TEXAS MEMORIAL STADIUM

A concrete stadium to replace wooden Clark Field was a long-time dream of University of Texas athletics director L. Theo Bellmont. In 1923, that dream turned to reality as Bellmont met with 30 student leaders and initiated a plan to build a stadium. The idea was presented to the Board of Regents, who approved the project in December 1923. A Central Stadium Committee was named at the Regents meeting on Jan. 16, 1924, and the project was underway.

Heralded as "the largest sports facility of its kind in the Southwest" upon its completion in 1924, the first unit of the stadium consisted of the east and west stands with a seating capacity of 27,000. A product of University of Texas and state pride, the stadium was financed through donations from both students and alumni. The estimated cost of the structure was \$275,000.

The enthusiasm was at an all-time high, and UT was forced to construct temporary bleachers to accommodate the overflow crowd of approximately 33,000 people at the dedication ceremonies during the 1924 Texas A&M game.

The UT student body decided to dedicate the stadium in honor of the 198,520 Texans — 5,280 of whom lost their lives — who fought in World War I. On Veteran's Recognition Day 1996, the stadium was rededicated to veterans of all wars in an effort to insure the memory of those who fought valiantly to preserve freedom.

HONORING DARRELL ROYAL

The University of Texas honored legendary head football coach Darrell Royal by adding his name to the Longhorns' stadium (Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium) in 1996. Royal, who led UT to three National Championships and 11 Southwest Conference titles in 20 seasons (1957-76), was recognized and the stadium officially named for him the weekend of the Notre Dame game that year.

CAMPBELL-WILLIAMS FIELD

At the request of the Jamail family, Joe Jamail Field was renamed in 2020 in honor of Longhorn Legends and Heisman Trophy winners Earl Campbell (1974-77) and Ricky Williams (1995-98).

Campbell, the famed "Tyler Rose," holds a special place in The University of Texas and state of Texas' football history. As a senior at UT in 1977, Campbell became the first Longhorn to win the Heisman Trophy after he rushed for 1,744 yards — a Southwest Conference record that stood for 16 years — and 19 touchdowns. He led the nation in rushing and scoring, and posted a pair of 200-yard games on the road against Texas A&M (222 yards) and SMU (213 yards). Campbell also set a Texas record for 100-yard rushing games that season (10).

Williams, a San Diego native, completed his UT career with 21 NCAA and 46 school records under his name en route to becoming Texas' second Heisman Trophy winner in 1998. He was a three-time first-team all-conference pick, a two-time Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and only the second player to twice win the Doak Walker Award (nation's top running back). Williams' career culminated in his final home game, on the field now named in his honor, when he surpassed Tony Dorsett's 22-year-old NCAA rushing record.

The field at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium was originally named after Joe Jamail in 1997 to honor the lifelong Longhorn's immense contributions to The University of Texas' athletic department.

DARRELL K ROYAL-TEXAS MEMORIAL STADIUM

As The University of Texas continues at the forefront of the college football landscape, Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium at Cambell-Williams Field remains a state-of-the-art facility.

The stadium, which is in its in 2023 is in it 100th season of operation, has continually gone through upgrades and renovations to enhance the fan and student-athlete experience.

In May 2019, Texas Athletics broke ground on a major expansion project in the south endzone od Darrell K Royal Texas Memorial Stadium with team moving into their new facility in August 2021. Fans began enjoying all of the amenities associated with it when the Longhorns kicked off against Louisiana on Sept. 4. The \$175 million stadium expansion project includes more than a 106,000-square-foot training facility footprint that provides significant upgrades to the Football coaches and staff offices, team areas, strength and development center and athletic training/medical facilities. It also will enhance the fan experience greatly with an end zone seating area of more than 4,500 seats, including more than 1,300 student seats. It includes the Founders Lounge, Myers-Dodds Legacy Club, Living Room and Loge Boxes, as well as a Field Club area right near the action that accommodates more than 800 people. Atop it all is a 160-foot by 44-foot videoboard to visually celebrate all of the action. The total gross square footage of the entire project is more than 215,000-square feet.

Prior to the 2017 season, the Moncrief-Neuhaus Athletic Center saw upgrades to the Longhorns' locker room, weight room and meeting rooms. Additionally, to enhance the fan experience, a new LED video board and ribbon boards were installed inside of DKR. Additionally, the west-side façade, including Bellmont Hall, underwent a restoration and reinforcement project, along with an application of a protective coating and painting.

After the 2012 season, UT Athletics started a waterproofing and bleacher replacement project to the lower east and west grandstands. Damaged concrete was repaired, then sealed and painted, and new bleachers and chairbacks were installed. Handrails, portals and field level walls on both sides of the lower level were also given a fresh coat of paint. The improvements not only beautify the stadium and improve the fan experience, but also help to preserve the revered structure.

Installation of a new FieldTurf playing surface was completed in the spring of 2013, providing a state-of-the art surface that not only holds up to challenging weather conditions, but also allows the stadium to be a multi-use facility.

The Red McCombs Red Zone Sports Medicine & Strength Training Project, located in the lower levels of the north end zone was completed in the summer of 2013. The two-floor, 32,448 square-foot project includes a state of the art sports medicine facility on the upper floor, and a strength training complex on the lower floor. Amenities include a hydrotherapy pool, two plunge pools, golf putting and simulator area, a 40-yard acceleration track, a nutrition area and student-athlete/staff locker rooms.

In May of 2012, the University's athletics offices were moved from Bellmont Hall on the west side of the stadium to the north end zone's Walter W. Fondren III Athletics Leadership Center. The move not only created new space for academics in Bellmont Hall, but also consolidated the various athletics departments into a modern office-space facility. Athletics department offices now housed in the beautiful, 53,812 square-foot venue include the men's and women's athletics directors, men's and women's basketball coaches and administration, the T-Association, the Longhorn Foundation, Business/Travel, Human Resources, Events, Trademark & Licensing, Communications and Athletics IT.

The Texas locker room underwent renovations for the 2011 season, featuring 135 new wide-space lockers connected to a state-of-the art exhaust system. Additions also included a nutrition bar, a lounge area with gaming stations, a 72-inch LED screen in the center of room along with five other LED screens throughout the area, and a new sound system and speakers.

In 2009, south end zone seating was upgraded and expanded, increasing the stadium to its current capacity of 100,119, making it the seventh-largest collegiate stadium in the country and the largest in the Southwest. In addition, renovations were completed on the Moncrief-Neuhaus Athletic Center that provided a new football academic center approximately three times the size of the previous area, along with a new indoor practice area, defensive meeting room, hall of fame and a newly-designed facility entrance.

In 2008, renovations to the north end zone, named the Red McCombs Red Zone, were completed with the addition of an upper deck, approximately 2,100 club seats and 47 suites. That end of the stadium also includes a new academic center for UT athletics, a war memorial plaza and a food court.

Including the 2007 renovations to the lower deck of the north end zone, the project added a total of approximately 9,000 additional seats, raising capacity to 94,113 for the 2008 season.

Two major upgrades were made for the 2006 season, including a new video board and temporary bleacher seating in the south end zone, which expanded the stadium's capacity by over 4,000 seats to a total of 85,123.

At the time, the scoreboard was the nation's largest high-definition video display board and remains the largest in collegiate athletics thanks to DAKtronics. The \$8-million Prostar Video Board is 55-feet high by 134-feet wide and offers complete flexibility, with the capability to show one large single video image, multiple video images and a combination of live or recorded video with real time scores and stats, out-of-town game information, sponsors' messages, graphics and animation.

In recent years, the stadium has also had renovations to the press box, the Carpenter-Winkel Centennial Room and other renovations to the interior of Moncrief, most notably to the players' lounge.

The stadium was previously renovated in August 1999 with the removal of the track and the lowering of the field by six feet to allow the addition of several rows of seats.

It was part of a project that included removal of the artificial turf from the stadium, construction of the Frank Denius Fields practice facility, the Red & Charline McCombs Field (softball), the Mike A. Myers Track and Soccer Stadium, and extensive remodeling of DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium/Jamail Field and the Moncrief-Neuhaus Athletic Center.

The first stages of the ambitious project were completed in 1996. They included the installation of a sophisticated grass playing field in the stadium and the completion of the Frank Denius Fields.

Progress continued in 1997 with the addition of 14 stadium suites on the west side. The first major construction to the facility since the upper deck was added in 1972 also included a total remodeling of the underside of the stands, including a new concession plaza and a visitors' locker room in the northwest corner of the stadium.

The changes that took place at DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium for the 1998 football season included the addition of a 5,000-seat upper deck on the east side. The massive construction included 52 suites and a 13,000-square foot private club room.

In the Moncrief-Neuhaus Athletic Center, significant expansion and upgrades included a new locker room, training room, trophy room, players' lounge, football academic center and an addition almost doubling the space in the strength and conditioning area.

The football coaching and academic staffs were moved to the facility, housing the key elements of the entire football program in a single complex for the first time.

The final phase of the construction began shortly after the 1998 season ended, when the 75-year-old stadium floor was excavated to a depth of six feet to allow a reconfiguration and addition of seats and the removal of the track to provide a more intimate football setting.

The stadium was originally dedicated on Thanksgiving Day in 1924, after the UT student body decided to name the stadium in honor of the 198,520 Texans who fought in World War I and the 5,280 who lost their lives doing so. In 1977, the stadium was rededicated to veterans of all wars.

TALE OF THE TURF

- Memorial Stadium's field was natural grass from 1925-68.
- Artificial turf was first applied to the Memorial Stadium floor in summer 1969. The turf also was replaced in 1974, '82 and '89.
- UT returned to natural grass (prescription athletic turf/PAT) in 1996.
- The field was lowered and the grass (PAT) was replaced in 1999.
- The turf (PAT) was replaced with TifSport Certified Bermudagrass in 2002.
- UT switched back to an artificial surface, installing FieldTurf, in 2009.

FREDDIE STEINMARK SCOREBOARD

In a pregame ceremony prior to UT's game with Miami on Sept. 23, 1972, the scoreboard at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium was dedicated to the memory of Freddie Steinmark.

The small (5-foot-10, 166 pounds) but tough Steinmark was a starting safety for UT as a sophomore and junior in 1968-69. During that time, the Longhorns won 20 of 22 games and two conference titles with Steinmark providing five interceptions as a sophomore and two as a junior. Steinmark, who also earned Academic All-Southwest Conference honors in 1968 and '69, led the team in punt returns (25 for 177 yards) as a sophomore and averaged 6.1 yards on 38 punt returns during his career.

Following the final regular season game of his junior year, he became a national symbol of courage and determination as he began a year-and-a-half battle against cancer. In fact, just six days before a diagnosis of bone cancer forced the amputation of his left leg, Steinmark started and played in UT's 15-14 win at Arkansas that clinched the 1969 National Championship.

Determined to live, he astounded the doctors by appearing on crutches less than a month later at the 1970 Cotton Bowl against Notre Dame. After UT won the game, 21-17, Darrell Royal and the Longhorns presented the game ball to Steinmark. Within six weeks, he walked on an artificial leg across the stage to accept his letter jacket at UT's awards banquet.

Steinmark continued his college education without interruption and served as a student freshman coach during fall 1970, which would have been his senior season.

However, his battle with cancer was one that could not be won on heart alone. Despite all the doctors could do, Steinmark died on Sunday, June 6, 1971. Born Jan. 27, 1949, in Wheatridge, Colo., he was just 22 years old.

As Longhorns players exit the dressing room for a game, they pass by the Steinmark Scoreboard and touch his picture in recognition of the courage he showed in his fight for life and facing his cancer.

R.D. WENTWORTH, 1894

(Record: 6-1)

An 1891 graduate of Williams College (Williamstown, Mass.) where he was the team captain in his final season, Reginald DeMerritt Wentworth became the first coach in Texas history when he accepted an offer of \$325 as salary and expenses in 1894.

The drive to hire a coach, or "trainer" as he was called then, came after a successful inaugural Longhorns football season when the first-ever UT team went 4-0. That team was formed by students and was managed by Albert Lefevre, who was secretary-treasurer of The University of Texas Athletic Association.

The 1894 hiring of Wentworth was spearheaded by two early law graduates, A.S. Walker and Thomas W. Gregory, who also saw to it that \$100 was appropriated to purchase orange and white jackets, moleskin pants, striped stockings and several rubber noseguards.

Wentworth's team shut out its first six opponents, outscoring them 191-0, but fortunes turned suddenly in the final game of the year when Missouri, playing a different style than the Texans were accustomed to, shut out Texas, 28-0.

Wentworth's judgment in the final game was questioned by Texas fans, which prompted historian Lou Maysel to write, "The critical and suspicious nature of fans manifested itself early in the school's football history." The tenure of UT's first football coach ended with that season. Wentworth returned to the East Coast and subsequently went into marine insurance in New York City.

FRANK "LITTLE" CRAWFORD, 1895

(Record: 5-0)

Following the stinging loss to Missouri in 1894 and R.D. Wentworth's departure, Texas had a difficult time hiring a coach. After a lengthy search, UT finally settled in mid-October of 1895 on Frank Crawford. A native of Colebrook, N.H., Crawford had coached Nebraska to a 5-4-2 record the previous two seasons.

Crawford's only known collegiate work was at Nebraska. Although Crawford reported that he attended Michigan State for two years, records never substantiated that claim.

"Little" Crawford taught the Yale system of play and stressed physical conditioning. He employed a daily routine that required the players to jog the mile or so from the campus to the Hyde Park practice field and then back after practice.

Because of his late arrival, the Texas season was delayed. The late beginning didn't prevent the team from experiencing tremendous success on the field. Texas rolled past its first four

opponents by a combined score of 88-0. UT's original season finale was a 38-0 crushing of San Antonio on Thanksgiving Day. Following the game in the Alamo City, Crawford left immediately to visit Mexico and watch some bullfights, then returned home to Nebraska. At the time, coaches were hired just for the fall season.

The Texas team went on to accept a postseason challenge from a Galveston team. Despite playing without its head coach, UT added a fifth victory with an 8-0 win.

HARRY ORMAN "JAKE" ROBINSON, 1896

(Record: 4-2-1)

Harry Orman "Jake" Robinson had been the only coach to defeat Texas in its first three years of competition when his Missouri team defeated the varsity, 28-0, in 1894, so it created a lot of excitement when he was hired to take over the team for the 1896 season.

Robinson, a native of Bangor, Maine, played lineman at Tufts (Medford, Mass.) in 1891-92, had a degree in electrical engineering and was an accomplished string musician. In football, he brought to Texas the Princeton style of play and benefited from the move of the UT practice area from Hyde Park to just east of the campus.

An upgraded schedule found the Longhorns finishing with a 4-2-1 record, winding up the season with a 10-0 loss to Missouri in early December.

After that game, 18 of the Missouri players were convinced to join the Texas team on an exhibition tour of Mexico, where Robinson and Missouri coach Frank Patterson actually played in one of the contests before returning to the sidelines.

Neither school counts the exhibition games in their records, but the trip was notable because the Missouri players had left school in late November. With permission for a one-week tour, the team's month-long absence brought the wrath of their parents as well as the school. Robinson remained with the Texas team through the trip before ending his one-season stint in Austin.

WALTER F. "MIKE" KELLY, 1897

(Record: 6-2)

For the first several years, coaches at Texas were under the control of The University of Texas Athletic Association, a group affiliated with but not controlled by The University of Texas itself. In 1895, an Athletic Council, which served as a faculty committee to supervise athletics, was formed. It included many of the same members as the Association, but its creation helped bring football under the control of The University.

In 1897, in a significant change from the policy of hiring a coach only for the fall semester, Walter F. "Mike" Kelly was hired as the full-time "Physical Director for Men" and was handed the football coaching duties as part of his responsibilities.

Kelly, who had played end on the Dartmouth College team only a year before, led the team to a 6-2 record, with most of the wins coming over town teams from San Antonio, Houston, Fort Worth and Dallas. A notable exception was an 18-10 victory over a Waco school known as Add-Ran College, which later moved to Fort Worth and changed its name to Texas Christian University.

Kelly's tenure as coach lasted only one year, however. Although he did not remain as head coach, Kelly returned in 1898 as director of the newly completed gym in the east wing of the Main Building and accepted a position as an assistant coach — the first true aide for a UT football coach.

DAVID FARRAGUT EDWARDS, 1898

(Record: 5-1)

The plans for a retention schedule of Longhorns head coaches changed quickly in 1898, only a year after the Athletic Council had hired Mike Kelly for a full year with the idea of keeping him more than just one season. Kelly returned, but his duties as "physical director" called for him to maintain the directorship of a newly completed school gymnasium. So he took the job of the first-ever assistant coach and David Farragut Edwards, who was hired only for the season, took the job as the fifth head coach in as many years at Texas.

Edwards, an 1896 graduate of Princeton who had played as a second-team lineman as a senior and served as assistant coach at Ohio State in 1897, took over the UT program in 1898.

Edwards led the young Texas team into a schedule that featured a swing toward collegiate competition, rather than the predominance of "town teams" that had filled the schedule since the beginning of the school's participation in football.

Along with a more challenging schedule, it was Edwards who made a drastic change in the school uniforms, which actually triggered a vote on the official school colors. Edwards shunned the orange and white combination that had been worn since orange and white streamers were purchased for use at a baseball game a few years earlier. His preference of orange and maroon did not wear well with the natives, who pushed for a vote on the school colors that eventually came two years later.

Edwards' team shut out every opponent except Sewanee, which blanked Texas, 4-0, for the only loss of the season. The only score in that game came on a trick play for a touchdown, which was worth four points in those days.

Following the season, Edwards returned to the east and eventually practiced law in Jersey City. His assistant, Kelly, also departed.

MAURICE GORDON CLARKE, 1899

(Record: 6-2)

With two vacancies in the infant athletics program, the Athletic Council in 1899 hired Maurice Gordon Clarke, a native of Omaha, Neb., who lettered three years in both football and baseball at an early-day powerhouse — the University of Chicago. Clarke played quarterback on the 1896-98 Chicago teams that compiled a 23-5-1 record. He brought to Texas the style of his teacher, the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagq.

The season featured the purchase of the first university-owned field as a group of key supporters agreed to help the university with the purchase price of \$3,000. The field was named Clark Field, in honor of George B. Clark, who as school proctor served as auditor, registrar, librarian, secretary of the faculty and campus caretaker. It was also the year that Texas ended road trips to "town teams" after a brawl broke out in the final trip to Dallas to play against a city team.

