Lake County is a destination for the nature lover with parks, preserves and open spaces for viewing many types of birds, animals and native plants. For the history buff we have

numerous museums, landmarks, pioneer towns and Pomo Indian culture.

Lake County produces wines of compelling quality and character. It is an ideal destination for the wine lover, with some of California's newest appellations, award-winning wines and friendly wineries that consistently receive rave reviews from visitors.

Visitors can take a springtime mule-drawn wagon tour of a historic ranch complete with authentic chuckwagon barbecue and local wine, go soaring in a glider high above hills and valleys covered in vineyards, majestic oaks, and whispering pines, or paddle a kayak for an up-close view of nesting herons, soaring eagles or dancing grebes.

Any time of year is right for discovering Lake County. In spring, vibrant redbud blossoms and wildflowers blanket valleys and meadows, making the area's already-stunning landscape even more picturesque. During summer, warm weather and the lure of the lakes beckon, enticing visitors to a myriad of activities at the water's edge. Independence Day celebrations include parades and a series of fantastic fireworks displays over Clear Lake.

With autumn comes the joy of exploring roadside farm stands, harvest festivals and tasting rooms to savor the flavors of the area's premium pears, crunchy walnuts and award-winning wines. Late fall and winter activities include holiday fairs and festivals, lighted parades, concerts and

a variety of live performances by extremely talented local musicians and actors.

Lake County's four fun-filled casinos are the perfect year-round destination for those wishing to try their luck with a multitude of slot machines and table games. Visitors also enjoy live entertainment and the great dining options available at each casino.

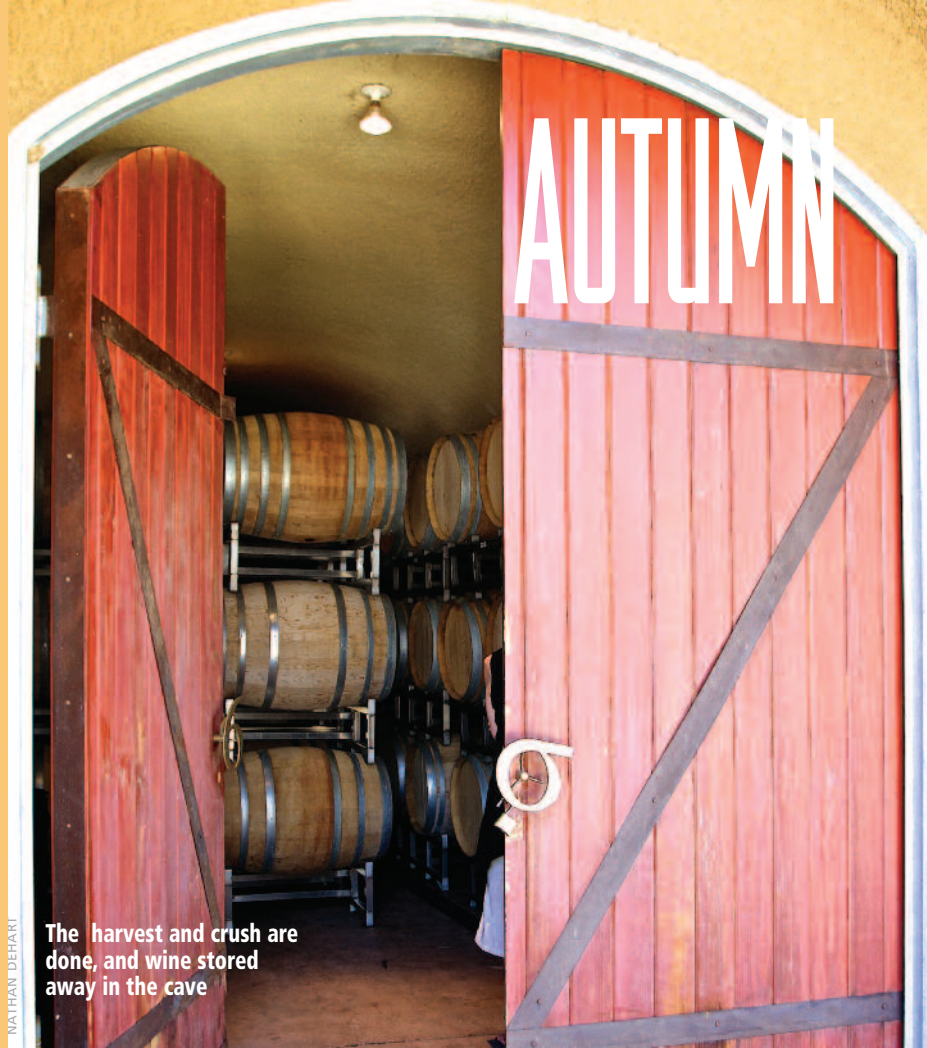

Lake County's primary business and enterprise sectors include wine and agriculture, education, hospitality and resorts, recreation and tourism, health care services, retail, senior housing, and green energy.

The Lake County Board of Supervisors continues to invest in projects to make Lake County an even more attractive place to live, work, and play – from improvements along the north shore of Clear Lake to the monumental opening in 2011 of Mount Konocti County Park, which put much of Lake County's iconic mountain into public hands for perpetuity.

County and City officials are committed to creating a favorable environment for businesses; maintaining a high quality of life for residents; and providing enjoyable amenities for visitors. 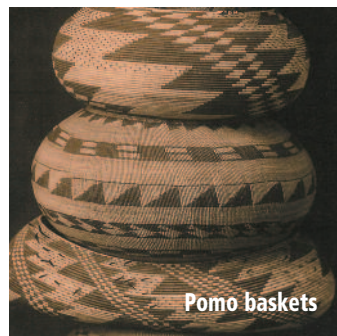
HISTORY AND HERITAGE

GEOLOGY

Geologists have determined that Clear Lake is the oldest lake in the New World. Though lakes and marshes have existed here for 2.5 million years, the lake, as we know it today, is at least 500,000 years old. During that time, its outlet has changed from flowing east toward the Sacramento River and west to the Russian River; the most recent change occurred about 12,000 years ago when the southern and eastern arms of the lake deepened, shifting the outlet to the south.

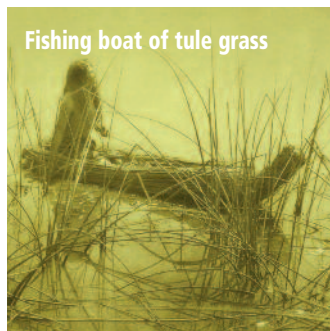
Mount Konociti rises above Clear Lake and is the most prominent volcano in the Clear Lake Volcanic Field at 4,299 feet. The lake basin was created, and is maintained, as a result of this volcano; the Earth's crust slowly sinks to compensate for the magma that flowed out of this volcano between 600,000 and 300,000 years ago. The lake basin is sinking at about 1/4" each year.

NATIVE PEOPLES

The ancestors of Lake County's Pomo- and Wappo-speaking people arrived in the area 20,000 and 14,000 years ago (12,000 years before the Egyptian civilization). Their languages belong to the two oldest language families in the New World. Some present-day reservations are located on ancient ancestral sites. The Lake Miwok at the south

end of Clear Lake are more recent arrivals.

The Native population relied on at least 2,000 different plants, fish and animals; many (such as Grebe, and Bald and Golden eagles) were considered sacred and not hunted. Tule reeds were used for house and boat construction, clothing, and food. Willow, sedge, and redbud were used for basket making; special gift baskets were often decorated with beads and feathers.

They were the first farmers in the county, collecting and processing grain crops by 8,000 years ago. By 6,000 years ago they were living in "orchards" of oak trees that provided acorns, a storable food source. With this abundance, there was no need for warfare and all groups lived together peaceably.

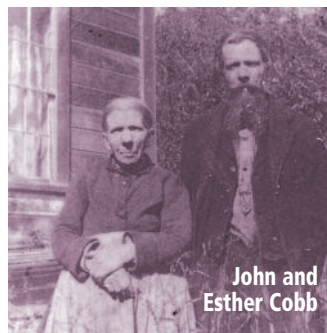
Lake County's Native people were one of the wealthiest and most influential groups in California. They controlled the obsidian that was traded and used for making tools all over California, they used shell (traded from the Pacific Coast) to manufacture beads that served as currency in California's prehistoric economy, and they controlled access along a main trade route between the coast and the central valley.

.....Researchers estimate Lake County's prehistoric population at between 9,000–12,000 before European arrival, at which time there were 31 major villages around the Clear Lake shoreline representing 11

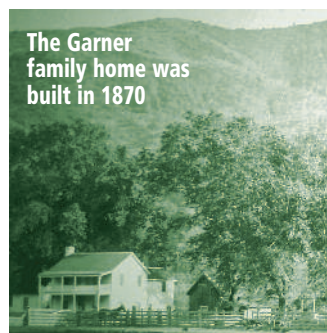
distinct tribes. In the late 1500s European diseases swept through the Americas, eliminating roughly one half of Lake County's Native population. Enslavement and mistreatment by the Spanish missions, Mexican and early European settlers during the 1800s further reduced the Native population to about 450 by 1900.

Today, seven Pomo tribes still inhabit the County. Many traditional cultural ways have been handed down through generations and are still practiced by some of the families. Four of these tribes operate casinos.

PIONEERS

In 1839, Salvador Vallejo received Spanish land grants in the areas from Upper Lake to Big Valley, and brought in large herds of horses and cattle. In 1847 he sold his lands to Andrew Kelsey and Charles Stone. By the mid-1850s, American and European pioneer families were making their homes in Lake

Did you know?

The steamer "City of Lakeport" was built in 1874, shipped in two pieces to Ukiah, and hauled to Clear Lake by wagon. It provided mail, cargo, and passenger service from 1875–1908. The "Lady of the Lake" carried visitors to various lakeside resorts between 1866–1893.

County, planting orchards and tending cattle ranches and farms. Mines yielded quicksilver and borax. Privately owned toll roads crossed

the mountains, bringing more people, who built stores, banks, churches, saloons, and other businesses, forming communities in the hills and around Clear Lake.

The act for combining portions of Napa, Mendocino, and Colusa counties to form Lake County was approved by the California Governor on May 20, 1861, with Lakeport as the County Seat. The first courthouse, a wooden structure built in 1861, burned in 1867. It was replaced by a concrete-covered brick courthouse, completed in 1871, the first California courthouse listed in the National Register of Historic Buildings, and now home to the Lake County Historic Courthouse Museum.

FARMERS

Settlers began planting vineyards in the 1850s, which flourished in the Mediterranean microclimates and soil rich in volcanic ash. In 1888, British actress Lillie Langtry purchased 4,190 acres in the Guenoc Valley, which had been planted with vineyards in 1854. She brought her own winemaker and introduced her first vintage in 1891.

By 1884, Lake County had nearly 600 acres of vineyards, but Prohibition (1920–1933) swiftly ended what had become an internationally-recognized wine industry. Ranchers pulled out grapevines and replanted with walnut, pear, and other fruit trees.

By 1960, only 100 acres remained in vineyards, but Lake County farmers began planting vineyards again. This time, the wine industry survived, and it continues to progress as Lake County's winegrapes are in high demand and its wines are winning national and international awards.

TOURISTS

Imagine...ferrying four hours by boat across the San Francisco Bay to Vallejo, hopping on a train to Calistoga, riding by stagecoach over Mt. St. Helena to

Middletown, continuing up over Cobb Mountain or on to Lower Lake—then taking a steamer ferry ride across Clear Lake to your final destination! That’s what it took to visit Lake County in 1874.

Although Lake County never acquired a railroad system, a powerful force pulled in tons of long-distance travelers: the mineral springs. Thought to possess medicinal virtues and heal the physically, mentally, and emotionally ill, visitors traveled for entire days to reach the revered springs, which also doubled as “pleasure palaces” for many.

Hotels and retreats were built at a feverish pace throughout the region. By the 1880s, the hills were dotted with

luxurious resorts built around mineral springs. Wealthy travelers from San Francisco and other parts of the world frequented the resorts, traveling to “take the waters,” enjoy nature, and indulge in lavish parties at these establishments.

Popular resorts of the times included Bartlett, Highland, Harbin, Pearson, Seigler, Adams, and Anderson Springs.

The 1906 earthquake caused many of the hot springs to stop or slow down; in the years that followed, fires destroyed most of the historic resorts that remained, while others were torn down.

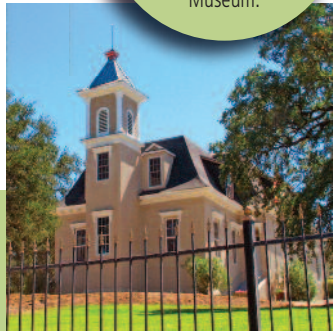
Today, tourists escaping the urban world still enjoy unspoiled scenic beauty and a variety of activities in Lake County.

Ely Stage Stop and Country Museum Offers Peek at Agricultural Past

Located near Kelseyville, the Ely Stage Stop dates back to the 1880s and, over the years, served as a stagecoach stop, hotel, post office, general store, and at one point, even a gas station before taking on its current role as a historical and community center.

The original building was part of the homestead of the vast S-Bar-S Ranch, and in 2007, through a generous donation by Beckstoffer Vineyards, the structure was moved to another part of the former ranch. This building inspired the vision for the Ely Stage Stop and Country Museum, and after careful restoration and ongoing preservation, it

opened in 2011 to offer visitors from all over the world an opportunity to learn about Lake County’s agricultural heritage. The plan for the museum complex encompasses several reconstructed old barns, farm equipment displays, agricultural demonstrations, and interpretive and living history exhibits, including a blacksmith shop, the next volunteer project.

The Ely Stage Stop and Country Museum is a joint project of the County of Lake and the Lake County Historical Society.

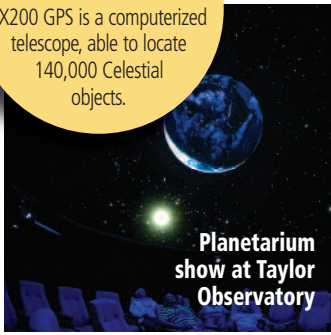

Look for the symbol throughout this publication for places where pets are allowed; always be sure to inquire beforehand as policies change. Many lodging establishments and most campgrounds and RV parks allow dogs.

WHERE TO GO

The Edgewater Resort on Soda Bay has been featured in books on traveling with your pets, and **The Lodge at Blue Lakes** has a dog agility course and hosts weekend camps for dogs.

The Blue Moon Café in the Clear Lake Rivas offers dog-friendly patio dining.

Events such as **Lower Lake Daze**, the **Kelseyville Pear Festival**, and the **Middletown Days Parade** include dogs in the parade, as well as among the audience.

Middletown Trailside Nature Preserve County Park west of Middletown, **Clear Lake State Park** near Kelseyville, the **Mendocino National Forest** near Upper Lake, and **Boggs Mountain Demonstration State Forest** on Cobb Mountain, all have pet-friendly walking and hiking trails for leashed dogs (the latter two

also offer camping); just follow the signs regarding areas where leashes are required. **Highland Springs Recreation Area** south of Lakeport and Kelseyville is also dog-friendly, and has a disc (Frisbee) golf course as well.

DESIGNATED DOG AREAS

Dogs that are on-leash and under their owner's control are welcome in several County parks in the following designated, posted dog areas. Dogs also are allowed on boat launches and ramps when exiting watercraft. Dogs are not allowed at any time on playgrounds, ball fields, grassy areas, or beachfronts other than those listed below.

- Lucerne Harbor Park – east end of parking lot near playground, on beach
- Hammond Park in Nice – signed and fenced area near Lakeshore Drive
- Keeling Park in Nice – on beach south of the boat ramp
- Clearlake Oaks boat launch facility – on beach west of the breakwater
- Lakeside Park in Kelseyville – fenced area at west end of park, interior park roads
- Middletown County Park Trailside Nature Preserve – interior park roads
- Highland Springs Recreation Area south of Lakeport

- Westside Community Park in Lakeport – fenced dog area
- Redbud Park at Thompson Harbor in Clearlake has dog waste disposal bags in parking lot

Important: Remember, it can be hot and dry in Lake County during the height of summer and early fall, so be sure not to leave your dog unattended in the car, and carry extra water and a dog bowl with you at all times.

NATURE AND OUTDOORS

THE BEAUTY OF THE LAKES AND LAND

KONOCTI REGIONAL TRAILS SYSTEM

Lake County is a haven for outdoor enthusiasts, with access to over 600,000 acres of public lands featuring 100 miles of hiking trails. Mendocino National Forest (MNF), the largest landholding in the county, boasts an additional 355 miles of forest roads for hiking, biking and horseback riding, and 235 miles for off-highway vehicle use. It is the only national forest in California without a major paved road, affording outstanding opportunities for backpackers seeking solitude. In addition to MNF, horseback riding enthusiasts will find a growing number of opportunities. Numerous trails and a horse camp are available at Boggs Mountain Demonstration State Forest in the village of Cobb; Kelseyville's Highland Springs Recreation Area offers several miles of trails with vistas of Mount Konocti. Longer rides and backcountry trails and campsites are available in the Cache Creek Natural Area and in North Cow Mountain.



The Konocti Regional Trails (KRT) Team is a group of dedicated outdoor enthusiasts actively working to expand and promote Lake County's existing network of trails. The goal is to create a system of linked pathways that connect recreational destinations, communities, and regional attractions. The gem of the network is Mount Konocti County Park, first opened to the public in September 2011. Whatever your passion, the KRT will offer hiking, biking, horseback riding, paddling, or simply, solitude.

