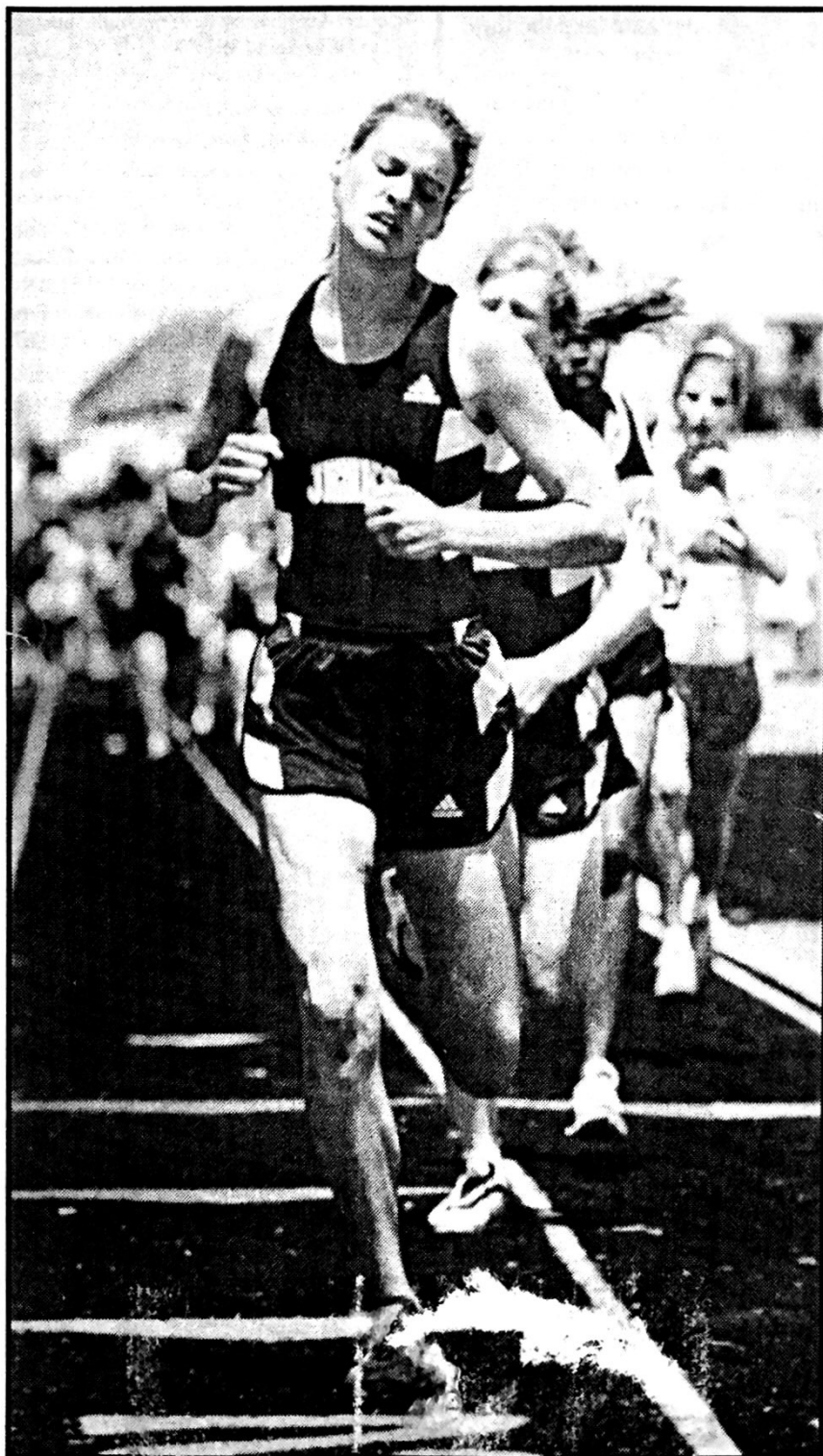

1998 Large School State Meets

CLASS 5A BOYS

Sophomore Chip Helaire lit an early fuse in the second event on Class 5A's final-day program and the Midwest City Bombers rocketed on to their first state track championship in 33 years.

Helaire ripped off a state record 1:52.31 in the 800 meters. Four events later, he placed second in the 400 (48.99 to the winning 48.47 by Choctaw's Quentez Ware) to virtually clinch the title.

Choctaw closed the day by winning the 1,600 relay, but wound up a firmly-beaten second to Midwest City in the team race, 88.5 to 64. Choctaw also won the 400 relay and nipped Moore, which scored only two total relay points, by a single point for the runnerup trophy.

Helaire had previously run the 800 just a shade under 1:57 this season (1:56.75 for second at the Mid-State Conference meet). He learned a valuable lesson, he said, in Friday's 1,600 relay.

"After the relay leg in the preliminaries, I decided I needed to take off faster," Chip explained. "So, I took out faster today."

Near the finish, Clay Cosby of Jenks - last fall's state cross-country champion - closed on Helaire, but couldn't catch him, clocking 1:53.71.

"It's the first time I've beat Clay," Helaire said. Clay also was the 800 silver medalist last year behind Mark Thompson of Edmond Memorial with a 1:55.25.

Jimmy Martinez of Moore, who nipped Helaire in the Mid-State meet, was third in 1:54.06 and came back later to win the 1,600 in 4:21.33. When all of Oklahoma's fastest half-mile times are lumped together (880 yards and 800 meters, converted and adjusted for hand timing), Helaire ranks No. 3 on the all-time list.

The Half-Mile Top Six (converted and adjusted for hand timing): Jim Davis Lawton (1975) 1:51.24; Bill Hamrick, Del City (1970) 1:52.04; Chip Helaire, Midwest City (1998) 1:52.31; Jeremy Thayer, Norman (1993) 1:52.42; Dirk Dahl, Okmulgee (1970) 1:52.54; Mark Cravens, Union (1993) 1:53.22

Midwest City's only other gold came in the 3,200 relay with DeSean Lusk, Mike Mitchell, Eric Delgado and Helaire combining for a 7:47.81, just a hair off the meet and state record 7:47.07, set by Putnam City on the same Choctaw track four years ago.

