Dear Friends of the N.E.W. Zoological Society, Inc.,

This year we accomplished our goal of completing our \$1.1 million Education & Conservation Center. Nothing warms my heart more than to see the busloads of students who come to visit the Education & Conservation Center. Educators are aware of the opportunities the zoo classroom of learning experience provides, meeting our mission of education, recreation and conservation.



As I reflect over the years as President of the N.E.W. Zoological Society, Inc. we have accomplished big things. The NEW Zoo became an Enterprise account which means all revenue generated at the zoo is segregated from other Brown County funds. The zoo logo and name references of the zoo were copyrighted. The N.E.W. Zoological Society established an Endowment Fund to ensure the continued existence of the Society and the NEW Zoo. A portion of all donations made to the N.E.W. Zoological Society goes into this fund. Funds were raised to erect the Education & Conservation Center, Tortoise, Snow Monkey, Giraffe, Red Panda, and other Exhibits along with the Carousel, Zoo train and back-up electric generator. Working with the Wisconsin Restaurant Association, the popular, annual "Feast with the Beasts" event began and is now in its 14th year. Dollars from "Feast with the Beasts" are used for education programs.

As we move forward, plans for the upcoming year are to build a new and much needed animal hospital. The groundbreaking ceremony is scheduled for this fall. The added building will allow for the old animal hospital to be renovated to expand the animal diet kitchen. The unique diets for the zoo animals will be prepared in a kitchen designed to meet the AZA standard requirement to separate the hospital from the kitchen. An added bonus is the show and tell factor of the new kitchen where visitors will be able to watch food preparation and experience the amounts and variety of foods fed to the animals every day.

The animal hospital is designed by architect Ben Schenkelberg, member of the N.E.W. Zoological Society Technical Advisory Board. Ben donated generously his time and design for this project as well as for the education building.

The N.E.W. Zoological Society, Inc., is organized as a 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization of the Internal Revenue Code. All donations are deductible to the full extent of the law for income tax purposes. Each year an independent audit is conducted. ► LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



Remember, you have a self-funded zoo unlike any other and it is only thru your support that we can continue to reflect your community pride.

Your NEW Zoo finished the 2012 year with an attendance number of 242,447 and we had a great year despite the state of the economy and not to mention the very hot summer. The Zoo also remained self-funded and ended the year with revenue exceeding expenses. That is a tremendous accomplishment being that the zoo is 1 of only 8 of the 226 AZA accredited zoos & aquariums in North America that is self-funded (receiving no tax support) and the only one that does not have operational support from an endowment fund. We truly are working with and towards a sustainable zoo business model. Being sustainable means we are truly living within our means and a reflection of the support from the community. The Zoo also attained AZA accreditation status in 2012 having passed its five year inspection. Congratulations to all who made this a reality and a most significant achievement for a zoo and its community. Every five years the Zoo must go thru an accreditation application and inspection as standards of excellence in our industry also change to reflect the highest standards in the modern zoological practices.

The N.E.W. Zoological Society is our support organization and I like to say a Zoo Director's best friend. The Zoo Society is continually raising funds for new capital improvements as well as helping out with operational support in some areas. Without a support organization, we would lack the connection to the fiscal support and fundraising opportunities within the community that we reside.

The Zoo Society has finished construction of the Education Conservation Center which is a significant upgrade from our previous educational facility which was built in the early 1950's. A dedication was held last fall and since then, the indoor education programs and attendance has soared. I can't tell you how great the feeling is to hear the children coming and going from our new classroom knowing that we are able to make a real difference with the new facility. Certain new exhibits and/or facilities can make a major change in the Zoo and the new Education Conservation Center lives up to that major change in what we can now offer. I know the building was only a dream for so many of us past and present and now a reality for all to enjoy!

The NEW Zoo supports the community in many ways. The zoo has a deep commitment to science, education and wildlife conservation, but it also generates valuable economic benefits to the region. It is a great investment for anyone interested in making a difference in their community. Each year we renew our commitment to the community by putting the "new" in the NEW Zoo, growing within our means and providing the community with a zoo they can be proud of.

In closing I would like to thank you for your support and investment in your NEW Zoo. BRICK PROGRAM

The Society updated and improved on the brick program, at the zoo, three years ago. Today all engraved bricks are placed in stainless steel frames, off the ground, at the entrances of our animal exhibits. The laser engraved bricks wear better and can be seen year round.

Personalized bricks make great gifts for a birthday, wedding, anniversary, employee or boss appreciation, pet appreciation, remembering a loved one, or for the person who has everything. Purchasing a personalized brick will help build the NEW Zoo and serve as a memorial for all to enjoy.

NATURAL RIVER ROCK BENCH

The hand crafted natural river rock bench is designed of two natural river rocks and a hand polished granite seat 39" x 16" x 18". The raised arm of the bench is the perfect place to have a loved one's name engraved.

The cost of the bench is \$1800.00 which includes up to 20 engraved letters.

100% RECYCLED PLASTIC CEDAR-STYLE BENCH

The hand crafted plastic cedar-style bench is approximately 5 feet long by 3 feet high with an engraved backrest. The cost of the bench is \$1000.00 and includes 2 lines of engraving with up to 20 letters per line.