Mount Konocti This ancient towering volcano provides a backdrop to California's Clear Lake. Home to falcons and other raptors, sacred to Native Americans, and the subject of legends, the mountain is one of the few landmarks ever-visible from most locations throughout the county. In private hands since the mid-1800s, few have enjoyed the breath-

taking beauty seen from the top. With Lake County's recent acquisition of 1,520 acres on Mount Konocti there are now over 2,300 acres of public land on the mountain, including all five of the main peaks. Initially available to hikers, the Wright Peak Summit Trail allows trails enthusiasts to experience stellar panoramic views of Clear Lake, the Sutter Buttes, the Snow Mountain back country and – on a clear day – Mount Lassen from the mountain's highest peak (4,299'). Other points of interest include the homesteader's cabin of Mary Downen – built in 1904 – and her son-in-law's gravesite, marked by an inscription on an enormous boulder. Park facilities are designed to have a minimal impact on the mountain, and only include bathrooms and picnic facilities. Hikers need to bring water, cell phone, and other necessities as there are no full-time rangers or developed amenities. Efforts are on-going to expand and develop new trails throughout the park and to connect nearby Clear Lake State Park to the top of the mountain. In the spring and fall months, local historians and naturalists lead scheduled docent tours throughout the park. Contact Public Services.....262-1618

Getting there: From downtown Kelseyville, take Main Street a few blocks south, turn left onto Konocti Road, and travel four miles to the parking lot and trailhead.

Water Trails

Similar to hiking trails, water trails – developed specifically for non-motorized boating – allow recreational paddlers the opportunity to learn about the Clear Lake watershed while fishing, birdwatching, or enjoying Lake County's clean air and beautiful vistas.

As part of the Konocti Regional Trails System, the seven water trails on Clear Lake are the first step in an integrated system, featuring 50 miles of paddling trails ranging from 4 to 10 miles, and from beginner to advanced experience levels.

The Water Trail brochures and maps help paddlers view wildlife and scenery only accessible via water along portions of Clear Lake's 100-mile shoreline, meandering through tule wetlands, down Cache Creek, and past heron rookeries at Rodman Slough and Anderson Marsh.

CLEAR LAKE... A NATURAL TREASURE

Clear Lake is the largest natural freshwater lake in California, with 68 square miles of surface area, more than 100 miles of shoreline, and an average depth of 28 feet.

Clear Lake is the oldest lake in the New World. The lake as we know it is at least 500,000 years old. The Oaks Arm and Lower Arm were marshy areas until the basin deepened between 12,000 and 17,000 years ago.

Clear Lake lies in a broad basin in the Coast Ranges of Northern California. A vast watershed, relatively shallow depth, and temperate climate keep Clear Lake's water warm and rich in nutrients, making it highly productive, or eutrophic. Studies indicate that Clear Lake has been eutrophic—providing abundant food for fish and wildlife—since the last Ice Age, more than 10,000 years ago.

The Clear Lake Basin is home to year-round populations of ducks, pelicans, grebes, herons, egrets, osprey, and winter populations of bald eagles. The Basin also supports abundant populations of deer, bears, mountain lions, raccoons, and other animals.

Archaeological evidence indicates humans have lived in the Clear Lake region for at least 20,000 years.

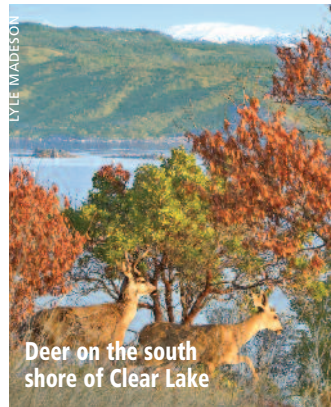
Efforts to reduce nitrogen input into Clear Lake since the 1960s have improved water clarity. With the reduction of food for blue-green algae, more sunlight gets through the lake's shallow waters, thereby allowing rooted plants to establish, grow and reach the water surface to generate seeds for the next crop.



Clear Lake's healthy ecosystem provides abundant food for many fish and animal species

Did you know?
Clear Lake is at least half a million years old, making it the oldest lake in the New World.

A restoration effort for Clear Lake is the Middle Creek Flood Damage Reduction and Ecosystem Restoration Project. This will reconnect more than 1,650 acres of former wetland and floodplain to Clear Lake. When complete, the project will eliminate substandard levees, restore natural habitat, and ultimately improve water quality with the increased wetlands that will once again act as a vast nutrient filter for water entering the lake from Middle and Scotts creeks via Rodman Slough.



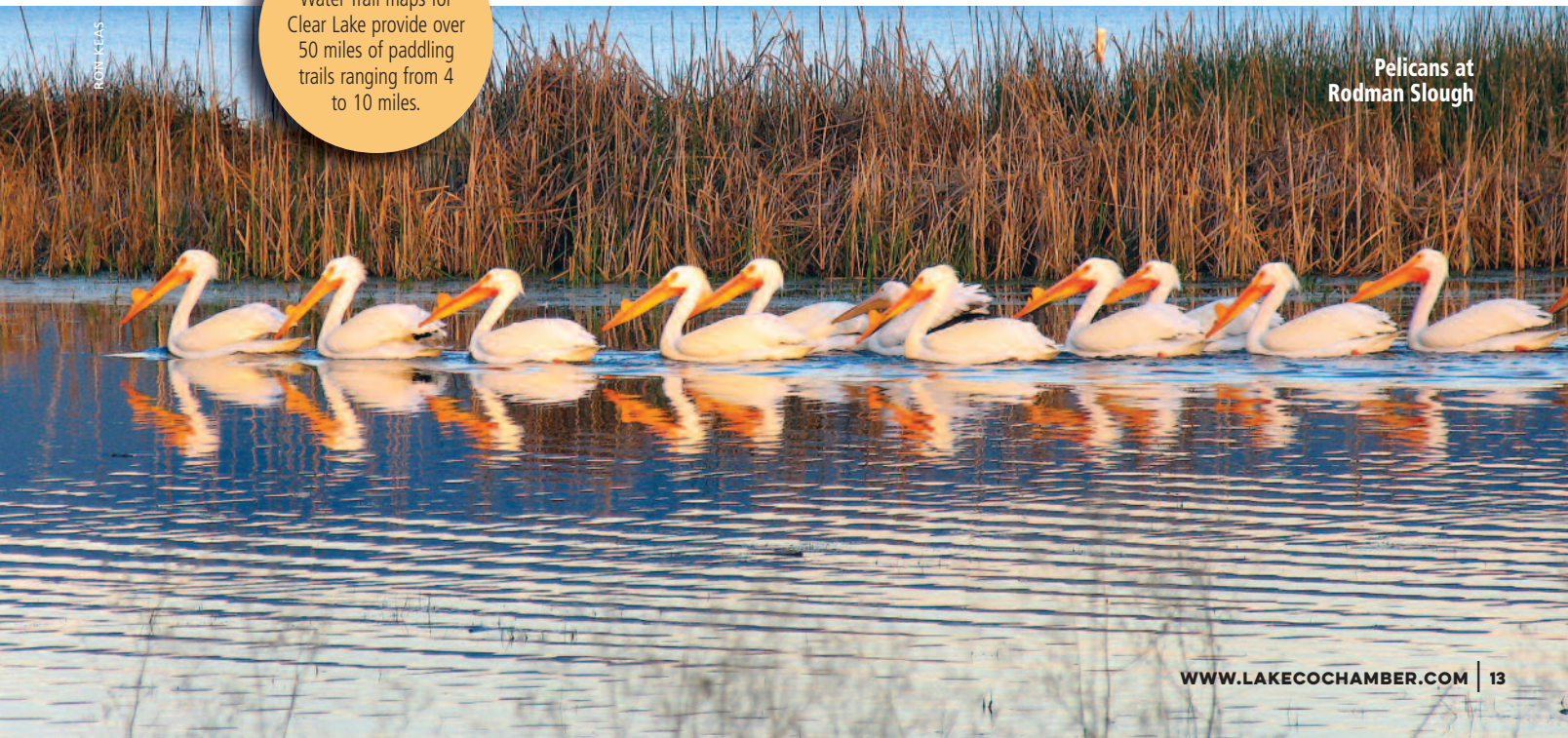

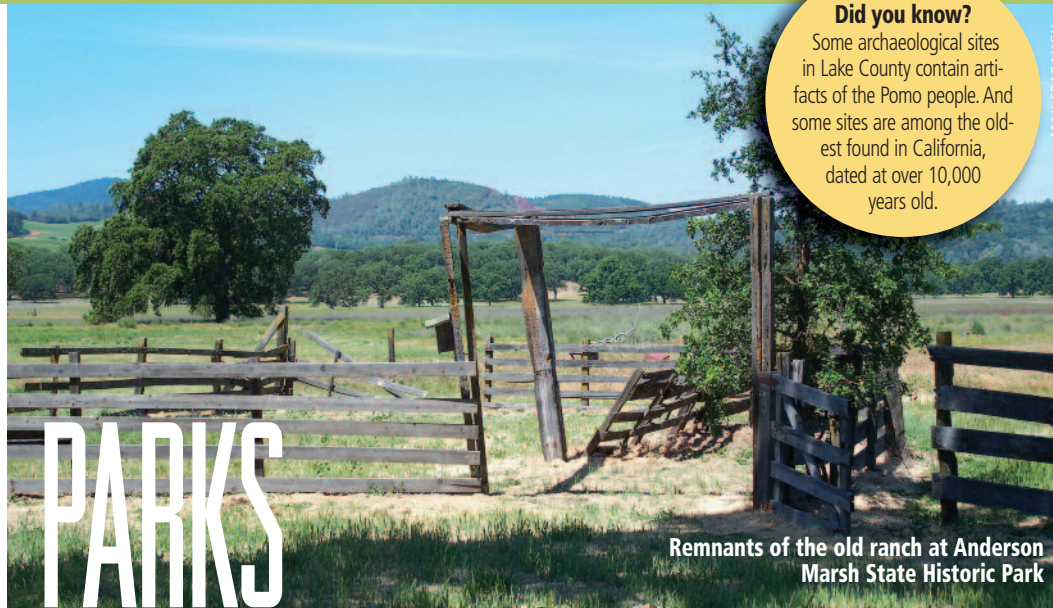

Anderson Marsh State Historic Park 🏞️

During the past 6,000 years, Anderson Marsh was home to the political and religious center of the Koi Tribe of Pomo. The park protects significant natural and cultural resources.

Several mostly-level foot trails wind through 1,065 acres of riparian, grassland, oak woodland, and tule marsh habitats. There are five major foot trails – the lovely McVicar Trail, the Marsh, Ridge, Anderson Flats, and the Cache Creek Nature Trail which features interpretive displays.

Wildlife, waterfowl, and other bird viewing can be done by both land and water, with exceptional sightings found in the marsh. An old ranch house is the starting point for monthly tours.

Along with various species of fish, wildlife include the Northwestern pond turtles, bats, gray foxes, frogs, garter snakes, western rattlesnakes, mink, muskrats, opossums, raccoons, river otters, skunks, and toads. For information call995-2658 or 279-2267

Boggs Mountain Demonstration State Forest 🏞️

Boggs is 4 miles wide and 2.25 miles long, with a total of 3,493 acres of land at elevations between 2,400 and 3,750 feet. Temperatures can get as low as 13° F and as high as 105° F throughout the year.

Ponderosa pine and Douglas fir are major habitat types, as well as chaparral, manzanita, mixed conifer forest, coffeeberry, and live and black oak. Deeper into the forest are meadows with a grazing history going back more than 150 years.

Four main creeks originate near the mountain top, including Mill Creek, Spikenard Creek, Houghton Creek,

and Malo Creek.

Along with several bird species, the black-tailed hare, black bear, bobcat, brush mouse, chipmunk, deer mouse, dusky-footed woodrat, gray fox, mountain lion, mule deer, ornate shrew, raccoon, western gray squirrel, wild pig, garter snake, sagebrush lizard, southern alligator lizard, western fence lizard, and western rattlesnake are the major wildlife that call Boggs home.

The forest features 25 miles of unimproved roads, over 22 miles of non-motorized single track multiuse trails, 2 campgrounds, and 1 horse camp. Self-registration & overnight fees at the forest entrance; for group reservations, call928-4379 www.boggsmountain.org

Clear Lake State Park 🏞️ 🏠

Clear Lake State Park provides the best of both worlds with its opportunities for land and water activities. Clear Lake State Park attracts 120,000 visitors annually, who come to swim, fish, boat, waterski, hike, bird, picnic, and, of course, to camp.

The park has eight cabins and four developed campgrounds with a total of 147 individual campsites and two group camps. There are no hookups at sites; bathrooms are located at each of the campgrounds. Water lovers will enjoy a swim beach, boat docks and launches, mooring, piers, boat slips, and a marina. There is also a boardwalk trail that is ADA accessible and includes small decks to allow for accessible fishing along Kelsey Slough.

The Visitor Center features interpretive displays that focus on natural, cultural, and recreational resources, as well as a large aquarium with some of the lake's species.

For land adventurers, the three-mile,

moderately strenuous Dorn Trail winds through oak woodland and chaparral and takes hikers through a variety of vegetation including manzanitas and various native wildflowers. The easier, quarter-mile-long Indian Nature Trail is a self-guided trip back into time, passing through the site of a former Pomo village and demonstrating how Pomo used native plants to meet their daily needs. Birding opportunities and wildlife sightings are common on both trails. Dogs are allowed, on leash. Mendocino National Forest 🏞️

The only one of 18 national forests in California not crossed by a highway or even paved road, Mendocino National Forest is sprawled across Mendocino, Glenn, Tehama, and Lake counties. In all its expansiveness, however, the national gem exudes tranquility.

Some campsites, fishing spots, and picnic areas in Lake County's Upper Lake Ranger District include Bear Creek, Deer Valley, Lower Nye, Middle Creek, and Pine Point. Lake Pillsbury's northern shoreline also is outlined by a handful of campgrounds including Sunset Facilities, Pogie Point Facilities, Oak Flat, Navy Camp, and Fuller Grove. Campsites are open May through September except for Oak Flat, which is open year-round. The forest's largest body of water, Lake Pillsbury is a 2,280-acre lake nestled in the middle of untarnished forestland with two public boat launches, no motor restrictions, and afternoon winds perfect for sailing and sail boarding.

Lake Pillsbury trails include the easy half-mile-long Sunset Trail Nature Loop for hikers only, features chaparral, oak, and

mixed conifers, as well as the more challenging 3.2-mile-long Packsaddle Trail for hikers and horseback riders. Packsaddle is rich with Douglas fir, madrone, black oak, and mixed chaparral.

The Snow Mountain Wilderness Area features the 6.5-mile-long Overlook Loop Trail for hikers and horseback riders, with great views of Mt. Shasta, Mt. Lassen, and the Yolla Bollys, through fir forest, low manzanita, creeks, and unusual plant communities, connecting to East Peak Loop and other trails deeper into the wilderness area. An alternate route, the Waterfall Loop, is 6.8 miles long and leads to views of Lake County's secret waterfalls.

Along with wildlife viewing, hiking and horseback riding, Mendocino National Forest features off-highway vehicle trails. Rodman Slough County Park

Rodman Slough is home to herons of all sorts, egrets, and grebes, all of which can be easily viewed from the water. Osprey rear young in a nest that rests atop a fake telephone pole—that lures the birds to nest on the highest spot around—which was installed for the birds' protection.

The site features a large community of blue oaks, valley oaks, and willows. The bulrushes support a strong population of marsh wrens, and at the lower edges of the slough, fish can be seen spawning and rearing—especially during the spring season. River otter might be spotted cavorting at the water's edge.

Visitors may experience the slough's diverse wildlife in several ways. Boaters can access it from Clear Lake under the bridge near the mouth of the slough and kayakers can put in at the soft launch ramp near the undeveloped county park.

Picnickers can enjoy the lakefront park—with views of Clear Lake and Mount Konocito—anytime. Guided hikes are given at the adjacent Rodman Preserve and Nature Education Center on Saturday mornings (see page 18 for details). 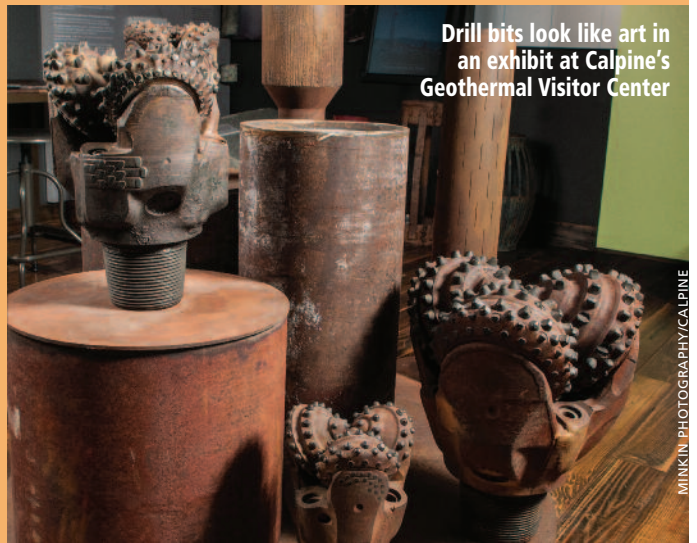
THE GEYSERS: A POWERFUL PLACE

Located in the Mayacamas Mountains along the Lake-Sonoma County line, The Geysers is a truly remarkable place with a rich history. Native Americans, the first known inhabitants of this region, visited the thermal areas for healing and for their ceremonial importance. When rediscovered in the 1840s, The Geysers soon became a world-famous tourist destination. Although there are no actual geysers at the wonder-inspiring region, the inaccurate name stuck. In the past 50 years, The Geysers has emerged as the world leader in generating sustainable geothermal power using steam from deep beneath the earth's surface.