Rocky Winkle's Bombers picked up points in 10 events, a vast contrast to last season when Midwest City

Bookout In Form Again

At the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association's East-West All-Star meet May 23, Kyle Bookout of Stroud unleashed a 196-11 discus throw — more than four feet beyond his state record 192-9.5

Should it be counted as the state record?

Past policy says "maybe."

State records were routinely beaten and counted during the early years of the Meet of Champions, held for seven years during the 1960's, a week after the State Meet.

Two of them still stand:

Mike Ryles' (Ada) 65-1 shot put in 1965.

Douglass' 41.4 in the 440 relay, also in 1965.

But, beginning with the 1967 Meet of Champions, the OSSAA the ruled Meet of Champions would no longer be sanctioned for state record-breaking performances.

That denied four new standards in 1967: 15-1'4 pole vault by Jim Crow of Tulsa Hale and Joe McClung of Lawton, 4:11.2 mile by Larry Rose of U. S. Grant, 9:34.0 two-mile by Ron Major of Enid and 3:20.4 mile relay by Fairview.

The next year, Lawton Eisenhower ran a then best-ever 3:19.1 mile relay in the Meet of Champions.

Without a state-record possibility, top performers began staying away from the Meet of Champions and its finale was in 1969.

Here's the argument for including Bookout's 196-11 as the state record:

The OSSAA no longer sanctions any state records.

The Oklahoma Track Coaches Association should be the sanctioning body (but has not yet accepted that responsibility). If the track coaches are in charge of record approving, why not approve the marks set in their own "East-West" champions meet? That would insure a stronger field and superior event.

However, if running records are to be counted, the coaches should use fully electronic timing. Relay times couldn't qualify as they are composite teams, not a single school team. Bookout's 196-11 should be put in limbo until such a time that proper decisions by the OTCA are made.

scored just five total points after a fairly productive regional (74.3 points).

"We bought a record board to put up in the field house (at the start of the season) and I think I'll have to change about 10 of those school records," Winkle said. "That's a tribute to these kids who have worked long and hard since January."

Midwest City's only previous state track title came in 1965 when legendary sprinter Rip Van Winkle swept the 100 and 220 and anchored two victorious relay teams.

Ware, who beat Helaire in the 400, was Choctaw's ace, helping the Yellow Jackets win the 400 relay (41.95) and the 1,600 relay (3:19.05). Also running winning legs on both were Justin Coccoran, Reggie Cato and Michael Westland.

Midwest City and Choctaw came from the same Putnam City regional, where they also finished 1-2 (188 to 112).

Norman's Josh Howk became the state's 20th 60-foot shot putter in history with a 60-11. Earlier this season, Stroud's Kyle Bookout, the 2A champion, had a 60-5. They are among only four 60-footers in Oklahoma during the 1990's.

Reggie Johnson of Muskogee was the lone double gold medalist in 5A boys. He won the 100 in 10.99 and the 200 in 21.77. Howk took both weight events a year ago, but was fourth this time in the discus. That was won by Moore's Frank Romero by more than 24 feet with a healthy 184-0. His season best had been just over 157.

CLASS 4A BOYS

Ardmore followed its script down to the last comma to handily win its fifth state track title by a comfortable 106 to 73.33 margin over Duncan.

"All of our kids finished exactly where we thought they would," said coach Keith Patterson. "We set out a goal to be state champion, so it wasn't a surprise to us."

Gold medals were pocketed by the Tiger 400-relay unit of Phil Smith, Steve Smith, Atelo Ford and Chris Cole, by Cole in the 100 (11.09) and by Tony McGee in the long jump (23-1.5).

McGee, a football tailback and basketball point guard who plans to continue his three sports at Southeastern State, first won the long jump title two years ago as a sophomore. He slipped to a fourth-place finish in 1997, but "won every long jump this year except one."

David Phillips of Tulsa McLain scored a championship double in the 200 (22.16) and 400 (48.32) and earned another gold medal with the 1,600 relay team. His and the Scots' 400 baton unit ran second to Ardmore.

Duncan got all but five of its points in the hurdles (16 of them) and field events (52.33).

Chris Brack won the intermediate hurdles (38.75) and ran third in the highs. Adam Doiron and Lute Croy swept the two top spots in the weights. Josh Dial improved on his own meet record in the pole vault.

Doiron, a 6-5, 240-pound sophomore, threw the shot 57-8.5, and the discus 156-6. Croy, a 6-3, 285 senior, did 56-9.5 and 172-4.

Croy was disappointed with his discus toss. It was a four-inch improvement on his state-winning performance of a season ago, but well below this year's 186-10 peak at the John Jacobs meet.

"In college, I'll throw the discus, shot and hammer," he said. His college? Southern Methodist, where he's being figured to fill a defensive tackle spot in football.

If you're a Dial, you pole vault, of course – and you win. Now a junior, Josh Dial has won back-to-back state titles, each at a meet record height – 15-4.5 and 15-6.

Uncle Joe Dial was a four-time state champion and the state record holder at 17-9.5.

Josh expected to go higher than 15-6 since he'd cleared 16 feet in four meets this season, including a career top of 16-7 at the Western Heights Invitational, which coincidentally is the same meet where Joe set his state record in 1981.

In the state meet, Josh didn't pick up his pole until the bar reached 14-6. By that time, only three vaulters were still alive, all from Claremore (Tyson Smith, Robby Woods and Michael Dee) and they all went out at 14-6, while Dial cleared it on his first attempt. He got his new record on his third and last try at 15-6, but couldn't better that.

