral, a longtime family friend testified Thursday.

Naiem Zeldan's testimony came during a sometimes-tense preliminary examination in which Samih Saleh appeared before Judge Gail McKnight in Westland's 18th District Court. McKnight ordered Saleh to stand trial Sept. 12.

Samih Saleh, dressed in black, wept quietly

through most of the exam. However, he lashed out when McKnight gave him a stern warning that his family and friends — some of whom sat in the courtroom — should refrain from threatening the victim's wife, also in the audience.

"It's my loss! Not her loss!" Saleh shouted. "It's my loss! It's my brother!"

McKnight's warning stemmed from a letter she received from the wife's family.

Following Saleh's outburst, McKnight ordered him removed from the courtroom, though she allowed him to return later.

Zeldan testified he accompanied the victim to Samih Saleh's Westland apartment about 11 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 4, and that the three men sat side by side on a couch and looked at family photographs during what was described as a friendly, 45-minute visit.

leave the apartment, however, Samih Saleh threatened his brother in an unprovoked attack that resulted in Sami Saleh's death from a single shotgun wound, Zeldan testified.

Seconds before the shooting, the Salehs, standing about two feet apart, had been talking in a hallway, Zeldan said, adding that he believed that the younger brother then went into the bedroom to get the shotgun.

Zeldan, who had his back turned to the brothers, testified that he heard Samih Saleh threaten his brother and then heard a single shot.

"I looked back and I saw Sami holding his stomach and Samih with the gun," Zeldan said, though he testified that he did not actually see the younger brother fire the shot.

DNR declares Whittier safe

The staff jokingly calls it Cooper on the Rouge at the Whittier.

"It was a difficult summer. I think everyone is looking forward to the new school year," said principal Linda Gantos of Westland's Cooper Elementary School.

With soil and air sample tests confirming the Whittier site environmentally safe, staff and parent volunteers delved into transforming the former junior high school building into a new home for Cooper students late last week.

The latest soil tests from the state Department of Natural Resources and the air tests by the Wayne County Department of Health indicate there is no danger to the health or

safety of students and staff at Whittier.

The two buildings face each other across Ann Arbor Trail, east of Middlebelt in the Westland portion of the Livonia school district.

CONTROVERSY HAS been brew-

ing since May with the revelation that Cooper was built on the site of a former landfill. A final decision on where the 350 students would be relocated wasn't cemented until late last week.

"I definitely feel better knowing the (test) results," said Mary Soronen, mother of Cooper fifth grader

Jonathan Soronen. "I knew the school district wouldn't send our kids here if it wasn't safe."

Soronen painted lockers Thursday afternoon with other mothers. Even the principal's recently retired husband pitched in.

"My son is really looking forward to school," Soronen said. "One of the things he's most excited about is having a locker."

In the smaller Cooper school kids had to make do with coat hooks and shelves, she said.

The Livonia school board closed Whittier junior high in 1979 and has been leasing it to various organizations since then.

Negligent homicide case delayed

A negligent homicide case involving a 17-year-old Westland girl was delayed Thursday, as attorneys awaited a medical report on the girl's friend, who fell from a van to her death Aug. 15.

Regina Beth Borders appeared before Judge Gail McKnight in Westland's 18th District Court for a preliminary examination to determine whether she should stand trial on a negligent homicide charge.

But McKnight honored a request from Borders' attorney, Nicholas Vendittelli, to postpone the exam one week so that he could obtain a Wayne County medical examiner's report on the death of 17-year-old Jennifer Lynn Cooley of Romulus.

James Wise, assistant Wayne County prosecutor, also agreed to the delay.

Council candidates discuss strategy on Westland Center

This is the second in a series of stories about Westland city council issues, based on interviews with the 10 candidates seeking nomination in the Sept. 10 primary.

A plan to use city taxes to boost the sale and expansion of Westland Center has drawn opposition from six out of 10 candidates competing in the Westland City Council primary.

Critics say the plan will create a traffic nightmare, divert tax money from the city budget, promote un-

necessary commercial development and aid a private developer who should pay for the project.

Supporters, however, say the plan will keep shoppers and their dollars in town, add to the city's tax base, create more jobs and make Westland

Center — the city's largest retail development — more competitive with other regional malls.

The current city council, in a 5-2 vote in April, endorsed using up to \$8.5 million in city taxes to make the project viable for Homart Development Co., which wants to buy the 26-year-old mall from Equitable Real Estate Investment Management Inc.

A purchase price has not been disclosed, and negotiations between the two companies are continuing. City aid would come from the Tax Increment Finance Authority (TIFA).

Candidates split on shopping center plan

which uses taxes collected in a special district encompassing the mall to spark economic development.

Homart has indicated it wants to expand the mall by adding a second floor of shops, a Sears store and a parking deck, among other improvements.

In recent interviews with the Observer, the plan was discussed by the 10 city council candidates competing in the Sept. 10 primary — which will narrow the field to eight for the Nov. 6 general election. Four council seats are up for grabs.

THE SIX candidates who oppose using city taxes to boost the project include incumbent Thomas Artley, former council member William

Ziemba and council hopefuls Dorothy Smith, Bhagwan Dashairya, Don Mead and Glenn Anderson. Those favoring the plan include incumbents Thomas Brown and Charles Pickering, and challengers Sharon Scott and David Cox.

Artley cited traffic congestion in opposing the project, saying that a traffic plan hasn't been developed to accommodate the increasing number of motorists that an expanded mall would draw.

Moreover, Artley said, "I don't believe in using TIFA dollars to promote development — especially commercial development."

Ziemba criticized the use of TIFA money to pay for "a private bricks-and-mortar venture" that he said should be paid by the developer. Ziemba also said that taxes from the TIFA district "should be returned"

to such taxing authorities as the city and Wayne-Westland school district, which he said cannot afford to see taxes diverted.

Mead said he opposes using TIFA money on the project, and he added that no new stores should be added to Westland Center until current traffic problems are addressed.

Some nearby residents, Mead said, "can't even get out of their driveways" because of heavy traffic.

Anderson said he "strongly" disapproves of the plan to divert tax dollars that he believes should be funneled into the city's general fund. Anderson also said the taxes should not be used for a private development.

Anderson also cited traffic woes and said that a worsening situation around Westland Center would create a need for more police and fire services there.

SMITH SAID she opposes using city taxes for the project, "especially since we (the city) won't own the mall."

Moreover, Smith said, "we're already overloaded with stores" in Westland. And she criticized plans for a Sears store, saying the company is on the decline.

Dashairya spoke against spending city dollars "on somebody else," other than local citizens, and he said Homart should be responsible for the purchase if it wants to buy the mall.

"They should come up with the necessary infrastructure," he said. Dashairya also cited traffic concerns.

Among those who favor the plan, Scott said she favors using TIFA money on the proposed expansion as long as traffic concerns are addressed before the project goes forward.

"I'd like to see more stores," she said, though she added that she would prefer a more upscale anchor store than Sears.

Cox also said traffic problems should be a top priority, but he favors city aid for the project and said Sears "would be a favorable addition" to the mall. Cox voiced concerns that Westland Center will lose customers unless it expands.

"If it doesn't grow," he said, "we'll see more shopper flight."

Brown said he favors using TIFA money for the project, though he said "it's premature to say" whether the sale will be completed and the mall expanded.

UNLIKE OTHER candidates, Brown said traffic problems already

are being addressed in the area. Several roads already have been improved, he said, and Joy Road also is slated to be widened in the next several months.

Pickering, who favors the plan, noted that the city's TIFA was initiated when he was mayor from 1982-86. "I believe that the program has been good for the community," he said.

Pickering predicted that the TIFA will be phased out "in the near future," leaving behind a more solid tax base that will generate more money for the city budget. An expanded Westland Center could be part of that improved tax base, he said.

However, Pickering added that traffic solutions should be found before the mall is expanded.

Borders has pleaded not guilty to causing the death of Cooley, who fell from an open, side door of a van being driven by Borders about 9:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 15, in the city's south end.

Borders, Cooley and two other teens, who had been shopping, were in the van during the accident that occurred as Borders was eastbound on Grand Traverse near Centerville.

COOLEY DIED from multiple

injuries to her head and body. She died en route to Ann Arbor Hospital in Wayne.

Westland police have said the negligent homicide charge was sought because Borders should have stopped the van until the sliding door was closed.

Borders has told her mother that she warned her friends several times to close the door and that she was afraid to pull to the side of the road because she feared the Norway neighborhood wasn't safe.

On Thursday, Wise said the preliminary examination was delayed

because attorneys need the medical examiner's report, which he said will explain "the cause and manner" of Cooley's death.

Cooley would have been a senior this year at Romulus High School.

Despite the charge against Borders, the Wayne County prosecutor's office has indicated the case may be weak.

Robert Sage, Wayne County deputy chief assistant prosecutor, has said it's "not the strongest case in the world," in part because the others in the van "had some duty to close the door."

Prior to the shooting, Zeldan testified, "It was a friendly evening. There was no arguing or fighting or nothing." The victim had no weapon, he said.

After Sami Saleh was shot, Zeldan ran from the apartment.

