





## Tech Time

For those of you that don't yet know me, a short profile. I've been racing one thing or another practically my entire life. I had previously held an NHRA drag racing pro license prior to discovering the thrill of making turns while road racing. I served as crew on the famous Chi-Town Hustler funny car in the 80's and built drag cars for Competition Motorsports in Bridgeview, IL. I moved to Batavia last year and started Kanna Motorsports. I was honored by being asked to be the drivers Ed tech coordinator for the 2001 season. I'll try to touch on some important tech tips in each upcoming issue of the Chicago Scene, here's the first.

There is something that most Porsche owners know little about and really don't care about, but it is of the utmost importance in how you car handles, stops, and accelerates.

It's called weight balancing, sometimes called corner balancing. I'll explain this in simple terms. All cars are designed to have their overall weight distributed on it's contact patches (tires) in a certain percentage. I'll use a 911 for example. Porsche designed the 911 to have its' weight distributed 60% on the rear and 40% on the front. There is little you can do with the suspension to change this, with the exception of changing the center of gravity, adding or taking away weight from the front or rear. The front and rear weights must then be equally distributed between the opposing wheels (front right and left rear, front left and right rear) each combination making up 50% of the total weight. Don't freak yet...it really doesn't matter if you understand it, the bottom line here is that if your car is not weight balanced you won't get proper weight transfer on acceleration, braking, or cornering. Sometimes it can be subtle, and other times it can be exaggerated. Want an example, just take a look at my 9305 on the December Chicago Scene cover. See that front wheel inches off the ground?

Its' not supposed to do that! I had recently changed all the suspension and had not had the time to get it on the scales to weight balance it before Octoberfest. Afterwards I put it on the scales and found that my left front only had 8% of the overall weight on it.

OK, lets all do the math together, if the front is supposed to have 40%, and there are 2 wheels in the front, that means that approximately 20% should be on each front wheel. Since you really can't change the weight distribution percentages from front to rear, that meant that about 32% was on the right front. Its' quite a bit more complicated than that, but I said I'll keep it simple. All the cornering was being done with 1 wheel....not the fast way around the track! To make it worse, braking was no fun either because only the right front had enough weight on it to effectively brake. But what about acceleration you ask? Remember we said earlier that the weight balance should be somewhat equal front left to right rear and vice versa, and each pair of those "corners" should equal 50% of the total weight (that's where we get the term "corner balancing"). If the rear weight is not even side to side, only 1 wheel is properly putting the power to the ground. Let me give you the true figures on mine when I first put it on the scales. Weight distribution front to rear was 62% rear 38% front. The left front was 8% the right front 30%. Right rear was 42% leaving the left rear with 20%. Now lets add that up. RF (30%) +LR (20%)=50%. LF (8%) + RR (42%) = 50%.

As you can see the corners were balanced to 50% each, however, the percentages on each wheel were terrible. I'll give you 1 guess as to what they are now. Suffice it to say you'll see all 4 wheels on the ground this year! If you want a faster, safer car, get it weight balanced and hold off on the new chip, headers, and all those other go fast goodies. Weight balancing is a job that requires a proper set of chassis scales, and a thorough understanding of the correct setup. We are fortunate enough to have many capable shops in the Chicago region. I see allot of people that concentrate too much on trying to make more horsepower in an attempt to go faster. Concentrate on making it handle, and you WILL go faster.

## Autocross Driver's School Sunday April 22

If you plan to participate in our autocrosses or in our driver's education events at Blackhawk Farms Raceway, Elkhart Lake and GingerMan, you should attend this first driving event of the real millennium. What is an autocross? An autocross is a competition event requiring precision and skill negotiating a tight course marked by rubber pylon cones. An autocross abuses your nerves more than your Porsche, so it will not destroy your budget or your Porsche. Beware that autocrossing is habit forming and may lead to an addiction to speed. This is a good thing.

