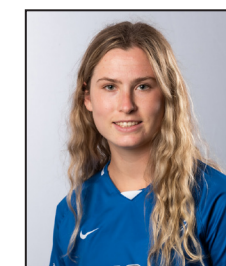

Shawn **BURKE**

Head Coach • Eighth Season • Mercyhurst '02

Career Head Coaching Record: 67-44-18

Shawn Burke enters his eighth season at the helm of the women's soccer program in 2021 after leading the squad to six straight MAC Tournament appearances. Burke guided the Bulls to their first ever MAC Championship in 2014. His .698 winning percentage through his first two seasons in Buffalo is the highest winning percentage through two seasons of any coach in UB women's soccer history.

In his seven seasons at the helm in Buffalo, the Bulls have produced an overall record of 67-44-18, including a 41-23-11 mark in league play. Burke has turned UB into a dominant home team as the Bulls own a 43-10-8 record at UB stadium under his guidance.

Individually, UB has produced 32 All-MAC selections and has placed 12 student-athletes on All-Region squads, highlighted by Marcy Barberic who became the first Bull to earn Second Team All-American honors and Jackie Hall who earned Third Team All-American honors in 2014.

Off the pitch, the Bulls have excelled in the classroom as UB has earned 55 All-MAC Academic selections, 11 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athletes, two COSIDA Academic All-District selections, a USC Scholar All-East Region First Team selection (Gurjeena Jandu) and an NSCAA Academic All-American (Jackie Hall).

Burke navigated the Bulls through an unprecedented 2020 spring season as UB went 6-1-1, including ending the season on a seven-game unbeaten streak. Buffalo scored 17 goals and finished with a final RPI of 37 while recording a 0.63 goals against average and a program-best .813 winning percentage. The Bulls received several individual recognitions including a historic Second Team All-American honor for Marcy Barberic as well as three All-Midwest region selections and a league-best five All-MAC recognitions, highlighted by the Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. UB also placed nine student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

The 2019 Bulls compiled a 9-8-3 overall record and a 5-4-2 conference mark and advanced to the MAC semifinals for the first time since 2015, before falling to eventual champion Bowling Green. The Bulls scored 33 goals off the feet of a MAC-best 15 different players. Three UB players earned All-MAC honors as defender Gurjeena Jandu earned First Team honors, junior Marcy Barberic earned Second Team honors and Leah Wengender earned a spot on the All-Freshman team. The Bulls also placed a program-record 10 student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC squad and Jandu was named to the United Soccer Coaches Scholar All-East Region First Team.

Burke made a lasting imprint on the UB women's soccer program as he led the squad to a regular season MAC Championship, first-ever MAC Tournament Championship and first-ever NCAA appearance in 2014. The Bulls broke many school records including shut-outs in a season (14) and unbeaten streak (14). The defensive-minded Bulls finished the historic season with an 11-0-1 home record, breaking the program record for home wins and recording the first unbeaten home mark since 1995.

For his efforts, Burke was awarded the MAC Coach of the Year award and All-Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year after leading his team to a program-best 16-3-3 overall record to go along with a perfect 9-0-2 MAC record, just the third unbeaten MAC regular season in conference history.

Burke finished the 2014 campaign tied for the NCAA lead in wins (16) for a first-year head coach and he had the highest winning percentage (.833) out of all first-year head coaches in the country. He helped the Bulls earn a sweep in all MAC major awards following the season as UB won Offensive Player of the Year (Katie Roberts), Defensive Player of the Year (Jackie Hall), Freshman of the Year (Laura Dougall) and Coach of the Year (Burke). The 2014 UB Bulls became the first program in MAC history to sweep all four major awards.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Buffalo, Burke served five years as assistant coach, with his tenure highlighted by his first recruiting class in 2011 which helped the Bulls jump 200 spots in the RPI rankings from the previous season, the biggest jump of any team in the country, and resulted in a MAC semifinal appearance.

Burke was a standout player at Mercyhurst College from 1998-2002, winning five straight GLIAC Championships. In 2002, Burke was named Great Lakes Conference Defensive Player of the year. He was also a three-time first-team All-Conference and two-time All-Region player selection. In his final year of play at Mercyhurst, Burke helped lead the Lakers to the Division II Final Four and the school's first and only #1 national ranking.

Burke graduated from Mercyhurst in 2002 with a degree in elementary education and graduated in May of 2013 with his Master's degree in Higher Education Administration from the University at Buffalo.

He holds a USSF "A" license as well as a US Soccer National Goalkeeping. Burke also holds a National Youth License.

Burke currently resides in Amherst with his wife Taylor, daughter Henley and son Kai.