"I DIDN'T know what was going on, and I was afraid," he said.

From outside the apartment, Zeldan said he could hear the defendant telephoning for help from inside his apartment at the Westwood Circle apartment complex, on the southeast corner of Joy and Hix.

Samih Saleh appeared "mad" during the phone conversation, Zeldan

testified. "He wanted them (police) to get there to help his brother," Zeldan said.

When police arrived, Zeldan accompanied them inside the apartment, where the victim sat on a couch, bleeding from his stomach. Sami Saleh told Zeldan he wanted to see his children.

"He knew he was dying, and he wanted to see his kids," Zeldan said. The victim died en route to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

WESTLAND POLICE arrested Samih Saleh on the scene, and he has since been held in the Wayne County Jail. During an Aug. 5 arraignment, a plea of not guilty was entered on his behalf, and he was ordered held without bond.

On Thursday, Saleh's attorney asked that a bond be set, but McKnight denied the request.

If convicted, Saleh could face life in prison for the murder charge. He also could face a mandatory two-year prison term on a felony firearms violation.

It will continue to house the school district's science center.

A Westland senior citizens group will continue to meet in the school, and principal Gantos said staff plans

to incorporate them into school activities.

"Maybe the children could read to the seniors, for example."

BECAUSE WHITTIER is bigger with a different layout than Cooper, an advisory group of parents and employees has devised a Wizard of Oz theme to help students become acquainted with their new building.

"Each hallway will have a name — Yellow Brick Road — for the main hall near the office, Over The Rainbow drive, and Munchkin road for the kindergarten area," Gantos said.

On the first day of school Tuesday, PTA members dressed as Wizard of Oz characters will conduct building tours for the students.

"The kids are looking forward to coming to school," said Cindi Nichols, mother of Cooper students Jeffrey, a second grader, and Chas, a fourth grade student.

"They're looking forward to the lockers. There's a stage here, a separate gym with a wood floor and more use of the science center," she said. "And I'm glad the kids will be close to home."

Cooper's long history (the school will celebrate its 150th anniversary this year) remains intact, with window displays already in place from the old school, featuring pictures of Cooper as a one room school house, census records, old textbooks and wooden desks with inkwells.

WITH THE start of the new school year, the DARE program has entered its second year. Three officers, including Hooper and officers Terry Donohue and Jeff Gillespie, participate in the program.

All three are former patrol officers. "We've seen the violence and crime caused by the drug culture," Hooper said.

DARE officers will visit every sixth-grade classroom in the Wayne-Westland district, and they also have expanded the program this year to

include local parochial schools, Hooper said.

Though the police department must raise money for program supplies, the officers' salaries are paid by the city.

The program focuses on the sixth grade in hopes of warning youngsters against drug abuse as they prepare to enter junior high and then high school.

"We believe it's making a difference," Hooper said. "We believe that education is the way to go to keep these kids off drugs."

Widened Newburgh to open

The mayors of Westland and Livonia will meet, almost at mid noon, fully armed on Wednesday to eliminate the last Newburgh traffic bottleneck.

Actually it will be 11:30 a.m. and Westland's Robert Thomas and Livonia's Robert Bennett will be armed with scissors when they pace it off at Newburgh and Joy Wednesday.

The scissors are for the planned ribbon cutting ceremonies to formally open the newly widened Newburgh north and south of Joy for motorists.

Mayor Bennett will open Newburgh from Ann Arbor Road to Joy while Mayor Thomas will open Newburgh south of Joy.

The opening will eliminate the last traffic bottleneck for Newburgh drivers, including students and bus drivers going to and from Churchill High School, on Newburgh just north of Joy, and the Livonia school district's Career Center, across the street, and others commuting to Livonia's industrial plants.

In Livonia, the \$1.07 million project rebuilt and widened Newburgh from two lanes of pavement to five lanes and linked the new five-lane bridge at Newburgh Lake, constructed in 1990, to new five-lane pavement in Westland.

"THIS IS an important step in our road improvement program," said Bennett. "The funds for this project come from the \$12 million road bond issue approved by the voters in November 1989."

Livonia city engineer Raul Galindo and the city engineering department were responsible for the design, layout, inspection and testing of the project. The construction contractor was Angelo D'Orazio Paving, Inc.

"This was a tough project," said Galindo. "All of the utilities (gas, water, sanitary sewer, and electrical) had to be relocated before construction of the road could take place. Additionally, it took almost two years and \$802,000 to acquire the necessary right-of-way."





SC faculty to get 5.9 percent raise

Schoolcraft College faculty members will receive a 5.9 percent raise this school year and a combined 15.5 percent increase over the life of a new three-year contract approved Wednesday by college trustees.

Negotiations between college officials and the Schoolcraft College Faculty Forum were completed in July, though ratification waited until the start of the college year. Union members ratified the contract Tuesday, trustees unanimously approved it one evening later.

"THIS IS the fastest we've ever been able to complete negotiations," Schoolcraft spokeswoman Sandra Florek said.

In addition to this year's wage increase, faculty members will receive a 5 percent increase in the 1992-93 school year and 4.6 percent increase in 1993-4.

Raises are based upon the top of the union scale. Employees below

the top of the scale are also eligible for step increases.

The contract covers 133 full-time and 280 part-time employees. The Faculty Forum represents college professors and instructors, as well as counselors and librarians.

Negotiations were conducted under a new format, target specific bargaining.

"What it is, is that both sides draft their proposals, then meet with a facilitator in the room to work out their differences," Florek said.

Don Power of Michigan State University, a creator of the target-specific process, was appointed facilitator by both sides.

In addition to wage increases, trustees also approved a change in the faculty health insurance plan.

Trustees approved a health insurance contract with the Michigan Education Specialty Services Association.

The association is affiliated with the Michigan Education Association, the state's largest teachers union.

SC sets tax hearing

Schoolcraft College's tax rate could be going up, slightly, as college officials revise assessment figures.

The tax rate is expected to rise by 0.0054 mill, as a result of recalculated figures.

Schoolcraft trustees have scheduled a Sept. 18 public hearing on the change before taking final action. The hearing begins 8 p.m. in the college board room, in the college administration building, 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.

The change is expected to provide roughly \$30,000 in additional college income.

The problem is believed to have been caused by a miscalculation in

Canton assessment figures. Trustees initially set the tax rate in mid-July.

Schoolcraft officials said they doubled checked figures even more thoroughly this year, with assessment freezes expected next year.

"We wanted to make sure the figures were as accurate as possible this year, with a freeze coming next year," college business vice president Adelard Raby said.

Schoolcraft's new tax rate would be 1.9771 mill, including assessments for general operating expenses and debt payments.

The tax rate translates to just under \$99 for persons living in homes assessed at \$100,000.

Base vote on ideology, not on your ancestry

IN 1990, I reported on the gulf on crime issues between state Supreme Court Justices Patricia Boyle and Michael Cavanagh, both seeking re-election.

Although both were Democratic nominees, Boyle usually voted for prosecutors, Cavanagh for defendants.

Republican nominee W. Clark Durant ripped into Cavanagh on issues — to no avail: Michigan voters stuck with the Irish incumbents, philosophy be damned.

Last week it happened again. Boyle sided with Justices Robert Griffin, Dorothy Comstock Riley and James Brickley (all Republicans) in favor of the prosecution. Cavanagh, now chief justice, dissented, joined by Justice Charles Levin.

IN A BERRIEN County case, a woman was charged with telling police, falsely, that someone had shot at her at a local school.

Her husband, W.C. Collins, allegedly offered an acquaintance, Earl Jordan, \$500 to lie in court that he had seen a rifle-carrying man flee the school grounds.

Jordan told State Police, who, with his consent, monitored and recorded his telephone conversation with Collins. Police also equipped Jordan with a concealed radio transmitter.

State Police obtained a warrant which, for unexplained reasons, turned out to be legally defective.

So when Collins was charged with obstruction of justice, Circuit Judge Ronald Taylor threw out that evidence, citing a 1975 state Supreme

Court decision: Electronic monitoring, without a warrant, violates the Michigan Constitution — "unreasonable searches and seizures." (That sentence is similar to the Fourth Amendment of the U.S. Bill of Rights.)

Our Supreme Court, with Boyle in the majority, reversed Taylor. The evidence can be used when Collins is re-tried.

JUSTICE GRIFFIN'S 34-page majority opinion with 57 footnotes is heavy reading.

It reversed the 1975 ruling, citing a 1979 U.S. Supreme Court ruling upholding conviction of one Caceres for bribing an IRS agent. Without a warrant, the agent wore a concealed radio which transmitted his chats with Caceres for recording by another agent.

In that case, Justice John Paul Stevens (a Gerald Ford appointee) said Caceres had no constitutional right to rely on flaws in the agent's memory, or to challenge the agent's credibility, without being beset by corroborating evidence — the recorded conversation.

In other words, if a witness can be asked to testify to what he remembers, he should be able to back up his

memory with electronic surveillance — no search warrant needed.

Griffin noted a 1988 national commission (established by Congress while Griffin was a U.S. senator) said such monitoring can be crucial in establishing the credibility of an informant, particularly since informants can be of dubious character. Monitoring also can protect the life of an agent or informant.

