COACHING STAFF



AARON BEST

Head Coach (7th Season / 23rd on staff)



Aaron Best bleeds Eagle red. 2023 marks his 27th season with Eastern Washington football after stepping on campus as a freshman offensive lineman in 1996. After four years as a student-athlete, including two years as the team's starting center, the Tacoma native was hired as a student assistant in 2000 and steadily worked his way to the top, serving as an assistant coach under Paul

Wulff and Beau Baldwin for 16 years before taking over in 2017.

Best earned the Big Sky Conference co-Coach of the Year in 2018 after guiding Eastern to a league co-championship and an appearance in the NCAA Division I Championship Game. He was also voted by fans nationwide as the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coach of the Year by Hero Sports.

In his six seasons as head coach, he has compiled a 44-25 record overall (.638) and 32-14 mark in the Big Sky (.696). Both winning percentages rank second in program history since joining the FCS level (formerly Division I-AA) in 1984.

Eastern ranked in the top five in total offense in the FCS in five of his first six seasons at the helm, including ranking 1st in 2019 (524.8 yards per game) and 2021 (554.5), and 3rd in the 2021 spring season. The Eagles also ranked 2nd in overall scoring in 2021, 3rd in passing (399.4) and earned a 6-0 record on the road during the regular season, the best such mark since 1967. Although a 20-game winning streak at home on "The Inferno" came to an end in 2021 and the team went 2-3 in Cheney in 2022, Best boasts an outstanding six-year record at Roos Field of 25-7 (.781).

Entering the 2023 season, he is unbeaten as a head coach versus five current Big Sky Conference schools – Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Northern Arizona, UC Davis and Cal Poly – as well as former Big Sky member North Dakota.

In his 26 seasons associated with the Eagle program, Best has been a part of teams which have won nine Big Sky Conference titles with a collective league record of 139-62 (.691), have made 12 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoff appearances and have an overall record of 203-110 (.649) in more than two decades (1996-06, 2008-22). He has been a part of 29 total playoff games (18-11), going

16-10 as a coach and 2-1 as a player. 22 of those games were played at home, going 16-6. Best was the team's offensive coordinator and offensive line coach when the Eagles won the 2010 NCAA Division I title. The Eagles finished with the 3rd-most wins in the decade (2010-19) with 97, and its winning percentage of .735 (97-35) was 5th-best among 124 FCS schools. Moreover, the Eagles currently rank 9th among current FCS members with 15 playoff berths, 12 of which Best was a player or coach during, and 7th among current members in playoff wins with 20. He has made three FCS Playoff appearances in six years as head coach, going 4-2 overall.

Best has coached 27 offensive linemen to All-America honors, 60 to All-Big Sky honors, 10 to senior bowl or all-star game appearances and two hear their name called in the NFL Draft. As a head coach, nine Eagles have received All-America recognition, including QB Eric Barriere, who was a two-time finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given annually to the most outstanding offensive player in the FCS. Barriere was twice named the Big Sky MVP and the team has earned 77 total All-Big Sky honors with Best at the helm, adding 26 Big Sky Player of the Week awards.

Eastern annually leads the Big Sky Conference in Academic All-Conference honors won, including 29 in the fall of 2022, good for 3rd among football members. Eagle football players consistently earn grade point averages in excess of 3.00 and graduate on-time, which was reflected in the latest 2021-22 NCAA Academic Progress Report as the program earned a score of 968 out of 1000, with 260 student-athletes represented in the four-year rolling average. Best and his staff also ensure Eagle football players are active members of the community, both on and off campus.

As a player, Best was a four-year contributor for the Eagles from 1996-99, serving as the long snapper for all four and starting center for his junior and senior seasons. He earned Big Sky First Team and All-America Honorable Mention honors as a senior, and All-Big Sky Honorable Mention recognition as a junior. A standout in the classroom himself, Best was twice named to the Big Sky All-Academic team and once to both the CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII Team and FCS Athletic Directors Academic All-Star Team (both in 1999).

Best agreed to terms on new two-year extension to his contract in January 2019, which runs through 2024. The extension came after the Eagles were 12-3 in Best's second year at the helm, finishing as NCAA Division I Runner-Up.

EXCELLENCE UNDER BEST

In his 26 seasons as a player, assistant or head coach, Eastern Washington football has experienced unparalleled success. Eagle accolades and achievements during Best's tenure in Cheney include:

As a member of the coaching staff, Best has led EWU offensive linemen to incredible individual awards, including:

- 10 senior bowl or all-star game appearances

JIM CHAPIN

Offensive Coordinator / QBs (2nd Season)

Chapin arrived in Cheney in 2022 after four seasons at the University of Sioux Falls where he served as the associate head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterback coach. In his first year as OC, the Eagles ranked 8th in scoring (24.6), 8th in yards per game (388.9) and 6th in passing (253.5).

In 2021, Sioux Falls finished 8-3 overall and won a Northern Sun Conference South Division title. Chapin led an offense that averaged 412.8 yards per game, along with 32.5 points per game and 6.2 yards per play.

Under Chapin, the Cougars led the NSIC in rushing yards per game this season with 217.2, which ranked seventh nationally. Sioux Falls also only allowed eight sacks in 2021, which was also seventh across all of Division II. Running back Thuro Reisdorfer was nominated for the 2021 Harlon Hill Award, Division II's national player of the year.