Casey DERKACZ

Associate Head Coach • Seventh Season • Buffalo '11

Casey Derkacz enters his seventh season with the Bulls and his fourth year as Associate Head Coach for the University at Buffalo women's soccer program. His main responsibilities are recruiting, on field coaching and academic liaison for the student-athletes.

In an unprecedented 2020 spring season Derkacz led Buffalo to a 6-1-1 overall record, including ending the season on a seven-game unbeaten streak. The Bulls received several individual recognitions including a historic Second Team All-American honor for Marcy Barberic as well as three All-Midwest region selections and a league-best five All-MAC recognitions, highlighted by the Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. UB also placed nine student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

Derkacz helped lead the Bulls to a 9-8-3 overall record and a 5-4-2 conference mark in 2019 as UB made their sixth straight MAC Tournament appearance and advanced to the semifinals for the first time since 2015. The Bulls fell to eventual champion Bowling Green 2-1 in the semifinals. Three UB players earned All-MAC honors and the Bulls also placed a program-record 10 student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC squad, while Jandu was named to the United Soccer Coaches Scholar All-East Region First Team.

Derkacz helped lead the Bulls to an 11-8 overall record and a 5-7 conference mark in 2018 as UB qualified for their fifth straight MAC Tournament. The Bulls lost 2-1 to Ball State in double overtime in the MAC quarterfinals. Four UB players earned All-MAC honors, including forward Carissima Cutrona who earned First Team honors and defender Gurjeena Jandu who was placed on the Second Team. The Bulls also placed seven players on the Academic All-MAC squad and Cutrona was named a MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete.

The 2017 campaign for the Bulls ended with a fourth straight trip to the MAC Tournament but UB wasn't able to advance as they were upended by Bowling Green in the MAC quarterfinals. Buffalo closed out their season with a 7-9-3 record and a 5-4-2 MAC mark while five UB players earned All-MAC honors including defender Gurjeena Jandu who earned First Team honors and goalkeeper Laura Dougall who was placed on the Second Team. The Bulls were also able to place seven players on the Academic All-MAC squad and two as MAC Distinguished Scholar Athletes.

Derkacz helped UB earn a 7-8-5 overall record and a 4-4-3 MAC mark during the 2016 campaign as UB was able to qualify for their third straight MAC Tournament but were dropped in the quarterfinals 1-0 by Central Michigan. The Hamburg native helped a pair of defenders earn All-MAC honors as Angel Hart earned the Second Team All-MAC nod and freshman centerback Gurjeena Jandu was placed on the All-Freshman squad after a strong campaign.

In 2015, Derkacz helped lead the Bulls to their second straight MAC semifinal match as he helped train the goalkeepers and backline all season long. The Bulls defense continued to perform at a high level as they allowed just 0.86 goals against per game while notching eight cleansheets on the season.

Derkacz had a pair of players earn All-MAC honors as senior centerback Jackie Hall collected first team All-MAC recognition for the second consecutive season while freshman leftback Brianna Shingary earned All-Freshman team honors after a huge season on the backline. Senior Kristin Markiewicz also earned MAC All-Tournament team honors after a strong MAC Tournament, moving to centerback midway through the season under Derkacz's watchful eye.

As the teams academic liaison, Derkacz saw a program record seven student-athletes earn Academic All-MAC accolades during the 2015 campaign including four, Cassidy Kidd, Jackie Hall, Julia Benati and Andrea Niper, who were named to the inaugural MAC Distinguished Scholar Athletes list. The four honorees on the MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete list were the most amongst all MAC schools. As a team, the Bulls collected a 3.299 cumulative GPA for the spring semester.

The Western New York native had a hand in just about everything that helped the 2014 team be the most successful in program history as he worked closely with the goalkeepers as well as the forwards. Derkacz also serves as the Bulls recruiting coordinator and academic liaison.

Derkacz helped Laura Dougall turn in one of the greatest goalkeeping seasons in MAC history in her freshman campaign as she earned a 16-1-3 overall record to go along with a goals-against average of 0.38 and a save percentage of .908, which ranks third in the NCAA. Offensively, Derkacz helped develop Katie Roberts into the MAC Offensive Player of the Year with a MAC-high 11 goals, after a junior campaign that saw her score



just two goals. Celina Carrero also turned into a star offensively, finishing with six goals and seven assists after a freshman campaign that produced no points. The UB offense improved drastically as they scored 32 goals this, up from 13 in 2013.

Off the field, Derkacz helped lead UB to new heights in the classroom as the team had the highest combined GPA (3.412) out of all 20 sports at Buffalo. Under Derkacz's tutelage, the Bulls had three athletes produce a perfect 4.0 while 15 had over a 3.0 GPA for the spring semester of 2014.

