

## Kathy Paroff recognized for her lifesaving CPR application on husband

Friend's of Kathy Paroff from the ambulance and rescue units of the Lowell Area Fire Department refer lovingly to her husband, John, as the heavenly reject.

As many have read and heard, John Paroff suffered a heart attack on June 3 in his home at 591 Alden Nash. There were a few times after the heart attack where John did not have a heart beat.

John was able to attend a special recognition meeting in honor of Kathy and the Rescue and Ambulance personel because Kathy remained alert enough to contact the Emergency Medical Service (911) and then calm enough to start and continue C.P.R. on John until members of Lowell Ambulance and Rescue Units from the Lowell Area Fire Department arrived to start defibrilation.

"I will admit I called 911 before John passed out, I wasn't that calm after he passed out," Kath said.

John Krohmer, Medical Director of the Kent County EMS said, "Not often do we find that it is a EMS provider involved in the saving of a spouse's life," he said. "Often

times it's a citizen. This is a stressful time for folks and even more stressful when it involves a family member."

Krohmer added that "Paroff's rescue was a wonderful example of a system working the way it should."

Krohmer was in attendance at the Look Memorial Fire Station on Saturday to present certificates of recognition to Lowell's ambulance and rescue personel and to Kathy Paroff for their work in such a traumatic situation.

"Often times we don't recognize exceptional patuient care because we either don't know, don't take time," Krohmer said. "It's nice to be able to recognize the exceptional care. I think people have a tendancy to take for granted that ambulance and rescue personnel are going to be there."

John Paroff, who was also in attendance, continues to go to cardiac rehabilitation three times a week. "I'm feeling good. They really push you at the center. It doesn't scare me. If something is going to happen that's the place where you want to be."



An establishment, having as a substantial or significant portion of its stock in trade, books, magazines, and other periodicals that are distinguished or characterized by their emphasis on matters depicting, describing, or relating to "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas" (as defined herein) or an establishment with a segment or section devoted to the sale or display of such material.

#### 2.51 ADULT ENTERTAINMENT

Any conduct, within an establishment having as a substantial or significant portion of its income from material, services, or matters distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on depicting, describing, or relating to \*specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas" (as defined herein); that presents material by books, films, slides, or the like or by live presentation that includes services to the patron of an establishment; that material is distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on matter depicting, describing, or relating to "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas" (as defined herein). Adult entertainment activities shall include but not be limited to adult bookstores, adult motion picture theaters, massage establishments, and establishments for the consumption of beer or intoxicating liquor on the premises that also have adult entertainment.

#### 2.52 ADULT MOTION PICTURE THEATER

An establishment used for presenting material distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on matters depicting, describing, or relating to "specified sexual activities" or "specified anatomical areas" (as defined herein)

#### 2.53 MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT

Any establishment where massages are administered for pay, including but not limited to massage parlors, health clubs, sauna baths, and steam baths. This definition shall not be construed to include a hospital, nursing home, medical clinic, or the office of a physician, surgeon, chiropractor, osteopath, or physical therapist duly licensed by the State of Michigan; nor shall this definition be construed to include a barber shop or beauty shop in which massages are administered only to the scalp, the face, the neck, or the shoulders. This definition shall not be construed to include a public or nonprotit organization such as a school, park department, YMCA; or YWCA operating a community center, swimming pool, or other educational, cultural, or recreational facilities for residents of the area. This definition shall not be construed to include massage therapists engaged in the personal performance of the duties of their respective professions who meet one (1) or more of the following criteria:

- A. Proof of graduation from a school of massage licensed by the State of Michigan.

#### NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF **BOWNE TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS**

- 2. There will be a minimal likelihood of conflicts arising between the residential use and the surrounding agricultural activities.
- 3. The precedent set by allowing the residential use in the circumstances under consideration will not adversely effect the long-term plans and development policies of Bowne Township.
- K. Rear Lot Line Exceptions: The Planning Commission may allow, as a special land use, a dwelling unit on a lot less than forty (40) acres in size that has a rear lot line greater than four hundred (400) feet from a road right-of-way if the following conditions are met:
- 1. The portion of the lot greater than four hundred (400) feet from a road right-of-way is poorly suited for agricultural production due to existing soil conditions, slope, or the presence of natural vegetation such as woodlots, brushland, and wetlands. The Planning Commission, in making its determination, may consider factors such as, but not limited to, past and present uses of the parcel, past productivity, and the difficulty in making the parcel suitable for farming.
- 2. There will be a minimal likelihood of conflicts arising between the residential use and the surrounding agricultural activities.
- 3. The precedent set by allowing the residential use in the circumstances under consideration will not adversely effect the long-term plans and development policies of Bowne Township.
- Change of Nonconforming Uses: A nonconforming use may be changed to another nonconforming use as a special land use if the Planning Commission finds that such new use would markedly decrease the degree of nonconformance and would enhance the desirability of adjacent conforming uses. Whenever a nonconforming use is changed to a more restricted or conforming use, such use shall not thereafter revert to the prior nonconforming use.

#### M. Adult Entertainment Activities:

- 1. The need for special regulation of certain business uses that, by their very nature, are deemed to have unique characteristics and effects on surrounding properties, is recognized as a legitimate objective. Special regulation is needed to ensure these uses are not concentrated in any one (1) area, thus preventing adverse effects upon the surrounding neighborhood, such as blight and urban deterioration, negative effects on economic development potential, social disorder and crime negative effects on community standards for aesthetics, the reduction of property values and the subsequent negative impact on the community tax base. The primary objective is to prevent a concentration of these uses by establishing spacing standards and thus, ensuring disbursement of these uses throughout the community.
- 2. Adult entertainment activities shall only be located within C-1 and C-2 Commercial Districts.
- 3. An application to establish an adult entertainment activity shall not be approved if there is already in existence one (1) or more adult entertainment activities within one thousand five hundred (1,500) feet of the boundaries of the site of the proposed activities, excepting as otherwise provided for within this section.
- 4. An application to establish an adult entertainment activity shall not be approved if the proposed location is within one thousand five hundred (1,500) feet of any residentially zoned District, licensed day-care facilities, adult foster care home, senior citizens' center, park, or church and shall not be approved if the proposed location is within two thousand six hundred fifty (2,650) feet from any K-12 school, excepting as otherwise provided for within this Ordinance.
- 5. The Planning Commission may waive the locational standards limiting adult entertainment activities as they relate to similar uses if the following findings are made:
  - a) That the proposed use will not be contrary to the public interest or injurious to nearby properties and that the spirit and intent of the section will be observed.
  - b) That the proposed use will not enlarge or encourage the development of a "skid-row" area.
- c) That the establishment of an additional regulated use in the area will not be contrary to any program of neighborhood conservation nor will it interfere with any program of urban renewal.
- d) That all applicable regulations of this section will be observed.
- 6. The Planning Commission may waive the locational standards limiting the location of adult entertainment activities as they relate to residentially zoned Districts, licensed day-care facilities, adult foster care homes, senior citizen centers, parks, or churches, provided a validated petition requesting such a waiver is presented to the Plant na

- Commission, signed by the owners or purchasers of at least fifty-one (51) percent of the parcels of land within five hundred (500) feet of the proposed location. In addition to this requirement, the Planning Commission may waive the requirement that adult entertainment activities be located no closer than two thousand six hundred fifty (2.650) feet from schools only if the proponent also demonstrates that school children are not required to pass by the location while walking to or from school. Any petition presented to the Planning Commission shall contain, at a minimum, the following:
- a) A statement in the form of an affidavit attested to by the circulator of the petition that the circulator personally witnessed the signatures on the petition and the same were affixed to the petition by the person whose name appeared thereon.
- b) A statement on the petition so worded that the signers of the petition will attest to the fact that they are the owners or purchasers of the parcel of land identified by the permanent parcel number opposite their signatures.
- c) For the purpose of this section, parcels of land shall equate to the permanent parcel numbers assigned by the Township to all property within the said five hundred (500) feet.
- 7. An applicant requesting a waiver of locational requirements shall file an application with the ordinance enforcement officer; however, the ordinance enforcement officer shall not accept an application for the waiver of locational requirements for an adult entertainment activity as it relates to residentially zoned Districts, licensed day-care facilities, adult toster care homes, senior citizen centers, K-12 schools, parks, or churches, without a petition as required herein. Said petition shall be validated by the ordinance enforcement officer. The ordinance enforcement officer shall then notify the Planning Commission of the receipt of the requests and petition within fifteen (15) days of filing.
- 8. Prior to the granting of a waiver of locational requirements, the Planning Commission may impose any conditions or limitations upon the establishment, location, construction, maintenance, or operations of regulated use as may, in its judgment, be necessary for the protection of the public interest. Any evidence and guarantee may be required as proof that the conditions stipulated in connection therewith will be

