

pen and welcoming to all, Dutchess is a vibrant region, rich with diverse cultures and a heritage that's celebrated by the community through its food, art, attractions and events. Here in "New York's Backyard," you'll find a year-round playground for outdoor adventurers and food enthusiasts, history buffs and culture vultures there's something for everyone.

Explore our history, shaped by the Wappinger tribe who originally inhabited these lands, the Dutch and German settlers who arrived in the 1600s and 1700s and the Gilded Age industrialists who built their opulent country estates here in the 1800s. Discover **Troutbeck**, the site of the 1916 and 1933 Amenia Conferences where W.E.B. DuBois and others discussed ways to advance the rights of Black Americans, leading to the formation of the NAACP. And learn about the legacy laid down by Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt at their Hyde Park homes.

Accessibility

Dutchess is committed to providing a growing number of accessible parks, recreational activities, events and sensoryfriendly experiences. A 12-passenger, wheelchair-accessible electric tram improves accessibility for those with mobility challenges to enjoy the Walkway Over the Hudson's entire 1.28-mile span. The packed stone-dust Woodland Trail at Stony Kill Farm is a perfect half-mile path for individuals in wheelchairs or who have limited mobility. Julie's Jungle,

a 16,000-square-foot accessible public playground, allows children of all abilities to play and learn together. Wilcox Memorial Park in Stanfordville has accessible campsites. The Bardavon 1869 Opera House, Fisher Center at Bard and other major entertainment venues provide wheelchair and companion seating for events as well as assisted listening devices.

Many hotels in Poughkeepsie and Fishkill, including the Hyatt Place, Homewood Inn & Suites, Residence Inn Marriott, Holiday Inn Express, Hyatt House and Courtyard by Marriott, feature rooms equipped with bathtubs and roll-in showers with grab bars in addition to



communication equipment for people with vision or hearing impairments.

Through our local ThinkDIFFERENTLY initiative, our community strives to create a supportive and welcoming tourist and business destination for all. Dutchess County has been designated by the Anderson Center for Autism as the first Autism Supportive County in New York State, and the Village of Rhinebeck has become certified as an Autism Supportive Community. Annual events such as Sinterklaas and the **Dutchess County Fair** offer guiet areas and special hours to provide respite for those who need sensory-friendly accommodations.

The America the Beautiful – National Parks & Federal Recreational Lands Access Pass allows U.S. citizens or permanent residents with long-term disabilities a free lifetime pass to see national sites, including the Vanderbilt Mansion and Home of Franklin D. **Roosevelt**. For New York State (NYS) residents with disabilities, the Access Pass gives free or discounted use of state parks, historic sites and recreational facilities operated by the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation and the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation.

This new food hall and event space in the heart of Poughkeepsie serves up delicious Asian fusion, Southern-style BBQ, fresh vegetarian cuisine, baked delights and so much more.

> Tenmile Distillery, Wassaic

Take a tour and sample locally grown and produced spirits — vodka, whisky and gin — while enjoying the beautiful Hudson Valley views from the bluestone patio or tasting room. This stunning distillery stands inside a 100-year-old dairy barn just a short walk away from the Tenmile Train Station (Metro-North), and offers visitors an educational look at the craft.







he quaint-but-bustling Village of Rhinebeck is the nexus of northern Dutchess. Its walkable, picture-postcard-like blocks are lined with historic original buildings housing fine and casual restaurants and shops. On the edge of the village center is the Dutchess County Fairgrounds, home to the annual Dutchess County Fair and other weekend festivals.

Right outside the village is the 200-acre **Ferncliff Forest** Game Refuge and Forest Preserve, whose 80-foot fire tower provides an incredible 360-degree view of the Hudson River and the encircling mountains. **'T' Space**, founded by the Steven Myron Holl Foundation, is a 30-acre woodland reserve and indoor exhibition space focusing on art, architecture, music and poetry. The **Omega Institute for Holistic Studies** offers diverse healing classes, workshops, conferences and retreats. A beloved attraction is the **Old Rhinebeck** Aerodrome, a living aviation museum with a collection of fully operational early-20th-century vehicles and aircraft where you can enjoy an air show or take a biplane ride.