Clarke's team carded a 6-2 record, with the only losses coming to Sewanee, 12-0, and Vanderbilt in Nashville, 6-0. The season featured the first field goal in UT history when Jim Hart kicked a ball through the uprights from the 23-yard line in an 11-0 win over Tulane in New Orleans.

SAMUEL HUSTON "SHY" THOMPSON, 1900-01

(Record: 14-2-1)

The 1900 season brought a vote on the colors of orange and white and the formation of the school's first band and it also brought the beginning of the first multi-year stay of a Texas coach. That year, Samuel Huston "Shy" Thompson was named head coach, while Dr. Frank Homer Curtiss was chosen as the new gymnasium director and served as assistant coach.

Thompson was a Princeton grad who had played on the great Tigers team of 1896 and coached at Oberlin (Ohio) in 1897 and then Lehigh (Pa.) in 1898 and '99. During the offseason, Thompson studied law in New York City. He moved to Denver the summer before coming to Texas and made Colorado his official residence thereafter.

A strict disciplinarian, who refused to let players drink water during practice, Thompson guided his team to a 6-0 record in his first season and piloted the Texas squad to an 8-2-1 record in 1901. In his second season, Thompson stayed on to lead a Texas team devoid of experienced manpower. He opened the year with a 6-0-1 record before disaster struck. A team at the American School of Osteopathy of Kirksville, Mo., proposed a game during a swing north by the Texas team. Thompson objected, but the school agreed to play.

Thompson said the Kirksville team was "composed of pickups from all over the country" and he was proved right, as a bitter contest ended with a 48-0 Kirksville win, during which the Texas team was humiliated on and off the field. Texas lost to Kansas the next week but bounced back to record eight wins in the most extensive schedule ever for a Texas team.

Thompson resigned after the season and finished his career with a 14-2-1 mark. He later served as assistant U.S. attorney general under President Woodrow Wilson from 1913-18 and on the Federal Trade Commission from 1919-27.

J.B. HART, 1902

(Record: 6-3-1)

Diminutive John B. Hart had to prove himself from the start as the new coach at Texas for the 1902 season. Fresh out of Yale as a June graduate, the 5-foot-5, 130-pound native of Cincinnati arrived on the UT campus to skeptics who wondered if the little guy had really played in the then mighty lvy League.

That was until Hart suited up for one scrimmage and left little doubt as to why he had won his "Y" as one of the smallest backs the school ever had.

Hart's very young team got off to a good start with wins over Oklahoma and Sewanee, but the season ended in a 12-0 defeat at the hands of rival Texas A&M, its first-ever win over UT. The loss left the Longhorns with a 6-3-1 slate and marked the most defeats the school had suffered in 10 years of football.

Hart, like so many of the coaches before him, was employed only for the season, and departed following the loss to Texas A&M.

RALPH HUTCHINSON, 1903-05

(Record: 16-7-2)

Frustrated by having to hire a coach every fall semester, the UT Board of Regents finally took action and established the post of "outdoor athletic director," whose job would include the coaching of baseball, track and football. The move had a double bonus for the struggling Athletic Association, because it meant the salary would be paid by The University, rather than from generated funds.

Ralph Fielding Hutchinson was chosen for the job in 1903 and in him UT got a versatile athlete and well-qualified coach. A Princeton man who was a native of Pennsylvania, he was a product of Mercersburg Prep. He played quarterback on the 1898-99 Princeton teams and was an infielder in baseball and a hurdler in track.

Before coming to Texas, he served two years as coach and athletics director at Dickinson College and coached backs at Princeton in 1902.

Hutchinson inherited an assistant — Homer Curtiss, who was the gym director — but found a team with apparently less-than-average talent. However, he quickly found outstanding players — including future U.S. Congressman Lucian Parrish — among the newcomers and rolled to a 5-1-2 record in his first year. Except for a historic 68-0 shellacking — the worst loss in UT history — at the hands of Chicago in his second

season of 1904, Hutchinson continued his success with a 6-2 record that year.

Hard times financially and on the playing field hit the next season, and Hutchinson left after UT suffered its greatest number of defeats to date with a 5-4 record. He wrapped up his three-year tenure with a 16-7-2 record.

H.R. SCHENKER, 1906

(Record: 9-1)

Following the 1905 season, college football had reached a crisis because the style of play, coupled with the lack of helmets and inadequate protection for the body, had produced 18 deaths and 159 serious injuries nationwide. Schools such as Columbia, Northwestern, California and Stanford either dropped the sport or changed to rugby.

Representatives of college football's Big Three — Harvard, Princeton and Yale —went to the White House and asked President Teddy Roosevelt to intervene and he did. With the assistance came sweeping changes in the game. The forward pass was adopted, first-down distance measured and the games were reduced in time.

The University, which had stepped into the larger arena four years before with the hiring of Ralph Hutchinson, took a step backward with the hiring of H. R. Schenker in 1906. Schenker, who was a young Yale graduate, had the supposed recommendation of none other than "the father of American football" Walter Camp. Fact was, Schenker knew nothing of the intricacies of the game of football or even how to hold one, although he supposedly had played on the scrub team at Yale.

Though one of his players would later write, "How he got the job has always been a mystery," the team banded together to win despite him. Future Statesman Lucian Parrish delivered a stirring talk to his teammates in which he said, "Men, we will have to face the fact that our coach is incompetent. It is true he should be taking lessons from us, rather than we from him. But the fact remains that he is employed to handle the team and is certainly the head of the football organization. I want to earnestly urge you to keep your mouths shut and follow the directions of the coach every day you are on the field. If you are instructed to do something that you know to be bad football, do the thing willingly and promptly at the time and then come to me about it. I will see that all mistakes are remedied."

The remarkable Parrish, a guard who died an early death while serving in Congress in 1921, was true to his word. With the help of two professors, including a young German instructor named W. E. Metzenthin, the team flourished despite Schenker, finishing with a 9-1 record. To no one's surprise, Schenker was not asked to return following the season.

W.E. METZENTHIN, 1907-08

(Record: 11-5-1)

The athletics family at UT was so impressed with the behind-thescenes work of Waldemar Eric Metzenthin that they prevailed on him to become the head coach for the 1907 season. An energetic young language professor, Metzenthin accepted no additional pay to do the job.

Born in Berlin, Metzenthin had attended public schools in Austin and in Lancaster, Pa., and had played quarterback at Franklin-Marshall and Columbia. Metzenthin did not inherit the best of worlds as Schenker's successor. Freshmen were barred by the faculty from competing their first semester and the program was in tough financial shape, but Metzenthin, who had been so successful in steering the program from behind the scenes the year before, came through. The first season ended successfully at 6-1-1 and the football program cleared more than \$1,000.

Metzenthin agreed to coach the team again, along with his professorial duties, in 1908, but his team struggled. Despite a spectacular 28-12 come-from-behind victory against Texas A&M — which allowed Texas to finish 5-4 and escape its first osing season ever — he quit after the season. Stating he was tired of the criticism, he returned to full-time professorship and Texas began searching for a coach once again. Several years later Metzenthin would return to athletics, serving as athletics council chairman, or athletics director as it would be later known, in 1927.

DR. DEXTER DRAPER, 1909

(Record: 4-3-1)

Dr. Dexter Wright Draper was hired immediately following the resignation of W.E. Metzenthin and by the time he got to Texas for the 1909 season, he had received his medical degree and was Dr. Dexter Draper. A rugged tackle at the University of Pennsylvania, Draper came with outstanding credentials as a player, having made the Walter Camp All-America team for three consecutive years.

A big man with a foghorn voice, he was a throwback to the old-style, hard-nosed football coach and wasn't the most popular person among the Texas players. He also faced a concentrated effort in improvement at Texas A&M and the result was two of his three losses coming at the hand of the Aggies.

Those two losses to Texas A&M, by a combined score of 28-0, and the mediocre 4-3-1 season had Draper on the hot seat, but he decided on his own against returning as the UT coach. He headed back east and later coached at Franklin & Marshall and William & Mary before entering his chosen field as a doctor in pediatrics. He then served as chief medical examiner for the city schools in Lancaster, Pa., where he died in 1961 at the age of 80.

W.S. WASMUND, 1910

(Record: 6-2)

From the fertile fields of the eastern cradle of college football, Texas turned at last to the Midwest for its 1910 coach with the hiring of William S. "Billy" Wasmund, who had quarterbacked a new-style offense for the Michigan Wolverines. Wasmund, a native of Detroit, had attended Lafayette College (Pa.) before transferring to Michigan to get his degree in civil engineering.

Wasmund's arrival at Texas came at the same time football rules changed significantly. The game was divided into quarters and seven players were required on the line of scrimmage. Interlocking interference was banned and so was pushing and pulling the ball carrier.

The new coach's style of football was both popular and successful. Wealthy team manager Lutcher Stark helped arrange an impressive schedule and despite losses to Oklahoma and Texas A&M, Wasmund was popular enough to be rehired for the 1911 season, but he didn't live to see it.

Wasmund's team held their first-ever preseason training camp, going off campus to a site near Marble Falls. When the team returned ready for its opener, the players were seasoned and tough. However, on Sunday morning, Oct. 1 — just six days before the season opener with TCU — Wasmund was found unconscious near his second-floor apartment, which was adjacent to the UT campus.

Rumors of foul play spread, but it later was determined that his fall was apparently an accident, for he was a known sleepwalker who apparently fell in the night. At first his injury wasn't thought to be serious, but his condition worsened and he died several days later.

DAVE ALLERDICE, 1911-15

(Record: 33-7)

Clinging to life on his deathbed, Billy Wasmund realized that his condition was worsening and that he would not be able to coach the team, so he advised the school's athletic officials to contact his old coach at Michigan. Fielding Yost, to help secure a successor who was familiar with the Michigan system. Wasmund mentioned a former teammate Dave Allerdice.

J. Burton Rix, the track and basketball coach, and William J. "Uncle Billy" Disch, the baseball coach, held the football team together as Wasmund fought for his life, but when Wasmund died just days before the TCU game, The University cancelled the game and sought a successor. When Yost recommended Allerdice as well, the Texas people knew he was their man.

The son of an Indianapolis packing house operator, David W. Allerdice was a remarkable athlete who was an All-American halfback on the 1907-09 Michigan teams. He also served as an assistant coach at Michigan but was at Butler (Ind.) University when he was contacted about the Texas job.

He arrived in Austin on a train just five days after Wasmund's death and he brought a warmth and quiet stability to the coaching position, thus becoming the most successful coach of the early era of Texas football. His teams went 5-2 in 1911, 7-1 in both '12 and '13, and was unbeaten at 8-0 in 1914. In 1915 he led his team into the inaugural season of Southwest Conference football. Despite outscoring its first three opponents 223-0, including a UT-record 92-0 victory over Daniel Baker (largest margin of victory and points scored in school history), Texas lost three of its final six games and finished with a 6-3 record. UT finished tied for third with a 2-2 mark in the Southwest Conference and suffered seasonending losses to Texas A&M and Notre Dame — the latter coming when star Clyde Littlefield, the future UT football and track & field coach, became ill and could not play.

With a remarkable 33-7 record, he informed the Athletic Council midway through the 1915 season that it would be his last because of the "super critical nature of the Texas fans." He returned to Indianapolis and went into his family's meat packing business. Allerdice, along with his wife and son, tragically died in a house fire during the 1940 Christmas holiday. He was posthumously inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1981.

EUGENE VAN GENT, 1916

(Record: 7-2)

Conrad Eugene Van Gent, a former three-sport star at Wisconsin, replaced Dave Allerdice in 1916 and continued the winning tradition. A 6-foot-3, 200-pound man, Van Gent was from Ottumwa, Iowa, and was an all-star in football, basketball and track for the Badgers. He had worked two years on the University of Missouri staff and the UT Athletic Council, led by the first-ever athletics director Theo Bellmont, had to raise its offer from \$2,250 to \$2,500 as a result of Missouri's efforts to keep him.

The 1916 campaign was the season when the Texas A&M students kidnapped and branded the Longhorns' mascot, hence Van Gent personally witnessed the birth of the name "Bevo" for the school's favorite steer.

Van Gent led the team to a 7-2 record and a Southwest Conference-best 5-1 record (although a conference crown was not awarded in 1916). However, when the season was over, the world was about to change. More than 500 students and Van Gent left the Austin school when the United States declared war on Germany. The UT coach reported to the First Officers' Training Camp at Camp Funston, near San Antonio in May 1917. He returned after the war as an assistant coach but left after the 1919 season. Van Gent then moved to California and entered private business. He returned to college coaching briefly at Stanford, posting a 4-4-2 record in 1922.

BILL JUNEAU, 1917-19

(Record: 19-7)

Legendary Longhorns baseball coach Billy Disch was a factor in the hiring of UT's coach in 1917, as he recommended William J. Juneau. He had coached Eugene Van Gent, Texas' previous coach, during his 1912-15 tour at Wisconsin. Juneau, who was also hired to coach track & field at Texas, had posted an 18-8-2 record and a 7-0 initial season for the Badgers.

Juneau, who had played his football at Wisconsin, was a high school teammate of Disch in Milwaukee and had coached at South Dakota State and Marquette. With many brave young men going away to war, Juneau inherited a far different football team than had any of his predecessors. His first team suffered three consecutive shutouts at midseason to end with a 4-4 record and Texas' first non-winning season in school history.

By 1918, the war had consumed the nation and Juneau's record of 9-0 was achieved against only five college teams and four military squads. The next year his team went 6-3 but was just 3-2 in the Southwest Conference. By that time, the dominant figure in college football in the state of Texas had become D.X. Bible, who was turning Texas A&M into a national power.

Faced with a disappointing season and the fact that the Longhorns had gone the first five seasons in the SWC without a league title, dissatisfaction was rampant in the Texas ranks and Juneau left under pressure. He moved on to Kentucky, where he posted a 13-10-1 record the next three seasons.

BERRY M. WHITAKER, 1920-22

(Record: 22-3-1)

One of the most enduring figures ever at The University of Texas was Berry McClure Whitaker, who founded the school's intramural program for men and also served as one of its most successful football coaches.

Whitaker was tabbed head coach for the 1920 season and was a part of a remarkable era in Texas athletics that saw its major sport teams of football, basketball and baseball rarely lose a game. Football was no exception, as Whitaker took over for Juneau and immediately guided the team to a 9-0 record and the Southwest Conference Championship.

A native of Anderson, Ind., Whitaker took the job in Austin because its offer was the farthest point from his hometown. He moved to Texas in 1916 to head up the men's intramural department and helped the coaching staff. When Juneau was fired, the unassuming Whitaker was called into Athletics Director Theo Bellmont's office and told — not offered the job — he was the coach.

With some of the most gifted players in early Texas history, Whitaker coached teams to seasons of 9-0, 6-1-1 and 7-2. Following the 1922 season and with a sparkling 22-3-1 record, Whitaker resigned amid rumors that he was in conflict with the rich and powerful former team manager, Lutcher Stark.

Whitaker denied it, simply saying, "I'm too thin-skinned and too conscientious. Defeats killed me. I was coming down with ulcers and that kind of thing. I didn't intend to stay in coaching in the first place. I was going to get out of it and get back in my profession." With that, he returned to his beloved intramural program, serving as the director for more than 40 years until he retired. He was inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1977.

E.J. STEWART, 1923-26

(Record: 24-9-3)

Hired to take over the UT program in 1923, Edward James "Doc" Stewart was the son of a Methodist minister and had played football and basketball at Mount Union College (Alliance, Ohio). He had attended medical school at Case Western Reserve University (Cleveland) where he played on the baseball team and was even a sportswriter for the Morning Gleander and Evening Independent in Massillon, Ohio.

In the early 1900s, he organized a town team called the Massillon Tigers, which set the stage for the storied history of football in that Ohio town. Stewart had coached two football seasons at Mount Union and had coached football and basketball at Purdue, Allegheny College, Oregon A&M (now Oregon State), Nebraska and Clemson, as well as an Army team during World War I.

Stewart, who wore a brimmed hat at games and practice, was a multifaceted man who played the piano and spoke so eloquently that the head of the UT English department offered him a job if he ever quit coaching.

On the field, he convinced Oscar Eckardt, one of the University's true legends, not to give up the game and that promptly resulted in an 8-0-1 season in 1923. He followed that with a 5-3-1 season in 1924, a 6-2-1 mark in 1925 and then struggled to a 5-4 record in 1926.

Stewart's varied interests probably proved to be his downfall as the UT coach, but he survived quite well financially. He invested in summer camps for kids near Kerrville and founded Camp Stewart for boys and Camp Mystic for girls, as well as Heart O' Hills Inn as part of a resort empire.

When his record slipped in 1926, war was about to break out over Texas athletics. Stewart had his backers and detractors, and finally, in an explosive meeting, the popular coach was fired with a 24-9-3 record. Stewart went on to serve as coach at what is now UTEP for two seasons before returning to Kerrville to run the camps, which were a huge financial success.

The bright light of success that Stewart was ended tragically just three years after his UT firing when he was shot and killed by a deer-hunting companion on Nov. 18. 1929.

CLYDE LITTLEFIELD, 1927-33

(Record: 44-18-6)

One of the most legendary figures ever in Texas Athletics, Clyde Littlefield paid little attention to the turmoil surrounding the dismissal of E.J. Stewart following the 1926 season, which also resulted in the firing of athletics director Theo Bellmont. Littlefield was hired to coach and accepted the position in 1927. He was the first true superstar to play and later coach at UT.

Littlefield was a native of Pennsylvania who came to Texas in 1904 when the oil boom around Beaumont attracted his father. He finished his prep schooling in San Antonio and chose Texas over Texas A&M in a move that defined history. He won 12 letters in three sports and could have earned another if he had more time for baseball. He started his coaching career in Greenville, and after a tremendous high school career, returned to Texas. His final high school football team was undefeated, untied and unscored upon.

Littlefield had been a superstar in football at Texas, so it was no surprise that he was hired as track & field coach and freshman football coach in 1920. When he took over as the head coach after Stewart's dismissal, he paid little attention to politics and proceeded to build a great staff with which to run the program. His first team went 6-2-1 and his second finished with a 7-2 record and won the Southwest Conference Championship. By 1930, with the arrival of Ernie Koy, Harrison Stafford and Bohn Hilliard, Littlefield had legitimate superstars and a second league championship with an 8-1-1 record.