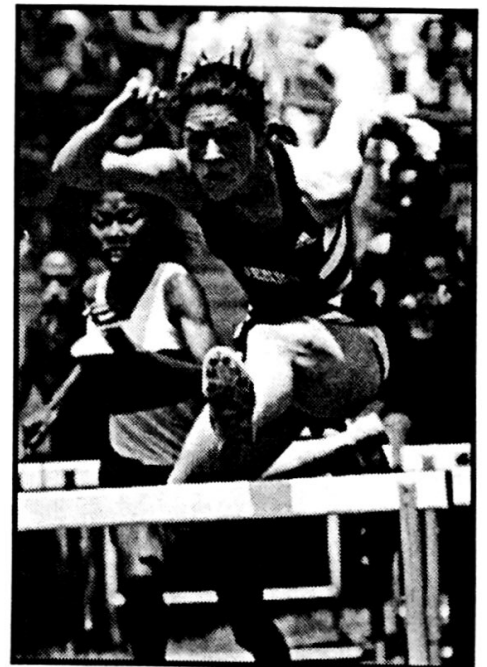
"My season doesn't end until August," said the 5-11, 145-pounder. "I have a busy summer schedule."

Dial's immediate goal is to stay at least even with Joe. "I've beat Joe or been tied with him at every (age) level up to this year," he said. Josh's work is cut out this summer. Joe cleared

17-1 to win the state high school title as a junior and first broke the national prep record by going 17-5.25 that season at the Kansas Relays.

Joe Dial's 17-9.5 is still the existing national high school mark, or at least it was when this season began.

Tulsa East Central's DeJaun Davis became a repeat champion in the 800, turning in a 1:55.9, compared to last year's 1:57.40.

CLASS 5A GIRLS

Led by hurdler Emily Waibel and record-setting senior half-miler Kelli O'Rourke, the Jenks Lady Trojans repeated as state champions.

And, but for 1996's disqualification in the wrapup 1,600 relay for tossing the baton at the finish-line, Jenks would own four titles in a row.

Waibel, third last year in both the hurdles and the long jump, decisively won the hurdles in 14.16 and 43.81.

O'Rourke, senior daughter of Jenks coach Martha O'Rourke and twice an 800 runnerup, snipped a fraction off former Trojan Amy Tinker's state record mark, lowering it from 2:13.90 to 2:13.63. She also ran anchor on the winning 3,200 relay team (9:30.47), joining Atalie Barber, Katie Collier and Ruth Emrick.

Barber won the 1,600 in 5:11.88, a 13-second improvement over her runnerup finish of a year ago.

Stillwater's Delisa McClain was a double winner, taking the shot at 42-7 and the discus at 119-2, no surprise as she came into the meet with the year's top 5A tosses in both events.

There were two repeat champions from 1997. Jessica Lingor of Tahlequah won the high jump both years at 5-6. Jessica Talton of Broken Arrow made a 400 improvement, from 57.75 to 57.11.

Several familiar names popped up atop the charts.

The 3,200 winner, Amy Bratton of Tulsa Hale (11:27.72) owns medals in numerous distance events, including cross-country silver last fall.

Teya Gill won the 100 for Del City (12.26) and helped the Eagles grab two relay crowns (400 in 47.01 and 1,600 in 3:56.08). Only a junior now, Gill won the state Class 100, 200 and 400 for Luther in 1996 and 1997.

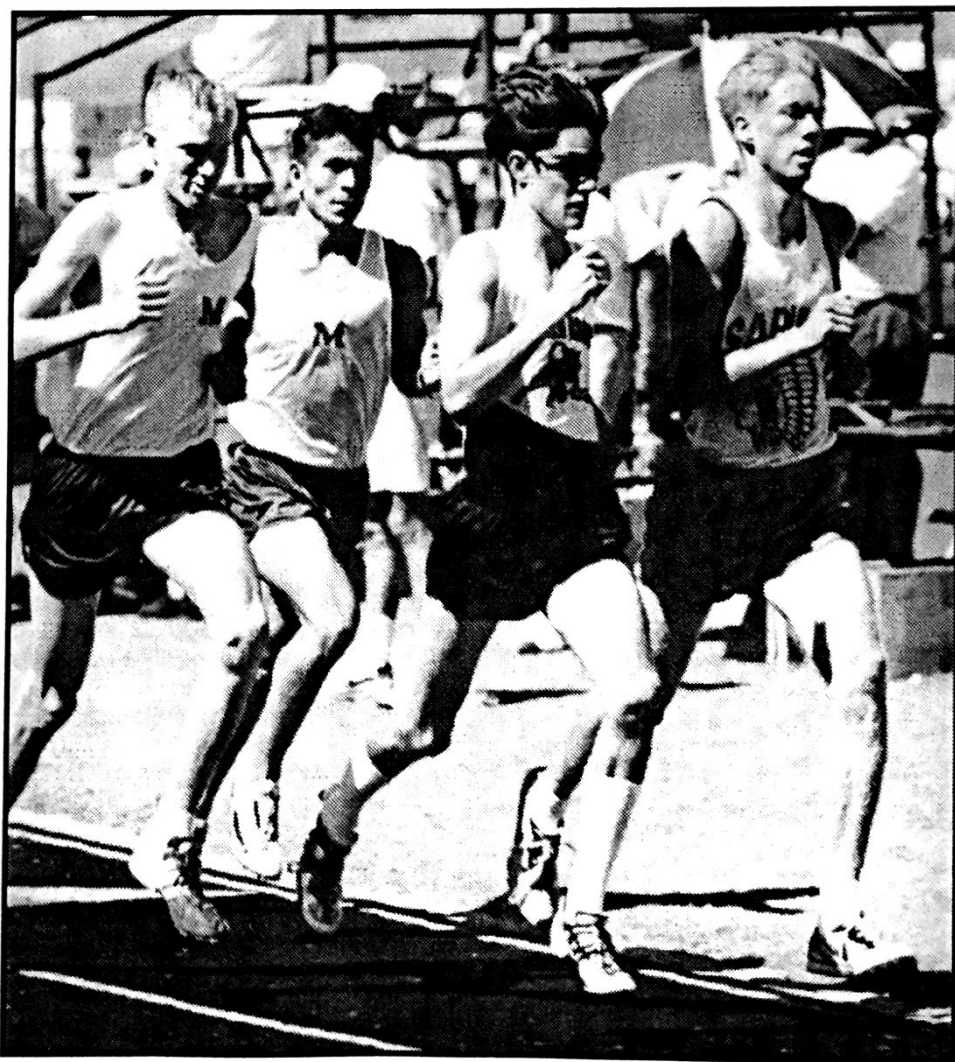
The Midwest City girls fell 18 points shy of joining the boy Bombers as state champions (Jenks 126, Midwest City 108.6), but they gave the state 800 meter relay record a close call.