On the campus of leading liberal arts institution Bard College in Annandale-on-Hudson is the futuristic, Frank Gehry-designed Richard B. Fisher Center for the Performing Arts, an acoustically astonishing venue for symphonic and jazz concerts, operas, ballets and other events. Shop and dine in nearby Red Hook or plan an overnight during Bard's annual music festival or Summerscape.

Visitors to the Village of Tivoli to the north will join residents in saying "i lov iT" (Tivoli spelled backwards). The popular annual Tivoli Street Painting Festival is a draw, as well as hiking and kayaking in nearby Tivoli Bays Wildlife Management Area and Research Reserve. Due east of Rhinebeck is Pine Plains, whose boundaries contain hiker's paradise Stissing Mountain and prime swimming spot **Stissing Lake**. Along the Hudson River west of Rhinebeck is the idyllic community of Rhinecliff and the Amtrak station that connects the region by rail to New York City and Albany.

oughkeepsie, the county seat, is home to pulsating entertainment, eclectic eateries, top-shelf breweries and shops. Exciting additions like The Academy and Eastdale Village give you a variety of options to eat, drink and shop in one location. Located within the livework-play community of Eastdale Village, Eastdale Avenue includes delicious dining options such as Pizzeria Posto and Amanda's Macaron Shoppe, and shopping destinations such as Daffodils Gift Shoppe and Ye Old Gift Shoppe. The Academy, a new food hall and event space in the heart of Poughkeepsie, serves up delicious Asian fusion, Southernstyle BBQ, fresh vegetarian cuisine, baked delights and so much more. The former-factory-building-turned-arts-complex Poughkeepsie Underwear Factory (PUF) houses the vegan café Little Loaf Bakeshop, artist studios and pop-up events.

Dutchess' unique and inspiring cultural scene continues to grow, particularly in and around Poughkeepsie. Many galleries, such as **Womenswork.Art** and **Cryptic**, offer unique points of view. Interact with the city's talented artists during Poughkeepsie Open Studios in June. Learn the craft of textiles, printmaking and pottery through exhibits, workshops and events with Fall Kill Creative Works, located at the historic Glebe House and at Clay Works. Visit The Trolley Barn for national juried art shows curated and presented by young artists enrolled in The Art Effect program. The nonprofit Arts Mid-Hudson organization sponsors area events and oversees permanent galleries and a pop-up shop.

A wonderful way to get a view of the city, along with sweeping vistas of the Hudson River and the Catskill Mountains, is to visit the Walkway Over the Hudson

State Historic Park. Rising 212 feet above the ground and stretching 1.28 miles across, it's the world's longest elevated pedestrian bridge. Take a glass-walled elevator down to Upper Landing Park. A short walk leads you to Victor C. Waryas Park on the Poughkeepsie waterfront, where you can spot boats of all sizes—cruise ships, barges and sailboats.

Taking off from Sky Acres Airport in LaGrangeville, let Hudson Valley Flight Service take you on an aerial tour of the Hudson Valley in a Cessna 182.



Other focuses like retaining water and fostering fungal expansion have rebuilt soil humus—the organic element of soil created by decomposing plant materials.

The couple acquired the farm in 2014. Touchet began raising Muscovy ducks and other fowl for eggs and meat, utilizing the Wappingers Creek and other surrounding waters. Leveraging two careers in wine sales, the couple developed a distillery concept.

Pike's friend Hans Reisetbauer helped him "skip the line" in learning the craft. Reisetbauer brings 30 years of experience and provided endless expertise from his home in Austria. During the pandemic, Pike assembled the distillery piece-by-piece with guidance through Zoom. Reisetbauer sent various mixes of organic botanicals, and they'd try different recipes for their gin.