Operating since the first commercial steam well drilled in 1954, today there are 18 geothermal power plants at The Geysers, producing about 24% of California's renewable electric generation and known as the world's single largest geothermal resource developed for electric generation.

POPULAR VIEWING SPOTS

Located along the Pacific Flyway, Lake County hosts more than 300 species of birds. With diverse landscapes sprawled around Clear Lake—the largest natural freshwater lake in California and possibly the oldest in North America—birds and other wildlife make Lake County their home throughout the seasons.

Lake County's resident birds include the great blue heron, green heron, Clark's and Western grebes, egrets, osprey, double-crested cormorant, and black-crowned night heron. As is the trend in other birding areas, a wider variety of birds are present during the winter and early spring months.

Anderson Marsh State Historic Park

By foot or boat, grebes, herons, marsh wrens, coots, mallards, great egrets, and other waterbirds. BIRD GUIDE

GREAT BLUE HERON



Appearance: white head, gray-blue body; up to 4' tall
Home: lives around fresh and salt water, close proximity to other colonies
Diet: fish, frogs, crayfish, snakes
Personality trait: A fish eater with an appetite, it is willing to eat other animals and has been known to choke to death on a fish that just won't fit in its throat.

WESTERN GREBE



Appearance: medium size; black back and face; long, white neck and underside
Home: saltwater bays in the winter, freshwater wetlands while breeding

Diet: fish, retrieved by diving under water
Personality trait: Known for its "rushing ceremony" or "dance"—a mating ritual in which a pair of courting grebes run side by side across the water's surface for up to 20 meters.

OSPREY



Appearance: black back, white belly; just under 2' tall with a wingspan 5' to 6'
Home: builds nest most often on manmade structures, such as telephone poles
Diet: various fish species
Personality trait: Known as the "fish hawk," it hovers just above water for prey and carries fish head-first to their dining location.

DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT



Appearance: immense, white head and body, large bill and pouch, black wingtips, 9' wingspan
Home: lives on large lakes, both coasts, in large flocks
Diet: fish, retrieved by dipping head underwater, flock often herds fish by encircling cooperatively
Personality trait: Flocks soar high in graceful V-formation, circling in unison.

Appearance: large, dark water bird with a long body and neck
Home: tree-top nests made of sticks and materials like rope, deflated balloons, plastic debris, and other junk
Diet: fish, other aquatic animals, insects, amphibians
Personality trait: Pebbles often are found in its nest, where they have been cared for as eggs.

Appearance: immense, white head and body, large bill and pouch, black wingtips, 9' wingspan

ON THE LAKES

BOATING AND FISHING



Whether they come for the fish or the splash, **Clear Lake** is a haven for boating enthusiasts. The largest natural freshwater lake in California, Clear Lake's shores are lined with boat launches—most are free to the public. From paddle to pontoon boats, wakeboards to wave runners, rentals are available at many businesses around Clear Lake (see page 22). One of the most popular places for launching a boat is **Clear Lake State Park**, which features a marina, swim beach, fishing pier, lakeside camping, hiking trails, and a visitor center.

The lake is brimming with many species of fish, including catfish, carp, crappie, and bluegill, and most notably, bass. In fact, two-thirds of the fish caught are largemouth bass. Major national bass tournament tours make a stop here; the average tournament-winning weight can be more than 5 pounds, a weight unmatched by any other lake in the nation. Clear Lake has earned a reputation for being home to "monster bass," and those in the know refer to Clear Lake as the "Bass Capital of the West." Even organizations like U.S. Bass, Cal Bass, and Western Bass agree that Clear Lake is the "number one bass lake in the nation."

Northwest of Clear Lake, fishing opportunities abound in the cold, clear waters of **Blue Lakes**, which has rainbow trout, catfish, bluegill, and black bass; no boat may exceed 5 mph, making the lakes perfect for kayaks, canoes, paddleboats, or a quiet day of fishing or swimming. **Lake Pillsbury**, nestled in the middle of the Mendocino National Forest due north of Clear Lake and surrounded by mountains, has black bass, pumpkinseed sunfish, and rainbow trout; all types of boats and lake activities are welcome. Remote and peaceful Indian Valley Reservoir to the northeast, where boats are required to stay below 10 mph, has rainbow trout, black bass, catfish, kokanee, and crappie. Southwest of Clear Lake, the **North Fork of Cache Creek** has rainbow trout. Due south, **Highland Springs Reservoir** has catfish, black bass, crappie, and bluegill, and any boat without a gas-powered motor is welcome; visitors also can hike, play disc golf or horseshoes, or enjoy a picnic in the area's oak woodland and brushy terrain.

Several businesses around Lake County offer fishing licenses and supplies, including a variety of bait and tackle. Professional fishing guides offer instruction year-round, as well as gear, sightseeing and hunting tours, nature photography opportunities, and more.

Did you know?

PROTECT OUR WATERS—STOP AQUATIC HITCHHIKERS!

Love to spend time on the water? Help protect Lake County's beautiful lakes and creeks by preventing the spread of harmful plants, animals, and other organisms, such as Quagga and Zebra Mussels. These aquatic nuisance species can hitch a ride on boats, clothing, gear, and other items used in the water and then spread to other bodies of water. If the conditions are right, these introduced species can become established and create drastic results.

Follow these simple procedures each time you leave the water:

- Remove any visible mud, plants, fish, or animals before transporting equipment.
- Eliminate all water from equipment before transporting.
- Clean, drain, and dry anything that came in contact with water or mud (boats, trailers, equipment, clothing, dogs, etc.).
- Never release plants, fish, or animals into a body of water unless they came out of that body of water.

To protect local water bodies from invasive species, Lake County requires all motorized vessels to have an inspection sticker prior to launching in Lake County. \$1000 fine for sticker violations. You can get a sticker at any location in this guide with  in its listing. Lake County has deep roots in agriculture dating back 6,000 years when the Native people tended and pruned “orchards” of oak trees throughout the valleys. Its rural landscape offers a rich tapestry of patterns and colors in its fields, orchards, and vineyards, and a rich heritage of farming and agricultural production that, today, is shared graciously through agritourism. The area is home to a wide range of agritourism operations, including family farm stands

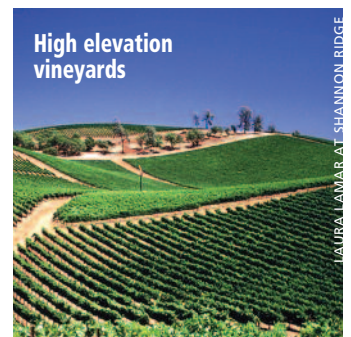
Lake County’s high elevation, distinct volcanic soils, and climate – hot summers and cool winters, clean air, and lots of sunshine – provide ideal growing conditions for dozens of varieties of flavorful winegrapes and many types of suc-

culent pears including the area’s famous Mountain Bartletts. Several varieties of walnuts and olives thrive, and countless other farm-fresh delights can be discovered at local farm stands and farmers’ markets, as well as at several local grocers and wine tasting rooms.

A NEW WINE COUNTRY

While Lake County’s winemaking history traces to the 1880s, the area has seen a recent rebirth as grape growers and vintners alike discover the superb quality of Lake County winegrapes. The local industry is made up of a small cadre of experienced growers who are focused on planting the right varieties in the right locations, innovative and well-known winemakers who are committed to quality and sustainability, professional industry groups that are leading the way with research and education in areas such as high-

elevation viticulture and enology, and friendly tasting room employees who are both knowledgeable and welcoming.

geologic landscape also created an astounding array of soils, from rocky volcanic highlands to mountain valleys lined with gravelly river courses.

Nearly 8,700 acres of vineyards grace the area's hillsides, valleys, terraces, and mountain ridges, with the majority of Lake County vineyards at 1,500 ft and above. Lake County's high-elevation vineyards enjoy both higher ultraviolet light levels, which promote concentrated flavors, and dramatic day-to-night temperature swings, which retain acidity – all of which can be experienced in wines that deliver both intensity and balance.

In this wine region where the

elevation is higher, the summers are drier, and the winters are colder, vines experience less pest and mildew pressure, which is why Lake County ranks among the lowest in terms of pesticide use among California wine regions.

Within Lake County, seven distinct AVAs exist—Clear Lake AVA, Benmore Valley AVA, Guenoc AVA, Red Hills District AVA, Big Valley District-Lake County AVA, Kelsey Bench-Lake County AVA, and High Valley AVA.

WINES WITH ALTITUDE

Over the past decade, the number of wineries in Lake County has grown from just a handful to more than 30, and more than 200 different wine labels outside Lake County use its distinct winegrapes.

The area's two dominant winegrape varieties are Sauvignon Blanc and Cabernet Sauvignon. Most Sauvignon Blanc grapes are grown

in Lake County's valley soils and harvested at different stages of ripeness, making for either crisp, herbaceous, and mineral-style wines or peach, melon, and tropical fruit-flavored wines. Young volcanic soils on ridges and hillsides contain coarse fragments of shiny black obsidian and other rocks and minerals, producing Cabernet Sauvignon grapes that are quite concentrated in flavor. As a result, Lake County has quickly become a leader in the North Coast for both fruit and wine made from these varieties.

In addition to Sauvignon Blanc and Cabernet Sauvignon, many other types of winegrape varieties do well including Zinfandel, Petite Sirah, Chardonnay, Merlot, as well as Syrah, Tempranillo, Barbera, Riesling, Grenache, and Viognier.

WINE HISTORY

Lake County's wine industry, like other North Coast areas, got off to a rapid start in the 1870s, and yet many today proclaim Lake County to be the "Undiscovered Wine Country." What happened in between? By 1884, Lake County's growing industry had 600 acres of winegrapes. Settlers from many parts of Europe and the United States were bringing their viticulture and winemaking expertise to the county. Notable arrivals in the 1880s included Serranus C. Hastings, founder of Hastings Law School, and Lillie Langtry, famous British actress and socialite. Each established a vineyard and winery; Langtry purchased 4,190 acres in Guenoc Valley near Middletown, which included vineyards that had been planted in 1854. She brought her own winemaker, establishing the Guenoc & Langtry Estate Winery – today known as Langtry Estate & Vineyards – with their first vintage in 1891. Young Harvard graduate Charles M. Hammond won best exhibit for dry white and red wines at the 1893 World Exposition in Chicago with wine produced at his Lake County vineyard, earning Lake County a solid reputation for producing some of the world's greatest wines.

Several challenges faced the local wine industry. Despite concerted local efforts, a rail link to the county was never established. Since the 1870s, Lake County had been a popular tourist destination with visitors flocking to its many mineral springs resorts. However, tourism went into decline after the

1906 San Francisco earthquake and with it, part of the local market for wine. The last blow to Lake County's wine industry came with the onset of Prohibition in 1920 as vineyards throughout the county were torn out and replaced by pear and walnut orchards. Only after the Napa Valley wine industry began to make its comeback in the 1960s did Lake County farmers begin to plant vineyards again. By 1990, 2,700 acres of grapes were planted in the county, and in 1991, the Lake County winegrape growers formed the Lake County Winegrape Commission with the objective of increasing the quality, price, and recognition of Lake County winegrapes.

Lake County has since become known as a wine region that produces winegrapes of compelling character with winemakers from across the North Coast recognizing the quality, consistency, and flavor profiles that Lake County grapes deliver to their finished wines. Vineyard acreage in Lake County has continued its steady growth from approximately 5,400 acres in 2002 to 8,700 acres today.

The number of wineries in the county also continues to grow – from just four in 1995 to more than 30 in 2015. So come discover Lake County...while it is still an uphill drive from the Napa Valley, Sacramento Valley, or Ukiah Valley, visitors find knowledgeable growers and winemakers, welcoming tasting rooms, spectacularly scenic high-elevation vineyards, and of course, award-winning wines.

Lake County's rich agricultural heritage is evidenced in long-time traditions like the annual celebration of the pear harvest – the Kelseyville Pear Festival (opposite), the area's largest community festival held on the last Saturday in September that will mark its 23rd year in 2015; the event features pear-packing competitions, cooking demonstrations, pie-eating contests, vendor booths and food, and a showcase of the pear's history in Lake County.

For other "don't miss" agricultural celebrations include Steele Wines Harvest Festival, made famous by its grape-stomping competition for all ages; the Kelseyville Olive Festival, with olive-oil tastings and fun olive-pit-spitting competitions; and the Lake County Wine Adventure, a two-day event in which thousands of locals and visitors tour more than 25 wineries and sip on wines made with Lake County's distinct mountain fruit.

A "Pear Pavilion" features pear tastings, cooking demonstrations, historical photos, agricultural memorabilia, fresh pears, pear products, and pear-inspired gifts. Stop by early to get a pear pie or turnovers,

The festival also features a quilt show, fine arts exhibits, arts and crafts vendors, wine tasting, musicians, dancers, and an antique tractor and farm equipment display. PEAR HERITAGE

The very first pears were planted here in the 1880s. Great-grandfather of Myron Holdenried (founder of Wildhurst Vineyards), Louis Henderson planted pears in 1890 and those orchards are still in production today, farmed by Myron's cousin Diane Henderson. Thomas Porteus is credited for planting the first commercial orchard in Lake County in the late 1800s, four acres in Big Valley. L.P. Clendenin in Scotts Valley, J.B. Laughlin and George Akers of Kelseyville, and J.W. Annette of Finley followed his lead, and by 1919, 700 acres of pears were planted in the county. In the early 1920s, the California Packing Company was established and operated the largest dry yard in the world in Kelseyville, which today is the site of Adobe Creek Packing Company. Until after World War I, early fruit was dried and primarily shipped to Europe where food was desperately needed. In the mid-1920s, Europe required a tariff on imported foods just as boxing fresh fruit became the norm. While most boxed fruit was shipped by train, Lake County—which has never had a rail system—had to haul pears by truck over the Hopland grade or to Ukiah. Throughout the 20th century, Kelseyville was revered as the "pear capital of the world." In 1999 alone, 85,000 tons of pears were processed in Lake County—most in Kelseyville. The Lake County Pear Association was established in 2005 and works to promote the many varieties of Lake County pears. Today, Lake County celebrates its special pears and agricultural history and heritage each year with the Kelseyville Pear Festival—a daylong event that summons thousands.

The Lady of the Lake label was originally a label on Lake County pear boxes and featured the "Lady of the Lake" holding a pear in her palm. In 2004, Mt. Konocti Growers took it upon themselves to update history by combining the area's two best agricultural assets: pears and wine. Lady of the Lake Sparkling Pear Wine uses the nostalgic label, replacing the lady's pear with a champagne glass.

From the Sacramento Valley
From Interstate 5 at Williams, travel west onto Highway 20 (the Tahoe-Pacific Heritage Corridor). The drive from Sacramento is just over 100 miles and takes about two hours.

From Alameda, Contra Costa, Solano, and Napa counties
Take Highway 29 through Calistoga and over Mt. St. Helena into Middletown. From there, you may choose to turn on Highway 175 over Cobb Mountain ending in the Kelseyville area; or continue on Highway 29 to its intersection with Highway 53 at Lower Lake. Turn left on Highway 29 for Kelseyville and Lakeport. Continue north on Highway 53 for the city of Clearlake, and beyond to Highway 20, Clearlake Oaks, and the north shore.

From San Francisco, Marin, Sonoma, and Mendocino counties
Take Highway 101 north; at Hopland, take Highway 175 for 19 miles to Lakeport, or skip the twists and turns of Highway 175 by continuing north on Highway 101 and then taking Highway 20 east, just north of Ukiah.

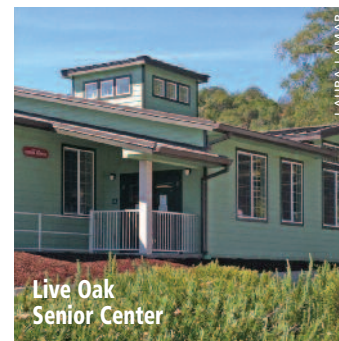

MCU students will be able to earn their Bachelor's Degree in Business, Liberal Arts, and Psychology. For the graduate student, master's degrees in Community Psychology, Business Administration, and Leadership and Global Development are available.

In addition to serving local students, MCU's Southern California students will have the opportunity to study at the University's newest campus while participating in research, internships, and service learning in a program called "Semester at the Lake". The University also will offer professional development courses and continuing education programs.

