

# editor's note



# BENIGN OR BELLIGERENT, NATURE CAN ALWAYS SURPRISE, DELIGHT OR SHOCK US. Anne and Russell Duncan

endured a frightening thunderstorm after moving to their new log home near Huntsville. Secure in the knowledge that their house was protected with lightning rods, they knew this was just another facet of their new life in the country. Earlier, they had had a more unusual encounter with nature – this one involving a reptile.

The white pines that Matt Davidson used to build the couple's Norwegian dovetail log home were harvested in Northern Ontario where the Ministry of Natural Resources takes special precautions to protect threatened species, such as the Blanding's turtle. This slow-moving critter lives in shallow lakes and ponds. Although it moves slowly, it travels farther overland than any other Ontario turtle, sometimes several kilometres between nesting sites and summer habitat. To protect these reptiles, the ministry imposes restrictions on loggers to keep their trucks and skidders from crushing the turtles and disturbing their habitat.

Last spring, construction of the Duncans' new log home had to wait for these reptiles to get out of the way before their pine logs could be harvested and delivered to their master craftsman.

"Believe it or not, at that time there were turtles that were migrating and because the turtles were migrating across the logging area, they were not allowed to get the logs out of the woods," says Anne Duncan. "We had to wait for those turtles." They waited an extra two months for their timbers, but still managed to get their beautiful home finished in just over a year.

As Anne and Russell settle in at their country home, nature is generous with pleasant surprises. White-tailed deer continue to graze among the oaks surrounding the home. A black bear crossed the road, about 100 feet from the house, just days after they moved in. "People joke around about bears, but I never thought I'd actually see one, especially the first week we moved in," Anne says. She bought herself a bear bell. "We live in the country. The odds of us seeing another bear are pretty slim and, quite frankly, I'm not afraid at all, but it is still reality," she says.

## COLOUR






As it was to be just the two of them, plus occasional guests, it was important to keep the size down to a manageable square footage. It would allow them to focus on construction details and finishes. "With a contained size, the fine finishing becomes far more affordable. Better to have less space and better finishings than the other way around," Debi says.


Joe Ball of MPS Engineering drafted plans for the new building and did the engineering. Once they had the basic design in place they decided that because of the traditional style with all its filigree, it needed to "manup," according to Debi. They contacted Denise Adams-Lawrence of West Eden Design, to discuss adding timber frame details to the gothic structure. Denise offered up some stunning truss work to add strength

and weight to the dormers and archways. She even managed to add a traditional carved pineapple, a symbol of welcome, beneath the main truss. Twig panels, reminiscent of the Adirondack camps in upstate New York adorn the outside walls, bringing a rustic, but intricate measure to the house, along with twig webbing and hand-hewn support posts for the decking and porches. All of these rugged details, along with the board and batten exterior wall surface, lend a more masculine feel to the structure.







Debi felt compelled to personally supervise each and every step of the building. For the better part of a year and most often three to four days a week, she was on site to participate in the project.

As an example, she and Steve decided the fireplace was to be a Rumford design, which demands a shallow box, roughly 12 inches deep. But in this case, they wanted a tall opening with shallow depth so that the heat would radiate outward with more intensity. **Felsman Masonry Ltd**. was up for the challenge. They did the research, brought in the appropriate material and executed the design without a hitch. "It turned out exactly as planned and works wonderfully well on those lovely fall and winter days when the fireplace is put to good use," Steve and Debi remark.


The heating system, designed and installed by **Ryman Plumbing and Electrical**, is another remarkable example. It was preordained that home comfort would be managed using a radiant system with water heated by two boilers in the basement control room. The house is warmed with gothic styled, flat black cast iron radiators, imported from England.



A few days after Anne and Russell Duncan moved into their new log home, a violent thunderstorm struck. It roared in the night, shaking the ground and the granite ridge where their home sits, high above Robinson Lake.