We offer a ninety-minute class discussing the fundamentals of high performance driving. Following the classroom session, you will receive personal instruction at the skid pad, braking practice, slalom and ninety degree turn exercises. Finally, we will coach you as you drive an autocross course at your own speed.

The format for Saturday and Sunday will consist of four run groups as follows:

	fairly new to Road America

Before you arrive at the track, it is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car and complete a Chicago Region Tech Sheet. Although you may perform this tech inspection yourself, we strongly recommend you consider using a competent mechanic who is familiar with what it takes to properly prepare a Porsche for use on the track. In either case, please pay close attention to the specifics detailed on the Tech Sheet, especially concerning brake fluid and brake pads.

For Groups 1, 2, and 3, a five or six point harness is mandatory for the driver. If you wish to have an instructor to ride with you, the same type of harness is also required on the passenger side. Mandatory clothing for this event includes a <u>SNELL approved SA 1995 helmet</u>, long sleeve cotton shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of non-synthetic material, and closed toe shoes. Recommended, but not mandatory are driver's suits, driving gloves and shoes, and a protective neck brace all made of Nomex or similar fire-resistant materials, and a properly mounted fire extinguisher. As a reminder, please check the date on your helmet NOW as it will be checked at tech inspection. Remember that if you do not pass tech inspection, you will not be permitted to drive!

The event registrar will assign car numbers prior to the event and ALL cars must display those numbers on each side of the car and on the front hood. Numbers must be at least 6 inches tall on the sides and 8 inches tall on the hood. Shoe polish is not acceptable! If the corner workers are not able to read your car's numbers at speed, you will be black-flagged and not be permitted out again until the deficiently is corrected. Once you have received your number assignment from the registrar, we recommend that you find a local sign shop that can create inexpensive static cling numbers.

All cars that participate in this event must not exceed the maximum Road America noise restriction level of 108 decibels. Please ensure that your car is in compliance with this limit in advance as there are residential areas near the track and monitoring equipment will used throughout the weekend.

Confirmed drivers will receive (by e-mail or snail mail) a confirmation packet that includes a copy of the *Rules of Road America*. We ask that you take the time to review them in detail before you arrive at the track. These rules are set by Road America and not the Chicago Region, so please help to ensure that you and all of your guests are in full compliance.

In addition to the mandatory Novice Orientation Meeting on Thursday evening, there will also be *Mandatory Driver's Meetings*n Friday morning for Novices and Instructors, and on both Saturday and Sunday mornings for *ALL DRIVERS* Each of these meetings will begin at 7:30 AM sharp. Any driver missing any of these meetings that address safety and policy issues for the weekend will not be allowed to drive.

Regarding safety, we are once again asking all participants to provide some personal medical information as part of the registration form. The Chicago Region believes in taking a proactive approach to your personal well being and this information will be made available only to the track physicians in the remote possibility it is needed. All medical information will be destroyed after the event. There is a service that can provide this medical information in confidentiality, Trak Med. Marian McCarthy of Trak Med has offered our members a special price for their service, \$99 instead of \$124.99. You must mention that you are a Chicago Region PCA member. They can be reached at 571.434.6758 or register on line at www.trakmed.com.

Spaces for this event are limited and we recommend that you pre-register early! Prior to April 1st we will accept pre-registrations from Chicago Region members ONLY. After that date, pre- registration will open to all Porsche drivers on a first-come, first-served basis and notification (by e-mail or snail-mail) of acceptance will be provided by the registrar. If you are planning to attend this event, this would also be a good time to make your room accommodations as many of the hotels in and around Elkhart Lake will fill up quickly for the holiday weekend. A listing of places to stay is provided on the next page. Please note that we have a block of rooms reserved for the Chicago Region Porsche Club at the Osthoff Resort.