In fact, for awhile the foursome of Brlttany Anderson (the 200 champion), Ilicia Walker, Teranek Crawford and Terri Young thought they had the mark with a 1:40.84. But the real 5A meet record is 1:39.87 by John Marshall in 1989 (which was listed correctly in the state meet program under "state meet records").

But, in a separate chart under "state records," another John Marshall time (1:41.01 in 1987) was incorrectly listed.

"We'll be after that record next year because we return three of our girls," said Midwest City coach David Gleason. "We didn't feel there was anyone in this year's 5A field who could beat us. So we held them in the blocks and used only safe handoffs."

Midwest City does own one state relay record for metric races, the 46.29 it clocked in last year's state meet 400 preliminaries. Terri Young

ran with that record-setting unit, which then struggled home sixth in the finals.

CLASS 4A GIRLS

While it's sometimes a puzzle trying to separate Northeast-Classsen from Northwest Classsen, there is no confusion in the ranks of either of those Class 4A girls track squads.

Both simply went out and gathered virtually every point possible.

The combine of Northeast and Classsen won the three sprint relays and got 72 points from seven girls. Northwest's Knights put a total of four girls on the track in four events and rolled up 68 points.

Ron Miller's Northeast girls owned the year's best 4A times in the 400, 800 and 1,600 relays and they lowered their clockings in all three to near record marks of 48.32, 1:41.06 and 3:58.45.

This was essential because Northwest, only third and fourth best on the pre-state 400 and 800 relay charts, was up to the challenge. The Knights gave Northeast a fight to the wire in both races while finishing second in 48.43 and 1:43.00. Three girls ran legs on Northeast's three relay champions - senior Nicole Jackson, sophomore Shilah Stanford and freshman Stephanie Madden. Senior Shanika James and freshman Tyisha James each ran on a relay unit in the finals and Shavon Young handled a 1,600 relay carry in the preliminaries.

"Northwest got all the points it could possibly get," Miller said. "They pushed us all year and deserve to be given credit."

Actually, entering the concluding 1,600 relay, Northwest had 68 points, Northeast-Classsen 52. Northwest had no relay entry, its junior sprint stars, Aishia Gordon and Chimese Brown, having just finished 1-2 in the 200 - as they did earlier in the 100.

be run with a strong wind and had them hand-timed with only a single watch on each place.

Duncan sophomore Camille Herron also was a double winner this year, clocking 5:17.30 in the 1,600 and 11:47.55 in the 3,200. She was state runnerup in the long race as a freshman and was third in 4A cross-country last fall.

Another Duncan Demon, Amonica Wiggins, was feeling so punk that she pulled out of the 800 early in the finals program, an event she had won two years ago as a sophomore.

She was feeling great though when she arrived at the finish line of the 400 later in the day. "They told me it was a 55.9," she said. That turned out to be the hand clocking, but the Accutrack 56.10 let her better her own meet mark of 56.72, posted last year.

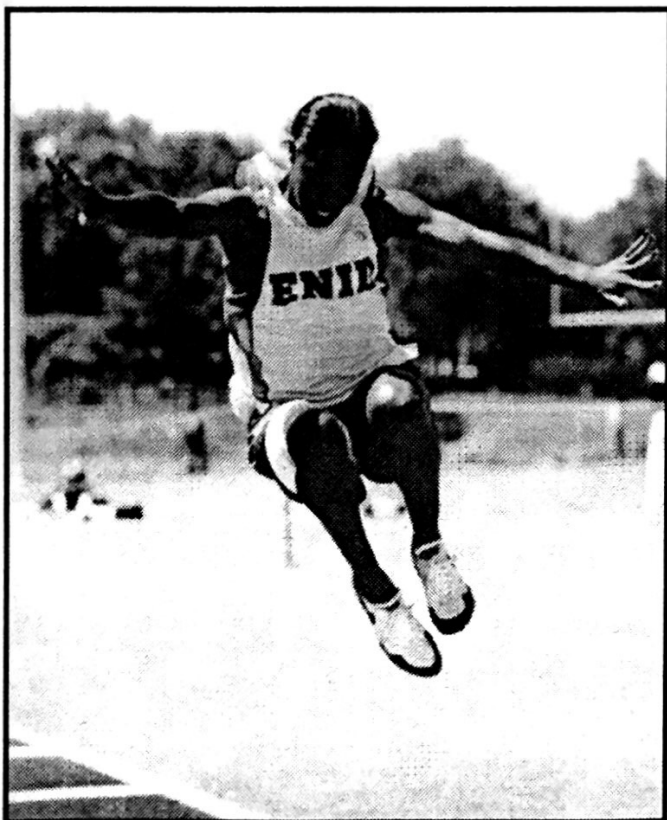
Ardmore junior Nova Marshall won the long jump at 18-0 to deal a blow to Kendall Arant of Lawton MacArthur. Arant has won seven state jumping medals, including two golds in the high jump. But in the long jump, she finished, in order, third, second, second and second.

Courtney Castle, a Claremore sophomore, won the high jump with a personal best of 5-6. In doing so, she avenged a regional loss to runnerup Brandy Anderson of Catoosa and blocked third-place Arant from a third consecutive gold.

Tracy Kmetz of Tulsa Kelley, the defending 1,600 champion, was beaten to the wire by Duncan's Herron and also finished second in the 800 behind Kim Thomas of McAlester, who had a strong 2:15.60. Thomas gave Wiggins a good push in the 400.

