

The coronavirus pandemic has dramatically reshaped healthcare, with millions of patients turning to telemedicine for many of the services that used to require a visit to the doctor's office. Our Flight of the Phoenix

This past year has been one of challenge. And the crisis, while universal, was also personal, threatening our very well-being. That's scary.

I like dealing in metaphor. In trying to find something appropriate that captures this moment in time I landed on the mythological bird, The Phoenix.

The Phoenix has been a recurring theme of renewal and reinvention throughout the ages. Exactly why is this symbol appropriate? The ancients defined it as a "Fabulous bird that was believed to be unique and reborn from its ashes." In other words it dies and comes back, only better. Different cultures treated it differently. Egyptians saw it as a symbol of rebirth of wealth and fertility. Greco-Romans identified it with immortality and resurrection. The Chinese (yes it traveled that far) saw it as a symbol of virtue, grace, and power, as well as prosperity.

Today we see it as a symbol of growth through re-emerging from adversity. In other words, you go through a difficult situation and come out renewed. Sounds very much like the Gestalt philosophy: "Out of chaos comes order." We certainly did that this past year.

Coral Gables didn't exactly crash and burn. It did, however, experience great pain which required the community to make massive adjustments along the way. Government adapted to social distancing (with a great deal of work achieved outside City Hall); restaurants (a sea of them) immediately reinvented quality outdoor dining, continuing to service the residents; shops never closed but rather

created personal service with reduced in-store customers; art galleries invented personal delivery to display works of art to be seen in your home; banks, investment firms, wealth managers, legal and accounting companies adopted reduced office hours for staff while continuing to provide their services to the home-bound community. The word "Zoom" took on a whole new meaning. In short, everyone became part of the solution rather than languishing in the problem. It showed the resiliency and strength of The City Beautiful.

It wasn't an individual response but rather a collective, community effort orchestrated by the underlying theme of our survival as a group rather than a series of one-offs. This is what tests our mettle and our "test results" provided clear proof of the value of Coral Gables and why it truly is the gem of Miami-Dade County. It is, and always has been, a community in its purest definition. Not exactly a film directed by Frank Capra...but pretty close. We're that good.

Those lucky enough to live and work here are exactly that – fortunate. We're an enclave of residents who view our community as something special: caring, smart, beautiful, successful, historic, powerful and one that respects the word legacy. Maybe that's why we're so concerned for each other. If the myth of The Phoenix is true, we're at the start of a new transformation of growth, success, and prosperity. Embrace it.








The Post-Pandemic Economic Landscape

ARE THE DRIVERS OF THE LOCAL ECONOMY STILL THE SAME?















A mong the hallmarks of the pandemic (and post-pandemic) economy has been a dramatic acceleration of technology and its use in the business place. From Zoom conferences to high-speed data connections, the work-from-home culture driven by Covid-19 has sped up the adoption of smart-city infrastructure that Coral Gables has pushed as fundamental to its economic development.

"We are getting national and international recognition as a smart city, for integrating technology into the economy," says Julian Perez, director of the city's Economic Development Department. Among recent accolades, the city has for two years won the top National Digital Cities award for municipalities of 75,000 or less. "To

marry high technology with business development is the future," says Perez. "This is the fourth wave of the industrial revolution – to move a lot of data and to make sense of that data, to be able to process it. We are really ahead of the game in these applications."

Among other initiatives, the city's government is in the final phase of transforming itself into a paperless, horizontally integrated system where everything is digital, and all departments can talk to each other in the same language. The enterprise software systems being installed will also make all government processes (including business licensing, taxing and permitting) transparent in real time.

Having said that, Coral Gables remains the same in terms of its blend of businesses that have kept the city prosperous and fiscally fit. Its budget remains balanced (with the city getting a AAA from all rating agencies). Its overall retail occupancy has reached 97.2 percent (88.6 percent on Miracle Mile). And even during the pandemic, 30 new businesses were launched – 13 new retailers, 16 new restaurants and 1 new hotel – along with 500,000 square feet of new office space.

"I always say that the biggest driver [of our economy] is that Coral Gables punches above its weight," says Mark Trowbridge, the CEO and President of the Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce, itself regarded as the top chamber in Miami-Dade County. "What I mean by that is, from office space to infrastructure to location to

having a major university partner, there is no sector you can look at where we are not above average." Just as importantly, "we are building a climate that is very user friendly to business."

That business-friendly climate, combined with stellar lifestyle amenities – a plethora of fine dining, theater, high-end retail, leafy neighborhoods, safe & walkable streets – is one reason why more than 100 multinational companies have located their regional head-quarters here, from Bacardi, Mastec, Diageo and HBO, to Fresh Del Monte Produce, IBM, Tiffany and American Airlines. "In essence, it's a human scale downtown in a suburban environment," says Zi-yad Mneimneh, who located his global real estate management firm Polaris Realty Capital to the Gables. "I can walk from a beautiful suburbia, on a quiet safe street, to a charming downtown," he says. "I envy myself."

Coral Gables is also, like South Florida as a whole, a city of small businesses and professional service firms, operating from a slew of office options that include new Class-A mid-rises as well as the largest per-capita number of shared workspaces in the state. "Coral Gables will always have in its DNA the small, mom and pop genre of businesses, and we are very proud of that," says Trowbridge, who estimates that at least half of his 1,600 chamber members are firms with fewer than 10 employees.

Partly as a result of so many small firms, Trowbridge notes that "you can do anything here – work here, live here, build your life here. You can grocery shop, get your hair cut, get your car serviced, go to the theater, visit your banker or your lawyer, have your clothes



drycleaned... We don't always promote the city that way, but it is a complete universe."

When it comes to larger employers, there are only a handful that exceed the federal government's definition of a small business, which means 500 employees or less. Those that top that benchmark – the top employers – include the University of Miami, Baptist Health System, Miami-Dade Public Schools, Doctors Hospital and Amerant Bank. All fall into the category of information and service-driven industries of the future.

"Everyone knows this area as Miami. But we are moving forward developing our own brand based on technological excellence," says Perez, including the installation of a 5G network throughout the downtown and real-time traffic data monitoring for retailers. "We are establishing the infrastructure. Companies feel very comfortable that the technology is here."

Multinationals in the Gables

WITH ITS INTERNATIONAL CULTURE, PROXIMITY TO MIAMI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, AND ABUNDANT STOCK OF ELEGANT HOUSING AND CLASS-A OFFICE SPACE, CORAL GABLES CONTINUES TO ATTRACT GLOBAL FIRMS THAT SEE THE CITY AS A PERFECT PLACE FOR HEMISPHERIC HEADQUARTERS

For decades, Coral Gables has taken pride as a hub for multinational companies, firms that have an office in the U.S. and in at least one other country. More than 120 multinationals now call the city home, operating offices that range from large global headquarters and North American executive offices to small regional bases for Latin America.

The companies span a wide variety of industries: tech, hospitality, luxury goods, engineering, media, accounting, dairy products and dance studios, to name a few.

Among those with the largest number of employees in Coral Gables are: MasTec, the Fortune 500 builder that keeps its global headquarters in the city and employs some 350 in Coral Gables; Bacardi, the spirits group that runs its North

American headquarters from the city and employs more than 300 in the Gables; and Fresh Del Monte Produce, with U.S. executive offices in the city employing more than 275.

Other multinationals that are major employers in the Coral Gables: telecom provider Millicom International Cellular, which has about 215 people in the city; engineering and design firm Stantec, which has about 90 located here; and software company Datapro, which employs about 85 in the Gables.

On the following pages, we profile heavyweights Bacardi, Fresh DelMonte and MasTec, as well as a rising star, Gables-based PayCargo, which provides an electronic payment system for freight transport. PayCargo just raised \$125 million to fund an expansion will likely double its Gables staff to 100.

BACARDI LIMITED

New flavored gins, featuring Bombay Bramble infused with black-berries and raspberries, plus Bombay Sapphire Sunset, filled with spices and Spanish mandarin – or Bacardi rum cocktails sold in cans with a new recipe (Bahama Mama, bursting with orange, red berries and pineapple). These are some of the latest innovations from Bacardi Limited, the world's largest privately held spirits company.

The Bermuda-based conglomerate produces and markets more than 200 brands and labels, including its signature Bacardi rum, Grey Goose vodka, Patron tequila, Dewar's blended Scotch whiskey, Martini vermouth and Bombay Sapphire gin. Still owned by its founding family, the company keeps its North American headquarters on Le Jeune Road in Coral Gables, employing some 300 people in the city, mainly handling sales and marketing in the US and Canada.

Leading the headquarters is regional president Pete J. Carr, who has worked in the beverage industry for more than a quarter century. The Gables office also holds Bacardi's archives, which span 30,000-plus items – from valuable paintings to antique bottles from the company's facilities founded in the late 1800s in the eastern Cuba city of Santiago.

Today, Bacardi employs about 7,000 people worldwide, operating 20 production facilities in nations as diverse as Italy, India and Mexico, and selling its brands in some 170 countries. Though the company does not disclose revenues, analysts have estimated that sales top \$5 billion a year, with the United States as the company's largest market.

MASTEC

CEO JOSE R. MAS PROJECTS RECORD REVENUE THIS YEAR, TOPPING \$8 BILLION

Based in Coral Gables since 2004, this Fortune 500 company is poised for its best year yet, thanks to the rollout of 5G wireless technologies and increased government spending on energy and infrastructure. MasTec projects revenues to top \$8 billion for the first time in 2021, up from \$6.3 billion in 2020 when sales dipped because of coronavirus. Profits in 2020 still topped \$300 million for the third straight year.

Listed on the Nasdaq exchange, Mas Tec started out as a builder mainly for landline phone companies. Now, it does construction and engineering for electric companies, wireless telecom, renewable energy, oil and gas companies and other industries. In May, it expanded its reach with the roughly \$420 million purchase of Intren, an Illinois-based contractor that provides services to utilities, cities and cooperatives in 14 states. Intren had about \$550 million in revenue in the 12-month period ended March 2021.

Though it ranks among the country's 500 largest companies by revenue, MasTec takes pride in its roots as a Cuban-American family business. CEO Jose R. Mas aims to add to the legacy of his hard-scrabble immigrant dad, who founded MasTec's predecessor firm Church & Tower. The younger Mas is taking MasTec into the latest growth areas, including 5G telecom, wind and solar energy, plus deployment of sensors for driverless cars. He aims to increase MasTec's annual revenues to \$10 billion.

MasTec (with offices also in Canada) employs more than 20,000 employees part- and full-time, including some 350 in Coral Gables.