The end product is modeled after London Dry gin, with a smooth balance of juniper with lemon balm, orange rind and other botanicals. Plus, onsite well water provides a beautiful texture and mouthfeel. Local fruit shines in the apple and pear brandies, as well as the soon-tobe-released black currant brandy. With a Taste Finder mobile passport (available at dutchesstourism.com/ finder), visitors to this pastoral destination receive a tasting of two spirits and one cider.

Branchwater Farms is the only grocery store in the town of Milan, and it serves as a marketplace for fine, handcrafted Hudson Valley products. "We really started to work with people with a similar ethos—whether it's the farming aspect or people that are land-management responsible. The focus is really on quality," Touchet says.

At the store, visitors can buy Montgomery Place Orchards jam and vinegar, dried black currants and syrup from Greg Quinn, Chaseholm Farms cheese and meat, Harney and Sons teas and other local goods. Branchwater Farms also produces their own raw honey, botanical soap, red/white wine vinegar and fermented hot sauces. "I think the Hudson Valley has a bounty of quality products. It's amazing to live in an area where there's just so much to choose from," Pike adds.

David Cruz of Reconnect Foods, Poughkeepsie

RECONNECT FOODS STREET FOOD CONCEPTS

> David Cruz, Reconnect Foods, Poughkeepsie

Born out of the Poughkeepsie Underwear Factory from a local mobile eatery, Reconnect Foods now has a permanent location at Eastdale Village. Founder Chef David Cruz graduated from The Culinary Institute of America in 2019 and sought to reconnect local food systems. His mission: demonstrate what is possible with local ingredients.

"We let the seasons design the menu. We build on our core dishes and make them fun. We're always switching out the vegetables," Cruz says. Even during cold winter months, Dutchess County farms—Obercreek Farm, Poughkeepsie Farm Project, Greig Farm, Rose Hill, etc.—provide incredible raw materials and inspiration for the chef.

"In the winter, our bowl features a cabbage-apple slaw; in the summer, that becomes a pico de gallo with tomato season. We switch over to greens and stonefruits... So the flavor profiles change, and we go from very savory with a winter spice to more bright flavors like spring garlic, onion and scapes to sweet and colorful with strawberries and peaches."

Visit to try steamed bao buns, freshly made ramen, Tex-Mex Asian fusion tacos and loaded rice bowls with a local touch.

Kevin Pike and Robin Touchet, Branchwater Farms, Milan

> Kevin Pike and Robin Touchet, Branchwater Farms, Milan

In Dutchess County, grain-to-glass beverage making is the norm. However, Branchwater Farms Distillery in Milan extends this philosophy further by implementing regenerative farming techniques. Husband-and-wife duo Kevin Pike and Robin Touchet put back as much into the land as they take from it—heritage corn, wheat and other ingredients for a triple-distilled gin, flavorful fruit brandies and other spirits.

"What's unique about our place, and specifically Northern Dutchess, is that we're in this kind of valley which was carved out by a glacier...we have big chunks of sandstone, quartzite and shale in the bedrock here. So it's great for drainage, which is ideal for crops," Pike says. Milan is the headwaters for five major water groups in Dutchess County.

Older grain varieties like organic turkey red wheat and red fife wheat stand taller than modern grain, allowing Branchwater to grow without herbicides. Cover crops continuously inhabit the fields and provide "green manure."

> Elaine Hayes, Executive Director Mount Gulian, Beacon

For more than three decades, Elaine Hayes has served as the Executive Director of the Mount Gulian Society. "One of the areas I became interested in was the Mount Gulian garden, and the story of James F. Brown—an escaped slave whose freedom was paid for by the Verplanck family and who became the master gardener," Hayes says. Managing a historic site requires constant care and ongoing restorations. A fire in the 1930s devastated the property, including the century-old garden. Hayes discovered a detailed map of the garden made by one of the Verplanck women, and with board members, located the original posts where the formal garden once stood.

