



They exceed every environmental protocol, including those set by the International Association of Antarctica Tour Operators (IAATO) and the Antarctic Treaty, the Association of Arctic Expedition Cruise Operators (AECO), the National Science Foundation, and the Environmental Protection Agency. A&K has been a fully vested member of IAATO since 1992 and AECO since 2012 and proactively supports efforts made by both organisations in each polar region.

IAATO has established best practices to ensure that ship-based tourism has minimal impact on the Antarctic environment. Bob Simpson, who leads A&K's Expedition Cruising programme, served as Chair of IAATO's executive committee for several years. Like many members of the A&K expedition team, Bob remains actively involved in committee work and serves as a constant advocate for preserving Antarctica's delicate ecosystems.

The association's core mission is preserving and protecting the endangered wildlife, delicate landscapes and remote villages of Svalbard, Jan Mayen, Greenland, Arctic Canada, the Russian Arctic and Iceland. 9 DEC: Arrive Buenos Aires, Argentina

Arrive in Argentina's capital and transfer to your hotel, where you spend the rest of the day at leisure.

10 DEC: Buenos Aires

Latin passion and European romance define the beautiful city of Buenos Aires, a dynamic mecca known for its wide-ranging architectural styles, contemporary and historical arts, and culinary pleasures and *parrillas* (steakhouses). 11 DEC: Ushuaia

12&13 DEC: Drake Passage

The journey south toward Antarctica is an exciting one, furthered by singular, voyage-long access to our knowledgeable expedition team and enrichment experts both on board and on shore. Set out into the Drake Passage, a nearly 1,000-kilometre-wide swath of water where the Southern Ocean currents are squeezed between South America's southern tip and Antarctica's northernmost reaches. An important trade route in the 19th and early 20th centuries, its stormy waters and icy conditions made the journey difficult. However, the stabiliser-equipped *Le Lyrial* handles it with ease. *Le Lyrial* | Meals: B L D

14-18 DEC: Antarctica

As the Antarctic Peninsula and its offshore islands appear on the horizon, a sense of excitement begins to build. Dependent on weather, sea, ice and wildlife conditions, Antarctic expeditions demand spontaneity, and no two are ever the same. With that in mind, your captain and expedition team carefully plan your active, curated itinerary and daily excursions that may include the following areas:

Antarctic Sound: At the northernmost tip of the Antarctic mainland, this body of water features some of the best sightseeing on the peninsula and a proliferation of giant icebergs. Noted for its vast numbers of bird



species, the sound is home to the largest breeding colonies of Adélie penguins in Antarctica. Look forward to opportunities to land on remote, wildlife-laden islands and possible options to experience a continental landing on the northwest tip of the Antarctic Peninsula.

South Shetland Islands: Antarctic research stations, remarkable history, amazing geological features, and abundant wildlife define these islands off the shore of the Antarctic Peninsula. Your expedition team looks for opportunities to visit a wide range of sites: working research stations, volcanic islands and historic sites as well as Gentoo, Adélie and chinstrap penguin rookeries.

Danco Coast: Bordering the South Shetland Islands along the Antarctic continent, the Danco Coast is famed for its scenic, jaw-dropping waterways. From the comfort of *Le Lyrial*, you may sail through some of its most stunning and photogenic channels, straits and bays.

Each cruise day begins with an early breakfast followed by a morning excursion on swift Zodiacs (sturdy inflatable boats). Piloted by expert A&K drivers, each tour is accompanied by lecturers and groups of no more than 10 guests. After mornings discovering native species and striking terrain, return to *Le Lyrial* for lunch and time to relax. Or observe the wildlife-rich waters surrounding you, searching for everything from fin whales, humpback whales or orcas to Antarctic and imperial shags.

By afternoon, set out for the day's second planned excursion, which may include visiting a scientific research station, hiking on a beach packed with basking southern elephant seals or circumnavigating colossal icebergs that serve as floating homes to seals and penguins.

After full days of adventure, evenings aboard your luxury cruiser invite you to unwind over cocktails in the cosy lounge before dinner in the elegant dining room. At night, choose to recap the day's discoveries with your naturalist guides, chat on deck with fellow guests or seize the opportunity to capture photos in the stunning low light characteristic of Antarctica's long, ethereal twilight. *Le Lyrial* | Meals: B L D

19 & 20 DEC: Drake Passage

Bid farewell to wondrous Antarctica and begin your cruise back to Ushuaia at the southernmost tip of Argentina. The ship's return through the Drake Passage is an interlude for recap and reflection, offering time to compare notes with your expert lecturers on the White Continent's wildlife, history and geology. Spend time on board with newfound friends in the comfortable common spaces of *Le Lyrial*, enjoy quiet relaxation on your private balcony or absorb more fascinating lectures by your captivating expedition team.




