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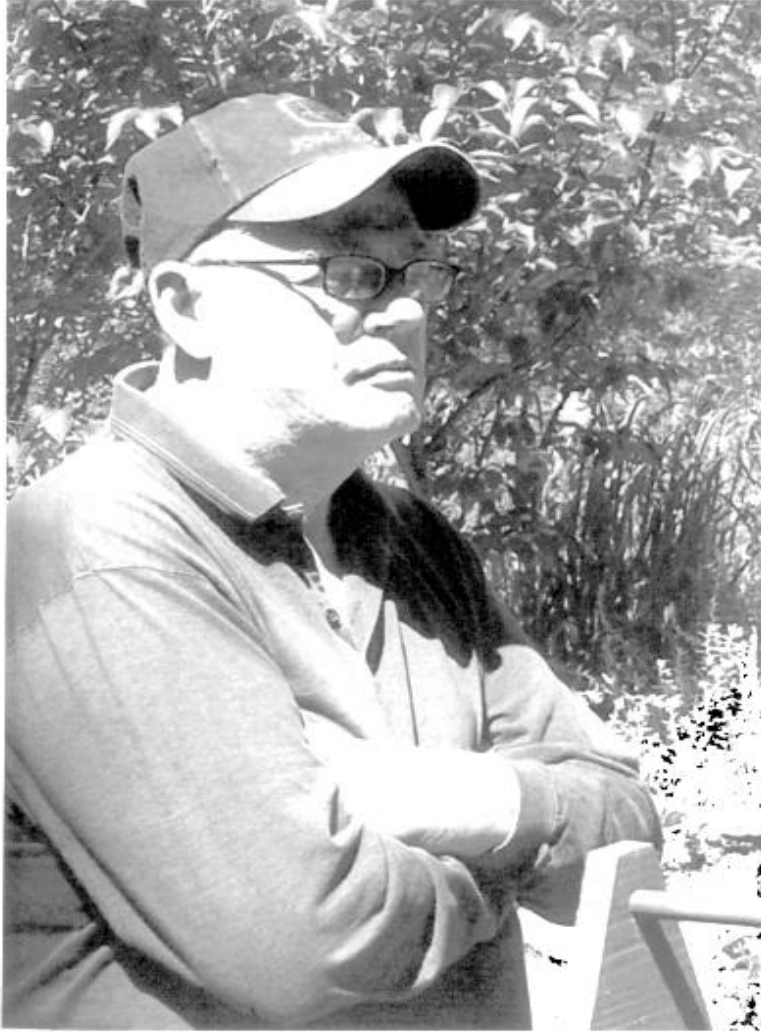
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Dedication

It was rare when someone in Winterport needed a helping hand that ‘Junior’ didn’t show up first. Be it family, friends, mere acquaintances, or the Town itself, he was frequently first in line with tools that ranged from a hand shovel to his favorite tool—his excavator.

Junior will be remembered by all who knew him as the ‘guy who would give you the shirt off his back’ and smile while taking it off.

Several terms as a member of the Winterport Town Council and more than his share of terms on the Town’s Planning Board made him a fixture at the Town Office many days for most of the last three decades.

Junior loved the town of Winterport, where he and his brother John opened a construction business and successfully ran the company for many years. He often bragged that he would be remembered by most people in town as the guy who installed their septic systems. Junior was most at home on his excavator—some claiming that he could remove a man’s hat with the business end of the huge digger—a claim he never denied.

Junior and his wife, Sheila (he called her his ‘personal angel’ because of her dedication to his health over the last several years) had two sons, Wayne and Shawn, who were at home in their dad’s truck before they were old enough to drive. Junior’s legacy will live on and he will be truly missed.

Boston Post Cane

Stan was born December 22, 1916 and passed away on July 2, 2014. Stan was 97. His wife Genevieve passed away in 2001. Stan was a no-nonsense type of guy that one would expect from a son of the “Pine Tree State.” He had a sharp sense of humor and loved telling a good joke. He had one of the nicest grins that often would blossom into the most heartwarming smile.

As a member of our “Greatest Generation,” Stan served in the Army Air Corps as a flight engineer on Boeing B17s during World War II, flying and fighting with the “Mighty 8th” Air Force in the European Theater of Operations. Returning from his war service, Stan soon married Genevieve Cross and settled in Vandalia, Ohio. They started raising a family of two sons Harland and Andrew, and daughter Deborah. He took a job working at nearby Wright Patterson Air Force Base from which he retired in the early 1970’s. Retirement did not suit Stan well and he soon took a job at Aviation Sales, a fixed based operator at Dayton International Airport. When Stan retired from this job in 1976, he and his beloved Genny moved back to Maine where they built a beautiful home on the banks of the Penobscot River. They both attended the Frankfort Congregational Church, where Genny was a Deacon. After Genny died in 2001, Stan lived alone with frequent visits from his son, Harland. As the years rolled by, he finally had to move to Ross Manor Assisted Living. He was proud to be bestowed the prized "Boston Cane" of Winterport and was looking forward to a presentation celebration. .