"We never had experienced a thunderstorm like it," Russell says. "As the lightning hit, it reflected off the lake like a mirror. It was like a flash going off in our bedroom. There was thunder and lightning all around us."

The memory of this fearsome encounter with nature is fresh in their minds. "We laid in bed that night, trying to be brave," Anne recalls. "But I must say I was also thinking, thank God we have a lightning protection system." The couple had done their homework. When planning their new Arts and Crafts-style home, atop a rocky hill overlooking Robinson Lake, Vernon Lake and the Big East River, they considered the elevation - 600 feet higher than nearby Huntsville. With at least one tree on their land already scorched by lightning, they realized the house needed protection from nature's fury. Simpson Lightning Rods installed lightning rods on every peak of the house, with braided copper wire connecting the rods to the ground to dissipate electricity when lightning strikes.

This foresight typifies the Duncans' careful approach to building their retirement home. As executives with large mutinational companies, they had lived in Mississauga for more than 25 years. As they retired from their challenging careers, they were ready for a fresh start and more space. "We both were born in Montreal and always lived near water. Being near water is important to us," says Russell. When they saw the view of the lakes and realized the privacy they could have on the five-and-a-half-acre property, west of Huntsville, they were thrilled. They thoroughly researched the town's amenities – a new hospital, good doctors and a nurse practitioner clinic. They discovered nice restaurants, beautiful resorts, good golfing and parks with nature trails - all just a couple of hours from Toronto. They were sold. Continued on page 51

The Duncans found their log home builder **Matt Davidson** on the Internet. "His unique approach is what got us," Russell says. "He's a man of integrity and passion and you can see it in what he does." Everyone they spoke to said **Davidson Log & Timber Artisans Inc.** delivers quality, on time and without compromise. "This is the first home we've ever built," says Anne. "That's why we needed someone we could really trust." The Duncans studied every facet of the building. "We sourced the vendors, we met them, took them to lunch. We wanted to know what kind of people we'd be working with." 



(If you are unfamiliar with any of these wines or beers just ask for help while in your local liquor store, they should all be readily available).

#### **HEADING TO A HOLIDAY PARTY?**

Try taking a bottle of prosecco or cava, both are festive sparkling wines that won't break the bank.

#### A BOTTLE FOR THE BOSS?

A cabernet sauvignon from California, an Amarone from Italy or a burgundy from France are always solid choices. Or try a 10, 20 or 30 year-old tawny port, this will last longer than one bottle of wine and will remind your boss how great you are over and over again.

#### THE FATHER, BROTHER, FATHER-IN-LAW, AND SO ON ...?

Put together an interesting basket of beers, choose all different varieties to allow a real taste experience. Fill it with wheat beer, stout, Abbey-style ale, an India pale ale and anything else that seems interesting.

#### THE MOTHER, SISTER, MOTHER-IN-LAW, AND SO ON ...?

Why not try a bottle of something floral, sweet and pretty. Dessert wines such as icewine, Beaumes de Venise, moscato or late harvest wines are a real sweet treat and are the perfect way to finish off a meal or to sip chilled as an aperitif before dinner.

#### THE FOODIE IN YOUR LIFE?

Choose a region in the world such as Spain or Niagara and then fill a basket or wine crate with wines and food products from that area. You can add olive oil, cheese, mustards, preserves, etc.

If you have a little extra time on your hands you can always make some gifts that incorporate wines and spirits. Here are a couple of suggestions that are easy and delicious!

#### CLASSIC FRENCH CHICKEN LIVER PATÉ

Give this as a hostess gift with a nice baguette and a bottle of Chardonnay from France or Niagara.

#### 2 tbsp unsalted butter

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lb chicken livers, cleaned
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup white onion or shallots, finely chopped

## 2 tsp fresh thyme, finely chopped

1/2 cup dry white wine

#### Salt and pepper to taste

- Melt butter in a pan, add onions and thyme and cook until onions are translucent, about 10 minutes.
- Add wine and reduce for 1 minute
- Add livers and cook through, 3-4 minutes. Place everything in a food processor, pureé to



 Place mixture in a glass crock or decorative ramekin and keep refrigerated until ready to give. Spread paté on bread slices and serve with chilled white wine.