Things continued to be solid for Littlefield when his 1932 team was 8-2. However, when the 1933 unit fell to 4-5-2 — UT's first losing season in 40 years of football — powerful people such as Lutcher Stark called for his resignation. Choosing not to fight and to avoid the politics, Littlefield quit as football coach with a 44-18-6 record that still stands as the fourth-most coaching victories on UT record. Littlefield remained as track coach where he served for 41 seasons and won 25 league championships.

He was the first Texas coach to win two SWC championships in football and his legacy remains today with his name honoring the nationally renowned track festival he created in 1925, the Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays. Littlefield was inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1961.

JACK CHEVIGNY, 1934-36

(Record: 13-14-2)

John Edward "Jack" Chevigny was a national football celebrity who almost literally wound up on UT's doorstep in 1934 and his flashfire of success was like a sky rocket that took off in a flurry and burned out quickly.

Part of the great legend of Notre Dame football was Chevigny, who scored the winning touchdown against Army after Knute Rockne's famous "Win One for the Gipper" halftime speech, and he allegedly said as he crossed the goal with the winning score, "That's one for the Gipper."

Chevigny might well have succeeded Rockne at Notre Dame had the famous coach not been killed in a plane crash in 1931, because he had Rockne's flair for the dramatic and was being groomed for the job as an assistant at Notre Dame.

The Hammond, Ind., native left Notre Dame after Rockne's death and coached the NFL's Chicago Cardinals (now the Arizona Cardinals) to a 2-6-2 record in 1932. He quickly determined that professional ball wasn't for him and accepted a job as the head coach at St. Edward's University (a sister school of Notre Dame) in Austin. So it was convenient that Chevigny was just across the Colorado River in South Austin when Texas began looking for a new coach in 1934.

The flamboyant Chevigny had impressed the Austin community and the media with his flair and he did an excellent job of self-promotion. He got the UT job and inherited from Littlefield a wealth of talent, including 20 lettermen. Chevigny's greatest moment came in just the second game of his career, when he directed a 7-6 victory over his alma mater, Notre Dame. When his team finished the season at 7-2-1, Jack Chevigny was the toast of the town.

However, it would be short-lived. His 1935 team fell to 4-6 and Chevigny failed to build bonds with the Texas fan base, and more importantly, with the Texas high school coaches. As the 1936 season crashed down around him, Chevigny announced he had asked UT authorities not to reappoint him. When the team finished 2-6-1, the Athletics Council took him up on his verbal resignation. To this day, Chevigny, with a 13-14-2 record in three seasons, stands as the only head football coach in Longhorns history to end his tenure with a losing record.

Chevigny stayed in Austin for a time working as an attorney for the State Tax Commission, but he soon tired of that and moved to Illinois, where he was very successful in the oil business. Chevigny died as a first lieutenant in the battle of Iwo Jima during World War II.

DANA X. BIBLE, 1937-46

(Record: 63-31-3)

When it came time to replace Jack Chevigny after the 1936 season, Texas made the boldest and most powerful move that it had made since the beginning of The University — at least as far as athletics was concerned — in 1937. In the midst of a national depression, Texas sought and hired Dana X. Bible, who agreed to leave a solid post at Nebraska to accept the dual post of coach and athletics director at Texas. Bible came to UT for a salary of \$15,000 — more than The University paid its president (who eventually got a raise as a result) at the time.

Still ranked as the third-winningest coach in UT history and one of the most successful coaches in the early days of college football history, Bible's 10-year stint at Texas from 1937-46 is credited with laying the foundation of the modern legacy of Longhorn football.

Born Oct. 8, 1891, in Jefferson City, Tenn., Bible's first name, Dana, honored a relative, while his middle name, Xenophon, recognized the ancient Greek historian. His father was a professor at Carson-Newman College and so it was natural for Bible to go to school there and become a football standout and scholar-athlete.

Even though he was a star on the field, Bible's thirst for knowledge of the game led him on summer pilgrimages to study with such legends of the game as Amos Alonzo Stagg and Pop Warner, among others. His first coaching assignment was at Brandon Prep in Shelbyville, Tenn., and he was only 21 years old when he was hired to coach Mississippi College in 1912. In 1916, he became an assistant coach at Texas A&M while he actually worked as a coach-on-loan at LSU part of that season. Bible returned to Texas A&M as the head coach in 1917 and a legend was born.

Following tremendous success at Texas A&M and Nebraska, Bible was hired in 1937 to turn the Texas fortunes around. He inherited a team that was more depressed than the nation's economy. After a tough start that saw Texas win just three games in Bible's first two seasons, the legendary coach turned things around. By the time his tenure was up, he had led the Longhorns to what was then a school-best 63 victories and won three Southwest Conference championships, all coming in the final five years of his Longhorns career.

He is credited for "The Bible Plan," which placed emphasis on education as well as success on the football field. His 1941 team, which finished the year with an 8-1-1 mark and a No. 4 national ranking — marking the first appearance for the Longhorns in the season-ending poll — was featured on the cover of Life magazine and is still regarded as one of the greatest in school history. Bible's 1941 squad climbed as high as No. 1 to record the program's first-ever top ranking at any point in a season. He won SWC titles in 1942, '43 and '45, while those teams finished with No. 11, No. 14 and No. 10 national rankings, respectively.

Bible's 1942 squad was just the second in UT history to post nine wins and was the first to play in a bowl game — a 14-7 victory against No. 5 Georgia Tech in the Cotton Bowl. His '43 squad was 7-1-1, a perfect 5-0 in the SWC and played Randolph Field to a 7-7 tie in the Cotton Bowl. The '45 team set a then-UT record with 10 victories, including a dramatic 40-27 win against Missouri in the Cotton Bowl. That game is best remembered for legendary quarterback Bobby Layne playing a role in each of UT's 40 points.

After leading the Longhorns to an 8-2 record and a No. 15 final ranking in 1946, Bible retired from coaching and remained at Texas as athletics director.

In 33 years as a head coach, Bible was 198-72-3 (63-31-3 at Texas) and the third-winningest coach in the history of the game when he retired, trailing only Amos Alonzo Stagg, who coached for 57 years, and Pop Warner, who patrolled the

sidelines for 44 years. Bible, who never lost a bowl game — boasting a 2-0-1 record in three Cotton Bowls, was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1951 and the Longhorn Hall of Honor in '60.

BLAIR CHERRY, 1947-50

(Record: 32-10-1)

Hand picked and groomed by D.X. Bible as his successor, Blair Cherry brought a wealth of experience and Texas roots to the position of head football coach in 1947. The first Texas-born coach, Cherry had been waiting in the wings since joining Bible's first staff at Texas in 1937. As his right-hand man, he was Bible's choice to succeed him when he stepped down from coaching and retained the athletics director position in 1946.

Cherry, a native of Corsicana, played his high school ball at Weatherford and later was a star at TCU. After a brief professional baseball career, he quickly moved into football coaching as a high school mentor at Ranger, before moving to Fort Worth North Side. In 1930, he became head coach at Amarillo and was part of one of the most incredible records in Texas high school sports. During his time at Amarillo, his team won 84 games, lost just five and ruled as State Champions his final three years.

Had Bible not accepted the Texas head coaching position 10 years earlier, Cherry was the next choice and he quickly proved why. With a veteran squad, including All-American quarterback Bobby Layne, Cherry's Longhorns posted a near-perfect record of 10-1, defeated No. 6 Alabama (27-7) in the Sugar Bowl and finished the year ranked fifth nationally in his first season of 1947. The only loss came in classic 14-13 battle with Doak Walker and SMU.

Cherry's 1948 team was 7-3-1, including a 41-28 win against No. 8 Georgia in the Orange Bowl. Following that victory, Cherry was offered head coaching jobs with both the Chicago Cardinals and the Washington Redskins of the NFL but instead chose to stay at Texas, accepting a new five-year contract.

Two years later, in the midst of one of the most successful coaching careers ever at Texas, Cherry resigned to enter private business. After a 6-4 record in 1949, his 1950 team went on to post a 9-2 record, earn a No. 3 national ranking and claim the Southwest Conference Championship with a perfect 6-0 conference slate. Cherry's team was ranked No. 5 in the country and was breezing to the SWC title when he announced at midseason that he was leaving to enter the oil business. His UT coaching career came to an end after a 20-14 season-ending loss to Tennessee in the 1951 Cotton Bowl.

Cherry suffered from an ulcer and insomnia. In a national article on "Why I Quit Coaching" a year later, he alluded to the "overemphasis on winning" and the critical nature of the media and the fans over the few losses he suffered in an amazing 32-10-1 career as the reasons he chose to leave. In four short seasons, he led Texas to three bowl games, two bowl victories and a pair of

Top Five national rankings. He was induced into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1968.

ED PRICE, 1951-56

(Record: 33-27-1)

Due to a long association with The University both as an athlete and an assistant coach, Edwin Booth Price was the natural choice to replace Blair Cherry as the Longhorns' head coach in 1951. Stunned by the sudden resignation of Cherry, Price's selection calmed the situation considerably, for he had been an assistant to both Jack Chevigny and D.X. Bible and had led Cherry's defensive units since returning from World War II.

Born in Brownwood, Price later was a four-sport star at Corsicana before coming to Texas, where he played on championship teams in football, basketball and baseball. He was also a sportswriter for the Daily Texan while in school.

He coached in high school and junior college at Hillsboro and El Paso before returning to Texas to join Chevigny's last staff in 1936. He stayed on as a freshman football coach for Bible.

Price quickly continued the winning tradition set by Cherry, leading the Longhorns to a 7-3 record in his first season as head coach. His 1952 team posted a 9-2 record, claimed the Southwest Conference Championship with a perfect 6-0 league mark and finished with a No. 10 national ranking. That unit, which featured an all-conference backfield and some of the best players of the era for UT, capped a terrific year with a 16-0 victory against No. 8 Tennessee in the Cotton Bowl.

His 1953 team finished with a 7-3 mark, was ranked 11th nationally and claimed a league co-championship. After just three seasons, Price had won two conference titles, led Texas to a 23-8 record and was riding a wave of success.

But despite high hopes, the 1954 team stumbled to a 4-5-1 record — Texas' first losing season in 15 years — and the downward spiral had begun. After a 5-5 year in 1955, UT tumbled to its worst record in school history in a 1-9 season in 1956. A 7-6 win against Tulane in the second game of the year was the only victory in the dismal campaign.

Whether the downfall came because of rule changes, as Price believed, or whether it was the mild-mannered Price's failure to recruit well and be hard-nosed, after over 25 years of direct association with athletics at Texas, his tenure in that department ended. On Oct. 31, 1956, citing his love for The University and his desire to move forward "for the good of the team," Price tendered his resignation effective at the end of the season. He posted 33-27-1 record in six seasons, but after claiming two conference crowns in his first three years, the Longhorns fell to the bottom of the league standings in his final two seasons.

He stayed on at Texas, first in the physical education department and later serving as assistant dean of students, for many years before retiring. He was inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1967.

DARRELL ROYAL, 1957-76

(Record: 167-47-5)

D. X. Bible's legacy as Texas' football coach may have ended in the 1940s, but the impact he had as athletics director in the '50s continued to be dramatic. For it was Bible, more than any single person, who fashioned the hiring in December 1956 of Darrell Royal, a young, 32-year-old former Oklahoma football star as the next Longhorns football coach.

Born in Hollis, Okla., Royal had played his college ball at the University of Oklahoma and served as an assistant coach at North Carolina State, Tulsa and Mississippi State. He coached the Edmonton Eskimos of the Canadian Football League, and in 1955, he returned to Mississippi State for his first collegiate head coaching job. He spent the next season at the University of Washington and was there when Bible called him to interview for the Texas job.

Royal was an immediate success at Texas, leading the Longhorns — who posted their worst record ever (1-9) in 1956 — to a 6-4-1 record, a No. 11 national ranking and a berth in the Sugar Bowl in his first season. He would never suffer a losing season in 20 years at Texas, led the Longhorns to their first National Championship in 1963 and followed that with national titles in 1969 and '70. Royal posted an astonishing 167-47-5 career record at UT, which included a 109-27-2 mark in Southwest Conference games. He claimed a league-record 11 SWC Championships, led UT to 16 bowl games and finished the year ranked among the nation's Top Five nine times.

In 1968, Royal was the first to install the famed "Wishbone" formation backfield. His teams would eventually spend 30 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation and post an astonishing 30-game winning streak (42 consecutive home wins) from 1968-70. From 1968-73, Royal's squads claimed six straight SWC titles and six consecutive Cotton Bowl berths. He coached 77 All-SWC players and 26 All-Americans.

Still at the top of his game in 1976, Royal retired and continued in the role of athletics director at Texas — a position he had maintained since taking over the dual role of coach and AD in 1962. His overall coaching record was 184-60-5.

FRED AKERS, 1977-86

(Record: 86-31-2)

When Darrell Royal retired following the 1976 season, the University administration picked one of his former assistants, Fred Akers, to lead the program. Akers, whose youthful appearance and early success as the head coach at the University of Wyoming captured the attention of the decision makers, inherited a wealth of talent which Royal thought he was leaving to his longtime assistant Mike Campbell, who had been his choice to succeed him.

But with a crack new staff and a switch to the "I" formation to utilize the talents of eventual Heisman Trophy winner Earl Campbell, Akers literally burst on the Texas scene in 1977. His first team went 11-0 through the regular season, daimed the Southwest Conference Championship and spent the final half of the year atop the national polls. Only a Cotton Bowl 38-10 loss to No. 5 Notre Dame denied Akers a National Championship in his first season.

A native of Arkansas, Akers played for the Razorbacks and served as a graduate assistant a season after finishing his playing career in 1959. He was a product of the Texas high school coaching ranks, having served as an assistant at Port Arthur and as head coach at Edinburg (19-9-1) and Lubbock High (7-3) before Royal hired him to join the Texas staff for the 1966 season.

At Texas, Akers coached running backs, defensive backs and then was co-offensive coordinator prior to accepting the head coaching job at Wyoming for the 1975 season. In two seasons, he took the Cowboys from 2-9 his first year to an 8-4 record and Fiesta Bowl appearance in 1976 before returning as Texas' head coach in '77.

Akers followed the spectacular start in 1977 with nine consecutive winning seasons and nine bowl berths in a row. In 1978, the Longhorns were 9-3 and finished the year ranked ninth nationally. UT matched that mark in 1979 and earned a No. 12 national ranking. After dipping to 7-5 in 1980, Akers and the Longhorns rocketed back on the scene in '81 with a 10-1-1 record and climbed back into the nation's top spot midway through that season. UT's 14-12 upset of No. 3 Alabama in the Cotton Bowl — Texas was in the Cotton Bowl because league champ SMU was on probation — vaulted Texas to a final No. 2 national ranking in 1981.

In 1982, Texas was 9-3 and finished the year ranked 17th nationally. Akers again had the Horns in the hunt for a national title in 1983. Texas opened the season ranked third nationally and posted the second perfect 11-0 regular season mark and the second SWC Championship of the Akers era, spent all but one week in the nation's No. 2 spot. However, a 10-9 loss to No. 7 Georgia in the Cotton Bowl ended the title hopes for the Longhorns. A victory, coupled with a 31-30 loss by No. 1 Nebraska to Miami in the Orange Bowl, would have given Texas its fourth national title. Instead, UT finished the year ranked fifth nationally.

Despite posting a 66-17-1 record, winning two SWC titles and finishing the season ranked among the nation's Top Five three times in his first seven years at Texas, Akers never endeared himself to the Longhorns faithful. When problems with recruiting hit, caused in part by rampant NCAA violations which saw severe sanctions levied against several SWC schools, they would signal Akers' eventually downfall. Texas struggled to a 7-4-1 mark that was capped by a 55-17 defeat at the hands of lowa in the Freedom Bowl in 1984. It didn't get any better in 1985 as the Longhorns finished 8-4 and unranked for the second consecutive year. Following a 5-6 injury-riddled season of 1986, Akers' first losing season, UT's program appeared to be on a free fall and he was released as the head coach.

He finished his career at UT with a 86-31-2 record (60-19-1SWC) — second only to Darrell Royal in victories — in 10 seasons. Akers led the Longhorns to nine bowl games and coached a Heisman Trophy winner (Earl Campbell), two Lombardi Trophy winners (Kenneth Sims, Tony Degrate) and an Outland Trophy honoree (Brad Shearer) as well as 48 all-conference players.

Following his departure in '86, Akers accepted the head coaching job and the challenge of rebuilding a struggling Purdue program in 1987. In four seasons in West Lafayette, Ind., Akers' Boilermakers were 12-31-1. After his departure from Purdue, Akers returned to his ranch near Austin and remained active as a motivational speaker.

DAVID MCWILLIAMS, 1987-91

(Record: 31-26)

David McWilliams joined Clyde Littlefield and Ed Price as a former Longhorns player who became the coach when he succeeded Fred Akers as UT's head coach in 1987.

A popular tri-captain on the 1963 National Championship team and a UT assistant to both Royal and Akers from 1970-85, McWilliams seemed the perfect choice to lead the Longhorns. Immediately, his homespun nature reminded people of Royal and the Longhorn lettermen — who had been divided in the years since Royal left — came as one unit in support of McWilliams.

McWilliams had served one year as the head coach at Texas Tech in 1986 before he returned to Texas, but his years of experience as a Longhorns assistant and his loyalty to the school gave the Texas community high hopes.

A native of Cleburne, McWilliams had been part of one of the greatest eras of UT football. In his three years as a player, from 1961-63, Texas lost only two football games, posting a remarkable record of 30-2-1. During that time, UT won a National Championship, three conference championships and finished the year ranked among the nation's top four each year.

Following his graduation from Texas, McWilliams served two years as an assistant coach at Abilene High, and in 1966, he

became one of the state's youngest head coaches, carving a record of 21-7-2 in four years before Darrell Royal hired him to join the Texas staff in 1970.

An honor student and a solid player, McWilliams concentrated his coaching on the defensive side of the football, working with ends and linebackers for Royal and Akers and serving as defensive coordinator for Akers his last four seasons as a Texas assistant.