This expedition has been designed with two additional days in Antarctica to allow for discovery beyond the Antarctic Circle and areas rarely explored in Antarctica. Excursions via Zodiacs (sturdy inflatable boats) are piloted by expert naturalist guides, joined by groups of no more than 10 guests and often accompanied by your lecturers.

Your captain and expedition team carefully plan your active, curated itinerary, dependent on weather, sea, ice and wildlife conditions. With that in mind, daily excursions may include exploration of the following areas:

South Shetland Islands: Remarkable history, amazing geological features and abundant wildlife define these islands offshore of the Antarctic Peninsula. Island visits may include Livingston, Half-Moon and Deception. The latter is a flooded, historic caldera that you may cruise into for the chance to explore its geothermal black-sand beaches and abandoned whaling stations.

Top moments from an expedition unlike any other

Your once-in-a-lifetime Antarctica voyage is brimming with highlights, from epic wildlife sightings to landings claimed by early polar explorers to the chance to sail inside the Antarctic Circle













Danco Coast: Bordering the South Shetland Islands along the Antarctic continent, the Danco Coast is famed for its scenic, jaw-dropping waterways. From the comfort of *Le Lyrial*, you may sail through the Gerlache Strait, Paradise Bay and photogenic Lemaire Channel. Landings you may experience include Neko Harbour, Cuverville Island and Wilhelmina Bay.

The Antarctic Circle: The most southerly of the five primary circles of latitude, the Antarctic Circle was first crossed by Captain James Cook on 17 January 1773. On any given date, the lengths of day and night here are the exact opposite of those at the Arctic Circle. Conditions permitting, you may cruise beyond the Antarctic Circle at 66°34'S 65°44'W, sailing along the west coast of the Antarctic Peninsula.

Marguerite Bay: You may also sail to the protected waters of mountainous Marguerite Bay and experience landings on Adelaide Island, discovered by British explorer John Biscoe. You may also visit the British Antarctic Survey (BAS) station at Rothera.

Mornings spent discovering the White Continent's rare and remarkable treasures from the shore to terra firma are followed by lunch aboard *Le Lyrial*. Enjoy time to relax and observe the surrounding abundance of wildlife, searching for everything from humpback whales and porpoising penguins to Antarctic and imperial shags.

By afternoon, set out for the day's second planned excursion, which may include hiking on spectacular beaches teeming with braying Gentoo penguins, or circumnavigating colossal icebergs that serve as floating homes to seals.

On each of these seven adventurous days, look forward to comfortable evenings aboard your luxury cruiser, sipping cocktails in the Panoramic Lounge before dinner. At night, recap the day's discoveries with your expedition team, enjoy entertainment in the theatre, and chat with fellow guests in one of the lounges of *Le Lyrial*, ever on the lookout for late-night wildlife appearances just off the deck. *Le Lyrial* | Meals: B L D

30 & 31 JAN: Drake Passage

You may still be catching your breath over the awe and inspiration discovered in Antarctica as Le Lyrial turns around to begin the voyage back to Ushuaia in Tierra del Fuego. 

23 AUG: Arrive Montreal, Canada

24 AUG: Montreal

25 AUG: Kangerlussuaq, Greenland

Transfer to the airport for an early morning charter flight to Western Greenland, arriving at Kangerlussuaq at the edge of the Greenland Ice Sheet. Later, board your luxury expedition cruiser and enjoy the thrill of setting off to sea. This evening, join fellow guests and your expedition team for a welcome reception. *L'Austral* | Meals: B L D

26-30 AUG: Western Greenland

In 1906, Roald Amundsen became the first polar explorer to cross the entire Northwest Passage successfully. Begin as he did, venturing along Greenland's stunning West Coast and north into Baffin Bay for the next five days. Your captain and expedition team determine the day's best excursions, which may include the following areas:

Sisimiut: North of the Arctic Circle, Sisimiut is the northernmost city in Greenland that can maintain a year-round, ice-free port as well as sufficient snow for dogsledding in winter and spring. Visit the local museum and enjoy an Inuit sea kayak demonstration.

Disko Bay & Ilulissat: Cruise into the wide inlet of Disko Bay, first explored by Erik the Red in 985. Discover the Ilulissat Icefjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site at the mouth of one of the fastest and most active glaciers in the world, Sermeq Kujalleq. Take a walking tour of Ilulissat, visit its history museum, and meet with villagers to learn about local life. Conditions permitting, board a local vessel for an iceberg cruise of Disko Bay.

