MACOMB COUNTY HISTORY

Named in honor of General Alexander Macomb, a highly decorated veteran of the War of 1812, Macomb County was formally organized on January 15, 1818 as the third county in the Michigan territory. At that time, it covered a much larger area than it does today. In 1819 and 1820, large portions of the county were removed to form the counties of Oakland, Lapeer, Genesee and St. Clair.

The first Europeans arrived in the area during the 17th century. They included French fur trappers who recognized the richness of the marshes and sought new opportunities for trade. Moravian missionaries established the first organized, non-native settlement in the county in 1782 as a refuge for Christianized Indians driven out of Ohio. They built along the banks of the Clinton River, then known as the Huron River, but were forced to leave four years later by the Chippewa Indians. In the late 1790s, Christian Clemens visited the area, and in March 1800, purchased a distillery considered the first building on the site of the future Mount Clemens. The next year he purchased 500 acres for development. This site, known as High Banks, was platted as the Village of Mount Clemens in 1818, when it was proclaimed the Macomb County Seat.

In the early 1800s, settlers moved into the interior of the county, carving out farms from the hardwood forests. The roots of the county villages and townships were established by this time. In addition to the original French and English, later settlers included Germans, Belgians and others who came directly from Europe.

In the 1870s, mineral baths brought international fame to Mount Clemens. Many believed the waters had healing powers. Although the stream still runs beneath the city, interest in the spas died out in the early 20th century. Recently, there has been a reemergence of interest in the mineral baths now being offered at Henry Ford Macomb–East Campus in Mount Clemens.

Between 1920 and 1930, Macomb County doubled in population, rising from 38,103 to 77,146 persons. Two significant developments spurred this growth – the establishment of Selfridge Field in 1917, and the beginning of the urbanization movement northward from the City of Detroit.

Construction of the first County building began in 1931. Plans were submitted for the 12-story, limestone-clad building by architect George J. Haas of St. Clair Shores. The winning bid went to the Otto Misch Company and a crew of 75 men (mainly Macomb County residents) worked tirelessly around the clock to bring the new building to life.

Notable design elements of the "Old County Building" include the iconic architectural ornaments of eight stone faces chosen specifically in tribute to nearby Selfridge Field and paying homage to the county's history. Designed by native Detroit, architectural sculptor Louis Sielaff, the faces chosen to gaze from the roofline include a soldier, sailor, airman (pre-Air Force), Marine (WWI Doughboy), two Native Americans, and two Revolutionary War soldiers. Sielaff's creations were fabricated from granite and have stood guard atop the county building for over 90 years.

Macomb County's population continued to grow during the 1940s and 1950s when movement from the central city to the suburbs increased. The largest growth occurred between 1950 and 1970, when over 440,000 people were added to Macomb County's population.

Today, Macomb County encompasses 482 square miles, and ranks third in population in the state, with a 2020 census population of 881,217 persons.

MACOMB COUNTY EMBLEM

Dominating the emblem of Macomb County is the county outline, flanked by a sailboat and three gears in representation of the area's recreation and industry. The banner crossing through the symbol contains three triskelions, an age-old symbol, representing progress. Encircling the emblem are the words "Macomb County" and "Michigan," separated by five-pointed stars as symbols of quality.