FRESH DEL MONTE PRODUCE

DIVERSIFYING FROM BANANAS, WITH ITS FRSHST BISTRO NOW OPEN IN CORAL GABLES

Long known for selling bananas and other fresh fruits and vegetables to supermarkets and distributors, Fresh Del Monte Produce is expanding its offerings. The company recently opened its first FRSHst bistro in Florida, in the same building as its U.S. executive offices at 241 Sevilla Avenue. It's all part of a larger effort to sell more directly to consumers and boost revenue from pre-cut produce and prepared foods.

Fresh Del Monte felt a sting from the coronavirus pandemic, when sales to the food service and restaurant industries fell. Yet supermarkets fared well, as families cooked more at home. The produce giant adjusted by selling some under-utilized assets and "making progress on our five-year strategic initiatives to become a value-added and more diversified company," said Chairman and CEO Mohammad Abu-Ghazaleh. For 2020, net sales dipped 6 percent to \$4.2 billion, and profits fell slightly to \$49.2 million, compared to 2019. Bananas still made up nearly 40 percent of revenue.

Spun off from Del Monte's canned food unit in the 1980s, Fresh Del Monte operates from farm to table, mainly growing, transporting, and selling freshly harvested produce. Its holding company went public on the New York Stock Exchange in 1997. Running day-to-day operations from Coral Gables is Youssef Zakharia, president and chief operating officer since 2016. The company employs more than 275 people in the Gables in such varied fields as shipping, information technology, marketing and sales.

PAYCARGO

EXPANDING IN EUROPE, ASIA AND BEYOND, WITH \$125 MILLION JUST RAISED

Coral Gables-based PayCargo made headlines in June, receiving a \$125 million investment from private equity firm Insight Partners to expand its business beyond North America and Europe. The money came after a \$35 million investment just months earlier by a group led by the same New York equity firm.

PayCargo provides an electronic system to make it faster and safer for people sending goods to pay logistics providers such as railroads and warehouses. Business had been growing at a solid pace but soared during the coronavirus pandemic. That's because many people did not want to handle paper documents for health reasons and because online transactions became more accepted globally.

In 2020, PayCargo roughly doubled the volume of payments handled to top \$4 billion, taking in \$45 million in revenue. In 2021, it expects to double its payments volume again, says CEO Eduardo Del Riego.

Today, PayCargo works with more than 67,000 users, paying vendors ranging from air and sea carriers to truckers. With added funding, it plans to grow in Europe and launch in Asia this year. Later, it aims to enter the Middle East, Africa and Latin America. Growth potential is huge, says Del Riego, because most global trade still relies on paper-based payments such as checks, cash and vouchers.

Founded by South Florida entrepreneurs, PayCargo set up its Gables headquarters in 2009. It expects to double staff in the city to roughly 100 people by 2024.

The largest bank based in Coral Gables, Amerant has a new chief executive as of March 2021. Jerry Plush has experience both in banking and private equity, and he's putting more emphasis on community outreach and on profitability at the company that trades its shares on Wall Street.

In recent months, Amerant has trimmed its network to 25 branches, 18 in South Florida and seven around Houston, closing two centers. It's also started buying back up to \$40 million of its own shares.

Profits rose to \$16 million in the second quarter 2021, up from \$14.5 million a quarter earlier. In 2020, the bank reported a \$1.7 million loss. That's mainly because of \$88 million in provisions for potential losses on loans, including cash owed by a Miami coffee trader that suddenly went bankrupt.

Amerant began in North Miami Beach in 1979 as Gold Coast National Bank. It then became Commercebank and later was bought by Venezuela's Mercantil group, which significantly increased assets. In 2018, it was spun off from Mercantil as Amerant Bancorp. and began trading its stock on the Nasdaq exchange.

Plush wants to deepen Amerant's local roots, shifting mindset from subsidiary to community bank.

"As we look forward," Plush told analysts, "we will be focused



on core deposit growth, building brand awareness, rationalizing our business lines and geographies, driving cost efficiencies across the business and optimizing our capital, with a clear goal to continue on the path toward improved performance."

Two key initiatives: Expanding digital offerings, an effort that features partnerships with fintech firms Numerated and Marstone, and boosting deposits from domestic U.S. customers.

Banesco USA is an independent Florida bank, with four branches in southeast Florida – Coral Gables, Hialeah, Aventura and Brickell, plus one branch in San Juan, Puerto Rico. It recently bought a building in the Doral area west of Miami International Airport and planned to open a branch there in late 2021.

The bank also intends to move its headquarters from Coral Gables to the building it purchased for nearly \$12 million at 3155 NW 77th Ave. in unincorporated Miami-Dade County. That shift aims partly to ensure more space for growth, says Mario Oliva, who became president and CEO in early 2020.

Founded 15 years ago, Banesco USA is now strong in real estate lending. "We've developed robust commercial real estate and residential products that are very competitive for our domestic and international customers," Oliva says.

Although Covid-19 cut office traffic and boosted investment in online offerings, Banesco USA achieved growth during the pandemic. "Lending to businesses through the government's Paycheck Protection Program brought in some 600 new customers," says Oliva. In the year ending June 2021, loans grew by 7 percent, or \$103 million; deposits by 2 percent, or \$38 million; and assets by 2 percent, or \$32 million, to top \$2 billion.



Banesco USA is part of Banesco International, a financial services brand with a presence in six countries including Venezue-la, Panama and the Dominican Republic. Its founder and primary shareholder is banker and economist Juan Carlos Escotet Rodríguez, who also is the primary shareholder in Spain's Abanca. Recently, Banesco USA and Abanca USA extended a \$17.5 million syndicated loan to Miami developer Cade Capital for a residential project of two five-story buildings in northern Miami-Dade County.

There's a new owner at the tech-savvy, one-branch bank on Miracle Mile that mainly serves Latin American customers: Bradesco, Brazil's financial titan that boasts nearly \$300 billion in assets. Publicly-traded Bradesco bought the nearly half-century-old Florida bank for about \$500 million in late 2020.

Now, longtime BAC chief Julio Rojas has become vice chairman, and Brazil's Henrique Lima is president and CEO at Bradesco BAC Florida Bank. The purchase helps expand U.S. options for Bradesco's clients in Brazil, helping them hold deposits in dollars and get loans for U.S. real estate, among other activities. "We have pent-up demand for these U.S. services," says Lima, noting Bradesco BAC is adding staff and investing to link BAC's and Bradesco's overseas tech systems to meet the demand from Latin America.

Lima calls the purchase "a perfect match." Both banks value digital offerings and nurture diverse teams, with many employees on staff for 10 years or more. BAC long has taken pride in serving overseas clients online, and more than half its officers are women. Today, about one-third of the bank's 215 employees in Coral Gables have worked at least a decade with either BAC or Bradesco, adds Lima.

Bradesco is keeping the Florida bank's strategy: service-orient-



ed and tech-focused, but accelerating its growth. "We're building capacity for the long term," says Lima. That includes strengthening the broker-dealer arm Bradesco BAC Florida Investments, to serve affluent Brazilians and other Latin Americans looking to invest in U.S. stocks, bonds and other instruments. An important lure for that clientele, says Lima: "We're from the Latin American region, unlike some of our competitors who are U.S.-centric and come and go from the region.'

It's unusual for a company headquartered outside Florida to base their top national manager in Coral Gables, but Calamos Wealth Management has done just that. Joe Nader runs the firm nationwide from an Alhambra Circle office, which was expanded in 2020 to an entire floor employing 15 people, notably wealth advisors and certified financial planners.

The firm builds on the investment ideals of investor and selfmade billionaire John P. Calamos, who is credited with "a risk-aware approach to investing," using corporate bonds that can be converted to stock. In 1977, the Chicago-area investor created Calamos Investments, now one of the country's largest "alternative asset" managers. That company spun off Calamos Wealth Management, expanding to New York and, in 2014, to Florida.


Nader says the firm chose Coral Gables for its third office and U.S. southeast base to serve existing area clients and because "domestic wealth is moving here from the Midwest and Northeast, and the second generation of Latin American clients is moving here." Coral Gables also is convenient for clients - near Miami International Airport and within a two-hour drive from the Palm Beach and Naples areas, he says.

Like its peers, Calamos offers advice and investment manage-



ment, operating on a fee-based model and a fiduciary standard to put client interests first. It differs, however, "in its investment strategies," often using convertible bonds, liquid alternative assets, hedging and "a suite of private investment offerings not easily accessible to the public," says Nader. The firm also has access to the research and resources of Calamos Investments, which had \$38 billion in assets under management as of mid-2021.

Nader is chairman-elect of the Nicklaus Children's Health System.

When Covid-19 hit in 2020, City National Bank of Florida mobilized fast to help small- and mid-sized businesses. The Miami-based bank approved roughly \$2 billion in government Paycheck Protection Program loans, the most (relative to its size) for any large bank based in the state.

That outreach is indicative of City National's focus as "the Big Bank Alternative, able to provide the same products and solutions as the biggest banks, but still small enough to deliver a client experience based on personal relationships and local decision making," says vice chairman and CEO Jorge Gonzalez.

Since taking the helm in 2009, Gonzalez has grown City National into the second largest bank based in Florida, boosting assets from roughly \$3 billion to top \$20 billion as of mid-2021. The bank now employs nearly 1,000 people and operates 31 branches, mainly in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties. It runs executive offices in Coral Gables and collaborates with many civic and nonprofit groups.

Growth has been fueled partly by acquisitions. In 2015, Chile's Banco de Credito e Inversiones (Bci) bought City National for \$882 million. With that backing, City National in 2018 purchased Miami-based Total Bank for \$529 million, adding nearly \$3 billion in assets. In 2020, it acquired Miami's Executive National Bank,



adding some \$500 million more in assets.

Expansion continues. In May 2021, it branded its private banking and wealth management services as City National Private to focus more on that growing business, hiring Coral Gables banking veteran Steven Hayworth to lead the division. City National is also extending its reach northward, recently opening a Central Florida headquarters in Orlando and eyeing opportunities in Jacksonville.

Coral Gables Trust Company offers something extra that distinguishes it from many other wealth management companies: trust and estate services. The firm advises clients on setting up trusts—separate accounts that hold client assets to minimize inheritance taxes and ease transfer of wealth to heirs after the client dies. That's on top of its fee-based services in financial planning and investment management.

2020 was the best year yet for the Gables-based firm in new clients added and in revenue, says CEO and Chairman Jim Davidson. In the early months of coronavirus, "a lot of people were locked in and had time to think about estate planning and investing. They wanted to talk." The firm's monthly calls with every client also prompted lots of referrals for new business, says Davidson.