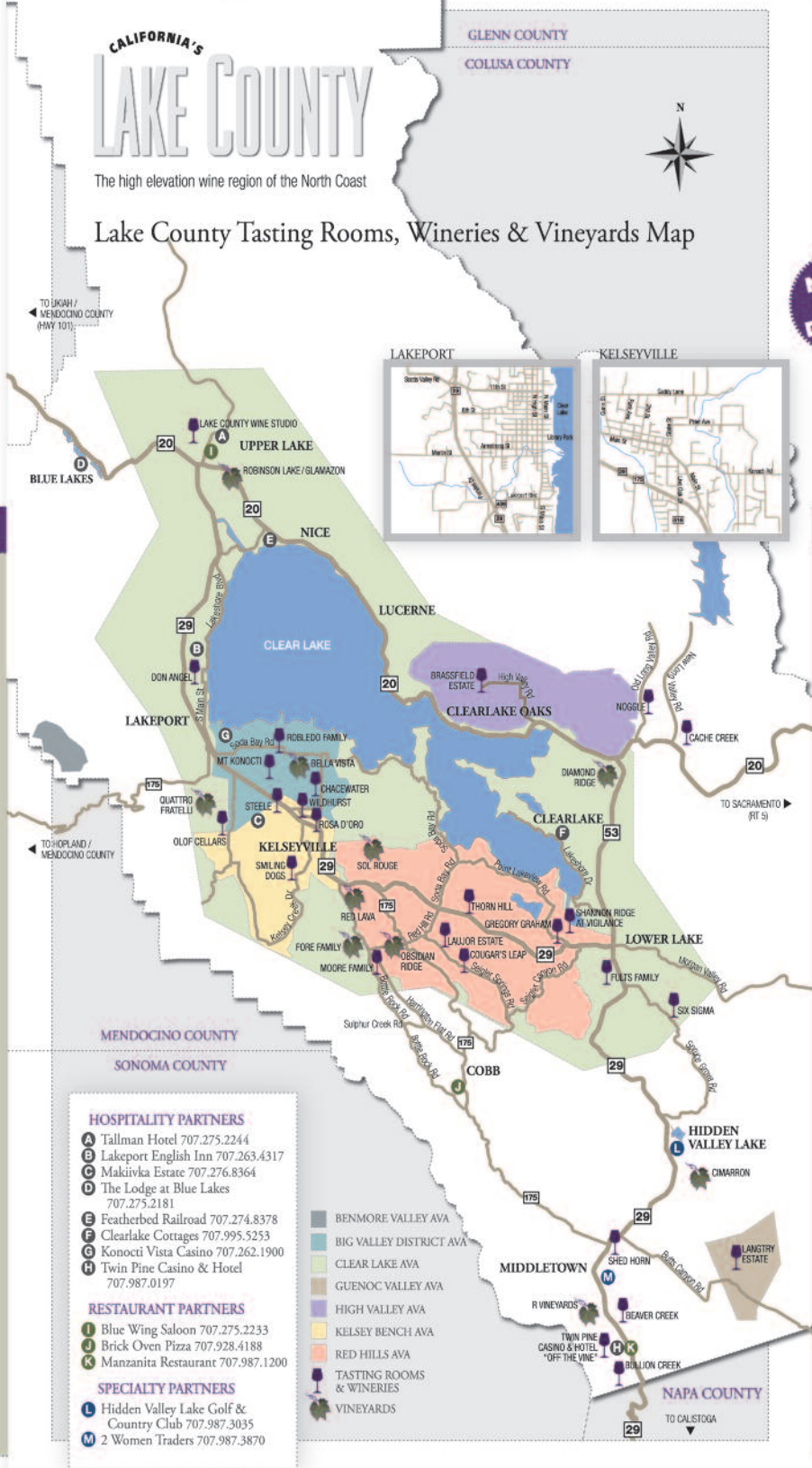

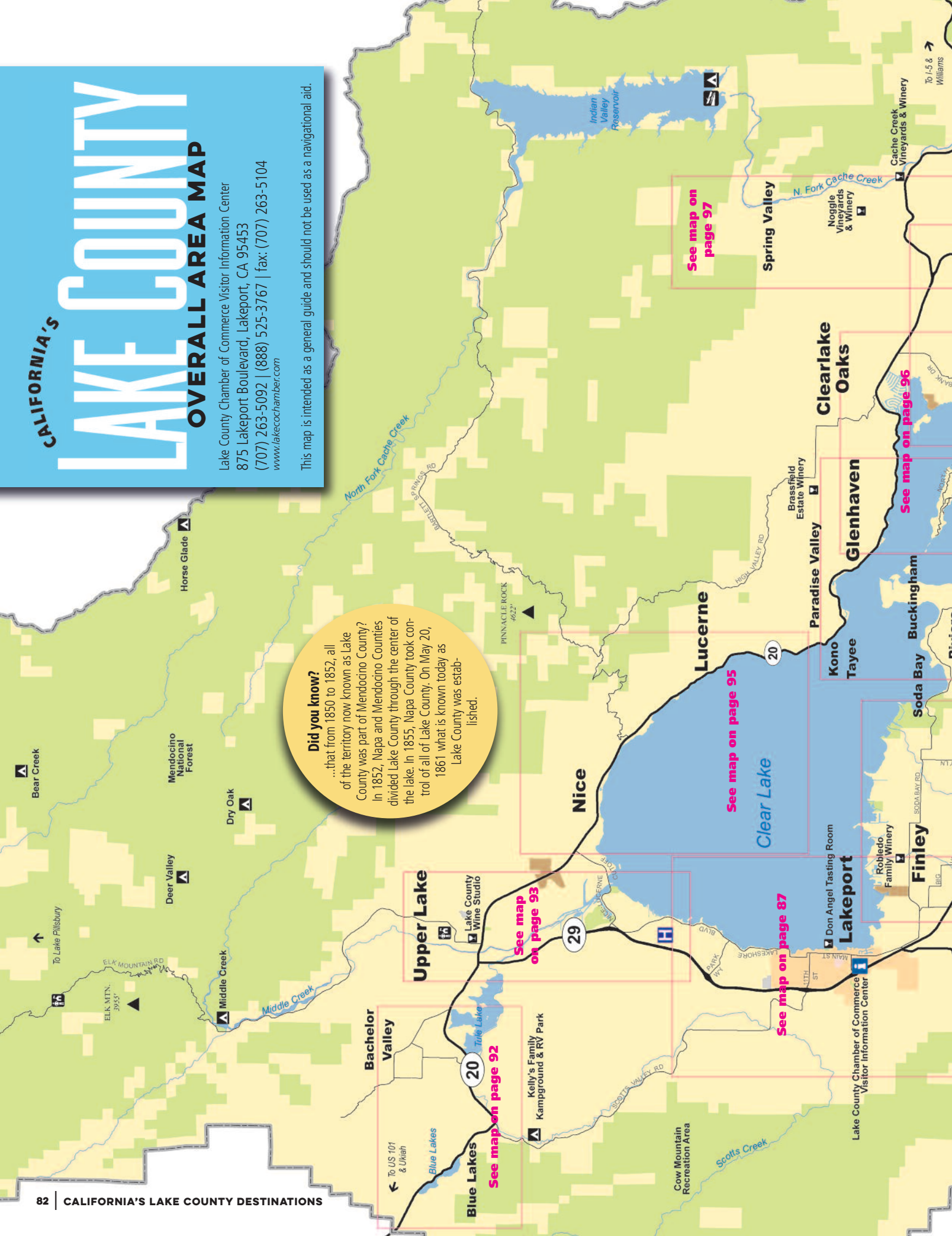
OVERALL AREA MAP

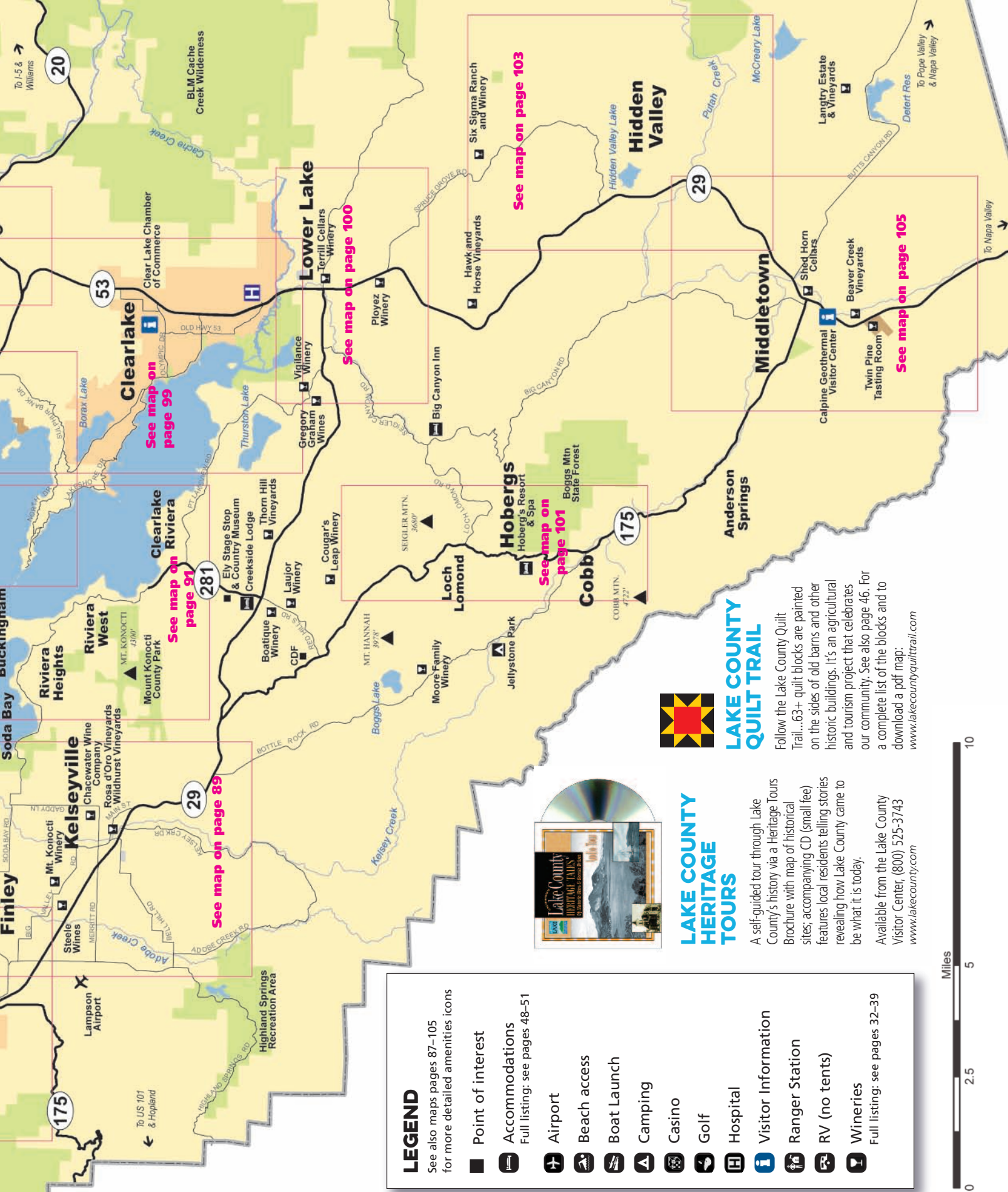

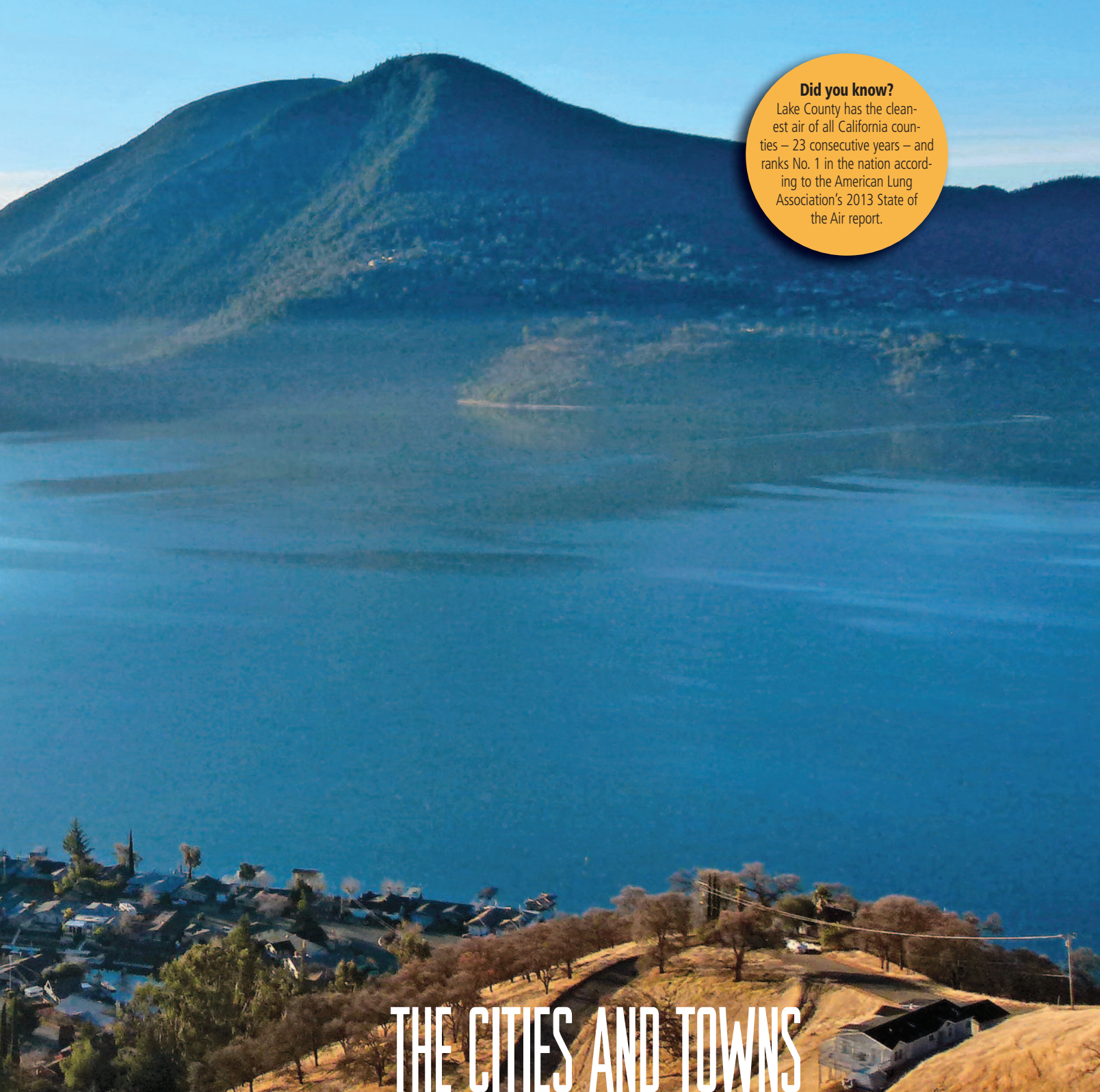

the San Francisco Bay area.

Lake County covers 1,327 square miles, at elevations ranging from 1,099 to 7,056 feet above sea level. Its climate is temperate, yet it still offers the beauty of all four seasons, and its terrain varies from thickly-forested mountains, to oak-studded rolling grasslands and hills, to pristine shady streamside valleys, to lakeside coves and peninsulas.

The communities here are just as varied as the terrain. There are two incorporated cities, the county seat of Lakeport on the western shore of Clear Lake, and the City of Clearlake on the eastern shore. Around the lake and scattered throughout the hills and valleys are myriad small communities, some of which began as spas, resorts, and vacation getaway destinations.

Other communities began as ranching or farming centers, steamboat landings, postal stations, mining centers, or stagecoach stops.

THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT

Lakeport is located on the west shore of Clear Lake about two hours north of San Francisco and west of Sacramento. The City has a distinctive, small-town character with strong community values, a business friendly attitude and an emphasis on promoting quality of life. A tourist and recreational destination, the City hosts numerous activities and events throughout the year including world-class bass fishing year-round and tournaments, wine festivals, a sea-plane fly-in, cultural entertainment, concerts in the park, biking, water sports, bird watching, fine dining, and much more.

As the oldest incorporated community in Lake County (1888), and as the county seat, the City is the regional center of commerce and governmental activity for the area. State Highways 20, 29, and 175 provide scenic access to the area. Lampson Airport is located two miles to the south.

Lakeport has a population of slightly over 5,100 residents with neighborhoods surrounding a historic downtown area, a land area of 2.7 square miles and median age of 40.8 years.

The City's retail trade population is over 35,000 people. Commercial areas are located along the City's arterial roadways, away from residential neighborhoods.

According to a recent business climate and community assessment:

- Lakeport is an alternative to big city living.
- Lakeport's downtown offers a unique ambience with lakefront vistas, and a historic Courthouse Museum Square.
- Lakeport is designated a California Main Street city.
- Lakeport is home to many businesses that attract hundreds of area shoppers to the community each day.
- Lakeport has an impressive mix of businesses that serve the everyday needs of local residents and workers.