## Foster's arches - pathway to creativity

The freestanding arches that are now on display at the Lowell Area Arts Center represent a pathway to new direction for Kenneth Foster of Nunica.

Foster has been working in the medium of ceramic sculptures since 1966. "I've always found it to be a fascinating medium. There are many applications in sculpture work and I never find the work boring," Foster explains.

Neither has the DeGraff Fine Arts Gallery where pieces of Foster's work can be found. "Much of my work reminds people of animal forms and things in nature," Foster says.

The inspiration to tackle ceramic arches came upon Foster during a 1989 sabatical in Europe. The Nunica artist says the forms and creativity in his work provide a freedom and spontaneity.

His ideas for forms, shapes

and textures have been inspired by underwater forms, cactus forms, bones, vertebrae and food. "Food has a wonderful opening. Baked bread forms inspire great forms of creativity," Foster says.

Foster's ability to create feeling in his work has helped to make him successful. "I feel I've been successful when someone looks at a clay sculpture and sees softness," he says.

The Nunica artist says he normally doesn't setaside time to create his sculptures. "When I'm hit with an idea then I can spend up to 12 hours on a sculpture."

Just recently Foster has branched out to encompass freestanding arches for large corporate size corporations. "The company shows me where it wants to put it and then I design a need to fit the space. A lot of the companies have me design pieces for the outdoors."

Foster does not like to title his work. He believes that puts

limitations on his sculptures. "If it isn't labeled that allows people to see many different things," he explains.


His sculpture work over the past 20-plus years has been done out of love. "I don't do it to make money. I teach at Muskegon Community College to support myself and my family," he explains.

Foster's artistic venue has also included acrylic painting, although it's been a while. "I soon. It allows you to mix collage and assemblage with paint," he said.

Foster is sure his work says something about him, but he's not sure what. "I enjoy it most because it is a neat way to express ideas and thoughts."

The sculptor is impressed by the neat and professional Art Gallery Lowell has. "I think it's impressive for a small town. The food the Art Gallery serves at the reception is just wonderful."

The new pathway to artistic freedom and creativity has may get back to it some day Foster a very happy and eager man to explore the many other sculpture possibilities that await him.



## Fail safe math program is students' insurance that they reach a certain level

Lowell High School's math department will test out what it believes may be a fail safe net for all students, especially for the lower and middle level math students.

The approach is designed to help all students reach a higher level of understanding. "This approach is to ensure that all students don't fail to reach a certain level," said Jim White, Director of Special Education and Instruction.

The concept was derived from the school improvement program initiated in the Lowell Schools two years ago. The University of Chicago School Mathematics Program best answered the charge that students need to know more math in any job these days. The National Council of Teachers of Mathematics states that students need to be taught more usable mathematic skills (e.g. statistics, geometry reading data, and probabilty).

Mike Michaud, spokeman of the LHS Math Department, said it will provide the groundwork for both teachers and students to promote a better understanding of mathemat-

While Lowell students have scored well above average on the MEAP test (85-95 percentile), there are still a portion of high school Algebra II students placing in college Algebra I courses. Chairman of the Lowell Math Curriculum Council, Sue Beute, said making a good math program better is what prompted the new expectations.

Lowell's math department will work to this end by guaranteeing students will be offered the same material and will be tested on the material the same day.

The staff will also be accessible at the beginning and end of the school day.

"We're also hopeful the new concept will help encourage students to be more responsible for their own education," Michaud said.