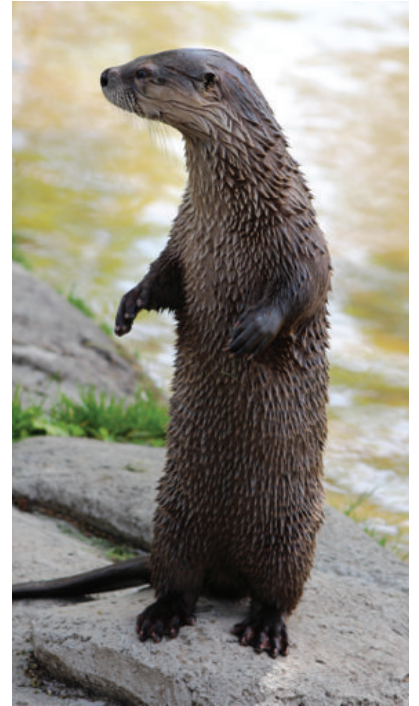

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR 2012: **LINDA IMMEL**

Hello! My name is Linda Immel, and I have been volunteering at the NEW Zoo for the past five years. My husband, James "JJ" Joseph, and I used to raise and show Tibetan Terriers. When my husband's health began to fail and we were no longer able to attend dog shows, I began to look for something that involved animals that I could participate in as a volunteer. Initially, JJ and I enjoyed shopping for and donating toys and things for the animals--we especially enjoyed picking out toys for the macaws and Pepper, the Pied Crow.

After JJ died, I began volunteering in the zoo kitchen, helping the zookeepers sort produce and prepare meals for the animals. I currently volunteer almost every Saturday and/or Sunday. My "volunteer day" typically starts early Saturday morning, when I stop at a grocery store to pick up some extra produce that I donate to the zoo--I often stop at the diner near the zoo for breakfast, and I always save a half slice of toast so I can make a peanut butter sandwich to give to Buttercup (the Zoo's South American Porcupine) for breakfast! I enjoy making the produce diets as colorful as possible--Tootie and Al, the tortoises, love colorful food--so they might get a red or yellow pepper, a tomato, a peeled orange (they don't like rinds!), yellow squash, a carrot and a chunk of sweet potato on a bed of lettuce--sometimes I dress it up by using purple kale or swiss chard to add even more color! The monkeys--Macaques and Tamarins, need a variety of fruits and veggies--or course they LOVE bananas but they also love oranges, pears, grapes and watermelon!

I also occasionally make treats/toys for the animals--but that's another story! I thoroughly enjoy my volunteer time at the zoo--and getting to know the keepers and zoo staff and hearing stories about the animals has been great. I hope to keep volunteering for a long time! Thank you to the NEW Zoo--it is great to be a part of your volunteer team! And THANK YOU so much for surprising me with the NEW Zoo Volunteer of the Year Award!

New Animal Hospital

The N.E.W. Zoological Society is currently raising funds to build a new Animal Hospital at the Zoo. The new Hospital will contain modern, state of the art equipment to provide our animals with the best possible medical care. It will also provide safe housing for sick and injured animals, and a quarantine space for all the new animals that come to us each year.

Our old Animal Hospital was built in 1993, and is only 3420 square feet in total size. A good portion of this is devoted to the diet kitchen, where all the meals for the animals are prepared. The facility has served for many years, but unfortunately we have outgrown it. The treatment and surgery rooms are so small that often there is not enough space for the entire veterinary team to work around a large animal and all the essential equipment! And, much of the equipment has become outdated or obsolete.

Many things have changed in the last twenty years! First, the Zoo's collection of animals has grown and become much more diverse. We now have over 220 animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, invertebrates, birds, and mammals. We care for red pandas, snow leopards, cougars, red wolves, giraffes, an albino alligator, large troop of snow monkeys, and tiny cotton topped tamarins, in addition to the lions, bears, deer, bison and elk. We have a very diverse collection of birds, including a colony of African penguins, many species of parrots, wattled



cranes, kookaburras, and emus. And there is a nice collection of farm animals in the Children's Zoo. Many of our animals are endangered species, and we participate in Species Survival Programs to help preserve them through planned breeding.

Second, veterinary medicine has become much more sophisticated in the last twenty years. The standards of care for zoological medicine are rising to keep pace with those of traditional veterinary practice. Technology has leapt forward, with sophisticated, digital equipment available to provide faster, more accurate diagnostics.

Because preventive medical care is our major focus, we perform many comprehensive examinations and routine testing of the animals, provide contraception, and monitor and treat chronic conditions. Dentistry, geriatric care, tumor removals, wound repair and other treatments frequently performed at the Zoo these days. Even a Caesarian section was done on a snow monkey! As our animals live longer, they routinely receive care for aging issues such as arthritis or kidney problems.

In planning the new Animal Hospital, we will resolve a number of challenges, but also provide for the future needs of the NEW Zoo's animal collection. The improvements will reduce stress to the animals, improve diagnostics and treatment, and increase safety for the animals and staff. And the new facility will provide a unique educational experience for our visitors, with a special viewing area that allows guests to observe our veterinary team at work on the animals!