McWilliams got off to a solid start with a 7-5 campaign and a No. 19 national ranking in the 1987 season that included a storybook last-play victory over Arkansas and a Bluebonnet Bowl win over Pittsburgh. But, after a 4-7 season in 1988 and a 5-6 campaign in 1989, the future of the Texas program came in question.

The 1990 season soothed a lot of the disappointment and was McWilliams' high water mark. That year, the Longhorns, beginning with a season-opening victory at Penn State (17-13), went on what they called a "Shock The Nation" tour. Texas finished the regular season with a Southwest Conference Championship, a 10-1 record —the only loss coming at the hands of eventual National Champion Colorado — and a No. 3 national ranking before being defeated by No. 4 Miami, 46-3, in the Cotton Bowl.

Despite the disappointing bowl loss, a 10-2 record and a No. 10 national ranking in 1990 carried Texas into the 1991 season with great expectations. There was preseason talk of a National Championship, but when Texas finished with a 5-6 record, McWilliams was forced out, officially resigning for the good of the program he so deeply loved. He finished his five-year tenure at UT with a 31-26 record that included one SWC title and two bowl games.

McWilliams remained in the athletics department, serving as associate athletics director for development and leading the "T" Association, the active group of former letterwinners who have been brought back into the UT fold through his efforts and those of the head coaches in every sport.

JOHN MACKOVIC, 1992-97

(Record: 41-28-2)

Not since the hiring of Darrell Royal in 1956, and D.X. Bible before him, had The University of Texas ventured as far as it did with the hiring of John Mackovic as head coach in 1992. The head coach and athletics director at Illinois, Mackovic brought the impressive credentials of having been a head coach with the NFLs' Kansas City Chiefs and an assistant with the Dallas Cowboys.

He also was the first coach to come into the Texas program from the outside since Royal in 1956 and Bible in '37. All others, from Blair Cherry through David McWilliams, had been a player or an assistant at Texas. A native of Ohio, Mackovic played his college football at Wake Forest and had an odyssey as an assistant coach that found him working for some of the true legends of the college game.

In 1970, his career came to the state of Texas for the first time, when he became the quarterbacks coach for Tom Landry with the Dallas Cowboys. In 1983, at the relatively young age of 39, he became the head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. He took the team to its first playoff bid in 15 years before leaving to enter private business. Mackovic returned to coaching at Illinois in 1988 and spent four seasons there before he was hired at Texas.

Known for his wide-open offense, his teams set numerous school offensive records and lured a number of talented offensive weapons, such as 1998 Heisman Trophy winner Ricky Williams, UT's all-time second-leading passer James Brown and UT's all-time leading receiver Mike Adams among them.

Determined to carve his own legacy, Mackovic steadily rebuilt a Longhorns program that had three losing seasons in the four years prior to his arrival. UT finished at 6-5 in 1992 and 5-51 in 1993. Mackovic's program made its most dramatic mark in 1994, when after suffering four losses in a six-game stretch midway through the season, bounced back with three consecutive victories. Including a come-from-behind 35-31 victory against North Carolina in the Sun Bowl — UT's first bowl victory in 13 years — the SWC co-Champions finished with an 8-4 record and No. 25 national ranking.

In 1995, Mackovic's squad charged out to a 10-1-1 record, claimed the final SWC Championship and finished the regular season ranked ninth nationally. On the heels of that enthusiasm, Texas entered 1996 with its first preseason Top 10 ranking since 1984 and with National Championship aspirations, but after losing four of its first seven games, Mackovic's squad was simply hoping to reach a bowl game. However, UT rallied to win five games in a row, including a 37-27 upset of No. 3 Nebraska in the inaugural Big 12 Championship game, to finish the regular season with an 8-4 mark and ranked 20th nationally.

Once again, though, the hopes of the program's future were high. The glory was short-lived, however, and even Mackovic's three league championships couldn't secure his position. Texas finished the 1997 season at 4-7 — matching the worst record for a UT team since 1956 — and Mackovic was relieved of his coaching duties and reassigned within the athletics department for the remainder of his contract. He finished his Longhorns tenure with a 41-28-2 record and led Texas to three bowl games.

MACK BROWN, 1998-2013

(Record: 158-48)

Mack Brown was the head coach of the Texas Longhorns for 16 seasons. With a mark at Texas of 158-48 (.767), the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year and the 2009 Big 12 Coach of the Year elevated the Longhorns program to new heights.

The 2005 Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award winner and coach of the 2005 BCS National Champions, he is one of a handful of coaches in the history of college football to lead two separate programs to a top five national finish.

A member of the Longhorn Hall of Honor, Brown's 244 career victories ranked 10th on the NCAA all-time list, and he was one of just four active coaches to reach the 200-victory plateau at the end of the 2013 season. He was also one of only two coaches nationally to direct his teams to 21 bowls in his last 22 seasons and the only one to have 23 winning seasons in his last 24 years, while his 158 wins at Texas were the fourth-most in the nation from 1998-2013, and his 225 wins overall from 1990 to 2013 were the most nationally.

Those streaks are a reflection of the continuing success Brown brought to a program that managed at least 10 wins just three times in the 16 years prior to his arrival in 1998, but did so nine times in his 16 seasons, including a streak of nine consecutive that is tied for the second-longest in NCAA history.

Brown also led the Longhorns to six seasons of at least 11 wins. Under Brown, Texas won nine of its last 12 bowl games during his tenure and has a 10-5 record overall, including a UT record streak of 12 consecutive bowl appearances. In the 15 years prior to Brown's arrival, Texas went to eight bowls and was 2-6. The 10 bowl wins give Brown the most in Texas history, surpassing Darrell Royal's eight. In addition, the streak includes a BCS National Championship, another BCS National Championship Game appearance and three BCS bowl wins.

The Horns finished the year ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his final 14 years, which included a string of 10 straight. They also had seven top 10 finishes and five top five rankings. Prior to Brown's arrival in 1998, the last time Texas had finished the year in the top 10 was 1983. In addition, from 1998-2013, Texas led the nation in all-time appearances in the BCS rankings with 103, ahead of both Oklahoma (100) and Florida (92).

Excellence and consistency were nothing new to the coaching veteran of 41 years, including 29 as a head coach. Establishing stability was a trademark of Brown's career, highlighted by his success at North Carolina and Texas. He rebuilt UNC after a series of disappointing seasons and turned it into a nationally-elite program.

Fresh off a season that saw North Carolina finish 11-1 and fourth nationally (USA Today/CNN), Brown was hired as the 28th head coach in the storied history of Texas football on Dec. 4, 1997.

In his 16 seasons, Brown's Longhorns squads featured a Heisman Trophy winner, two runners-up and a third-place finisher, three Maxwell Award winners, three WCFF Player of the Year Award winners, two Doak Walker Award winners, two Thorpe Award winners, two Nagurski Trophy winners, two O'Brien Award winners a Butkus Award winner, a Lombardi Award winner, two Manning Award winners, a Hendricks Award winner, two Draddy/Campbell Trophy winners, a Wuerffel Trophy winner, a Disney Spirit Award winner, a FWAA Armed Forces Merit Award winner, 54 All-Americans, 73 first-team All-Big 12 selections, five Big 12 Offensive Players of the Year, six Big 12 Defensive Players of the Year and 12 Big 12 Freshman of the Year honorees.

During that time, UT established one of the nation's premier offensive attacks, while rejuvenating a once struggling Longhorns' defense into one of the nation's best.

On offense, the Longhorns set 138 school records and featured the school's only 3,000-yard passers (Colt McCoy, 2007, 08, 09/Vince Young, 2005/Chris Simms, 2002/Major Applewhite, 1999), 2,000-yard rusher (Ricky Williams, 1998), 1,000-yard receivers (Quan Cosby, 2008/Jordan Shipley, 2008, 09/Roy Williams, 2002, 03/Kwame Cavil, 1999/ Wane McGarity, 1998) and 1,000-yard passer/rusher (Vince Young, 2004 and 05) in a season.

Defensively, Texas led the Big 12 in scoring defense three times, in total defense seven times and four of his last six years, and rushing defense seven times and five of his last eight seasons.

With all of the success on the field, the primary emphasis remained the same with Brown's squads — maintaining a high level of achievement in the classroom and in the community. Eighty percent of his players at North Carolina received their degrees and he increased the pace at Texas, while more than a third of his players at Texas have regularly earned 3.0 grade point averages and achieved spots on the Big 12 Commissioner's and Athletics Director's honor rolls.

Over his last eight years, the success in the classroom reached an all-time high. The Longhorns led the Big 12 in academic all-conference selections in five of Brown's last eight seasons, and in three of those had equal or more first-team selections than all but two Big 12 schools have had total selections.

CHARLIE STRONG, 2014-16

(Record: 16-21)

Charlie Strong was the head coach of the Texas Longhoms from 2014-16, compiling a record of 16-21 while on the 40 Acres. While at Texas, Strong guided the Longhorns to four wins over ranked teams and two top-10 recruiting classes.

During his first season at UT, Strong guided Texas an appearance in the Texas Bowl where the Longhorns played Arkansas. Despite finishing with a record of 6-7, the Texas defense finished the 2015 season ranked No. 25 in total yards allowed, No. 11 in passing defense, No. 7 in yards allowed per play, No. 15 in

passing efficiency defense, tied for 11th in sacks and 31st in points allowed.

A number of players earned individual honors in Strong's first season. Defensive tackle Malcom Brown, a first-round pick of the New England Patriots in 2015, was a finalist for both the Nagurski and Outland Trophies. Brown was a consensus All-American. Linebacker Jordan Hicks also earned All-America honors, in addition to 10 total players earning All-Conference accolades.

Following his first season at Texas, Strong saw five players selected in the 2015 NFL Draft. Brown (first round to New England), Hicks (third round to Philadelphia), safety Mykkele Thompson (fifth round to NY Giants), cornerback Quandre Diggs (sixth round to Detroit) and tight end Geoff Swaim (seventh round to Dallas) were all selected, in addition to five others earned UDFA opportunities.

In 2015, Strong's team posted upset wins over College Football Playoff participant and No. 4-ranked Oklahoma, as well as No. 13 Baylor on the road. The true freshman class featured three freshman All-Americans and 10 players who started a game.

Strong and the Longhorns went just 5-7 in 2016, but started the season off with a bang - a win over No. 10 Notre Dame in double-overtime in front of a record crowd at Darrell K Royal - Texas Memorial Stadium. For the second straight season, Strong's squad defeated Baylor, while also beating UTEP, Texas Tech and lowa State.

TOM HERMAN, 2017-20

(Record: 32-18)

A Texas Ex and former University of Texas graduate assistant with deep ties to the state of Texas, Tom Herman led the Longhorns for four season from 2017–20. In that time, he posted a 32-18 overall record that included four winning seasons and four bowl victories, highlighted by the 2019 Allstate Sugar Bowl over Georgia following the 2018 season. The Longhorns also won the 2017 Texas Bowl against Missouri, along with back-to-back Valero Alamo Bowl victories over Utah in 2019 and Colorado in 2020. His 32 wins tied for the third-most for a head coach in their first four seasons at UT. In all, 14 Longhorns went on to be drafted under Herman, including six in the third round or better, along with numerous others who went on to success as undrafted free agents.

In 2020, Herman guided the Longhorns to a 7-3 record in a pandemic-shortened season. JACK Joseph Ossai and OL Smauel Cosmi garnered All-American recognition, with Ossai named consensus. Thirteen Longhorns earned All-Big 12 honors, with Ossai and Cosmi as first-team selections, while QB Sam Ehlinger, PK Cameron Dicker and DB Chris Brown were on the second team.

Herman led the Longhorns to an 8-5 mark in 2019. Nine Longhorns earned All-Big 12 recognition that year with WR

Devin Duvernay and OL Zach Shackelford both collecting first-team honors. Cosmi and DB Brandon Jones were both were named second-team performers. Ehlinger became only the third Longhorn to surpass 4,000 yards of total offense in a season, joining Longhorn Legends Vince Young (2005) and Colt McCoy (2008) in that exclusive club. Ehlinger totaled 39 touchdowns in 2019, the third-most in school history.

In 2018, Herman led Texas to a top-10 ranking, a 10-4 record and a Big 12 Championship Game appearance in his second season. The Sugar Bowl marked Herman's second appearance in a NY6 Bowl Game in just four seasons as a head coach. DE Charles Omenihu was named Big 12 Defensive Lineman of the Year, while Sterns was UT's seventh all-time Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year. In total, 18 Longhorns garnered All-Big 12 recognition, including four on the first team. Ehlinger also became the only player in UT history to pass for at least 25 touchdowns and rush for at least 15 in a season in 2018.

In his first season at Texas, Herman guided the Longhorns to a 7-6 record. Both P Michael Dickson and S DeShon Elliott were named unanimous All-Americans, with Dickson becoming UT's first-ever winner of the Ray Guy Award. Seven players were named All-Big 12. Linebacker Malik Jefferson was named Big 12 Co-Defensive Player of the Year, defensive lineman Poona Ford was the conference's Defensive Lineman of the Year, and Dickson was the conference Special Teams Player of the Year for the second-straight season. Elliott joined the trio of players of the year as a unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection.

A native of Simi Valley, Calif., Herman came to Texas after compiling a 22-4 record in two seasons at Houston, the fourth-best record in the FBS in that span. His time as head coach at Texas made it 17 seasons spent in the state of Texas out of 23 years coaching on the collegiate level. That includes his time as a graduate assistant at UT (1999-2000), where he earned a master's degree in education.

STEVE SARKISIAN, 2021-PRES.

(Record: 25-13)

A former All-American quarterback at BYU whose coaching career includes six years as an offensive coordinator at both the NFL and collegiate levels, Steve Sarkisian was named the 31st Head Football Coach at The University of Texas on January 2, 2021.

In 2022, Sarkisian guided Texas to an 8-5 record with all five defeats coming by seven points or fewer, and it is just the second time in the last nine years the Longhorns reached eight wins in the regular season. Meanwhile, this past season's trip to the Valero Alamo Bowl marks the sixth bowl game Sarkisian has led his teams to in nine completed seasons as a head coach. The 2022 Longhorns featured a balanced attack that averaged 34.5 points per game (25th FBS) and allowed just 21.6 points per game (28th FBS). Running back Bijan Robinson won the Doak Walker Award and earned first-team All-America honors after leading the nation in tandem yards

during the regular season with 1,894 (1,580 rushing, 314 receiving) and ranking second in total touchdowns (20), while averaging a Big 12-best 131.7 rushing yards and 157.83 all-purpose yards per game. Robinson was also a first-team All-Big 12 selection and was joined in that honor by tight end Ja'Tavion Sanders and linebackers Jaylan Ford and DeMarvion Overshown. A three-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honoree in 2022, Ford was second in the Big 12 in tackles (119; 9.2 tpg). His four interceptions were tied for the UT linebacker record and were the most among FBS linebackers this year. He was also the only Power 5 player with four interceptions and three forced fumbles, and the only FBS player with four interceptions, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Additionally, wide receiver Xavier Worthy, true freshman offensive lineman Kelvin Banks Jr. and defensive lineman Keondre Coburn earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades, as a total of 20 Longhorns received all-conference recognition.

Year one had its ups and downs as the Longhorns dealt with inconsistency, injuries and adversity in a 5-7 campaign. Texas opened and closed the 2021 season with big victories as the Sarkisian era began with a 38-18 victory over No. 23 Louisiana and ended with a 22-17 win over Kansas State. In between, five of the Horns' seven losses came down to the end with Texas falling by eight points or fewer in each of those. The Longhorns' offense averaged nearly 200 yards rushing and 425 total yards while ranking 18th nationally in scoring at 35.2 points per game on the season. Worthy had a recordsetting season on his way to Freshman All-America and Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year honors. Despite missing the final two games with an injury, Robinson compiled 1,127 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns to go with 26 receptions for 295 yards and four more touchdowns. Kicker Cameron Dicker and offensive lineman Derek Kerstetter joined Worthy and Robinson as four Longhorns who earned first-team All-Big 12 honors. All totaled, 14 Longhorns earned All-Big 12 recognition.

DARRELL K ROYAL UT'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH

The union between The University of Texas football program and Darrell Royal was a Hollywood producer's dream and for 20 years the best matchup since boots and saddles brought unparalleled success, fame and prestige to the Longhorns and the man who guided their destiny.

Royal, who was 32 years old when he took the head coaching job at Texas in December 1956, and he came to the Austin campus with a folksy sense of humor that produced a phenomenon called "Royalisms" and an innovative style of football that produced almost instant success.

Texas went from a 1-9 season in 1956 to a 6-3-1 regular season in 1957, and with a trip to the Sugar Bowl, Royal's Longhorns were off to the first of 16 bowl trips they would make during the next 20 years.

In 1962, Royal assumed the dual role of athletics director and head football coach, and when he resigned from the football job following the 1976 season, he remained as director of athletics for three years. In January 1980, Royal left the athletics department and became a special assistant on athletics programs to The University President.

Royal's roots came from the dust bowl days in southwest Oklahoma, where the Hollis native began his life in football as a high school star in the early 1940s. He was an All-American quarterback at the University of Oklahoma and came to The University of Texas after head coaching jobs at Mississippi State and the University of Washington.

In 23 years as a head coach, he never had a losing season, and his teams went 167-47-5 in his 20 years at Texas — the best mark in the nation over that period.

Royal's great friend, the late President Lyndon B. Johnson, once wrote him after a particular victory. "You are the finest example of an inspiring world leader I know."

Royal's Longhorns teams finished in the Top 10 nationally 11 times. He coached 77 All-Southwest Conference players and 26 All-Americans. His overall coaching record was 184-60-5.

During Royal's tenure, UT won three National Championships, 11 SWC Championships and played in 16 bowl games.

As an innovator, Royal is credited with two major changes in collegiate football. In 1961, he achieved great success and later went on to win a National Championship while applying the "flip-flop" to the winged-T, allowing the offensive picture to flip right or left, so that blocking assignments remained simplified.

Then, in 1968, Royal installed the famed "Wishbone" formation backfield, with the fullback lined up two yards behind the quarterback and a step up from the other backs. With that formation, his teams won 30 consecutive games and a record six SWC Championships in a row.

While winning on the field may have been the most apparent standard of the Royal Era at Texas, his overriding concern with success in the classroom and adherence to the rules could well have been his most significant contribution.

