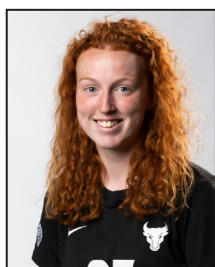

Shawn **BURKE**

Head Coach • Ninth Season • Mercyhurst '02

Career Head Coaching Record: 80-48-21

Shawn Burke enters his ninth season at the helm of the women's soccer program in 2022 after leading the squad to seven straight MAC Tournament appearances and 80 career wins. In his eight seasons at the helm in Buffalo, the Bulls have produced an overall record of 80-48-21, including a 47-25-14 mark in league play. Burke has turned UB into a dominant home team as the Bulls own a 49-11-10 record at UB stadium under his guidance.

Individually, UB has produced 36 All-MAC selections and has placed 15 student-athletes on All-Region squads. Burke has also produced the first two Division 1 All-Americans in program history, Marcy Barberic Second Team All-America and Jackie Hall who earned Third Team All-America honors in 2014. UB has also seen 5 players awarded MAC Player of the Year during his tenor.

Off the pitch, the Bulls have excelled in the classroom as UB has earned 65 All-MAC Academic selections, 11 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athletes, two COSIDA Academic All-District selections, five Scholar All-Region selections and two NSCAA Academic All-Americans (Jackie Hall, Gurjeena Jandu).

In 2021, Burke guided the Bulls to a 13-4-3 record and their second straight appearance in the MAC Tournament semifinals. UB recorded 34 goals on the year, good for second-best in the Burke era. The Bulls received several individual recognitions, highlighted by Barberic earning a spot on the prestigious MAC Hermann Trophy Award Watch List. Four Bulls earned All-MAC recognition and a trio of Bulls were named to United Soccer Coaches All-Midwest Region teams. UB placed a program-record 12 student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

Burke navigated the Bulls through an unprecedented 2020 spring season as UB went 6-1-1, including ending the season on a seven-game unbeaten streak. Buffalo scored 17 goals and finished with a final RPI of 37 while recording a 0.63 goals against average and a program-best .813 winning percentage. The Bulls received several individual recognitions including a historic Second Team All-American honor for Marcy Barberic as well as three All-Midwest region selections and a league-best five All-MAC recognitions, highlighted by the Offensive (Barberic) and Defensive (Hannah Callaghan) Players of the Year. UB also placed nine student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

Burke made a lasting imprint on the UB women's soccer program as he led the squad to a regular season MAC Championship, first-ever MAC Tournament Championship and first-ever NCAA appearance in 2014. The Bulls broke many school records including shutouts in a season (14) and unbeaten streak (14). The defensive-minded Bulls finished the historic season with an 11-0-1 home record, breaking the program record for home wins and recording the first unbeaten home mark since 1995.

For his efforts, Burke was awarded the MAC Coach of the Year award and All-Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year after leading his team to a program-best 16-3-3 overall record to go along with a perfect 9-0-2 MAC record, just the third unbeaten MAC regular season in conference history.

Burke finished the 2014 campaign tied for the NCAA lead in wins (16) for a first-year head coach and he had the highest winning percentage (.833) out of all first-year head coaches in the country. He helped the Bulls earn a sweep in all MAC major awards following the season as UB won Offensive Player of the Year (Katie Roberts), Defensive Player of the Year (Jackie Hall), Freshman of the Year (Laura Dougall) and Coach of the Year (Burke). The 2014 UB Bulls became the first program in MAC history to sweep all four major awards.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Buffalo, Burke served five years as assistant coach, with his tenure highlighted by his first recruiting class in 2011 which helped the Bulls jump 200 spots in the RPI rankings from the previous season, the biggest jump of any team in the country, and resulted in a MAC semifinal appearance.

Burke was a standout player at Mercyhurst College from 1998-2002, winning five straight GLIAC Championships. In 2002, Burke was named Great Lakes Conference Defensive Player of the year. He was also a three-time first-team All-Conference and two-time All-Region player selection. In his final year of play at Mercyhurst, Burke helped lead the Lakers to the Division II Final Four and the school's first and only #1 national ranking.