Uummannaq Fjords: North of Ilulissat, this geological wonder teems with marine life. Visit Karrat Fjord to see the iceberg-clad bay and the remains of ancient huts, built by Thule hunters (Inuit ancestors) more than 500 years ago.

Kullorsuaq: Translated as 'Big Thumb', Kullorsuaq remains one of the most traditional hunting, fishing and trading villages in Greenland. *L'Austral* | Meals: B L D

31AUG-7 SEP: Nunavut, Canada

Cruise into the Canadian Arctic Archipelago of Nunavut and enter the heart of the Northwest Passage. As your luxury expedition cruiser winds through legendary channels and inlets, A&K's enrichment specialists continue to spark captivating discussions that enhance your discovery. Your crew and expedition team determine your itinerary, dependent on weather, sea, ice and wildlife conditions. Exciting excursions may include:

Pond Inlet: 'Place of Mittima's Grave', Pond Inlet is the gateway to the Northwest Passage and a rich archaeological site. After clearing customs formalities, embark on a shore excursion to an area once inhabited by the ancient Thule. Visit the Nattinnak Visitor's Centre or Toonoonik Sahoonik Co-op, where you may shop for handcrafted goods.

Lancaster Sound: Situated between Devon Island and Baffin Island, this body of water is home to an abundance of Arctic cod and seasonal populations of beluga and bowhead whales, black guillemots, Arctic terns and other wildlife.

Beechey Island: Historic moments in Arctic exploration define this island. Beechey is best known for providing a haven to British explorer Sir John Franklin in 1845, who took shelter for two years before his ill-fated attempt to conquer the Northwest Passage. See the grave markers for three of his men and visit Franklin's cenotaph.

Best of the Northwest Passage with A&K

This historic passage, bookended by two oceans, reveals the northern coast of North America and its rare Arctic waterways, wildlife, geology and communities. Experience these highlights and more with A&K













Fort Ross: Abandoned in 1948, this former trading post was founded in 1937 as a place for trappers to barter Arctic fox pelts in exchange for necessities. Explore its remaining structures and perhaps take a Zodiac excursion to CoBay, as your naturalists share stories about its residents.

Gjoa Haven: During his attempt to cross the passage on 'Gjoa', Roald Amundsen took respite in this natural harbour as he waited for ice conditions to improve. For two years, he lived with the Netsilik Inuits and learned survival skills that later proved invaluable on his South Pole expedition.

Victoria Island: Cruise the south coast of Victoria and through the Queen Maud Gulf, Dease Strait and Coronation Gulf. Expedition stops may include bird sanctuary Jenny Lind Island and Johansen Bay.

8-10 SEP: Northwest Territories

Enter Canada's Northwest Territories and continue through the heart of the Northwest Passage, where you may experience exciting excursions that include:

Ulukhaktok: Visit with the local Inuit of Holman Village, experiencing drum dances and tastings of fresh char and bannock rings (fried dough) prepared over an open fire. Tour the town art centre and discover Ulukhaktok's beautiful printmaking tradition, carvings and hats made of coveted musk ox wool.

Banks Island: The fourth-largest island in the Canadian Archipelago, Banks is home to deep Inuit history and a population of about 60,000 musk oxen.

Franklin Bay: Discover the 'Smoking Hills', cliffs of bituminous shale that endlessly combust and burn. This

geological phenomenon has likely been occurring for millennia and is a rare sight to see. L'Austral | Meals: B L D

11SEP: Herschel Island

On an expedition in 1826, Captain Franklin was the first European to lay eyes on this unique island at the northernmost point of the Yukon Territory. Herschel supports numerous wildlife and is one of the only places on Earth where you may see a grizzly bear, black bear and polar bear. Evidence of the island's whaling culture and Thule ancestors remains along its coastline, now significantly affected by sea erosion and climate change. *L'Austral* | Meals: B L D

12-13 SEP: Cruising the Beaufort Sea

Typically dense with ice floes and fog, the Beaufort Sea opens up the nearly 100-kilometre-wide coastal pass from August to September. As your expedition ship cruises into the U.S. and clears at Point Barrow, Alaska (U.S. Customs clearance only), continue participating in lectures led by your expedition team. Relax on your private balcony or join fellow guests on deck where, with some luck, you may spy beluga whales, which travel in numbers here, and the northern lights in autumn. *L'Austral* | Meals: B L D

(e) On receipt of your correct deposit we will book your arrangements and issue a Confirmation Invoice. A contract will come into existence on the date on which we issue a Confirmation Invoice. If your confirmed arrangements include a flight, we (or if you booked via an authorised agent of ours, that agent) will also issue you with an ATOL Certificate.

