# This Is Your University

CHARTERED in February, 1851, by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota, the University of Minnesota this year celebrated its one hundred and twentieth birthday. As one of the great Land-Grant universities in the nation, the University of Minnesota is dedicated to training the young people of today to become the leaders of tomorrow. Each year our graduates leave our campuses to add new skills and knowledge to the existing resources of our state. They have been trained here as physicians, lawyers, engineers, social workers, teachers, journalists, dentists, pharmacists, nurses, farmers, businessmen — to name only some of the careers for which preparation is offered. Since its founding, the University has awarded more than 232,000 degrees, each one in recognition of the successful completion of an exacting academic program.

In addition to giving collegiate instruction to over 51,000 students annually on its Twin Cities, Duluth, Morris, Crookston, Waseca, and Rochester campuses, the University offers, through its Schools of Agriculture and its General Extension Division, specialized training designed to assist those who wish to study on a part-time basis. It offers further educational opportunity throughout the state by providing county agents, home agents, 4-H club agents, and recreation and health consultants who give effective instruction to residents of the state in their own homes.

In the diversified research laboratories on the University's six campuses, at the several agricultural experiment stations scattered throughout the state, at the Rosemount Research Center, the Cloquet Forest Research Center, the Cedar Creek Natural History Area near Bethel, the Horticultural Research Center and the Arboretum at Excelsior, the Lake Itasca Forestry and Biological Station, and the Hormel Institute at Austin, and at the University Hospitals, University scientists are working on countless experiments of vital importance to the future health and welfare of us all. Research projects, of which only a few are mentioned here, are concerned with cancer, heart surgery, taconite, gamma irradiation, cheese making, teacher training, municipal government, school surveys, and development of new varieties of grains, fruits, and flowers.

THE UNIVERSITY is acknowledged to be the cultural hub of the Northwest. It is the home of the University Artists Course, Radio Station KUOM, the University of Minnesota Television Hour, the University Theatre, the Minnesota Orchestra, and the local performances of the Metropolitan Opera Company. Through the University of Minnesota Program Service, the University brings renowned artists and lecturers to almost two million persons living in the area it serves.

The people of Minnesota are proud of their University, not only because it is one of the leading state universities in the nation, but also because of the extent and quality of its services from which they, their families, communities, and organizations benefit. Their interest in the University is a dynamic thing and expresses itself in many ways. Contributions from them have made it possible for the Variety Club Heart Hospital and the great Mayo Memorial Building to be constructed. Through the American Legion and its auxiliary posts all over the state, thousands of friends have made generous donations to provide an endowed research professorship in heart disease. Generous contributions have built the Masonic Memorial Hospital, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Cancer Research Center, and Diehl Hall (which houses the biomedical library and additional medical research facilities).

Equally generous have been the contributions made by corporations, associations, foundations, trade unions, clubs, and individuals, whose tireless efforts have made hundreds of scholarships and fellowships available to promising students each year. Chiefly because of financial difficulties, only half of the state's high school graduates of marked ability enter any college or university. Friends and supporters of the University, recognizing the need to alleviate this situation, continuously try to increase the number of scholarships and the amount of money available for scholarship assistance.

As it meets the needs of present students, the University must also make plans for those of the future. The 51,000 students who enrolled at the University at the beginning of the 1970-1971 academic year represented nearly half of Minnesota's college-level enrollments. They underline the fact that there are limits to the University's physical capacity. Future enrollments must be adjusted to those limits.

THE 1969 LEGISLATURE granted the University \$141,093,656 for general operations and maintenance during the 1969-1971 biennium. In addition, the University received \$9,210,301 for University Hospitals; \$15,758,812 for special appropriations, including special extension and research activities; \$55,486,951 for new buildings, land, and the rehabilitation of existing buildings; \$1,640,000 for the Crookston Technical College; and \$165,000 for the Waseca Technical College.

Each year the University publishes and widely circulates a summary financial statement, which is available to anyone upon request, as is a much more comprehensive and complete statement for those who wish to make a special study of the University's income and expenditures.

The summary financial statement of 1969-1970 showed that the University's current income amounted to \$242,435,977. Of the total received, \$23,-804,920 came from student tuition and fees; \$38,588,720 from activities relating to educational departments such as Hospitals, Dental Clinic, Cancer Detection Center, and University Theatre receipts, and sales of bulletins and agricultural products; \$1,874,688 from intercollegiate athletics; \$31,740,398 from such services as the dormitories and dining halls, printing, the laundry, the University of Minnesota Press, the Department of Concerts and Lectures, and the Health Service; and \$15,119,488 from corporations, foundations, individuals, and endowment income for instruction, research, prizes, and scholarships. Also, \$49,065,185 came from the federal government for instruction, research, and agricultural extension. The state provided \$82,242,578 or 33.9 percent of the University's total operating costs.