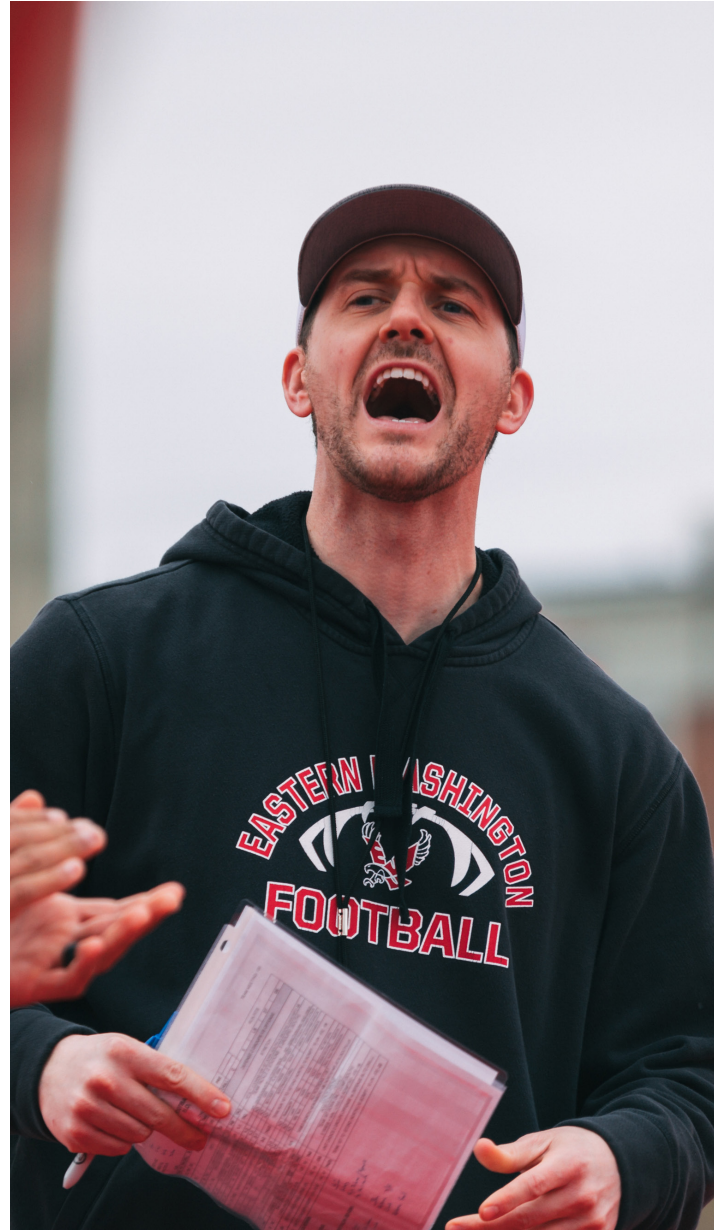
The Cougars had a winning record all four seasons under Chapin as the offensive coordinator, going a combined 32-14 (.696) during his tenure. Other highlights during Chapin's time at Sioux Falls include two NCAA DII playoff appearances in 2017 and 2018 and the Cougars finished the 2017 season ranked No. 20 in the final American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) poll.

Chapin also coached offensive tackle Trey Pipkins who was drafted in the third round in the 2019 NFL draft by the Los Angeles Chargers. Also in 2018, Chapin coached running back Gabe Watson to a NSIC Offensive Player of the Year nod along with a Super Region 4 Player of the Year honor. During his tenure, Chapin coached two first team All-Americans, three All Region honorees, eight first team NSIC selections, and 14 second team NSIC selections.

Chapin also brings some familiarity of the Big Sky Conference with him to Cheney, as he served as the special teams coordinator and running backs coach at UC Davis from 2015 to 2016. At UC Davis, he coached running back Manu Luuga to a second team All-Big Sky nod.

Chapin also had stints at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2012-2014) and Adrian College (2010-2011). In his three seasons at Indiana University of Pennsylvania as the running backs coach, the team won a PSAC Championship in 2012 and ended the season nationally ranked after reaching the NCAA quarterfinals. He coached two first team All-PSAC West recipients and the PSAC West Offensive Player of the Year among several other AP All-American and Super Region honorees.

He is originally from Troy, Mich. and began his coaching career at Troy High School and Dexter High School (also in Michigan) after graduating from the University of Michigan in the Spring of 2009.

JEFF COPP



Defensive Coordinator (2nd Season / 4th on staff)

Copp was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2022 after two years on staff coaching the defensive tackles, beginning with the abbreviated 2020-21 spring season. Before Eastern, he spent four seasons at Florida International University, including the final two as co-defensive coordinator.

Copp has coached two Eagle defensive linemen to four All-Big Sky honors during his tenure in Mitchell Johnson (First Team in 2020-21, Third Team in '22) and Joshua Jerome (Honorable Mention in 2020-21, Third Team in '22). Following the 2021 season, Jerome was named to the HERO Sports Sophomore All-America Defensive Team, and was named to the Phil Steele All-Big Sky fourth team along with Johnson.

During his tenure, Copp and the Eagles have garnered an overall record of 18-13 with a 13-9 mark in conference play, making two NCAA FCS Playoff appearances. In 31 games, Eastern has held 12 of its opponents to 23 points or less, including a 19-9 win over Northern Iowa in the 2021 FCS Playoffs first round (3 FGs).

Copp is a native of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and played college football at Boise State, earning All-Big West honors as a defensive end while helping the Broncos win two Humanitarian Bowls. His 20 years of coaching experience includes stints at Big Sky Conference members Northern Arizona (2016), UC Davis (2009-15) and Idaho State (2004). As a player and coach, he's been on teams which have won three league titles and advanced to six bowl games.

At FIU under head coach Butch Davis, he coached safeties for two seasons before being promoted to co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. In 2020, the Panther defense ranked 17th overall in the nation for passing yards allowed per game (195.0) and 23rd in pass efficiency defense. Stanley Thomas-Oliver III was selected in the seventh round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers. In 2018, his safeties helped the Panthers rank second in C-USA and 11th nationally for total interceptions (17). They ranked 30th nationally in passing yards allowed per game (194.1)

Copp went to FIU after spending one season (2016) at Northern Arizona as the Lumberjacks' special teams coordinator. He coached at UC Davis for seven seasons before NAU, first as a safeties coach before coaching the entire defensive backfield and special teams, then linebackers. UC Davis led all NCAA Div. I (FCS) teams in net punting (41.4 average) and kickoff returns (26.4 average) in 2012. Punter Colton Schmidt was named All-Big Sky 1st team after averaging 44.5 yards per attempt, 6th-best in the FCS, before becoming starting punter for the Buffalo Bills. Under Copp, linebacker Steven Pitts earned All-Big Sky honorable mention accolades in 2013 after posting 74 tackles, a team-high 11.5 TFLs and four sacks for 35 yards in losses. He repeated All-Big honors in 2014.

He earned his bachelor's degree in health sciences from Boise State in 2001, then added a master's degree in higher education at Arizona State in 2003.

MARC ANDERSON

Associate Head Coach / Tight Ends / Recruiting Coordinator (2nd Season / 9th on staff)

Anderson enters his 2nd season as Associate Head Coach and 9th overall at Eastern. A two-time Eagle grad – earning his bachelor’s and master’s degrees in Cheney – he originally started with the program as a student assistant.