(f) It is important for you to check the details on the Confirmation, and ATOL Certificate where applicable, as soon as you get it, as these set out the services we have agreed to provide. In the event of any discrepancy please contact us immediately. If you arrange your holiday direct with the Company all correspondence and other communications will be sent to the address of the person who made the initial payment unless you specify otherwise. If you request correspondence through a business address, a residential address will also be required for emergency and security reasons.

(g) If your booking is made through a travel agent, the Company will address all communications to that travel agent, who will act as agent for you in regard to all communications from us to you. All monies paid by you to a travel agent under or in contemplation of this contract will be held by the travel agent for the Company until such monies are forwarded to the Company.

(h) Final payment of the cost of your arrangements is due 90 days prior to departure. For all Luxury Expedition Cruises and select Journeys indicated below* final payment is due 120 days prior to departure. If your reservation is made within this period, the entire cost of the trip must be paid at the time of the request in order to secure confirmation. For Wings Over the World Journeys that include European Destinations final payment is due 180 days prior to departure. If it is not paid in time, we reserve the right to treat your booking as cancelled by you in which case the cancellation charges set out in clause 2 below will become payable. An additional £600 per person non-refundable permit fee is required at time of booking for the Uganda and Rwanda extension tour.

2. AMENDMENTS & CANCELLATION

(a) Amendments by you

The Company will make every effort to assist you if you wish to alter your arrangements, but it may not always be possible. Requests for an amendment must be in writing, signed by the person who made the initial payment. If it is possible to make the amendment, it will be subject to an amendment charge of £50 per booking, together with all communication charges or other expenses incurred by the Company as a result of the change. These charges will be payable whether or not the Company succeeds in confirming your requested amendment. Scheduled airlines normally regard name changes as a cancellation and rebooking, and any alteration may incur a 100% cancellation charge in respect of the air fare. Please note that save for the transfer of a booking, it will not be possible to make changes within 28 days of your departure date. Your request may be treated as a cancellation and re-booking and the normal cancellation charges detailed in clause 2(c) below will apply dependent upon the conditions imposed by our suppliers.

If you wish to change your arrangements whilst on your holiday, all costs are payable by you.

Date amendments: Should you wish to amend the date of departure of your trip this will follow the rules outlined in part 2(a) above. The new departure date must be initiated within six months of the original date of departure. If travel commences after six months of the original holiday departure date this will be treated as a cancellation and rebook and the normal cancellation charges detailed in clause 2(c) will apply.

Destination amendments: Should you wish to change the destination (unless for reasons of extraordinary circumstances outlined below) of your confirmed holiday before departure this shall be treated as a cancellation and rebook and the normal cancellation charges detailed in clause 2(c) will apply.

(b) Transfers of Booking

If you or any member of your party is prevented from travelling, that person(s) may transfer their place to someone else, subject to the following conditions:

 $a.\,that\,person\,is\,introduced\,by\,you\,and\,satisfies\,all\,the\,conditions$ applicable to the holiday;

b. we are notified not less than 7 days before departure;

c. you pay any outstanding balance payment, an amendment fee of £50 per person transferring, as well as any additional fees, charges or other costs arising from the transfer; and

d. the transferee agrees to these Terms and conditions and all other terms of the contract between us.

e. flight tickets may not be able to be transferred in which case a replacement ticket for the transferee would need to be purchased.

You and the transferee remain jointly and severally liable for payment of all sums. If you are unable to find a replacement, cancellation charges as set out in clause 2(c) will apply in order to cover our estimated costs. Otherwise, no refunds will be given for passengers not travelling or for unused services.

(c) Cancellation by you

All cancellations must be advised in writing, signed by the person who made the initial payment and sent to the Company at St George's House, Ambrose Street, Cheltenham, Glos. GL50 3LG. Cancellations are effective on the date they are received by the Company. Recorded delivery is strongly recommended. Since we incur costs in cancelling your travel arrangements, the

following cancellation charges will be payable, depending upon the number of days prior to departure the Company receives your notice of cancellation

We will deduct the cancellation charge(s) from any monies you have already paid to us.

Important note: Certain arrangements may not be amended after they have been confirmed and any alteration or cancellation could incur a cancellation charge of up to 100% of that part of the arrangements in addition to the charge above.

Partial room cancellation: If guest cancels or leaves a journey and a roommate remains, an additional supplement may apply to the price for the remaining guest.

CANCELLATION CHARGES FOR INTERNAL AIR

All internal air is 100% non-refundable at time of final payment (some exceptions may apply).

CANCELLATION CHARGES FOR EXTRA SERVICES

Additional hotel nights and other extra services booked in connection with Abercrombie & Kent journeys are subject to specific cancellation penalties. These will be provided at the time of booking and noted on the invoice.