Funds expended for the construction and remodeling of buildings and the purchase of land amounted to \$25,132,319.

COMMENCEMENT marks only the conclusion of the individual's academic life at the University. As a graduate, he contributes to its history and participates in its aspirations. Alumni are urged to continue their affiliation with the University through the Minnesota Alumni Association and its college groups. Also, support is urged for the University of Minnesota Alumni Fund, administered in the Alumni Office, and the Special Projects Program, which includes scholarships, medical and technological research, and college service funds.

Alumni, their families, and their friends are always welcome here. The University hopes they will return frequently to visit the campus and to renew cherished ties.

# Academic Costume

Academic costume — cap, gown, and sometimes hood — may be worn by anyone with a college degree, or by a candidate whose degree is soon to be awarded. Characteristics of costumes show their wearers' highest degrees and, often, the fields of major interest and the institutions by which the degrees are granted.

All bachelors' and masters' gowns are black and untrimmed. The bachelor's gown has a long pointed sleeve; the master's a closed sleeve with an arm slit. Doctors' gowns in the United States are usually black, with velvet front facings and sleeve crossbars. (Some universities, especially those abroad, prescribe colorful crimson, bright red, or other colors, set off by black or colored facings.)

At commencements degree candidates wear the gowns for the degrees they are about to receive. Hoods are worn only by those who already possess degrees. Anyone who has a University of Minnesota degree may wear the Minnesota hood — black with a maroon chevron on gold. The length and shape of a hood identify the most advanced degree its wearer has earned, and the hood's velvet edging shows the degree's field: dark blue for philosophy, light blue for education, green for medicine, lilac for dentistry, orange for engineering, russet for forestry, drab for business, olive green for pharmacy, purple for law, gray for veterinary medicine, golden yellow for science, white for liberal arts and letters.

Caps — usually tasseled mortarboards — show by tassel color the nature of degrees awarded at University of Minnesota commencements. Doctors' tassels may be black or gold; masters' are black. Bachelor's degree candidates at Minnesota, however, indicate their fields of study by their tassel colors (given here in the order they appear in the procession):

Cold shoulder fourragères are worn by candidates who are honor students.

After receiving his degree, a holder may wear the academic costume on any appropriate occasion. But he always wears the black tassel, and omits the shoulder insignia. Appropriate academic costumes can be obtained anywhere that academic ceremonies are conducted.

# This Is Your University

CHARTERED in February, 1851, by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota, the University of Minnesota this year celebrated its one hundred and twentieth birthday. Research projects, of which only a few are mentioned here, are concerned with cancer, heart surgery, taconite, gamma irradiation, cheese making, teacher training, municipal government, school surveys, and development of new varieties of grains, fruits, and flowers.

THE UNIVERSITY is acknowledged to be the cultural hub of the Northwest. It is the home of the University Artists Course, Radio Station KUOM, the University of Minnesota Television Hour, the University Theatre, the Minnesota Orchestra, and the local performances of the Metropolitan Opera Company. Through the University of Minnesota Program Service, the University brings renowned artists and lecturers to almost two million persons living in the area it serves.

The people of Minnesota are proud of their University, not only because it is one of the leading state universities in the nation, but also because of the extent and quality of its services from which they, their families, communities, and organizations benefit. Their interest in the University is a dynamic thing and expresses itself in many ways. Contributions from them have made it possible for the Variety Club Heart Hospital and the great Mayo Memorial Building to be constructed. Through the American Legion and its auxiliary posts all over the state, thousands of friends have made generous donations to provide an endowed research professorship in heart disease. Generous contributions have built the Masonic Memorial Hospital, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Cancer Research Center, and Diehl Hall (which houses the biomedical library and additional medical research facilities).

Equally generous have been the contributions made by corporations, associations, foundations, trade unions, clubs, and individuals, whose tireless efforts have made hundreds of scholarships and fellowships available to promising students each year. Chiefly because of financial difficulties, only half of the state's high school graduates of marked ability enter any college or university. Friends and supporters of the University, recognizing the need to alleviate this situation, continuously try to increase the number of scholarships and the amount of money available for scholarship assistance.

As it meets the needs of present students, the University must also make plans for those of the future. The 51,000 students who enrolled at the University at the beginning of the 1970-1971 academic year represented nearly half of Minnesota's college-level enrollments. They underline the fact that there are limits to the University's physical capacity. Future enrollments must be adjusted to those limits.