Over the last two seasons, Eagle tight ends have combined to bring down 64 catches for 715 yards and 12 touchdowns, highlighted by the duo of Blake Gobel and Dylan Ingram scoring 4 TDs each in 2022.

Anderson provides a variety of administrative support services for head coach Aaron Best and the program, including recruiting, budget, staffing organization/hiring, head coach media obligations and other duties. Eastern’s recruiting class in 2019 was ranked No. 1 in the Big Sky and No. 2 in FCS. Anderson also assists with roster management, coordinating team meals and camps, but now on lesser scale with the addition of his tight ends coaching duties.

After assisting the program for nearly three seasons as a student intern, he was hired as a student operations assistant and video coordinator in 2014. Anderson took on more responsibility in 2016, when he was promoted to Director of Football Operations. He added recruiting coordinator duties in 2020 and was named Associate Head Coach in 2022.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts and Education in English in 2014 and a Master of Arts degree in English in 2016.

ZACH BRUCE

Safeties / Defensive Pass Game Coordinator (4th Season)

Bruce enters his 4th season as coach of Eastern safeties in 2023 after a prolific playing career as an Eagle from 2012-16. He added defensive pass game coordinator duties this season.

In 2022, Bruce coached Marlon Jones Jr. to Third Team All-Big Sky Honors after recording 52 tackles in 11 games (9 starts), leading the team with 4 pass deflections and 3 interceptions. The Eagles ranked 4th in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (215.2). They ranked 3rd in interceptions (13) and 19th nationally,

Bruce coached Calin Criner to Third Team All-Big Sky honors in 2021 after he ranked 3rd on the team with 83 total tackles, 2 INTs and 9 breakups. The Eagle defense held opponents to 23 points-or-less 7 times and ranked 18th in the nation with 14 INTs. He coached safety Anthony Smith to First Team All-Big Sky honors in the abbreviated 2020-21 season as Smith had had a team-leading 44 tackles, adding 2 INTs (one for a 71-yard TD). Smith racked up 17 tackles – 19th-most in school history – against Idaho on April 10.

Bruce served as an assistant coach at Mead High in Spokane in 2017-18. Along with several other former Eagles, he was a founding member of the Pro Vision Academy in Spokane. He also spent time in 2018-20 as defensive backs coach and speed and conditioning coach in Helsinki, Finland, where his wife was playing professional basketball.

As a player, he walked on after a standout career at University High in Spokane Valley, Wash. and redshirted in 2012. He then played four years and ranks in the top 50 in EWU history in games played (50; t-42nd) and total tackles (227; 27th). He earned First Team All-Big Sky honors as a senior when he served as team co-captain. He also earned Honorable Mention All-Big Sky in 2014, and in 2015 and 2016 he was selected to the Big Sky All-Academic team. He made 14 tackles in a single game twice and 115 total during his senior year (13th in program history). Eastern went 41-13 (.759) in the four seasons he played, including 28-4 in Big Sky play (.875). The team won the Big Sky Conference title and advanced to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs in 2013, 2014 and 2016.

Bruce received his bachelor’s degree in history from Eastern in 2018. He earned a minor in coaching and a secondary minor in social studies education.

Bruce is married to Delaney Hodgins, who is the all-time leading scorer in EWU women’s basketball history (2,120; 2015-18). While he was in Finland, Bruce wrote a book about football called “Dumb Jocks” which takes a deep look into the understanding of defensive football.

Johnson-Farrell joined the EWU staff in 2023 after coaching at the University of Sioux Falls. He was the Special Teams Coordinator and Wide Receivers Coach from 2018-22, Running Backs Graduate Assistant and Assistant Special Teams Coordinator in 2017 and Wide Receivers Graduate

Assistant and Assistant Special Teams Coordinator in 2016.

Under his guidance in 2021, Sioux Falls attained program bests in blocked punts (4), kickoff coverage average (15.8 yards) and net punting (38.8). Mace also joins the Eagle staff this season after a stop at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), where he was the Offensive Line Coach from 2020-22 and promoted to add Offensive Coordinator responsibilities in 2022.

Under his guidance, the Sioux Falls offense improved in nine statistical categories in 2022, including points per game, yards per game, 3rd down conversions and red zone scoring. They ranked in the top three in the conference in PPG, YPG and yards per play, while leading the conference in rushing for the second-straight year (12th in all of D-II). Sioux Falls, an NCAA Division II program and member of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC), went 8-3 last season. Four USF players earned All-NSIC honors, including RB Thuro Reisdorfer who led the conference in rushing, was a Second Team All-American and Harlon Hill Award nominee for D-II National Player of the Year.

Nurse enters his second season in Cheney after taking over cornerbacks for the 2022 campaign. In his first year, he helped Eagle defensive back Marlon Jones Jr. to Third Team All-Big Sky honors last season as EWU ranked 3rd in the conference as a team with 13 interceptions, 2nd in defensive TDs with 2, and 4th in passing yards allowed per game (215.2).

2023 SEASON PREVIEW

Eastern Washington football looks to bounce back from a down year in 2022 and return to their familiar position in the upper echelon of the Big Sky Conference this season. To do so, they'll have to battle through a familiar but tough schedule that includes five games against teams ranked in the FCS Coaches' Poll Preseason Top 25, plus an FBS program in Fresno State.

Here's an early look at players to watch during the 2023 campaign:

OFFENSE

After boasting the top-ranked offense in the entire FCS in 2019 and 2021, eyes will undoubtedly focus on that side of the ball with a new starting quarterback but many familiar faces looking to step into a more prominent role.

QUARTERBACK

Kekoa Visperas returns to Cheney for his redshirt sophomore season after appearing in five games in 2022, starting one. The Spanaway, Wash. made his first career start in the Eagles' final game of the season, turning in a stellar performance that included 17-of-21 passes completed for 235 yards and 2 TDs, adding 33 yards and a TD on the ground. A threat with both his arm and legs, Visperas had 19 rushing attempts for 88 yards and 2 TDs on the season.

Also taking snaps behind center at fall camp are transfers **Michael Wortham** and **Jared Taylor**, joined by true freshmen **Aidan Carter** and **Nate Bell**. Wortham has showed his athleticism throughout spring and fall camps, even getting looks as a punt and kick returner. Taylor was an efficient passer at Feather River College last year, completing 69 percent of his passes for 1,961 yards and 24 touchdowns to only 1 interception.