CAVANAGH'S dissent said the U.S. Supreme Court ruled only because of a change of justices, not for good reason.

Cavanagh said the Michigan Supreme Court is "a sovereign, independent judicial body with ultimate authority to interpret Michigan law" that need not follow the U.S. court's lead "unless their reasoning is intrinsically persuasive on the merits."

Cavanagh accused the majority of "expanding the rights of the police force to invade the privacy of the people without warrant or probable cause."

He added some liberal rhetoric about courts being a "protector of the powerless," meaning defendants, not crime victims.

YOU DON'T CARE about my view of the court decision because I'm neither a judge nor a candidate.

But I suggest Michigan voters habitually fail to do their homework and blindly vote for Irish names.

Voters should have picked Boyle or Cavanagh — not both.

TWO PEOPLE were killed last week when swimming in the Atlantic Ocean. They made the mistake of going in the water as Hurricane Bob was bumping along the East Coast. Some would state the obvious: It's not real smart to go swimming when a hurricane is headed your way. But who can blame them when the storm is known as Bob.

It's a fine name to go through life with. It's easy to spell, nobody mispronounces it and it's never offensive, a great benefit in our politically correct times.

But let's face it. Bob is a wimpy name for a storm. It's sounds like the guy who lives next door or your brother-in-law, but not the name of a storm that has the power to smash houses and blow large sailboats 10 miles inland.

Let's just hope he didn't plug in Chip and Muffy.

MAYBE THE weather service should hire a poet or an old-headline writer to name the storms.

Most Latin sounding names would

work, too. Tony, Nick and Guldo all have that unpredictable sound to them that should be applied to a storm.

SCANDANAVIAN names like Sven or Eric have that seafaring sound and lend a wonderful Nordic flavor to a hurricane blowing in from the ocean.

I'd love to go back to the days when Bertha bashed or Susie left them shivering. But it's not going to happen. I can accept that. But for safety's sake, let's leave Bob, Bruce and names with pretentious spellings like Geoff out of the computer.

They don't scare anybody. If Bob had been named Thor, the two swimmers might not have drowned in the ocean. I kind of doubt it, but you never know. At least it's worth a try.







Rockets bolt past Highland Park

Westland John Glenn unleashed its own version of "Thunder and Lightning" Friday, as the vaunted backfield of Tad Quattlander and John Ward did not disappoint in a season-opening 26-6 football win over visiting Highland Park.

Dangerous skies delayed the start of the game for nearly 96 minutes, but it didn't matter as the host Rockets, who have reached the state playoffs five out of the past six years, dominated from start to finish.

Quattlander, a speedy 5-foot-7, 171-pound senior tailback, carried the load most of the night, zapping the Polar Bears for 136 yards in 20 carries and three touchdowns (on runs of 2, 6 and 8 yards).

Ward, meanwhile, did most of his work in the defensive secondary, but showed flashes of brilliance on the other side of the ball. The 6-1, 188-pound senior made the most of his opportunities, carrying the ball five

times for 40 yards (all in the second quarter) to go along with a TD.

"They'll pretty much alternate series," Glenn coach Chuck Gordon said. "They pull for one another, and who carries the ball is not a problem whatsoever. They're both unselfish players."

GLENN, HOWEVER, proved it has more than a two-back attack.

Quarterback Terry Hower, making his first varsity start, completed six of seven passes for 75 yards.

"Terry's performance is just what we expected," said Gordon of the 6-2, 179-pound senior. "He's been consistent all along and he's been steady in our preseason practices."

The Rockets, who enjoyed a 19-0 halftime lead, were never in danger.

They outgained the Polar Bears in total yardage, 282-91. Highland Park was unable to gain a first down in the opening half.

Glenn ran 45 plays to its opponents' 26. Highland Park QB DeWayne Jones completed only one pass for 5 yards and was intercepted once (by linebacker Jason Hagelthorn).

Gordon, however, said the offense was "pretty sloppy at times." Ward had one long run nullified by a penalty.

The defense did not receive much of a test, but lost its shutout bid with 7:42 left in the third quarter when tailback Terrance Reed fumbled and Jones scooped up the undetected ball, racing 51 yards untouched with a gang of blockers in front of him for a touchdown.

"OUR CONCEPT is a swarming kind of defense," said Glenn linebacker Jamle Henry. "The play was a sweep off tackle and we had the guy (Reed) all wrapped up without realizing he had dropped the ball. We like to fly to the ball and maybe on that play we were a little overly aggressive."

"At that point I was worried because I wanted the

shutout because that's a great way to start the season, but it was just a fluke thing."

Glenn scored two possessions later, marching 87 yards in eight plays, capped by Quattlander's 5-yard TD run, which ended his last carry of the night with 8:20 to go.

Gordon then emptied his bench and sent in the reserves to finish out the game.

"I was glad we were able to play tonight because it would have been tough to come back tomorrow (Saturday) and play," said the Glenn coach. "The kids were down in the cafeteria and I told them we'd do everything we could to play it tonight."

The waiting period had somewhat of a psychological effect on the Rockets.

"I didn't know what to think. I was ready to go," said Henry, a returning starter. "It was hard to adjust because we were all jacked up. I was doubtful we would play."

State AA champs primed for defense

Whereas some coaches must walk the hallways of their high schools in desperate search of football talent, Redford Catholic Central coach Tom Mach almost had to do the unthinkable last month.

Cut some players.

"We were thinking of cutting some because we thought we didn't have enough uniforms, but we didn't have to," said Mach. "So we can still say we've never had to cut players."

Football always has been popular at CC, but perhaps never as much as this season, one year after the Shamrocks won the Class AA state championship. Mach said about 140-150 players usually come out for CC's freshmen, junior varsity and varsity teams, but the varsity roster is especially large this year with 56 players.

Twenty seniors who played on last year's state champion team, joined by 36 juniors.

"We usually have 45 to 50 players on the varsity, but we had a big sophomore class last year and that's the element right there," Mach said. "I think the interest in the program has been pretty steady all these years, but the last four seasons we've been very productive and the interest is higher. Winning the state championship left us on a good note."

CC WAS CLASS A runnerup in 1987 and '88 before finally taking the Class AA crown a year ago with a 21-0 win over Detroit Martin Luther King at the Silverdome. The Shamrocks finished 11-2 overall, winning their last eight games, including four in the playoffs by a combined score of 94-28.

Several big-play skilled players graduated off a team that outscored its opponents, 256-77, last season, but defending the AA championship

isn't out of the question. Replacing speed and finding a quarterback among three candidates are the biggest worries Mach has had in the preseason.

"We had probably the fastest team we've had in quite awhile last year — Brian Chaney, Arshon Stewart, Mike Thomas and Jack Davidson — all four were speedsters," Mach said. "You always miss certain aspects of every team, but this year's team has picked up on last year's temperament and the way we worked at the end of the season. These kids haven't lost a beat and haven't got big heads. They've been a pleasure to coach so far."

CC will employ a whole new offensive backfield, but much of the Shamrocks' optimism begins in the trenches, where the offensive line averages 233 pounds per player. Returning starters include senior guard Dan Cretu (6-foot-1, 240), senior tackle Brian Brewer (6-3, 245) and senior center Steve Leiger (6-0, 225). First-time starters are junior tackle Aaron Babelec (6-0, 240) and senior tight end David Bruhowzki (6-6, 220).

Bruhowzki was a reserve tackle last year as a junior.

"There's overall size and strength there and they are all mobile," CC line coach Dan Fortune said. "We'll be able to do a lot of things this year that we couldn't do last year, like trapping. Plus we have Bruhowzki at tight end, which is like having a third tackle because of his blocking ability."

THE SHAMROCKS aren't so fortunate at quarterback with the graduation of Jason Carr, who completed 44.7 percent of his passes (59-132) for 704 yards and six touchdowns. As of Thursday Mach was undecided who might start, with juniors Chris Barbara and John Priestap and senior Matt Pinard still vying for the position.


Barbara (5-11, 215) quarterbacked the JV last year and is a "good man in charge of the huddle," Mach said. Priestap, a transfer from Ann Arbor Gabriel Richard is a "good athlete, has good football sense but this is his first year in the program and is still picking up things we did," Mach said. "What he needs is more reps (repetitions)."

Pinard is the only one with varsity experience, having spent last year as Carr's backup. "Matt took a lot of snaps last year, has good knowledge of the game and has a good arm," Mach said. "He showed real good signs in the four-way scrimmage."

Stewart and Thomas combined for 1,140 yards rushing a year ago at the tailback position and this year the job belongs to senior Jeff Tibaldi (5-9, 180). Tibaldi, who gained most of his 90 yards a year ago in a win over Lansing Sexton, will be backed up by senior Brett Walter and junior John Raasch (5-8, 180).

Jon Barbara, who gained 732 yards and was the heart and soul of

Jason Wetmore, who tossed 11 touchdowns passes a year ago.

"He throws really well and we're real pleased with what he's done so far," said the Wayne coach.

Senior Greg Carrico (6-2, 180), who possesses a 32-inch vertical jump, is one of team's top receivers along with senior Rick Barnes (6-2, 180).