#### LIMONCELLO



Here is an easy recipe for the sunny liqueur from the Amalfi coast in Italy. The first year I lived in Rome I made this as a Christmas gift for everyone in my family. On returning to Canada for the holidays I was stopped at Customs with a suitcase filled with the yellow bottles. Fortunately for me

(and my family), the Customs agent was Italian and let me pass through with my clandestine stash!

#### 5 large lemons, washed well

750 ml vodka, a mid-priced brand is sufficient

- 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups sugar
- 2 ¼ cups water
- Peel the zest from all the lemons, making sure to avoid the white pith. Place in a large glass jar along with the vodka. Cover and let stand for 2 weeks in a dark place.
- When ready, heat sugar and water in a small pot, stir until sugar has completely dissolved. Let cool to room temperature.
- Strain vodka into sugar mixture and divide into decorative bottles for gift giving. Make sure to serve Limoncello straight from the freezer in small sherry glasses or shooter glasses. Salute! OH

# HOME INSPECTION RAISING THE BAR

Bill Mullen has high hopes! The Ontario-based home inspector is also the director of external relations for a new organization, the National Home Inspector Certification Council (NHICC).

The NHICC is pushing for nation-wide licensing of home inspectors, but at this time Ontario, the Atlantic Provinces and Saskatchewan are just looking at this possibility.

Alberta and British Columbia already license home and property inspectors. B.C. led the way, endorsing inspectors since April 1, 2009, while Alberta came onside September 1, 2011. Neither of these came about without a lot of pushing from interest groups within those provinces, and Mullen doesn't expect it to be much different in Ontario, though he hopes that the timeframe to have licensing passed into law could be shortened because of the groundwork done by those first two provinces.

According to Peter Link, manager of house and property inspection registration for the Applied Science Technologists and Technicians of B.C. (ASTTBC), his organization lobbied for two decades to make this happen.

Helene Barton, Executive Director of the B.C. branch of the Canadian Association of Home and Property & Inspectors, (CAHPI), agrees. "We lobbied the government for eight years to have our industry regulated because prior to that anyone who bought a ladder and had a business card could say they were a home inspector. Many were charlatans."

Though there are training courses and college programs in all provinces, in most provinces there is no onus on someone who calls him/herself a home inspector to take such education. In the two provinces that currently license, the several certifying organizations that exist require some or all of the following to become licensed: specialized education (number of hours varies from organization to organization), a practical (or field) test, written exam, a peer inspection process, and, finally, an application to the



provincial licensing body. In the case of B.C., that's Consumer Protection B.C. For Alberta, it's Service Alberta. The outcome of the application process is not ideal, according to Darcy McGregor, secretary and founding member of CAHPI Alberta. "We thought they (the government) would raise everyone to the highest level, like our members follow, but they said that wouldn't be fair."

While the expectations aren't as high as he'd like, McGregor says, "Licensing at least gives homeowners a bit more assurance that the person they are dealing with has some education and the ability to look after them as a home inspector."

Link echoes this sentiment: "We pushed for one certifying organization and one standard of practice, but there are four in B.C." So buyer beware is still in force, and homeowners must research any home inspector they are thinking of hiring. "The onus is still on the homeowner. (They should ask) where did they get their education; do they have experience in the field to have the ability to recognize problems."

Barton, though, feels that the process has been overall positive. "It got rid of a lot of people who are unqualified. We are still trying to get the consumer to ask about the licence before hiring a home inspector. It gives them peace of mind knowing that they (inspectors) are qualified."