RUNNING BACK

On any given day, Eagle fans might see a different name making a big play at running back. The group is chock full of talent, with returning veterans **Tuna Altahir** (R-So.) and **Justice Jackson** (Jr.) leading the way.

Altahir paced the team with 104 carries for 444 yards a

season ago, scoring 3 TDs while adding a 4th TD receiving. He earned a career-high 153 yards on the ground against Northern Colorado. Jackson posted a similar line, gaining 408 yards on 83 carries with 2 scores on the ground.

Redshirt junior **Micah Smith** returns to the squad after chipping in 245 yards and 2 TDs on 45 rushes, with the majority of that production coming in a monster game against Montana State (13 car, 114 yds, 2 TDs).

Another player to watch is junior transfer **Malik Dotson**, who was teammates with Jared Taylor at Feather River College last season. The Arlington, Wash. product averaged an incredible 9.27 yards per carry in 2022, highlighted by a 276-yard, 6-TD performance vs. Los Medanos.

WIDE RECEIVER

The storied tradition of wide receiver excellence at Eastern looks to continue in 2023 with a cadre of proven pass catchers competing with eager and anxious youngsters looking to make their mark.

Plenty of attention will go the way of **Efton Chism III**, who

earned Preseason All-Big Sky honors after being selected to the All-Big Sky Third Team last season. Chism averaged 6.2 receptions per game, good for 3rd in the conference and 17th in the nation. He also returned kicks, averaging 100.9 all-purpose yards per game to rank 7th in the Big Sky. He finished the season with 607 yards receiving.

After Chism is a battle among several potential breakout candidates, including **Nolan Ulm** (29 rec, 396 yds, 4 TDs last season), **Jakobie James** (18 rec, 228 yds, 1 TD in 8 GP), **Anthony Stell Jr.** (14 rec, 163 yards, 1 TD) and **Robert Mason III** (5 rec, 36 yards in 4 GP).

TIGHT END

Blake Gobel looks to take over the reins as the go-to tight end after earning Preseason All-Big Sky recognition this summer. The redshirt senior from Banks, Ore. boasts 27 career receptions for 368 yards and 9 TDs, including 9 catches for 119 yards and 2 TD last season.

Also earning reps during spring and fall camps are redshirt junior Jett Carpenter as well as redshirt sophomores JP Murphy, a transfer from San Diego State, and Messiah Jones.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The Eagle offensive line, as usual, goes about its business without much fanfare but will prove critical to the team's success. Eastern brings back four regular starters from a year ago in **Wyatt Hansen**, **Luke Dahlgren**, **Brandon Rivera** and **Seth Carnahan**.

Hansen started every game last year (mostly at left tackle) and earned Big Sky Honorable Mention honors. Dahlgren, who joins Chism, DE Brock Harrison, CB Darrien Sampson and P Nick Kokich as one of five team captains this season, started at center last year while Rivera lined up at right guard and Carnahan started the majority of games at right tackle. **Matthew Hewa Baddege** also saw time at right tackle, including two starts.

DEFENSE

It's no secret that the Eastern Washington defense struggled at times last season, but after a dedicated offseason that saw significant gains in strength and time to recover from injuries, the Eagles are poised to bounce back to their ball-hawking ways.

A healthy mix of key returners, impact transfers and young players eager to step up has the Eastern Washington defense ready for 2023.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Returning on the defensive line are veterans **Brock Harrison**, **Matthew Brown** and **Jacob Newsom**.

Harrison, who was named a team captain and given the honor of wearing jersey No. 4 this fall, had 32 tackles (17 solo) and 5.5 tackles for loss, including 2 sacks. The senior leader also forced 2 fumbles and boasts 79 career tackles (41 solo), with 30+ in each of the last two seasons.

Brown and Newsom will both be tasked with causing havoc up the middle. Brown played in 9 games a year ago and picked up 3 sacks to rank 2nd on the team. He had 28 total tackles (13 solo), with 5.5 of those coming for a loss. In 26 career games (15 starts), Brown has 47 tackles and 4 sacks. Newsom appeared in all 11 games a year ago, tallying 17 tackles and a forced fumble. The Colville native has 54 career tackles and 6 tackles for loss (3 sacks) in 31 games.

A new name to keep an eye on along the defensive line is Fresno State transfer **Da'Marcus Johnson**. He appeared in 10 games for the Bulldogs a year ago, making 10 tackles and 1 sack, adding a blocked PAT. He had 9 tackles (6 solo) and 2 tackles for loss in just 6 games at Fresno as a Sophomore during the spring 2020-21 season.

LINEBACKERS

Two of the team's top three tacklers from a year ago return in linebackers **Jaren Banks** and **Derek Tommassini**. The duo combined for 130 total tackles in 2022, including 7.5 for loss.

Banks, a super senior former transfer out of Rice University, played in and started nine games in his first season as an Eagle, making 66 tackles. He had a season-high 11 tackles against Portland State on Oct. 29 and recorded 9 tackles in a game two other times.

Tommassini, a junior out of Eagle, Idaho, is also a former transfer, joining Eastern in 2022 after two seasons at Idaho. He flourished in his first campaign in red, recording 64 tackles (26 solo), 3.5 tackles for loss and 2 quarterback hurries.

Veteran linebacker **Ben Allen**, a super senior transfer out of Bucknell University, also figures to make an impact on the linebacking corps. Allen was a Second Team All-Patriot League performer last season after piling up 83 tackles (43 solo), including 4 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. He recorded 10 tackles three separate times. In four seasons with the Bison, Allen recorded 188 total tackles in 37 games. Fresno State product **Da'Marcus Johnson** also looks to make an impact at defensive end,

SECONDARY

Headlining the Eagle secondary is Preseason All-Conference selection **Marlon Jones Jr.**, who took home Third Team All-Big Sky honors in 2022 after tying for the team-high in interceptions with 3 and passes broken up with 4. He recorded 52 total tackles in 11 games (nine starts). Jones also had 3 interceptions in 2021 and in 29 career games played, he has 123 tackles (67 solo).

Team captain **Darrien Sampson** looks to return as an impact corner after having his season cut short by injury in 2022. Despite being sidelined for the year after getting hurt at Florida in Week 4, Sampson had 11 tackles and 2 pass break-ups. In 38 career games played, the South Seattle product has 72 tackles (50 solo), 3 interceptions and 12 pass deflections.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior punter **Nick Kokich** returns for 2023 after earning Second Team All-Big Sky honors a year ago and Preseason recognition this year. The veteran out of Tacoma ranked 2nd in the Big Sky and 7th in the country in punting average in 2022, pinning 14 of his 55 kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard-line.