Revenue rose, as its fees for investment management were applied to a larger base. Assets climbed toward \$2 billion both from clients' portfolio gains and new customers, including some transplants to South Florida from California and New York. "Through personal connections, we've been able to gain a number of new clients moving from high-tax states," says Davidson.

CGT serves clients with assets from \$1 million to \$50 million-plus, smaller amounts than many larger firms allow. It has four



offices: Coral Gables, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach and Boca Raton. "We pride ourselves on putting clients' interests first, and we're more accommodating with clients than huge national banks," Davidson says. "And because we're local, we can be more flexible and responsive."

The firm also takes pride in community involvement. Executives and directors help with nonprofit groups including the Coral Gables Community Foundation, the Chapman Partnership, Informed Families and Vizcaya Museum.

Evensky & Katz started in South Florida some 35 years ago and has slowly expanded westward. It opened in Texas in the 2000s, when founder Harold R. Evensky helped develop the Personal Financial Planning Program at Texas Tech University. In 2020, it set up in Seattle, when planner Josh Mungavin relocated to serve clients in tech and other industries on the Pacific coast.

The boutique wealth-management firm differs from peers partly in its ownership model. It recently added four more shareholders, so that nearly half of its 33 employees now hold equity in the firm.

"We're really proud to be an employee-owned firm, where our diverse team treats this like a family business," says David Evensky, chief marketing officer and the founder's son. "And because we're business owners with skin in the game, like a lot of our clients, we really understand how important it is to give quality service."

The firm is well known because founder Evensky literally wrote the book on wealth management – that unique blend of financial planning and services to preserve and grow wealth long-term – in the 1990s.

Today, some two out of three staffers are certified financial planners. The team helps executives, institutional clients and others expand assets for future generations, advising on philanthropy and



other goals. It does not sell proprietary products nor accept commissions on sales. Employees earn fees for managing client assets through third-party custodians and working under a fiduciary standard that puts client interests first, says Evensky.

While coronavirus affected clients' finances – some saw business revenue dip or retired early – clients overwhelmingly stuck to pre-pandemic investment plans, says Evensky. "We're long-term investors looking at long-term goals," he says.

Fiduciary Trust International is a global wealth management firm founded in New York 90 years ago "by families for families." It builds and manages personalized investment portfolios for clients and develops estate plans that aim to extend wealth for future generations.

The firm is part of Franklin Templeton, one of the world's largest investment companies. It leverages Franklin Templeton's extensive resources and capabilities, including research on the global economy and on thousands of companies. Yet wealth-planning decisions are tailored to the needs of each client and made locally, says Michael A. Cabanas, managing director of the firm's Coral Gables office.

Headquartered in New York, the firm and its subsidiaries have 13 offices across the United States and a presence in the Cayman Islands. In Florida, it has locales outside Coral Gables in Boca Raton, Fort Lauderdale and St. Petersburg.

Fiduciary Trust opened in greater Miami more than three decades ago, but relocated from the downtown area to Coral Gables in 2015 to be in a more central and convenient location for its clients,



says Cabanas. Its Alhambra Plaza office now has nearly 20 employees serving clients in Florida, Latin America, Europe and beyond.

Coronavirus had little impact on how clients invested because of the firm's planning-based, long-term approach, Cabanas says. But extra time at home and concerns over health did spur new activity. "Some people who'd been thinking about drafting an estate plan or setting up a trust went ahead and did it," he says.

Wealth management firms range widely in size from large corporate-owned companies to small family or employee-owned businesses. Firestone Capital Management represents the "high-touch, boutique" approach, operating a single office with a staff of eight, many of them certified financial planners and chartered financial analysts.

The Coral Gables-based firm focuses on "multi-generation family planning," aiming to preserve, enhance and transfer wealth from generation to generation, to charitable causes and to others that investors hold dear. It works on a fee-only model for advice, with no commissions on sales, and emphasizes personalized service, says planner Jerad Waggy.

The 30-year-old company takes pride in its community roots and relationships. "Three out of five partners are born or raised here in Miami-Dade, so we're locals serving locals," says Waggy. The staff is active with nonprofit groups including the Woody Foundation, Miami Music Project and National Christian Foundation.

Firestone differs from some wealth-management firms by personalizing portfolios for clients who want investments to reflect their social values. That might mean putting cash into companies that produce renewable energy or that develop technologies of the future. Or it may mean steering clear of mutual funds with stocks in fossil-fuel, tobacco, gun or for-profit prison industries. Says Waggy:



"When clients want to be more mindful of where their money is invested, we accommodate them."

In the year ending June 2021, Firestone boosted assets under management by roughly \$100 million to \$625 million, both from new clients and portfolio gains, Waggy says. During coronavirus, staff stayed in close touch with clients, he says, "reminding people of the long-term, so they could step back and look at their investment strategy for the next 20 years or into future generations."



In business for 95 years, Grove Bank & Trust boasts a key role in South Florida's history. After the 1929 financial crisis, for instance, it helped the then-insolvent University of Miami avoid being sold, buying its assets and developing a plan for UM to buy them back. It also helped fund brothers Ralph and James Ryder's venture to transport mail in Miami, helping grow what became Fortune 500 giant Ryder.

Sheldon T. Anderson, former president and CEO of the southeast region for Northern Trust Co., became chairman and CEO in March 2021 after five years on the board. Anderson leads a community bank with assets topping \$1 billion in mid-2021. It has five offices: the Coconut Grove headquarters, Coral Gables, South Miami, Palmetto Bay and Aventura. South Florida's billionaire doctor and entrepreneur Phillip Frost is the largest shareholder.

Anderson says Grove Bank & Trust differs from others by offering "highly personalized service and solutions for families and institutions that have been here for generations." It also offers both banking and trust services, while "most banks of our size don't have trust and investment management capabilities," he adds. Anderson now is keen on expanding the bank's wealth management and trust business. Longer-term, he's considering growth into Broward and



Palm Beach counties.

As banking goes digital, Grove has been making significant investments in technology and online offerings. It's also active with the Beacon Council, Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce, New World Symphony, Gables Stage, Miami Foundation and other groups, says Anderson, "to really enhance our community."



In its second year in operation, Kaufman Rossin Wealth saw business double to some \$90 million in assets under management. The firm picked up new clients partly through its affiliation with 59-year-old South Florida accountancy Kaufman Rossin. It also built on personal relationships forged through decades in banking and community groups by its founder and president Jay Pelham.

Coronavirus spurred growth too. "People had a lot more time to reflect on 'Gee, do I have a financial plan?'," says Pelham. After filing taxes or consulting on tax questions with Kaufman Rossin, some opted to work with the wealth-management affiliate and develop a long-term investment strategy.

Established in 2019, Kaufman Rossin Wealth now has a team of six at its Coconut Grove headquarters. It also recently added a financial advisor at Kaufman Rossin's accounting office in Fort Lauderdale. And plans call for adding more financial advisors at other Kaufman Rossin offices later, says Pelham.

The business operates like many wealth-management firms in South Florida: planning-based, fee-only, with a fiduciary standard that puts client needs first. What makes it different, besides its Kaufman Rossin links and Pelham's relations, is an association with Buckingham alliance, a group that advises investment management



firms that handle some \$50 billion in assets. Buckingham provides investment research, a bond desk, access to mutual funds and other services, says Pelham, "so we can focus on clients."

For 2021, Pelham also expects solid growth, partly from newcomers to South Florida relocating from New York, California and other higher-tax areas. After consulting Kaufman Rossin on taxes, some may choose to develop financial plans and manage assets locally, "without calling someone out of town."

The fifth largest banking group in the United States, PNC Bank debuted a Coral Gables office in April 2021. It opened a 6,000 square-foot space in the mixed-use development Plaza Coral Gables, which it helped finance. The office offers commercial banking, wealth management, retail and mortgage services, with some 40 employees, says Cressman Bronson, regional president for southeast Florida.

Based in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, with roots in finance for 176 years, PNC Bank long has served the U.S. mid-Atlantic, Midwest and southeast regions. It entered Florida in 2009, initially operating north of Miami-Dade County. By mid-2021, it had offices in the county in Aventura and Coral Gables and was opening soon in Brickell, Pinecrest and Doral. It also had a Miami office specializing in wealth management for international clients, part of its \$11.6 billion purchase of BBVA USA from Spain's BBVA Group completed in June 2021.

Buying BBVA USA increased PNC's assets by roughly \$100 billion to \$574 billion and raised its ranking from seventh to fifth place among the country's largest commercial banking groups. The bank is part of the diversified PNC Financial Services Group Inc., whose stock trades on the New York Stock Exchange.

Yet PNC differs from other big peers in its "Main Street



philosophy" and management structure, Bronson says. The bank has more than 50 regional presidents nationwide who each oversee their respective area and lead that region's philanthropic foundation and outreach. "We really have a focus on making local decisions," he says

Locally, the PNC Foundation is active in early childhood education and coronavirus relief. The bank also is working to boost loans in low-and moderate-income areas and support African-American communities.

Just one year after going public on Wall Street and completing its merger with Marquis Bank, Coral Gables-based Professional Bank is making bold moves again. The community bank announced that it's opening loan-production offices in the Tampa-St. Petersburg and Jacksonville areas to tap strong economic growth in those markets. The expansion is the bank's first in Florida outside the southeast.

Professional has been busy during the coronavirus pandemic. It approved more than \$322 million in three rounds of Paycheck Protection Program loans for businesses, the most (relative to its size) of any small bank in the state. The bank also has expanded its online offerings, working through its Digital Innovation Center in Cleveland, Ohio. Profits for the first half of 2021 were \$11.1 million, up five-fold from a year earlier.

A group of investors led by local physician Lawrence Schimmel started the bank 13 years ago, aiming to offer fellow professionals the quality customer service typical in private banking and sometimes hard to find in large commercial banks. Today, it has nine branches in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties, plus a loan-production office in New England for a specialized product. Staff now tops 200 people, serving a broad range of clients from professionals and corporations to small businesses and retirees.



To help with growth, Professional recently named its first Chief Marketing Officer, Adrian D. Collard, formerly with Mastercard and PayPal, among other companies. Yet the bank remains committed to personalized service for people, says President and COO Abel L. Iglesias. Clients want to know, says Iglesias, "if they have a problem, they can pick up the phone and get one of us on the line."

SUNSTATE BANK

Many South Florida-based banks picked up customers during the coronavirus pandemic, when owners of small businesses sought personalized help to apply for loans through the U.S. government's Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). One clear winner: service-focused Sunstate Bank.