Please note that at certain times of year, for example peak season, or for certain products, for example some game lodges and cruises, stricter cancellation conditions may apply. Any such revised conditions will be notified to you prior to booking.

We strongly recommend that you secure adequate travel insurance as per clause 6 below.

(d) Cancellation by you due to unavoidable & extraordinary circumstances:

You have the right to cancel your confirmed holiday before departure without paying a cancellation charge in the event of "unavoidable and extraordinary circumstances" occurring at your holiday destination or its immediate vicinity and significantly

affecting the performance of the holiday or significantly affecting the transport arrangements to the destination. In these circumstances, we shall provide you with a full refund of the monies you have paid but we will not be liable to pay you any additional compensation. Please note that your right to cancel in these circumstances will only apply where the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office advises against travel to your destination or its immediate vicinity. For the purposes of this clause, "unavoidable and extraordinary circumstances" means warfare, acts of terrorism, significant risks to human health such as pandemic, epidemic or the outbreak of serious disease at the travel destination or natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes or weather conditions which make it impossible to travel safely to the travel destination.

(e) Re-booking following a cancellation

Should you wish to cancel a holiday and re-book an alternative this will be subject to the cancellation terms within these booking conditions. If the alternative booking requires a greater deposit than has already been paid (after deducting cancellation fees) then the balance between what is required as a deposit and any deposits sums already paid becomes due.

(f) Accuracy of information

We check the information which we provide about our holidays very carefully. However, tour, excursion or cruise itineraries may change as a result of local conditions. Circumstances such as these, or weather conditions, may cause some of the amenities we have described to be unavailable or different from those advertised. When we are told of any significant or long term changes we will always endeavour to advise you prior to your departure.

(g) Amendments by the Company

Great care is taken to ensure that the description and prices given in our brochures and on our website are accurate at the time of publication. However, changes can occur, and the Company reserves the right to change any of the details in company literature, including prices, in which case the Company will advise you of any such change before accepting your booking. After a Confirmation Invoice has been issued, the Company makes every effort to operate all holidays as advertised. We plan arrangements a long time in advance of your holiday using independent suppliers such as airlines, hotels, local transport operators and guides, over whom we have no direct control. In very rare circumstances, the Company may have to modify a holiday before you depart. Most of these changes are insignificant. If we make an insignificant change to your holiday, we will make reasonable efforts to inform you or your travel agent as soon as reasonably possible if there is time before your departure but we will have no liability to you. Examples of insignificant changes include alteration of your outward/return flights by less than 12 hours, changes to aircraft type, change of accommodation to another of the same or higher standard and changes of carriers.

We also deem certain Covid-19 related travel and destination requirements as insignificant changes in that we do not expect these changes to significantly affect the performance of the holiday or your overall holiday enjoyment. Such changes may include the requirement to wear face masks, make regular use of sanitising stations and maintain social distancing. Some changes may also affect the availability of certain services and facilities. We expect all guests to adhere to the local and national guidance that is in force at the destination and whilst travelling to and from the destination, and the Company shall have no liability to you if you fail to comply with those rules and regulations.

Where we deem Covid-19 changes to have a significant impact upon your holiday we will follow the procedure as outlined below

Occasionally we may have to make a significant change to your confirmed arrangements. Examples of "significant changes" include the following, when made before departure: a change of flight time by more than 12 hours, a change of international airport (except between airports serving the same city), a change of destination or a change to a lower standard accommodation, and/or price. If we have to make a significant change we will tell you as soon as possible and if there is time to do so before departure, we will provide you with three alternatives. You may accept the modification, you may change your booking to another available and comparable holiday, or you may cancel and receive a full and prompt refund. If you choose another holiday which is cheaper, the Company will make the appropriate refund.

You must notify us of your choice within 7 days of our offer. If we do not hear from you within 7 days, we will contact you again to request notification of your choice. If you fail to respond again, we will assume that you have chosen to accept the change or alternative booking arrangements.

If you cancel and receive a full refund following a significant change made for any reason other than Force Majeure or Low Bookings you will receive the following compensation, calculated according to the number of days prior to departure that you are notified of the change.

*IMPORTANT NOTE: We will not pay you compensation in the following circumstances:

(a) where we make an insignificant change;

(b) where we make a significant change or cancel your arrangements more than 91 days before departure (or 121 days in the case of the select journeys listed in clause 1(h), above, and related Group Pre/Post Tour Extensions, Hosted Journeys and Ultimate Arctic Adventures);

(c) where we make a significant change and you accept those changed arrangements or you accept an offer of alternative travel arrangements;

(d) where we have to cancel your arrangements as a result of your failure to make full payment on time;

(e) where the change or cancellation by us arises out of alterations to the confirmed booking requested by you;

(f) where we are forced to cancel or change your arrangements due to Force Majeure.