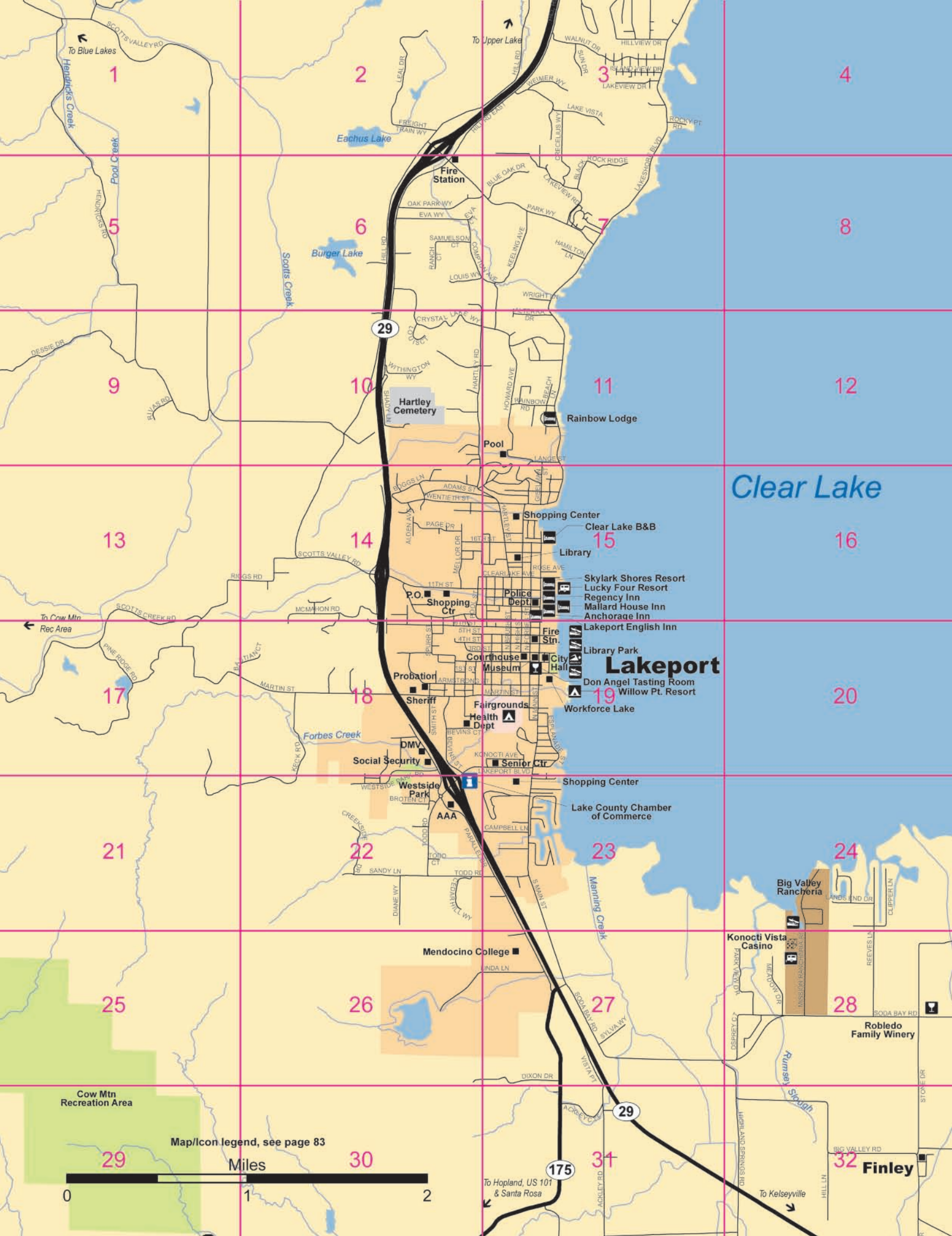

The charming country town of Kelseyville is home to a community of people involved in the area businesses, schools, churches, service groups, and cultural activities. Members of the community take pride in the town's amenities: historical sites, recreation, lodging, dining, shopping, and special events complemented by rural countryside and agricultural lands.

Visitors and residents are drawn to the peace and quiet of Kelseyville. An ambiance of country friendliness is found in the charming shops along Main Street, which is lined with historic, early 20th Century streetlamps. Take time to discover the many wooden quilts that hang on many Main Street buildings. Enjoy a meal at the many eateries, taste Lake County wines and specialized micro brewery beers at their respective tasting rooms and brewery.

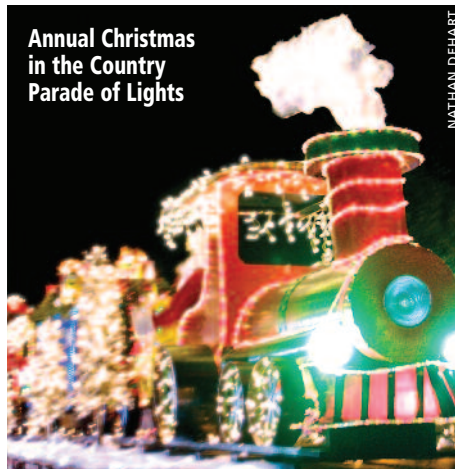
The community is host to several special events during the year. In February the Wine & Chocolate event features Lake County wines paired with – you guessed it – chocolate, along with delicious foods and music. The Kelseyville Olive Festival takes place in April, with olive oil, wine, and beer tastings, a variety of food, music and an olive pit spitting contest! Every June, July, August and September on the 3rd Thursday evening, the Kickin' in the Country street dances – featuring different bands each month – lure all ages to dance on Main Street.

The town's signature annual event, the Kelseyville Pear Festival, takes place on the last Saturday of September. The first Friday evening of December is Christmas in the Country with a lighted parade on Main Street, merchant open houses and tree lighting.

For recreation all year, spend a day on the lake, bike the back roads, explore water trails via kayak or canoe, watch a sailboat regatta or an equestrian competition, go birding or hike the trails at the Clear Lake State Park, or take in the panoramic views from atop iconic Mount Konocti, now Lake County's newest County Park: the parking lot and main access point for hikers is just a few minutes from Main Street.

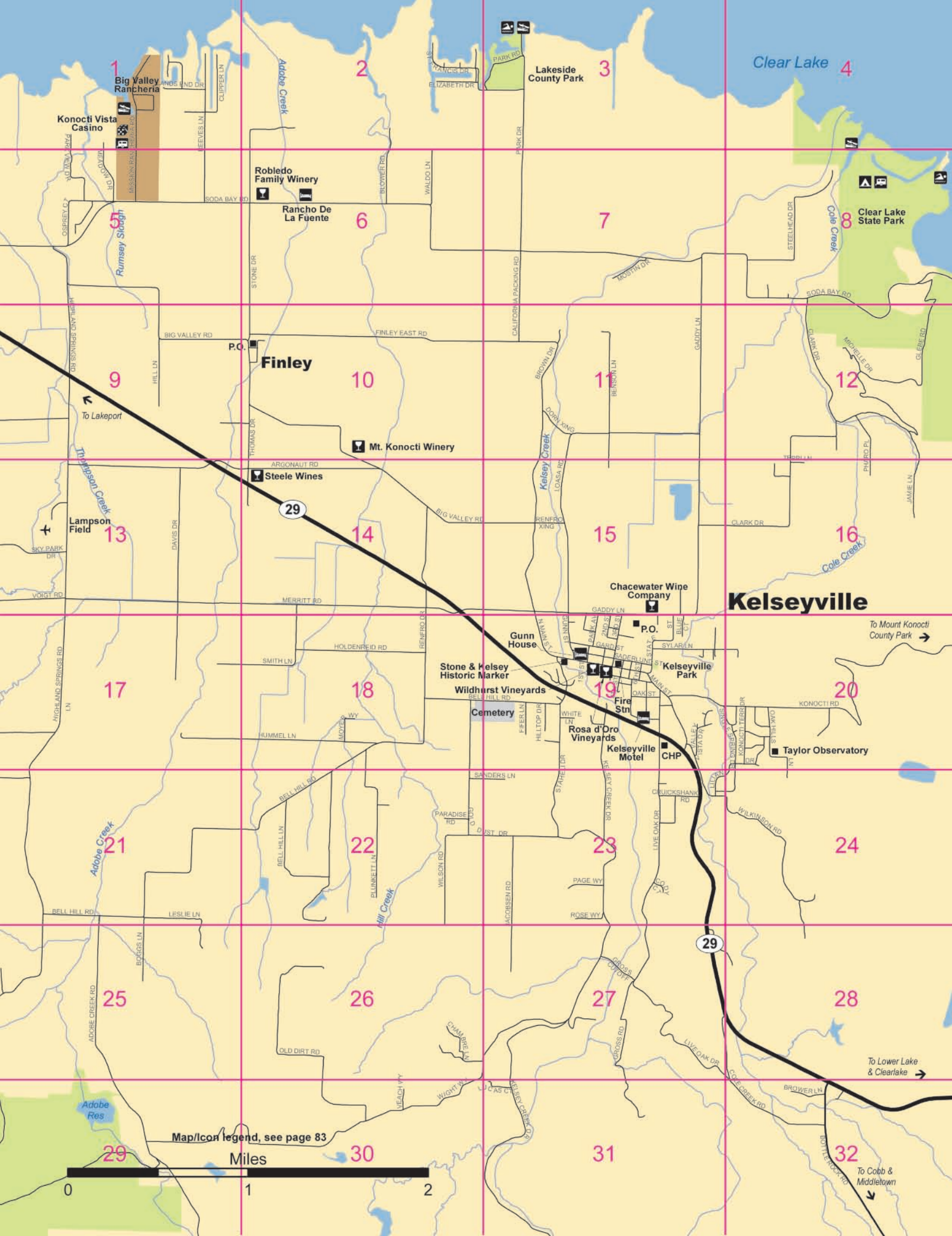
Located at the foot of Mount Konocti, Taylor Observatory and Norton Planetarium offers stargazing with a 16-inch computerized reflector telescope, full dome movies, planetarium shows, student astronomy camps, and much more. This telescope is the largest in northern California.

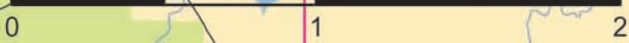

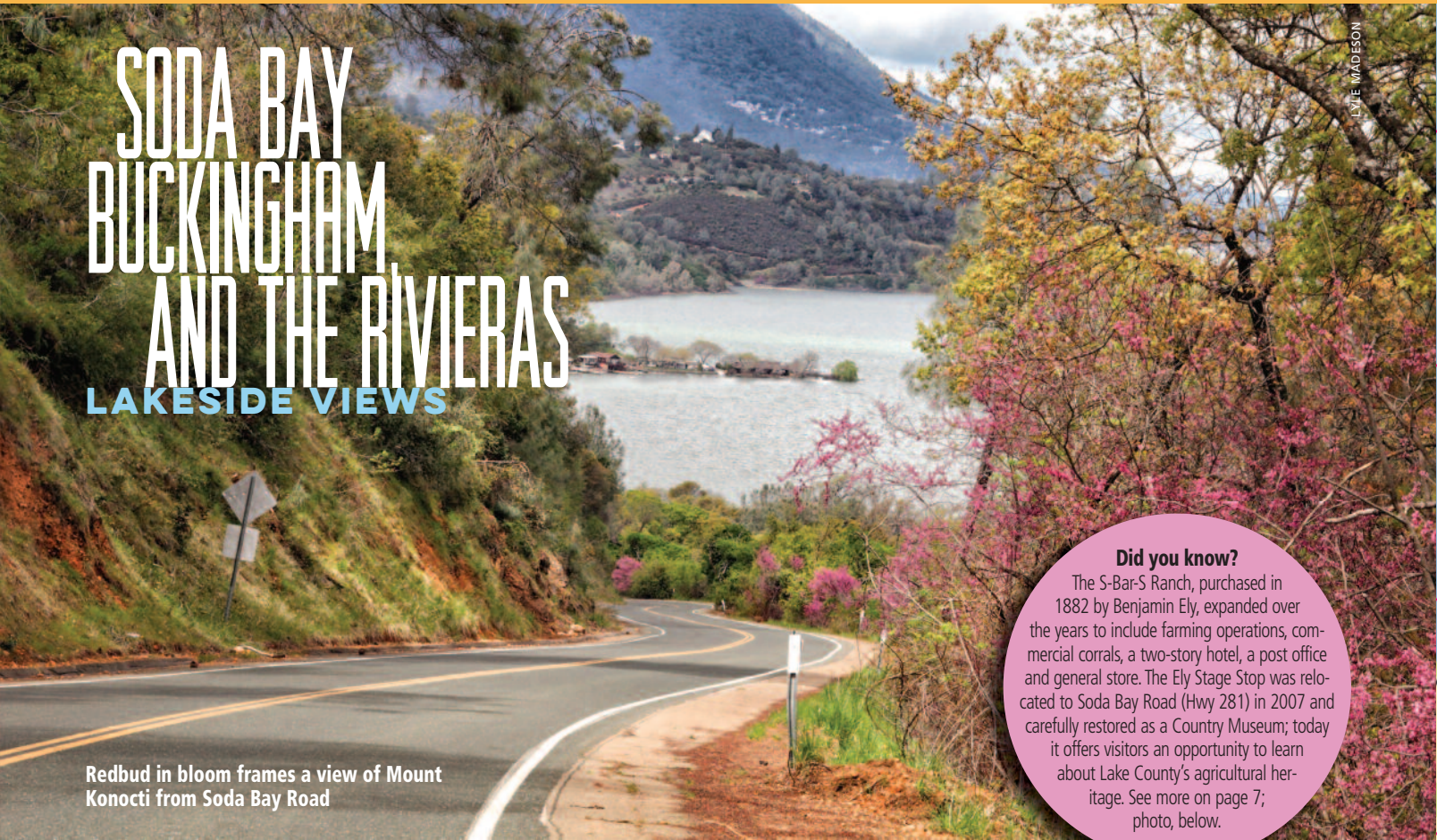

Did you know?
The S-Bar-S Ranch, purchased in 1882 by Benjamin Ely, expanded over the years to include farming operations, commercial corrals, a two-story hotel, a post office and general store. The Ely Stage Stop was relocated to Soda Bay Road (Hwy 281) in 2007 and carefully restored as a Country Museum; today it offers visitors an opportunity to learn about Lake County's agricultural heritage. See more on page 7; photo, below.

This wonderful mountainous area affords fantastic views of Clear Lake and its north shore. Swimming, fishing, boating, and other water sports are popular in Soda Bay (named for the bubbling soda springs offshore) because the bay is sheltered from wind by the promontory of nearby Clear Lake State Park. The state park offers visitors great opportunities to hike, camp, swim, and even learn about the flora and fauna at the informative visitor center. Homes and small lakefront resorts ring the bay. The resorts are definitely family-style with many amenities including RV spaces and rental boats; some are known for their dog-friendly policies. A small market offers nearby convenience.

Buckingham boasts a challenging nine-hole golf course, Buckingham Golf Club, with a seasonal restaurant in the Tee Room. Beautiful homes abound on the Buckingham peninsula from the top of the ridge to lakeside; the views are amazing. A full-service marina is at the eastern tip of the peninsula; Braito's Marina offers fuel and covered or open slips.

The neighborhoods of the Rivas, located from water's edge to the towering slopes of Mount Konocti, include Riviera West, Clear Lake Rivas, and Riviera Heights, all with unpar-

leled views. A small shopping center located in Clear Lake Riviera is home to a video store, gas station, market, salons, fitness studio, gift store, café, and pizza parlor. Across the street, the Blue Moon Café features a casual menu, brunch on the weekends, and dog-friendly patio dining.

Richmond Park Bar & Grill (located on the shore below Soda Bay Road, just north of the Riviera Shopping Center) offers dining, RV

spaces and fuel, dock space for those who arrive via the lake, and live entertainment most weekends.

The Riviera Golf & Country Club is located on a hilltop with spectacular views of Clear Lake and the mountains across the lake—a beautiful backdrop for great dining and a wonderful facility for weddings, receptions, and events, or for just enjoying the view.

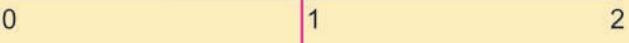

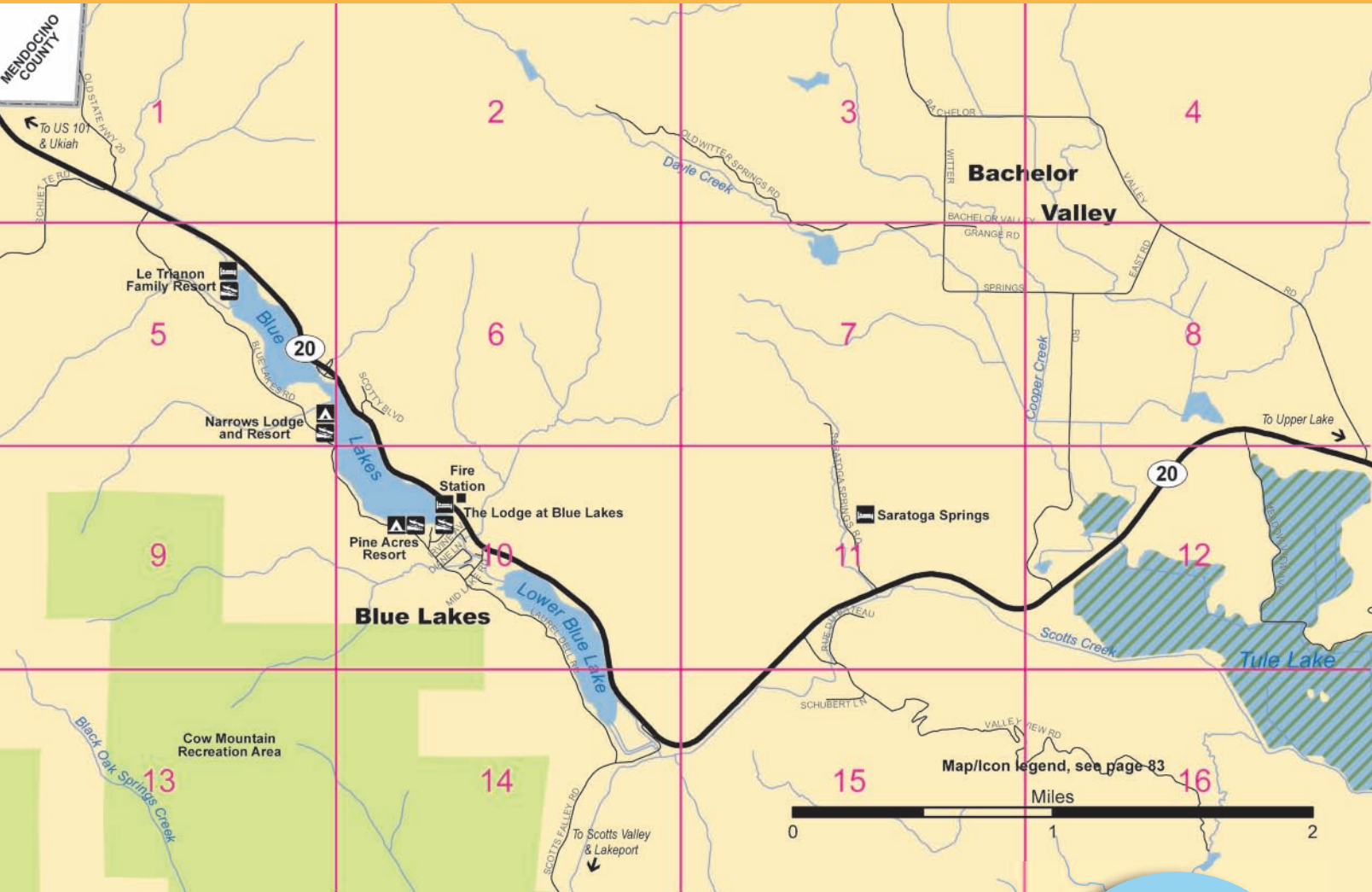

In northwestern Lake County, the quaint recreational community of Blue Lakes dots the shores of two small, peaceful lakes known simply as Upper Blue Lake and Lower Blue Lake, bordered by State Highway 20 to the north and densely forested hillsides to the south. Just a few minutes' drive from Upper Lake or Lakeport, this spot is a favorite getaway for local residents and out-of-town vacationers alike, with lodging options from upscale to camping.