"We did more than 1,000 PPP loans, and probably half were new customers," including some who decided to keep accounts permanently with Sunstate, says president and CEO Lloyd DeVaux.

The small bank began a generation ago as Sofisa Bank of Florida, owned by a family in Brazil that got its start in the shoe business. In 2007, it changed its name to reflect its priority to serve clients in Florida and make clear it is no longer linked to Brazil's Sofisa Bank. It also added the tagline "State of the Art Banking" to underscore its Sunshine State roots and widening digital reach.

In 2018, Sunstate bought the one-branch Intercontinental Bank, headquartered in West Miami, for \$28.5 million. In mid-2021, it was setting up a holding company to pursue future acquisitions.

Sunstate now operates three branches: its Palmetto Bay headquarters, Coral Gables and West Miami, and employs some 65 people. It serves both international and domestic customers, lending mainly for U.S. real-estate transactions and especially for homes in Florida.



DeVaux wants to grow Sunstate's assets to spread the rising costs of complying with regulations and deploying new technologies over a broader base. He's been investing to upgrade Sunstate's computer systems and to roll out new digital offerings for customers.

"Covid probably accelerated the digital transformation at banks by five years at least. Customers got used to online transactions," says DeVaux. "Business comes down more to the digital experience."

The Foreign Connections

FOR TRADE AND COMMERCE, THE GABLES' CONSULAR CORPS ARE IMPORTANT PIECES OF THE PUZZLE



IN FRONT OF THE PERU CONSULATE

When you include those adjacent to the city, and those countries which have multiple offices here, Coral Gables hosts nearly two dozen consular and trade offices that provide services ranging from visa and passport acquisition to tourism, trade and educational exchanges. Some of the offices are full-scale consulates, with diplomats sent to Florida from their respective homelands. Others feature honorary, or volunteer, consuls. Don Slesnick, the former mayor of Coral Gables, serves for example as the honorary consul for Australia from his law offices in the Gables; business consultant Carolina Rendeiro, for another example, serves as the honorary consul for Portugal from her Gables offices.

"You really have two separate groups. There are the consul generals, and there are the honorary consuls, who represent the country but don't have the power of a career diplomat like a consul general does," says honorary consul Rendeiro. "We are, however, the boots on the ground, and nine out of ten times we have the business knowhow and the contacts in our market that the consul generals don't have because they switch out every four years."

On the reverse side of the coin, the consul generals here are well connected with their home countries and can provide important connections there. "People think that consular officers grant visas and stamp passports, but they do much more, from educational interchange to receiving groups from their countries," says Nabil J. Achkar, Secretary of the Consular Corps of Miami. "The main job of the consulates now is business and economic development. Trade functions are an important part of their work." These include offering advice on trade opportunities, arranging visits (in both directions) and supporting their country's products with trade exhibitions.

In addition to their offices located here, Coral Gables is also the home to numerous consular officials who choose to live here because of the city's cultural diversity and the old-world Latin/European elegance of its architecture, cuisine, and streetscapes. Even the U.S. government has a consular-type office in the city: An Office of Foreign Missions, which among other things serves foreign diplomats in the U.S. southeast region and ensures that diplomatic benefits are properly exercised.



PERU

Peru has become one of Miami's top trade partners, with nearly \$3 billion in combined air and sea shipments during 2020. Its consulate for Florida is based on Ponce de Leon Boulevard in Coral Gables, serving not only the interests of Peruvian citizens across the state, but acting as the connecting point for information about the Peruvian economy and trade opportunities.

Peru is the ninth largest trading partner at the Port of Miami, with nearly \$1.2 billion in trade last year, and the eighth largest trading partner at Miami International Airport, with more than \$1.7 billion in goods moved between the U.S. and Peru by air cargo last year. Principal imports from Peru include agricultural goods, gold, clothing, and tin; leading exports to Peru include machinery, plastics, car parts, computers, aircraft equipment, and telecom gear. Coral Gables is also a culinary outpost for Peru, with exceptional and authentic Peruvian cuisine.

ITALY

Italy is the fourth largest trading partner at the Port of Miami by volume, with more than \$1.2 billion dollars in imports and exports for fiscal 2020. They do another half billion in trade through Miami International Airport. Their consular office is located in the Collection building on Ponce de Leon Boulevard and Bird Road.

The top imports from Italy include medicines, passenger vehicles, wine, and designer goods such as handbags, jewelry, wallets and leather shoes. Top exports to Italy include jewelry and gems, pharmaceuticals, organic chemicals, and computer parts. In Coral Gables, Italian companies include retail fashion outlets such as Italian Eyewear on Aragon Ave., and Artigiano on Laguna Street, where clients can have their tailored suits and shoes manufactured in Italy and shipped here. Much of the high-end kitchen and bathroom cabinetry used in Gables homes comes from Italy as well, via such shops as Snaidero and Scavolini, both on Ponce de Leon Boulevard. Italian food is the number one restaurant category in the city.

COLOMBIA

Colombia is one of South Florida's largest trading partners. Last year, Colombia ranked second only to Brazil in trade (by dollar value) through Miami International Airport and came in at No. 7 for all goods exported from the Port of Miami. Top imports include coffee, gold, flowers, aluminium and seafood; top exports include machinery, chemicals, aircraft parts, computers and cellphones.

Established in 1981, the Colombian consulate is located in the heart of downtown Coral Gables, across the street from Books & Books and adjacent to the Art Cinema. It plays an active part in the city's cultural life, for years offering a venue for artists as part of the First Friday Gallery Night program.

The jurisdiction for the Colombian consulate covers all of South Florida, from Key West to Port St. Lucie. Its mission is to protect the interests of Colombian citizens here, and to enhance two-way trade and travel between the U.S. and Colombia.

SPAIN

Due to its cultural affinity with Coral Gables (two of the Gables' sister cities, Sevilla and Granada, are located there), Spain has the most extensive presences of any foreign country in Coral Gables. Its consulate, education office, tourist office, cultural center and trade commission are all co-located in a mid-rise at the intersection of LeJeune Road and Valencia Avenue. Spanish companies comprise one third of all multinational firms with offices in the city.

Spain's consular and trade officials oversee activities across all of Florida, as well as those in Georgia and South Carolina. Their mission is not only to help Spanish citizens here, but to foster bilateral trade and investment, along with educational projects and cultural exchanges. Most recently they assisted in the establishment of offices for the University of Salamanca in the Gables. The leading categories of exports to Spain include aircraft gear, telecom equipment, military supplies and scientific/medical supplies; leading imports include glass and ceramics, industrial machinery, beverages and pharmaceuticals.



Non-Governmental Organizations


THE KEY PRIVATE GROUPS THAT ENHANCE THE REACH OF BUSINESS LEADERS

MISSION

The mission of the Business Improvement District of Coral Gables is to promote the commercial vitality of Miracle Mile and Downtown Coral Gables through the implementation of marketing and advocacy programs. This collective organization of property owners and merchants position the downtown as the center of culture and commerce in Coral Gables.

SUMMARY

The Business Improvement District of Coral Gables was founded in 1997 as a special taxing district bound by Le Jeune Road on the west, Douglas Road on the east, Aragon Avenue on the north and Andalusia Avenue on the south. Using funds from the special assessments paid by property owners in this area (typically passed on to the merchant tenants), the BID markets the downtown as a destination for shopping, dining and experiencing the unique smalltown feel of an area comprising mostly owner-occupied shops, with a limited number of national chains. The BID also advocates with local and state government for the needs of their member merchants. Among their various programs are events that bring people into the downtown area. While many of these have been curtailed by the pandemic, all are expected to return in the coming year.

PROGRAMS/SERVICES

WEBSITE FOR MERCHANTS

The BID maintains a comprehensive website with a directory of merchants by categories such as Arts & Culture, Beauty, Bridal, etc., including more than 92 restaurants and coffee shops. The site also features a calendar of events and marketing resources for small businesses.

WEEKLY NEWSLETTER

The BID sends out a weekly newsletter to residents alerting the 26K subscribers to special deals and promotions offered by shops and restaurateurs in the district.

GIRALDA UNDER THE STARS

During the cooler winter months, the BID hosts a monthly Giralda Under the Stars event on Giralda Plaza, consisting of a band performing at the east end of the plaza, and sponsors who offer free samples of drinks in several locations on the Plaza.

FAMILY EVENTS

The BID organizes family-oriented events on Miracle Mile (usually at McBride Plaza) and on Giralda Plaza, encouraging families to bring kids downtown for outdoor movies, magic shows and art classes.

HALLOWEEN

The BID hosts a downtown Halloween event, so kids in costume can trick or treat in the shops, attend spooky museum events and story time at Books & Books. The BID organizes the street with themed vignettes and supplies the candy and the visuals to the businesses.

MUSIC ON THE MILE

Over multiple weekends in the winter season the BID engages musicians to play at street corners on Miracle Mile. New performances will have temporary seating near the performers.

RESTAURANT WEEK

Usually scheduled for June, this event showcases local restaurants with promotional and culinary events. Special deals and discounts on menus are offered for diners who participate.

WINDOW IMAGES

The BID dresses up vacant storefronts with photo montages of local flora and fauna that are applied to the windows. QR codes allow visitors to experience the animals and the flowers of South Florida and learn about their local environment.

CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS

In partnership with the city, the BID dresses up Miracle Mile and Giralda Plaza during the Holiday season with a giant Christmas tree, bulbs, lights and wreaths that welcome visitors to the Downtown.

ART ON THE MILE

The BID continues to identify working artists for Pop-Up opportunities on Miracle Mile, a wonderful way to fill empty stores with activity that will attract visitors for interactive programs and personal engagement.

MISSION

Celebrating 30 years, the Coral Gables Community Foundation works to foster initiatives that enhance the quality of life for people who live, work, learn and play in Coral Gables. The Foundation is at the forefront of Coral Gables' evolving needs by bringing together benefactors and beneficiaries to fund programs with the greatest impact and benefit to The City Beautiful.

SUMMARY

Founded in 1991, The Coral Gables Community Foundation is the city's principle platform for channeling charitable donations to worthy causes in the arts, education and small business. Since its inception, it has donated nearly \$10 million to worthy causes throughout the community. The Community Foundation serves as the steward of more than 80 Donor-Advised Funds that improve the community. In the past year the Foundation has launched Support Surfside efforts; previously it provided free meals daily for eight weeks to home-bound seniors and the unemployed during the height of the pandemic. The Foundation also donated computers for those in need of home schooling or remote work stations during the pandemic. The Foundation is known for hosting two signature fund raising events each year, the Tour of Kitchens and the Biltmore Ball. It is also proud of bringing the Umbrella Sky to Giralda Plaza in 2018, creating a social media sensation and doubling foot traffic for restaurants there.