Though there is mixed reaction to the outcomes in B.C. and Alberta, there's one point that McGregor, Link and Barton all agree on – home inspectors in those provinces are now required to carry errors and omissions insurance. They must be insured up to \$1 million, so if they miss something during an inspection and this results in a costly repair, the homeowner may have financial recourse.

One piece of the puzzle that is still missing, according to Nigel Trevethan, of Harper Grey LLP and legal counsel for CAHPI B.C., is a "cooling off period, like many other large purchases." He thinks it's regrettable that the "government hasn't mandated that every real estate transaction must involve a home inspection. This is especially important in an overheated housing market, like Vancouver." He feels that this is key to consumer protection.

So, though Mullen's hopes for the future of licensing in Ontario – and throughout the country – are high, experience tells us that the outcome may be less than stellar but better than the status quo. **OH**

# ALMOND GINGER CHOCOLATE BARK + lots of topping variations

#### ALMOND GINGER CHOCOLATE BARK (Makes: about 20 pieces)

1 lb (450 g) dark chocolate, chopped

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup toasted whole almonds, coarsely chopped

 $^{2}\!\!\!/_{3}$  cup candied ginger, thinly sliced

- Melt chocolate in a heatproof bowl set over a pot of gently simmering water, stirring often until smooth.
- Stir in about one third of each of the almonds and candied ginger. Pour mixture onto parchment paperlined baking sheet and gently spread with the back of a spoon until about an even scant ½-inch (1 cm) thickness.
- Sprinkle with remaining almonds and candied ginger.
- Refrigerate until solid, about 20 minutes. Break or cut into pieces.
- The bark will keep refrigerated in an airtight container for about 1 week.
- For gift giving, package as desired.

## VARIATION:

Pistachio Cranberry Apricot Swirl Bark - Melt separately 10 oz. (280 g) dark chocolate and 6 oz. (170 g) white chocolate. Stir one third of each: ¾ cup roasted shelled pistachios, ¼ cup dried apricots, quartered and ⅓ cup dried cranberries into the melted dark chocolate. Spread onto baking sheet. Drizzle with melted white chocolate. Use toothpick, skewer, or back of knife to swirl the chocolates together. Sprinkle with remaining pistachios, apricots and cranberries. Continue as recipe above. он





# YOU CAN'T ALVVAYS GET WHAT YOU WANT

We have a lot of needs in our culture. We need a place to live, a car, a job and lots of money to buy all kinds of things, from clothing to food, dinners out, vacations, flat screen TVs, lots of shoes, concert tickets, Tim Hortons or Starbucks twice a day... the list goes on!

When it comes to buying a home, we each have different needs – some may need a certain type of location, others a certain size of home, others a certain number of bedrooms, still others a finished basement for their kids to hang out with friends. Some people have a very long list of needs, others have a shorter list. We have all experienced the frustration of trying to get

the frustration of trying to get all our needs met in a home search. It can take months, or even years.

But what if we looked at it differently? What if we shifted our perspective? If you think about it, we actually live in a culture of want, not need. We may say

that we NEED this or we need that, but the truth is that for most of us, we are living far beyond our needs and well into our wants. After all, our only real needs are food and shelter (and hopefully love and friendship). Everything else, if we are honest about it, is a want.

When it comes to looking for a home, aside from the roof we hope to put over our heads, everything else on our list is really a want. The important thing about wants is that they are WANTS. This means that they are nice to have, maybe even hugely important to have, but sad as it is to say, they do not rise to the level of need. You may have heard the news – you can't always get what you want – especially if your list of wants is long!

I recently helped clients new to Canada with their home search. They started with a long list of wants, the top of which was a certain location. Of course, as luck would have it, the other wants on their list were not terribly available at the price they wanted to pay, in the location they wanted. Imagine that! So to test their conviction about the various wants on their list, I took them to a bunch of other locations where the other wants were more available at their price point. What did I find? They were happy that the other wants were being met, but they didn't like the locations. Imagine that.