Track registration for Novices and Instructors will take place at Siebkens Resort in Elkhart Lake on Thursday, May 24th from 4:00 pm until 7:00 pm. Registration for all other drivers will be at the Registration Building at Road America from 4:00 pm – 7:00 pm on Friday,

May 25th. Please remember that all drivers must present a valid driver's license and a current PCA membership card at registration. The tech crew will also be on hand to scrutinize your car and helmet. If your car is not available for tech on Thursday or Friday afternoon, it must pass inspection on Saturday morning following the driver's meeting. No cars will be allowed to run without a tech inspection sticker!

Siebkens will once again be the headquarters for Thursday registration as well as the Novice Orientation Meeting. In addition to lodging, they offer a continental breakfast starting at 6:00 am and a full service breakfast starting at 9:00 am. Someone from Siebkens will also be on hand during Thursday evening's registration hours and at the track during the lunch hour on Saturday to sell tickets for a dinner in their dining room on Saturday evening after the track closes.

If you are looking for an easy way to get around the pits and track viewing areas, consider a golf cart rental that Road America will offer once again this year. Reservations must be made at least four weeks in advance of the event. Please note that you will be responsible for any damage and a minimum age of 16 years is required to operate the carts.

The registration fee includes a **R.A.D.E. 2001**shirt. Please indicate your shirt size on the pre-registration form. Extra shirts, at \$15 each, may be ordered if payment and size are included with the registration fee. A very limited supply of shirts will be available for purchase during the event.



#### FOR EXTERIOR PAINT MAINTENANCE...

- \* Meguiar #00 Hi-Tech Car Wash or, Meguiar #62 Carwash & Conditioner or, Sonax Gloss Shampoo:
  Good car wash formulas. They all clean thoroughly and protect the paint and wax. Remember, never use dishwashing liquid to wash your car. The grease cutting agents in the dishwashing liquid will remove all wax from your paint, and it may cause a cloudy film to dry on your clearcoat, which you will have a very hard time to get rid of.
- \* P215 Total Auto Wash: This product is a degreaser and will remove wax, therefore do not use as a weekly car wash, unless you want to strip the wax off. This cleaner will remove tree sap, bugs, bird droppings and general grime, as well as, grease and oil. Dilute with water for specific cleaning needs.
- \* 3M Imperial Hand Glaze: This is a hand buffing liquid with high filling characteristics to clean, polish and renew paint prior to waxing. This product will remove oxidation, acid rain marks, fine scratches and swirl marks. Apply using moderate hand pressure in a linear motion and buff out with a soft 100% cotton cloth. Follow immediately with a coat of quality wax.
- \* Zymol HD Cleanse: This is a paint cleaner formulated to uncover a lower level of paint, remove light oxidation, and moderate scratches. Apply using moderate pressure on a 24" x 24" area at a time. Work into the surface until tacky, then buff out with clean, soft, 100% cotton cloth. Follow with an application of wax to protect the finish.

#### TIP of the DAY for your Cabriolet:

In order to protect the plastic "glass" from excess scratches, place a towel between the folding sections, as the ragtop is folding. The folded top moves around under acceleration and cornering, which is what causes most of the scratches. The towel will cushion the movement and prevent the top surfaces from rubbing each other.

Meguiar #17 Plastic Cleaner followed by Meguiar #10 Polish will remove the scratches and any discoloration and help restore the clarity. Meguiars #17 and #10 also provides UV protection. The scratches may also be removed with Wenol, or Blue Magic. A suggestion for cleaning the window is a product called ClearVue. Apply ClearVue to the surface using a well-used soft cloth, such as fabric baby-diapers, and well-worn white tee shirts.

#### TIP of the DAY for your Boxster:

Boxsters are usually prone to fogging of the rear plastic window, and the Plexiglas windscreen between the two headrests. A solution to the fogging is to use an equal amount of Blue Magic and 3M Imperial Hand Glaze in a compound. Rub ONLY horizontal, and then wipe clean with a fresh white cotton cloth.