Force Majeure has the meaning set out in clause 16

If there is an insignificant change before you depart (that is, any change not included in the definition of a significant change set out above), the Company will try to notify you, although it is not obliged to pay any compensation. If the Company becomes unable to provide a significant proportion of your holiday after it has commenced, every effort will be made to provide suitable alternative arrangements, which will be made for you at no extra charge to you (save in the case of Force Majeure) or, alternatively, you will be returned to your point of departure and the company will, where appropriate, pay compensation. No compensation is payable in the case of Force Majeure.

(h) Cancellation by the Company

We reserve the right in any circumstances to cancel your holiday for any reason, subject to commitments in 2(g). However, we will not cancel your hotel arrangement less than 90 days before your departure date, except for reasons of Force Majeure or failure by you to pay the final balance. If you fail to pay the balance of the holiday price at least 90 days before departure, the Company will treat your booking as cancelled and levy the cancellation charges set out in clause 2(c). If the Company is obliged to cancel your holiday in any other circumstances before departure, the Company will use its best endeavours to offer alternative arrangements of equivalent or very closely similar standard and price, if available; travel arrangements of a lower standard and a refund of the difference in price; or will give you a full and prompt refund of all monies paid. In addition, unless the cancellation has been caused by Force Majeure, failure by you to pay the final balance or Low Bookings, the Company will pay you compensation as set out in clause 2(g).

(i) Abercrombie & Kent Guaranteed Departures

All Luxury Small Group Journeys, Luxury Expedition Cruises and related extensions and Wings Over the World Journeys are guaranteed to operate with a minimum of two (2) persons unless noted on the Itinerary. Guaranteed departures will operate except in cases of Force Majeure, which could include any major world event adversely affecting international travel patterns. If only two, three or four people are booked, we will advise you before travel and check that you are happy to travel even if numbers do not increase or whether you would prefer a departure with more guests booked, subject to availability. If only one person is booked we will offer alternative dates at the same price. Hosted Journeys are subject to minimum numbers.

3. ABERCROMBIE & KENT PRICE POLICY

(a) We reserve the right to alter the prices of any of the holidays shown in our brochure or on our website. You will be advised of the current price of the holiday that you wish to book before your contract is confirmed.

(b) When you make your booking you must pay a deposit, see section 1b for relevant deposits. The balance of the price of your travel arrangements must be paid by the date indicated on your confirmation. If the deposit and/or balance is not paid in time, we shall cancel your travel arrangements. If the balance is not paid in time we shall retain your deposit.

(c) In respect of any booking covered by our ATOL, all monies you pay to the travel agent are held by them on behalf and for the benefit of the Trustees of the Air Travel Trust at all times. This is subject to the agent's obligation to pay it to us for so long as we do not fail. If we fail, any money held at that time by the agent, or subsequently accepted from you by him, is and continues to be held on behalf of and for the benefit of the Trustees of the Air Travel Trust without any obligation to pay that money to us.

(d) The Company is under no obligation to give a breakdown of the costs involved in a holiday.

(e) The Company reserves the right to notify you of an increase in the brochure or advertised price before accepting your booking and prices may go up or down. While we do our utmost to avoid such a scenario, due to human or computer error there may on occasion be an incorrect price shown in a brochure or online. When we become aware of any such error, we will endeavour to notify you at the time of booking (if we are then aware of the mistake) or within 7 days of the time of booking, or as soon as reasonably possible. We do have to reserve all our rights in a situation such as this which may include cancelling a holiday if the actual price applicable to the holiday is not acceptable to you. We will of course allow you to amend your holiday with us, if you so wish, to an alternative holiday at the correct price.

(f) We reserve the right to increase the price of confirmed holidays solely to allow for increases which are a direct consequence of changes in:

a. the price of the carriage of passengers resulting from the cost of fuel or other power sources;

b. the level of taxes or fees chargeable for services applicable to the holiday imposed by third parties not directly involved in the performance of the holiday, including tourist taxes, landing taxes or embarkation or disembarkation fees at ports and airports; and

c. the exchange rates relevant to the package.

Such variations could include but are not limited to airline cost changes which are part of our contracts with airlines (and their agents), cruise ship operators and any other transport providers.