Burke graduated from Mercyhurst in 2002 with a degree in elementary education and graduated in May of 2013 with his Master's degree in Higher Education Administration from the University at Buffalo.

He holds a USSF "A" license as well as a US Soccer National Goalkeeping. Burke also holds a National Youth License.

Burke currently resides in Amherst with his wife Taylor, daughter Henley and son Kai.

Casey **DERKACZ**

Associate Head Coach • Eighth Season • Buffalo '11

Casey Derkacz enters his ninth season with the Bulls and his fifth year as Associate Head Coach for the University at Buffalo women's soccer program. Derkacz is also responsible for alumni outreach, fundraising, budgeting and serves as the academic liaison.

In Derkacz's eight seasons in Buffalo, the Bulls have qualified for the Mid-American Conference Tournament in seven straight seasons and have averaged 10 wins per season in that span, the only MAC school to accomplish that feat. Under his guidance, UB has had two USC/NSCAA All-American selections, 15 USC/NSCAA All-Region selections and 38 All-MAC honorees. Buffalo has received two MAC Offensive Players of the Year and two MAC Defensive Players of the Year awards, highlighted by sweeping the individual conference awards in 2014, a first in MAC women's soccer history.

The Bulls were back-to-back MAC East Champions in 2014 and 2015 for the first time in program history and won the MAC regular season and MAC Tournament titles, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history, in 2014.

Derkacz has led Buffalo to success off the pitch as well, as UB has had two USC/NSCAA Scholar All-Americans, four USC/NSCAA Scholar All-Region recipients and 67 Academic All-MAC selections. The Bulls are six-time United Soccer Coaches Academic Team Award recipients and earned the "Bulls Pride" Team Award for Distinguished Community Service and School Spirit.

In 2021, Derkacz helped guide the Bulls to a 13-4-3 record and their second straight appearance in the MAC Tournament semifinals. UB recorded 34 goals on the year, good for second-best in Derkacz's tenure. The Bulls received several individual recognitions, highlighted by Marcy Barberic earning a spot on the prestigious MAC Hermann Trophy Award Watch List. Four Bulls earned All-MAC recognition and a trio of Bulls were named to United Soccer Coaches All-Midwest Region teams. UB placed a program-record 12 student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

In an unprecedented 2020 spring season Derkacz led Buffalo to a 6-1-1 overall record, including ending the season on a seven-game unbeaten streak. The Bulls received several individual recognitions including a historic Second Team All-American honor for Marcy Barberic as well as three All-Midwest region selections and a league-best five All-MAC recognitions, highlighted by the Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. UB also placed nine student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

The Western New York native had a hand in just about everything that helped the 2014 team be the most successful in program history as he worked closely with the goalkeepers as well as the forwards.

Derkacz helped Laura Dougall turn in one of the greatest goalkeeping seasons in MAC history in her freshman campaign as she earned MAC Freshman of the Year honors. The Bulls also recorded the highest shutout total in program history with 14 on the year.

Offensively, Derkacz helped develop Katie Roberts into the MAC Offensive Player of the Year as she scored a MAC-best 11 goals. The UB offense improved drastically as they scored 33 goals, good for second in program history. The Bulls finished with an 11-0-2 record in conference play, becoming just the third undefeated team in MAC history, while also setting a program record for win totals, finishing with a 16-3-3 overall record. UB received votes in the NSCAA Top 25 poll and finished with the highest RPI in program history (32).

Prior to arriving in Buffalo, Derkacz helped lead Slippery Rock to two straight NCAA Tournaments, a Sweet 16 appearance in 2012 and an Elite 8 appearance in 2013. The Rock earned the PSAC Championship in his first season with the team and they won the Atlantic Region



title in 2013. Over his two years at Slippery Rock, Derkacz guided The Rock to a 29-10-5 record while helping them finish the 2013 season ranked No. 6 in the Division II national poll.

Before Slippery Rock, he helped guide the Penn State Behrend men's and women's teams to NCAA Division III tournament berths and Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference championships while receiving a master's in business administration from Penn State Behrend.