"After the fire, one of the descendants went into the garden and actually dug up yucca plants, roses and peonies and brought [them] back to her house in Connecticut. When she learned that we were reconstructing the garden, she donated them back to us to replant. [The plants you see here today are] the descendants of the original yuccas, peonies and roses from the 1804 garden." The Mount Gulian Society also restored the roof and the 1720 Dutch barn and transcribed centuries-old letters and other documents. "We're a small, small site, but we have a lot of history—from the Wappinger people through the Revolutionary War period to the reconstruction."

Roasted Eggplant with Cheese, Herbs and Hot Honey

INGREDIENTS Serves 4

2 pounds eggplant, any variety

4-8 oz of a soft cheese like goat or feta from Hoofprint Cheese Company (Millbrook) or Chaseholm Farm (Pine Plains) 1 bunch scallions

¹/₄ cup olive oil from The Blue Olive (Pawling)

2 cups packed soft herbs, parsley and basil

1 clove garlic

1/2 cup honey from Hummingbird Ranch (Salt Point)

1 tablespoon crushed chili flakes or other dried chili

1/2 cup walnuts, toasted (optional)

Salt

DIRECTIONS

1. Heat the grill or turn on the broiler.

If pieces are thicker, you may need to flip them and place back under the broiler until cooked through.

5. In a small saucepan, toast chili flakes over low heat until fragrant. Then add honey and heat gently for a few minutes. Then turn off heat and allow chili to infuse the honey.

6. To assemble, layer all components of the dish. Place a portion of the eggplant on a platter and top with scallions, herb sauce, honey and cheese. Continue to layer until all ingredients are used. Top with toasted

With more than 75 trail systems and nearly 200 parks, nature is easily accessible in every corner of Dutchess.



> Hikina

Dutchess is home to incredible hiking. To skip the crowds, visit some of our hidden-gem hikes. Ascend to the highest point in Dutchess, Brace Mountain in Millerton, or discover woodland sculptures and protected wetlands at **Vlei Marsh** Trail in Rhinebeck. An area of diverse habitats, Buttercup **Farm Audubon Sanctuary** in Stanfordville includes six miles of trails, and on a spring day, it's possible to see over 80 species of birds. In Red Hook, take man's best friend for a walk (leashed) at Poets' Walk Park.

Named one of the 15 Best Trails in the U.S. by Travel + Leisure, The William R. Steinhaus Dutchess Rail Trail, which connects to the Maybrook Trailway in Hopewell Junction, is part of the 750-mile **Empire State Trail**. With its continuously paved and mostly flat path, it is fun for all ages.

Hike to the top of **Stissing Mountain** in Pine Plains and climb the fire tower's stairs up 90 more feet for views of five surrounding states (Connecticut, Massachusetts, Vermont, Pennsylvania and New Jersey) and as far north as Albany in New York. Sitting at over 1,500 feet above sea level, the summit at **Mount Beacon** provides gorgeous views of Beacon, the Hudson River and the Newburgh-Beacon Bridge. Continue hiking another mile

to the top of the fire tower and see both New York City and Albany on a clear day. Dutchess' third fire tower is in the **Ferncliff** Forest Game Refuge and Forest Preserve (cover photo). The world-famous Appalachian Trail traverses eastern Dutchess County, crossing through Pawling (where it



has a designated Metro-North station) before heading east toward Connecticut. Don't miss the massive, 300-plus-yearold Dover Oak, the largest oak tree on the trail.

> Recreation

Right off the Taconic State Parkway in Pleasant Valley, James Baird State Park has multiple areas for sports activities, including pickleball, and seven miles of scenic wooded trails. When there's snow, enjoy cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. At the turtle-themed playground, children can learn about the local species. Tymor Park in Union Vale is the largest municipal park in the state, with trails for mountain biking and hiking, an equestrian center, disc golf, an outdoor pool and more. Bowdoin Park in Poughkeepsie has a playground and water spray park, a nationally recognized cross-country racecourse and five pavilions for outdoor entertaining.

