# AFC PORTCHESTER 4 US PORTSMOUTH 1





Mitchell Parker started his AFC Portchester career in some style as he inspired his new team to a 4-1 win over United Services Portsmouth.

He set up the opening goal of the afternoon before grabbing two goals of his own as the Royals put the disappointment of the previous weekend's result against Sherborne behind them with this comfortable victory.

Portchester were quick out of the blocks on a humid afternoon and they opened the scoring on four minutes. Parker took the ball down the left hand side of the box before turning it back inside to Lee Wort, who took the ball down before placing his shot out of the reach of keeper Logan O'Donnell and into the corner of the net.

The visitors then created a couple of half chances when a cross from the right was flicked away from danger in front of goal by a home defender and Simon Woods got clear down the left hand side of the box but his shot at the near post was blocked by a defender.

On 17 minutes a long clearance was picked up by Marley Ridge, who got the ball down under control and took it to the edge of the box before unleashing a shot which O'Donnell just got his finger tips to and he pushed the ball over the crossbar.

Visiting captain Cam Quirke tested

home keeper Steven Mowthorpe's alertness on 25 minutes when his shot from just outside the box was gathered at the second attempt.

The home side doubled their lead on 32 minutes after O'Donnell brought down Wort as he made his way into the penalty area and Parker sent the keeper diving the wrong way with his spot kick.

The Royals had the three points sewn up when they netted their third goal of the afternoon on 58 minutes.

US Portsmouth gave away possession as they tried to play their way out of defence and Wort sent the ball into the path of Parker and he fired the ball into the net.


The introduction of Harrison Brook on 70 minutes proved to be an inspired substitution as he netted Portchester's fourth goal moments after coming on. He took the ball inside the box, side stepped his way past two defenders and then dispatched his shot past O'Donnell.

The only blip on an otherwise perfect afternoon came seven minutes later when Tom Rolls' shot through a crowd of players found the back of the net to deny the home side a clean sheet.

Portchester went close to restoring their four goal advantage on 83 minutes when Brook crossed the ball to Wort and his shot from in front of goal was well blocked by the visitors.



After months of uncertainty, angst and sheer agony at times, the long-suffering supporters of Southend United and Scunthorpe United were finally given some reason to cheer.

A winding-up petition to the High Court over a £275,000 tax debt threatened to bring an end to Southend's 116-year history, with much maligned owner Ron Martin at the centre of protests for his refusal to sell up.

However, the loyal faithful finally got the news they had waited so long for after a three-man consortium of supporters, led by Australian businessman Justin Rees, announced they had finally got the deal over the line.

"We can confirm that an agreement for the sale of the club has been reached with a consortium led by Justin Rees," a club statement read. "We recognise that this has been a stressful time for all associated with the club. We would like to thank our staff for their incredible loyalty and also thank all our stakeholders for their patience."

Martin, who took over the club in 1998, has been the target for all the fans' ire for how the situation has spiralled to the brink of abyss. Protests have been held outside his house, marches through the coastal town before matches and games even held up when toy rats were thrown on the pitch in a desperate bid to get him to sell-up.

Fan power also won the day when a bumper crowd of 5,063 attended Scunthorpe United's game with Brackley Town to celebrate the dawn of a new era for the Iron. A takeover deal with former commercial director Michelle Harness finally brought an end to David Hilton's turbulent nine-month tenure in charge.

Hilton had replaced Peter Swann in the Glanford Park hotseat in January and he recently confirmed that he had withdrawn his funding from the club and was actively trying to sell the club.

Despite a looming eviction from Glanford Park, winding up petitions, county court judgements and players and staff not being paid, Harness had agreed to take over a 75 per cent share of the club, while fans did their bit by clubbing together to raise more than £68,000 to help pay the staff in their hour of need.

The Brackley game was emotional for another reason as it was Scunthorpe's last at their famous Glanford Park home "for the foreseeable future", with a groundshare in place at Gainsborough Trinity.

Sadly, not all clubs are as blessed as Southend and Scunthorpe when it comes to powerful fanbases and it wasn't such great news for Step 4 club Hamworthy United.

The Hammers have been hamstrung since the closure of the only seated stand at their County Ground home, following a structural report in February.

An on-off deal to replace it was eventually struck and with a short term groundshare at Weymouth secured at the 11th hour, United got the green light to remain at Step 4 this season.