THE 1971 LEGISLATURE granted the University \$162,174,982 for general operations and maintenance during the 1971-1973 biennium. In addition, the University received \$9,343,500 for University Hospitals; \$29,408,892 for special appropriations, including special extension and research activities; \$40,632,960 for new buildings, land, and the rehabilitation of existing buildings; \$1,844,000 for the Crookston Technical College; and \$1,400,000 for the Waseca Technical College.

Each year the University publishes and widely circulates a summary financial statement, which is available to anyone upon request, as is a much more comprehensive and complete statement for those who wish to make a special study of the University's income and expenditures.

COMMENCEMENT marks only the conclusion of the individual's academic life at the University. As a graduate, he contributes to its history and participates in its aspirations. Alumni are urged to continue their affiliation with the University through the Minnesota Alumni Association and its college groups. Also, support is urged for the University of Minnesota Alumni Fund, administered in the Alumni Office, and the Special Projects Program, which includes scholarships, medical and technological research, and college service funds.

Alumni, their families, and their friends are always welcome here. The University hopes they will return frequently to visit the campus and to renew cherished ties.

The University of Minnesota is guided by the principle that there shall be no differences in the treatment of persons because of race, creed, color, sex, or national origin and that equal opportunity and access to facilities shall be available to all.

# Academic Costume

Academic costume — cap, gown, and sometimes hood — may be worn by anyone with a college degree, or by a candidate whose degree is soon to be awarded. Characteristics of costumes show their wearers' highest degrees and, often, the fields of major interest and the institutions by which the degrees are granted.

All bachelors' and masters' gowns are black and untrimmed. The bachelor's gown has a long pointed sleeve; the master's a closed sleeve with an arm slit. Doctors' gowns in the United States are usually black, with velvet front facings and sleeve crossbars. (Some universities, especially those abroad, prescribe colorful crimson, bright red, or other colors, set off by black or colored facings.)

At commencements degree candidates wear the gowns for the degrees they are about to receive. Hoods are worn only by those who already possess degrees. Anyone who has a University of Minnesota degree may wear the Minnesota hood — black with a maroon chevron on gold. The length and shape of a hood identify the most advanced degree its wearer has earned, and the hood's velvet edging shows the degree's field: dark blue for philosophy, light blue for education, green for medicine, lilac for dentistry, orange for engineering, russet for forestry, drab for business, olive green for pharmacy, purple for law, gray for veterinary medicine, golden yellow for science, white for liberal arts and letters.

Caps — usually tasseled mortarboards — show by tassel color the nature of degrees awarded at University of Minnesota commencements. Doctors' tassels may be black or gold; masters' are black. Bachelor's degree candidates at Minnesota, however, indicate their fields of study by their tassel colors (given here in the order they appear in the procession):

# This Is Your University

CHARTERED in February, 1851, by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Minnesota, the University of Minnesota this year celebrated its one hundred and twentieth birthday. As one of the great Land-Grant universities in the nation, the University of Minnesota is dedicated to training the young people of today to become the leaders of tomorrow. Each year our graduates leave our campuses to add new skills and knowledge to the existing resources of our state. They have been trained here as physicians, lawyers, engineers, social workers, teachers, journalists, dentists, pharmacists, nurses, farmers, businessmen — to name only some of the careers for which preparation is offered. Since its founding, the University has awarded more than 232,000 degrees, each one in recognition of the successful completion of an exacting academic program.

In addition to giving collegiate instruction to over 51,000 students annually on its Twin Cities, Duluth, Morris, Crookston, Waseca, and Rochester campuses, the University offers, through its Schools of Agriculture and its General Extension Division, specialized training designed to assist those who wish to study on a part-time basis. It offers further educational opportunity throughout the state by providing county agents, home agents, 4-H club agents, and recreation and health consultants who give effective instruction to residents of the state in their own homes.

In the diversified research laboratories on the University's six campuses, at the several agricultural experiment stations scattered throughout the state, at the Rosemount Research Center, the Cloquet Forest Research Center, the Cedar Creek Natural History Area near Bethel, the Horticultural Research Center and the Arboretum at Excelsior, the Lake Itasca Forestry and Biological Station, and the Hormel Institute at Austin, and at the University Hospitals, University scientists are working on countless experiments of vital importance to the future health and welfare of us all. Research projects, of which only a few are mentioned here, are concerned with cancer, heart surgery, taconite, gamma irradiation, cheese making, teacher training, municipal government, school surveys, and development of new varieties of grains, fruits, and flowers.