PROGRAMS

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

The Foundation sets up charitable funds for donors, then manages the investment and distribution of the funds. The donor requests disbursement to their favorite charities, while the Foundation manages the back end. They have more than 80 ongoing funds.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Foundation manages 12 different scholarship programs. Eight are managed for third parties (local families and organizations), while the remaining four are used to distribute funds raised by the foundation's board and through its annual events.

COMMUNITY GIVING

Twice each year, in the fall and in the spring, the foundation gives cash grants to local non-profits that serve Coral Gables directly or indirectly. These range from the Lighthouse for the Blind to local schools in need of laptops for underprivileged students.

THE TOUR OF KITCHENS

Each spring the Foundation organizes a full-day tour of kitchens in local homes. The kitchens are in the homes of volunteers, with food served by local restaurants, and funds going toward the foundation's educational programs.

THE BILTMORE BALL

Each fall the Foundation organizes a grand black-tie ball with a theme (one year it was the Beatles invasion, another it was a Cirque

A Guide to the "Smart City"

Coral Gables continues to be a national leader in smart city technology. Last year the Center for Digital Government awarded the Gables its top honor for innovative technologies in U.S. cities with 75,000 or fewer residents. Likewise, the Smart Cities Connect Foundation named Coral Gables No. 1 for Urban Infrastructure in its "Smart 50 Awards." This year the city was named the top-performing U.S. organization in the Open Cities Index (OCI). Under the direction of Chief Innovation Officer Raimundo Rodulfo, the wired city continues to offer a wealth of information to businesses through its website and apps, especially via its Smart City Hub (www.coralgables.com/smartcity). Here are brief descriptions of Smart City Hub resources:

TRANSPARENCY PORTALS

Via these financial and public information dashboards and graphs, businesses can request and search for public records on city revenues and expenditures, capital improvement projects, city lobbyists, city contracts, scheduled permit inspections, and more. When its new enterprise software is fully installed next year, the status of all city permits will be visible in real time.

CITIZEN ENGAGEMENT

This section of the city's website is designed to facilitate communication between citizens and the municipal government. It includes connections to the police department, links for public input, information on sustainability programs, maps of city points of interest, and signups for enews and city programs.

APP STORE

The Coral Gables App Store allows users to download the city's Mobile App, which lets users check for such things as available parking, public transportation routes and locations, where to dine and shop, and a slew of FAQs on everything from permitting to recycling to where to file complaints. www.coralgables.com/cityapp.

eGOV CITY SERVICES

Here businesses can apply for and pay for licenses, certificates of use, invoices, permits and leases; pay a stormwater bill or special assessment; register as a city vendor; or pay for a parking permit renewal. It also includes information on the city's zoning code (by parcel, as well), city employees and registered lobbyists.

OPEN DATA

The city offers a dozen free open data sources that provide information on such things as the city's tree canopy and government financial transparency. For businesses, the Open Business Data portal is the most useful, with information on requirements to start a business, city properties for sale or lease, demographic data, business workshops, and links to the Chamber of Commerce and the Downtown Business Improvement District (BID)

INTERNET OF THINGS

Sensors in downtown Coral Gables that track pedestrian and vehicle traffic provide retailers and marketing analysts with real-time information. For example, block-by-block foot traffic on Giralda Plaza, and vehicle and foot traffic on Miracle Mile and at various intersections, can be invaluable in planning retail strategies.

GIS (GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SCIENCE)

The "science of where" integrates data and maps to provide businesses with an array of information, including WiFi locations, EV charging site locations, street light locations, bicycle routes, and WAZE traffic activity.

COMMUNITY INTELLIGENCE CENTER

Businesses are invited to join residents on this platform, designed in part for community initiatives and collaborations – for example, in Smart City competitions seeking solutions to transportation and traffic challenges. It is also designed to supply real time date on traffic.

GABLES-BASED ORGANIZATIONS THAT HELP GET BUSINESSES OFF THE GROUND



Coral Gables is one of the great U.S. municipalities for small businesses, frequently ranked at the top of surveys of small cities conducive to new startups. The reasons are copious, ranging from the profusion of inexpensive, shared workspaces to a culture that encourages small businesses, independent professionals and, more importantly, high-tech enterprises that rely more on brain than brawn.

The city is home to a number of organizations that assist startups with funding and mentorship; even its shared workspaces, such as The Forum, offer ongoing lecture series and programs to educate budding entrepreneurs. The city itself, through its Department of Economic Development, has been enormously supportive of small businesses. After a survey revealed that 63 percent of small businesses were unprepared for online

commerce during the pandemic, it created a series of "virtual bootcamps" to address such things as how to set up secure consumer websites and optimize that site for search engines.

"The city is now a Google partner, which means we have access to webinars that Google puts out," says Belkys Perez, who hosted seven of the online tutorials. The city also went out of its way to make sure that, during the pandemic, 60 small businesses were granted \$15,000 each to help pay their rent. High-tech instruction and incubators aside, one of the great attributes of the city as a bastion of small enterprises is the business culture created by the Chamber of Commerce and the downtown Business Improve-

ment District (BID), both of which encourage a co-mingling of ideas and resources.

"One big thing that is useful [for new, small businesses] is industry-based connections, which come through the Chamber and the BID," says Nick Sharp, who launched first his successful ThreeFold Café on Giralda Plaza, and has since launched Bay 13, an elegant, sprawling craft brewery and restaurant on Alhambra Circle. "The organizations in themselves are great, but it's the events you attend, so that you can share resources and experiences – like how to navigate the city in terms of basic operations... Information sharing between businesses is really, really helpful, and the Chamber is really good at that."

For that reason and others, Coral Gables remains a petri dish for new small businesses, both low and high tech, many of them growing into regional, national and even multinational enterprises. "For us, entrepreneurship is the cornerstone of economic development," says Andrea Torres, former head of strategic partnerships and marketing for Endeavor Miami.

What follows are a few of the organizations designed to help entrepreneurs.

ENDEAVOR MIAMI

Endeavor is a nonprofit that helps startups grow in emerging markets. It started in Latin America more than two decades ago and Endeavor Miami, the first U.S. affiliate, came to the Gables in 2013. By focusing on emerging markets, the idea is to create a community of entrepreneurs that will encourage other startups in those area. "Eighty percent of entrepreneurs [in Argentina] can be linked back to Endeavor ... that's exactly what we want to curate in Miami," says Andrea Torres, former head of strategic partnerships and marketing for Endeavor Miami.

Endeavor looks for high-impact companies, where founders can become future mentors and future funders. Another criterion is scalability; they want to support ongoing startups that can generate the most jobs and revenue. Their ScaleUp Program is a four-month acceleration program for companies that are at least three years old with a minimum of 20 percent compound annual growth rate CAGR. Their EdeavorLAB Program is a two-month accelerated program designed to support local early-stage companies currently using Endeavor's mentorship and peer support for growth, with a focus on women and minority founders.

Endeavor Miami currently has a portfolio of 22 companies led by 38 high-impact entrepreneurs. According to Torres, those 22 companies have created over 3,000 jobs and \$250 million in revenue in Miami.

EMERGE AMERICAS

Founded by Gables serial entrepreneur Manny Medina, eMerge Americas aims to transform Greater Miami into the hub for technology and innovation in the Americas. "eMerge Americas is a platform that connects the dots between startups, investors, government officials, higher-education institutions and corporate enterprises all for one objective: To spur investment in South Florida and Latin America and to help create a sustainable and thriving tech hub of the Americas in South Florida," says eMerge Americas' COO Diane Vidoni.

Gables-based eMerge Americas hosts an annual tech confer-

ence which gathers over 16,000 attendees and over 100 different start-ups from all over the world. Startups that are selected to compete at the showcase pitch their ideas in front of investors and corporate partners. Three different categories enter the competition: The university track, the early-stage track, and the later-stage track. Key components include a clear problem/need being served; if the team has the knowledge, skills and passion needed; and if financials are solid and show a strong return – except for the university track where they expect little return.

"Coral Gables was an easy choice [to locate eMerge], as it offers easy access to all of the Miami and South Florida market, in addition to great office space options, exceptional restaurants and an overall community feeling," says Vidoni.

OUTLIERS INSTITUTE

On Tuesday or Wednesday evenings the Coral Gables Museum becomes an interactive classroom. This is Outliers Institute, a new Gables business school for startups. "We have a core curriculum, but we layer in guest speakers who talk about their experiences," says Wayne Eldred, the proprietor and ringmaster of the non-profit academy. "My class is full of business leaders, owners, managers – it's really an immersive incubation to learn how to overcome challenges."

LAUNCH PAD

Launch Pad is a free, on-campus service for students, alumni and faculty who want to start businesses. Since its inception in 2008, over 500 companies have been created through Launch Pad, with two thirds of them making it past the five-year mark. Two of those companies are The Salty Donut, which has locations in Wynwood and South Miami, and House of Per'La, a coffee processor with a shop on Almeria Avenue. Through Launch Pad, entrepreneurs affiliated with UM can participate in one-on-one counseling, mentorship programs, and comprehensive workshops. Entrepreneurs can also utilize free co-working space, a resource library, and events and lectures. Launch Pad Director Brian Breslin sees his incubator as a vital tool to develop what he calls "a ton of intellectual property and talent" associated with UM. "Miami is a very young and malleable city and as a first-generation Miamian, I'm happy that this is happening. I think this is good for the locals, the overall ecosystem, the universities, and all the Miami institutions," he says.


WALLACE H. COULTER CENTER FOR TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH

The Wallace H. Coulter Center for Translational Research supports transforming biomedical science and engineering research into products. A committee of executives, investors and entrepreneurs looks at the most promising projects and selects a few each year to receive funding and development support. "There's been \$4.9 million in project expenditures and those technologies have gotten over \$500 million in follow up funding over the years," says Dr. Norma Kenyon, Vice Provost of Innovation for the University of Miami and Chief Innovation Officer of the Leonard M. THE STARTUP CLINIC

Another free service is The Startup Clinic, which was launched in 2016 by Dan Ravicher, a former law school professor. The clinic connects UM law students with new entrepreneurial clients needing legal assistance for issues that arise as they launch and grow their businesses. "In essence, we're like a boutique law firm that represents entrepreneurs," said Ravicher. "Entrepreneurs have lots of transac-

tional corporate securities and intellectual property needs and we will do all of those." The Startup Clinic receives at least 100 applications every month, most sourced through the students, out of which they work with around 50 clients a year.

