By the time they reached Calcutta they had run out of money and decided not only to fly advertising flights for whisky and tea companies over Calcutta but also to publish this account setting down the record of their flight thus far in order to help raise funds. They did eventually reach Melbourne and their aeroplane survives as part of the Australian War Memorial Collection in Canberra.

Edward Phelipps (1613-1679) of Montacute in Somerset, was the elder son of Sir Robert Phelipps and Bridget, daughter of Sir Thomas Gorges. A supporter of Charles I, following the defeat near Chard, he retreated to Exeter, and was taken prisoner when the Castle surrendered to General Fairfax, and all his estates sequestered by Parliament. He married Anne, daughter of Sir Robert Pye, of Clifton Hall Staffordshire.

The stamp was evidently used by generations of Phelipps, and they are found on books published as late as 1775. Possible candidates are:

- Sir Edward Phelipps (1631-1699), son of Edward Phelipps and Anne, daughter of Sir Robert Pye. Firstly he married Dorothy Cheeke, secondly Edith Blake, of Langport, Somerset, daughter of John Blake, ironmonger, and niece and coheir of Admiral Blake.

- Edward Phelipps (1725-1797) of Montacute, Member of Parliament for Somerset 1774. He married Maria Wright, daughter of William Wright.

- Edward Phelipps (1763-1792), Member of Parliament for Somerset. He married Elizabeth Lockver.

The modern spelling in the form of Phelips seems to have been adopted by Edward Phelips in the mid-eighteenth century. Before that date the variations and combinations of vowels and letters `l' and `p' are endless. (1) $f_{200} - f_{300}$



















Walter Preston was a convict engraver whose ability came to the attention of Captain Wallis, who, as well as being the commanding officer of the Newcastle Convict Settlement, was a talented amateur artist. Their relationship resulted in a collection of views which were published by Ackermanns in 1821 called 'An Historical Account of the Colony of New South Wales'. Newcastle had a fearsome reputation as a place for secondary punishment and was described by a contemporary officer as 'the Hell of New South Wales'; which makes the collaboration and artistic achievement all the more extraordinary. It should be remembered that high-grade copper suitable for engraving was not available, so the copper sheets were manufactured from old sheathing plates from ship's hulls. This marine copper was much softer and more difficult to cut with precision and this accounts for the somewhat 'open' appearance of the engraving. Ultimately Preston was pardoned - on the recommendation of Wallis - in no small part because of his work on producing the plates for the book. Bennelong Point is now the sight of Sydney Opera House. He is widely regarded as the master of canine engraving from the late 20th century. (5)



For a full account of the life of George Drought Warburton (1816-1857) see ODNB - 'Army officer and writer on Canada, the third son of George Warburton, of Aughrim, Galway, formerly inspector-general of constabulary in Ireland, and his wife, Anna. He was educated at the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, and served in the Royal Artillery from June 1833, which he entered as a 2nd lieutenant. From 1837 to 1838 he was with a detachment of the Royal Artillery serving in the Carlist War in Spain, where he was badly wounded in action. For his services he was made knight of the first class of San Fernando. In July 1844 he was sent to Canada, where he was stationed at Montreal. His anonymous description of the country under the title 'Hochelaga, or, England in the New World' (2 vols, 1846) was published as 'edited by Eliot Warburton' that is, his elder brother Bartholomew Elliott George Warburton, who had already established himself as a travel writer. George Drought's work quickly ran to several editions in England and the USA and soon became staple reading for travellers. Warburton returned from Canada in 1846 and was in 1848 promoted captain and served briefly in Corfu: he returned to Woolwich in 1849. The success of his first book encouraged him to write another anonymous work, The Conquest of Canada (2 vols. 1849), which like the first passed through several editions and was widely read ...'. 

There is very little 'vert' (green) in the shields, a colour that was not much used in early heraldry. The watermarks (pomme de pin, double-headed eagle and bear) compare to examples included in Briquet & Piccard dating from between the 1480s to 1540s.



Haig was sent out to India in November 1886 as a junior officer and promoted to captain in 1891. He left India in 1892 but returned there briefly before returning home as Aide-de-camp to Sir Keith Fraser, Inspector General of Cavalry, a position he was appointed to on 28 April 1894.