TOWN MANAGERS AND COUNCIL REPORT

This will be the second year in a row that winter has brought us cold temperatures and close to record snow fall. The only saving grace was that heating costs rolled back to an acceptable level from the previous years spike in prices. Again spring has been slow in coming and we all are looking forward to warmer weather with blossoming flowers and the re-growth of bushes and trees damaged in our early seasons wet snow falls.

With the appointment of the Winterport Building Committee by the Town Council things are moving forward on the building of our new Municipal Building which will house the town office, fire department, ambulance and emergency services, and public works. The Committee is close to recommending an architect to the Council, who in turn will produce the design based around the Committee's concept, along with building plans, bid documents, and overseeing of the construction and renovation of the property located at 44 Main Street, the Athena Health care building. We are all very excited about this opportunity and thank our residents for supporting this effort with a positive vote at two Town Meetings.

The Town Council, Budget Committee, and Town Manager are very pleased to note that this upcoming new fiscal year municipal budget covering 2015-2016 is lower than the current year's budget. We have worked extremely hard to keep costs in check to try and assure that our mil rate remains the same for next year. Our portion of the County budget has increased along with our share of the RSU 22 school assessment resulting in an increase in our overall budget. Even though our total budget is increasing by \$22,835.00 with new builds and increases in some of our revenue streams property taxes should remain the same.

We also want to take a moment to mention the passing this year of Councilor Dallas Harriman Jr. a true gentleman who always looked out for the best interests of the residents of Winterport. He will be sorely missed.

In closing, the Town Council and I look forward to seeing all of you at Town Meeting on Thursday evening June 11th at the Wagner School cafeteria. We promise you that we will do our best, working with you, and for you, as Town Manager and Town Council, to keep Winterport the place we love to call home.

Greeting Residents of Winterport!

The Winterport Volunteer Ambulance Service (WVAS) is facing a shortage of licensed medical responders. In December of 2014 the service ordered a new ambulance at an expected cost of \$195,000, with expected delivery in September 2015. WVAS will need additional Medics to staff the second ambulance. Starting this summer we will actively seek to hire more emergency medical technicians (EMT) at the Paramedic, Advanced EMT and the Basic EMT level. WVAS will pay stipends on a per shift and call basis (certain restriction will apply.) With the WVAS as a contributing partner to the new station quarters will be built into the station to help accommodate any overnight shifts, for non-residents. In 2014 WVAS paid out almost \$26,000 in stipends. If you are willing to participate, or if you know of someone, please contact Phil Higgins, Director, at 299-4568 or email me at Dirwvas23@gmail.com.

In 2014 the WVAS continued to have exciting challenges. During 2014 WVAS responded to 393 calls with an average call duration of two hours. Normal staffing per call is a Driver and two Emergency Medical Technician (EMT's) for a total of approximately 2,358 man hours of time. Additional time is donated for administrative functions, cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance for an approximate total time of 725 hours of donated time to the residents of Winterport.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

August 20, 2014

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of and for the year ended June 30, 2014, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents, and related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for audit opinions.

Opinions

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2014, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Matters

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 3-7 and 28, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Winterport, Maine's financial statements as a whole. The introductory section, combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements. The combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole. The introductory section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on them.

WINTERPORT CEMETERY DISTRICT

Don Nelson has continued to serve as Sexton in place of longtime Sexton, Sam Butler. We thank Don for his work. Gloria Aurelio has agreed to join the Board and serve as Secretary. The District Board meets on the third Wednesday of each month throughout the year. Time has been spent adopting a unified policy of regulations for operation of the cemeteries, developing an updated inventory of the cemetery lots and repairing damage caused by time and vandalism.

For those who may not know, there are seven public cemeteries in Winterport:

1. Oak Hill Cemetery on Lebanon Road
2. Bald Hill Cove Cemetery on the Rt. 1A and Old County Road
3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
4. Perkins/Vinal Cemetery on the Monroe Road
5. Ellingwoods Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwoods Corner
6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$300.00 per grave (\$150.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. We now send our recycling to Hancock, which costs more for trucking. A lot of towns are going single stream recycling using Waterville, Casella's in Old Town, and DM&J in Winterport. Single stream can cost from \$ 20 a ton up to \$ 100 a ton. I think it is the way to go, then the only thing we can't recycle is Styrofoam and shrink wrap and it can go in one dumpster.