"Greg is also an outstanding safety and just a natural athlete," Howton said. "He's pretty quick and he's one of the scouts (college) may be taking a look at."

"And Rick is a basketball player who has great hands. And more importantly, he's just a super individual."

Senior Eric Bates (6-3, 195) fills the void at tight end. He is out for

football for the first time, but Howton calls him "an aggressive kid who blocks well."

The backfield is just as talented as the wide-outs.

Returning is 6-foot, 205-pound senior Jermaine Ellis, who is joined by newcomers Lee Williams (5-10, 165), a speedy senior, and Bruce Calhoun (6-2, 185), who could be an impact junior.

CALHOUN may not be ready for Friday's opener at Adrian because of an elbow/arm injury suffered in last week's preseason scrimmage against Northville.

"He's was our best worker during the off-season and we hope to have him back by the fourth game," Howton said.

Wayne's offense, however, will not become potent unless the line matures into a solid unit.

The top returnees include senior guard Jason Bodden (6-4, 220), a co-captain who runs a 4.8 in the 40-yard dash; and junior tackle Derek Reeves (5-10, 210), who saw considerable action as a sophomore.

The center is senior David House (5-10, 205), who "doesn't make mistakes" according to Howton.

At the other guard is senior Brian Foster (5-10, 175), who went down with an injury in last year's opener against Adrian and never returned.

Junior Ramzy Saleh (5-10, 220) will open at the other tackle.

Howton's kicking and punting duties will be handled by junior Tim Mate (6-1, 180) and Wetmore.

DEFENSIVELY, Wayne's 50-50 defense will line up with Barnes and Ellis at the ends; junior Murdank Forrest (5-10, 175) at nose guard; with Reeves, House or junior Kier Cook (5-7, 215) at the tackles.

The linebacking crew and secondary will be the team's strength.

Captain Scott Dzedzic (6-0, 180), a starter last year at monster back, will play linebacker along with Bodden.

Mate, meanwhile, moves into the defensive backfield along with Carrico, junior Johnny Ballard (5-8, 165) and senior Mike Martin (5-9, 155).

"Our perimeter defense is good," Howton said. "And we have people with athletic ability in those special positions."

"But there are a lot of ifs. We also have a lot of people going both ways. I don't know if that's good or bad. It's good from the standpoint that we have a lot of people in condition to play at the start, but we may wear down as the season goes along."

Howton, however, believes this team has many of the same qualities of last year's squad.

"Last year we had a lot of heart," he said. "And I believe this year we have it, too."

Ocelots rebuild for 1991

It will be a different kind of team that takes the field for Schoolcraft College's men's soccer team this season.

Which is to be expected; all junior college coaches must rebuild their teams annually. Get half the team back, and the groundwork is there for a great season.

The Ocelots return three full-time starters from their 1990 squad and three others who saw plenty of action. Plus, Rick Menary — an all-region selection in '89 (he sat out last year) — is back on the team.

So SC has a foundation to build on. And just as important, some of the divisive, off-the-field elements from last year's team — the first in more than a decade to reach the National Junior College Athletic Association Tournament — are gone.

"I think there's more team unity this year," said Jeff VanDemergel, SC's leading scorer last season. "If we go (to the NJCAA Tournament) this year, it'll be a whole different thing. We have a whole different attitude this year."

LAST SEASON, the Ocelots charged to their first-ever NJCAA Inter-region championship in Van Dimitriou's tenure as coach. But their trip to Trenton, N.J., for the NJCAA tourney bordered on embarrassing — SC lost its first two matches by 3-0 scores.

There was some finger-pointing afterwards, but now, the finger-pointers are gone and Dimitriou is back.

The strengths of the 1991 team should be at forward and in the middle. On the front line, VanDemergel will be joined by freshmen Brian Hauman and Jim Meldrum.

Also, a couple of players who saw action at both midfield and forward return — Chris Crawford and Shane Millner. They will play both positions again this season; indeed, Crawford will be a starter somewhere.

The SC midfield is particularly impressive. Joining Menary, Crawford and Millner will be returnee Bob Hayes and another pair of impressive freshmen: Nate Stovall and Dave Hebestreit.

"The midfielders and forwards are our strengths," said Dimitriou, "but they have to start working together."

MENARY, THE SC coach said, should regain his all-region honors from two years ago. "The guys around him have to get used to playing with him, he's so smooth."

Even better, Dimitriou figures Stovall to be on the same level. "He's outstanding. He plays a lot like Menary. He makes some slick passes out there."

The third full-time starter returning — joining VanDemergel and Crawford — is keeper Scott Hauman. Hauman was steady enough in goal last season, but this year he'll be facing a more difficult task.

That's because the defense in front of Hauman must be rebuilt. Dimitriou feels the tools are there, but there's been no test of fire yet.

Dimitriou had hoped two promising freshmen, Chad Cain and Andy Gutowski, would be joining the team. But Gutowski isn't eligible, and Cain's eligibility is questionable.

That could hurt, particularly with several other players moving to fill positions. Jack Abate is slated to be at stopper, with Mike Presley at sweeper. Both are freshmen.

"I'D LOVE to have Mike at forward or midfield, but he's the toughest kid we've got," said Dimitriou.

Wayne Worosz, another freshman, will see action on defense, together with sophomore Shaun Mack. Two other freshmen defenders, Brian Pagett and George Murphy, have also been impressive in preseason drills.

For SC to make a return trip to the Inter-regional tournament, and perhaps beyond, "two things have to happen," said Dimitriou, who will be assisted this year by former SC standout Chris Speen. "We definitely have to improve defensively, and our forwards and midfielders have to

O'Shea faces old problem

There's something all-too-painfully familiar about the Schoolcraft College women's soccer team.

Once again, a numbers game faces the Lady Ocelots.

A year ago, when they finished third in the National Junior College Athletic Association Tournament, they did it with the bare minimum. Cindy Bowman, who had been one of SC's top scorers, was in goal throughout the season-ending tourney simply because there was no one else.

Literally. There were just 11 team members at the end of the season.

While the talent in some aspects is improved — including goal, where Farmington grad Kim Owczarzak takes over — there are still holes to fill.

The bench is, once again, one of them.

When defender Jennifer Marshall opted against returning for her sophomore season, it left coach Nick O'Shea with a problem. All of the defense, save Livonia Franklin grad Jennifer Whitfield, has departed.

AND THERE is little to choose from. O'Shea opened practice last Monday with just 10 players. He has since increased his roster to 12, and had some other contacts.

But the latecomers may not be able to contribute too much, too soon.

Why the problems in recruiting? "I really think it's the '73 birth year," answered O'Shea, who has guided SC to the NJCAA Tournament in three of his four seasons and coached the Ocelots to a national title in '87. "They had a hard time in age group soccer and a lot of them quit then."

"There just weren't many seniors last year in high school."

The hometowns of O'Shea's signees indicate he has had to go to greater lengths to find players. Among his recruits are Becky Dinverno from Milford-Lakeland, Carol Pietila from South Lyon and Stacey Hilgendorf from St. Clair Shores South Lake.

STILL, IF O'Shea can find enough bodies, his team should fare well again. The offense is impressive, with Nikki Johnson (from Livonia Churchill) returning from last season's squad and Shannon Meath (Plymouth Canton) back after taking a year off. Meath was an all-American in '89.

Joining them will be Lori Place (Churchill), a strong inside player who started for O'Shea's Churchill team for four years.

The midfield should be more than adequate, too. Sarah Hayes (Plymouth Salem), who played both midfield and forward last season, returns. Nancy Pulice (Churchill), Dinverno and Pietila will join her there.

Of Dinverno, O'Shea said: "She's been a pleasant surprise. She has a real hard shot and works hard. I've

been impressed by her so far. "It's the same thing (with Pietila). Neither one is from a traditionally strong program, but they have looked good."

ON DEFENSE, O'Shea has Colleen O'Connor (Farmington Hills Mercy) slated as stopper and Amy Krajewski (Salem) to fill in at sweeper. Whitfield will be at one outside defender and Hilgendorf is expected to be the other.

Such a thin — actually, almost non-existent — bench creates so many questions. "If these 12 stay healthy, if we have them going into nationals, we'll do well," O'Shea predicted, "because they can play."

And yet, he admitted, "the defense right now is the question mark. If I have to rob from my midfield or offense for my defense, it will hurt."

The Lady Ocelots will be tested during their regular season, facing many of the top teams in the NJCAA. Included on their schedule are two trips to New York, the first this weekend for the Monroe CC Invitational. SC plays two games at Farmingdale CC (N.Y.) Sept. 27-28, a week after a trip to St. Louis (Sept. 20-21) for games against Central College (Kan.) and Florissant Valley CC.



Smoking is good for meat

Country people have long known that meat hung in the smoke of hearths and chimneys lasts longer — and often tastes better — than fresh meat. Smoking, drying and salting were the main means of preserving meats in the days before refrigeration.

Of course, in contrast, we feel it good duty to mention that some studies have shown that smoking is regarded as hazardous to your health.

Today, with modern refrigeration, we are not so concerned with smoking as a means of preservation. We don't need to hang hams and sausages for days or weeks to keep them from spoiling over the long winter. Rather, we are looking for the fragrant smoky flavors of hickory, oak, apple wood and mesquite.