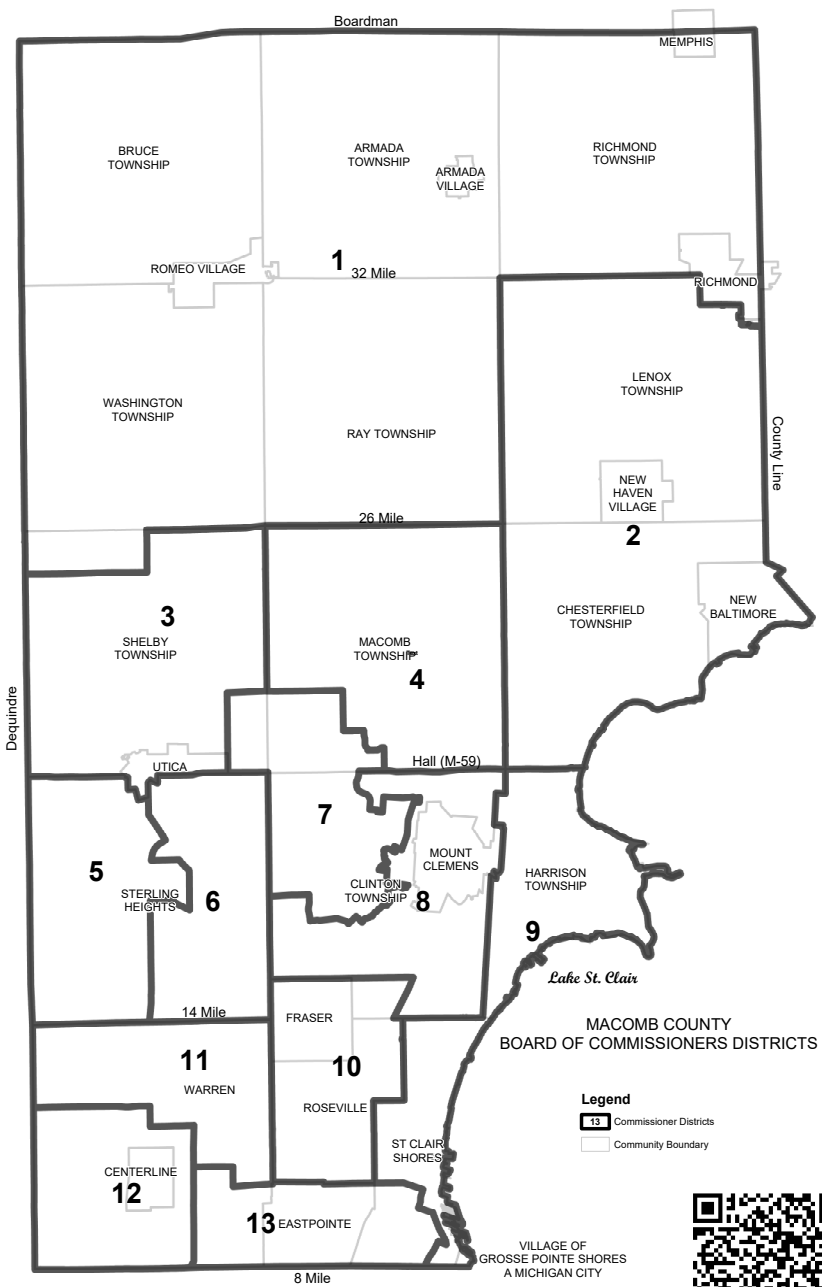

The Macomb County Commission is the legislative and policy-making body of Macomb County government. Commissioners are elected from 13 districts of nearly equal population for two-year terms, with their current terms expiring December 31, 2024. The Commission functions on a committee basis. An indication of the scope and subject matters dealt with is revealed in the titles of the various committees. Ad Hoc committees are appointed as needed for specific purposes.

Finance/Audit/Budget Committee

Chair: Joe Sabatini; Vice Chair: Phil Kraft



The Finance/Audit/Budget Committee oversees matters relating to the Finance Department (including Equalization, Purchasing and Risk Management), the Retirement Commission, and the Treasurer’s Office, receives the quarterly reports and manages the annual budget review process.

Responsibilities under the County Charter include the purchasing policies and procedures (Section 8.10) and hiring of an independent certified public accountant to conduct annual independent audits as required by law and to conduct other audits as determined necessary, subject to the appropriations in the County’s annual budget for such purpose (Section 8.3).

Government Oversight Committee

The Government Oversight Committee oversees matters relating to Corporation Counsel, the Executive’s Office, the Ethics Board, the Human Resources and Labor Relations Department, and the Commission Office, including its Rules of Procedures, office operations; independent counsel; legislative activities; and appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Responsibilities under the County Charter include codification of ordinances and preservation and indexing of resolutions (Section 4.7).

Health & Human Services Committee

The Health and Human Services Committee oversees matters relating to Animal Control, Macomb County Community Mental Health, the Department of Human Services, Health and Community Services (including the Health Department, Macomb Community Action, MSU Extension and the Medical Examiner), Martha T. Berry Medical Care Facility, the Office of Senior Services, and Veterans’ Services.

Older Adult Advisory Committee (OAAC)

The Older Adult Advisory Committee is an advisory committee to the Macomb County Commission composed of older adults designated by commissioners, one to represent each Commissioner district and up to four at-large-members. The committee meets on a regular basis and its purpose is to learn and inquire about challenges, trends, concerns and opportunities affecting older adults in the County and to communicate with the Commissioners what is learned.

COMMISSION PROGRAMS

Casual Day Program

The Commission proudly coordinates the Macomb County Casual Day Program. With department leader permission, participating employees may wear casual clothing to work on Fridays/designated days if they donate at least one dollar. The donations are collected and distributed to charitable organizations.