Now, in this case, we had the benefit of time pressure to focus the mind. They needed to find a home (see, a real NEED – shelter!) within a fairly short time frame. So we spent some time coming to terms with the truth of the search – they would have to make trade-offs between the various wants on their list. If they wanted this set of wants, they would have to forgo certain others. In other words, they were not likely to get everything they wanted, so they would have to focus on getting their most important wants met.

This actually became kind of a fun game as we tested the various wants. During each home visit, as they would voice their reactions, one of us would blurt out the guiding principle of the search – trade-offs! In the end, they came back to the original location and gave up some of the features they liked in the homes in other locations. And having gone through the process, with realism and eyes open, they made their final decision fairly quickly and with confidence that they had made the right trade-offs, satisfying their higher wants and leaving the lesser ones on the table.

Try this little shift in perspective next time you are looking for a home. Ask your agent to keep you honest about the trade-offs you'll need to make. You'll find the search easier, more fun and more fruitful. You can't always get what you want. But if you try sometime, you just might find, you get what you need. **OH**

# HOW TO CHOOSE a mattress

Tossing and turning all night? It may be time to trade in your mattress. After all, if you spend six-to-eight hours on it every night, it's the most important investment piece in your home!

Most people replace their mattresses about every 10 to 12 years, says Dave Friesema, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer at Sleep Country Canada, but you should start re-evaluating your sleeping situation after about eight years.

When you're ready to invest in a new bed, Friesema says choosing the right mattress begins before you even enter a store.

#### **BEFORE YOU GO**

Set aside some time to go shopping for your new mattress. It shouldn't take all day, but you don't want to be rushed, either. Allow enough time to talk with a salesperson and try out a number of mattresses for at least a few minutes each.

Friesema also recommends wearing comfortable clothes. It's pretty hard to effectively test mattresses in a skirt and high heels!

#### WHEN YOU ARRIVE

Once you arrive at the mattress store, it's okay to take a look around on your own but a salesperson can be really helpful here. Friesema says staff should ask shoppers lots of questions to help them find the right mattress. Do you have any regular aches and pains? Special needs? These are the kinds of things your sales representative will want to know to be able to accommodate you and find something comfortable. Don't be afraid to ask your own questions, too.

#### FINDING THE RIGHT COMFORT

Most people know whether they like a soft or firm bed. This is important, especially depending on your sleep style. Do you sleep on your back, side or stomach? What about your partner?

This is where you can start trying some beds for comfort. When you try one out, make sure to lie the same way you normally sleep. There's no point determining if a bed is comfortable when you're on your back if you always sleep on your side.



#### NARROWING DOWN THE DETAILS

Once you've established what type and level of cushiness you like, it's important to explore a range of different mattresses with various features.

Do you sleep very hot? Friesema says there are mattresses that mitigate that. Does your partner toss and turn all night? Look for a mattress that curbs movement across the whole bed so you can still sleep soundly.

#### COMPLEMENT YOUR MATTRESS

According to Friesema, choosing the right pillow is just as important to a good night's sleep as choosing a great mattress.

Once you've found a bed that feels right to you, find a pillow that matches the bed.

"A mattress is just a mattress, but a mattress and a pillow are a sleep system," says Friesema. "When you're sleeping on your side, the gap between your shoulder and head is bigger than when you sleep on your back, so you need a different pillow." Both pieces need to jive together and work for you, so explore all your options in terms of size, shape, density and material.

#### WHAT IF YOU CHOOSE THE WRONG ONE?

Most mattress retailers have exchange policies, but be sure to ask at your preferred store. Often, if you choose a mattress you think is just the right fit, but after a couple of weeks you still find yourself counting sheep and waking up with aches and pains, you can go back and exchange your mattress for something more suitable.

While Friesema says this doesn't happen too often, it does happen. "Then we can ask, 'what was wrong with the bed the first time?' and choose a mattress that solves that problem," he says. OH