WITH VERY little equipment or effort, you can achieve the taste and aroma of traditionally smoked foods with just a covered grill or barbecue and a handful of wood chips.

Venture into any local gourmet shop and you will notice eye-catching grill displays featuring the latest in barbecue apparel, equipment and even wood chips.

I don't care what I wear as long as I'm comfortable. But "You name it and I have it" in the line of gadgets is the motto of some meat smokers, with most gadgets being overrated and under-used.

But when it comes to smoking with wood, the intrigue begins. Hardwoods are best for smoking. Softwoods such as pine, fir, cedar and spruce are not suitable because they are so full of pitch and resin that they impart a turpentine flavor in the food.

Never use backyard clippings that may contain insecticides or poisonous plants such as oleander or poison oak. The most popular woods are hickory, cedar, mesquite, oak and fruit woods. Dried corn cobs can even be used.

MY PERSONAL favorite? I think mesquite is overrated. Anything I smoke on the grill is going to have enough flavor of its own. Maybe it's my taste buds, but short of a smoky flavor, I can't tell any difference.

When you price mesquite anywhere other than in Arizona and New Mexico, be prepared to pay the price.

Hickory is fine and most readily available, but everything at the supermarket is smoked in hickory, such as hams and sausages.

I want something different, something sweet. I love fruit woods. I think the best thing about fruit woods are their compatibility with either beef, chicken, pork or fish. Fruit woods make everything taste good.

Most backyard grillers who wish to smoke will most generally use what is called the hot smoke method.

If you've ever eaten Texas-style barbecue, then you've eaten hot-smoked meat. This type of smoking is done at high-enough temperatures to cook the food while imparting a mild and pleasantly smoked flavor.

FOR HOT smoking, good cooks first will buy chunks of wood instead of slivers or sawdust (both of which make for good cold smoking). The chunks of wood should be soaked in water for at least 30 minutes. (You can use the wood chips, but you will have to replace them more often).

Drain, and when the coals are red hot and covered with a little gray ash, drop a healthy handful, get ready to add the food and the top to keep those smoky flavors inside. Yours truly likes to keep the bottom vents open and the top vents closed for a more intense flavor.

Cook the foods as you normally would for their required amount of time — but watch out — the flavors of smoke might make you regular smoker!

Sweetness ushers in the Jewish New Year

A NEW YEAR, a new start — "May you be inscribed for a good year" is a greeting frequently exchanged by Jews all around the world when guests arrive for the celebration of the days of Rosh Hashana.

"We bring in the new year on a sweet note," said Leslie Miller of West Bloomfield. "All of the dishes we serve are sweet, there's nothing bitter."

Rosh Hashana means "Head of the Year" in Hebrew, and coincides with the first day of Tishri on the Hebrew calendar, which is the lunar calendar. This year Rosh Hashana begins at sundown Sept. 8 and ends at sundown Sept. 10.

From Rosh Hashana to Yom Kippur, which is the day of atonement, are 10 days of penitence. One of the most important symbols of the Rosh Hashana observance is the blowing of the shofar, or ram's horn, which is sounded in synagogues as a call to worship.

For Jews, it is a time of reflection and thinking about the year past, making atonement for any mistakes, and promising to do better in the year ahead.

THE DISTINCTIVE theme of the Rosh Hashana dinner is joy in the year ahead, the dominant culinary symbol of which is sweetness.

Food frequently served includes honey, apples, dates, quinces, pomegranates, leeks, Swiss chard, green beans, carrots, turnips, zucchini, lamb and fish.

Common desserts are honey cakes, plum pie, baked apples and apple strudel.

Miller's Rosh Hashana menu consists of: fruit compote, gefilte fish, chicken soup with matzo balls, turkey with stuffing, roast beef brisket, noodle kugel, carrot tsimmes, green bean casserole, salad topped with homemade dressing, and cake for dessert.

and family we haven't seen in a while," Miller said. "I start by de-cluttering the house. I keep almost nothing on the kitchen counters. It makes it a lot easier to work. We'll have a lot of company, so I de-clutter the living room too. I keep out toys that are easy to clean up."

SUNDAY, SHE'LL make chicken soup, a turkey, beef brisket and the dinner salad. She makes chicken salad with the chicken from the soup to serve for lunch the next day.

For the new year dinner, she'll serve the gefilte fish, soup and fruit compote. Guests will eat in the dining room, and help themselves to other foods at a buffet in the kitchen. The fruit compote will be served cold.

"It's refreshing, almost like a sorbet. I serve the fruit compote in wine glasses because it looks pretty, and I decorate the table with African violets so people can talk without having to look over flowers."

DINNER BEGINS with a prayer, and the breaking of bread — a sweet bread, crown challah, made with raisins. An extra cup of raisins is sometimes added to the dough to make it more festive for the new year celebration.

"A lot of people dip it in honey." Some families also say a blessing over apples and honey and pass the dish around the dinner table. Each person dips his apple in honey before eating it. This symbolizes hopes for a sweet new year.

AT TEMPLE Kol Ami in West Bloomfield, everyone is handed a trash bag to take home with them. They bring it back 10 days later, on Yom Kippur, filled with food for the needy.

"While we're reflecting on our own deeds for the new year, we also think about making the rest of the world a better place," Hurwitz said. Last year they collected 3,000 tons of food.

Traditionally, the new year dinner is served before sundown on the night the holiday starts.

"The holiday is for celebration of the new year, and reflection of the past year, and not for mundane tasks like work, so observant Jews will prepare all of their food before sundown on Sept. 8," said Lissa Hurwitz of the Jewish Community Council of Metropolitan Detroit in West Bloomfield.

ORTHODOX JEWS, Miller and her husband, Ron, a Realtor, belong to Bais Chabad of West Bloomfield.

A busy mother of three, who operates a business out of her home, Leslie Miller's cooking philosophy is pour everything into a pot and let it cook.

She likes foods that are easy to make, but taste like you've been fussing over them for hours.

Combine fruit, including juice in a baking pan. Bake at 350 F. for 35 to 45 minutes. Chill. Serve cold.

- NOODLE KUGEL**
 1 bag of flat egg noodles
 1 can crushed pineapple, drained well
 1 cup white or brown raisins
 1/2 cup sugar
 2 tablespoons cinnamon
 3 eggs

Cook and drain noodles. In a bowl, mix egg, cinnamon, sugar, add pineapple, raisins, and noodles. Mix well. Put in a greased 9 x 12 baking dish, sprinkle with cinnamon. Bake 350 F. for 35 to 45 minutes.

- HONEY CAKE**
 1 1/4 cups purpose flour

- 1/2 wheat germ
 1/2 cup raisins
 1/2 cup sugar
 4 teaspoons baking powder
 1 teaspoon baking soda
 1 teaspoon cinnamon

 1/2 cup coffee, cooled

Dry Creek Valley wines offer abundance of flavor

Separated by a range of hills, the American Viticultural Area known as Dry Creek Valley runs parallel to Alexander Valley in northern Sonoma County. The northern end is warm, and lacking a river influence, it is an ideal region for growing zinfandel and cabernet sauvignon with ripe berry flavors and melony sauvignon blanc.

The fertile, well-drained, valley-floor soils, influenced by morning fog in the south, are also well known for quality sauvignon blanc with a heightened grassy character.

The Dry Creek Valley benchlands, have red soils and less fog influence. This is an area that boasts 100-year-old zinfandel vines and distinguished cabernet sauvignon exhibiting attractive herbal, dill and olive components.

Doug Nalle, co-owner and winemaker at Nalle Winery who has experience working with Dry Creek fruit, believes that the region should be divided into north and south.

"It is impossible to say that Dry Creek is best for one varietal over another because the boundaries are too general," he said. "When identifying best locations, north versus south must be considered, based on temperature differences as well as soil and site."

John Pedroncelli owns the oldest producing winery (since 1927) in Dry Creek Valley. "Even in Bordeaux, there are good sites and poor ones," he explains. "They're not all first growths!"

In the warmer, upper end of Dry Creek Valley, Preston Vineyards is demonstrating that southern Rhone varietals, such as syrah and mourvedre, are successful.

"When planted on gravelly soil, syrah achieves good flavor development and smoky, earthy, ripe plum characters akin to the northern Rhone," said Lou Preston, owner of Preston Vineyards.

"Typical Dry Creek zinfandel develops ripe fruit, jammy, raspberry and blackberry flavors and spiciness (cinnamon, clove, allspice). It's not

style," said Stare. "The heavy, rich bottomland soil of the valley floor encourages vine vigor and a characteristic herbaceousness."

"When I started making sauvignon blanc from 100 percent Dry Creek fruit, it had a strong varietal character that I like in the wine. But this business is market driven, and the consumer doesn't appreciate that style as much as I do. Currently, I blend Dry Creek and Alexander Valley sauvignon blanc to produce a wine with highlighted melony fruit and just the right touch of varietal herbaceousness."

Successful Dry Creek chardonnay is site dependent. When grown on gravelly, well-drained benchland soils, chardonnay develops a distinct, sage, earthy-dusty character.