If sleeping under the stars is your thing, **Malouf's Mountain Campground** in Beacon is perfect for the camper with no gear and no car-they can supply everything needed for an easy getaway. The Rudd Pond area at Taconic State Park boasts 15 tent sites and 26 tent platform sites with views of the Taconic Mountain Range, pond and nearby countryside, where countless activities will keep you busy during your stay.

> Bikina

No matter your level, enjoy biking through the heart of the Hudson Valley, with its mix of rolling hills, winding roads, magnificent views and stops through charming towns and quaint villages along the way. Bike shops and rental facilities include Bikeway in Wappingers Falls and City Bike Rentals **PK** in Poughkeepsie. For electric bike rentals, check out Pedego in Beacon. Bike along the Harlem Valley Rail **Trail**—once a rail line for both freight and passengers, now a multi-use path that leads from Wassaic to Millerton and north into Columbia County.

> Kayaking & Boating

At Norrie Point Paddlesport Center in Staatsburg's Mills-Norrie State Park, Atlantic Kayak Tours leads beginnerfriendly short tours and day-long tours that include lunch on the grounds of either the Staatsburgh State Historic Site or Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site. With The River Connection, take in views of Franklin D. Roosevelt's Springwood estate and the Vanderbilt Mansion. The family run enterprise also guides kayakers through Tivoli Bays, a tranquil, 1,722-acre natural heritage area of freshwater marshes occupied by waterfowl and other wildlife. Walk from the Beacon train station to **Scenic Hudson's Long Dock Park**, where **Hudson River Expeditions** launches explorations of **Denning's Point** and Fishkill Creek. A true hidden gem, Quiet Cove Riverfront Park in Poughkeepsie has a new kayak and canoe launch and two observation decks — for fishing, photography or just plain relaxation.

> Sailing & Cruising

Folk music legend and environmental activist Pete Seeger co-founded Hudson River Sloop Clearwater, and today his mission and legacy sail on, embodied by the educational efforts of the sloop **Clearwater**, based in Beacon. Passengers can board a faithful replica of a 19th-century sloop for public and private sails on the river and learn about the role of the river throughout American history and its connection to the modern environmental movement. Or



Cast your line at public fishing streams full of trout in various spots along Route 22, from Dover to Millerton. Try your hand at fly fishing in Wappingers Lake, a shallow impoundment of Wappingers Creek that is filled with largemouth bass, chain pickerel, yellow perch and black crappie. At **Orvis Sandanona**, take lessons in fly fishing or wingshooting from skilled instructors, spend the day upland hunting in the fields, or enjoy a round of sporting clays. It's the oldest permitted shotgun shooting club in the country and has a nationally acclaimed sporting-clays course. **Mountain Valley Farm** in Millerton also offers guided hunting and fishing as well as horseback trail riding, kayaking and camping.

> Fish & Game

> Golf

courses, including the nine-hole Dutcher Golf Course in Pawling and the 18-hole **Dinsmore Golf Course** at Mills-Norrie State Park in Staatsburg, built in the 1890s.

Just off the Taconic State Parkway is the 18-hole championship James Baird State Park Golf **Course**, which is known for its lengthy fairways and tricky shots. Poughkeepsie's McCann Memorial Golf Course, designed in 1972 by William F. Mitchell and updated in 2001 by Stephen Kay, features a formidable assortment of blind tee shots, water hazards and other obstacles.

Robert Trent Jones Sr. set the 18-hole **Casperkill Golf Club** amongst soaring ancient oaks and the meandering Casperkill Creek. In southern Dutchess, The Beekman Golf Course lies at the foothills of the Berkshire Mountains, offering spectacular views along the 27 holes of the USGA-rated course. One reviewer described The Links at Union Vale as "18 holes of Ireland in Dutchess County."