It has been a long, cold, snowy winter this year. I think a lot of us would like to see the green grass again. As always, it has been a pleasure working with you all and I hope to have many more years to come.

There were small farm animals on display and a fall-themed hay exhibit for taking pictures.

The basketball season came next and proved to be challenging due to a lack of experienced coaches. Heather Roberts and Frank Brilliant stepped in and did the program a tremendous service by training coaches and even assisting and/or coaching teams. Several parents also stepped in and did a great job coaching.

The heavy snowfall of late January and early February caused the postponement and eventual cancellation of the Winter Festival. It also ended a string of successful weeks of ice skating at the rink. We did manage to get in two well-attended Skate Nights (ice skating, hot drinks, and snacks) before the winter overwhelmed our efforts to keep the rink and Abbott Park accessible for skating and sledding. As I am writing this we are planning on having our Easter Egg Hunt on April 4. There is still a foot or two of snow on the ground, so it will be interesting to see how it goes.

Art classes and Zumba sessions are also in the final planning phases and should be starting sometime in late April. The T Ball and Instructional Baseball season may start late this year (like last year) due to wet fields.

Winterport Memorial Library

The Winterport Memorial Library has had another great year. The library received several grants. Next Generation Foundation awarded the library a \$50,000 grant for building renovations/maintenance. The library has begun using this grant. The interior of the building has been newly repainted. Light fixtures have been replaced with energy efficient light bulbs with the help of Efficiency Maine. Ceiling fans have been installed to help with the heating and cooling of the building. Exterior projects include repair of the beautiful masonry of the building. The exterior front steps will be replaced in the spring as they are deteriorating rapidly. The remainder of the grant monies will be put aside for other projects.

The library also received two grants from the Rose and Samuel Rudman Library Trust. One was for \$500 for the expansion of the audio book section. The other was for \$250 for the development of Discovery Bags which will begin this summer. These bags will consist of fun activities that can be checked out and used by families.

The Libri Foundation also awarded the library a grant for new children's books worth over \$1,000. This will be a great addition to our children and young adult sections.

In the last year the pavement has been replaced and repaired in the parking lot and driveway. The library has replaced its three public computers through PC's for Maine. These computers are refurbished and offered at an incredible discount. The carpeting will be replaced in the Spring and will give the interior of the library a much needed update.

Programs continue at the library for both children and adults. There is Lego Club on Tuesday afternoon right after school, Story Time on Fridays at 10:30, and a Book Club for Adults that meets the second Thursday of the month at 6:00. Follow us on Facebook for updates. The Summer Reading Program continues to bring new and existing patrons together once a week throughout the summer. The theme for 2014 was all about science and many experiments and exploration was done. The 2015 theme is Be a Hero and the library will be inviting many of our local heroes to speak and interact with the children. A flier will be going home before the end of school with all the details.

There are many services that the library provides to our citizens. Besides the books, magazines and movies that can be checked out, there are three public computers all connected to the internet and printer. The printer is also a scanner, copier and fax machine with all of those services offered for a minimal fee. The WML participates in Inter-library loan program and offers e-books and audio books through the Maine State Library.

WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Winterport

Thankfully, our responses to structure fires in 2014 were again well below the level experienced in 2011. Even with the lower cost of home heating oil experienced this fall, the risks associated with alternate heating methods continues to be of great concern. Appropriate care needs to be exercised, including: Being sure that you have properly operating smoke detectors in your home; heating equipment is serviced annually and your house number clearly displayed.

We had seventy-one calls in 2014. About 1/3 was for traffic control and to assist the ambulance. We had six structure fires and went to the aid of our mutual aid partners eight times. The remainder is varied in nature from chimney fires to CO detector and smoke alarms and fire alarms at the schools.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be *reflective*. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed so as to be easily viewed as responders approach from either direction. "First red house on the right" does not work well as a description at night.

As you read this, I am hopeful that the 1989 Mack fire engine which was purchased in 2013 will have completed installation of a new larger water tank install in addition to other improvements to bring this up to present standards. We hope to have the 1983 Mack, we bought a few years ago, converted into a tank truck before winter. This will allow the retirement of the rather light duty GMC tank truck that has a gasoline engine and hydraulic brakes. The tank body on this truck was built locally and we have made rust repairs a couple of times. We feel it best to move to the more heavy duty truck and avoid a complete refit of this twenty-eight (28) year old truck.