(g) We will absorb and you will not be charged for any increase equivalent to 2% of the price of your travel arrangements, which excludes insurance premiums and any amendment charges and/or additional services or travel arrangements. You will be charged for the amount over and above that. However, if this means that you have to pay an increase of more than 8% of the price of your confirmed holiday (excluding any insurance premiums, amendment charges and/or additional services or travel arrangements), you will have the option of accepting a change to another holiday if we are able to offer one (if this is of equivalent or higher quality you will not have to pay more but if it is of lower quality you will be refunded the difference in price), or cancelling and receiving a full refund of all monies paid to us, except for any insurance premiums and any amendment charges and/or additional services or travel arrangements. Should you decide to cancel for this reason, you must exercise your right to do so within 7 days from the issue date printed on your final invoice. We will consider an appropriate refund of insurance premiums paid if you can show that you are unable to transfer or reuse your policy.

(h) Should the price of your holiday go down due to the changes mentioned above, then any refund due will be paid to you less an administrative fee of £10. However, please note that travel arrangements are not always purchased in local currency and some apparent changes have no impact on the price of your travel due to contractual and other protection in place.

(i) There will be no change made to the price of your confirmed holiday within 20 days of your departure nor will refunds be paid during this period.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COMPANY

(a) The Company applies all reasonable checks to ensure that those involved in the preparation and provision of your holiday maintain the appropriate standards.

(b) We will accept responsibility for the arrangements we agree to provide or arrange for you as an "organiser" under the Package Travel and Linked Travel Arrangements Regulations 2018, as set out below and as such, we are responsible for the proper provision of all travel services included in your package, as set out in your confirmation invoice. The descriptions, information and opinions given in our brochures or on the website by the Company in respect of the airlines, hotels and other suppliers whose services are used are given in good faith, based on the latest information available at the time of printing. The Company accepts liability for any loss you may suffer if due to fault on our part, or that of our agents or suppliers, any part of the holiday arrangements you book with the Company before your departure is not as described in our brochure, on our website, or itinerary or not of a reasonable standard and we don't remedy or resolve your complaint within a reasonable period of time, and this has affected the enjoyment of your package holiday, in such circumstances you may be entitled to an appropriate price reduction or compensation or both. You must inform us without undue delay of any failure to perform or improper performance of the travel services included in this package. The Company limits its liability in respect of these claims to a maximum of three times the holiday cost. Subject to the conditions set out below, The Company also accepts liability if the conditions set out below, The Company also accepts hability if you or any member of your party suffers death or personal injury as a direct result of the negligence of the Company or its suppliers. However, these acceptances of liability do not apply if there has been no fault on the part of the Company or its servants, agents, or suppliers or if, the loss, death or personal injury suffered is attributable to (i) your own acts or omissions, (ii) the acts or omissions of a third party not involved in providing the services which make up your holiday and which were unavoidable and extraordinary or (iii) Force Majeure. In addition, where claims do not involve personal injury or death, they are also conditional upon you following the procedures for notification of complaints set out in clause 11, and upon you assigning to the Company any right you may have against any other person whose acts or omissions have given rise to the Company's liability. Nothing in the above shall limit or exclude the Company's liability for fraud or for death or personal injury caused by negligence, or to the extent otherwise not permitted by law.

(c) The Company's liability to compensate you and the amount of such compensation is subject to the following limitations. First, in the case of damage other than death, illness or personal injury, compensation is restricted to a reasonable amount having regard to such factors as, inter alia, the holiday cost and the extent to which the enjoyment of your holiday can be said to have been affected. Second, if any failure in your holiday arrangements relates to, or if you or any member in your party is killed, injured or becomes ill during or as a result of, carriage by aircraft, ship, train or coach forming part of the holiday arrangements booked with us before your departure from the UK, our liability to pay compensation and/or the amount of compensation we will pay is limited as if we were the carrier under any international convention which governs such services. International Conventions which may apply include: in respect of carriage by air, the Montreal Convention 1999 or the Warsaw Convention 1929 (including as a mended by the Hague Protocol of 1955 and by any of the Montreal Additional Protocol of 1975); in respect of carriage by sea, the Athens Convention 1980; and in respect of rail carriage, the Berne/Cotif Convention 1980; and in respect of carriage by road the Geneva Convention 1973. The terms of these conventions are incorporated into and form part of your contract with us. In respect of death or personal injury, the liability of an air carrier under the Montreal Convention and the Warsaw Convention is limited to damage sustained caused by an accident which takes place onboard the aircraft or in the course of any of the operations of embarking or disembarking. You can get copies of the relevant conventions may limit or remove the carrier's liability to you ask us for them. You should also how that the carrier will rely upon its 'conditions

of carriage' which may limit or remove the carrier's liability to you and limit compensation under international conventions.

(d) Our suppliers (such as accommodation or transport providers) have their own Terms and Conditions or conditions of carriage, and these conditions are binding between you and the supplier. Some of these conditions may limit or remove the relevant transport provider's or other supplier's liability to you. You can get copies of such conditions from our offices, or the offices of the relevant supplier.