The 'Cane Angel Network was launched in mid-March 2020 to bring together the extended UM network to support the growth of startups. The 'Cane Angel Network extends farther than just UM students, alumni and faculty; it also includes direct family members of students and alumni. "It's really meant to capture the broad UM community," says Dr. Norma Kenyon, Vice Provost of Innovation for UM. "So, if you are a member of that community, your startup can apply to the network for funding. If you are a member of that community and you qualify as an investor by IRS regulations, you can be an angel." Start-Up criteria includes having a founder, executive, or board member who is a UM alumnus, employee student or parent, a raising of early stage equity capital, and a location in the US. Investor criteria includes being a UM alumnus, employee student or parent.

A Return to the Downtown

Prior to the Covid sending employees home to work remotely, some 50,000 workers commuted daily to Coral Gables, filling its array of mid-rise Class A office buildings (all of which are capped at 16 stories high). Those high occupancy rates predictably slipped during the pandemic, but the good news is that workers are coming back, and office occupancy is again on the rise – as are rental rates.

According to various surveys, about half of all workers want to come back to the office, for the personal relationships they have with colleagues, as well as the desire to be more productive and more creative through those interactions with other workers. About a quarter want to continue working some days from home – creating a 'hybrid' work model – while a final quarter want to continue working from home.

Partly for these reasons, office vacancies in the Gables rose from 9 percent up to about 17 percent, according to figures supplied by Avison Young. Another reason was the addition of more than a half million new square feet of office space, mostly via new office buildings at The Plaza project on Ponce Circle.

"The combination of a slowdown and new deliveries made our vacancy rate skyrocket," says Donna Abood, a leading commercial realtor with Avison Young. While the increase in vacancy does not look good at first blush, the current activity for new leases in the City Beautiful "is amazing," says Abood. "What's making it look bad is the new space." Indeed, says Abood, commercial rental rates are actually rising rather than falling, thanks to out-of-state businesses – in particular high-tech and fin-tech companies – moving not just to the Gables, but to all of greater Miami.

While the offices are back open, with the return of 50 to 60

percent of office workers, one reason that companies have not drastically cut their space requirements is because office layouts are being redesigned post-pandemically, with more space between desks and work areas. Abood predicts that vacancy rates will drop over the next 12 months, leveling off by summer 2022. "We got spoiled working from home," says Abood. "It was too comfortable not to get up and commute."

Regardless of how the mix of working at home vs. working at the office sorts itself out, commercial realtors see strong demand for Class A product in coming months. "We have emerged as a highly desirable location due to the pandemic," says Thad Adams of the Allen Morris Company. "Many top executives have relocated to residences down here. Now we are getting calls for office space near their new homes," he says.

Adams notes that Coral Gables has always been one of the stronger commercial submarkets in Miami-Dade County, thanks to the clustering of multinationals here, the proximity to the airport and its safe, walkable environment. Those elements remain strong, and "Going into the third and fourth quarters this year, there will be pent-up demand from all the companies that hit the pause button [during the pandemic]," he says. "We are looking to see a reemergence of the absorption of office space."

Adams predicts that interest in office space will rise in tandem with the percentage of people who get vaccinated. "While home working is here to stay, the surveys show that workers only want to work at home a few days a week, not five days a week. The office is not gone, but it is being redefined. Essential relationships between employees cannot be conducted remotely."





Flexible Space

A GUIDE TO COWORKING SPACES OFFERED IN THE GABLES

They are known as flex spaces or shared office spaces or coworking spaces, and Coral Gables has more of them per capita than any other city in Florida. The concept is simple and efficient: an office complex configured into a variety of smaller spaces, with short term leases and shared facilities, such as kitchens, conference rooms and office support equipment. They can accommodate anything from a tiny startup to a division of a major corporation. They offer low costs and flexibility, and in the post-pandemic world of shrinking office footprints and hybrid work patterns, they are more in demand than ever. WeWork, for example, provides everything from simple access to shared, open workspaces (tables) for individual entrepreneurs with their laptops, to several floors it currently rents to a 215-person division of telecom giant Millicom.

While WeWork was among the first national brands to popularize the concept, they are becoming the new normal in the business world. In Coral Gables, co-working spaces have blossomed, many created by smaller firms that offer unique configurations for companies, from start-ups to multinationals.

"It's really about flexibility, and about reducing your footprint," says Rishi Kapoor, whose firm Location Ventures launched Forum on Alhambra Circle last year. "Companies just don't want to commit to long-term leases if they don't have to." Besides the standard amenities, Kapoor's Forum provides businesses support services such as marketing and accounting, as well as education forums for entrepreneurs.

Shared workspaces also benefit the growth of the business community by offering low-cost entry points for start-ups that want to be based in the Gables. "I love that we have these spaces here because Coral Gables does not allow home-based businesses," says Mark Trowbridge, president and CEO of the Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce. "If you're not ready to go from the germination of an idea to a fully fleshed-out business, this gives you a runway to do that. I think people will always value a Coral Gables business address."

Besides providing a local address, coworking spaces have other benefits that businesses can't get from traditional office space without making substantial investments – such as access to state-of-the-art technologies in communications and data storage.

Since there are so many coworking spaces to choose from in the Gables, it comes down to which is best for your business model. Some, like Office Edge, cater to small businesses that are already established; others, like Pipeline, are entrepreneurial-focused; still others are hybrids. "We have some creative and some tech [firms], but our soft spot is professional firms in law and finance," says Laura Kozelouzek, CEO and founder of Quest Workspaces. Taking that specialization one step further is Esq. Suites, which focuses entirely on lawyers.

The move away from traditional office space to flex space has, of course, been accelerated by the coronavirus. With many companies realizing that working remotely is possible, some are looking to downsize offices and move into shared workspaces. "Companies with long term agreements are much more desirable to get into short term situations, say six months instead of three years, to be able to scale up or scale down at a later time," says Phillipe Houdard, founder and CEO of Pipeline. "This flexibility is very important and

One of the more recent additions to the Coral Gables coworking scene, Forum is a collaborative environment with a kitchen, lounge, and conference rooms of varying sizes. It is on the first floor of its Alhambra Circle location, so feels grounded. Their conference rooms include "Parley," their smallest for four people at 100 square feet, "Roundtable" with 50 additional square feet, and "Council," a large space that sits eight to 10 people at 300 square feet.

The Forum spaces are rented as memberships, starting at \$350/ month for the "nomads" who just need a space to work. All include meeting room credits, printing room credits, amenities like networking events and seminars, and services like high speed internet and consulting services. For \$500 a month, "reserved desks" provide a small, lockable space to work. And starting at \$800 monthly, business owners can have a private suite for one, two or more workers. For those who don't need workspace, there is a virtual membership starting at \$95 per month, and the Access membership at \$150 a month, which includes all the benefits of virtual membership along with bi-monthly workspace access, programming, and business support.

The Forum is also located in the office building/headquarters of owner Venture Locations, which houses numerous business support services, such as marketing, accounting, graphics, legal, web design, etc. These are available to clients on an à la carte basis.

With two locations in downtown Coral Gables, Quest offers turn-key private offices that come with a number of amenities, such as garage parking, administrative support, unlimited coffee, access to a gym, and networking and wellness events, starting at \$500 per month. All you have to do is focus on growing your business. When you need more space than a private office, you can purchase a monthly meeting room package, priced at \$149 for five hours, \$249 for 10 hours and \$449 for 20 hours.

While some of its clients are small tech and design firms, most provide professional services. For this reason, their individual offices are walled and private, with little "open architecture" or glass walls. If you don't want a physical office in one of their Gables locations, Quest offers virtual services. For that desired Gables business address, a mailbox costs \$99 per month and includes administrative assistance, discounts on meeting rooms and day offices, and, most importantly, complimentary café use. For another \$50, entrepreneurs can add a phone plan that includes a local phone number, calls answered in the company's name and call forwarding.

PIPELINE

Pipeline is a flexible workspace designed to attract small, creative companies, both startups and more established businesses. It has an edgy vibe, with everything from shared "flex space" (open your laptop and start working in any open space), to "dedicated desks," which means a tiny, one-person room, to private office suites for up to six people. Most of the space is separated by glass walls, for a modern, futuristic feel. More than 200 small companies call it home, 50 of them in private suites.

The \$199 monthly flex space membership is optimal for individuals or teams who don't need to leave items overnight. The



smallest monthly lockable space – the "dedicated desk" – goes for \$449 monthly. Pricing for private suites starts at \$649 per month. Private offices vary in size and can accommodate up to six people.

Pipeline also offers virtual offices for \$99/month, for that coveted Gables address, local phone number and access to conference rooms and receptionist services. The office space is open 24/7, so tenants, both virtual and physical, can work whenever. And if you're working 24/7, at least there's gourmet coffee.

One of the best-known workspaces is WeWork, with two locations in downtown Gables: One on Giralda Avenue and the other next door on the corner of Giralda and Ponce de Leon. Both locations have common areas, meeting rooms, lecture events, Wi-Fi, phone booths for a quiet place to take a call, and kitchens stocked with cutlery, cups and condiments. 255 Giralda has additional amenities like a wellness room, a bike storage rack and outdoor balcony and rooftop space where you can have coffee or lunch – or even squeeze in a quick yoga practice.

The main difference between the two locations is pricing, with the newer and more expansive 255 Giralda location slightly more expensive. There are three different types of workspaces in both locations: "Hot Desks" for the solo entrepreneur, with access to vacant desks in common areas (\$340 vs. \$425); Dedicated Desks in shared, lockable offices (\$520 vs. \$680); and private offices (\$1200 vs. \$1,380 for two persons). You can also purchase a day pass in a co-working space for \$29 a day or a conference room from \$10 an hour.

WeWork prides itself on its mix of larger, established firms that want a shared, interactive environment (Kayak, Millicom) with smaller entrepreneurs and startups.

ESQ.SUITES

With the doubtful return to water cooler gatherings or office life in general, what will law firms look like for the rest of 2021 and beyond? That is the question posed – and answered – by ESQ.suites, a shared workspace for lawyers and legal professionals only. Located

on the 15th floor of what is arguably the most prestigious office building in the city – The Alhambra Tower – Esq. Suites has a litigation war room, multiple conference rooms and a parking garage for tenants and visitors. It also has 23 suites with stunning views, which they offer starting at \$1,250 per month.

If you are looking for something less permanent, virtual office packages are available, where you can also have access to the conference rooms for \$50-\$100 per hour. Launched just three years ago, the idea here is for easy networking within the legal profession, including cross-specialty referrals.