The **Red Hook Golf Club** in northern Dutchess is player-friendly and appeals to a wide range of skill levels. College Hill and Vassar Golf Courses in Poughkeepsie and Dogwood Knolls Golf Course in Hopewell Junction are family-friendly nine-hole golf courses that are perfect when you're looking to get out for a quick game.

Fishkill Golf Course and Driving Range makes a fine practice facility with a 12-hole executive course and grass tee range. In addition to the driving range at **Par Fore Golf Center**, families can take advantage of batting cages and a mini-golf course.

History Comes Alive


Discover Dutchess' rich past and the stories of the people – explorers, artists, taste-makers and more — who called this special place home.

> Bannerman's Castle

Visit Pollepel Island in the Hudson River to view the ruins of the Scottish-style castle. It was built in the early 1900s by Francis Bannerman VI to store military surplus items. Only accessible by boat or kayak from Beacon, the castle, residence and restored gardens can be explored by guided walking tours. Special events and exhibits, movie nights, lectures and theatrical performances offer memorable experiences with amazing views of the Hudson Highlands.

> Wilderstein Historic Site

Wilderstein Historic Site in Rhinebeck was the home of Franklin D. Roosevelt's cousin and close confidant Margaret "Daisy" Suckley. With its five-story circular tower, the brightly painted Queen Anne-style Victorian house, built in 1852, is a dazzling sight to behold. Wilderstein, or "wild man's stone," references a Native American petroglyph found on the property, a nod to the original habitants of the Hudson Valley.



> Montgomery Place

Montgomery Place in Red Hook is the region's only surviving Federal-era estate house, with walking trails that reveal gorgeous views of the Catskill Mountains. It was built in 1805 by Janet Livingston Montgomery, the widow of Revolutionary War hero General Richard Montgomery.

> Locust Grove Estate

In Poughkeepsie, explore Locust Grove, the summer retreat of telegraph and code inventor Samuel F. B. Morse. The

Italianate-style mansion is now open for tours, allowing visitors an up-close view of more than 15,000 pieces of fine and decorative arts, paintings and furniture. Explore the grounds, which feature 200 acres of hiking trails, an ornamental flower garden and river vistas.



> Staatsburgh State Historic Site

Step back in time at the lavish country home of Ogden and Ruth Livingston Mills, one of several opulent Gilded Age estates overlooking the Hudson. Tour the Beaux-Arts mansion of 79 rooms and explore the 192-acre property, which features a variety of hiking, biking and cross-country trails directly on the Hudson River in Mills-Norrie State Park. Plus, check out Titanic-themed tours, special exhibits and live music on the lawn.

> Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome



The Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome preserves more than 60 antique and reproduction airplanes, plus vintage automobiles and motorcycles. Most notably, it is home to the world's oldest regularly flying airplane, a fully functioning 1909 Bleriot XI. Founded in 1958 by vintage aircraft enthusiast Cole Palen, the Aerodrome includes a flying reproduction of the Spirit of St. Louis, the plane aboard which Charles Lindbergh made the first nonstop solo transatlantic flight in 1927. Watch a thrilling airshow with simulated combat between WWI-era biplanes, monoplanes and triplanes. Book your own 15-minute flight in a 1929 New Standard D-25 biplane with an experienced pilot and up to three passengers.

> HISTORIC HYDE PARK

Franklin D. Roosevelt, 32nd President of the United States, was born in 1882 in Hyde Park at Springwood and raised there by his parents. He returned after marrying his distant cousin Eleanor in 1905. The Home of Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site offers visitors the chance to view the Roosevelts' rare family photographs and furniture, tour their World War II-era victory garden, walk the trails of the estate and visit their Rose Garden grave sites. During his presidency, he built the nearby Dutch Colonialstyle **Top Cottage** as his personal quarters, where he penned his memoirs and met with several world leaders.