Haig entered Staff College, Camberley in 1896, completing the course and leaving in 1897. There he was taught that victory must come from defeating the main enemy army in battle, and that as in Napoleonic warfare, attrition was merely a prelude to the commitment of reserves for a decisive battlefield victory, and traces of this thinking can be seen in Haig's decision making for battles in World War I. The one maxim which has some pencil underlining is XVI in which Napoleon writes that one must avoid the battlefield one's enemy has reconnoitred and studied. (1)

Footnote: Accompanying the diary is a letter from the National Army Museum, November 1977, which had studied the diary and offered some information. The writer was a prisoner-of-war, first at Sarrelibre near Metz, and from 28 May 1813 at Verdun. 'He was apparently captured at sea on 21 December 1805 and landed at La Rochelle on 29 December and this would suggest that he was travelling on an unescorted merchant ship which was taken by a French privateer in the Bay of Biscay. On 21 December 1812 he notes "wrote a letter to the Minister of Marine requesting my exchange", and on 6 October 1813 he mentions owning an Army List. He also oversaw the repayment of money to seamen at Sarrelibre (9 Sept. 1812) and gave money to a midshipman (29 November 1812). While at Sarrelibre most of his acquaintances were apparently not military officers (based on an absence from the Army Lists), but at Verdun he names about a score of officers at both Army and Navy. Theodore Roussel had first married Frances Amelia Smithson Bull but after her death he married Melville's widow Ethel in 1914. Marion was therefore Roussel's step-daughter. Roussel also had a daughter, Ivy (born c. 1900), with his mistress Hetty Pettigrew.

Agnes Ethel Mackay (1889-1980) was a poet and critic by vocation. She was the niece of Roussel's second wife, Ethel, and cousin to Marion Melville. After Ethel's death, Agnes moved to St Leonards-on-Sea to take charge of the household, which comprised Roussel and the 13-year-old Marion Melville. Agnes acted as studio assistant and companion to Roussel until his death in 1926. She then moved with Marion to Upper Cheyne Row, London, and then to France in 1937.

An interesting and apparently unpublished account of the early part of Roussel's artistic life up until his significant first meeting with Whistler. A transcript of the autobiographical text is available on request.

Barnum equipped him with a miniature coach. Painted an ultramarine blue and decorated with a coat of arms and the motto "Go Ahead", it measured but 20ins high by 11ins, wide. Drown by ponies only 28ins, high and ridden on the outside by children costumed in liveries and wigs, it cost Barnum in excess of \$2,000. **The smallest person ever (recorded in Guinness Book of Records) was Gui Mohammed of India. Accounts of the famous murder case and subsequent trial of Abraham Thornton, who was accused of the rape and murder of Mary Ashford at Erdington in 1817. Mary Ashford had gone to a dance party at a public house on 26 May 1817, also attended by Abraham Thornton, who had walked Ashford and her friend Hannah Cox home, Cox later leaving the pair. Mary Ashford was discovered the following morning drowned in a water-filled pit and Thornton was arrested on suspicion of her murder but acquitted at his trial on 08 August. Mary's brother, William Ashford appealed the case, Thornton was re-arrested and put on trial again, at the King's Bench in London beginning on 17 November, at which Thornton when asked to enter his plea replied 'Not guilty, and I am ready to defend the same with my body', and after putting on one of a pair of leather gauntlets, threw the other one down for Ashford to accept the challenge of trial by battle, a medieval method of single combat to settle accusations, which had never been repealed by Parliament. Ashford refused the challenge and after further deliberationsThornton was freed once more, and due to public hostility emigrated to America in 1818. The Lord Chancellor introduced a bill to abolish trial by battle in 1819. (1)

AFTER THE AUCTION

Payment: The price you pay is the amount at which the auctioneer's hammer falls (the hammer price), plus a buyer's premium (a percentage of the final hammer price) and vat where applicable. You will be issued with an invoice made out to the name and address provided on your registration form.

Please note successful bids made via live bidding cannot be invoiced or paid for until the day after an auction. A live bidding fee of 3% + VAT (Dominic Winter / Invaluable) or 4.95% + VAT (the-saleroom) will be added to your invoice.

METHODS OF PAYMENT

Cheque: Cheques will only be accepted on the day of the sale by prior arrangement (please contact our office for further information). Cheques by post will be accepted but a period of 5 working days will be required for the cheque to clear before purchases can be collected or posted.

Cash: Payments can be made at the Cashier's Office, either during or after the sale.

