AWARDS

The following awards are announced by various departments of the University

AMERICAN HISTORY ESSAY CONTEST.—Scoring five points, Hays Hall placed first among campus groups in the sixteenth annual contest sponsored by the Sons of the American Revolution, thereby winning possession for the coming year of a bust of Washington designed by Bianchini. FRENCH SCHOLARSHIP.—A bronze medal executed by Morlon given by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the French Republic through its Consul-General at San Francisco is awarded to Jean Hitchcock Baer of Boise for highest scholarship in French.