"Our girls knew they had to win the relay," Miller said. Anchor Shilah Stanford (Classsen's biggest contribution to the squad) took the baton nearly 10 meters behind and finished at least that much ahead. "We caught her in 56.9," Miller said.

Gordon and Brown were joined on the Northwest relay teams by seniors Kristie Douglas and Denise Anderson.

Gordon won the 100 in 10.29 and the 200 in 24.91 to run her 3-year state gold medal collection to five. She won both the 200 and 400 in 4A in 1996 as a freshman and the 200 in 5A last season.

Her 200 last year was a 24.04, the best girls clocking in Oklahoma history, but can't go down as the record. That's because state meet officials inexplicably changed all the 200 races to

OSU's Ren Carlsen provisionally qualified for the NCAA's with a personal best 29:27.41. The native of Odense, Denmark finished sixth against some pretty stiff competition as teammate and Welsh native Nathaniel Lane (30:13.15) also had a personal best. Erik Framme (30:26.24) of Stenungsund, Sweden also ran well for the Cowboys.

Oklahoma Outdoor - Norman, OK April 25

Sooner highlights from the meet hosted by the Sooners included: (Women) Hammer throw - Katie Webster - 162-2 (2nd), Shot Put - Candie Palmer - 45-5.5 (1st), Long Jump - Janel Hayes - 18-11.5 (1st), Triple Jump - Shayla Austin - 36-4 (2nd), 1500 meters - Corrie Hussar - 4:50.25 (1st), 5000 meters - Andrea DeLozier - 18:28.67 (1st), 100 meter hurdles - Andrea Bell - 14.76 (2nd). (Men) Discus - Ryan Dicus - 157-9 (2nd), High Jump - Marcus Modey - 6-8 (3rd), 1500 meters - Jason Larabee - 3:59.08 (1st), 800 meters - Milton Murphy - 1:57.34 (1st). The other half of Tulsa's team competed in Norman at the John Jacobs track.

Mid-Continent Conference Kansas City, MO - May 1-2

Joe Dial's ORU Golden Eagles competed in their first outdoor championship for the Mid-Continent Conference at this meet hosted by the University of Missouri - KC. The Eagle women fared well as they finished with a fourth place showing of 111 points to winner Southern Utah's 208. Kay Dennis was crowned conference champ in the 100 meters (12.33), finished third in the 200 (25.56), and ran a leg on the fourth-place 400 meter relay team (48.31). The ladies also finished fourth in the 1600 meter relay (3:58.60). In the field events, Dorenda Desland triple jumped her way to the winners stand (41-4.25), jumped to a third place in the high jump (54.25), as well as a close second place effort in the long jump (19-6.75), with teammate Terressa Scott in third (19-2.5). Adrienne Beamon was second to Desland in the triple jump at 39-6.5.

In the men's meet, Southern Utah again prevailed (179) as ORU finished sixth with 78 points. There were several conference champions as Dedrick Marsh took both the century and double-century in 10.55 and 21.89 respectively. Teammate Devon Metcalf was second (10.70) and third (21.99) in both events. Ben Houlberg won the 1500 meters (3:52.18), and was fourth in the 800 meters (1:54.66). The Eagles finished fourth in the 1600 meter relay in 3:23.73. The

pole vault produced two good performances in third-place Matt Robinson (15-3.5), and fourth-place Ben Chisum (14-11.5). Chisum also leaped to a third place in the long jump (23-2).

OSU Cowgirls' sprinter LaToya Hinds, in leading her fellow sprinters in place of injured teammate Sherita Jackson, sprinted to a 11.77 fifth-place clocking in the 100 meters, coming back later to finish second in the 200 meters with a 25.06. Some other performances included: 800 meters - Andrene Thompson - 2:09.67 (3rd), and Megan Robbins 10-0 fourth place effort in the Pole Vault.

Queen City Invitational Springfield, MO - May 2

The Cowboys' Brian Young qualified provisionally for the NCAA's with his 3:45.31 clocking, good for fourth. Montana sophomore Chuck Sloan ran with Young the whole way, but just missed qualifying with his 3:46.55 in fifth place. Another sophomore, Ben Phillips ran a season best 3:52.10 for tenth.

Kendra Lollis of the University of Tulsa, set a new school record in the women's 100 meter hurdles finishing second in 14.57. Other TU women's results included Caroline Avbovbede's victory in the 200 meters (24.73), Tiffany Williams (24.93) for second, and Fride Vullum's win in the 1500 meters (4:35.49). On the men's side, Adam Ellison won the 800 meters in 1:51.22 with Rodney Peterson a step back in second (1:51.85), Cary Stidham won the 3000 meters (8:39.19), and Sedrick Lusk was third in the Long Jump (24-0.75), and second in the 100 meters (10.68). The 1600 meter relay team also scored a win in 3:15.15.

Phil Diamond Invitational Ann Arbor, MI - May 8

OSU's Rene' Carlsen finished second behind Michigan's Todd Snider in a 5000 meter race. His time was 14:36.66

Cardinal Invitational Palo Alto, CA - May 9

OSU's Chuck Sloan finished third in a 1500 meter race at Stanford, and qualified provisionally for the NCAA's with a 3:44.15. He's already qualified for the 3000 meter Steeplechase.

Cardinal Qualifier Palo Alto, CA May 16

Tulsa's Hurricane provisionally qualified three runners for the NCAA's in this meet hosted by Stanford. Fride Vullum broke her own school record while finishing third in the 3000 meters. Her time was 9:34.45. Dwight Davis, in finishing sixth, also clocked a new school record with a 3:44.05 in the 1500 meters. Adam Ellison again lowered his school record with a 1:48.78 in the 800 meters for a fourth place finish. Other highlights included Tiffany Williams victory in the 400 meters (54.98), Monique Poindexter's 2:11.95 in the 800 meters, and Rodney Peterson's 1:49.02 personal best, also in the 800 meters.