Swimming and fishing are popular in the crystal clear water. A boat speed limit of 5 mph makes for serene surroundings and a popular spot for kayaks, canoes, patio boats, and even the occasional windsurfer; several resorts offer watercraft rentals, even electric boats and the latest craze, "SUPs" (stand up paddle boards).

The deep water of Upper Blue Lake supports populations of bass and bluegill and are stocked monthly with rainbow trout, so both novice and experienced anglers can drop in a line from a dock, the shore's edge, or even a boat at a favorite fishing spot. If you are a fishing enthusiast, be sure to mark your calendar for the Trout Derby held on April 25–26, 2015.

BLUE LAKES

A FAVORITE GETAWAY

Blue Lake's quiet waters are perfect for swimming, sailing, canoeing, windsurfing and fishing

Did you know?
Indians believed in a legendary "Monster of Blue Lakes," or "Devil Fish," which was said to be half-fish and half-horse, between ten and twenty feet long, and was said to appear only once every ten years. Its presence was believed to signal the onset of great calamities.



Welcome to Upper Lake. Established in 1854, the town has had a succession of storefronts throughout its long history.

Formerly, streets were lined with butcher shops, clothing stores, bakeries, saloons, restaurants, hardware stores, ice cream parlors, as well as pharmacies. Today, this town has grown up. A face lift, completed in 2010 – including Victorian-style street lights, an exquisite town arch, and a new town clock – has revived the town. A new generation of shopkeepers, innkeepers, and restaurateurs all have an eye toward preserving the rich history of this pioneer town.

What was once a stagecoach stop along the Sacramento to Mendocino route now includes the restored Tallman Hotel, and a re-created Blue Wing Saloon Restaurant. Concerts with Conversation, and an annual Blues Festival in August are found at the Tallman/Blue Wing site. Lake

County Wine Studio features monthly artists' shows with music and local wine and food pairings.

All businesses showcase historical integrity, which offers visitors the opportunity for a luxurious overnight stay, delicious meals, a wine tasting bar and shopping on Main Street.

Come, stay, explore, and find antiques and collectibles from around the world, clothing, Native American arts, pet supplies, gifts and original local works of art.

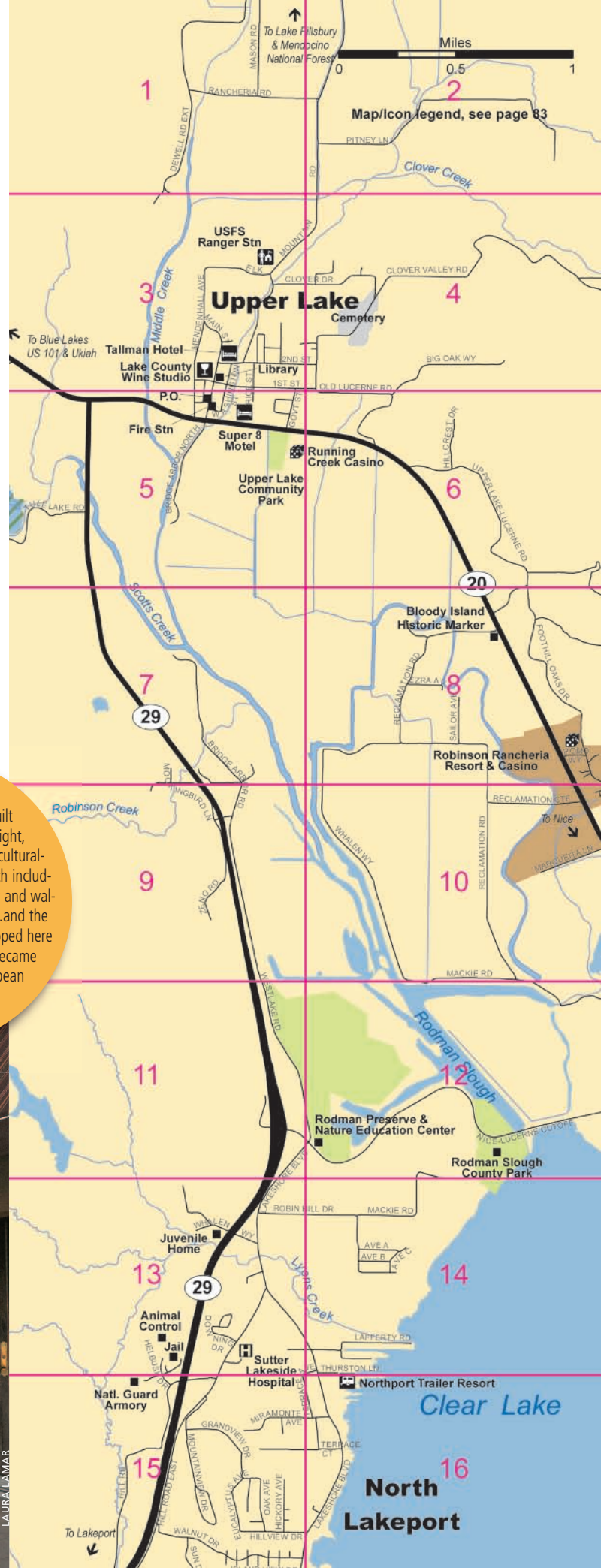
Upper Lake Mercantile opened in mid-2014 by the Town Clock on Main Street. A good addition to the eclectic mix of businesses on Main Street in Upper Lake, the Mercantile is a sister business to the Tallman Hotel and Blue Wing Saloon.

A picturesque lighted parade down Main Street takes place on the first Saturday evening of December, followed by a tree-lighting ceremony, caroling and fun for everyone.

UPPER LAKE PAST PERFECT

Did you know?

The Bank of Upper Lake, built in 1921 (building shown on right, below), was a tribute to the agricultural-based prosperity of the area, which included cattle and sheep ranching, pear and walnut processing, a cheese factory...and the Blue Lake bean, which was developed here by Adolphus Mendenhall and became the foundation of the green bean industry in California and Oregon.

NICE AND LUCERNE

FROM CASTLES TO CABOOSSES

Did you know?
The historic Lucerne Hotel (once known as "The Castle") was part of a grand vision for Lucerne. Built on the best site in town overlooking the lake, it was connected to the newly constructed Ukiah-Tahoe Highway (Highway 20) by a wide boulevard, which was later to be converted to a canal for a water linkage between the lake and the Hotel.

Lucerne and Nice are two lakeside communities along the north shore of Clear Lake on State Highway 20, the major east-west thoroughfare in Lake County. Long, beautiful stretches of shoreline are shaded by large pepperwoods and giant oaks, and spectacular redbud shrubs bloom throughout the area in springtime. Several resorts and campgrounds offer visitors a place to stay, and public beaches, parks, and harbors provide many opportunities to enjoy the lake.

With the steep Bartlett Mountain Range as its backdrop, the lakeside town of Lucerne is often referred to as "the Switzerland of America" with terrain and sweeping views reminiscent of the Alps. The town of Nice was named in June 1871 after the small town of Nice, France.

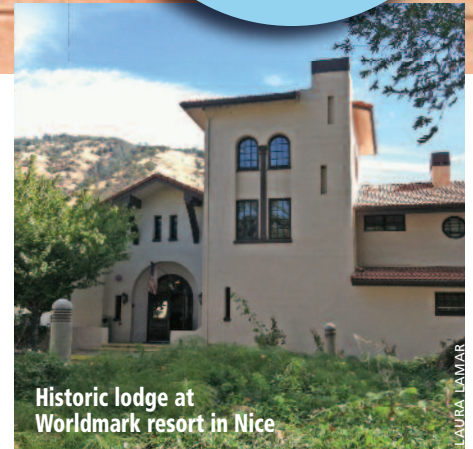
The historic 1928 Lucerne Hotel on seven scenic acres was recently renovated to become the latest campus of Marymount California University, with classrooms, student and faculty housing, food service facilities, outdoor recreation, and gardens. Students will be able to complete upper division degrees in business, liberal arts, psychology, and other areas.

In the community of Lucerne, as part of the Lucerne Promenade between State Highway 20

and Clear Lake, the new Third Street Pier area provides visitors opportunities to enjoy a view of the north bay of Clear Lake and Mount Konociti. An interactive Visitor's Kiosk can be found in Lucerne Pharmacy which will provide information on all of Lake County.

Hinman Park in downtown Nice features an attractive gazebo in the center of the park, palm trees, a lush lawn, and other amenities that are enjoyed by visitors and residents alike. The County's Keeling Park provides a public boat launching facility, a playground, swimming area, boat dock and other popular amenities. Further to the west on Hammond Avenue, a new County park is under development, which already includes playground equipment and will soon include a ball field, walking trails, wildlife viewing on adjacent wetlands, and more.

Nice is home to several other tourist-oriented businesses and attractions, such as a quirky lunchbox museum, a unique caboose-themed B&B, and a world-class lakefront timeshare facility that is a destination in and of itself. Its lodge was built in 1904 as a private residence, and became the Clear Lake Lodge in 1922, operating as a hotel with a pool and even a casino.

GLENHAVEN AND CLEARLAKE OAKS

THE EASTERN TIP OF THE LAKE

The small towns of Clearlake Oaks and Glenhaven are the “gateway” to Clear Lake — the first lakeside communities seen by travelers heading west on State Highway 20.

“The Oaks” downtown area features Nylander Park and The Plaza. Clearlake Oaks Beach and Boat Launch are just a short walk away. Visitors enjoy wine tasting at Brassfield Estate, located in High Valley. A short drive east on Highway 20 are Noggle and Cache Creek Vineyards & Winery.

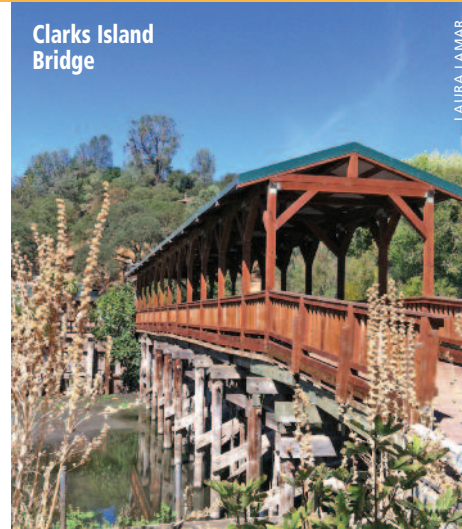
A hotspot for community volunteerism, Oaks residents and businesses consistently pitch in with donations of money, time, and materials for local projects.

The most recent effort is at Clarks Island, located next to the Tower Mart on Highway 20. Clarks Island is accessed via a small footbridge (shown, above right). The Clarks Island volunteer

effort focuses on ecotourism and the environment. Components include natural earth building, a kayak launch, and indigenous plantings.

A unique element includes a demonstration area of “biohaven floating islands” that are made from recycled plastic bottles and designed to mimic natural wetlands. Community members and businesses raised money to purchase the first floating island, which was planted with rescued cattails. Future plans include a “living” bioswale pathway and a series of additional islands aimed at tule restoration, wildlife habitat, and algae reduction. Interpretive signage will educate the public on the Clear Lake watershed.

Volunteers pitched in to build an adobe entryway kiosk and bench using simple Natural Building techniques and local clay. Future plans include a large shade gazebo, designed by

architectural students from the University of San Francisco.

Clarks Island also is a stopping point for the Rattlesnake Island Water Trail, the first in a series of eight kayaking trails which highlight unique aspects of the geology, culture and wildlife of Lake County, allowing paddlers to enjoy beautiful scenery while learning about the environment (see more, page 12).

Spring Valley, at the eastern end of Long Valley, is approximately 12 miles outside of Clearlake Oaks, off of State Highway 20. The area is set in oak woodlands; Chalk Mountain is a prominent landmark. The abundant wildlife includes deer, rabbits, raccoons, Roosevelt Elk, coyotes, fox, bear, and mountain lion, plus a myriad of avian species.

There are currently 1,035 residents living in homes and ranchettes. The subdivision is a County-maintained water and road district. There is an active home owners association but membership is voluntary. Fire service is provided by the Northlake Fire Protection District and a volunteer manned fire station is located in the valley. Police service is provided by the Lake County Sheriff's Department; mail service is rural delivery six days per week out of the Clearlake Oaks

Post Office; and Konocti Unified School District provides school bus service. Medical services include St. Helena Hospital, Clearlake and Sutter Lakeside Hospital.

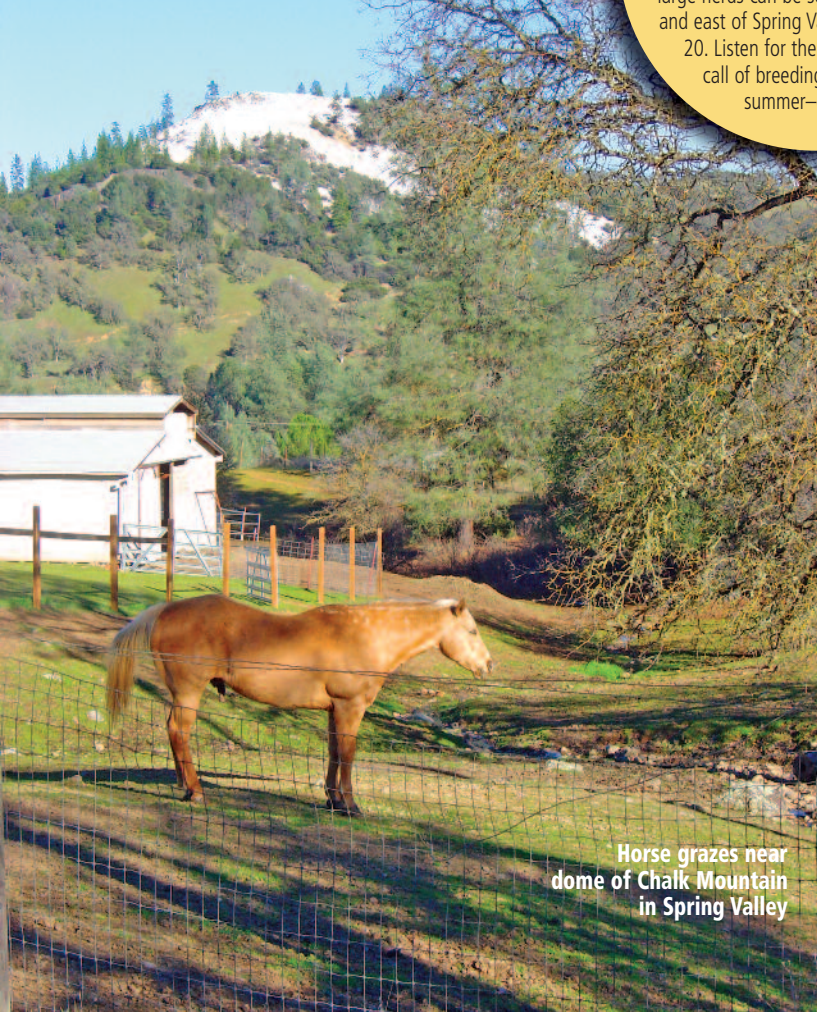
Amenities include access to both BLM land and the Mendocino National Forest, an active Community Center, as well as two major creeks, Wolfe Creek and Cache Creek, and a small lake for recreational enjoyment.