When Royal came to Texas, his first act was to employ the nation's first academic counselor, and over the years, four out of five men who lettered for Royal went on to achieve their degree. Royal set aside a fund for a special "T" ring, which he personally awarded to his lettermen upon their graduation.

In the struggle for honesty in intercollegiate athletics, Royal was a champion in lobbying the cause before the NCAA.

"Integrity has been a key word for Darrell," said Neils Thompson, Royal's athletic council chairman and a past president of the NCAA. "He has run his football team accordingly. He has lived by the rules . . . if he didn't like those rules, he would fight to change them, but he would never intentionally break them."

Besides his duties at Texas, Royal parlayed his love of golf and country music into numerous charity benefits which raised thousands of dollars for various needy causes.

The Longhorns' National Championships came in 1963, '69 and '70, and the performance of Royal's teams during the 1960s earned him the honor of Coach of the Decade as chosen by ABC-TV.

Royal's football teams won more SWC games (109) and more overall games (167) than any coach in league history and his six consecutive conference titles and Cotton Bowl trips from 1968-73 were league records.

During Royal's tenure as athletics director, UT won six national titles, three in football, two in golf and one in baseball. Royal was a driving force in the upgrading of basketball when he brought in Abe Lemons as coach, and of swimming, when he hired Eddie Reese. Royal served on numerous boards and committees, including the NCAA Television Committee.

UT honored its legendary coach by naming its football stadium - Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium - after him in 1996.

His honors include membership in both the Texas and Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame and the Longhorn Hall of Honor. He is past president of the American Football Coaches Association and was twice named Coach of the Year by the AFCA and three times by the Football Writers of Association. Royal was chosen Southwesterner of the Year four times and SWC Coach of the Year on five occasions. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame in 1983. In '96, Royal earned the prestigious Horatio Alger Award for his lifetime success. He was a member of the Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame's initial class in spring 1998 and was recognized with the first-ever Contribution to College Football Award at the 2002 Home Depot College Football Awards on ESPN.

Royal's teams were marked by a fierce intensity of competition without, as one guest coach put it, "emotional or rah-rah tactics."

"It was," the guest said, "a matter of knowing what had to be done and keeping your head so as to be better able to accomplish it."

Royal's great friend, the late President Lyndon B. Johnson, once wrote him after a particular victory, "You are the finest example of an inspiring world leader I know."

And Johnson's lasting tribute to Royal came late in his life, after his presidency had ended, when he attended all UT games.

"I'm not a football fan, but I am a fan of people and I am a Darrell Royal fan because he is the rarest of human beings," the former President said.

EARL CAMPBELL 1977 HEISMAN TROPHY WINNER

Earl Campbell, the famed "Tyler Rose", will always have a special place in The University of Texas and state of Texas football history.

Born March 29, 1955, in Tyler, Campbell was the fifth of 11 children raised by Ann Campbell. Two of his six brothers, Tim and Steve, joined him as Longhorns.

Campbell galloped into UT football history with his Heisman Trophywinning 1977 season. He rushed for 1,744 yards (a Southwest Conference record that stood for 16 years) and 19 touchdowns and led the nation in rushing and scoring, posting 200-yard rushing games at Texas A&M (222) and at SMU (213). Campbell set a Longhorns record for 100-yard rushing games that year (10).

On Campbell's heels, Texas jumped out to a 6-0 mark and claimed the No. 1 spot in the nation at the season's midway point. The Longhorns held the nation's top spot for the remainder of the regular season and went on to finish 11-0 before falling to Notre Dame in the Cotton Bowl. Texas finished the year ranked No. 4 nationally in the final Associated Press poll.

Campbell was an instant success at Texas, starting at fullback in the Longhorns "Wishbone" attack and rushing for 928 yards and six touchdowns as a freshman in 1974. He claimed the first of his three consensus All-SWC honors that year.

As a sophomore, Campbell ran for 1,118 yards and 13 touchdowns, earning his first of two consensus All-America awards. He helped lead Texas to a 10-2 record that year and was tabbed the Offensive Player of the Game in the Longhorns' 38-21 win against Colorado in the Bluebonnet Bowl. UT finished the year ranked sixth nationally in the final Associated Press poll.

Injuries dampened the glitter on Campbell's career in 1976, as he missed four games with a pulled hamstring and the Longhorns struggled to a 5-5-1 mark. Campbell, playing on a strained hamstring much of the time, posted a career-low 653 rushing yards and three touchdowns. The highlight of the year was his first career 200-yard outing, a 208-yard effort against North Texas.

By his senior season, Campbell was at full strength again and turned in one of the finest rushing campaigns on school record. He finished his brilliant career with a then-Longhorns record 4,443 yards and 41 touchdowns.

After his star-studded collegiate career, Campbell took his talents to the National Football League. Selected No. 1 overall by the Houston Oilers in the 1978 NFL Draft, he quickly made a name for himself.

As a rookie, Campbell claimed virtually every award possible including Rookie of the Year, MVP and Offensive Player of the Year. Campbell, who went on to play in the Pro Bowl, first served notice on the NFL and the nation in his initial appearance on Monday Night Football (Nov. 20, 1978). That night Campbell bulled over the Miami Dolphins for 199 yards and four touchdowns in the Oilers' 35-30 victory. Probably the most memorable of his 28 carries that evening was his last. With Houston facing a second-and-long and leading 28-23, Campbell broke off tackle and jaunted 81 yards for a touchdown. He went on to rush for 100 yards six more times that season in claiming the NFL rushing crown with 1,450 yards.

Campbell was an instant celebrity, claiming the Great American Youth award as the top professional male athlete in 1978. He was presented with the trophy by Bob Hope.

The former Longhorn led the NFL in rushing again in 1979 with 1,697 yards and garnered his second consecutive league MVP and Offensive Player of the Year award. Campbell was named to the Pro Bowl for the second time as well.

In 1980, Campbell posted his first 200-yard game as a professional, rolling up 203 yards against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He bounced back the following week to do it again with 202 yards in a meeting with the Cincinnati Bengals. The 200-yard game became a regularity, as Campbell went on to post 206 yards against the Chicago Bears and set an NFL record with his fourth 200-yard game of the season as the Oilers clinched a playoff spot with a 20-16 win against the Minnesota Vikings. He wrapped up the year with his third NFL rushing title (1,934 yards), a third consecutive Pro Bowl appearance and the Offensive Player of the Year award.

Campbell claimed his final NFL rushing title in 1981 with 1,376 yards. The wear and tear caught up with him as he rushed for just 538 yards and two touchdowns in an injury-riddled 1982 campaign. He bounced back with 1,301 yards and 12 touchdowns in 1983.

Campbell was traded to the New Orleans Saints for a first-round pick in 1984. In 1985, he ran for 160 yards on 35 carries against the Vikings in what proved to be his top game with the Saints.

On Aug. 18, 1986, Campbell retired. He wrapped up his pro career with 9,407 rushing yards and 74 touchdowns along with 121 receptions for 806 yards in eight seasons.

UT retired Campbell's No. 20 jersey in ceremonies at the Longhorns' game with Baylor on Nov. 24, 1979, and the Oilers retired his No. 34 in 1987.

He was selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Jan. 26, 1991. Campbell was inducted along with kicker Jan Stenerud, offensive lineman John Hannah, lineman Stan Jones and former Dallas Cowboy president Tex Schramm on July 27, 1991.

In spring 1988, Campbell was inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor, and in 1990, he became a member of the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. Campbell received the Doak Walker Legends Award in 2003.



RICKY WILLIAMS 1998 HEISMAN TROPHY WINNER

With his trademark dreadlocked hair, a rare combination of strength and speed and a flair for the dramatic, Ricky Williams left an indelible mark on The University of Texas, the Big 12 Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

Born May 21, 1977, in San Diego, Calif., Williams followed a dominant prep career by taking his talents to Texas, an area he believed cared more than anywhere about its football. Texas and the Southwest embraced their new star, who quickly became a hero on the field and in the community.

After vaulting onto the scene as a true freshman, claiming the starting fullback job the day he stepped on campus and drawing comparisons to the most-honored player in UT football history, Earl Campbell, Williams steadily developed into one of college football's greatest players.

His legend began as a fullback in a freshman year that saw him break Campbell's UT freshman rushing record with 990 yards and eight touchdowns on just 166 carries. In the final year of the Southwest Conference, his presence was significant as the Longhorns established themselves as one of the nation's premier offensive attacks. On the heels of four subpar seasons in a row — by Longhorns standards — UT and its new star rolled to a 10-2-1 record, climbed as high as No. 9 in the national polls and earned a spot in the Sugar Bowl. Williams saved his finest performance for the grandest of stages, a trait he would carry throughout his collegiate career, rushing for 163 yards and two TDs in UT's 16-6 win at No. 16 Texas A&M. The victory, the Longhorns' first in College Station since 1983, secured the final SWC title, earned Williams SWC Offensive Freshman of the Year honors and re-established Texas as one of the nation's top programs.

Texas entered Williams' sophomore year considered a potential national title contender. Although some early-season defeats knocked the Longhorns from that perch, the second-year fullback never disappointed. He rushed for 100 yards seven times, registered 1,272 yards and 12 TDs, earned his first of three consensus first-team All-SWC honors and was tabbed UT's Offensive MVP. Again, Williams turned in his top efforts in the season's biggest games, rushing for 533 yards and three TDs, while catching eight passes for 130 yards and two TDs in the team's regular-season closing four-game winning streak. His 145 rushing yards and score helped UT cap the year with a 51-15 victory against Texas A&M, earning the Longhorns a berth in the first-ever Big 12 title game. Although Williams' numbers didn't reflect it, his performance in the stunning 37-27 upset of defending National Champion and third-ranked Nebraska were critical in the Longhorns claiming the first-ever Big 12 Championship. Williams' effort in helping neutralize Nebraska's All-American end Grant Winstrom in that game is among the most memorable of his career. The victory gave Texas, which finished the year with a 9-5 record and ranked 21st nationally, a spot in the Fiesta Bowl — its second straight Alliance Bowl (then the Bowl Championship Series and now College Football Playoff).

With his powerful thighs and breakaway speed, Williams had captured the nation's attention in just two seasons and entered his junior year as a Heisman Trophy candidate. While UT was going through one of its most disappointing seasons in decades, the junior tailback was having a breakout year. Williams registered his first 200-yard rushing game in posting 249 yards and a then-UT record five TDs at Rice. He would gain 200 yards in six of his next eight games (including a UT-record four in a row) and led the nation with a then-UT-record 1,893 yards and 25 TDs (tied for No. 5 on NCAA chart and now tied for 26th). Williams claimed first-team All-Big 12 honors, was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and was UT's MVP. He also became just the second UT junior to earn a spot among the top-five vote getters for the Heisman Trophy (he finished fifth) and claimed his first major award in winning the Doak Walker Award (nation's outstanding running back).

Williams solidified his place in college football history with a dash to the NCAA all-time rushing record and the Heisman Trophy in 1998. After announcing he was passing on a certain top-five selection in the NFL Draft and returning for his senior year on Jan. 8, 1998, Williams set his sights on leading the Longhorns back to a major bowl, breaking the NCAA rushing record and making a run for the Heisman Trophy. When the dust cleared on Nov. 27, he had reached two of those goals and on Dec. 12 at the Downtown Athletic Club in New York City, he claimed the third goal and became UT's second Heisman Trophy winner. Williams led Texas to a 9-3 record, set 21 NCAA records and received what was then the greatest percentage of first-place votes cast in Heisman history (43% of the 920 voters).

RICKY WILLIAMS 1998 HEISMAN TROPHY WINNER

The 6-foot, 225-pounder produced one of the finest seasons on NCAA record in 1998, rushing for 2,124 yards (No. 5 on the NCAA's all-time chart and now 14th) and 27 TDs (No. 4 on the NCAA's all-time list and now tied for 13th). He also became the first-ever two-time winner of the Doak Walker Award (nation's outstanding running back) and claimed the Maxwell Award, Walter Camp Foundation Player of the Year, The Associated Press Player of the Year, The Sporting News Player of the Year and the Football News Offensive Player of the Year. With his second consecutive unanimous first-team All-America honor in 1998, Williams became the first UT player since Jerry Gray (1983-84) to earn unanimous first-team All-America recognition in consecutive seasons.

However, it was his route to the Heisman Trophy that was most impressive. Capping his senior year with a 259-yard rushing effort in a 26-24 upset of No. 6 Texas A&M, Williams posted one of the greatest runaway victories in the award's 64-year history. He swept the voting in all six regions, scoring at least a 200-point victory in each section of the country. His 714 first-place votes were the third-most ever and 673 more than runner-up Michael Bishop (Kansas State). Williams' 2,355 points were third-most in Heisman history while his 1,563-point margin of victory over Bishop (792 points) was the fourth-largest on the trophy's record book. Only 0.J. Simpson (1,750) in 1968 and Charlie Ward (1,622) in 1993 produced greater routs.

On top of it all, the four-year starter (two at fullback, two at tailback) added 46 school records, two Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year awards, three first-team All-Big 12 accolades and was just the fifth UT player ever to be twice tabbed the Longhorns' MVP.

Most importantly to Williams, he had left UT as he started it, considered among the nation's best teams. After losing two of its first three games in his senior year, he helped Texas post victories in eight of its final nine games. On the heels of Williams' Offensive MVP effort of 203 rushing yards and two TDs in a 38-11 Cotton Bowl victory against Mississippi State (UT's first New Year's Day bowl victory since 1982), the Longhorns finished Williams' senior year with a 9-3 record and No. 15 ranking.

Texas officially retired Williams' No. 34 jersey in a pregame ceremony prior to the Oklahoma State game on Sept. 30, 2000.

After a record-setting collegiate career, Williams began a new chapter of his life, again in historic fashion. On April 17, 1999, Mike Ditka and the New Orleans Saints stunned the NFL and the sports world by trading their entire draft in 1999 and first and third-round selections in 2000 (to the Washington Redskins) for the right to select Williams with the fifth pick.

In three seasons in New Orleans, Williams established himself as one of the NFLs premier running backs. He rushed for 3,129 yards and 16 TDs and caught 132 passes for 1,092 yards and a pair of TDs in 38 games (all starts). Williams became the first Saints 1,000-yard rusher in more than a decade in 2000 and followed that up with a career-best 1,245 rushing yards in 2001. He became the first New Orleans player to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons.

On March 8, 2002, Williams was again a part of a blockbuster deal. The fourth-year NFL back was traded to the Miami Dolphins for what turned out to be a pair of first-round picks, one each in the 2002 and 2003 NFL drafts.

Williams kicked off his Dolphins career with a bang, leading the NFL in rushing (1,853 yards/ Dolphins season record/eighth-best season rushing total in NFL history) and ranking second in the league in yards from scrimmage (2,216). He earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl and was named MVP at that game. The Dolphins co-MVP rushed for a team record 16 TDs and ranked second on the team with 47 catches for 363 yards. He also caught a TD pass and ranked second on the team with 102 points. During a two-game stretch, he rushed for 216 yards against the Chicago Bears and 228 in a snowstorm at Buffalo. That marked just the fourth time in NFL history that a player posted back-to-back 200-yard rushing games. He also had 10 100-yard rushing games.

In 2003, Williams posted his fourth straight 1,000-yard season, rushing for 1,372 yards (No. 2 on the Dolphins all-time season list) and nine TDs. He joined Green Bay's Ahman Green and the Jets' Curtis Martin as the NFL's only backs that rushed for 1,000 yards in each of the those seasons. Williams also ranked second on the team with 50 receptions (for 351 yards and a TD). He registered seven 100-yard rushing games, including 153 yards on a Dolphins record 42 carries against Buffalo.

Williams returned to the NFL in 2005 and rushed for 743 yards and six TDs. He spent the 2006 season in the Canadian Football League, rushing for 526 yards and two TDs. He returned to the NFL in 2007 and played in one game, rushing for 15 yards on six carries, before suffering a season-ending torn chest muscle. Williams made a splash with Dolphins in 2009 when he posted 1,121 rushing

yards setting an NFL record for longest span between 1,000-yard seasons at six years. In 2010, his last season with the Dolphins, Williams recorded 673 yards on 159 carries and two touchdowns. The Baltimore Ravens signed Williams in 2011 for his final NFL season before retiring. He played in all 16 games amassing 444 rushing yards on 108 attempts with a pair of TDs and caught 13 passes for 83 yards.

Williams is one of just 29 players in NFL history to rush for more than 10,000 yards. He totaled 10.009 career rushing yards and 66 rushing TDs over his professional career. He also had 342 receptions for 2,606 receiving yards.

His exploits on the gridiron where honored in January, 2015 when he was voted into the College Football Hall of Fame. He is also a member of the Longhorns Men's Hall of Honor, having been inducted in 2012.



DALLAS GRIFFIN 2007 DRADDY TROPHY WINNER

It is a long way from Katy, Texas to the grand ballroom of the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City, but as Dallas Griffin strode to the microphone to accept the honor of 2007 Draddy Trophy winner as the nation's top scholar-football player, he seemed right at home.

Griffin, the Longhorns' starting center, had just been named as the winner of the prestigious award they call "the academic Heisman" by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. He was chosen from an elite class of 15 finalists, becoming the first winner of the award from The University of Texas.

"I suppose," joked Dallas, "that at this moment I should say something intelligent."

That would not have been hard.

Dallas Griffin came to The University of Texas as a freshman in 2004 after a successful high school career that included a three-year tenure as the starting center for Katy Taylor High School and a UIL Class 5A individual state championship in the shot put.

His goals, from the time he entered Texas, were to succeed both on the playing field, and in the classroom. After redshirting his first year, his path to New York began in earnest during the Longhorns' team journey to the BCS National Championship in 2005. He played in 10 games as the backup center, while earning first-team Academic All-Big 12 honors.

As a junior, despite battling knee problems, he was the Longhorns' primary backup at center, and was again a first-team Academic All-Big 12 selection. That season, he was named one of the Longhorns' "Most Improved" offensive players, and was one of the winners of the Lan Hewlett Academic Award as the football team's top scholar athlete.

He entered the 2007 football season as one of only two seniors on the offensive line, and as the starting center, he was a critical part of the offensive front's schematic attack.

By that time, he had already excelled in the classroom, graduating with a double major in Business Honors and Finance in the spring of 2007. When he first snapped the football to quarterback Colt McCoy to start his senior season on the field, he was enrolled as a graduate student in UT's prestigious MBA program at the Red McCombs School of Business.