Val-Kill at the Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site across town is the only National Historic Site dedicated to a first lady. Here, Eleanor employed local artisans to produce hand-crafted home goods and furniture. She lived in the main stone cottage residence after FDR died until her 1962 death. Today, Val-Kill features a permanent exhibit documenting her rise as a social and political leader.

In 1938, FDR devised the idea of establishing a public repository for the thousands of documents related to his lengthy political career, and in 1941, he opened the nation's first presidential library adjacent to his home, which has provided the template for subsequent presidential libraries. The engaging and interactive **Franklin D. Roosevelt** Presidential Library and Museum chronicles the lives of the Roosevelts, including Franklin's state and national political ascendancy and general life in early-20th-century America. Among the facility's standout exhibits are a recreation of the secret White House map room with a timeline of World War II battles; FDR's 1936 Ford Phaeton automobile, which was outfitted with special hand controls for the polio-afflicted president; and replicas of 1930s and '40s living rooms and kitchens, where visitors can listen to a recording of one of Roosevelt's famous fireside chats.



A great way to get a glimpse into the Gilded Age is with a visit to Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site. It was the country home of railroad magnate Frederick William Vanderbilt and his wife, Louise. Designed by the renowned architectural firm of McKim, Mead & White and built between 1896 and 1899, the mansion boasts 54 rooms—including a "gold room" and a grand room—which were outfitted with state-of-the-art electric lighting and indoor plumbing. The estate's perfectly symmetrical Italianinspired gardens—which have been restored and are today fastidiously maintained by a staff of volunteers—and the rest of the grounds of the riverside estate are open to the public, free of charge, between sunrise and sunset and offer perfect spots for picnics.





> Raise the Curtain -

The Nutcracker at The Bardavon, Poughkeepsie

From concerts to comedy, dance, film or theater, Dutchess County has long been a lively epicenter of exceptional entertainment. Top-notch touring artists and productions regularly visit the stages of our theaters, and many local performers and live events are on par with the steady stream of traveling attractions.

> PERFORMING ARTS

Every summer, Vassar College's Powerhouse Theater and New York Stage & Film Summer Season present a dynamic schedule of new plays, musicals, readings and works in progress. Internationally known as the theater that premiered "Hamilton!" before it became a Broadway smash, Powerhouse has cemented its reputation as the place to see a new work while it's in development.

Opened as the Collingwood Opera House in 1869, the opulent structure now known as the Bardavon 1869 Opera **House** has presented performances by the likes of Mark Twain and Aretha Franklin. Today, catch performances by the Hudson Valley Philharmonic, live simulcasts of New York City's Metropolitan Opera and leading performers in music, opera, literature and comedy, including author David Sedaris, Broadway powerhouse Audra McDonald, and EGOT award winner John Legend.

The Stissing Center opened its doors in 2019 after years of renovations and restoration of Pine Plains' Memorial Hall, which was originally built in 1915. The Center acts as an artistic and cultural hub and presents events in music, film,



dance and theater, including the Local Produce Readers' Theatre play-reading series, which features local playwrights and talent, and the Chamber Music Series.

On the campus of Bard College in Annandale-on-Hudson stands the gleaming, magnificent Richard B. Fisher Center for the Performing Arts, which hosts orchestral and jazz concerts, dance productions and other events. The center comes alive, however, during the college's annual SummerScape and Bard Music Festival, which run for eight weeks of superlative concerts, dance, opera, theater, film and discussion. Don't miss the dazzling "tent of mirrors" known as Spiegeltent, June through August.

In Tivoli, diverse world-class performances can be found at Kaatsbaan Cultural Park, an artist sanctuary serving as an incubator for innovative dance, theater, music, film, poetry, culinary, media and visual arts. Tivoli's Tangent **Theatre** showcases mainstage productions and pop-up play readings at intimate settings throughout town. It also hosts the annual NEWvember New Plays Festival.