Although our fleet is aging, the upgrades detailed above will allow some breathing room. When the above detailed work is complete, our fleet will be 11, 25, and 31 years old. The Capital Reserve Account will also be significantly reduced to get the work done. Funding of the Capital Reserve Account should be at a level which will restore the balance as quickly as reasonably possible to keep our options open to be in good financial shape to buy either good used equipment when the opportunity arises or to be able to buy new if needed. I continue to be concerned that solutions to budget issues in Augusta will continue to flow down hill to the municipalities putting pressure on already strained resources.

Fire permits are required for ALL open burning, year round. Permits are available from Fire Warden, Thomas Doe, or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at <http://www.maineburnpermit.com/> subject to the conditions imposed due to the environmental conditions. All burns are required to be conducted after 5:00 pm unless there is a steady rain or the ground is completely covered with snow. It is illegal to burn: Treated wood, shingles, siding, wiring, insulation and all other non-wood materials.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments.

During the planning of the new Municipal Building, there appeared to be interest in developing a substation to shorten response times and thereby improve fire protection. I have discussed this with the Town Manager and the Town Council. The concept has full support. The first step is to identify volunteers and get them trained. With trained volunteers in place, locating and planning the substation could begin. I will have an open house in early summer to allow potential volunteers to see what firefighting and the training is all about

We have added additional an additional firefighter this year. Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Fire Chief, Thomas Doe at 223-4412, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the fire station.

Honorable Commissioners & Citizens of Waldo County,

I am excited to offer my first Annual Report as your Sheriff. I was sworn into office just twelve days ago but I am not new to the Waldo County Sheriff's Office or the law enforcement profession. I am currently serving in my 31st year as a law enforcement officer. During those years I served as a Troop Commander for the Maine State Police, as Chief of Police for the City of Belfast and as your Chief Deputy for the last three years here in Waldo County.

I want to thank former Sheriff Scott Story for his service to the citizens of this County. I am truly honored to take charge of a very professional agency staffed by outstanding law enforcement officers, corrections officers and civilian staff.

The patrol deputies had another very busy year in 2014, handling 8,044 calls for service from the public. These calls include all manner of incidents to include domestic violence, burglaries, thefts, child abuse, sexual abuse, and motor vehicle crashes to name only a few. Our School Resource Officer at RSU 3 provided safety and security to students and staff at all RSU facilities during the year. He also developed several comprehensive programs focusing on underage drinking, texting while driving, and overall safety in the lives of students.

The re-entry center served 51 residents in 2014. Those residents were all nearing the end of their term of incarceration and were integrated as productive citizens back into society. The re-entry residents provided 6,204 hours of free community service all over Waldo County. If this free labor was paid at minimum wage, it would translate to \$38,460 in free labor. The re-entry residents also provided 25,000 pounds of fresh produce to local food pantries from the County's garden project. And the residents also paid \$15,000 in restitution to victims and \$26,000 in room and board payments to the County during the year.

The 72 hour holding facility, which shares space with the re-entry center and is staffed by corrections officers, booked a total of 1,181 persons who were under arrest last year by all the law enforcement agencies serving Waldo County to include the Sheriff's Office, State Police, Belfast Police, Searsport Police, Islesboro Police and the Stockton Springs Police Department. If a prisoner cannot bail within 72 hours, he/she has to be transported to the Two Bridges Regional Jail in Wiscasset by our transport division. This, along with bringing prisoners to court and medical appointments, generated 406 transports for our transport division in 2014.

The civil paper service division served 1677 sets of legal paperwork all over Waldo County.

I speak for all the staff here at the Sheriff's Office when I say that we are proud to serve the citizens of Waldo County and we look forward to providing professional law enforcement and corrections services to the County in 2015.

Annual Report

2014

As Superintendent of the Winterport Water District, I am pleased to present my annual report to the Town of Winterport.

Our main focuses for 2014 were to move forward with submitting the facilities plan for implementation of secondary treatment for our wastewater plant, complete the project of aligning our accounting systems with the Public Utilities Commission standards, maintain & repair our water system to abate water loss due to leaks.

The District was heavily involved in a MEDOT project to replace the culvert at the end of Whig St. Temporary water lines were installed to continue to provide service to the area as the MEDOT exposed and suspended our large water main and sewer line to work on the culvert replacement, below.