According to George Bursick, winemaker at Ferrari-Carano, "When grown on the deep, fertile, valley floor, Dry Creek chardonnay can develop the same varietal characteristics as sauvignon blanc."

heavy and tannic, but medium bodied with a clement-like quality.

"When grown on well-drained benchland, Dry Creek cabernet sauvignon exhibits soft tannins with a combination of cassis and delicate currant fruit accompanied by a delicate herbal, cedary-spice quality. The wines are typically round and soft with medium body. They are accessible when young and do not require lengthy bottle age to be attractive."

In 1971, David Stare founded Dry Creek Vineyards in the Dry Creek Valley. "The Dry Creek sauvignon blanc is a very flavorful grape and produces a grassy, herbaceous

Don't run to the store, substitute

The secret in being a good cook is not in following a recipe to the letter; anyone can do that. It lies, instead, in using your imagination and ingenuity, and learning to make substitutions when necessary.

If a recipe calls for one-half cup of wine in the sauce or marinade, and you don't have any wine in the house, mix together one-fourth cup of vinegar, one-fourth cup of water, and a tablespoon of sugar. Use this mixture in place of the wine.

You're all out of allspice? Don't panic and rush out to the store. Instead, mix one-half teaspoon of cinnamon with one-eighth teaspoon of cloves. Use this in place of one teaspoon of allspice, and no one will be the wiser.

Cornstarch can be used as a substitute for arrowroot.

One slice of regular white bread is equal to one-half cup of soft bread crumbs, or one-fourth cup of dry crumbs, or three-fourths cup of cracker crumbs. Or, use rolled oats in place of any of them.

If the cookbook says you should use buttermilk, or sour milk, and you don't have any, you can turn fresh milk sour in a minute by adding a bit of vinegar or lemon juice.

Chopped dried pitted prunes or dates may be used instead of raisins, add vice versa.

The point is that you must not be afraid to experiment a little.

Tomato juice, tomato sauce, tomato paste, tomato puree, and catsup can all be made to take the place of each other by adding a little of this, or a bit of that.

For instance, if you are out of catsup, add two tablespoons of sugar, (brown or white); a tablespoon of vinegar; and a pinch of cloves to one-half cup of tomato puree, paste, or sauce. This will work out in any recipe that calls for one-half cup of catsup.

The main difference in canned tomato juice, paste, sauce, or puree is the amount of water each contains.

During the "great Depression" that people my age still like to talk about, and again during World War II, certain foods were not always available. Cooks were forced to

make substitutions of all sorts.

This is when the Ritz Cracker Mock Apple Pie became popular. One time when we had no apples, and no Ritz crackers, either, my mother created an imitation of the imitation. We called it "Mama's Mock Mock Apple Pie."

I made it recently, and my son-in-law bragged about what a great apple pie I had made. I never told him any different.

Soda crackers were cheap and plentiful, even in difficult times, and were substituted for apples, flour, cereal, and all sorts of things in those days.

The mock raspberry jam recipe below was included in a column that I wrote two years ago about tomatoes. I received more comments, letters, and phone calls (all favorable), about that one recipe than all the others I have ever written about.

It tastes exactly like real raspberry preserves, and has the same texture and appearance. No one will ever guess that it is not the genuine jam.

I am including that recipe again, for those of you who missed it the first time. Try it, along with some of the other recipes printed below, for foods that aren't what they seem to be. After tasting how good they are, I'll not be surprised but what you'll decide to make up a few recipes of your own.

Mock Raspberry Jam
3 pounds green tomatoes
2 cups sugar
1 3-ounce pack of raspberry jello

Wash the tomatoes, and cut them into chunks. Process them in the blender until you have two cups. Add two cups of sugar, and boil for 15 minutes. Remove from the heat, and add powdered jello. Mix well.

Pour into clean containers, and refrigerate or freeze.

Mama's Mock Mock Apple Pie
24 single soda crackers
1 1/2 cup sugar
1 1/2 teaspoons cream of tartar
3 teaspoons apple pie spice (or 1 teaspoon grated nutmeg, 1/2 tea-

spoons cinnamon and 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves, as a substitute)
1 1/2 cups cold water
2 tablespoons cold butter.
pastry enough for a double crust pie

Place the whole crackers in a bowl. Don't deliberately break them; some will break up accidentally, and that's OK.

Mix together the sugar, cream of tartar, and apple spices.

Stir in the water, a little at a time, and pour mixture over the top of crackers. Allow it to sit for 15 minutes. Then pour gently into a pastry-lined pie tin. Dot with butter.

Add top crust, and cut vent holes, or pierce with a fork. I also like to brush the top with milk or mayonnaise, and sprinkle lightly with sugar before baking.

Bake in a 400 degree fahrenheit oven for about 40-45 minutes.

Mock Chopped Liver
(People who hate green beans would never guess that they are the secret ingredient.) 1 pound fresh or frozen green beans (not canned), cooked, drained, and chopped
2 large onions, chopped
4 hard boiled eggs, shelled
1/4 cup walnut meats, finely ground
2 Knorr chicken bouillon cubes
2 tablespoons Kitchen Bouquet salt and pepper to taste

Place chopped green beans in blender or food processor. Saute chopped onions in oil until dark, but not burned. Add browned onions to beans and blend.

Next, add eggs, nuts, Kitchen Bouquet and bouillon cubes. Blend until smooth. If mixture is too dry, add a bit of oil.

Chill before serving with slices of sweet onion.

Mock Fried Oysters
2 cups whole uncooked kernel corn

(fresh or frozen, but not canned)
3 large eggs
3 tablespoons flour
salt and pepper to taste
oil for frying

Separate the eggs. Combine egg yolks with the corn, flour, salt and pepper. Stir until well mixed. Beat egg whites until stiff, and gently fold into corn mixture.

Heat oil until 375 degrees fahrenheit, and drop batter by spoonfuls (about the size of an oyster) into the hot oil. Cook until golden brown, turning once.

Serve hot, with cocktail or tartar sauce, or with lemon juice or sherry wine for sprinkling.

Mock Pecan Pie


The following two recipes are both so good, I couldn't decide which to offer you. So, try them both, and decide which is your favorite.

Mock Pecan Pie No. 1
1 cup Post GrapeNuts
1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
1 stick (1/4 pound) melted butter or oleo
3 eggs
3/4 cup lukewarm water
1 cup dark Karo corn syrup
1 teaspoon vanilla
a pinch of salt
1 unbaked pie shell

Soak GrapeNuts in water until absorbed. Combine sugar, syrup, butter and salt in a sauce pan. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Beat eggs until foamy.

Add a small amount of the hot mixture to the eggs. Mix well, then add the rest. Blend in the soaked GrapeNuts, then put the mixture in the pie shell, and bake at 375 degrees fahrenheit for 40-50 minutes.

Cool before serving.

HAM AND SALAMI BISTRO BAGUETTES

Preparation time: 25 minutes
4 ounces each sliced Genoa salami and "fully cooked ham"
1/2 cup chopped jarred roasted red pepper
2 tablespoons each prepared pesto sauce and chopped ripe olives
1 tablespoon finely chopped green onion
Spinach leaves
4 ounces sliced provolone cheese
4 individual French baguettes (each 5 to 6 inches long), split

Combine red pepper, pesto sauce, olives and onion. Spread bottom half of each baguette piece with 1 1/2 tablespoons red pepper mixture. Layer with equal amounts of spinach leaves, cheese, Genoa salami and ham. Top with an equal amount of remaining red pepper mixture. Close sandwiches with baguette tops. Sandwiches can be served immediately or packed to go. (Wrap sandwiches individually in plastic wrap and refrigerate up to 4 hours; carry to site in an insulated cooler.) 4 sandwiches.

2 swordfish steaks
1/4 cup butter or margarine
2 large cloves garlic, finely minced
1 tablespoon chopped parsley or chives
1 pound soaked hardwood chunks
Prepare a covered grill as desired

for cooking. Make sure coals are white hot and covered with just a little gray ash. Add about 2 cups of the drained hardwood to the hot coals, cover the grill and allow the wood to begin to burn and create a good smoke. Meanwhile, combine butter or margarine with finely minced garlic and parsley. Mix well. When grill is smoking, place fish on the

rack about 4-6 inches from heat source. Brush lightly with garlic butter creation and cook, as desired. A basic 1/2-inch swordfish steak will cook in about 10-15 minutes in a covered smoker.

HICKORY SMOKED BURGERS
2 pounds hamburger, made into burgers

1 pound hickory chunks, soaked in water, drained

Prepare the grill with coals and allow the coals to become white hot and covered with just a little grey ash. Drain the hickory and add to coals to begin smoking. Place burgers on the grill about 4-6 inches from heat source. Cook as desired.

Schiff shows stuff on Showtime

Three minutes before the conclusion during the taping of Mark Schiff's first comedy special on Showtime, the lights went out.

The power-outage could've allowed the comedian to plug into the early days of his stand-up career some 14 years ago. Oh, what difficult times those were.

Like when Schiff would travel 100 miles to do five minutes of stand up for nothing, when people such as Richard Belzer used to call his act one of the worst he had seen and when detractors would line up to tell him to quit the business.

