The men and women of the Mayfield Heights Police Department understand the value and need in maintaining a close relationship with the Community that we serve. For this reason, the Community Operations Office was created in 2012. "Comm Ops" consists of two full-time officers that run the community programs and address quality of life issues that arise within the City. The two Comm Ops officers are regularly assisted by officers throughout the Department to make the community outreach programs successful and to allow citizens to get to know all the officers better. The programs include:







Neighborhood Watch

- In-person and live-streaming meetings
- Safety Tips
- Detectives briefing residents on the latest scams and crime updates

- Regularly attended by our Mayor, City Council Members, Police Chief and Captain, and many Officers from the Department

Citizens Police Academy

- The 8-week program is held one night per week and offered free to any resident or those that work or worship within the City. This program has been run annually since 2014. Almost every officer on the Department participates in the program so our "Cadets" get to know most of the officers.
- Each week focuses on a different aspect of the Police Department:
 - Patrol Division
 - o Detective Bureau
 - Accident Investigation
 - BCI Crime Scene Investigations presented by a BCI Agent

- Municipal Court / mocks trial attended by the Municipal Court Judge and Prosecutor
- Shooting range with instruction by the range officers (using airsoft Glocks/AR-15s). Cadets compete for the "Top Shot" trophy
- Specialty Units Night: SWAT, Bomb Squad, Drug Enforcement Unit, and Hostage Negotiators. Cadets are assigned to one of the specialty units and participate in a practical scenario that involves all the units working together to bring the mock incident to a peaceful conclusion. Cadets conduct an undercover controlled drug buy with DEU, SWAT executes a search warrant in their "shoot house", the Hostage Negotiators work to de-escalate a barricaded suspect, and the Bomb Squad removes and detonates a "suspicious package" with the robot's water cannon.
- o Graduation with a certificate presented by the Mayor and Police Chief, followed by a reception.





Citizen's Academy for Teenage Students (C.A.T.S. – named after the school districts mascot, the Wild Cats)

This 2-day program incorporates most of the material presented at our adult Citizen's Academy but with a lot more hands-on activities such as having the kids process a mock crime scene and conduct mock traffic stops in a parking lot.