Placekicking looks to be a battle between lefty **Jackson Cleaver** (R-So.) and righty **Soren McKee** (R-Fr.). Cleaver has made 4-of-6 attempts during his career and handled some kickoff duties in 2022, though he did not attempt a field goal last season. McKee went 1-for-1 last year.

WR **Efton Chism III** handled primary return duties last year, averaging 21.5 yards per kick return with a long of 47. The Eagles attempted just 5 non-fair catch punt returns in 2022, all handled by Chism.



MICHAEL & KATHERINE ROOS FIELD

The 2023 football season at Eastern Washington University marks the 57th season Eastern has played its football games at its current site in Cheney, Wash. But it will be the 14th as "Roos Field," as a new red synthetic surface made its debut in 2010 and was replaced in 2020.

The 2023 campaign marks the 57th played by the Eagles at the current stadium site in Cheney, Wash. and 14th as "Roos Field" on the famous red turf. The field has been in use since 1967 and the red playing surface was installed in 2010, cementing the site as one of the most memorable NCAA destinations in the country.

Originally named Woodward Field in 1932 in honor of former Eastern head football and basketball coach Arthur C. Woodward, the location of the field moved several times prior to 1967, including where the current JFK Memorial Library sits on campus. Woodward was an important figure on campus, serving as the head of Eastern's department of physical education and health from 1923-50, when he passed away.

Longtime NFL standout with the Tennessee Titans and EWU Hall of Fame inductee Michael Roos and his wife Katherine kickstarted the Red Turf Project with a \$500,000 contribution as part of their ongoing legacy of giving to Eastern. As a result, the field was renamed in their honor at a dedication ceremony on Sept. 16, 2010. Two days later, 18th-ranked East-

ern defeated sixth-ranked Montana 36-27 in the first game on the red Sprinturf field. The nickname "The Inferno" was announced the night before the game, winning a fan vote over other options such as the Red Sea, Red Zone, Big Red, Red Carpet, Ring of Fire and Lava Pit. The original red surface was replaced in 2020 by new AstroTurf, with the nearly \$1 million project funded as part of a \$5 million pledge from local businessman Jack Gillingham.

Roos Field has 8,600 permanent seats after an expansion in 2004 that included the addition of 1,600 in the north endzone as well as the current suites and media center. Renovations to the facilities in the 1990s included resurfacing the running track, additional bleacher seating on the east side, addition of lights and two new restroom facilities. A new video board was installed in 2012 and a new concessions stand, team store and 500 new parking spaces were added in 2013. Other minor renovations occurred in 1999, 2000 and 2002.

With the additional of temporary bleachers, crowds at football games have often exceeded 10,000 people, including a facility record 11,702 in 2010 as the Eagles battled Montana, winning 36-27.

EWU has sold out the current stadium location 46 times entering 2023.

DOMINANCE AT ROOS FIELD

The Eagles boast one of the most dominant home records in college football, including:

- **179-70 (.719)** record all-time at Roos/Woodward Field (249 games)
- **64-15 (.810)** since the field was renamed and red turf was installed in 2010
- **20-game win streak** from Sept. 2018 to Oct. 2021 (snapped vs. Weber State on 10/23/2021, 35-34)

NOTABLE MOMENTS IN ROOS/WOODWARD HISTORY

1967: [Sept. 30] "New" Woodward Field opens as Eastern overcomes a large deficit to defeat Central Washington 25-21. In December, head coach Dave Holmes leads Eastern to a runner-up finish in the NAIA Playoffs as Eastern finishes 11-1 to complete a major reversal of fortunes for Eastern's football program. After Eastern failed to win a football game in 1961 and 1962, Holmes took over as Eastern's head coach in 1963. He was 34-13-1 in five seasons for a school-record .719 winning percentage. A member of five different halls of fame, he passed away in 1999.

1968: [Nov. 16] Tommy Thompson sets an Evergreen Conference record with 397 passing yards against Puget Sound, an Eastern record that would stand for nearly 18 seasons.

1979: [Sept. 15] Dick Zornes coaches his first Eastern game, a 20-7 victory over Carroll College. Zornes, a former player and assistant coach at Eastern, finished his career with an 89-66-2 record in 15 seasons with a Big Sky Conference Championship in 1992 and NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoff berths in 1985 and 1992. As athletic director, Eastern teams won 30 more games in five seasons with a Big Sky championship and a "Final Four" appearance in the NCAA Football Championships Subdivision Playoffs (then I-AA) in 1997. In his 26 years of affiliation with Eastern Football, the school was 158-112-3 for a winning percentage of 58.4 percent in that span of 273 games.

1989: [Oct 14] The Eagles beat Idaho State 45-26 in the first home game in Cheney since Oct. 15, 1983. In that six-year time span, EWU played all of its home games at Albi Stadium in Spokane during the school's rise from NAIA to NCAA Division I-AA.

1990: [Sept. 15] Eagle freshman Harold Wright pounded Boise State for 152 rushing yards on a school-record 40 carries in a 16-10 win. Although the only touchdown EWU scored was on an interception return by Doug Harris, the win vaulted EWU to 10th in the I-AA poll. [Nov. 10] On a field without lights in a game in November, darkness was setting in when Montana State prevailed 28-25 in double overtime to close EWU's home schedule. The next week, Eastern lost at offensive juggernaut Houston by an 84-21 score.

1992: [Oct. 3 & 10] On back-to-back weeks, Eastern thumped Weber State 32-14 and beat Montana State 23-17 in games that catapulted EWU to the league title. David Lewis rushed for 195 yards versus the Wildcats and EWU held the Bobcats to 80 yards of total offense in the second half of that game. [Oct. 17] The largest crowd at the time in Woodward Field history – 6,879 – was on hand for the EWU-Idaho showdown for first place in the Big Sky Conference standings. Although EWU lost to the Vandals 38-21, the Eagles went on to share the league title with Idaho and advanced to the FCS Playoffs (then known as I-AA).

1994: Eastern beats Cal Poly on Sept. 10 in the first-ever night game at Woodward Field, which was also the debut of Mike Kramer's head coaching career. In Dec., Eastern closes its home season with a 16-13 loss to Boise State in such muddy conditions that BSU head coach Pokey Allen – a former EWU assistant – called the game "a joke."