Debit Card: There is no additional charge for purchases made with debit cards in the UK.

Credit Cards: We accept Visa and Mastercard. It is advisable to let your card provider know in advance if you are intending to purchase. This reduces the time needed to obtain authorisation when the payment is made.

Bank Transfer: All transfers must state the relevant invoice number. If transferring from a foreign currency, the amount we receive must be the total due after the currency conversion and the deduction of any bank charges.

Note to Overseas Clients: All payments must be made by bank transfer only. No card payments will be accepted unless by special prior arrangements with the auctioneers.

Collection/Postage/Delivery: If you attend the auction in person and are successful in your bid, you are free to collect your item once payment has been made.

Successful commission or live bids will be invoiced to you the day after the sale. When it is possible for our in-house packing department to send your purchase(s), a charge for postage/packing/insurance will be included in your invoice. Where it is not possible for our in-house packing department to send your item you will be required to make your own arrangements or to contact Mailboxes etc (tel: 01793 525009) or Pack and Send (tel: 01635 887237) who may be able to help.

We provide a monthly delivery service to Central London, usually on Wednesday of the week following an auction. Payment must be received before this option can be requested. A charge will be added to your invoice for this service.

ARTIST'S RESALE RIGHT LAW ("DROIT DE SUITE")

Lots marked with **AR** next to the lot number may be subject to Droit de Suite.

Droit de Suite is payable on the hammer price of any artwork sold in the lifetime of the artist, or within 70 years of the artist's death. The buyer agrees to pay Dominic Winter Auctioneers Ltd. an amount equal to the resale royalty and we will pay such amount to the artist's collecting agent. Resale royalty applies where the Hammer price is 1,000 Euros or more and the amount cannot be more than 12,500 Euros per lot.

The amount is calculated as follows:RoyaltyFor the Portion of the Hammer Price (in Euros)4.00%up to 50,0003.00%between 50,000.01 and 200,0001.00%between 200,000.01 and 350,0000.50%between 350,000.01 and 500,000

Invoices will, as usual, be issued in Pounds Sterling. For the purposes of calculating the resale royalty the Pounds Sterling/Euro rate of exchange will be the European Central Bank reference rate on the day of the sale.


CONDITIONS OF SALE AND BUSINESS

- The Seller warrants to the Auctioneer and the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claims.
- (a) The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
 - (b) Where goods are bought at auction by a buyer who has entered into an agreement with another or others that the other or others (or some of them) shall abstain from bidding for the goods and the buyer or other party or one of the other parties is a dealer (as defined in the Auction Biddings Agreement Act 1927) the buyer warrants that the goods are bought bona fide on joint account.
- 3. The buyer shall pay the price at which a lot is knocked down by the Auctioneer to the buyer ("the hammer price") together with a premium of 20% of the hammer price. Where the lot is marked by an asterisk the premium will be subject to VAT at 20% which under the Auctioneer's Margin Scheme will form part of the buyer's premium on our invoice and will not be separately identified (the premium added to the hammer price will hereafter collectively be referred to as "the total sum due"). By making any bid the buyer acknowledges that his attention has been drawn to the fact that on the sale of any lot the Auctioneer will receive from the seller commission at its usual rates in addition to the said premium of 20% and assents to the Auctioneer receiving the said commission.
- (a) The buyer shall forthwith upon the purchase give in his name and permanent address and pay to the Auctioneer immediately after the conclusion of the auction the total sum due.
 - (b) The buyer may be required to pay down during the course of the sale the whole or any part of the total sum due, and if he fails to do so after such request the lot or lots may at the Auctioneer's absolute discretion be put up again and resold immediately.
 - (c) The buyer shall at his own expense take away any lot or lots purchased no later than five working days after the auction day.
 - (d) The Auctioneer may at his own discretion agree credit terms with a buyer and extend the time limits for collection in special cases but otherwise payment shall be deemed to have been made only after the Auctioneer has received cash or a sterling banker's draft or the buyer's cheque has been cleared.
- 5. (a) If the buyer fails to pay for or take away any lot or lots pursuant to clause 4 or breaches any other condition of that clause the Auctioneer as agent for the seller shall be entitled after consultation with the seller to exercise one or other of the following rights:
 - (i) Rescind the sale of that or any other lots sold to the buyer who defaults and re-sell the lot or lots whereupon the defaulting buyer shall pay to the Auctioneer any shortfall between the proceeds of that sale after deduction of costs of re-sale and the total sum due. Any surplus shall belong to the seller.
 - (ii) Proceed for damages for breach of contract.
 - (b) Without prejudice to the Auctioneer's rights hereunder if any lots or lots are not collected within five days or such longer period as the Auctioneer may have agreed otherwise, the Auctioneer may charge the buyer a storage charge of £1.00 + VAT at the current rate per lot per day.
 - (c) Ownership of the lot purchased shall not pass to the buyer until he has paid to the Auctioneer the total sum due.
- 6. (a) The seller shall be entitled to place a reserve on any lot and the Auctioneer shall have the right to bid on behalf of the seller for any lot on which a reserve has been placed. A seller may not bid on any lot on which a reserve has been placed.
 - (b) Where any lot fails to sell, the Auctioneer shall notify the seller accordingly. The seller shall make arrangements either to re-offer the lot for sale or to collect the lot and may be asked to pay a commission not exceeding 50% of the selling commission and any special expenses incurred in cataloguing the lot.
 - (c) If such arrangements are not made within seven days of the notification the Auctioneer is empowered to sell the lot by auction or by private treaty at not less than the reserve price and to receive from the seller the normal selling commission and special expenses.