Derkacz helped lead Slippery Rock to two straight NCAA Tournaments, a Sweet 16 appearance in 2012 and an Elite 8 appearance in 2013. The Rock earned the PSAC Championship in his first season with the team and they won the Atlantic Region title in 2013. Over his two year's at Slippery Rock, Derkacz guided The Rock to a 29-10-5 record while helping them finish the 2013 season ranked No. 6 in the Division II national poll.

Prior to Slippery Rock, he helped guide the Penn State Behrend men's and women's teams to NCAA Division III tournament berths and Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference championships.

For his playing career, Derkacz appeared in 64 games and made 49 starts as a midfielder for Penn State and UB. He led the University at Buffalo in assists during his senior year and helped the team reach the conference semifinals. On top of his playing accolades, Derkacz was an exceptional student, earning Academic All-Big 10 honors at Penn State and MAC Academic All-Conference honors at UB.

A native of Hamburg, N.Y., Derkacz has also been involved with coaching various club teams since 2009.



Brianne CASEY

Assistant Coach • Third Season • Central Connecticut '16

Brianne Casey enters her third season with the Bulls after being hired by head coach Shawn Burke in June of 2019.

Casey helped guide the Bulls to a 6-1-1 record in an unprecedented 2020 spring season. Under her guidance, junior Emily Kelly continued to excel in net, recording four shutouts, a 0.61 goals against average, 28 saves and a .848 save percentage. Buffalo ended the season on a seven-game unbeaten streak, set a program-record with a .813 winning percentage and had a league-best five players recognized on All-MAC teams.

In her first season in Buffalo she helped guide the Bulls to a 9-8-3 overall record and a 5-4-2 conference mark in 2019. She worked primarily with the UB goalkeepers, including sophomore Emily Kelly who was a mainstay between the pipes for the Bulls, compiling a 9-8-3 overall record with a 1.06 goals against average, 87 saves, a .798 save percentage and four shutouts in 20 starts for the Bulls. Buffalo made their sixth straight MAC Tournament appearance and advanced to the semifinals for the first time since 2015.

Casey spent two seasons on the coaching staff at Southern Connecticut where her responsibilities included developing the goalkeepers, recruiting, implementing team training sessions, compiling scouting reports and organizing the team's travel schedule, clinics and fundraising events.

A native of Columbia, CT, Casey joined the Owls for her final season of eligibility in 2016 and tallied four points. Along the way, she was a multiple selection to the NE10 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Prior to SCSU, Casey played collegiately and completed her undergraduate work at Central Connecticut State University. She was a four-time selection to the Northeast Conference All-Academic Team, a President's List selection and Dean's List honoree. Casey helped Blue Devils to one NEC title and one NCAA Tournament berth.

A Lyman Memorial High School graduate, Casey the Bulldogs in scoring three times and was a three-time Team MVP. A three-time All-State and All-Conference selection, Casey is the ECC Conference's record holder for assists.

Casey holds a National D license from U.S. Soccer the Advanced National Diploma from United Soccer Coaches. She currently coaches with the Western New York Flash and has additional coaching experience with the CFC Sound Football Club and the Connecticut Soccer School.

With a returning core that featured two-time All-MAC all-star and Buffalo's all-time leading scorer in Paula Listrani and fellow All-MAC performers in defender Linnea DiNallo, midfielder Elizabeth Pfeffer and goalkeeper Jaime Adams, the Bulls were already a formidable team.

The freshmen class, featuring Nicole Olszewski and Emily Russell, teamed with Listrani to form a potent offense, and Devon Russell teamed with DiNallo to make one of the league's stingiest defenses.

The Bulls started off the season with a 7-1 defeat of Canisius as they won their first three games, including a 4-1 win at Niagara.

Buffalo dropped its next two contests, non-conference games against Syracuse and Rutgers, but downed Kent State, 4-2, in the MAC opener on Sept. 13, with freshman Olszewski scoring twice in the effort.

Nine days later, the Bulls lost to Ohio, 2-1, but shook that off, and proceeded to win five straight, with Listrani scoring a goal in double overtime at conference front-runner Western Michigan on October 8. She set the school's all-time points record.

The team continued to roll behind Listrani, who scored in four-straight games at one point in the year. The Bulls heading into the final weekend with a slim one-game lead in the conference standings. A 1-1 tie with Bowling Green on Oct. 20 kept them in first after Miami (OH) lost a game and the Bulls clinched the title with a 3-1 win against Toledo on Oct. 22.

Although the Bulls lost to Miami (OH) in the semifinals of the MAC Tournament, Buffalo had left its mark as a perennial conference contender, with then head coach Jean-A. Tassy earning the MAC Coach of the Year

2014: A YEAR TO REMEMBER

BULLS BRING HOME SCHOOL'S FIRST MAC TOURNAMENT TITLE AND NCAA APPEARANCE



2014 was a special year for the UB Women's Soccer program as the Bulls clinched their first-ever MAC Tournament Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first-time in program history.