UTEP Twilight Invitational El Paso, TX - May 16

Highlights from this meet include: Pole Vault - Chris Duffy (OU) - 17-9 (1st), Ben Chisum (ORU) - 16-725 (4th), 100 meters - Devon Metcalf (ORU) - 10.54 (3rd), Dedrick Marsh (ORU) - 10.57 (5th), 800 meters - Ben Houlberg (ORU) - 1:52.33 (1st), 200 meters - Devon Metcalf (ORU) - 21.68 (3rd), and Laura Arthun (ORU) - 11-9.75 for third in the Pole Vault.

Big 12 Championships Columbia, MO - May 15-17

The Huskers of Nebraska prevailed on the men's side as they chalked up 151 points to runner-up Baylor (101). Texas was a few points back in third (93.5) with the Oklahoma Sooners winding up with an excellent fourth place showing (68.5). Oklahoma State had some good performances from their distance corps but finished last overall with 25 points.

Texas' speedy sprinters were the difference as the Lady Longhorns garnered the championship trophy with a 151 to 113 point margin over Nebraska. Oklahoma's relay teams helped their cause as the Lady Sooners finished with 52 points for eighth place overall. The Oklahoma State Cowgirls didn't fare as well, but had some promising performances in finishing last with 15 points.

Led by Omar Brown's scintillatingly fast and NCAA-qualifying 48.98 victory in the men's 400 meter hurdles, and Chris Duffy's victory in the Pole Vault (17-6.5), the Sooner men are pointing towards the nationals in Buffalo, NY to further test their abilities. The 1600 meter relay squad showed much improvement in finishing runner-up to NCAA-favorite Baylor. The Sooners' 3:04.32 is the best so far this year. Baylor won in 3:01.84. The 400 meter relay was slightly different, although the outcome was the same. Baylor (39.62) was able to hold off a furious rally by Texas Tech (39.65) and Oklahoma (39.68) in what was certainly a photo-finish.

OSU's Chuck Sloan further validated his ranking as the top steeplechaser in the country with his close 8:52.30 victory over Missouri's

Ray Hughes. The two finished in a dead heat with Sloan getting the nod over the Tiger. Jason Larabee continues to run well for the Sooners as he finished just a few seconds back of Big 12 perennial champion Adam Goucher in the 1500 meters. Larabee was timed in 3:47.52, with OSU's Brian Young arriving in sixth at 3:51.95.

Larabee also scored some valuable points in the 5000 meters, finishing fourth in 14:35.12. OSU had a trio of runners, not in scoring position, but nevertheless running well as Nathaniel Lane (14:57.04), Scott Gray (15:33.60), and Ben Phillips (15:41.29) showed future promise.

In the 10000 meters, Rene' Carlsen of OSU finished fourth in the 25-lapper in 31:14.28, leading fellow Cowboys Nathaniel Lane (31:28.23), and Erik Framme (31:30.50) to fifth and sixth place showings.

Other OU highlights included: Edward Clarke in the 400 meter hurdles - 51.13 (3rd); Shomari Wilson - 100 meters - 10.38 (4th); and Nils-Andre Oliveto in the Hammer throw - 186-6 (4th).

The Lady Sooners' relay teams ran very well as the 1600 meter relay foursome easily qualified for the NCAA's edging out Texas by an eyelash in 3:31.81. Baylor won the event in 3:29.11. In the 400 meter relay Oklahoma's likewise ran well in finishing third (44.67) to Texas (43.64) and Baylor (44.31).

Melody Vaughn of OSU scored some valuable third place points as she jumped to a 19-9.75 with OU's Janel Hayes finishing seventh with a leap of 19-425. The Pole Vault produced some

good performances for both state schools as four finished in the top twelve. Lindsey Harris of OU (11-7.75), Megan Robbins of OSU (11-1.75), Kelly Miller of OSU (9-8), and Angie Montgomery of OU (9-225) in fifth, sixth, tenth, and twelfth respectively.

Amy Tinker, who provisionally qualified earlier in the season finished third in a close 800 meter race in 2:07.82. OSU's Andrene Thompson was fifth in 2:09.03. Cecile Cargill just missed qualifying for the NCAA's with her excellent 52.25 fourth place effort in the 400 meters, but she is still has a PQ mark.

Other highlights included: OU's Jacqueline Horton (11.65), and Donnette Brown (11.69) in the 100 meters in fifth and sixth; Horton (23.65), and Brown (23.87) again in the 200 meters in seventh and eighth; Tamara Dingley (OSU) and Andrea DeLozier (OU) in the 3000 meters. They ran 10:10.88 and 10:14.55 for seventh and eighth respectively; OU's Jessica Longfors (160-7), and Bambi Carson (153-5) in the Discus (fifth and ninth); OU's Candie Palmer (46-5.5) in the Shot Put (seventh); and OU's Katie Webster in both the Hammer (160-4) for 12th, and the Javelin (154-8) for fifth.

Western Athletic Conference Houston, TX - May 20-23

Brigham Young University put on a track and field clinic at host Rice University's Track Stadium as they overpowered the rest of their conference rivals in winning both the men's and women's championships. The Cougar women scored a whopping 249 points to easily outdistance the rest of the field, with Tulsa University scoring 47 points for an eighth place finish out of 14 teams.

The Hurricanes' Frida Vullum and Tiffany Williams both captured gold medals,

with Williams also being named the WAC's Outdoor Freshman of the Year. In the 5000 meters Vullum, a native of Aure, Norway went to the front of the pack with 1000 meters remaining and steadily increased her advantage over three trailing Cougars. She went on to win by seven seconds in 17:04.68, with teammate Rachel Hasser finishing up in 16th with an 18:42.23. In an earlier race, Vullum finished fourth in the 3000 meters with a time of 9:48.90.

Williams, in winning the 400 meters in a quick 53.82, kicked all the way to the finish to win her first WAC title of what promises to be a great career. She was also a member of the 1600 meter relay team which outkicked Fresno State for second place to set a new TU record of 3:40.30. Rice won the event in 3:38.30. Other teammates included Caroline Avbovbede (5th in 400m in 54.98), Inemesit Usoroh, and Monique Poindexter.