The Casual Day program was first adopted by resolution in 1994 and it has continued to grow thanks to Macomb County employees' commitment to helping others. Since the program's inception, over \$700,000 has been generously donated to various charities.

Green Schools Program

Established in 2006, the Michigan Green Schools program is open to any K-12 public or private school in Michigan. The intent of the Program is to encourage students to participate in activities which help them learn about preserving natural resources, protect the environment and promote energy efficiency and savings. Any K-12, public or private school in Michigan may apply to be designated an "Official Michigan Green School" by submitting an application documenting activities to the designated county coordinator of the program. Qualified activities in which the school participates earn points toward achieving Official Green School status. The Commission has been the coordinator of the Macomb County Green Schools Program since 2008. Annually, near Earth Day, the Commission honors the participating schools at a ceremony.

Pat Daniels Veteran of the Year Award

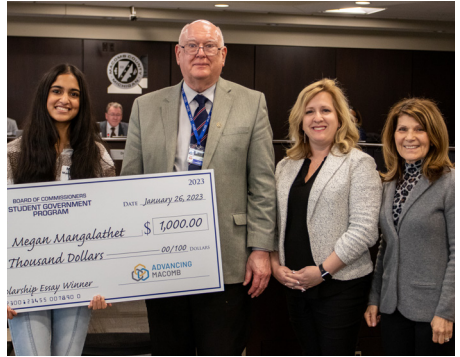

Tri-County Summit

Each fall, the Commission joins colleagues from the Oakland and Wayne County Commissions to further their commitment of working together to address issues that are significant to the area. Through different sessions and presentations, officials from the state's three most populous counties explore ways to collaborate as a region. This recurring, regional event is attended by top elected and other public officials, as well as key representatives of the business community. The 2023 summit will focus on mental and behavioral health issues as well as the future of energy and technology infrastructure.

Volunteer Recognition Program

Each April, for "National Volunteer Recognition Month," the Commission hosts a Volunteer Recognition event. At this event, Commissioners proudly recognize the valuable contributions made by deserving and dedicated volunteers who have committed their time to enrich the county. This event has been held annually since 1990. Since 2021, through the Commission's Older Adult Advisory Committee, a "Senior Volunteer of the Year" award has been given to a volunteer 60 or older.

Yoga At The Hill

Yoga is for EVERYbody! Since 2016, the Commission has offered the opportunity for all residents, regardless of age or experience level, to learn about the beneficial practice of yoga and to personally participate in a group yoga session. This annual event, held at Freedom Hill County Park, is an excellent opportunity to enjoy a county green space and try yoga for the first time, revisit past practice, or enhance a current routine.