The season started out just as good as anyone could have hoped for as the Bulls won four of their first five games. UB was able to earn five straight shutouts over the streak while compiling a 4-0-1 record. The Bulls first loss of the season came against nationally-ranked Virginia Tech without starting keeper Laura Dougall. With the Hookies first goal of the game UB's program record shutout streak of 482 minutes came to an end.

After another loss next time out to Cornell, 3-2, the Bulls began to play their best soccer of the season as they closed out the regular season with an 11-game unbeaten streak (9-0-2) while claiming the MAC Regular Season Championship with a conference mark of 9-0-2, just the third unbeaten MAC season in conference history. UB also finished off their first unbeaten home season in program history, going 8-0-1 at UB Stadium.

After clinching the regular season title UB entered the MAC Tournament as the #1 seed and didn't disappoint as the hosts. In the opening round UB dominated Toledo, winning 2-0. In the semifinals Andrea Niper scored a double overtime rocket of a goal from 30-yards out to move UB onto the Championship game against Western Michigan.

In the MAC Championship game, junior defender Jackie Hall scored in the 82nd minute to give UB their first-ever title and giving the program their first NCAA Tournament berth. The Bulls drew top-seeded Penn State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and fell on the road by the score of 4-1 despite a valiant effort after losing All-American Jackie Hall to injury late in the first half.

UB's magical season was capped with the Bulls collecting all four major MAC awards, becoming the first team in MAC history to sweep the regular season awards. Katie Roberts earned MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jackie Hall was MAC Defensive Player of the Year, Laura Dougall was MAC Freshman of the Year and first-year head coach Shawn Burke was named MAC Coach of the Year.

Nov. 5, 2002: A DAY TO REMEMBER BULLS AWARDED WITH NCAA SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

UB Women's soccer team, through the character of their actions following the events of Nov. 5, 2002, was awarded with the Citizenship Through Sports NCAA Award on June 15, 2003.

It was on that day that tragedy struck the Bowling Green women's soccer team as one of its players, Leslie Dawley, collapsed and died on the field in the first round of the Mid-American Conference Championship Game. The game was halted and resumed the following day with the host Falcons winning 2-1 in double-overtime. However, it was the actions of then head coach Jean-A. Tassy and the UB women's soccer team on that day that moved Bowling Green to nominate Buffalo for the award.

Prior to the start of the game, UB chose to warm up on an adjacent practice field. The team did not want to disturb the area where Dawley had collapsed less than 20 hours earlier and wanted to give Bowling Green some time to reflect as a team. During player introductions, each UB player handed a single yellow rose to their counterpart, exchanging hugs and tears. Following the introductions, the teams joined hands in a circle in the middle of the field for a moment of silence to honor Dawley.

In an excerpt from the nomination letter, Bowling Green representatives wrote: "Everyone that was involved with the events of November 5th and 6th at Bowling Green State University will not soon forget the character and sportsmanship that was displayed by the University at Buffalo's Women's Soccer Team and Coaching Staff. It is this type of character and sportsmanship that makes collegiate athletics so great. These acts of compassion by the Buffalo players and coaching staff were not lost on the more than 700 fans that filled the stands that day and a number were heard to comment that they had never witnessed such sportsmanship."



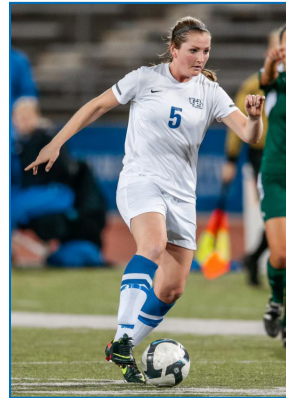

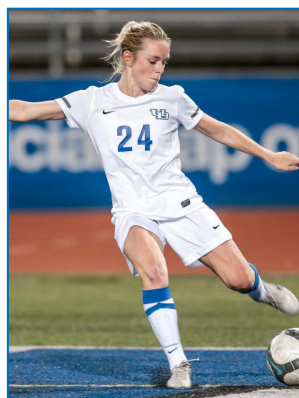

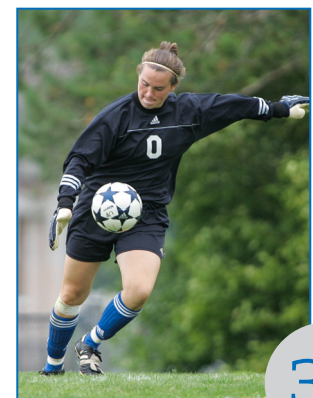