Derkacz played collegiately at Penn State and UB. Derkacz and his wife Danielle, both Hamburg, NY natives, currently reside in Buffalo.



Brianne **CASEY**

Assistant Coach • Fourth Season • Central Connecticut '16

Brianne Casey enters her fourth season with the Bulls after being hired by head coach Shawn Burke in June of 2019.

In 2021, Casey guided the Bulls to a 13-4-3 record and their second straight appearance in the MAC Tournament semifinals. Under her watchful eye, senior Emily Kelly continued to be a force for UB between the pipes as recorded a 13-4-3 overall record, seven shutouts, 28 saves, a 0.97 goals against average and a .759 save percentage. As a whole, the UB defense recorded eight clean sheets and a goals against average of 0.96. The Bulls received several individual recognitions as four Bulls earned All-MAC recognition and a trio of Bulls were named to United Soccer Coaches All-Midwest Region teams. UB placed a program-record 12 student-athletes on the Academic All-MAC team.

Casey helped guide the Bulls to a 6-1-1 record in an unprecedented 2020 spring season. Under her guidance, junior Emily Kelly continued to excel in net, recording four shutouts, a 0.61 goals against average, 28 saves and a .848 save percentage. Buffalo ended the season on a seven-game unbeaten streak, set a program-record with a .813 winning percentage and had a league-best five players recognized on All-MAC teams.

In her first season in Buffalo she helped guide the Bulls to a 9-8-3 overall record and a 5-4-2 conference mark in 2019. She worked primarily with the UB goalkeepers, including sophomore Emily Kelly who was a mainstay between the pipes for the Bulls, compiling a 9-8-3 overall record with a 1.06 goals against average, 87 saves, a .798 save percentage and four shutouts in 20 starts for the Bulls. Buffalo made their sixth straight MAC Tournament appearance and advanced to the semifinals for the first time since 2015.

Casey spent two seasons on the coaching staff at Southern Connecticut where her responsibilities included developing the goalkeepers, recruiting, implementing team training sessions, compiling scouting reports and organizing the team's travel schedule, clinics and fund-raising events.

A native of Columbia, CT, Casey joined the Owls for her final season of eligibility in 2016 and tallied four points. Along the way, she was a multiple selection to the NE10 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Prior to SCSU, Casey played collegiately and completed her undergraduate work at Central Connecticut State University. She was a four-time selection to the Northeast Conference All-Academic Team, a President's List selection and Dean's List honoree. Casey helped Blue Devils to one NEC title and one NCAA Tournament berth.

A Lyman Memorial High School graduate, Casey the Bulldogs in scoring three times and was a three-time Team MVP. A three-time All-State and All-Conference selection, Casey is the ECC Conference's record holder for assists.

Casey holds a National D license from U.S. Soccer the Advanced National Diploma from United Soccer Coaches. She currently coaches with the Western New York Flash and has additional coaching experience with the CFC Sound Football Club and the Connecticut Soccer School.

2021: One of four Bulls to appear and start in all 20 games for the Bulls... recorded a 13-4-3 overall record, seven shutouts, 28 saves, a 0.97 goals against average and a .759 save percentage... recorded a career-high 11 saves in a draw with Kent State (9/26)... Earned Academic All-MAC honors for the third time in her career.

2020: One of five Bulls to start all eight games as a junior... Named First Team All-MAC... Was a force between the pipes for UB, compiling a 6-1-1 overall record with four shutouts, 28 saves, a .061 goals against average and a .848 save percentage... Recorded a season-high six saves in a win over Ohio (3/21)... Earned Academic All-MAC honors for the second time in her career.

2019: One of six Bulls to start all 20 games during her sophomore campaign... Was a mainstay between the pipes for the Bulls, compiling a 9-8-3 overall record with a 1.06 goals against average, 87 saves, a .798 save percentage and four shutouts... Recorded a career-high 11 saves at Oregon (9/22)... Had nine games with five or more saves... Earned Academic All-MAC honors for the first time in her career.