1996: Eastern's 38-7 win over Southwest Texas State on Sept. 21 marks the 100th EWU game at the facility.

1999: [Sept. 25] With a pair of 200-yard individual performances to both rank among the top 12 all-time in school history, Eastern rushed for a school-record 456 yards and passed just 18 times in a 48-41 victory over Cal State Northridge. Jovan Griffith rushed for 262 yards and had school records of six touchdowns and 42 carries. Jesse Chatman had 211 yards with an average of 13.2 yards per carry.

2000: [Sept. 16] Eastern wins its ninth-straight game at Woodward Field with a 38-7 victory over Idaho State, but that streak would end a month later when the Eagles missed a 25-yard field goal with one second left. Eastern matched the streak from 2009-10, including an 8-0 record during the school's National Championship season and inaugural season on the red turf.

2003: An anonymous \$1 million pledge is made to help pay for construction of the new Donor Suites and Media Center at Woodward Field. The project is completed in time for the 2004 football season.

2004: Eastern advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA FCS Playoffs after defeating No. 1 ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois 35-31 in the first round. Eastern then lost 35-34 to Sam Houston State in the quarterfinal round in EWU's first-ever playoff game at Woodward Field.

2005: On Nov. 12, Eastern wins for the 100th time at Woodward Field with a 35-14 victory over Montana State. A week later, Eastern wraps up the Big Sky Conference championship with a 24-7 victory over UC Davis at the fog-shrouded stadium, during which results of plays and statistics are relayed to the pressbox via cell phone because of limited visibility.

2008: [Sept. 27] The Eastern Athletic Department recognizes 100 former players as the "100 for 100" All-Time Football Team to commemorate Eastern's 100th year of football. Among those honored players who returned was 81-year-old Dick Maurs-tad, who played for Eastern from 1936-39. The World War II Purple Heart recipient passed away the following year in 2009.

2010: In January, A \$500,000 pledge from Michael and Katherine Roos sets in motion the Red Turf Project, a fundraising campaign led by Eastern Hall of Famer Dick Zornes including donations from other notable former coaches, players and alumni, such as radio personality Colin Cowherd. The Eagles go on to a perfect 8-0 home record, including three playoff wins en route to the 2010 NCAA Division I National Championship.

2011: The inaugural game on the Red Turf is played versus the University of Montana on Sept. 18, won by the Eagles 36-27 in front of a sold-out record crowd of 11,702. It was the first victory over the Griz since 2005 and the first in Cheney since 1991. The field was dedicated and officially re-named Roos Field two days earlier on Sept. 16.

2014: On Aug. 23, down 21-14, top-ranked Eastern out-scored No. 17 Sam Houston State 42-14 in the final 36 1/2 minutes to register a 56-35 victory in the "FCS Showcase" televised by ESPN.

2017: The 50th anniversary of Roos/Woodward Field is celebrated by a reunion of the 1967 football team.

2019: On Sept. 7, the Eagles roll up a school-record 769 yards of offense in a 59-31 home win over Lindenwood. Eric Barriere came four yards from the individual record, finishing with 556.

2020: AstroTurf receives the bid to replace the iconic red turf at Roos Field. The nearly \$1 million project is part of a \$5 million pledge provided by local businessman Jack Gillingham toward the Roos Field Renovation Project. The new turf is installed in summer of 2020, in time for the unique COVID-affected Spring 2020-21 season.

2021: #6 Eastern hosts Montana under the lights on ESPN2 on Oct. 2, coming from behind to win 34-28, keeping the Grizzlies winless in Cheney since the Red Turf was installed. Later that month, the Eags earn their 20th-straight victory at Roos Field in a 71-21 blowout over Idaho. The 71 points were the most-ever scored at Woodward or Roos Field. EWU also put up a program record 837 yards of total offense, 600 of which came behind the arm of Eric Barriere. Barriere also set a school record for most touchdowns responsible for with eight.

2022: [Oct. 2] Eastern hosts Montana under the lights on ESPN2. The No. 6 Eagles were down 21-10 entering the final quarter of play and outscored the Grizzlies 24-7 in the final 15 minutes to win 34-28, keeping the Grizzlies winless in Cheney since the Red Turf was installed. [Oct. 16] The 20th-straight victory at Roos Field came in a 71-21 blowout win over Idaho. The 71 points were the most-ever scored at Woodward or Roos Field. EWU also put up a program record 837 yards of total offense, 600 of which came behind the arm of Eric Barriere. Barriere also set a school record for most touchdowns responsible for with eight.

BIGGEST CROWDS AT ROOS

Despite a permanent capacity of 8,600, Roos Field can be expanded to accommodate marquee matchups. The stadium has sold out 46 times since expanding in 2004, including five over 11,000 fans:

PLAYOFF SUCCESS

In 2021, the Eagles became just the 12th program in history to earn its 15th berth the FCS Playoffs. The Eagles are 16-6 in playoff games played at home (3-7 on the road).

All-time among FCS programs, Eastern ranks:

- **12th** in playoff appearances (9th among current FCS members)
- **t-11th** in playoff wins (t-7th among current members)

Eastern's title in 2010 marks the most recent FCS Championship won by a Big Sky Conference program. Montana (1995, 2001), Montana State (1984) and Idaho State (1981) are the only other Big Sky rivals to ever win an FCS (or I-AA) title.

Among Big Sky conference members in the FCS Playoffs, Eastern Washington ranks:

Since 2010, Eastern has 15 playoff wins, **more than any other Big Sky program** during that span (Montana State is 2nd with 10).

Led by LB J.C. Sherritt among several other key contributors, the Eagle defense held Delaware scoreless in their last four drives to as the top-ranked Eagles won the final game a series of playoff nailbiters, finishing the season 13-2.

WALTER PAYTON AWARD WINNERS

Eastern Washington is the only university in the country to boast four winners of the Walter Payton Award, given annually to the top offensive player in the FCS. Only one other school (Villanova) has three, and all other Big Sky programs have five combined.

2021 – Eric Barriere, QB

Barriere threw for 5,070 yds, 46 TDs and 8 INTs as red-shirt-senior after finishing as a runner-up the year prior.