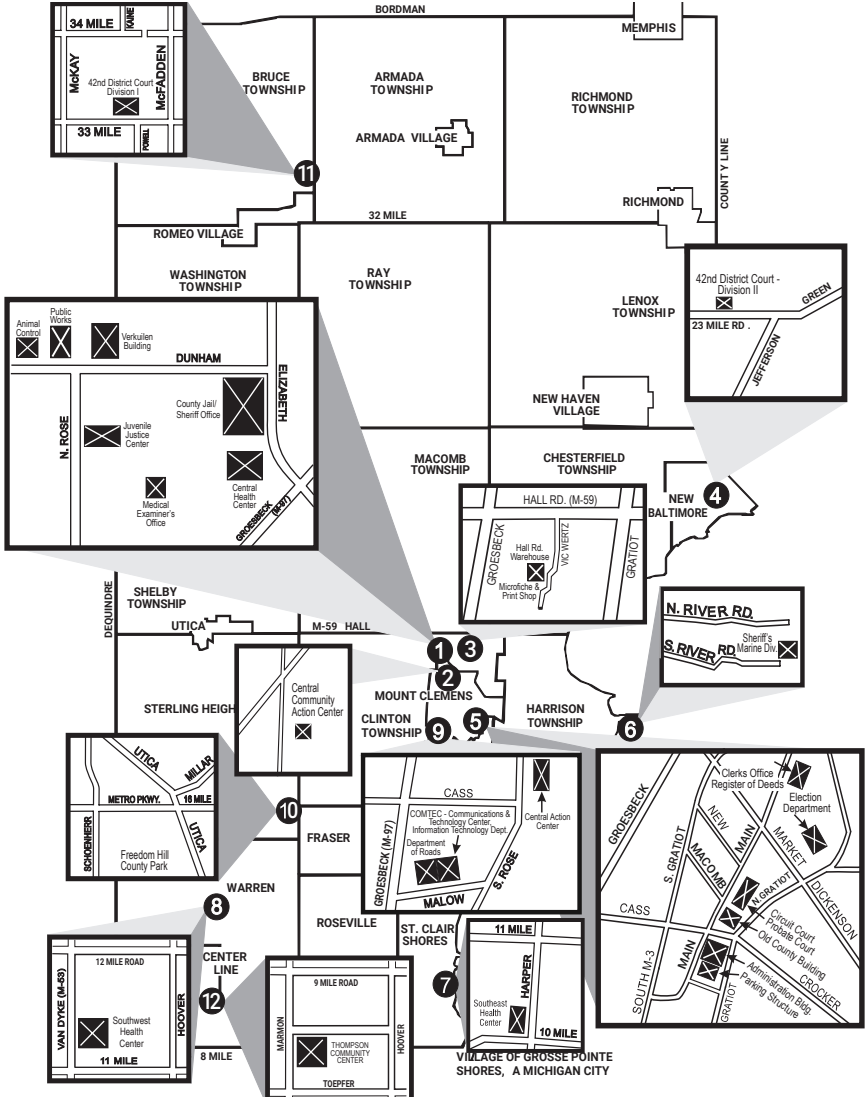

The purposes for which the Authority is organized are to: support the operation of an encyclopedic art museum, and the facilities where the DIA operates; enhance the world-class art collection of the DIA; and contract for art institute services with a world-class art institute services provider that will provide meaningful and educational experiences involving the appreciation of an encyclopedic art museum.

The Brownfield Redevelopment Authority promotes the revitalization of environmentally distressed areas, either by providing incentives for developers to clean up contaminated or functionally obsolete property, or by receiving grants to perform the clean up before a development is involved, or a combination of the two. A Brownfield Redevelopment Authority may use Tax Increment Financing as a tool for property redevelopment. An authority may: 1) capture increases in property tax revenues generated by the redevelopment of eligible properties to reimburse parties for costs of eligible development activities and 2) use captured revenues to finance a local remediation revolving fund to address other eligible sites. Brownfield authorities can qualify for Brownfield site assessment grants, redevelopment grants and the state revitalization loan fund. Authorities are authorized under Michigan PA 381 of 1996.

The Macomb County Public Works Office has two goals: to enhance the quality of life for all Macomb County residents; and to serve as a critical component of economic prosperity in our communities. MCPWO maintains more than 475 county drains which remove storm water from neighborhoods, roadways and industrial areas. The office works closely with local partners to enhance water quality in our drains, thereby directly improving water quality in Lake St. Clair and throughout the Great Lakes System.

MCPWO provides wholesale sanitary sewer services to 11 Macomb County communities via the Macomb Interceptor Drain Drainage District and also co-manages the Oakland-Macomb Interceptor District. Together, these two districts provide sanitary sewer service to more than 1 million people.

MCPWO also administers the Soil Erosion Control Act, provides Engineering/Plan Review and inspections of development and re-development projects in the county and administers and operates the Chapaton and Martin Retention Basins in St. Clair Shores. The office is actively engaged in ongoing public education efforts on how our local infrastructure operates and steps that individuals, businesses and communities as a whole can take to protect our natural resources.

The Criminal Division handles all Macomb County felony criminal actions and some serious misdemeanor cases. The County Clerk serves as Clerk of the Court. Circuit Court judges are elected to six-year terms on non-partisan ballots. The Family Division handles all domestic relations matters. The Juvenile Division is part of the Family Division and handles delinquency, abuse and neglect and adoption cases.

MACOMB COUNTY DISTRICT COURTS

District Courts have exclusive jurisdiction of all civil litigation up to \$25,000 and also handle garnishments, eviction proceedings, land contract forfeitures, civil infractions, and other proceedings. For criminal cases, the district court conducts preliminary examinations in felony cases and handles all misdemeanors where punishment does not exceed one year in jail including arraignment, sentence, and setting and acceptance of bail. District judges may appoint magistrates. The magistrates may set bail and accept bonds in criminal matters, accept guilty pleas, sentence for traffic, motor carrier, dog, game, snowmobile and boat law violations, and issue arrest and search warrants. Attorney magistrates may hear small claims cases. Magistrates may, at the direction of the Chief Judge, perform other duties allowed by statute.

Municipal Court civil jurisdiction is limited to \$1,500. Its criminal jurisdiction is similar to district court. Municipal judges must be lawyers, residents, and electors of their cities. They are paid by the municipality and are elected for four-year terms as provided by city charter. They are part-time judges and may practice law outside of the courtroom.