2018: Made an immediate impact in her first season in Buffalo, starting all 19 games between the pipes for the Bulls... Named to the All-MAC Freshman Team... Finished the season with an 11-8 record to go along with a 1.52 goals against average and .759 save percentage... Notched seven shutouts while making 88 saves on the season... Recorded a season high nine saves in a 2-0 win at Cornell (8/31)... Notched three straight shutouts in wins at Youngstown State (8/24), Cornell (8/31) and Albany (9/2)... Had 10 games with five or more saves.

High School: Kelly comes to Buffalo after turning into one of the best goalkeepers in western New York as she played varsity soccer for four seasons at Wilson high school under head coach TJ Baia. Kelly closed out her prestigious high school career earning All-New York State honors twice while also leading her squad to the Sectional finals during her junior and senior campaigns. 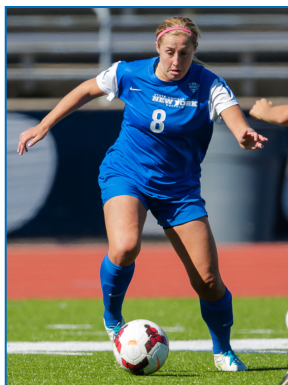

With a returning core that featured two-time All-MAC all-star and Buffalo's all-time leading scorer in Paula Listrani and fellow All-MAC performers in defender Linnea DiNallo, midfielder Elizabeth Pfeffer and goalkeeper Jaime Adams, the Bulls were already a formidable team.

The freshmen class, featuring Nicole Olszewski and Emily Russell, teamed with Listrani to form a potent offense, and Devon Russell teamed with DiNallo to make one of the league's stingiest defenses.

The Bulls started off the season with a 7-1 defeat of Canisius as they won their first three games, including a 4-1 win at Niagara.

Buffalo dropped its next two contests, non-conference games against Syracuse and Rutgers, but downed Kent State, 4-2, in the MAC opener on Sept. 13, with freshman Olszewski scoring twice in the effort.

Nine days later, the Bulls lost to Ohio, 2-1, but shook that off, and proceeded to win five straight, with Listrani scoring a goal in double overtime at conference front-runner Western Michigan on October 8. She set the school's all-time points record.

The team continued to roll behind Listrani, who scored in four-straight games at one point in the year. The Bulls heading into the final weekend with a slim one-game lead in the conference standings. A 1-1 tie with Bowling Green on Oct. 20 kept them in first after Miami (OH) lost a game and the Bulls clinched the title with a 3-1 win against Toledo on Oct. 22.

Although the Bulls lost to Miami (OH) in the semifinals of the MAC Tournament, Buffalo had left its mark as a perennial conference contender, with then head coach Jean-A. Tassy earning the MAC Coach of the Year



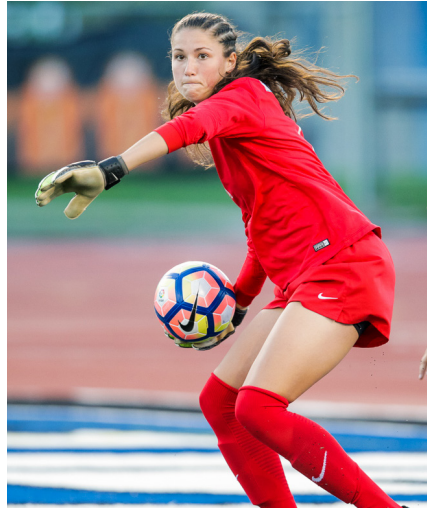

2014: A YEAR TO REMEMBER

BULLS BRING HOME SCHOOL'S FIRST MAC TOURNAMENT TITLE AND NCAA APPEARANCE



2014 was a special year for the UB Women's Soccer program as the Bulls clinched their first-ever MAC Tournament Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first-time in program history.

The season started out just as good as anyone could have hoped for as the Bulls won four of their first five games. UB was able to earn five straight shutouts over the streak while compiling a 4-0-1 record. The Bulls first loss of the season came against nationally-ranked Virginia Tech without starting keeper Laura Dougall. With the Hookies first goal of the game UB's program record shutout streak of 482 minutes came to an end.