2015 – Cooper Kupp, WR

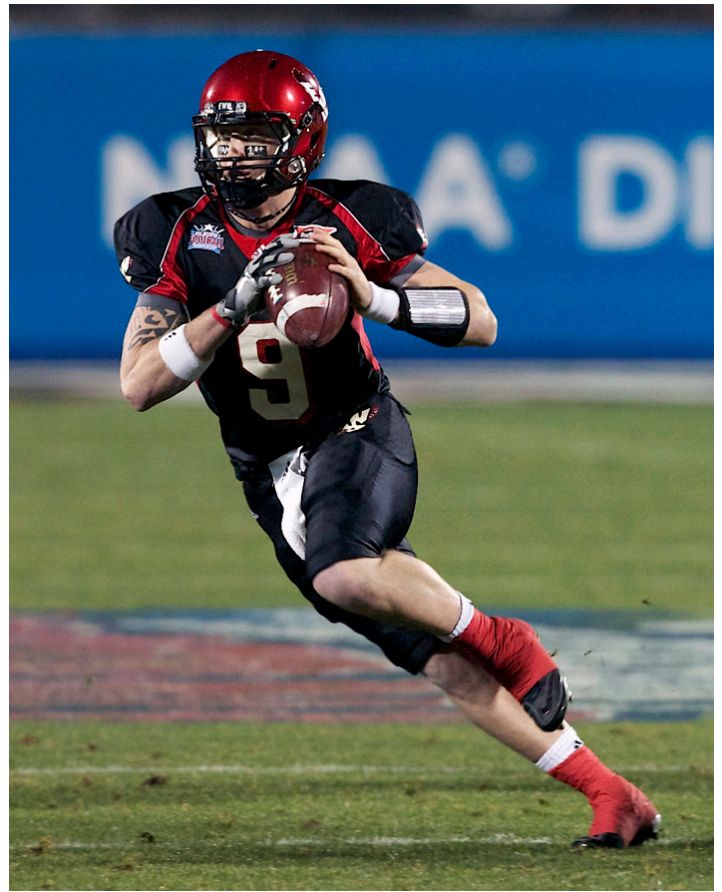
Kupp piled up 114 rec, 1,642 yds, 19 TDs as redshirt-junior. He was a runner-up the next season despite equally monstrous numbers (117 rec, 1,700 yds, 17 TDs). Kupp is the only non-QB to win the award since 2004.

2011 – Bo Levi Mitchell, QB

Led the FCS in four categories, including passing yards (4,009) and TD passes (33), breaking four school records.

2005 – Erik Meyer, QB

Eastern's first Walter Payton Award winner, Meyer set the FCS record for career passing efficiency rating (166.5), throwing 84 TD to just 17 INTs.

BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD WINNERS

While the Eagles have gained well-deserved attention for high-flying offenses, Eastern has produced top-end performers on the defensive side of the ball as well. EWU is one of only 7 schools (5 current FCS) to produce 2+ Buck Buchanan Award winners, recognizing the top defensive player in the FCS.

2010 – J.C. Sherritt, LB

A four-year player at Eastern, Sherritt ranked 3rd in the FCS in tackles in 2010 (150; 11.5 per game), including 18 in the national championship game, marking the 7th-most in school history. He actually led the FCS in tackles the year prior (170) and went on to a successful career in the CFL, winning a Grey Cup with Edmonton in 2015.

2008 – Greg Peach, DE

Peach was the first Eagle to earn the Buck Buchanan Award after racking up 72 tackles (35 solo), 23.5 tackles for loss, 18 sacks, a pass break-up and fumble recovery in 2008. He remains the EWU career leader in sacks with 35.5.

DEDICATION IN THE CLASSROOM

Not only have the Eagles displayed excellence on the field, they have consistently shown their dedication in the classroom, earning some of the NCAA's most prestigious academic awards. In 2019, center **Spencer Blackburn** was selected to the 2019 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete Class and was one of 12 finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded by the NFF to the college football player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance. It is considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman" and nicknamed as such. Other notable academic honors for the program include but are not limited to:

COOPER KUPP

Wide Receiver – Los Angeles Rams – EWU 2013-16

No other former FCS player has more national name recognition right now than Eastern Washington's **Cooper Kupp**, and for good reason.

It's hard to imagine a more prolific collegiate career than Kupp's. The Eagle legend was a Walter Payton Award winner, two-time FCS Athletic Directors Offensive Player of the Year, Jerry Rice Award winner, two-time Big Sky Offensive Player of the Year, four-time first-team All-American, and named the STATS FCS Player of the Decade.

At Eastern, Kupp rewrote the record books from 2013-16, establishing 15 FCS, 11 Big Sky and 26 EWU marks. He pulled in an incredible 428 catches for 6,464 yards and 73 touchdowns in 52 games played from 2013-16. Those numbers obliterated the existing FCS records of 395 receptions (Terrell Hudgins, Elon, 2006-09) and 58 touchdowns (David Ball, New Hampshire, 2003-06). **His yards mark stands alone among all divisions of NCAA football**, besting a record set in 1999 by Scott Pingel of Division-III Westminster College.

He was selected in the 3rd round (69th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams, becoming EWU's 2nd-highest draft pick behind only Michael Roos (41st overall in 2005). He enters his 7th season with the Rams in 2023.

As a professional, Kupp has continued to dominate, becoming one of the most feared receiving threats in the NFL.

In 6 seasons with Los Angeles, he has played in 80 games, starting 66, racking up 6,329 yards receiving on 508 catches while scoring 46 touchdowns. Since joining the league, he ranks 6th amongst all NFL receivers in receptions, 8th in touchdowns and 7th in receiving yards.

His career highlight to-date was the 2021 campaign, during which he led the entire NFL in all three primary receiving categories, scoring 16 touchdowns on 145 receptions and 1,947 yards. The catches and yards numbers were both Rams franchise records and the "Triple Crown" achievement was the first in the NFL since 2005. He also set several NFL records, including most yards from scrimmage by a wide receiver and the 1st-ever receiver with 2,000+ receiving yards combined between regular season and postseason.

Kupp was named a 2021 First Team All-Pro and NFL Offensive Player of the Year. He added MVP honors in Super Bowl LVI, during which he pulled in 8 receptions for 92 yards and 2 TDs including the game-winning score with 1:25 left in regulation. The Rams beat Cincinnati, 23-20.

In 2022, Kupp was ranked by his fellow NFL peers as the #4 player in the entire league.



