VILLAGE HIRES NEW CHIEF OF POLICE




CHIEF OF POLICE

SEASONAL REMINDERS

Spring Hydrant Flushing

Hydrant flushing dispenses minerals and sediments that have settled in the pipes over time. Flushing also helps verify the proper operation of fire hydrants.

If you experience rusty water, please let your water run in order to clear the rust. It also is recommended not to wash clothing during this time. Packets to remove the rust from your clothing are available at Village Hall free of charge.

OUTDOOR WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

Water conservation is something everyone should practice. Except for the air we breathe, water is the single most important element in our lives. It's too precious to waste.

In an effort to conserve water for fire protection, health and environmental reasons, the Village of Shorewood asks for your cooperation in complying with the following regulations:

DAYS: Addresses ending in even numbers may water on even number calendar days. Addresses ending in odd numbers may water on odd number calendar days. This applies year round including weekend and holidays.

HOURS: 6:00 am to 10:00 am & 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm

HAND HELD HOSE WATERING: 6:00 am to 10:00 am **&** 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm

NEWELY SODDED AND SEEDED LAWNS: A permit to water your lawn for newly sodded or seeded yards can be obtained through Water Utility Billing located in the Finance Department. These permits are valid for two weeks and allow you to water outside of the odd/even permitted days. No permits will be issued between June 15 and September 15. Permits must be displayed in a window.

WATER CONSERVATION AT HOME

Top 10 Water Conservation Tips

Ways To Incorporate Water Conservation In Your Home

- 1. Purchase and install WaterSense labeled toilets.
- 2. Don't let the water run when brushing your teeth, washing your face or shaving. Most of it will be wasted. Just take what you need and save the rest.
- 3. Control your irrigation.
 - Ensure the direction of water is maximized as well as adding auto features for on and off.
- 4. When loading your dishwasher or washing machine, make sure that you are filling them up. Running a cycle through one larger load saves more water than running multiple, smaller loads.
- 5. If everyone in the U.S. flushed the toilet just one less time per day, we could save a lake full of water about a mile long, a mile wide, and four feet deep..... Every day!
- 6. Check for leaks. A faucet drip of only two tablespoons a minute is equal to 105 gallons of water in a week.
- 7. Do your lawn sprinkling early in the morning, between 6:00 am -9:00 am. After 10:00 am, both heat and evaporation increase, robbing the lawn of moisture.
- 8. Purchase a cover for your pool or hot tub.

 Making sure your pool or hot tub is covered
 when not in use can help reduce evaporation.
- 9. Landscape for water conservation.
 - Try the concept of Xeriscape which means "landscape for water conservation."
- Be Smart. Example: When cleaning your fish tank, use the dirty water to water your house plants. The water is rich in nitrogen and phosphorous.

Sewer Dumping

Please help keep water clean by refraining from dumping anything down sewer grates. The sewer grates drain directly into rivers, streams and ponds.



Does your home have an irrigation system?

Did you know that you are required to get an RPZ [Backflow Assembly] test annually whether you use it or not?

Spring is the best time to have this done!

Studies have found that the most common cross-connections come from irrigation sytems since water can accumulate by the sprinkler heads. If there is a loss in water pressure, water could be sucked back through the pipes bringing any chemical fertilizer, pesticides, animal waste or other bacteria and parasites that were on the ground, back into your plumbing system.

Don't forget to submit the test results to the village's consultant, BSI, it's required by the state.

Native Plantings

Tired of having your water bill go up every summer?

Try incorporating native species into your home landscaping. Plants native to this area have evolved in order to best withstand this climate.

Planting natural species will not only cut down your water bill, but also the amount of time you spend doing yard work. These plants do not need to be fertilized and mulching with wood chips helps to keep the weeds away!

Did You Know?

There is as much water in the world today as there was thousands of years ago. Actually it's the same water!

Nearly 97% of the world's water is salty or otherwise undrinkable. Another 2% is locked in icecaps or glaciers. That leaves just 1% for ALL of humanity's needs!

The United States alone uses some 45 billion gallons of water every day. Only about 6% of that, 27 billion gallons, is taken by public water supply systems.

Indoor water use varies from family to family but they average out pretty reliably. Nearly 40% gets flushed down toilets, more than 30% is used in showers and baths, laundry and dishwashing take about 15%, leaks claim 5% or more, which leaves 10% for everything else.

A MESSAGE FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT



The Spring and Summer months are rapidly approaching and with this comes time for people to emerge from their winter activities and spend time out doors. This includes children who will be more likely to enjoy outdoor activities. Motorists need to be aware that while school is still in session. Also, the likelihood of children playing or riding bicycles outside when the weather improves is higher and so is the risk of tragedy. Drivers are asked to be more aware of their surroundings and obey all speed limits and traffic laws, particularly when traveling through neighborhoods or near schools.

This season is also a good time to remind drivers not be distracted or use their cell phones while driving. The State of Illinois and the Illinois Department of Transportation have designated April as Distracted Driving Month. This is a time of year where these groups partner with local law enforcement to make the public aware of the dangers of distracted driving. The Shorewood Police will be conducting increased education and visible enforcement during this time to aid in preventing this behavior

HOME PROJECT REMINDERS

The warmer weather will bring many new projects for all of us around the house. This is a time to clean gutters so that they do not overflow and leak into basements. Downspouts should not be aimed at neighboring properties. Also, if your home has a crawl space, this is a good time to make sure the vents are open for air circulation and to reduce moisture. With all of the rain so far this year, lawns are growing faster than previously. Village Ordinance requires grass to be no more than 10 inches in length. If your lawn is getting close, you may receive a Notice of Visit. This is not a ticket, but a friendly reminder. There are a number of vacant properties in town. We are trying to stay on top of them. If you notice the grass hasn't been cut, please notify us at the Community Development Dept. at 815-553-2310. Also, if the grass in the rear yard is long, we need to be notified, as this is not always visible from the street.