The 800 meters produced three in the top eight including Monique Poindexter - 2:11.78 (4th), Jany Van Gerwen - 2:13.39 (6th), and Erin Simpson - 2:17.79 (8th).

Dwight Davis ran another NCAA provisional qualifier in the men's 1500 meters as he led a group of five Hurricane runners who placed in the top 12. Davis' 3:44.97 earned him third place honors, as Jeremy Hollis (3:51.54), Kristian Braekkan (3:51.60), Monte Hawkins (3:56.48), and Cornelius Mason (4:01.45) finished 8th, 9th, 11th, and 12th. The Hurricane men scored 30 points to finish tenth overall out of twelve teams.

The 800 meters produced another school record for Adam Ellison as he chased three others down the final stretch to a 1:47.69, breaking his old, set last week, school record by a second. Rodney Peterson came in behind him a couple of ticks back in 1:49.43.

Other highlights included: 5000 meters - Davis - 15:05.99 (12th), Tim Surface - 15:06.44 (13th); 400 meter relay - 41.84 (7th); 1600 meter relay - 3:13.44 (4th); Triple Jump - Kevin Guynn - 48-4.75 (5th).

SEC Championships Gainesville, FL - May 21-23

The Arkansas Razorbacks of John McDonnell once again prevailed at the SEC championships, this year hosted by the University of Florida. The Hogs scored 183 points to win easily by 50 points over LSU. Catoosa native Phil Price scored in two events as he coasted to an easy 3:43.91 third place in the 1500 meters, in addition to his 14:19.81 5000 meter performance, good enough for fifth. Price has qualified in both events for nationals, so it's now just a matter of fine tuning his speed and resting up. Moore's Jonathan Leon provided some needed points for the Porkers as he sprinted to a quick 46.37 400 meters (4th). He also anchored the 1600 meter relay squad to a third place 3:09.13.

NAIA Championships Tulsa, OK - May 21-23

Held for the first time in Tulsa, at the new East Tulsa Sports Complex, the Life University

Eagles rolled to it's second consecutive men's championship with a total of 82 points. Oklahoma Baptist University was third overall with 65.5 points, Phillips - 14th (22), and Southern Nazarene - 21st (16).

OBU's sprinters led the way for the Bison as Jason Mathis and Jamaal Jackson (of Cushing) each won their events in close races, Mathis in the 100 meters - 10.67, with Cody Lawson of Southern Nazarene in fourth (10.86), and Jackson with a thrilling 200 meter win over a pair of Southern of New Orleans speedsters. Jackson was timed in 21.45. Lawson of Southern Nazarene was sixth in 21.66. The Bisons' Desire' Pierre-Louis finished a strong third in the 400 meters (47.46), and along with Marvin James' second place showing in the 400 meter hurdles (52.53) provided more satisfying moments for head coach Ford Mastin, as he tries to get OBU back to the top of the NAIA track world.

Southern Nazarene's Jeremy Baskettt improved on his best jump by nine inches as he tied T.J. Kloster of Concordia, Nebraska for the victory with a jump of 16-8.75 in the Pole Vault.

The Bison relay teams were sharp as usual, as the 3200 meter relay team breezed to a second place time of 7:40.28, and the 1600 meter relay

boys likewise did the same in 3:12.46 in a runner-up role to Southern of New Orleans amazing 3:05.50 performance. The 400 meter relay unit was fifth in 41.14.

Leading the scoring for the Bison distance corps was Zac Johnson, a junior from Velma-Alma. Johnson, running in only his first marathon dueled it out with Lubbock Christian's Peter Tanui, and Phillips' Seef LeRoux over the last few miles to notch a second place time of 2:32:39. Not bad, huh? LeRoux finished fourth in 2:35:29.

On Thursday evening, the first day of the meet, Phillips' Likhaya Dayile hung in there with the boys from Life University as he eked out a fourth place 30:53.33 clocking over the 25-lap 10000 meter run on a warm, humid evening. OBU's Awet Tsehaye from Eritrea in East Africa finished in ninth in 32:36.70. On the final day of competition, Dayile came back in the 5000 meters, and against the same competition he faced in the 10000 finished with a fourth place 14:39.79.

Other results included: Long Jump - Phillips' Chris Collins - 23-11.75 (4th), High Jump - Phillips' Alonzo Richmond - 6-8.75 (5th).

The women's championship race was settled by the distance stars of Simon Fraser University of British Columbia, as they easily won the title with 84 points. They accomplished the first-ever NAIA women's triple crown of cross country, indoor and outdoor track in the same season. Southern Nazarene of Bethany, OK, finished in 18th place with 21 points, in addition to

20th place Phillips with 20, and Oklahoma Christian in 52nd with 2 points.

SNU's Steph Miller came off the final turn of the 800 meters in a crowd but soon distanced herself with a convincing kick over the final 80 meters, winning in 2:10.60. Phillips' Nicky Emblem was the Javelin champion as she heaved her spear 166-6 for the victory. Her teammate, Melissa Haarhoff was in the chase pack of the 1500 meters on the final lap, but came up slightly short at the end. Her time of 4:38.68 gave her a fourth place finish. In the 3000 meters, OBU's Melissa Flood was ninth in 10:26.13.

In the relays, Phillips' 3200 meter squad ran to a fourth place clocking of 9:17.07, while the Southern Nazarene 400 meter and 1600 meter relay foursomes finished up in sixth place in both races. They were timed in 48.52 and 3:53.11 respectively.

Other results included: 100 meter hurdles - SNU's Alesha Peel - 14.17 (4th); 400 meters - OCU's Kathy Nelson - 57.66 (7th).

Reebok Invitational Atlanta, GA - May 23

OSU pole vaulter Megan Robbins broke her outdoor school record for the fourth time this year by vaulting 11-7. The performance bettered her 11-1.75 vault from the Big 12 Championships, both performances provisionally qualifying her for nationals. Her teammate Andrene Thompson fell short of the PQ mark for the 800 meters, though, in finishing seventh in 2:07.63.