The Marriott Pavilion on the Hyde Park campus of The Culinary Institute of America hosts the Northern Dutchess Symphony Orchestra, which performs music by well-known composers like John Williams along with innovative, lesserheard works. The CENTER for the Performing Arts at Rhinebeck, a long-running community theater, hosts a popular Saturday morning family series featuring children's performers. The Rhinebeck Chamber Music Society sponsors concerts at the Church of the Messiah every spring and fall, while the Pawling Concert Series presents classical, world and modern music events at the Trinity-Pawling School. The architecturally gorgeous Howland Cultural Center just celebrated its 150th year in Beacon and continues to be a community arts and performance space hosting the Howland Chamber Music Circle Piano Festival, Beacon Litfest and a variety of workshops, art exhibits and more.

> VISUAL ARTS

The largest jewel in the Dutchess County art crown is **Dia Beacon**, a sprawling former Nabisco box-printing plant and one of the largest exhibition spaces in the U.S. for contemporary art. Its permanent collection contains works by Richard Serra, Sol Lewitt, Dan Flavin, Louise Bourgeois and others. Bask in the natural light from 34,000 square feet of skylights illuminating the galleries and wander through the gardens on the banks of the Hudson River. Dia Beacon is just a 10-minute walk from the Beacon Metro-North station and the Hudson River waterfront.


Many of the Hudson River School paintings of the 19th century that captured the beauty of our landscapes are on display at Vassar College's Frances Lehman Loeb Art **Center** in Poughkeepsie, which offers free admission. Designed by famed architect Cesar Pelli, the museum houses 21,000 pieces in its collection, ranging from antiquities to the present day. See works by Rembrandt, van Gogh, Picasso, Degas, Munch, O'Keefe, Warhol and more.

In terms of artistic mission, the Wassaic Project stands out. In 2008, the 1940s-era mill building in the Amenia hamlet of Wassaic was relaunched as an arts complex angled at uniting visitors and area residents through a philosophy of artistic inclusion and experimentation. The site hosts exhibitions and edgy summer festivals, along with interactive family programs.

In northern Dutchess, the CSS Bard Hessel Museum of Art presents exhibitions of contemporary art year-round on Bard's Hudson River campus. The museum's collection includes more than 3,000 works and is free to visit.







> NIGHTLIFE

The Majed J. Nesheiwat (MJN) Convention Center —

formerly the Mid-Hudson Civic Center — hosts an array of concerts, craft fairs and expos for visitors to enjoy. Conveniently located next door to the Poughkeepsie Grand Hotel & Conference Center, it has hosted comedian Sebastian Maniscalco, Hudson Valley Motorcycle Expo, Foreigner and more.

Fantastic live music can be heard every Wednesday through Sunday at **Daryl's House**, the restaurant and live entertainment venue in Pawling owned by Daryl Hall, half of the musical duo Hall & Oates. At the Pawling venue, fans can sit up close and immerse themselves in rock, blues and soul from national and regional musicians.

Quinn's, housed in a former luncheonette in Beacon, gives you the full indie experience, hosting world-renowned avant-garde jazz musicians and regional rock acts-complete with a bowl of ramen on the side seven days a week.

Catch contemporary and cult-classic rock bands at Poughkeepsie's long-running rock club, **The Chance**. It started as a playhouse and vaudeville theater until becoming a saloon and necessary stopover for bands of the punk and New Wave era. This legendary venue has hosted Pete Seeger, The Ramones, The Police, Bob Dylan, David Bowie and Phish.



Roosevelt National Historic Site is the birthplace and final resting place of America's 32nd president. Eleanor Roosevelt's cottage, **Val-Kill**, is the only National Historic Site dedicated to a first lady. The immersive exhibits at the FDR Presidential Library and **Museum** provide visitors a deeper insight into the Roosevelts and their countless contributions to the world. A Special Exhibit "Black Americans. Civil Rights, and The Roosevelts, 1932-1962" will be on display from June 3, 2023, through Dec. 31, 2024.