He also had been chosen by Playboy Magazine as the Anson Mount Scholar-Athlete on its preseason All-America team, and was picked as one of the top players to watch by NFL draft analysts.

He started the first 10 games of the season at center before suffering a season-ending knee injury, that effectively halted thoughts of the NFL, but it didn't affect his run to the nation's highest award for a scholar-athlete football player.

By the time he went to New York in early December, he had garnered accolades as an honorable mention All-Big 12 performer on the field and a first-team Academic All-American as recognized by ESPN the Magazine and chosen by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (COSIDA) off the field.

When he joined teammate Derek Lokey on the Academic All-America first team, the two became the 24th and 25th Longhorn selections over the last 49 years.

Dallas Griffin's body of work as a Longhorn football player extended far beyond the playing field and classroom. The Eagle Scout had been extremely active in UT's community service program. He had answered phones and taken donations during the Children's Miracle Network Telethon, and had regularly visited youngsters at the Austin Children's Hospital. He also spent time at elementary schools and facilities for mentally challenged youngsters.

Overall, he maintained a 3.875 GPA as an undergraduate, posting a perfect 4.0 six times. He twice earned UT's Provost Award, and recorded a 700 (out of 800) on the GMAT (admissions test for MBA programs) and ranked in the 92nd percentile with that score. Griffin also was a 10-time member of UT's Athletics Director's Honor roll. He was a recipient of the C. R. "Smilo" Mallison Endowed Presidential Scholarship and a member of the Dikolli Accounting Honor Roll.

Griffin also kept busy in the summers, interning at NFL Hall of Famer Roger Staubach's real estate company (The Staubach Company) and working for an Austin-based hedge fund company.

Griffin became the eighth Longhorn, and the first since Pat Fitzgerald in 1996, to be chosen as an NFF Scholar-Athlete. In 2007, each of the recipients earned an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship, and with his Draddy Trophy, Dallas' monetary award increased to \$25,000.

At a private dinner the night before the banquet, Dallas spoke of the day when his head coach, Mack Brown, came to his high school. It was only then that Griffin, who was not widely recruited, learned of the Longhorns' interest in him.

Recruiting, at best, is not an exact science. When Brown came to Texas in 1998, he said that his program's goal would be "to win championships with nice kids who graduate." Dallas Griffin has done more than that. He reinforced the true meaning of the word "student-athlete."

He became a great example for his teammates, who cheered his every success in the classroom. He was a leader on the field, being part of a senior class that finished its four years with the second best win-loss record in America.

Most of all, as he stood in that historic space where leaders of the world have walked and spoken, he was the very best example of the very best of college football.

SAM ACHO 2010 WILLIAM V. CAMBELL TROPHY WINNER

Senior DE Sam Acho was named winner of the 21st National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) William V. Campbell Trophy, as college football's top student-athlete in combined academic success, football performance and exemplary community leadership. He was announced as the winner at the NFF Annual Awards Dinner at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York.

Acho became the second Longhorn in four years to earn the honor, following C Dallas Griffin in 2007 when it was named the Draddy Trophy. He was also the third finalist in four years, including QB Colt McCoy in 2009.

"I'm just honored to be a part of this," Acho said. "Looking back, we had a winner of this award four years ago, Dallas Griffin. He won when I was a freshman and he really inspired me to strive for excellence and to do my best on the field and in the classroom. We have the same major and I really looked to him as a mentor. I wouldn't be here today without him, without my family and the family I've developed at The University of Texas.

"This means so much because of what it represents, the people you meet and the family you become a part of. The Campbell Trophy stands for excellence both on and off the field. I feel that through coach Brown and the entire staff at Texas, and also through the McCombs School of Business, I've really been able to excel both on and off the field."

Finalists earned the honor of being named a NFF Scholar-Athlete and receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship, while the winner earns a \$25,000 scholarship. Overall, Acho became the 11th Longhorn to be named a NFF Scholar-Athlete.

"Sam defines champion in every way, on the field and off the field, which is why he is so deserving of the Campbell Trophy," head coach Mack Brown said. "He works as hard as anybody I've ever been around. He's got great character and values from his family. He gives back to the community, but at the same time, football's very important to him and he's another in the line of great defensive ends we've had who will go on to the NFL. This is a very, very special young man and not many people can live up to all that Sam Acho stands for."

In 2010, Acho was also named the winner of the Wuerffel Award and ARA Sportsmanship Award, an Allstate AFCA Good Works Team member, an ESPN Academic All-America First Team member and a finalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy and Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. He was also a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award and Lombardi Award. An All-Big 12 First-Team selection, Acho earned a spot on the prestigious 2010 Preseason Playboy All-America team and was on the watch lists for the Nagurski Trophy, Hendricks Award and Outland Trophy.

An honors business major in the prestigious McCombs School of Business, Acho was UT's seventh two-time academic all-American and maintains a 3.55 GPA. He was a two-year member of UT's Student-Athlete Advisory Council and was the choice as UT's representative at the 2009 NCAA Leadership Conference in which one student-athlete from each NCAA school attends. He was the student-athlete representative of the Big 12 on the NCAA Football Issues Committee, and was one of UT's representatives at the Big 12's Conference on Black Student Government. In addition, he has attended the Minority Mentorship Symposium in Austin, which features high-profile leaders, executives and stars from the business, entertainment and music industries speaking on topics that focus on success.

Named one of The Sporting News' "20 Smartest Athletes," Acho went on to earn the NCAA's prestigious Top VIII Award, was a three-time first-team Academic All-Big 12 selection and eight-time UT Athletics Director's Honor Roll member. The past two years, he has been honored with the Arthur Ashe, Jr., Sports Scholarship Award, which is a national award that recognizes minority student-athletes who are committed to both education and athletics. Last year, he completed an internship at Target where he had a marketing idea advance to the level of the CEO.

In April 2010, Acho was inducted into UT's Friar Society, which is the oldest and most prestigious honor society at The University of Texas and recognizes students who have made significant contributions to The University.

Acho saw action in 50 career games (26 starts) and tallied 148 tackles, 23.5 sacks (No. 11 on UT's career list), 37 TFL, 44 pressures, eight PBD, eight forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries (t-No. 2 on UT's career list).

In 2010, he recorded 59 tackles, 17 TFL, nine sacks, 18 pressures, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries. His five fumble recoveries lead the nation this season and are tied the UT single-season record. His five forced fumbles are tied for second nationally and tied for seventh on the UT single-season list.

A 2009 semifinalist for the Lott Trophy, Acho notched 63 tackles, 10 sacks, 14 TFL, 15 pressures, three PBUs, two forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries that season. The four fumble recoveries were tied for the most nationally and tied for third on UT's single-season list.

Acho and his family have made several medical mission trips to his parents' native country of Nigeria. He helped organize a fundraiser in Dallas prior to the 2009 and 2010 trips. Then he, his brother Emmanuel and several teammates traveled to assist his father and approximately 40 doctors by providing medical treatment to Nigerians who may only have access to a doctor once a year. The family hopes to build a permanent clinic in the area soon.

Acho was taken in the fourth round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals. He spent his first four seasons in the league with the team and is now a member of the Chicago Bears.

1963 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Following two seasons that saw Texas flirt with its first National Championship, the Longhorns opened the 1963 campaign as the No. 1 team in the nation according to Sports Illustrated and Street & Smith's Football Yearbook. The Associated Press did not agree and forced UT to work its way up the ladder with a preseason No. 5 ranking.

After a pair of decisive season-opening wins at Tulane (21-0) and against Texas Tech (49-7), UT rapidly climbed into The AP Poll's No. 2 spot. Texas held that position after a 34-7 win against Oklahoma State and that set the stage for a battle for the nation's top spot in the annual rivalry with No. 1 Oklahoma, in Dallas.

FINAL AP POLL

A convincing 28-7 win against the Sooners rocketed the Longhorns to No. 1 and they maintained their ranking through the remainder of the regular season. It wasn't all easy though. In their first week at No. 1, UT nearly blew a 17-0 halftime lead in a 17-13 win at Arkansas and got another scare in a 7-0 win against Baylor later on in Austin.

In the biggest play of the season, Duke Carlisle made a sensational leaping interception of what looked like a sure last-minute, gametying Baylor touchdown pass. With 29 seconds remaining in the game and Baylor at UT's 19-yard line, Bears quarterback Don Trull was looking at his favorite target, Lawrence Elkins, who was running a post pattern. Elkins had eluded UT's Joe Dixon and looked to be wide open as he approached the goal line before Carlisle, who had covered nearly 15 yards since the ball left Trull's hand, made the miraculous play.

"Thank you, Duke. You saved my life," Dixon said to Carlisle after the game-saving catch.

The Longhorns avoided another upset attempt in a 15-13 victory at Texas A&M, scoring the winning touchdown on a Carlisle 1-yard plunge with 1:19 remaining in the game. UT entered the fourth quarter trailing 13-3 before putting the finishing touches on the victory.

Since there was no Associated Press postseason poll, Texas went into its

Cotton Bowl matchup against No. 2 Navy with The AP national title already secured, but the Football Writers Association and the Helms Foundation withheld naming a National Champion until after the game. The Midshipmen were expected to provide quite a test behind the multi-talented skills of junior quarterback Roger Staubach, who had claimed the Heisman Trophy during the season.

"I've never seen a team which deserved to be No. 1 more than Texas," Hardin said after the game. "Texas was just the best we've played, that's all. Staubach didn't play as well as usual, but I imagine Texas had a lot to do with that."

Appleton earned consensus All-America and All-Southwest Conference honors, running back Tommy Ford rushed for 738 yards and earned All-America and All-SWC recognition, Nobis was a consensus All-SWC pick and the American Football Coaches Association tabbed Royal its Coach of the Year. Appleton, Ford and center David McWilliams served as captains for the Longhorns, who finished with a perfect 11-0 record and 7-0 mark in SWC play.



The 1969 season marked the 100th year of college football and ABC television executive Beano Cook arranged for Texas and Arkansas to play the final game of the regular season, moving their usual October date to the first weekend in December.

For a long while, it looked as though the game would be a meeting of also-rans. Ohio State was dominating the Big Ten and the chances of the game being anything other than just the last game of the season were pretty remote.

However, as the Longhorns took a Saturday off to prepare for their upcoming game on Thanksgiving Day with Texas A&M, Michigan and its upstart coach Bo Schembechler upset the Buckeyes. Texas vaulted to No. 1 in the polls and Arkansas claimed the No. 2 spot.

That set the stage. Even the day took on an eerie feeling. The night before, a steady, cold rain fell in Fayetteville and an icy fog hovered over the stadium as the crowd awaited the arrival of President Richard Nixon, who would award a plaque symbolic of the National Championship to the winner.

In the 100th year of college football, it truly was the "Game of the Century." The Longhorns overcame turnovers and a 14-0 Arkansas lead to post a 15-14 victory. James Street scrambled for one touchdown, got a two-point conversion and then hit Randy Peschel on a dramatic 4th-and-3 play late in the game. Donnie Wigginton, the third-string quarterback who was the holder, made a big save on a high snap and Happy Feller booted the extra point for the winning score with 3:58 remaining. Tom Campbell's interception on UT's 21-yard line halted Arkansas' final drive.

Less than a week later, when safety Fred Steinmark underwent surgery for the removal of his leg because of bone cancer, UCLA administrators watching the Longhorns play basketball in Los Angeles actually wept.

The Cotton Bowl prompted a great deal of interest with No. 1 Texas hosting No. 9 Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish were making their first bowl appearance since the "Four Horsemen" beat Stanford 27-10 in the 1925 Rose Bowl. Ara Parseghian's 8-1-1 squad was ending its 44-year self-imposed departure from bowls.

Again, it took some dramatics for a Texas win. UT trailed 17-14 midway through the final period before Street directed the Horns 76 yards for the winning score. Billy Dale's 1-yard run capped the drive and gave UT a 21-17 lead and the 500th win in school history.

In the locker room after the 21-17 victory, Royal gave Steinmark the game ball. The little safety would become a national symbol of courage as he battled cancer for a year-and-a-half before dying in June 1971.


An ABC-TV poll of sportswriters tabbed Royal Coach of the Decade after wrapping up the 1960s with a pair of national titles. Tackle Bob McKay earned consensus All-America and All-Southwest Conference honors, while linebacker Glen Halsell, wide receiver Cotton Speyrer, running back Steve Worster and offensive tackle Bob Wuensch each earned All-America and All-SWC recognition. Street, tackle Leo Brooks and defensive end Bill Atessis each earned consensus All-SWC honors. Halsell, Ted Koy and Street served as captains for the 11-0 (7-0, SWC Champions) Longhorns.

Texas entered the 1970 season with a 20-game winning streak on the line and as the defending National Champions. With all of their startling credentials, the Longhorns entered the season ranked No. 2 behind Ohio State in the polls.

Despite a rash of preseason injuries, UT stormed into the year with a pair of decisive victories against California (56-15) and at Texas Tech (35-13).

The win over the Golden Bears propelled the Longhorns into the No. 1 spot in the UPI poll and narrowed their gap on Ohio State for the top spot in The AP poll. Despite the easy win against Tech, the Horns dropped back to No. 2 in the UPI poll, with Ohio State claiming a unanimous No. 1, again.

With UT's winning streak standing at 22 games, it appeared that the string of success with the unstoppable "Wishbone" had finally run out. In the season's third week, No. 13 UCLA conceived a unique defense which stymied the Longhorns. The Bruins appeared ready to end the streak with a 17-13 lead, 25 seconds remaining and Texas 45 yards away from the end zone. It was then that UT quarterback Eddie Phillips hit Cotton Speyrer in stride at the 25-yard line. Speyrer shook a UCLA defender and crossed the goal line with only 12 seconds left as UT came away with a 20-17 victory.

After the come-from-behind home victory against UCLA, the Longhorns posted back-to-back victories against Oklahoma (41-9) and at Rice (45-21). Those wins vaulted the Longhorns ahead of Ohio State into the nation's top spot.

A 42-15 win against SMU helped the Longhorns maintain the top spot. In its second week at No. 1, UT was forced to hold off a stubborn Baylor team in Waco (21-14) to remain at No. 1.

The Longhorns continued to hold the top spot with decisive victories at TCU (58-0) and against arch-rival Texas A&M (52-14) to set up a battle with No. 4 Arkansas. For the second consecutive year, the meeting with the Razorbacks would decide the Southwest Conference crown.

After claiming their third consecutive SWC crown with a 42-7 win against Arkansas, the Longhorns were awarded the UPI National Championship.

UT entered its Cotton Bowl rematch with No. 6 Notre Dame as the nation's top team in both The AP and UPI polls.

After falling 24-11 to the Fighting Irish, which snapped UT's 30-game winning streak, the Longhorns dropped to No. 3 in The AP poll but remained UPI's National Champion. The 30-game winning streak currently stands as the 12th-longest in NCAA history.

Defensive end Bill Atessis, fullback Steve Worster and offensive tackle Bobby Wuensch earned consensus All-America and All-SWC honors, while linebacker Scott Henderson and Speyrer earned All-America and All-SWC recognition. Running back Jim Bertelsen and offensive guard Bobby Mitchell also earned All-SWC accolades. Henderson, Worster, Wuensch and Zapalac were the captains for the 10-1 (7-0, SWC Champion) Longhorns.

Following an 11-1 campaign in 2004 that culminated in the Longhorns' first BCS win over Michigan in their first Rose Bowl, Texas entered the 2005 season ranked No. 2 behind defending champion USC. The ranking was UT's highest in the preseason since 1970, its last championship season.

The Longhorns opened with a 60-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette as QB Vince Young accounted for four TDs and freshman RB Jamaal Charles made the top freshman rushing debut in UT history with 135 yards.

The win set up a historic first meeting with No. 4 Ohio State. Trailing 22-16, Young connected with WR Limas Sweed on 24-yard TD with 2:17 remaining. The defense held firm, forcing a safety for the 25-22 final to give UT its second-straight win over a Big Ten power.

A 51-10 win over Rice at home, in which Charles racked up 189 rushing yards and three TDs, sent Texas into its bye week and then conference play, where it opened at Missouri. Young produced his first 100-yard passing/rushing game of the season with 236 passing and 108 rushing in the 51-20 victory.

The Red River Rivalry arrived with much being made of Oklahoma's

five-game winning streak in the series. However, 2005 would produce a stark contrast, as Texas rolled to a 45-12 win, highlighted by an 80-yard TD run by Charles for a 14-6 lead. The Longhorns never looked back, capping the win with a 67-yard fumble return TD by DT Rod Wright.

Next was No. 24 Colorado, and Young would have one of his finest days passing. He broke his own school record for completion percentage by connecting on 25-of-29 (86.2%) attempts for a career-high 336 yards and two TDs, while also reaching the end zone three times on the ground for a 42-17 win.

That set the stage for undefeated No. 10 Texas Tech. WR Billy Pittman collected his third 100-yard game with a career-high 138 yards and two TDs, while the defense held the nation's top-ranked scoring offense to 17 points for a 52-17 win.

The Longhorns then traveled to Oklahoma State, a team that in 2004 held a 35-7 lead before Texas made the greatest comeback in school history with 49 unanswered points. Again, the Cowboys jumped out, this time 28-9, and again UT responded. This time with 38-unanswered points. Young became the first player in NCAA history to rush for over 250 yards and pass for over 230 in the same game for a UT record 506 yards of total offense.

Texas closed the regular season with wins over Baylor, Kansas and Texas A&M for its first undefeated regular season since 1983, while clinching a spot in the Big 12 Championship, where it would meet Colorado again. The final score was set midway through the third quarter at 70-3, giving Mack Brown his first Big 12 title and sending the Longhorns to the BCS National Championship to face No. 1 USC.

The two teams played a game for the ages. Young took the spotlight from Heisman Trophy winners Reggie Bush and Matt Leinart, becoming the first player in NCAA history to pass and rush for more than 200 yards twice in a career. He recorded 267 yards passing and 200 yards rushing with three TDs, topped by his fourth-down, eight-yard TD run with 19 seconds to go for the 41-38 win.

Young won the Maxwell Award, the O'Brien Award and the Manning Award, and was consensus first-team All-America. Safety Michael Huff became UT's first winner of the Thorpe Award and was unanimous first-team All-America, along with OT Jonathan Scott. Wright also was named consensus first-team All-America.