KENDRICK BOURNE

Wide Receiver – N.E. Patriots – EWU 2013-16

One of five Eagles to appear in a Super Bowl, Bourne went undrafted after a prolific Eastern career from 2013-16, during which he was a three-time All-Big Sky selection and went 39-straight games with at least 1 catch. Bourne formed an incredible duo with Kupp as the two played together in each of Bourne's 52 career games (32 starts).

As a pro, he signed a free agent deal with San Francisco in 2017 and played 4 seasons with the 49ers before signing a 3-year deal with New England in 2021. In 91 career NFL games entering 2023, he has racked up 227 receptions for 3,003 yards and 17 TDs, highlighted by an 800-yard, 5-TD campaign in 2021 with the Patriots.



SAMSON EBUKAM

Defensive End – Indianapolis Colts – EWU 2013-16

An All-American in 2016, a Freshman All-American in 2013 and a three-time All-Big Sky selection, Ebukam had 24 sacks in his career to rank sixth in school history. He finished with 188 total tackles in 53 games (38 as a starter).

He was selected in the 4th round (125th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft by the L.A. Rams and has been a regular NFL contributor ever since, making 56 starts in 91 games between the Rams (4 years) and San Francisco 49ers (2), recording 220 tackles (134 solo) and 22 sacks, with at least 3 sacks in each of the last 5 seasons. Prior to the 2023 season, Ebukam signed a 3-year contract with the Indianapolis Colts.



TAIWAN JONES

Running Back – Buffalo Bills – EWU 2008-10

Originally recruited as a cornerback, Jones switched to running back as a redshirt sophomore and never looked back, becoming an All-American and Big Sky Offensive Player of the Year. Jones averaged 7.7 yards per carry in 24 games as an Eagle from 2008-10, serving a critical role on the 2010 National Championship team. He finished 4th in the Walter Payton Award voting.

He was drafted in same slot as Ebukam – 4th round, 125th overall – just 6 years earlier in 2011 to the Oakland Raiders. He has enjoyed a long NFL career, entering 2023 with 137 games played, primarily as a returner.



NSIMBA WEBSTER

Wide Receiver – Chicago Bears – EWU 2015-18

A speedy receiver originally from Antioch, Calif., Webster piled up 156 catches, 2,233 receiving yards and 18 touchdowns as an Eagle from 2015-18, with each mark standing inside the Top 20 in program history upon his departure. His most-memorable performance came in December 2018 when he tied the Eagle single game record with 4 TD receptions in an FCS Playoffs win over Maine, also tying the FCS Playoffs single game record.

Undrafted out of college, Webster signed a free agent deal with the Los Angeles Rams and has since had stops in San Francisco and Chicago. He has appeared in 29 career NFL games, mostly on special teams as a returner while adding 2 catches for 14 yards.

MICHAEL ROOS

Offensive Tackle – Tennessee Titans – EWU 2001-04

A bastion of stability of longevity, Eagle legend **Michael Roos** retired in 2015 after a superb 10-year NFL career, all with the Tennessee Titans after becoming the highest-ever draft pick out of Eastern Washington in 2005, going in the 2nd round (41st overall).

A four-year player for the Eags from 2001-04, Roos anchored the offensive line for 35-straight games, earning All-America and FCS Lineman of the Year honors as a senior.

He was a three-time All-Pro with the Titans and started each of the 226 games he played, including 190-straight from 2002-12.

Outside of his on-field acumen, Roos has been a model citizen, role model and supporter of Eagle Athletics. Among several philanthropic endeavors, he and his wife Katherine provided the principal donation for the Red Turf Project, leading the way for the installation of the infamous Inferno playing surface.

His number 71 was retired in 2009 and Eastern's home field was re-named in his honor in 2010. Roos was inducted to the EWU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2016 and the Big Sky Hall of Fame in 2023, joining EWU volleyball player Kim Exner.

Seattle Seahawks Training Camp

Preseason training camp for the Seattle Seahawks of the National Football League took place on the EWU campus from 1997-2006. Thousands of spectators as well as members of the media converged on Cheney throughout the month of practices. Seattle also had training camp at Eastern from 1976-85.

Leading the Big Sky

Through 2022, the Eagles are 72-20 in their last 92 Big Sky games since an 0-2 start in 2011. Eastern has won 62 of its last 80 league games (including two at the end of the 2012 season). Including non-conference victories (two versus MSU and one each against Cal Poly and Northern Arizona) and two playoff wins (Montana and UC Davis), the Eagles have won 68 of their last 86 versus conference foes, and are 78-21 since the 0-2 start in 2011.

Players of the Week

The Eagles have won 148 Big Sky Player of the Week honors in the past 26 seasons (1997-2022).

1,000 Yard Rushers

The Eagles have had a 1,000-yard rusher in half of the last 28 seasons (1995-2022), most recently Antoine Custer Jr. with 1,228 in 2019.

Turnover Battle

In the past 15 seasons (2008-22), the Eagles are 77-5 when they've won the turnover battle, 26-12 when they've been tied and 26-39 when they've lost (total of 129-56). EWU is 69-4 since 2010 when they've won the turnover battle, 23-12 when they've been tied and 24-32 when they've lost. That's a collective record of 115-48 (70.6 percent), with 32 of those 48 losses (66.7 percent) coming in games EWU has lost the turnover battle

Closing Out Strong

The Eagles have concluded their regular season schedule with a win in 22 of the last 24, including 2022.

Offensive Linemen

25 EWU offensive linemen have earned All-America accolades in 39 years in FCS (1984-2022), including 16 first team All-Americans. They have combined for 79 honors (41 first team, 20 second team, 10 third team and 12 honorable mention). Most recently, Tristen Taylor was honored on two squads in the 2020-21 season as a first team selection and four squads in 2021 as a third and second teamer. A total of 63 Eastern offensive linemen have earned All-Big Sky accolades in 36 seasons in the league (1987-22), including 28 on the first team. They have combined for 108 honors (36 first team, 25 second team, 4 third team, 43 honorable mention). Wyatt Hansen most recently earned an honorable mention nod in 2022.

Winning Seasons

Eastern has had winning seasons in 24 of the last 27 years (1996-2022), including a school record 15-straight (2007-21) and another stretch of 7-straight (1999-2005). Prior to 2005, the last time Eastern had 7+ winning seasons in a row came 75 years earlier in the Red Reese era when Eastern had a string of 11-straight (1931-1941).