Yes, we know, Schiff's career has been comedy's perpetual bumper car among semis.

"That stuff didn't bother me," said Schiff in a telephone interview from his home in Los Angeles. "It just made the rise more interesting. I had nothing easy. Everything was a pain in the neck."

"I knew I had it in me even though other people didn't."

That's changing: Schiff is considered one of the hotter comedic commodities around, no doubt on the rise with his first half-hour television special on Showtime, "My Crummy Childhood" premieres 10:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 6, on the cable network.

THE BRONX, N.Y., native also appeared recently at the prestigious "Just for Laughs" festival in Montreal where a stage-wise Milton Berle gave Schiff a pep talk to quell some jitters.

"He just told me not to try to please anybody but the audience. Manager, agents... don't worry about them, just do your work. He told me, 'It's no mistake you're here.'"

With his oversized dress shirts and wild ties, Schiff begs for a lunch date with Oscar de la Renta. More than anything, though, he just wants to belong.

In his 30-minute special before a hometown crowd at New York University, Schiff delves into such universal themes as growing up, going to the grocery store and marriage.

"I stopped smoking, quit drinking and got married," he says during his on-stage routine. "I'm basically

dead. I sit on the edge of my bed in boxer shorts, peeling fruit."

His style varies from stone-face deadpanned to outright maniac. His routine is squeaky clean with the "hells" and "damns" are judiciously interspersed.

Like the forefather of family comedy, Bill Cosby, Schiff makes his points oh so subtly. Even in the course of a telephone conversation, discussing his 12-week-old son Jacob.

"YOU GO into a restaurant with a baby and everyone stares at you and yet if you're single and sit down at a table people are afraid to look at you. Isn't that weird?"

The birth of his son and marriage has opened up a whole new vista of material. He met his wife, Nancy, a few years ago during a benefit for the Jewish Federation in San Antonio, Texas. She was on the federation board, which organized the benefit.

"She was the only single woman there," Schiff said. "Everyone else was in their 70s. Any 30-year-old woman looks good then."

Ta dum. But marriage and fatherhood has perhaps made him even more reflective when discussing his own childhood.

Like the title of his show, Schiff said he believed his wasn't the best childhood at the time. He said every other family seemed to have more money, more worldly possessions.

The lingering pain from those times seeps through on "My Crummy Childhood" as Schiff maniacally recounts a face-to-face encounter with his mother. His eyes widen, his face contorts into a spasmodic rage portraying a parent screaming at her child.

FUNNY, YES, but the bit betrays more hurt perhaps than Schiff intended.

Schiff said he does have fond memories of childhood, though, such as going to Yankee Stadium with his dad.

Schiff said he gets deadpanned style from his father, who was a taxi driver in the Bronx. His more frantic moments emanate from his mother.

"I think every kid thinks they had a crummy childhood, especially when they are a kid... That's what I'm talking about."



'Eleni' thrives on suspense

In her small rural Greek village, Eleni Gatzoyannis had been raised according to tradition. She was to be obedient and to know her place. For probably the first time in her life, Eleni says a resounding no when Greek communists terrorize her village in 1948 and demand that the mothers give up their children for the party.

Before the Greek civil war ended in 1949, 28,000 Greek children had been taken from their families and shipped off for indoctrination in communist countries like Albania. One of the children who escaped the relocation was Eleni's son and New York Times reporter, Nick Gage, whose book is the basis for "Eleni," a 1985 Peter Yates film.

Raised in America since he was 9, the adult Gage has become increasingly obsessed with the torture and murder of his mother as the 30-year statute of limitations allowed under Greek law is about to run out.

Well played by John Malkovich, Gage keeps a handgun in his desk drawer and waits for a transfer to become bureau chief in Athens. He clearly has his own agenda for returning to Greece and wanting to locate surviving participants from the civil war.

ELENI'S STORY is told through flashbacks of Gage's memories of his mother and accounts he is able to piece together through his own investigations. Gage doesn't even respond to small talk from a boyhood friend he connects with in Athens.

He just keeps pushing for information about Eleni.

Played by Kate Nelligan, Eleni is a sturdy, unglamorous woman who has been keeping her family together without the help of her husband, who has been building the family fortune in America for nearly a decade.

Eleni's world is a place where firewood is gathered, goats are herded, and life is quiet. It will just a matter of time before her husband gets enough money and a home to bring his family to join him.

One of the ironies about Eleni's situation is that she was totally non-political. Early on she helps a local communist running from the monarchist soldiers. That same man later returns with the communist troops to force her family from their home, take all their food and put the local residents into forced labor details laying mines.

Eleni didn't know or care about politics. All she cared about was keeping her family together and from starving, at one point stealing the feedbag from a soldier's horse for the oats.

LINDA HUNT is very good as a

local woman whose communist sympathies don't help her when her maternal instincts run contrary to the communist party goals. After failing to get the appropriate patriotic response to their call for volunteer children, the party man tries to bribe the starving children with fresh bread.

Malkovich's Gage is a man haunted by the last glimpse he had of his mother as she was marched away on a work detail. After they had said their good-byes, Eleni senses the boy is still watching and turns just before she is out of sight for a final wave. It's that small boy that Gage remembers and helps fuel his rage that by simply surviving long enough, his mother's killers become innocent men.

For a film in which a large part of the conclusion is known at the outset, "Eleni" still manages to provide a good deal of suspense. It's the tension of filling in the outline of what we know with what is revealed in layers.

Trashy thriller has style

"Defenseless" is one of those films that could easily get overlooked among the end-of-the-summer leftovers. And it would be too bad, because this trashy little thriller moves an audience through its twists and turns with just enough style.

It also provides Barbara Hershey with her most rewarding role in years as T.K. Andrews, an attorney who gets much too close to her latest case. The victim, it turns out, was not only her client and lover, but also coincidentally the husband of her college roommate.

Overly melodramatic and hokney? You bet. But this low-budget thriller (made by New Visions Pictures and distributed by New Line and Seven Arts) delivers on suspense while scriptwriter James Hicks serves up quirky characters you don't find in your typical Hollywood thriller.

T.K., as it turns out, leads a pretty cluttered life. Her office is piled high with lawbooks, case files, and the occasional half-eaten chicken sandwich. Instead of a Franklin Planner, she writes notes and phone numbers on little scraps of paper. She keeps meaning to repair her old convertible, but never seems to find the time.

Her love life isn't much cleaner. She consistently falls for the wrong guys and this time picks a doozy when she both defends and sleeps with Stephen Seldes, a successful businessman who rented a warehouse building to a pornographic

movie studio which employed minors.

THE FATHER of a 14-year-old starlet flips out and starts stalking all the principals in the case. He bloodies sleazy director Jack Hammer and lops off the principal asset of porno actor Bull Dozer. He apparently got carried away by stabbing Seldes 18 times.

"Defenseless" begins with a clever twist. Instead of the usual opening credits, we watch the first shots of "Ball Busters," the Jack Hammer production about a cheerleader who will do anything to win the big game. For a moment you think you're in the wrong theater.

From here director Martin Campbell employs a pretty straightforward visual style that occasionally falls into the shadowy domain of film noir. When he does toss in a tricky shot, like mouse-eye-view closeups following high heels or characters silhouetted by strong backlighting, it works as a pleasant surprise.

Meanwhile, there's a great study by Mary Beth Hurt as Seldes' wife, a Southern belle who has kept her irritatingly sunny disposition ever since college. T.K. has always been a little suspicious. "If anyone was that happy, they'd die of hypoglycemia," she says.

Sam Shepard, the playwright and sometimes actor, doesn't have much to do as the investigating officer. He always looks cool smoking a cigarette, but his wooden disposition means he should never be cast outside of a role where he doesn't wear a cowboy hat.

"Defenseless" isn't a great film. It doesn't have the visual sense or emotional intensity of this summer's "Mortal Thoughts," but it is a solid night at the movies. And in this buffer zone between summer and fall, that's a welcome sight indeed.

Knight-time fun

Renaissance Festival offers joust about everything

A journey backward in time to a fun-loving age of discovery can be yours provided you "suspend your disbelief" and head for Holly, Mich.

If you can, you'll find knights jousting, jesters jesting and people speaking of dragons, damsels and magic.

You could consider the Michigan Renaissance Festival a sort of theme park in the raw. Situated on 200 acres in northwest Oakland County, the festival, in its 12th year, provides an impressive array of crafters, magic and stage acts, food and drink, and people just being a little silly. And being mirthful is the key to enjoying the outdoor event that runs for seven weekends from mid-August through the end of September.

"It's as much (fun) as you make it," said festival official Peggy Burkhard. "You have to live the dream."

Craft booths, featuring about 150 artists whose works have been juried for their authenticity, line the 16th Century streets under ample tree shade. Food booths feature modern favorites such as pizza and gyro sandwiches along with culinary delights of an earlier time: roasted turkey drumsticks, Scotch eggs and apple dumplings.

The 700-member staff, dressed in period costume, are bound to get you in a festive mood whether it be through a melodramatic farce on stage at the Swan Theatre, a

knights joust in full armor on horseback, or just a little ribbing as you walk along. Characters like Ded Bob, Magical Mystical Michael and Sir Ryosus help keep the mood light. And there's always an event on the grounds.