One of The University of Texas' most cherished athletics traditions is the Texas Athletics Hall of Honor. Founded in 1957, the Texas Athletics Hall of Honor is one of the most cherished athletics traditions at The University of Texas. Inductees are a distinguished circle of individuals who have made a distinct and lasting contribution to The University of Texas. The governing body — the Longhorn Hall of Honor Council — is made up exclusively of men who have lettered at The University of Texas. The Council is in charge of all arrangements for the vote of lettermen and for the installation banquet. Each year, a selection committee nominates 16 candidates, whose names are distributed to the Hall of Honor Council. The four nominees receiving a majority of votes are inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor during a ceremony in conjunction with a Texas home football game. Mounted silver scrolls, which carry the announcement that they are presented 'In recognition of those qualities that brought credit and renown to The University of Texas,' are presented to the honorees. In addition, honorees are recognized in The Frank Denius Family University of Texas Athletics Hall of Honor.

HUB BECHTOL (INDUCTED: 1991)

End/1944-46

Considered one of the finest receivers in UT history, Hub Bechtol was UT's first consensus All-American. Bechtol is one of only two Horns ever to earn All-America honors three times. A native of Lubbock, Texas, Bechtol actually began his collegiate career at Texas Tech, were he earned one letter in football prior to serving in the Navy during World War II. Following his stint in the military, he returned to school, electing to enroll at Texas where he earned three letters in football (1944-46) and two in basketball. Bechtol made his fame catching passes from another All-American, Bobby Layne. He was an integral part of the third-best passing attack in the nation as a senior, and as a junior, he helped UT earn a No. 10 national ranking. He and Layne helped lead the Longhorns to the Southwest Conference Championship and a Cotton Bowl win against Missouri. In that game, Bechtol caught nine passes for 138 yards and he also set a UT single-season record for touchdown receptions with seven that year. Bechtol went on to play professional football with the Baltimore Colts for three seasons before returning to Austin to work in real estate and insurance. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1963.

DANA X. BIBLE (INDUCTED: 1951)

Head coach/1937-46

One of the winningest head coaches in the history of the college game, Dana X. Bible's 10-year run at UT from 1937-1946 is credited with laying the foundation for the modern legacy of Longhorns football. Following success at Texas A&M and Nebraska, Bible was hired in 1937 to turn the Texas fortunes around. He inherited a team that was more depressed than the nation's economy, but before his time was over, his teams won three Southwest Conference Championships, all coming in the final five years of his career. He is credited for "The Bible Plan," which placed an emphasis on education as well as success on the football field. In 1941, his team — still regarded as one of the best in UT history — was featured on the cover of Life magazine. A winner of 201 games in 33 years as a head coach (63-31-3 at UT), Bible was the third-winningest coach in the history of the game when he retired — trailing only Amos Alonzo Stagg, who coached for 57 years, and Pop Warner, who coached for 44 seasons. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1960.

MACK BROWN (INDUCTED: 2018)

Head coach/1998-2013

Mack Brown led Texas Football back into its rightful place through the first decade of the 2000s, compiling a record of 158-48 (.767) in 16 seasons as the head coach for the Longhorns. In 30 total seasons as a head coach, Brown had a record of 244-122-1 (.666). His 244 wins are the 10th most in NCAA history by a coach with at least 10 years at an FBS school. When he departed Texas after the 2013 season, Brown was one of only two coaches nationally at the time to have directed teams to 21 bowls in the previous 22 seasons and the only one to have 23 winning seasons in the last 24 years. His 225 wins overall from 1990 to 2013 were the most nationally. At Texas, Brown was named the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year and the 2009 Big 12 Coach of the Year. In addition, he was also named the 2005 Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year after guiding his Longhorns to the 2005 National Championship. Under Brown, Texas won nine of its last 12 bowl games during his tenure and had a 10-5 record overall, including a UT record streak of 12 consecutive bowl appearances. The 10 bowl wins give Brown the most in Texas history, surpassing Darrell Royal's eight. In addition, the streak includes a BCS National Championship, another BCS National Championship Game appearance and three BCS bowl wins. During his 16 seasons in Austin, the Longhorns featured a Heisman Trophy winner, two runners-up and a third-place finisher, three Maxwell Award winners, three WCFF Player of the Year Award winners, two Doak Walker Award winners, two Thorpe Award winners, two Nagurski Trophy winners, two O'Brien Award winners, two Hendricks Award winners, a Butkus Award winner, a Lombardi Award winner, two Manning Award winners, two Draddy/Campbell Trophy winners, a Wuerffel Trophy winner, a Disney Spirit Award winner, a FWAA Armed Forces Merit Award winner, 54 All-Americans, 73 first-team All-Big 12 selections, five Big 12 Offensive Players of the Year, six Big 12 Defensive Players of the Year and 12 Big 12 Freshman of the Year honorees.

EARL CAMPBELL (INDUCTED: 1990)

Running back/1974-77

Earl Campbell galloped into UT football history with his Heisman Trophy-winning 1977 season. Campbell rushed for 1,744 yards (a Southwest Conference record that stood for 16 years) and 19 touchdowns and led the nation in rushing and scoring. He posted 200-yard rushing games against Texas A&M (222) and SMU (213), both on the road, and set a UT record with ten 100-yard rushing games that season. Campbell was an instant success at Texas, rushing for 928 yards as a freshman "Wishbone" fullback. He claimed the first of three consensus All-SWC honors that year. As a sophomore in 1975, he ran for 1,118 yards and 13 touchdowns, earning the first of his two consensus All-America awards. Injuries dampened his junior season when he played with a pulled hamstring for much of the season. He missed four games and only posted 653 rushing yards. However, by his senior season, he was at full strength. He moved to tailback in the "I" formation utilized by new head coach Fred Akers and turned in one of the finest rushing campaigns in UT history. The Tyler, Texas, native finished his career with school rushing records of 4,443 yards and 41 touchdowns. Inducted into both the College Football and NFL Hall of Fame, Campbell earned NFL Rookie of the Year honors, won four rushing titles and was selected to five Pro Bowls in a stellar career with the Houston Oilers and New Orleans Saints. He rushed for 9,407 yards and 74 TDs in eight seasons as a pro. Following his retirement, Campbell returned to Austin where he owns a food company. He also serves as an assistant to the athletics director in the UT athletics department. Campbell was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1988.

DOUG ENGLISH (INDUCTED: 2011)

Defensive tackle/1972-74

After helping lead the Longhorns to a 10-1 finish, a Southwest Conference championship and a No. 3 final AP ranking in his first varsity season in 1972, Doug English quickly established himself as one of the top defensive lineman to come through the University of Texas. Following the Longhorns' win over fourth-ranked Alabama in the 1973 Cotton Bowl, Texas won its second consecutive SWC title in 1973 with English anchoring the defensive line. In his three seasons, Texas compiled a 26-8 record and finished in the top 20 every year. English twice earned All-Southwest Conference honors and was named First Team All-America as a senior in 1974. He also received UT's George "Hook" McCullough Outstanding Football Player Award and the D. Harold Byrd Leadership Award while serving as a team captain his senior season. For his career, English tallied 260 tackles (111 solo) and four forced fumbles while totaling 105 tackles as a senior. Drafted in the second round of the 1975 NFL Draft, English, a Dallas native, played 10 seasons with the Lions. He recorded a career-high 13 sacks and two safeties in 1983 while helping lead the Lions to the NFC Central Division title. He finished his NFL career with 59 sacks while earning All-Pro honors four times (1981-84). His four safeties tie him for the most in an NFL career. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1986 and was a member of the 2013 class of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame.

CHRIS GILBERT (INDUCTED: 1999)

Running back/1966-68

Chris Gilbert, the crown jewel in an era when Texas Longhorns running backs dominated the nation's ground game, was the first player in NCAA history to gain 1,000 yards in each of the seasons for which he was eligible. Gilbert played for Darrell Royal from 1966-68 and competed in a time when freshmen were not eligible for varsity competition. The 5-foot-11, 180-pounder was a three-time All-Southwest Conference back who rushed for more than 100 yards in exactly half of his 30 career games and he had four 200-yard efforts. The three-time UT MVP finished his career as the SWC's and the school's all-time leading rusher with 3,231 yards, which ranked third on the NCAA all-time list at the time. As a sophomore, Gilbert rushed for a then-school record 1,080 yards and was voted the Outstanding Back in the 1966 Bluebonnet Bowl victory against Mississippi. He added 1,019 yards to his total as a junior and recorded a 96-yard touchdown run against TCU, the longest run from scrimmage by a Longhorn. Gilbert's senior season marked the inaugural year of the famed "Wishbone" offense and he rushed for a UT-record 1,132 yards and scored 13 touchdowns. His efforts helped Texas to a 9-1-1 record and a No. 3 ranking after a 36-13 victory against Tennessee in the Cotton Bowl. Following graduation, Gilbert was drafted by the New York Jets but chose to enter private business in Texas and ran a highly-successful summer camp for youngsters and managed a respected residential real estate business. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1978.

JERRY GRAY (INDUCTED: 2013)

Defensive back/1981-84

One of the all-time greats defensive backs, Jerry Gray has his name etched in the Texas history books. A four-year letterman (1981-84), Gray is one of only seven Longhorns to earn two-time consensus All-America honors, as he did in 1983 and 1984. He earned unanimous honors as a senior and is still one of only 20 players in UT history to accomplish that feat. He was also a two-time Southwest Conference Defensive Player of the Year (1983-84). Gray finished his career ranked second on the Texas career interceptions list and still stand third with 16, just one behind record holders Noble Doss and Nathan Vasher. He is also tied for second on the single-season interceptions list after pulling seven his senior year. Gray finished his career fourth on the career fumble recoveries list and still stand eighth with six recoveries. Gray recorded 297 career tackles, 16 interceptions and 20 pass breakups during his time in Austin. After being selected as the 21st overall pick in the 1985 NFL Draft, Gray played with the Los Angeles Rams (1985-91), Houston Oilers (1992) and Tampa Bay Bucaneers (1993) during his professional career. He was also named Defensive Back of the Year in 1989. Gray broke into the coaching ranks in 1995 and is currently the defensive coordinator of the Tennessee Titans, a position he has held since 2011.

JOHNNIE JOHNSON (INDUCTED: 2007)

Defensive Back/1976-79

A versatile threat as a fierce tackler and punt returner, Texas' Johnnie Johnson set numerous Texas records during his four-year career and was twice named a consensus All-America ('78, '79). Hailing from LaGrange, Texas, Johnson earned recognition from the Downtown Athletic Club as the nation's top defensive back in 1978. He finished his career with 13 interceptions returned for 150 yards, 282 tackles and led a defense that surrendered an average of only nine points per game. Equally as impressive as his defensive accomplishments, Johnson accumulated over 1,000 career punt return yards and still owns the UT records for single season punt returns (44) and career punt returns (114). The three-time All-Southwest Conference pick currently ranks second all-time in school season return yards (538) and fourth in career return yards (1,004). Selected as the 17th overall pick in the 1980 NFL Draft, he spent 10 of his 11 years in the professional ranks with the Los Angeles Rams. He was also selected to the SWC All-Decade Team for the 1970s and to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1990.

DERRICK JOHNSON (INDUCTED: 2023)

Linebacker/2001-04

One of Texas Football's most-decorated defensive players in the program's long and storied history, Derrick Johnson was the winner of the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (nation's top defensive player) and Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker) as a senior at UT in 2004. He was a two-time consensus first-team All-American (2003-04), a two-time finalist and three-time semifinalist for the Butkus Award, as well as a finalist for the Bednarik Award (nation's top defensive player), Lombardi Award (nation's top lineman) and Lott Trophy (defensive player of the year) in 2004. He also finished 12th in the 2004 Heisman Trophy balloting and was listed among the top 10 finalists for the Walter Camp Football Foundation Player of the Year, the only defensive player in both of those groups. Johnson was a unanimous first-team All-American selection in 2004 and that year's Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, leading UT to an 11-1 record and a 38-37 victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl. He also was selected as the 2004 Big 12 Male Athlete of the Year. From 2001-04, Johnson played in 50 career games (40 starts) during a four-year stretch that saw the Horns win 11 games three times, at least 10 games all four years and post an overall record of 43-8 (27-5 Big 12). UT won three bowl games, finished in the top 12 nationally all four years and among the top six on three occasions. Johnson tallied 458 career tackles (No. 3 on UT's career list at the time), 280 solo tackles (No. 4), 65 tackles for loss (No. 1), 10.5 sacks, 39 QB pressures, 30 pass breakups (UT record for LBs), nine interceptions (UT record for LBs), 11 forced fumbles (T-No. 3) and five fumble recoveries. He started all 12 games as a senior and posted 130 tackles (73 solo), 19 TFLs and an NCAA-record nine caused fumbles. As a junior, he started all 13 games and recorded 125 tackles, 20 TFLs and four interceptions, tying his own UT record for linebackers. In 2002, Johnson started all 13 games and registered 120 tackles, 13 TFLs and picked off four passes – the first time he set the benchmark for Longhorn linebackers. Johnson played in all 13 games as a true freshman in 2001, including a pair of starts. He earned National Freshman of the Year and first-team Freshman All-America honors, as well as being named the Big 12 co-Defensive Freshman of the Year and the Defensive MVP of the Holiday Bowl.

MALCOLM KUTNER (INDUCTED: 1974)

End/1939-41

Malcolm Kutner, a star in the D.X. Bible era of UT football, was one of two All-Americans honored on the 1941 team, generally regarded as the best of its era and one of the best teams in school history. Kutner was a three-sport star at Texas, earning letters in football, basketball and track & field. However, his versatility as a football player, where his primary position was end, helped earn praise for Bible's innovative offense as "the best balanced, perhaps most versatile ever developed in the cow country, if not in the nation." In all, Kutner earned seven varsity letters: three in football, three in basketball and one in track — where he was a member of two Southwest Conference Champion relay teams. He was the first UT player chosen to compete in the Chicago Tribune's collegiate all-star game, matching an all-star team of just-finished collegians against the NFL champions. Kutner continued his playing as a member of the U.S. Armed Forces team during World War II. Following his service career, he played five years as a member of the Chicago Cardinals. As a pro, he was Rookie of the Year in 1946, made the All-Pro team in both 1947 and '48 and earned NFL Most Valuable Player honors in 1948. Kutner retired from the NFL following the 1950 season and entered the oil business in Texas. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1965.

BOBBY LAYNE (INDUCTED: 1968)

Quarterback/1944-47

It was his great friend Doak Walker who said of Bobby Layne, "Layne never lost a game ... time just ran out on him." Layne is generally regarded as the greatest quarterback in UT history. He was known as much for his free spirit approach to life as he was to the game he played. Recruited as a baseball pitcher, Layne was one of the best two-sport stars in school history. However, it would be in football that he would forever etch his name. He finished his UT career with a school-record 3,145 yards passing on 210 completions and 400 attempts. He was the Outstanding Back of the 1948 Sugar Bowl victory against No. 6 Alabama as a senior and was one of the first inductees into the Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame based on his incredible performance in the 1946 Classic win against Missouri. In the 40-27 victory, Layne accounted for every point, scoring four touchdowns, kicking four extra points and passing for the other two touchdowns. His brilliant 15-year professional career included leading the Detroit Lions to three league titles and twice being named the all-league quarterback during a his career (Detroit and Pittsburgh). He was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in 1967 and elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1963.

ROOSEVELT LEAKS (INDUCTED: 2005)

Running Back/1972-74

A tremendous running back and fearless pioneer, Roosevelt Leaks became the first black athlete to earn All-America and All-Conference honors for the Longhorns, forever changing the complexion of football at Texas and the Southwest Conference. Prior to suffering a serious knee injury that hampered his senior season, Leaks earned consensus first-team All-America honors in 1973 and finished third in the Heisman Trophy voting, the first and highest place of the three UT underclassmen to finish in the Top 10. A two-time first-team All-Conference selection, he was named Southwest Conference MVP in 1973, while setting the conference record for rushing yards (1,415). A team captain and MVP, Leaks guided the Longhorns to two conference titles. Drafted in the fifth round of the 1975 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Colts, Leaks enjoyed a nine-year professional career with the Colts and Buffalo Bills. A community-minded individual, Leaks hosts an annual charity golf tournament for children in East Austin. In 2003, he became the first recipient of the Living Legends Award presented by the Ministry of Challenge.

BUD MCFADIN (INDUCTED: 1983)

Guard/1948-50

From the tiny town of Iraan, Texas, Bud McFadin came to The University of Texas and became a two-time All-American offensive guard and defensive tackle and was named Most Valuable Player of the 1951 Cotton Bowl. In 1950, he helped lead UT to the Southwest Conference Championship and a No. 3 national ranking. He was named the Most Valuable Player of the SWC as a senior and was a first-round draft choice by the Los Angeles Rams of the National Football League. Prior to the start of his pro career, he was named MVP of the collegiate all-star game that matched top college players against the NFL champions. McFadin went on to play 11 seasons of professional football and was a five-time Pro Bowl selection. Along with the Rams, McFadin also starred at Denver and Houston, where he concluded his career. He is one of only two former Longhorns to appear as a Pro Bowl selection with two different teams — Los Angeles (1956-57) and Denver (1962-64). When he finished his NFL playing career, McFadin became a coach for the Oilers and spent five seasons tutoring the defensive line. After leaving coaching, McFadin turned to farming near Victoria, Texas. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1973.

BOB MCKAY (INDUCTED: 2017)

Offensive Line/1968-69

A consensus First Team All-American in 1969, McKay guided Texas to a perfect 11-0 season and the National Championship after defeating Notre Dame in the 1970 Cotton Bowl. He also helped the team to a No. 3 final ranking nationally in 1968 following a win over Tennessee in the 1969 Cotton Bowl. The 1969 All-Southwest Conference selection led the Longhorns to two conference championships. Behind McKay and the rest of the offensive line, the 1969 squad outscored opponents 435-119 while leading the FBS in rushing offense (363 yards per game) and scoring offense (33.8 points per game). With McKay in the starting lineup, Texas held an impressive 20-1-1 record and twice finished in the top three of the AP rankings. After his senior campaign, he played in the Coaches All-America Game and the Hula Bowl. McKay was drafted 21st overall by the Cleveland Browns in 1970 and spent nine seasons in the NFL with the Browns and New England Patriots. He would lead each franchise to two playoff appearances during his career.