Many property owners are considering building improvements this time of year. The reason a building permit is required is to protect building occupants, neighbors, future buyers and anybody that enters the building. Inspection(s) are included with each permit to communicate the acceptability of the construction work.

The building department requires a building permit for many projects around the house, roofs, siding, patio and sheds to name a few. A permit is not required for cosmetic work, such as painting and decorating, or ceramic tile; if you are not sure if you need a permit, call the Building Department at 815-553-2310 to inquire. A homeowner or contractor can make application for a permit. Permits can be attained by visiting our website at www.vil.shorewood.il.us Applications are available online. The requirements for each project are listed on the applications. You can submit applications online to permits@vil.shorewood.il.us Feel free to drop your application off in person, or you can mail regular mail. June through September is the busiest time at the building department. If you apply early, your wait times may be reduced. We hope your summer projects go well, and don't forget - build safely.

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COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE



The Village is in the process of updating its Comprehensive Plan. This plan will help to shape the future of the Village. It will identify the community's goals and will provide a roadmap for how to achieve them. The Plan will include a Parks & Recreation Master Plan and will address community branding.

Have you ever found yourself wishing that Shorewood had certain amenities, housing types, or businesses? Do you have a vision for what would make Shorewood the perfect place for you and your family? Now is the time to share the ideas, to turn those dreams into reality!

There will be several opportunities for residents and business owners to get involved with Designing Shorewood. Visit the DesigningShorewood.org website to read about the plan, to provide comments, to share a concern or suggestion on the idea map, and to learn more about open houses and other ways you can participate.

The Comprehensive Plan is a long-range strategy that will guide Shorewood's future development and address Village needs about housing, commercial areas, industrial uses, and economic development. It will also evaluate transportation and infrastructure requirements and include a Recreation Master Plan.



The Village has selected Teska Associates, Inc to lead the process. They are a planning and landscape architecture firm, based out of Evanston and Plainfield, with extensive experience in municipal comprehensive planning

and parks planning. The engineering firm of Baxter & Woodman will assist with transportation, infrastructure and sustainability planning. Wohltgroup will direct the development of the branding and marketing campaign.

Comprehensive planning sets a community's vision for the futre and serves as a guide for economic sustainability. The Plan is a tool to manage growth, respond to the evolving economy, and inform public policy and investment.

FAQS ABOUT THE PROJECT

What is a Comprehensive Plan?

The Comprehensive Plan is a long-range strategy that will guide Shorewood's future development and address Village needs about housing, commercial areas, industrial uses, and economic development. It will also evaluate transportation and infrastructure requirements and include a Recreation Master Plan.

Do we have a Plan now?

Shorewood's current Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 2007, which was prior to the Great Recession. As many economic factors have changed since adoption of the plan, and the Village has grown and changed, the Village Board decided to complete a new Comprehensive Plan that reflects current market realities.

Why do we need a Comprehensive Plan?

Comprehensive planning formalizes and communicates a community's vision for its future, which serves as its guide for economic sustainability. Specifically, the Plan is a tool to manage growth, respond to the evolving economy, and inform public policy and investment. A Comprehensive Plan is essentially a community's investment guide for the private and public sectors.

What does the Village hope to gain through this process?

Through this process, the Village hopes to achieve the following:

- Provide Continuity give future Village Boards and officials a common framework for addressing development and land use issues over time.
- Balance Competing Interests evaluate the community as a whole in order to create orderly and rational development patterns.
- Protect Public Investments promote system expansion as part of orderly and phased development.
- Preserve Valued Resources plan for the enhancement or protection of natural resources by future development.
- Shape the Appearance of the Community establish policies and guidelines that foster a distinctive sense of place.
- Promote Economic Development clearly communicate Shorewood's expectation as it relates to economic sustainability.
- Validate Decision-Making provide a factual basis by which the community can make sound zoning decisions.
- Build Community Consensus encourage public support for a collective vision that provides clarity and consensus when proposed projects are consistent with the plan.
- Build Community Capacity engage residents, business owners and other partners and empower them to participate in carrying out Shorewood's shared vision.

What are the topics?

The Comprehensive Planning process will begin with an evaluation of existing conditions including the built environment, the market, and residents' opinions. Recommendations will be made as part of an overall implementation strategy relating to the following topics:

- · Community Vision, Identity, Marketing
- Housing Housing Types, Design
- Commercial Retail, Offices, Restaurants
- Industrial Opportunities, Jobs, Logistics
- Parks, Recreation & Open Spaces
- Transportation & Infrastructure
- Economic Development
- Sub-Area Planning

FAQS ABOUT THE PROJECT

What's the process?

The Comprehensive Planning process takes approximately 14-16 months. We are finishing up the first phase which includes data collection and community feedback. A draft plan and subarea plans will be prepared and the community will be invited to provide additional feedback. Once the vision is refined, the final plan will be prepared for review by the public, and formally considered at a Planning and Zoning Commission meeting before being adopted by the Village Board.

What is a subarea?

Some parts of the Village, and areas that may be part of the Village in the future, have development and design opportunities. The Plan will focus on more detailed suggestions for these subareas, relating to what development could look like there and how to best serve the Village. For this Comprehensive Plan, subareas to be evaluated and planned for are:

- I-55 corridor from US 52 to Black Road,
- IL Route 59 corridor from DuPage River to I-55 interchange,
- Earl Road and Geneva Street area,
- Mound Road to I-80 from railroad tracks to River Road, and
- Ridge Road at US Route 52.



BEGINNING GOLF

"Don't be too proud to take lessons. I'm not" - Jack Nicklaus