Local services include a small convenience store, several real estate agents, a financial planning office, bookkeeping, notary and tax service, yard maintenance and handyman services, and heavy equipment operators. Shopping, as well as access to Clear Lake, is available in the City of Clearlake or the town of Clearlake Oaks, a short 15-minute drive away.

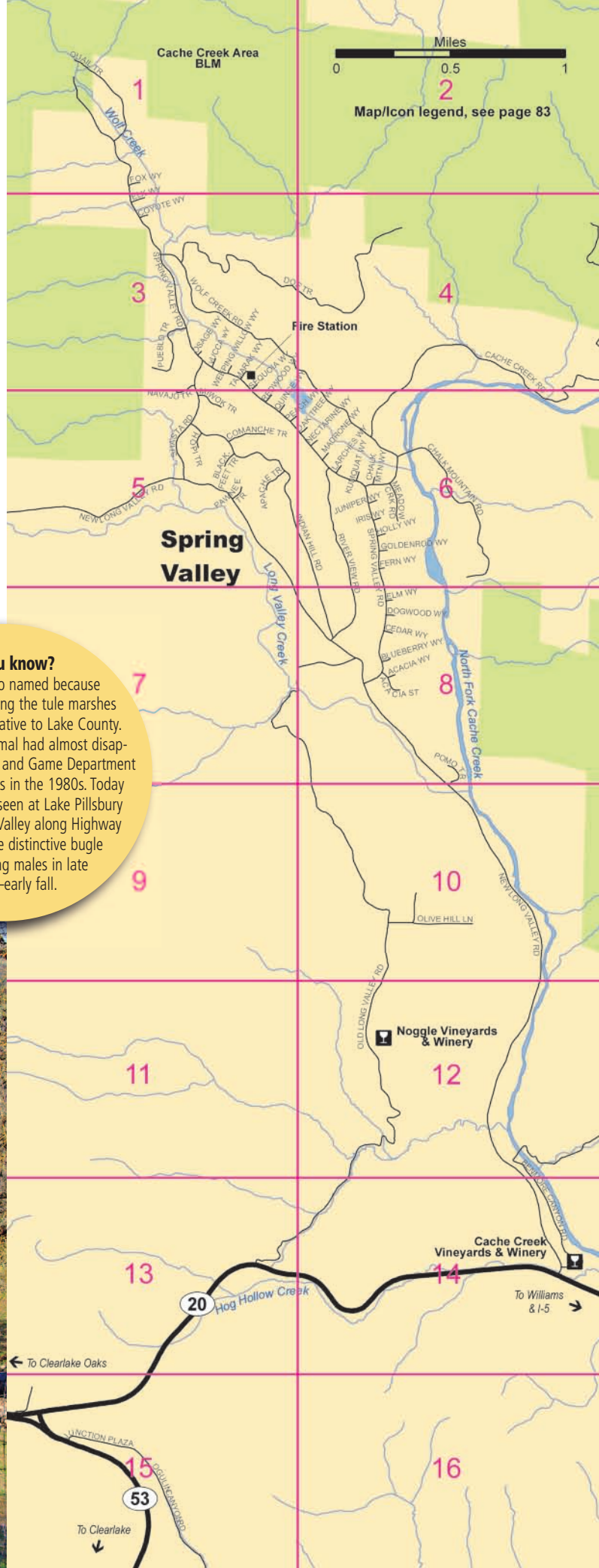
SPRING VALLEY

A RURAL HIDEAWAY

Did you know?
 The Tule Elk – so named because it used to live among the tule marshes of Clear Lake – is native to Lake County. This magnificent animal had almost disappeared when the Fish and Game Department restocked local herds in the 1980s. Today large herds can be seen at Lake Pillsbury and east of Spring Valley along Highway 20. Listen for the distinctive bugle call of breeding males in late summer–early fall.

Did you know?

Borax Lake, adjacent to Sulphur Bank Road, was once mined for its large borax deposit. Bordered by homes, it is now a national archeological site.

Stretching along the east shore of Clear Lake from Cache Creek to Windflower Point, the City of Clearlake was incorporated in 1980; its population is now over 15,000. Known as “the Highlands” to longtime residents, the city meanders over hills throughout its 10.5 square miles. Development of the area began in 1922 with walnut orchards, a common sight. Some of those original orchards remain today in the Burns Valley area. The City prides itself as a tourist destination with small-town charm.

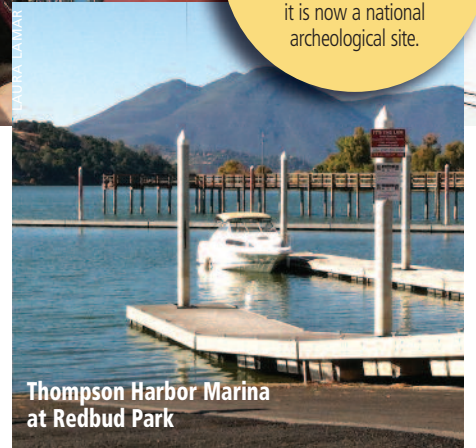
Within the city are three lakefront parks: Redbud Park, Austin Park and Highlands Park, each with their own special amenities. The annual Fourth of July parade begins at Redbud Park and fills Lakeshore Drive to Austin Park, where festivities continue, closing with a fireworks display at dusk. Austin Park also has been the site for the annual International Worm Races since 1970. Redbud Park also is a popular bass tournament destination. The annual Christmas parade ushering Santa into town begins at Redbud Park the first Saturday in December ending at Austin Park with lighting of the community tree.

Between Redbud and Austin parks, Lakeshore

Drive serves as the main focus for commercial, retail and visitor-oriented activity. Highlands Park is located in this same area and is undergoing renovation of a building on the property to serve as a visitor center. City Hall neighbors Austin Park on Olympic Drive. With a new General Plan scheduled for adoption by the beginning of 2015, economic and commercial clusters include the areas at Highway 53 at Dam Road, at Lakeshore Drive, along Olympic Drive, and just off Highway 53 north of the city. Commercial uses are also anticipated on the former Pearce airfield site on Highway 53.

A unique spot within the City is Borax Lake, adjacent to Sulphur Bank Road. Once mined for its large deposits, recently shouldered by homes, the lake is a national archeological site.

The Clear Lake campus of Yuba Community College, St. Helena Hospital—Clearlake, and Clearlake Shopping Center, a major shopping center, are clustered near the southern edge of the city. Near Burns Valley Mall are the Clearlake Cinema; Redbud Library, a branch of the Lake County Library system; and an assisted living facility.

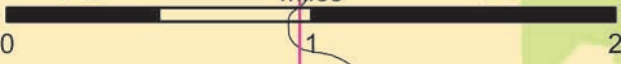

LOWER LAKE

AN HISTORIC SMALL TOWN

Historic Lower Lake is located at the southeastern end of Clear Lake where two major Native American trails crossed. Founded in the late 1850s, the town soon became the center of commerce for the region. Lake County was created out of the northern portion of Napa County in 1861. Lower Lake vied with Lakeport to become the county seat, succeeding in winning that distinction from 1867 to 1870.

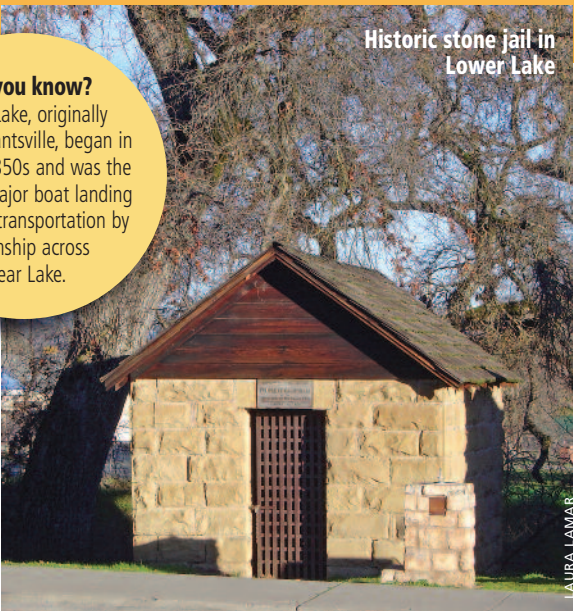
The town features some of the oldest buildings in Lake County and prospered in early years from nearby mining of sulfur, borax, and quicksilver. The first jail in Lake County, a stone structure of just one room, is said to be the smallest in the United States. It is California State Historical Landmark #429.

The Lower Lake Historic Schoolhouse Museum, built in 1877, served as a schoolhouse until 1935. Due to the hard work of a grass-roots organiza-

tion, the schoolhouse was restored and reopened in 1993 as a fine museum. The building has a distinctive Mansard roof, remodeled in 1906 after the great California earthquake damaged the bell tower. The 16-foot-tall ceilings and nine-foot windows give the museum its true historic character. Displays include a schoolroom, Victorian parlor, gems and minerals, and Native American and pioneer artifacts. The upper floor auditorium serves as a venue for cultural and community events.

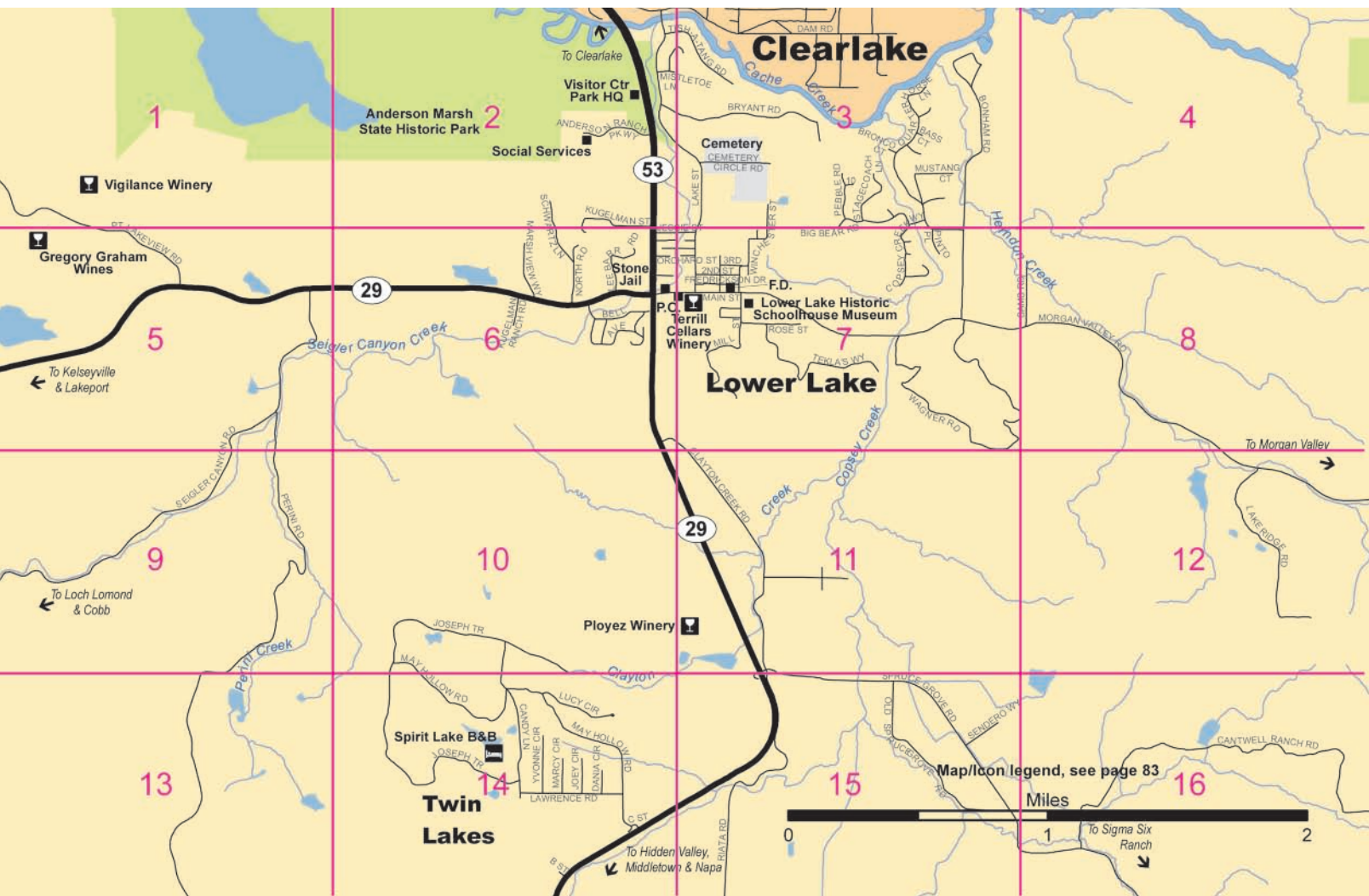
Other historic sights in Lower Lake are the Pioneer and Lower Lake Cemeteries, the Odd Fellows Hall, built in 1868, and the United Methodist Church, built in 1884. Anderson Marsh State Historic Park, just north of town, features a ranch house, archeological sites, and nature trails.

Did you know?
Lower Lake, originally named Grantsville, began in the late 1850s and was the site of a major boat landing providing transportation by steamship across Clear Lake.

Lower Lake offers hometown shopping with a variety of businesses, including coffee shops, BBQ, pizza, wineries, a picturesque recreation of a Tuscan village, and antique stores. Featured on Memorial Day Weekend is a Renaissance Faire presented by Tuscan Village, and the community presents Lower Lake Daze with a parade and festival. Lower Lake offers visitors an opportunity to truly step back and “stroll around” enjoying history in rural America.

Did you know?
In 1885, Gustav and Mathilda Hoberg offered rest to weary travelers at their homestead ranch...which grew to become the largest privately-owned resort of the mid-1900s. The rich, famous, and elite guests came to hear leading musicians of the day, to swim, dine, and dance the night away.

A WOODED WONDERLAND

Cobb is a 'Four Season Wonderland' in the Mayacamas Mountain Range, with elevations from 2,400 to 4,722 feet. Trees become more majestic with each rise in elevation: forests of pine, oak, fir, madrone, and cedar are enlivened with dogwood, red-bud, and wild lilac blossoms.

Boggs Mountain Demonstration State Forest is open year-round to the public for hiking, camping, picnicking, mountain bicycling, horseback riding, and hunting. The Nature Conservancy offers guided tours of Boggs Lake Ecological Preserve, a protected vernal pool.

The communities surrounding Cobb Valley began in the late 1800s when several famous volcanic hot springs resorts attracted people seeking remedies for their ailments. Cobb is the site of the historic Hoberg's Resort, originally constructed in the 1800s and currently being renovated. With a "soft open-

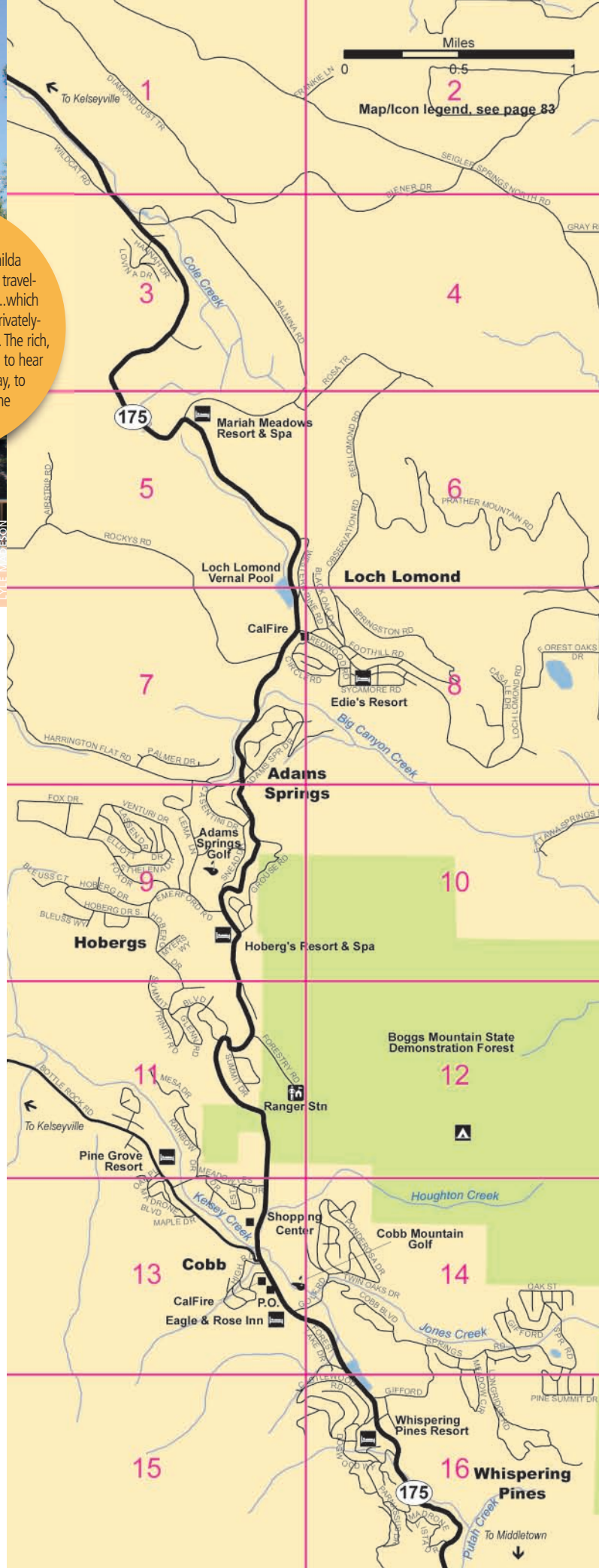
ing" in 2014, Hoberg's Resort & Spa is once again offering accommodations and hosting musical entertainment. A wine bar focusing on high-elevation wines, wine tours, wedding packages, and a restaurant will open in 2015, with plans for a larger restaurant, indoor ballroom/music venue, and more to come.