STEVE MCMICHAEL (INDUCTED: 2009)

Defensive Tackle/1976-79

A four-year letterman from 1976-79, Steve McMichael was a member of the 1977 Southwest Conference Championship team. Twice selected All-Southwest Conference (1978-79), he graduated as the school's all-time leader in career tackles (369) and sacks (30). A finalist for the Lombardi and Outland Awards in 1979, McMichael claimed team and Hula Bowl MVP honors. During his time at Texas, the Longhorns posted an impressive 34-12-1 record. McMichael went on to be drafted in the third round of the 1980 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots. He signed with the Chicago Bears in 1981 and spent 13 seasons with the team, including six Central Division Championships and a victory in Super Bowl XX. McMichael retired as a five-time All-Pro selection and holds the Chicago Bears record for most consecutive games played (191). Following his playing career, McMichael became a pro wrestler, coached in the Continental Indoor Football League and commentated for the Chicago Bears. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1999.

TOMMY NOBIS (INDUCTED: 1981)

Linebacker, Guard/1963-65

Considered the finest linebacker in UT history, Tommy Nobis ranks as one of the greatest football players of all time. UT's famous No. 60 was a two-time All-American, made the All-Southwest Conference team three years and was the only sophomore starter on the Longhorns' 1963 National Championship team. The next year, he registered one of the most famous tackles in Orange Bowl history when he led his teammates on a fourth-and-inches stop of Joe Namath at the goal line to preserve UT's 21-17 victory against No. 1 Alabama. Darrell Royal called Nobis the best two-way lineman he ever coached, and in 1965, Sports Illustrated tagged him "the best defender in College Football." He went on to win the Outland Trophy and Maxwell Award as a senior. Nobis averaged nearly 20 tackles per game at UT, despite the effort of opponents to run away from him. He also was often the primary blocker for touchdown runs on teams that were ranked No. 1 in the nation at some point during each of his three years. A knee injury slowed the latter part of his senior season, but he went on to a successful 10-year career with the Atlanta Falcons. He was named to the NFL's All-1960s team and was selected to the Football News' alltime All-American team. As a member of the front office of the Falcons, Nobis' popularity and durability are evident by a career that has spanned 35 years with the Atlanta franchise. The San Antonio native was a first-round draft choice of the Falcons in 1966 and he was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1976.

DARRELL ROYAL (INDUCTED: 1983)

Head coach/1957-76

In December 1956, Darrell Royal came to Texas as one of the youngest head coaches in America, and for the next 20 years, he led the Longhorns to success that was unparalleled in Southwest Conference history. Royal's remarkable record included 11 teams that finished in the nation's Top 10 and three National Championships. He also registered 11 SWC titles, 16 bowl berths, 26 All-Americans and 77 All-SWC players. He also recorded unprecedented streaks, including a 30-game winning streak from 1968-70 and record run of six consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. Royal finished his career with a UT-record 167 victories, including 109 against league foes. His honors were numerous as well. Royal was tabbed Coach of the Year on numerous occasions, earned a spot in a number of halls of fame and was picked as coach of the decade in the 1960s. In the 10-year period from 1961-70, Royal's teams finished in the nation's Top Five seven times, including the three seasons at No. 1. Royal was not only a winner, but he also was recognized as one of the game's great innovators — simplifying offenses by flipping the offensive line and later installing the famed "Wishbone" offense, which he unveiled in 1968. After he retired in 1976, Royal continued to serve as UT's Athletics Director — a post he held beginning in 1964. Royal later was an assistant to the UT president, advising that office on matters pertaining to athletics. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1976.

JAMES SAXTON (INDUCTED: 1996)

Running back/1959-61

Tabbed the "quickest player in America" in 1961 by legendary Longhorns head coach Darrell Royal, James Saxton turned in one of the most spectacular seasons by a UT back that year. A first- team All-Southwest Conference back and the Longhorns MVP, he capped his career in spectacular fashion in 1961, eventually finishing third in the Heisman Trophy voting and earning the Texas Sports Writers Association Amateur Athlete of the Year award. While UT rolled to a 10-1 record and climbed as high as No. 1 nationally during his senior campaign, Saxton led the SWC in rushing with 846 yards on only 107 carries. He also scored nine touchdowns and led the Longhorns attack with breathtaking runs of 80, 79, 66, 56, 49 and 45 yards. Saxton set a UT single-game rushing record against SMU with 173 yards, and a week later, picked up 171 yards against Baylor. His 7.9 yards per carry average that year was the highest recorded in SWC history. The Palestine, Texas, native topped off his terrific year by helping UT upset No. 5 Mississippi 12-7 in the 1962 Cotton Bowl. His 73-yard punt on a quick kick in that game still stands as a UT bowl game record. Saxton helped the Longhorns to a 25-5 record during his three-year career. and he finished his career ranked third on the UT all-time rushing list with 1,524 yards. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1973.

HARLEY SEWELL (INDUCTED: 2000)

Guard/1950-52

Harley Sewell, who came from the tiny Texas town of St. Jo, was a first-team All-American two-way guard who helped UT to a 9-2 record in 1952 and was chosen defensive MVP in the 1953 Cotton Bowl victory against Tennessee. In that game, he led a UT defense that limited the Vols to six first downs and an amazing minus-14 yards rushing. A two-time All-Southwest Conference selection in 1951 and '52, Sewell was drafted in the first round (13th overall) by the Detroit Lions in 1953 and played for the Lions from 1953-62 before finishing his career with the Los Angeles Rams. In Detroit, Sewell teamed with fellow Texans Bobby Layne and Doak Walker to earn NFL championship rings in 1953 and '57 and was a four-time Pro Bowl selection. He was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1975.

KENNETH SIMS (INDUCTED: 2021)

Defensive tackle/1978-81

Sims arrived on the Forty Acres as a freshman in 1978 and was an impact performer at the heart of the Longhorns' defensive line for four seasons. In that time, the 6-6, 265-pound tackle recorded 322 tackles, 29 sacks, 50 tackles for loss, 15 forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and three blocked kicks. Sims' 15 career forced fumbles sstand as the most by a player in a school history, while his 29 sacks (fourth) and seven fumble recoveries (fifth) both rank among the top five among Longhorns all-time. His 50 career tackles for loss are ninth-best in school history. He earned consensus All-America and first-team All-Southwest Conference honors in each of his final two seasons at Texas, including unanimous first-team recognition as a senior. During his senior campaign in 1981 season, Sims was so dominant in an injury-shortened season that he became Texas' first Lombardi Trophy winner, and was also voted the UPI Lineman of the Year. UT's team captain, Sims finished eighth in the Heisman Trophy voting and received three firstplace votes in 1981. In addition, he joined Rowdy Gaines, Oliver Luck, Lynette Woodward and Par J Arvidsson in receiving the prestigious all sports NCAA Today's Top V Award in 1982, recognizing the nation's premier student-athletes for their efforts on the field, in the community and in the classroom. Sims was also named the Team MVP in his final two collegiate seasons, making him the first Longhorn since Chris Gilbert (1966-68) to earn that honor in consecutive seasons. Sims was selected by the New England Patriots with the first overall pick in the 1982 NFL Draft, playing eight seasons with the Patriots (1982-89), including the 1985 AFC Championship season when New England advanced to Super Bowl XX. Following his career with the Patriots, Sims was enshrined in the Texas Athletics Hall of Honor as part of the Class of 1997.

JERRY SISEMORE (INDUCTED: 2002)

Tackle/1970-72

One of the great offensive tackles of his era, Jerry Sisemore was a three-year letterwinner, a two-time consensus All-American (1971-72) and a team captain during one of the best three-year periods in the history of Texas football. In his three seasons, the Longhorns posted a 28-5 (.848) overall record, lost only one game in Southwest Conference play, won three consecutive league championships and played in three straight Cotton Bowls. As a sophomore, he helped lead UT to a 10-1 record and UT's third National Championship in school history. The 6-foot-4, 260-pounder also played in numerous all-star games following his outstanding career, including the Senior Bowl and Coaches All-America Game in 1973. Sisemore was selected in the first round of the 1973 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles with the third overall pick. He remained with the team for the duration of his 12-year career and was a two-time Pro Bowl selection (1980, '82). Sisemore appeared in the postseason four times and was inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1980.

MORTIMER (BUD) SPRAGUE (INDUCTED: 1970)

Tackle/1923-24

Mortimer "Bud" Sprague was only 16 when he came to Texas, but by his junior year, he was a 200-pound anchor in the middle of the defensive line on an undefeated UT team. The Longhorns posted a 20-5-2 record during his career and he was an All-Southwest Conference tackle but also doubled as a standout track athlete. Sprague excelled in the rare combination in track & field as a sprinter and shot putter. He won the SWC shot put title in 1925 and ran on the 440-yard relay team. After graduating from UT, he won the then-allowed privilege of continuing his college career by enrolling at West Point. There, his career blossomed. He was a vital member of Army's great teams of the late 1920s, a two-time All-American and captain of the 1928 team. Sprague had a distinguished career in the insurance business and was president of the New York Board of Trade and director of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1970 for his deeds at both Army and Texas and elected into the the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1993.

HARRISON STAFFORD (INDUCTED: 1975)

Halfback/1930-32

A walk-on from Wharton, Texas, Harrison Stafford went on to become perhaps the toughest football player in UT history. Statistics never told the story of Stafford, who was considered the finest blocking back in school annals. He also was an outstanding runner and receiver, but his fame was carved by his crushing blocks and devastating tackles. Stafford came to UT completely unannounced and volunteered for the freshman team where assistant coach Shorty Alderson worked him out and reported to head coach Clyde Littlefield, "Clyde, I found you the darndest football player you ever saw. He tore up a couple of dummies and hurt a couple of men. He says his name is Harrison Stafford." Stafford went on to earn All-Southwest Conference honors three times and was named to several All-America teams. A versatile person as well as an athlete, he also served as a member of the UT Student Assembly in 1931-32. A knee injury cut short his professional career and he returned to Texas and became a successful rancher. Stafford was elected to the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1959.

RICKY WILLIAMS (INDUCTED: 2015)

Running Back/1995-98

A two-time unanimous first-team All-American and the 1998 Heisman Trophy winner, Ricky Williams was a four-year starter for Texas (1995-98) who completed his career with 21 NCAA and 46 school records. He led Texas to the final SWC Championship (1995) and the first-ever Big 12 title (1996). Williams was a unanimous first-team All-American as a junior and senior, along with being a two-time Doak Walker Award winner as the nation's top running back. Additionally, he was named the Maxwell Award winner and was voted national player of the year by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Associated Press and Sporting News in 1998. The San Diego native was a three-time first-team All Big-12 choice and won back-to-back NCAA rushing titles in 1997 and 1998. He led the nation in scoring in 1997 and was a close second in 1998. When he finished his career at Texas, Williams' 6,279 rushing yards, 72 rushing TDs, 75 total TDs, 452 points, 33 games with a TD, 11 career 200-yard games, and 6.2 yards per carry were all NCAA all-time records. He also broke the NCAA all-purpose yardage record with 7,206 yards despite never returning a punt or kickoff. Williams eclipsed Tony Dorsett's more than twodecade-old NCAA rushing record with 259 yards in the Horns 26-24 regular season victory over Texas A&M in 1998. Williams was selected in the first round (fifth overall) in the 1999 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints and went on to play 12 seasons.

VINCE YOUNG (INDUCTED: 2019)

Ouarterback/2003-05

A consensus first-team All-American in 2005, Young was the runner-up for the Heisman Trophy while claiming the Davey O'Brien and Maxwell awards. That season, the unanimous Big 12 Player of the Year and first-team All-Big 12 selection led the Longhorns to a conference title and a perfect 13-0 season after winning the BCS National Championship Game against No. 1 USC in the 2006 Rose Bowl. The win capped a remarkable season that saw the team captain become the first player in FBS history with more than 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season. Young left Texas as the winningest quarterback in school history, compiling a 30-2 record (.938) as a starter, including victories in the final 20 games of his career. He completed 61.8 percent of his passes for 6,040 yards (No. 6 on UT's career list) and 44 TDs (No. 5 on UT's career list). He also posted 3,127 rushing yards and 37 TDs. Both his rushing yards and TDs are UT quarterback records, and stand fifth and fourth, respectively, among all Longhorn rushers. Young went on to be drafted third overall by the Tennessee Titans in 2006. He claimed NFL Rookie of the Year honors after taking over as the starting guarterback in Week 4 and leading the Titans to an 8-5 record. He earned a spot in the Pro Bowl, becoming the first rookie quarterback ever to play in that game. Young followed up his rookie year by leading the Titans to a playoff berth in 2007. He played five seasons in Tennessee, one with the Philadelphia Eagles and one with the Green Bay Packers. A member of the Longhorn Hall of Honor, his No. 10 jersey is one of only six retired by Texas, and he is also enshrined in the Rose Bowl, State of Texas Sports, and Texas High School Football halls of fame.

TEXAS AND THE NFL

The format of the NFL draft has changed many times since the brainchild of former NFL Commissioner and club owner Bert Bell was accepted by the league owners on May 19, 1935. The initial draft was held on Feb. 8, 1936, at the Ritz Carlton Hotel in Philadelphia. More than 80 years later, the draft has gone through stages of 10, 20 and 30-round affairs to the current seven-round event set each April. Through it all, The University of Texas has played a key role in the event. Including a record 17 players drafted in 1984, the Longhorns have had 337 players called on draft day and had at least one player selected in 76 consecutive drafts (1938-2013). Among those draft choices, 44 UT players have been selected in the first round with three of those former Longhorns — Kenneth Sims, 1982; Earl Campbell, 1978; Tommy Nobis, 1966 — earning the honor of being the first player selected overall.

Casey Hampton (Pittsburgh Steelers - 2006, '09, '11) and Malcom Brown (New England - 2017-19) have made the most Super Bowl appearances with three. Twelve former players have been on a pair of Super Bowl rosters, including Glenn Blackwood (Miami Dolphins - 1983, '85), Bobby Micho (Denver Broncos - 1987, '88), Dave Studdard (Denver - 1987, '88), Ray Woodard (Denver Broncos - 1987, '88), Terry Orr (Washington Redskins - 1988, '92), James Patton (Buffalo Bills - 1993, '94), Dan Neil (Denver Broncos - 1998, '99), David Thomas (New England Patriots - 2008; New Orleans Saints - 2010), Limas Sweed (Pittsburgh - 2009, '11), Tony Hills (Pittsburgh - 2009, '11), Aaron Ross (New York Giants - 2008, '12) and Earl Thomas (Seattle Seahawks - 2014-15).

Four Longhorns have claimed multiple titles: **Casey Hampton** (Pittsburgh Steelers - 2006, '09), **Dan Neil** (Denver Broncos - 1998-99), **Terry Orr** (Washington Redskins - 1988, '92) and **Aaron Ross** (New York Giants - 2008, '12).

There were a school record five former Longhorns in the 1986, 1988 and 2011 Super Bowls, and four in 1969, 1987, 2009 and 2013. There have been at least three Longhorns in the Super Bowl 10 times (1969, '86, '87, '88, '99, '06, '09, '11, '13, '14).

A Longhorn has appeared in 16 consecutive Super Bowls from 2006-2021, the longest stretch in UT history. The only other time at least one Longhorn made an appearance was a stretch spanning 1985 though 1995. There was a Longhorn on a school-record seven straight winning teams (2008-14).

Twenty-seven players have claimed Super Bowl Champion rings.

Sixty-one former Longhorns have made 78 total appearances on 53 different Super Bowl squads.

SUPER BOWL NOTABLES

- George Sauer caught eight passes for 133 yards to help the New York Jets to an upset win against the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl III (1969).
- Raul Allegre scored six points (21-yard FG; three PATs) in the New York Giants' 39-20 win against the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXI (1987).
- Justin Tucker tallied 10 points, including a pair of fourth-quarter field goals, to help the Baltimore Ravens hold off the San Francisco 49ers, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII (2013).
- Safety Earl Thomas made seven tackles, including a team-best six solo stops, in aiding the Seattle Seahawks in downing the Denver Broncos, 43-8, in Super Bowl XLVIII (2014).

BY THE NUMBERS

Earl Thomas has the most all-time appearances with seven, followed by Justin Tucker with six, then Earl Campbell, Casey Hampton, Bobby Layne, Bud McFadin and Tommy Nobis with five each, while Bobby Dillon, Doug English, Jerry Gray, Brian Orakpo, George Sauer, Harley Sewell, Jamaal Charles and Derrick Johnson each had four selections. Thomas, however, was unable to play in both the 2014 and 2015 Pro Bowls since the Seattle Seahawks were in the Super Bowl.

The Longhorns have had a Pro Bowl player selected in each of the last 22 seasons, the longest consecutive streak in school history. They have also had two separate streaks of nine years with a Pro Bowl player. The first was from 1952-60 and the second from 1967-75. UT also has had streaks of six years (1979-84), five years (1986-90), three years (1962-64) and two years (1993-94/99-2000). In 2020, the game was replaced with a virtual-only event due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Longhorns have had 45 different Pro Bowlers representing 24 teams who have made a total of 114 appearances.

PRO BOWL NOTABLES

- The first Longhorn player to reach the Pro Bowl was center Bill Hughes of the Chicago Bears in 1942. The most recent were Kansas City Chiefs linebacker Derrick Johnson and Seattle Seahawks safety Earl Thomas who were selected to the 2016 game.
- Since 1952, there have been only 11 years in which a former Longhorn was not selected to the Pro Bowl (1961, '65, '66, '76, '78, '85, '91, '92, '96, '98, 2001).
- The Longhorns had a record five players in the 2013 Pro Bowl Kansas City Chiefs running back Jamaal Charles and linebacker Derrick Johnson, Cleveland Browns place-kicker Phil Dawson, Seattle Seahawks safety Earl Thomas, and Chicago Bears defensive tackle Henry Melton. UT had four players in the Pro Bowl four times (1957, '68, '10, '14). Three players have represented UT eight times (1956, '82, '84, '87, '06, '07, '09, '11) and two former Horns have been selected 14 times (1958, '59, '63, '67, '69, '73, '74, '79, '80, '88, 2003, '04, '12, '15).