Regus is one of the oldest and best-known brands in coworking spaces, founded in Belgium in 1989 to provide "serviced offices," business lounges and conferencing facilities. It has two locations in downtown Gables: one in the Colonnade building and the other in the penthouse of Columbus Center off Alhambra. Both locations have office spaces for teams, coworking spaces for individuals, and virtual office memberships. Combined, Regus has 148 private offices, 18 coworking desks and six meeting rooms. Private office space starts at \$799 per month and a virtual office starts at \$267 per month. There is also the co-working option beginning at \$329 a month which provides offices for a specific number of days per month; the bang here is that clients have access to Regus offices for the day anywhere in their extensive international network.

A boutique provider of turn-key executive suites, private offices and meeting rooms, Office Edge has served business owners, attorneys, accountants and other professionals since 2002 from The Collection Building on Ponce and Bird Road. The airy 8,800 sq. ft. space features 22 furnished offices with a choice of sizes and views, well-equipped conference rooms seating up to 16, a dedicated mailroom with keyed access to private mailboxes, and a complete kitchen. A full-service business center is staffed by in-house administrative professionals, including live receptionists, bookkeepers, certified paralegals and certified court reporters. Service packages and pricing are fully customized to meet each client's unique needs. Private offices start at \$700 monthly. Work-at-Home virtual service packages range from \$160 to \$175 monthly. There is ample garage and street parking, with easy access to the Shops at Merrick Park, international restaurants, boutique hotels and other area amenities.

Founded in 2010, Platinum Business Center is located in the North Gables business corridor in a modern, state-of-the-art office tower, occupying a total of 12,000 square feet. Clients share a reception area where calls are answered in the company name, with a coffee/tea break room and conference rooms of various size. Platinum Business Center also has three virtual office plans: The virtual office plan, which includes address, mailbox



and access to business center services (\$75 monthly); the gold plan, which adds a business line and call answering (\$175 monthly); and the platinum plan, which adds break room access, meeting room hours, docking station hours and private office use hours (\$275 monthly).

Standard services include reception, answering service, mail and package handling, conference room, and furnished offices for between one and four persons. Among its amenities is access to a wide balcony with seating overlooking the city, dry cleaning services, and freshly brewed coffee, tea, etc. You can lease office space for price ranges between \$500 to \$1500 per month. There's easy parking for tenants and guests in the building, and it's walking distance to a Publix and Miracle Mile shops and restaurants.

Intended for the work needs of independent professionals, tech start-ups, and teams from both small and large businesses, BizNest offers private suites, dedicated desks, and flex spaces for any kind of work style, from those well established to more flexible ones.

Starting at \$550 a month, this is the best option for those who wish to work with the most privacy. Dedicated desks begin at \$300 a month, and include an individual desk where you can set up your own computer and personal items, while also including lockable storage and whiteboard. The flex space option allows clients to come in and sit at any desk or outside work space for \$99 per month. This is the most convenient option for startups with limited resources. All that is needed is a laptop; the coffee is free!

PROGRAMS IN AND AROUND CORAL GABLES

For many in the business community, returning to school for an advanced business degree provides a path to career advancement – as well as a sharper business brain. Fortunately for Gables residents and professionals, you don't have to uproot your life to pursue a post-graduate business degree. During the downtime of the pandemic, there has been

a renewed interest in graduate programs. "MBA programs are a little bit countercyclical, meaning when there is a downturn in the economy, people go back to school," says Dr. Henrik Cronqvist, vice dean of graduate business programs and executive education at UM's Herbert Business School. Here are some of the best programs available.

UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI

The Miami Herbert Business School has several MBA programs. The full-time MBA program, which has been in existence for over 70 years, is a two-year (21-month) program. It is ranked among the top 50 such programs in the country. There is also a seven-month accelerated program and an 18-month accelerated MBA in real estate.

The latter is tailored to fully employed healthcare professionals who are seeking leadership positions in the industry.

The Miami Herbert Business School also offers specialized master's programs where you can earn your degree in less than a

year. These programs are offered in accountancy, taxation, business analytics, finance, health administration, international business, leadership and, most recently, sustainable business. They are designed for undergrads who do not yet have a lot of real-world experience but who want to specialize in one particular field.

Another perk of pursuing a business degree at UM is the alumni network throughout the Gables and beyond, an important source for career advancement and employment. Tuition is \$2,170 per credit hour, so the overall cost varies per program. Visit bus.miami. edu for more information.

KELLOGG SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT AT NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY

Northwestern University has a satellite campus in downtown Coral Gables that offers an executive MBA degree. According to their website, the Chicago-based university chose a campus in Coral Gables because "the city is bustling with global commerce, attracting corporations from around the world and serving as a bridge between the United States and Latin America."



The Miami EMBA offers the same rigorous curriculum as the Chicago program, with high quality faculty and the same access to their global campus network. Designed so that non-Miami residents can earn a degree through the program, classes meet only once a month from Thursday to Sunday afternoon. With campus just four miles from Miami International Airport at 95 Merrick Way, traveling business students are put up in the Hyatt Regency Coral Gables. The program also allows students to travel to the Evanston campus in Chicago – or any other campus – to take elective courses not offered in the Gables. Classrooms are equipped with the latest technology and the "campus" has private study rooms, conference areas and lounges.

The Miami EMBA program has two start dates: In September and January. The annual tuition cost is currently \$108,918, bringing the two-year total to \$217,836. This includes courses, books and supplies, meals, accommodation at the Hyatt, career services and a lifelong access to elective courses on an auditing basis. The full-time international MBA is a 12-month program with classes Monday through Friday. Depending on the year, 30 to 50 percent of the students in this program are international, and the demographic skews younger than other MBA programs designed for professionals.

The executive MBA program, for example, is 16 months long and geared toward those with 12 to 15 years of experience in the workforce. These "students" may be division managers, or senior executives, in search of a broader perspective.

The trend lately, however, is the specialized master's programs. They're popular because they are shorter, less expensive and more focused on one specific area. FIU has nine different specialized master's degrees, including ones in health information and analytics, finance and accounting. Among the strongest is the master's in real estate.

The Chapman Graduate School of Business is recognized both nationally and internationally for its graduate programs. The online MBA program was #3 in the U.S. in 2020 and the master's in marketing program was #6 in the U.S. in 2019, according to QS World University Rankings. In 2020, the international MBA program was ranked eighth and the online master's in business program was ranked 22nd by U.S. News & World Report.

Tuition varies per program and ranges from \$14,315 to \$52,000 for Florida residents. For more information, visit business.fiu.edu. ■



Housing Trends

Coral Gables is known for single-family houses with leafy canopies and ample lawns. But a new residential option is gaining traction: luxury townhomes and house-size condos, especially for empty-nesters and new arrivals from cities in New York and California.

The trend is clear in the success of two Coral Gables-based developers: Rishi Kapoor of Location Ventures and Alirio Torrealba of MG Developer, who both have deluxe projects selling now and plans for even bigger ones.

Kapoor is developing Villa Valencia, a 13-story condo building downtown with 39 units selling for an average \$2.5 million each. He expects to start delivering units in December 2021, provided supplies are not too delayed by Covid bottlenecks. As of summer, about 60 percent of the units were sold at an average price of \$1,000 per square foot, "a new record for condos in Coral Gables," says Kapoor.

"And we're exploring a sequel larger than Villa Valencia," says Kapoor. He's considering a 17-floor building with similar luxury

features, from high-end appliances to a resort-style pool, spa and conference room. "There is a market for people who want to be in the Gables, who want great amenities and who want nothing but the best finishes. That's led me to target a project twice in scale."

Torrealba is completing Biltmore Square, comprising more than 55 luxury residences at an investment topping \$80 million. Next up for delivery: Five grand townhomes at Althea Row, named for the mother of Gables founder George Merrick. Each three-story unit spans more than 7,000 square feet, with four bedrooms, a four-car garage and high-end appliances, among other amenities. The price: about \$4 million each.

By summer 2021, three of the five units were sold, fetching almost \$900 per square and setting a new record for townhomes in the city, Torrealba says. He also is developing 10 more townhomes at adjacent Biltmore Row, where prices on four- or five -bedroom units are expected to start at around \$3.3 million.

Torrealba is already planning his next big venture: Gables Village, a mix of townhomes, duplexes and condos that could add 50 units near the Coral Gables branch library by 2024. The new residences would sit on 17 lots that his company aims to buy for roughly \$20 million. Those lots now have older one- and two-story houses or apartment buildings on them.

"Coral Gables founder George Merrick was a big proponent of



villages, from the French to the Chinese," says the Venezuela-born developer. "We want to build on his legacy with Gables Village, offering a variety of options for residents. The condos at 1,200-squarefeet can appeal to younger professionals."

single-family houses in Coral Gables, fueled in part by the coronavirus pandemic. Covid prompted many families to seek more space to work and study, both inside their homes and in private outdoor areas. With limited inventory in the city, prices for houses have been skyrocketing.

"Any house we list ends up selling, often in a few days, and often for more than the asking price, in a kind of bidding war," says Patrick O'Connell, senior vice president of real-estate Berkshire Hathaway HomeServices EWM Realty, which is based in Coral Gables.

Headlines show the strength of the market for houses. Salsa singer Marc Anthony sold his 12-bedroom mansion in May 2021 for \$22.4 million, three years after buying it for \$19 million. Real estate developer R. Donahoe Peebles sold his 10-bedroom estate in

December 2020 for \$13 million, after a \$1 million upgrade. Peebles had purchased it for \$5.4 million in 2004, records show.

The Elliman Report, prepared for real-estate company Douglas Elliman, shows the inventory of houses shrinking. Coral Gables had about 1.5 months of supply in the second quarter 2021, down from 10.5-month supply a year earlier. The average price for houses sold in the city that quarter: \$2.27 million.

"Many people look for a single-family house first, but when they realize the price has increased significantly and the inventory is so low, they turn to multi-family homes," says O'Connell. "We're seeing a lot of New Yorkers and Californians looking for these large townhome or condo units, with walkability. And they're unfazed by prices at \$800 per square foot, coming from New York City or Silicon Valley." His firm currently handles townhouse sales at Althea Row and Biltmore Row, and at Merrick Manor, a high-end condo mid-rise near the Shops at Merrick Park.