Additional changes will be coming for the sewer division as the EPA has revoked all permits that they previously issued to primary treatment facilities that discharge into an estuary. The District has now been issued a secondary treatment permit and is currently operating under a consent agreement from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection to add secondary treatment to our system. The District, working with Olver & Associates Engineering, created and submitted a facilities plan to determine the most effective and efficient means to add secondary treatment. The District is now in the process of applying for funding from various agencies to fund the secondary upgrade in order to meet the parameters of the new permit issued by the MEDEP.

The focus of District's water division is maintaining the water system, including recent upgrades, through hydrant flushing, valve exercise and leak detection. We also replaced the battery back-up on the standpipe and took new measures to avoid freeze-ups in order to prevent standpipe overflows and pressure losses during the winter months. Additionally, we have tightened up the system, through leak repair, nearly eliminating all water loss.

The District continues to participate in a monthly area water utilities meeting, comprised of nine nearby water utility systems that share information and resources. The group meets at the Bangor Water District and collaborates on current issues, ways to reduce costs to our customers and maintaining quality customer services.

In closing, I would like to thank the Board of Trustees, the Town of Winterport, our customers and employees for their dedication and support through this past year.

Dear Friends:

In November, the people of Maine entrusted me to serve another term in the United States Senate. I am deeply honored to serve you and will continue to work to bridge the partisan divide and to forge bipartisan solutions to the many challenges our nation faces. With the New Year just beginning, I welcome this opportunity to reflect on some of my work from this past year and to highlight some of my priorities for the year ahead.

The biggest challenge facing our State remains the need for more jobs so that Mainers can stay in our great State to live, work, and raise their families. Since small businesses create the vast majority of jobs, we must help them to start up, grow, and succeed. We must update our tax code to encourage small business investment in equipment and other assets, cut the red tape that is hampering job creators, build the transportation and energy infrastructure to support an expanding economy. We must also foster opportunities for key industries, from agriculture to defense. We must ensure that our workers have the skills they need for the jobs of today and tomorrow. These initiatives will remain my top priorities in the new Congress.

I am pleased to report a number of successes from this past year, including provisions from my "Seven Point Plan for Maine Jobs." My proposals to streamline job training programs and better match workers' skills with employers' needs were enacted as part of a workforce investment act. I helped secure promising manufacturing opportunities for our state—from requiring the military to buy American-made athletic footwear for new recruits, just as it does for other uniform items, to an additional Department of Energy investment in the deepwater, offshore wind power project being developed by the University of Maine, Maine Maritime Academy, and private companies. For Maine agriculture, I succeeded in including the fresh, white potato in a federal nutrition program from which it has been the only vegetable to be excluded.

Also last year, I was pleased to join in the christening of the *USS Zumwalt* at Bath Iron Works, a Navy ship for the 21st Century that will help protect our nation and strengthen one of Maine's most vital industries. And, for Veterans living in rural areas, I secured a two-year extension of the successful Access Received Closer to Home program, which is improving access to health care for Veterans in northern Maine. Finally, after several years in the making, I am delighted that Congress has approved my legislation to form a commission – at no cost to taxpayers – on the creation of a National Women's History Museum. A museum recognizing the contributions of American women is long overdue, and this bill is an important first step toward that goal.

In the new Congress, I will serve as Chairman of the Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee. This position will allow me to continue working to ensure investments are made in critical transportation infrastructure, which is essential for our safety and economic growth. To date, Maine has received more than \$90 million for highway, bridge, airport, rail, and port projects through the successful TIGER grant program.

I will also serve at the helm of the Senate Special Committee on Aging in the 114th Congress, a position I sought because Maine has the highest median age in the nation. Working to address pressing issues facing our seniors, from long-term care and retirement security to the vast potential of biomedical research, will be on our agenda. Preventing and effectively treating Alzheimer's should be an urgent national priority as this devastating disease continues to take such a personal and economic toll on more than five million Americans and their families. The Committee will also continue to focus on the scams and frauds targeting our senior citizens and has a toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) where seniors and their loved ones can report suspected fraud.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. As 2014 ended, I continued my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997; a tally that now stands at more than 5,700 consecutive votes.

We are at work to address the issues raised by these multiple filings. With each case involving each family's unique details, we are needing to give this matter a lot of case-by-case attention.

In some circumstances involving contested family cases, we continue to offer and continue to find that this helps families develop skills at solving family problems.

Finally, every fall, as part of the court outreach, I offer free probate basics courses in various town halls, adult education centers and libraries, with times, dates and places posted in the September newspapers.

Finally, located at 39A Spring Street in Belfast, we stand ready to serve you Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with additional hours as emergencies require.