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Setting the "Records" Straight

In the State Meet program and in this publication, the state meet and state over-all records did not always agree.

Some glitches occurred in sorting the old yardage records from the current metric record. In most cases of disagreement in the State Meet program, the meet record was correct. The State Record had not been correctly updated and was wrong.

Listed at the right is how the two sets of records should read, including the 1998 additions (Anyone feeling any record is not correct, please let us know at Oklahoma Track and Field News and we will check it out).

Class 2A Revisited

A review of charts at the Accutrack-troubled state meet at USO (May 8-9) provided good news for Chelsea fans.

They already knew their Green Dragons won the 2A boys title, but thought they'd set some unrecognized records as well.

Sprinter Larry Crenshaw did beat the 2A meet record in the 200, but not the state record. A time of 21.01 was listed on post-meet printouts as Accutrack, which would make it an all-class state record.

However, that time and all other times in the race, which indeed was caught by Accutrack, were reversed with the hand times.

Actually, Crenshaw ran 21.47 Accutrack, which breaks the 2A meet record of 21.52, set by Jay Wilkinson of Stroud in the 1993 preliminaries.

Chelsea's 400 relay team of Crenshaw, Adam Longier, Matt Hagabush and Adam Field also set a meet record. The Green Dragons' 42.72 shoots down a 42.87 by Watonga in 1993.

Crenshaw, a 5-11, 175-pound senior, is headed to Missouri Southern as a football tailback and, of course, sprinter.

In 2A girls, Amanda Wedel of Lexington ran 57.91 in the 400 preliminaries. But that was a hand time. Accutrack did not get a picture of it. The formula for matching hand times to electronic times is to add .24.

That would make Wedel's time 58.15. The 2A meet record is 58.16 by Ebony Shirley of Davis, set in 1996.

But, in theory, three watches are supposed to be on first place in hand-timing and only one ever is used when Accutrack is supposedly on. As unfair as it might seem, Wedel's time can not be accepted as a new record.

Long-time track referee Glenn Chowin says (although not specifically on this case), "I can't in all consciousness approve hand-time unless it beats the record by at least a full second."

Look at Crenshaw's 200 times, for example: The hand and electronic difference wasn't .24. It was .46.

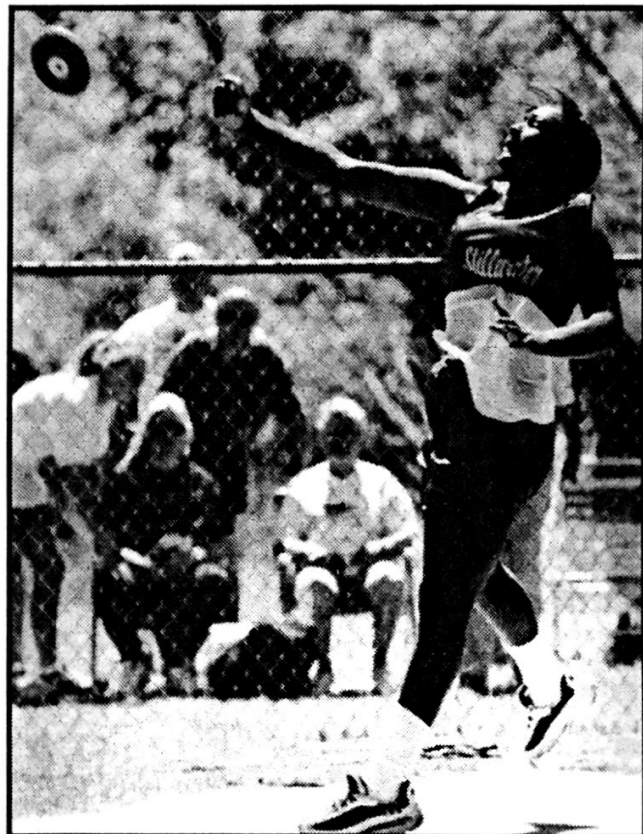

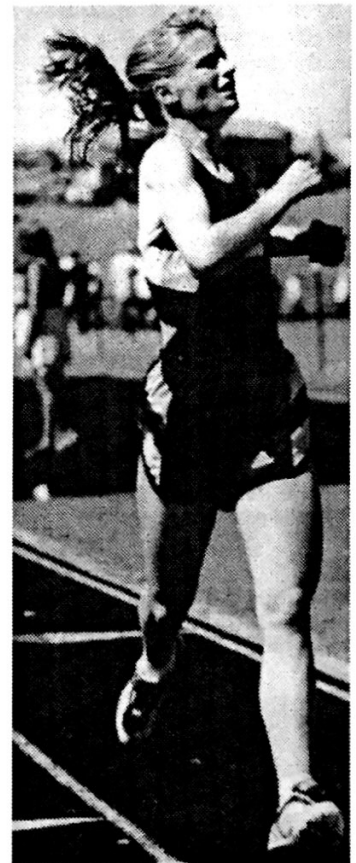

Jim Hamilton Retires

Jim Hamilton is hanging up whatever track coaches hang up when they retire. His stop watch?

After 27 years of guiding the speed-oriented Lawton MacArthur Highlanders, highly appropriate since he won six state meet sprint gold medals during his own running days, the 1998 state meet was Hamilton's finale.

Under Hamilton, Mac finished in the state meet top five 10 times, swept to three straight championships (1982, 1983 and 1984) and won nine relay gold medals.

His 1983 unit still holds the state 400 record of 40.96.

Hamilton was a senior on Oklahoma's most dominate track team ever, He won the 220 and ran on two winning relay teams as the 1962 Lawton Wolverines swept nine of the 14 events.

Lawton scored 64.5 points, leaving only 110.5 points for everyone else. Tulsa Central finished second with 15. Hamilton was a Big Eight Conference quarter-mile champion for the Oklahoma Sooners.