THE UNIVERSITY is acknowledged to be the cultural hub of the Northwest. It is the home of the University Artists Course, Radio Station KUOM, the University of Minnesota Television Hour, the University Theatre, the Minnesota Orchestra, and the local performances of the Metropolitan Opera Company. Through the University of Minnesota Program Service, the University brings renowned artists and lecturers to almost two million persons living in the area it serves.

The people of Minnesota are proud of their University, not only because it is one of the leading state universities in the nation, but also because of the extent and quality of its services from which they, their families, communities, and organizations benefit. Their interest in the University is a dynamic thing and expresses itself in many ways. Contributions from them have made it possible for the Variety Club Heart Hospital and the great Mayo Memorial Building to be constructed. Through the American Legion and its auxiliary posts all over the state, thousands of friends have made generous donations to provide an endowed research professorship in heart disease. Generous contributions have built the Masonic Memorial Hospital, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Cancer Research Center, and Diehl Hall (which houses the biomedical library and additional medical research facilities).

Equally generous have been the contributions made by corporations, associations, foundations, trade unions, clubs, and individuals, whose tireless efforts have made hundreds of scholarships and fellowships available to promising students each year. Chiefly because of financial difficulties, only half of the state's high school graduates of marked ability enter any college or university. Friends and supporters of the University, recognizing the need to alleviate this situation, continuously try to increase the number of scholarships and the amount of money available for scholarship assistance.

As it meets the needs of present students, the University must also make plans for those of the future. The 51,000 students who enrolled at the University at the beginning of the 1971-1972 academic year represented nearly half of Minnesota's college-level enrollments. They underline the fact that there are limits to the University's physical capacity. Future enrollments must be adjusted to those limits.

THE 1971 LEGISLATURE granted the University \$162,174,982 for general operations and maintenance during the 1971-1973 biennium. In addition, the University received \$9,343,500 for University Hospitals; \$29,408,892 for special appropriations, including special extension and research activities; \$40,632,960 for new buildings, land, and the rehabilitation of existing buildings; \$1,844,000 for the Crookston Technical College; and \$1,400,000 for the Waseca Technical College.

Each year the University publishes and widely circulates a summary financial statement, which is available to anyone upon request, as is a much more comprehensive and complete statement for those who wish to make a special study of the University's income and expenditures.

COMMENCEMENT marks only the conclusion of the individual's academic life at the University. As a graduate, he contributes to its history and participates in its aspirations. Alumni are urged to continue their affiliation with the University through the Minnesota Alumni Association and its college groups. Also, support is urged for the University of Minnesota Alumni Fund, administered in the Alumni Office, and the Special Projects Program, which includes scholarships, medical and technological research, and college service funds.

Alumni, their families, and their friends are always welcome here. The University hopes they will return frequently to visit the campus and to renew cherished ties.

The University of Minnesota is guided by the principle that there shall be no differences in the treatment of persons because of race, creed, color, sex, or national origin and that equal opportunity and access to facilities shall be available to all.

## Academic Costume

Academic costume — cap, gown, and sometimes hood — may be worn by anyone with a college degree, or by a candidate whose degree is soon to be awarded. Characteristics of costumes show their wearers' highest degrees and, often, the fields of major interest and the institutions by which the degrees are granted.

All bachelors' and masters' gowns are black and untrimmed. The bachelor's gown has a long pointed sleeve, the master's a closed sleeve with an arm slit. Doctors' gowns in the United States are usually black, with velvet front facings and sleeve crossbars. Some universities, especially those abroad, prescribe colorful crimson, bright red, or other colors, set off by black or colored facings.

At commencements degree candidates wear the gowns for the degrees they are about to receive. Hoods are worn only by those who already possess degrees. Anyone who has a University of Minnesota degree may wear the Minnesota hood — black with a maroon chevron on gold. The length and shape of a hood identify the most advanced degree its wearer has earned, and the hood's velvet edging shows the degree's field: dark blue for philosophy, light blue for education, green for medicine, lilac for dentistry, orange for engineering, russet for forestry, drab for business, olive green for pharmacy, purple for law, gray for veterinary medicine, golden yellow for science, white for liberal arts and letters.

Caps — usually tasseled mortarboards — show by tassel color the nature of degrees awarded at University of Minnesota commencements. Doctors' tassels may be black or gold; masters' are black. Bachelor's degree candidates at Minnesota, however, indicate their fields of study by their tassel colors (given here in the order they appear in the procession):

Gold shoulder fourragères are worn by candidates who are honor students. After receiving his degree, a holder may wear the academic costume on any appropriate occasion. But he always wears the black tassel, and omits the shoulder insignia. Appropriate academic costumes can be obtained anywhere that academic ceremonies are conducted.