Summer is busy as visitors flock to Cobb's lodgings and resorts, restaurants, pub, golf courses, market, video store, and shops. A water bottling plant, post office and gas station can also be found on the mountain.

Golfers enjoy two high altitude 9-hole courses nestled under the pines: Adams Springs, and Cobb Mountain Golf, alongside an active creek.

Many young families have purchased homes in the area and many older summer homes have been remodeled to accommodate year-round living. Parents are delighted to find that Cobb Mountain Elementary School is rated among the highest in the state.

The Cobb Mountain area is home to many artists and published authors, and hosts events such as Cobbstock in June (a festival of music with several bands), and the Holiday in the Pines Art & Craft Faire in November.

Did you know?

Hidden Valley Lake was part of the 21,000-acre Rancho Guenoc in the mid-1800s. One of the last Spanish land grants, the ranch extended from the small town of Guenoc on Putah Creek, to the east, and what would later become Lillie Langtry's estate in the late 1800s.

The Hidden Valley Lake subdivision is truly a unique place to own a home. Just north of Middletown, the main entrance is on Highway 29 in the southwest corner of Lake County. The surrounding area offers many of the amenities of city living, such as excellent schools, hospital, police and fire protection, and cultural activities, but still provides the many benefits of living in a community located in a more rural setting. Two shopping centers adjacent to the community provide a market, restaurants, and other shops and services.

Hidden Valley Lake offers something for everyone—whether a young family looking for a place to raise children, a retiree interested in playing golf or fishing, or simply a person looking for the good life at a reasonable price. The only way to truly appreciate the community and all that it has to offer is to take a tour and see for yourself.

Commanding spectacular views of the lake valley from the banquet room and the golf course valley from the pool area, the hilltop activity center is one of those rare places where it is a joy just to be there. The building, with its long entry trellis, lighted parking lot, and attrac-

tive post-and-beam architecture, was designed as a restaurant and banquet facility by the original developers. The facility includes a large kitchen, banquet room with adjoining outdoor deck, bar, dance floor, and restrooms, and is

used for banquets and special occasions.

From April to September, a monthly Concert on the Green takes place at the Hidden Valley Lake Golf and Country Club. For more information, see page 43 or go to www.golfhvl.com.



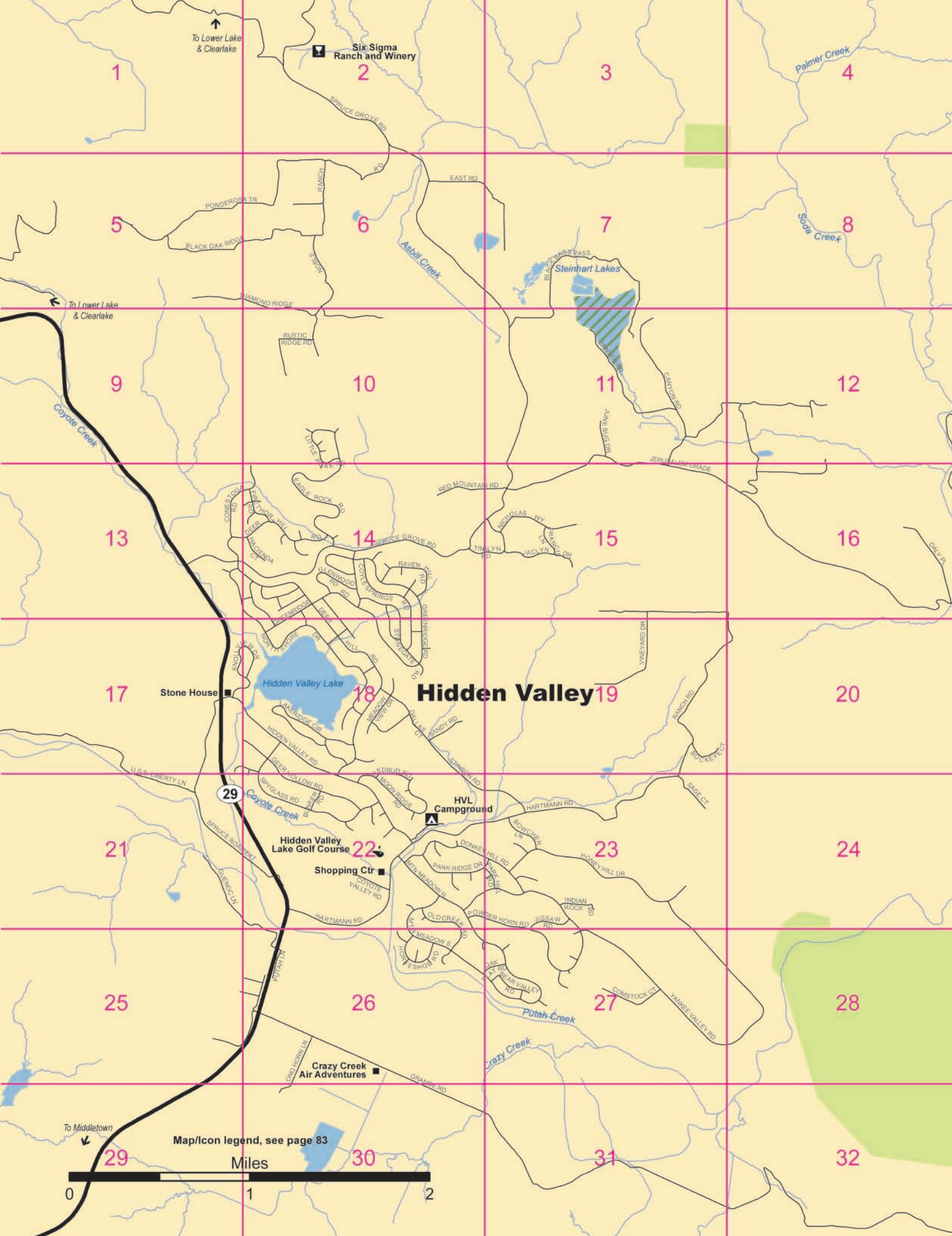

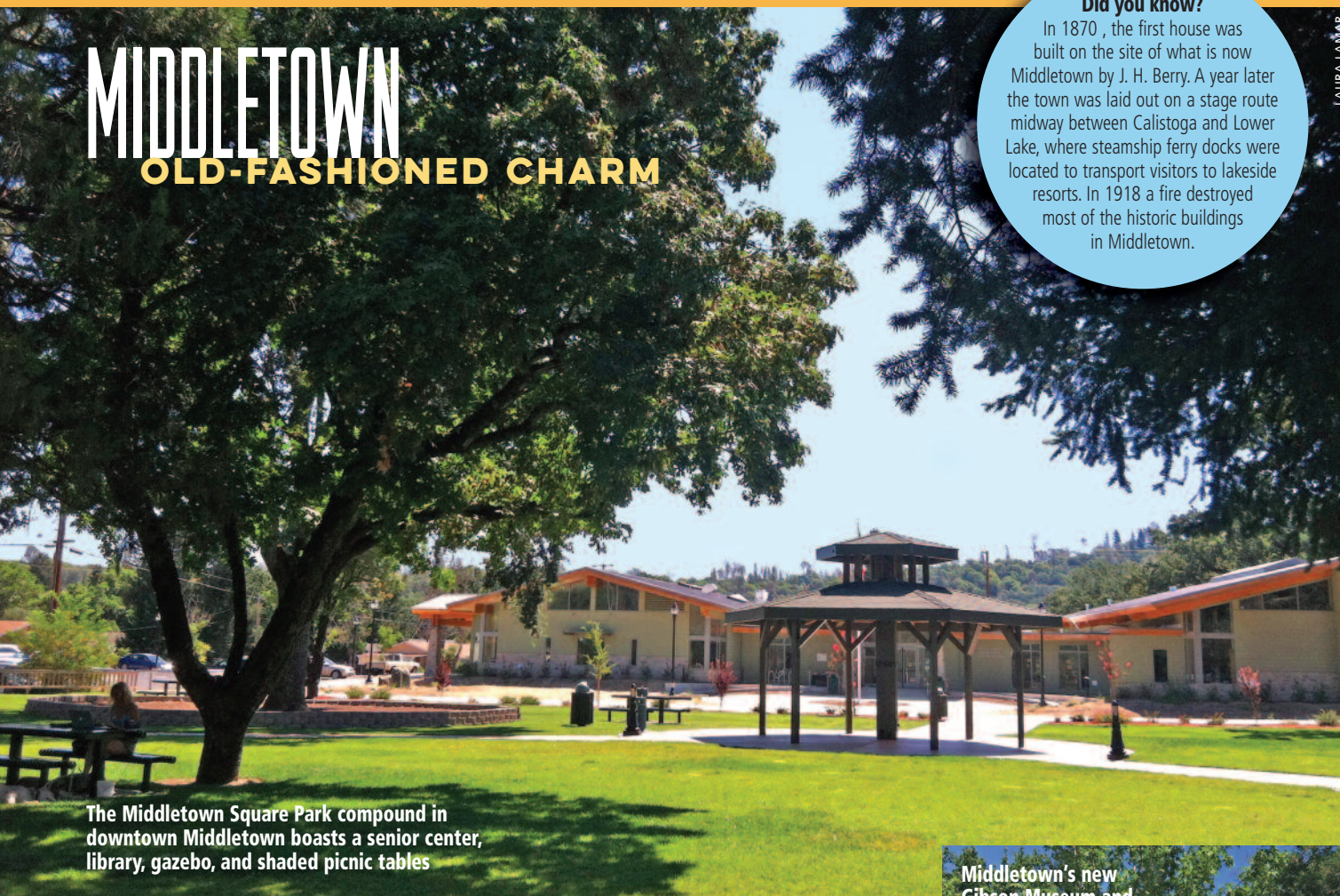
MIDDLETOWN

OLD-FASHIONED CHARM

Did you know?

In 1870, the first house was built on the site of what is now Middletown by J. H. Berry. A year later the town was laid out on a stage route midway between Calistoga and Lower Lake, where steamship ferry docks were located to transport visitors to lakeside resorts. In 1918 a fire destroyed most of the historic buildings in Middletown.

Middletown, a quaint, rural destination named when it was a stagecoach stop midway between Calistoga and Clearlake, was founded in 1870 and still retains its old-fashioned western charm; many of the original buildings are still standing. These days, many house small-town treasures like unique gift shops, antique stores, a book store, a toy store, and nurseries. After a day of shopping, wine tasting, and exploring, relax with a leisurely massage or a visit to one of the inviting day spas or beauty parlors. If your plans allow it, try the rewarding benefits of a local hot springs resort or take to the skies in a glider. Hot air balloons take advantage of fog-free, clear blue skies—a wonderful sight during the warm spring and summer months.

Middletown is the place to stop for food as well, boasting old-fashioned breakfast places, a juice bar, a wine tasting room, several wifi-capable coffee and tea shops, a brew pub, and delicatessens, as well as sit-down Mexican, American, Thai, and Chinese cuisine. A restored drive-in offers take-out or sit-down dining. If you plan to spend a night – or more – try out the clean, friendly, local motel or the local casino’s beautiful, rustic lodge-style hotel.

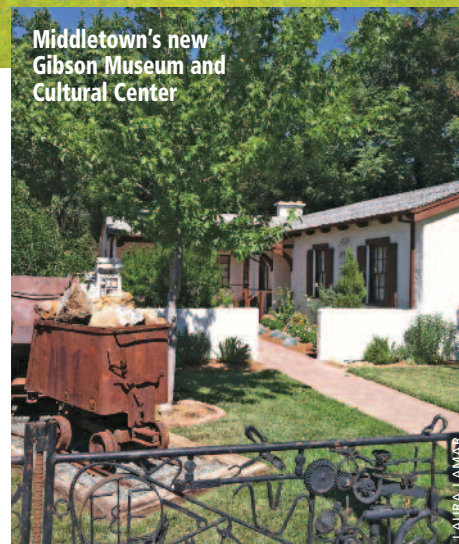
Just south of town, Calpine’s Cartwright Geothermal Visitor Center offers fascinating interactive displays explaining how geothermal energy is generated using steam from deep within the earth. Guided tours of a geothermal power plant, a picnic area, and facilities for meetings and community events complete the center’s offerings.

A Senior Center, Library, and park with a gazebo and picnic tables graces the east side of Highway 29 just south of the center of town. Across the street, Middletown’s new Gibson Museum & Cultural Center features the history of South Lake County in the town’s original 1930s public library, now beautifully restored; see www.cgibsonmuseum.com for more details.

Middletown also is a hub of a variety of denominations, including Baptist, Catholic, Methodist, Seventh-day Adventist and community churches, all with warm, welcoming congregations.

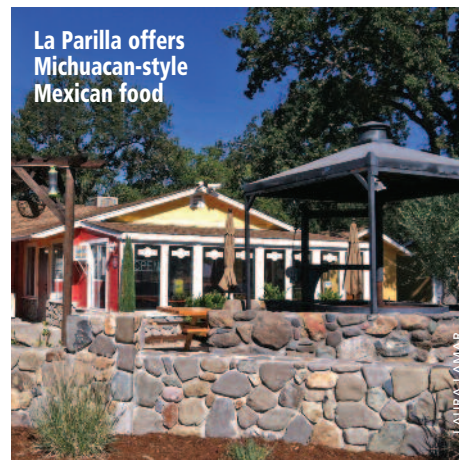

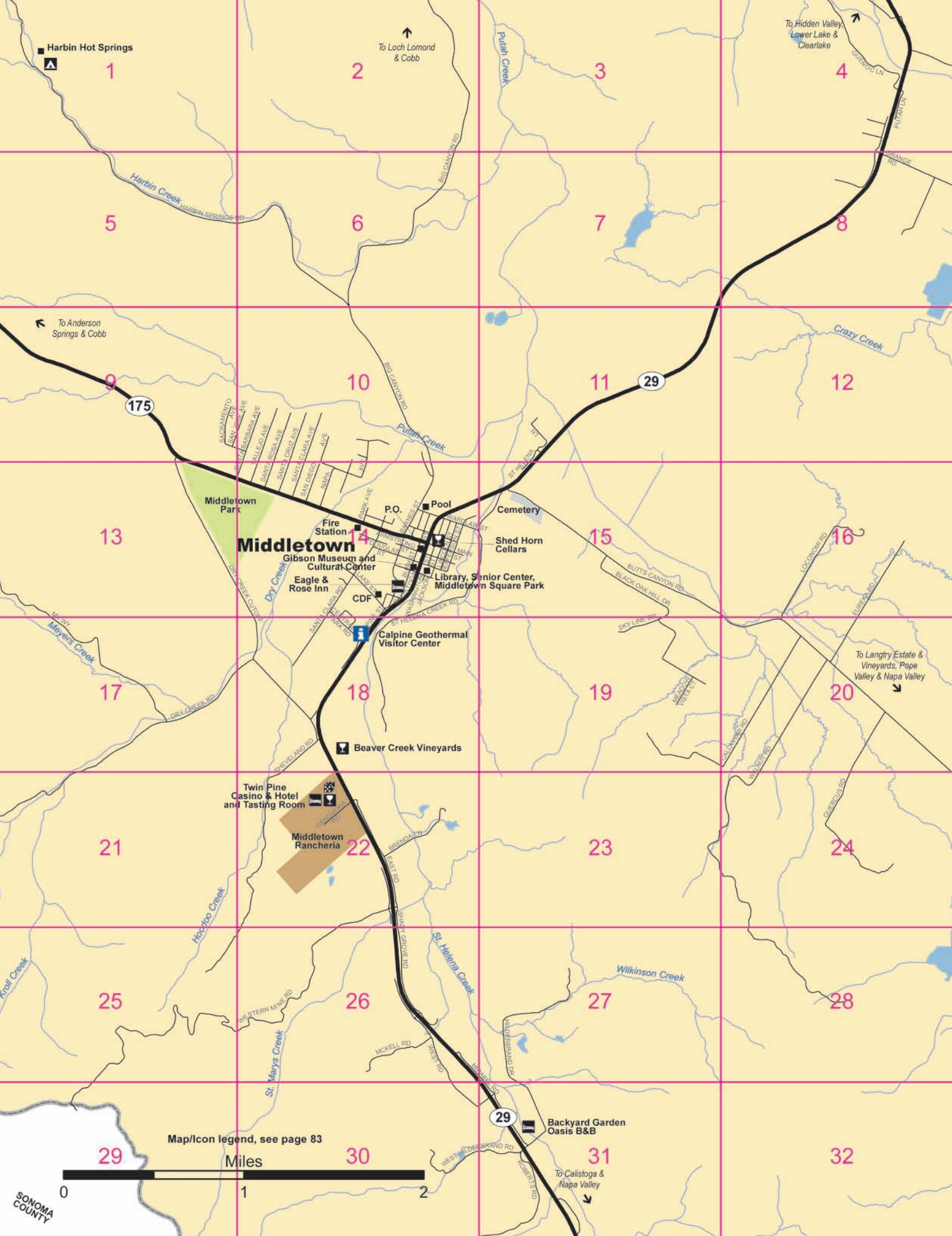