Also fueling luxury townhomes and condos: a decade-old Coral Gables zoning update that lets developers build closer to the street, provided they offer access for parking through an alley or driveway in the back. The idea is to encourage urban townhomes like those in Boston, Charleston and New York, with doors in front and not cars. The townhomes help create a visual link between single-family houses in more suburban areas to more vertical apartment towers on the city's busy thoroughfares. MG Developer's proposed Gables Village would have all its parking inside the complex, for instance. "This helps make parking and traffic more orderly and makes the area more walkable," says Torrealba.

EMPTY-NESTERS AND ARRIVALS FROM NEW YORK, CALIFORNIA, LATIN AMERICA

So far, most of the buyers of the new luxury townhomes and condos are locals from the greater Gables area, many of whom have decided to sell their large houses after their children moved out. They no longer want to maintain a lawn, garden and private pool; instead, they seek to easily lock their door to take off traveling.

Kapoor estimates locals – mainly from the Gables, Coconut Grove, South Miami, Miami Beach and Key Biscayne – make up 65 percent of buyers at his Villa Valencia, most of them empty-nesters. "There's a peace of mind of not having to take care of a large house and a large yard," says Kapoor.

A small percentage of buyers come directly from overseas,

though the portion of foreign buyers in South Florida has declined in recent years, partly because coronavirus has made travel difficult. So far, Kapoor says two families from Mexico are among buyers at his 515 Valencia Ave. condo building. "We expect that overseas demographic to pick up, as Latin Americans make plans to come back to the United States and buy," he says. The timing will depend in part on how fast vaccines are rolled out across Latin America and when travel restrictions ease, say experts in international business.

Further revving up sales since 2020: transplants from the U.S. Northeast and U.S. West Coast, who realized while working remotely during Covid that they could be just as productive elsewhere. They've moved to South Florida for lower taxes, a business-friendly climate, warm weather and a home with more bang for the buck. And they've chosen the affluent, well-planned Gables for its central location, proximity to Miami International Airport and abundance of restaurants, shops, schools and amenities.

So far, Kapoor estimates U.S. transplants make up about 25 percent of buyers at Villa Valencia. At Torrealba's Althea Row, all three of the buyers to date come from other parts of the United States. "We never expected buyers from outside the area," says Torrealba. "Our target market has been people moving from houses in Gables Estates or Cocoplum. But since our type of product might fetch \$8 million in Boston or \$11 million in New York, people moving to the Gables see great value at our price point."

The boost from out-of-town buyers has real estate executives especially buoyant. "The long-term trend for Coral Gables is up," says BHHS/EWM's O'Connell. "I fully expect demand for luxury real-estate in the Gables to grow." – *Doreen Hemlock*

Permitting & Business Licensing

IN CORAL GABLES, THE PROCESS FOR NEW BUSINESSES AND NEW CONSTRUCTION PERMITS CAN BE COMPLEX, BUT IT IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY TRANSPARENT AND EASIER TO TRACK



As with any city or unincorporated area in the State of Florida, new businesses must apply for permits in order to operate. This applies to any company, from a professional moving into a high-rise office space to a retailer opening a shop on Miracle Mile.

The simplest thing to acquire is a business permit for a company moving into an office and making no changes, either in the type of business being practiced or in the physical location. From there it becomes more complex, with added requirements for change of use and/or for

modifications to the physical site, especially exterior changes. The most complex process is for a business that requires a new building; the larger the project, the more hurdles it has to clear.

Sometimes the process of acquiring permits needed to conduct business are straight forward. Other times the flow can move in different directions between departments.

In the end, the art of getting permits for new businesses comes down to two things: understanding the requirements and following those rules; and allocating sufficient time in your business planning cycle to accommodate the process.

"As a professional planner, I can tell you that Coral Gables is no different than other communities you go to," says Julian Perez, director of the Economic Development Department. "There are certain processes that you have to follow." Coral Gables does have stricter codes than most cities, however – one reason it remains a City Beautiful. "The most important thing for [new businesses] that come here is to have either a consulting team or use the team we have in Economic Development, to understand the process," says Perez.

PERMITTING PROCESS FOR NEW BUSINESSES "AS IS"

The simplest permits to acquire are for businesses that require no changes to their space, either office-based businesses that provide professional or administrative services, or retail businesses that find the suitable space, as is, for a similar usage.

For both, a Certificate of Use and a Business Tax License is required, the first from the Zoning Administrator in the Zoning & Planning Department, the second from the Finance Department. With rare exceptions (the need for a new fire inspection, for example, or to re-certify the plumbing work), that's it.

When the business moving in is different from the previous tenant, however, applicants should first check with the Zoning Administrator, or what is known as the Concurrency group in the Development Services Department (Zoning is part of both) to make sure the new use is permissible in that space.

PROCESS FOR NEW BUSINESSES WITH CONSTRUCTION NEEDS (INCLUDING ADDITIONS AND REPAIRS)

Construction of any kind must be reviewed and approved by the Building Division of the Development Services Department, which issues a Building Permit. The City of Coral Gables, like other municipalities in the State of Florida, requires that all provisions of the Florida Building Code be met prior to issuing that permit.

Unlike other Florida cities, however, any new buildings and/ or exterior changes to existing buildings must be approved by the Board of Architects, which reviews the plans to make sure they comply with the aesthetic standards of the city.



Also, unlike most Florida cities, Coral Gables is increasingly transparent in the process, with full online access to the status of any plan reviews and/or inspections available beginning by Q2 2021. Go to www.coralgables.com for information on how to access records in process.

Once construction is complete, and passes inspection, the business receives a Certificate of Occupancy. The business can then get its Certificate of Use and Business Tax License and start to operate.

HOW THE PROCESS IS ORGANIZED

The Development Services Department is the city's umbrella organization for all business permits and licenses. It is broken down into three parts:

PLANNING & ZONING THE BUILDING DIVISION CODE ENFORCEMENT DIVISION

THE PLANNING & ZONING DIVISION

Planning & Zoning is responsible for initial permitting of businesses, as well as making sure that all businesses are in compliance with the city's zoning regulations. In addition to staff who receive applications for business permits – aka Certificates of Use – as well as organize inspections of the premises, the Planning & Zoning Division is comprised of a number of important boards that review plans for new use and construction.

PLANNING & ZONING BOARD

A seven-member quasi-judicial board advisory to the City Commission that meets the second Wednesday of each month to review development applications as required for compliance with zoning regulations, particularly for larger projects that affect things like density, height, contentious uses, land-use amendments, and the right-of-way.

DEVELOPMENT REVIEW COMMITTEE

An administrative and technical committee composed of representatives from Planning and Zoning, Building, Fire, Police, Public Services, Historical Resources, Parking, Public Works and other departments. The DRC is intended to streamline and coordinate the review of the development process. Meets second to last Friday monthly.

BOARD OF ARCHITECTS

A board of seven local architects that meets every Thursday morning to "preserve the traditional aesthetic character of the community" by reviewing applications for construction of new residences and new commercial structures, or exterior changes to these.

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

A seven-member quasi-judicial board that meets on the first Monday of each month. It hears variances and appeals from staff decisions other than the City Architect.

THE BUILDING DIVISION

The Building Division is in charge of the permitting process for any construction, to make sure it is compliant with the Florida Building Code. The Building Division ensures that the construction plans are within code for structural, mechanical, electrical and plumbing elements, as well as in compliance with zoning, fire, historical, public works and other departments as needed. If all passes, then a Building Permit is issued.

THERE ARE SEVERAL TYPES OF APPLICATIONS FOR BUILDING PERMITS

For Interior Changes, the application goes directly to the Building Division for code compliance review. It may need a review for fire, plumbing, electrical, zoning, etc., but in most cases can be approved by the City Architect.

For Exterior Changes and/or Additions, the city requires review and approval by the Board of Architects, to make sure it meets the changes meet the aesthetic standards for the city. Then the plans are reviewed for zoning compliance, followed by review of the structural elements by the Building Division. Other departments are brought in as needed – historical, landscape services and public works for example.

For New Buildings and/or Projects, the city requires the most



comprehensive reviews, encompassing not only aesthetic standards, but those of zoning, building, environmental impact, and public services, such as sewage treatment. The largest projects require approval not only from numerous boards and divisions, but also from the City Commission.

When all changes/construction has been completed, the Building Division provides inspectors for structural, mechanical, electrical, plumbing approvals prior to granted a Certificate of Occupancy for the structure.

The Building Division is also home to the Construction Regulation Board, a five-member board that enforces construction laws, including licensing, building codes, and land development regulations. This board keeps contractors from violating the state building code.

TIMELINI

For minor repairs and upgrades to the electrical, mechanical or plumbing within a building, the permits are normally reviewed in one to two business days.

For new construction projects, additions or exterior alterations,

the process can take between two weeks and a month for plans to be reviewed. It can then take as much as another month for the county agencies DERM (Department of Environmental Resource Management) and WASD (Water and Sewer Department) to review plans.

For large projects that impact entire neighborhoods, or ones that require significant variations from the zoning code and therefore need to be reviewed by the City Commission, permitting may take many months to complete.

DEMOLISHING BUILDINGS

Coral Gables places a high priority on preserving historic buildings. Hence, the demolition of any building requires a review by the Historical Resources and Cultural Arts Department. If considered of historic importance, the demolition must be reviewed by the Historic Preservation Board, a nine-member board which meets on the second Monday of each month. It has the power to designate a building as historic, preventing it from being demolished.



- 4. A new Certificate of Use application, especially for a new type of use, may trigger inspections from building and fire officials, as well as county inspectors from DERM (The Department of Environmental Resources Management)

FOR A NEW, MOVE-IN BUSINESS WITH INTERIOR REMODELING

- 1. Present plans to the Development Services Department
- 2. If they are simple, they will go to the Building Division to review for Building, Electrical, Mechanical, Plumbing, Fire, etc. for review and approval.
- 3. If the plans are extensive and involve a significant change of use, they may go to the DRC (Development Review Committee) as well as Zoning and DERM for approval.
- 4. Perform the work and apply for a Certificate of Occupancy
- 5. Apply for Certificate of Use and Business Tax License
- 6. Move in and open doors for business

FOR A NEW, MOVE-IN BUSINESS WITH EXTERIOR REMODELING/ADDITIONS

- 1. A pre meeting with Zoning Administrator is always advised
- 2. If there is a new use for the space, check with Zoning first
- 3. Present plans to the Board of Architects
- 4. Once approved, submit plans to the Building Division to review for Building, Electrical, Mechanical, Plumbing, Fire, etc.
- If the plans are extensive, they may go to the DRC (Development Review Committee) as well as to Public Works & Landscape, Historic, and the county (DERM) for approval
- 6. Perform the work and apply for a Certificate of Occupancy
- 7. Apply for Certificate of Use and Business Tax License