THERE'S EVEN an open air pub with entertainment that serves imported English beer and includes part of a real pub brought over from the old country. Cyril Lilly, an Englishman celebrating his birthday at Watneys Pub said it's quite authentic.

And while most visitors to the festival don't come quite as far, they seem to have just as much fun.

"My son challenged me (to dueling buckets)," said a somewhat damp Kathy Poole of Livonia. "I won. You don't often win with a kid," she added with a laugh. "They set the tone so that it's really fun."

And rain or shine, the festival goes on.

The event runs every Saturday and Sunday and Labor Day through the last weekend in September. Crowds for the opening weekend, which included a rainy Saturday, exceeded 20,000, most from Oakland County, Burkhard said. Yet the wide "streets" of the festival and large parking area make it easy to get around.

And many visitors are happy just to walk through the myriad of craft shops, which include weaving to glass blowing to the making of knight's armor. Others find it easy enough to stop at one of several stages to see a play, a puppet show or a magic act. And games for kids of all ages abound. What festival celebrating the 16th century in Europe would be complete without archery? Kids can joust on Fight the Knight, use their balance on Hunker Hauser and get all wet with Dueling Buckets.

ONE OF THE most popular events of all is the Joust. Three times a day, knights take arms, first on horseback, and then on foot, to win honor and glory before the king and his court. The lances break for real, but the knights survive intact, except for the verbal barbs of the crowd.

All kidding aside, the event coincides with the Harvest celebrations of earlier times. And for many actors, magicians and singers, it's a chance to display their talents.

Festival staff can be amateur actors to professional minstrels who play at the pub. And there are enough of them to keep visitors continually entertained.

And that's the festival's goal, to make sure those who enter this "kingdom" of a bygone era let go of their daily cares for an afternoon.

That quality of make-believe is an essential ingredient of the festival's success, says M'Arch McCarty, who along with his wife Janet serve as King Edward and Queen Katheryne.

"When I welcome visitors I say 'I am King Edward here, today, and you are whoever you want to be,'" said McCarty, who works as an actor throughout the year. "And it's true — for awhile."

The Michigan Renaissance Festival runs consecutive weekends, through Sept. 28-29, on Dixie Highway, one mile north of Mt. Holly. Hours are 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Admission is \$9.95 for adults at the gate (\$8.75 in advance); \$4.95 for children at the gate (\$4 advance). For information, call 645-9640.

Leave summer behind at state fall festivals

The leaves are coming. In two weeks they will begin their crisp colorful descent across the Upper Peninsula. By the end of the month they will cross the Mackinac Bridge and begin to stain the ground around Mackinaw City and Traverse City.

By mid-October they will wrap their gold and green glory around Bay City and central Michigan, moving on south like a freight train of autumn color until they reach us in mid-October.

You can't stop them. Nature is in charge. They will roll down I-75 past Dayton and Cincinnati, through the mountains of Kentucky and Tennessee, painting the world with their color and marking our calendars with the promise of winter to come.

For many of us, it is a favorite time of year, a time of autumn festivals and weekend getaways, with the kids in school and the heat of summer fading away.

You like festivals? Check out the action this weekend, Sept. 6-8, at either the Michigan Wine and Harvest Festival in Kalamazoo and Paw Paw or the Michigan Potato Festival in Posen and Edmore.

Or start at the western end of the UP with the Sept. 14-15 Oktoberfest in Copper Harbor, hit the Ewen Log-Jam-Boree Sept. 27-28 and end up Oct. 11-12 at either the Pumpkifest in Bessemer or the Oktoberfest in Iron Mountain.

There's an Oct. 4-6 Red Flannel Festival in Cedar Springs and an Oct. 11-13 Oktoberfest in Frankenthuth. Call toll-free (800) 5432-YES for a booklet called Michigan Fall Secrets from the Michigan Travel Bureau.

It will tell you about the three Great Lakes circle tours posted around lakes Michigan, Huron or Superior.

Explore the Agawa Canyon color train out of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, which leaves daily at 8 a.m. for the 230-mile trek north into the autumn-leaf glory of Agawa Canyon.

Or the Southern Michigan Railroad trains that leave every weekend from Clinton and Tecumseh to Raisin Center, call (517) 423-7230.

Or the Bluewater Michigan Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society, which runs a pair of fall color tours by special excursion train that run from Birmingham to the Thumb, a 200-mile circle, Oct. 19 and 20.

Ride a canoe or take one of the fall color tours offered Sept. 29 through Oct. 21 on the Au Sable River Queen. Take a hot air balloon above the trees at sunrise or sunset from Capt. Phogg Balloon Rides in Penton.

Did somebody say cider mills? We've got a million of them, starting with Adrien and Armada and ending with Ypsilanti. Check the state book for addresses.

And if you'd rather hang out a sign that reads "gone fishin'," we've got a million fishing tournaments for you.

We like to think that nobody else in the world has color like Michigan's color, but you can follow it down Interstate 75 to the mountains north of Atlanta before it begins to fade. Call Kentucky's ColorFall line toll-free at (800) 225-TRIP for color dates, late September to early November, when the color peaks in the southeast.

To the lighthouse at Big Bay Point

When the sun sets on Lake Superior, you'll know where to find the guests of the Big Bay Point Lighthouse. In the tower, high among the bluffs, I joined in the show as the glowing orange ball bid another good night to the Upper Peninsula shoreline.

I had arrived just an hour before to find a pink sheet of paper taped to my bedroom door. Innkeepers Buck and Marilyn Gotschall leave these for all overnight guests, a tongue-in-cheek description of duties while staying overnight. A button attached to the instructions distinguished me as a Keeper's Helper.

I didn't have to monitor weather

conditions or replace a lamp filament, but I did feel, for a night anyway, that I guided the mighty Great Lakes freighters as the Big Bay beam traveled out over the waves.

According to the innkeepers, Big Bay Lighthouse is the only privately owned and operated lighthouse on the Great Lakes and the only one in the country where guests sleep right on the premises. The Gotschalls bought the historic 1896 brick structure in 1986 and immediately opened it as an inn.

"Guests like the mile of shoreline," Buck said. "It's rocky and craggy and good for rock-hounding."

Buck is a great kidder who picked up tennis at age 50 and has since whipped players half his age in statewide tournaments. He's also an avid sailor and pilot with his own airstrip and plane 100 feet from the front door. Marilyn, meanwhile, is a world traveler.

The breakfast conversation, as a result, is especially fascinating. Stories about Italian vacations. About the bear who ran into the woods with a trash can. About Buck's growing-up years in the same Indiana town where James Dean lived.

Big Bay Lighthouse has all the warmth and friendliness you expect from a great bed and breakfast, but it's not a luxury stay. Like the craggy rocks on which it sits, the lighthouse is more than a little rough around the edges.

During my visit, tools and books were piled high on a stair landing. The homey, cluttered common rooms displayed postcards and T-shirts for sale. Some corners needed redecorating, others a simple straightening and dusting.

Six upstairs guest rooms, which command \$65 to \$165 per night, are sparsely decorated and comfortable. Some share bathrooms down the hall. The Tower Room, with its dramatic view of the lake, remains the most requested.

The guests gather after dark in the first-floor living room, where the great stone fireplace takes a bite out of the cold lake wind; the

wind can beat fiercely during a fall gale. Our conversation turned to William Pryor, the original Big Bay Point lighthouse keeper, who died under mysterious circumstances in 1901 and whose ghost reportedly roams the bluffs.

"He whispers to me in the spring to go fishing," Buck said. "I go, because I don't want a mad ghost around, but Marilyn doesn't hear him and she is getting suspicious!"

The second-floor library leads to a circular staircase and up to the tower, 120 feet above the water, where the light casts its beam. The current lighting apparatus is considerably smaller than the original Fresnel lens, which is on display in the foghouse.

Buck notes that it came from Paris with a list of 52 lighting instructions.


Breakfast is in two shifts, six guests each, during busy summer mornings, and it emphasizes the healthy and homegrown. We started with a whipped fruit drink of peaches, pears, apples, red raspberries and a touch of yogurt. Homebaked muffins came next, followed by delicious yogurt/buttermilk waffles. They serve white-

fish or brook trout in season.

The innkeepers suggest (and so do I) the 4½ hour \$25 tour of Big Bay with friend and neighbor Jeff Ten Eyck. He guides the adventurous to favorite spots, hopping stone-to-stone over rushing water or scaling medium-sized cliffs. Jeff caters to any guest, including the elderly or disabled, who wants to journey by van to hiking sites and enjoy a trail lunch of U.P. pasties.

The Innkeepers have blazed a pleasant trail that begins as a tree-lined path, then ends in meadows along the Lake Superior bluffs, so you can hike around the property. Explore the town restaurants and the spots made familiar by "Anatomy of a Murderer," the 1959 movie which was filmed here and in nearby Marquette.

During your second breakfast, you'll be upgraded to Senior Helper, but your only real responsibilities will be to relax and enjoy one of the country's most unusual bed-and-breakfast experiences.