After another loss next time out to Cornell, 3-2, the Bulls began to play their best soccer of the season as they closed out the regular season with an 11-game unbeaten streak (9-0-2) while claiming the MAC Regular Season Championship with a conference mark of 9-0-2, just the third unbeaten MAC season in conference history. UB also finished off their first unbeaten home season in program history, going 8-0-1 at UB Stadium.

After clinching the regular season title UB entered the MAC Tournament as the #1 seed and didn't disappoint as the hosts. In the opening round UB dominated Toledo, winning 2-0. In the semifinals Andrea Niper scored a double overtime rocket of a goal from 30-yards out to move UB onto the Championship game against Western Michigan.

In the MAC Championship game, junior defender Jackie Hall scored in the 82nd minute to give UB their first-ever title and giving the program their first NCAA Tournament berth. The Bulls drew top-seeded Penn State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and fell on the road by the score of 4-1 despite a valiant effort after losing All-American Jackie Hall to injury late in the first half.

UB's magical season was capped with the Bulls collecting all four major MAC awards, becoming the first team in MAC history to sweep the regular season awards. Katie Roberts earned MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jackie Hall was MAC Defensive Player of the Year, Laura Dougall was MAC Freshman of the Year and first-year head coach Shawn Burke was named MAC Coach of the Year.

Nov. 5, 2002: A DAY TO REMEMBER BULLS AWARDED WITH NCAA SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

UB Women's soccer team, through the character of their actions following the events of Nov. 5, 2002, was awarded with the Citizenship Through Sports NCAA Award on June 15, 2003.

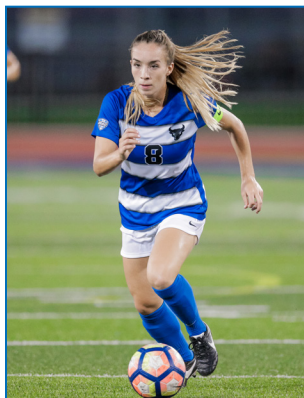
It was on that day that tragedy struck the Bowling Green women's soccer team as one of its players, Leslie Dawley, collapsed and died on the field in the first round of the Mid-American Conference Championship Game. The game was halted and resumed the following day with the host Falcons winning 2-1 in double-overtime. However, it was the actions of then head coach Jean-A. Tassy and the UB women's soccer team on that day that moved Bowling Green to nominate Buffalo for the award.

Prior to the start of the game, UB chose to warm up on an adjacent practice field. The team did not want to disturb the area where Dawley had collapsed less than 20 hours earlier and wanted to give Bowling Green some time to reflect as a team. During player introductions, each UB player handed a single yellow rose to their counterpart, exchanging hugs and tears. Following the introductions, the teams joined hands in a circle in the middle of the field for a moment of silence to honor Dawley.

In an excerpt from the nomination letter, Bowling Green representatives wrote: "Everyone that was involved with the events of November 5th and 6th at Bowling Green State University will not soon forget the character and sportsmanship that was displayed by the University at Buffalo's Women's Soccer Team and Coaching Staff. It is this type of character and sportsmanship that makes collegiate athletics so great. These acts of compassion by the Buffalo players and coaching staff were not lost on the more than 700 fans that filled the stands that day and a number were heard to comment that they had never witnessed such sportsmanship."

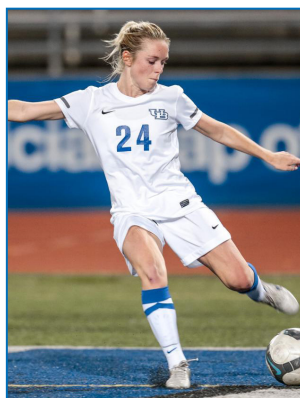

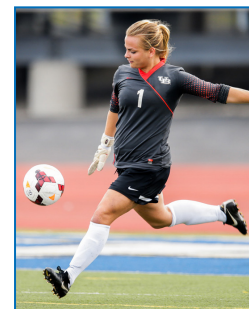