- 7. Any representation or statement by the Auctioneer in any catalogue, brochure or advertisement of forthcoming sales as to authorship, attribution, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price is a statement of opinion only. Every person interested should exercise and rely on his own judgement as to such matters and neither the Auctioneer nor his servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions. No warranty whatsoever is given by the Auctioneer or the seller in respect of any lot and any express or implied warranties are hereby excluded.
- 8. (a) Notwithstanding any other terms of these conditions, if within fourteen days of the sale the Auctioneer has received from the buyer of any lot notice in writing that in his view the lot is a deliberate forgery and within fourteen days after such notification the buyer returns the same to the Auctioneer in the same condition as at the time of the sale and satisfies the Auctioneer that considered in the light of the entry in the catalogue the lot is a deliberate forgery then the sale of the lot will be rescinded and the purchase price of the same refunded. "A deliberate forgery" means a lot made with intention to deceive.
 - (b) A buyer's claim under this condition shall be limited to any amount paid to the Auctioneer for the lot and for the purpose of this condition the buyer shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by the Auctioneer.
- 9. Lots may be removed during the sale after full settlement in accordance with 4(d) hereof.
- 10. All goods delivered to the Auctioneer's premises will be deemed to be delivered for sale by auction unless otherwise stated in writing and will be catalogued and sold at the Auctioneer's discretion and accepted by the Auctioneer subject to all these conditions. In the case of miscellaneous books, the Auctioneer reserves the right to extract and dispose of books that, in the opinion of the Auctioneer at his absolute discretion, have no saleable value and, therefore, might detract from the saleability of the rest of the lot and the Auctioneer shall incur no liability to the seller, in respect of the books disposed of. By delivering the goods to theAuctioneer for inclusion in his auction sales each seller acknowledges that he/she accepts and agrees to all the conditions.
- 11. (a) Unless otherwise instructed in writing all goods on the Auctioneer's premises and in their custody will be held insured against the risks of fire, burglary, water damage and accidental breakage or damage. The value of the goods so covered will be the hammer price, or in the case of unsold lots the lower estimate, or in the case of loss or damage prior to the sale that which the specialised staff of the Auctioneer shall in their absolute discretion estimate to be the auction value of such goods.
 - (b) The Auctioneer shall not be responsible for damage to or the loss, theft, or destruction of any goods not so insured because of the owner's written instructions.
- 12. The Auctioneer shall remit the proceeds of the sale to the seller thirty days after the day of the auction provided that the Auctioneer has received the total sum due from the buyer. In all other cases the Auctioneer will remit the proceeds of the sale to the seller within seven days of the receipt by the Auctioneer of the total sum due. The Auctioneer will not be deemed to have received the total sum due until after any cheque delivered by the buyer has been cleared. In the event of the Auctioneer exercising his right to rescind the sale his obligation to the seller hereunder lapses.
- 13. In the case of the seller withdrawing instructions to the Auctioneer to sell any lot or lots, the Auctioneer may charge a fee of 12.5% of the Auctioneer's middle estimate of the auction price of the lot withdrawn together with Value Added Tax thereon and any expenses incurred in respect of the lot or lots.