However, with demolition work now paused following the discovery of asbestos, officials felt they had no choice than to quit the Southern League and pull the plug on the first team to safeguard the club's future.

"We didn't want the club to go bankrupt," chairman Steve Mitchener explained. "The decision was not taken lightly but we had to do this to preserve the club and the business." As drastic and as sad as it was for Mitchener to pull the plug on the Hammers' season, it's a prime example of responsible club ownership, something that the higher-profile pair would have given anything for.

# NO DISSENT NO SIN BIN

Founded in 1885, Christchurch FC can claim to be one of the pioneers of Hampshire League football, as they were founder members of the Hampshire Football Association in 1887 following the dissolution of the South Hants and Dorset FA and the consequential formation of the Dorset FA

Christchurch's first honours came in 1893 when they won the Hampshire Junior Cup and further successes were achieved in the same competition in 1912 and 1921.

Between the wars, Christchurch were members of the Bournemouth and Hampshire County Leagues and in 1938 they gained promotion to Hampshire Division 1 for the first time by winning the Division 2 championship.

Christchurch have enjoyed mixed fortunes during their history. They have been relegated to Hampshire Divisions 2 and 3 and then climbed back to the top division again, winning Division 2 again in 1948 and 1986 and Division 3 in 1953

In 1970 Christchurch were the first club to win the Bournemouth Senior Cup three times in successive seasons, also winning the Bournemouth Pickford Cup in 1977 and the Hampshire Intermediate Cup in 1987.

Christchurch gained admission to the Wessex League in the 1987-88 season.

Christchurch's long association with Barrack Road Recreation ground, in the centre of the town, ended at the start of the 1984-85 season when the club accepted the opportunity to move to

Hurn Bridae.

The ground had been owned by British Aerospace and a substantial investment was made initially by the council, football club and sports club on various ground improvements, including the provision of floodlights, covered accommodation for spectators and two extensions to the clubhouse.

Season 2011-12 was one of the best ever at the club, with the first team finishing in third place with their highest ever points total of 85 points, reaching the final of the Russell Cotes Cup and winning the Wessex League Cup by beating local rivals Brockenhurst.

Season 2012-13 brought another creditable performance in the Premier Division with a third place finish and 2013-14 saw a change of management team, with Michael Cuffie and Bob Sullivan taking the reins after Graham Kemp left for pastures new having had six very good years at the club.

Season 2014–15 saw a new management team in place of Adie Arnold and Danny Saxby but at the end of a turbulent campaign the first team were relegated to Division 1.

Season 2017-18 saw the club win the Wessex Division 1 title, and Christchurch's return to the Premier Division brought a fourth place finish in 2019-20 and sixth place in the Covid-19 curtailed seasons of 2019-20 and 2020-21. The club declined the chance to go up to the Southern League.

Christchurch now have Nathan Brown as manager, ably assisted by Chia Khider, Darren Berry and Rob Gillett.



The story of the Women's FA Cup stretches back over 50 years to the early 1970s – and a south coast side dominated the opening decade of the national cup competition.

The first Women's FA Cup competition, known originally as The Women's Football Association Mitre Challenge Trophy, took place in the 1970–71 season under the now-defunct Women's FA.

The 71 entrants were placed in eight geographical groups and they included teams from Scotland and Wales. Southampton beat Scottish side Stewarton 4–1 in the final played at the Crystal Palace National Recreation Centre in London.

Since the Football Association took over direct control of English women's football in 1993, the semi-professional teams affiliated with male Premier League and Football League counterparts have tended to dominate the competition.

For the first contest under the FA in 1993–94, there was an entry of 147 teams and Doncaster Belles beat Knowsley United 1–0 in the final at Scunthorpe United's Glanford Park.

Arsenal have won the competition a record 14 times, the last time coming in 2016 when Danielle Carter's goal gave them victory over Chelsea at Wembley – the venue for the final since 2015.

Southampton have been winners of the competition eight times, with all of those triumphs coming between 1971 and 1981. The Doncaster Belles have won the FA Cup six times and reached the final on a further seven occasions.

Last season's final was watched by a crowd of 77,390, compared to the first recorded crowd for a final of 1,500 for the 1972 contest between Southampton and Scottish side Lee's Ladies.