(e) If we make any payment to you or any member of your party for death, personal injury or illness, you must co-operate fully with us in seeking recovery of any payment we make.

(f) Operational decisions may be taken by air carriers and airports resulting in delays, diversions or rescheduling. Abercrombie & Kent has no control over such decisions and is therefore unable to accept responsibility for them. Where, as a result of circumstances beyond our control we are obliged to change or end your holiday after departure, but before the end of your holiday, we will not pay compensation or reimburse you for expenses incurred. We strongly recommend you have adequate travel insurance for your holiday and should claim via your insurance company for any loss or damage to luggage and/or personal possessions. In the event that any claim is made directly with us, our liability to pay compensation and/or the amount of compensation will be limited in accordance with the conventions referred to in (c) above.

(g) If you suffer death, injury or illness during your holiday arising out of an activity which does not form part of the inclusive arrangements booked with the Company, the Company will offer assistance where appropriate and in its sole discretion. This assistance must be requested within 90 days of your misadventure and will be limited to general advice and/or assistance with legal fees up to £5,000 per party, such contributions to be repaid to the Company out of any judgment or insurance payment you subsequently obtain.

(h) Where it is impossible for you to return to your departure point as per the agreed return date of your package, due to "unavoidable and extraordinary circumstances", we shall provide you with any necessary accommodation (where possible, of a comparable standard) for a period not exceeding three nights per person. If the circumstances continue beyond a three night period our responsibility under this clause will cease and you will need to claim upon your travel insurance where you are able to so. Please note that the 3 night cap does not apply to persons with reduced mobility, pregnant women or unaccompanied minors, nor to persons needing specific medical assistance, provided we have been notified of these particular needs at least 48 hours before the start of your holiday. For the purposes of this clause, "unavoidable and extraordinary circumstances" mean warfare, acts of terrorism, significant risks to human health such as pandemic, epidemic or the outbreak of serious disease at the travel destination or natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes or weather conditions which make it impossible to travel safely back to your departure point.

(i) Please be aware that the Company accepts no responsibility or liability for any destination that imposes access restrictions or otherwise hinders peaceful enjoyment of destination services and facilities based upon race, gender or sexual preference. The Company will provide general information in line with its obligations, however, you accept that it is your responsibility to thoroughly research your intended destination to ensure that it satisfactorily meets your holiday needs and requirements

(j) Abercrombie & Kent reserves the right to modify the programme itineraries, including arranged sightseeing and featured experts, and substitute accommodations, including vessels, aircraft and trains at any time due to unforeseen circumstances or circumstances beyond Abercrombie & Kent's control. Reasonable efforts will be made to operate itineraries as planned, but alterations may occur after the final itinerary has been issued. Due to the nature of Luxury Expedition Cruises, itineraries are for guidance purposes only and may be adjusted due to unforeseen circumstances including weather, wildlife, ice, medical emergencies and other conditions beyond Abercrombie & Kent's control at the sole discretion of the Captain on board. Geoffrey Kent's participation in the Northeast Passage: Across the Russian Arctic cruise cannot be guaranteed; if Geoffrey Kent is unable to join the cruise due to unforeseen circumstances beyond Abercrombie & Kent's control, the cruise will continue to operate as planned

5. YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

(a) Make yourself travel aware - Before making a booking, please consult the travel advice produced by the government of your home jurisdiction, as well as that of the government who issued the passport and/or visa you intend to travel under.

Also ensure you make yourself familiar with the Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office advice on staying safe and healthy on your trip – www.gov.uk/travelaware. Advice can change, so always check regularly for the latest updates.

(b) If the Foreign Office advises that people should not visit a particular country, we will act on this advice. US residents who are planning a holiday with us should be aware that the US State Department issues a travel warning when, based on all relevant information, it determines that Americans should avoid travel to or within a certain nation. The State Department maintains a list of nations under a travel warning on its website at: http://travel.state.gov/travel/cis_pa_tw/tw/tw_1764.html. American travellers are advised to check this before making a booking.

(c) In the event of active government advice and warnings against travel to a specific destination or location(s) of a trip, should the traveller still choose to travel, notwithstanding such travel advisory or warning, the traveller assumes all risks of loss, personal injury, death or property damage from any event that may arise out of or associated with the travel advice or warning given. The Company strongly recommends you do not travel against Foreign Office Travel or US State Department Travel

advice and warnings as they are given for your safety and security.

(d) It is important that you check the details on your Confirmation Invoice when you receive it. In the event of any discrepancy, you should contact the Company or your travel agent.

(e) General information concerning passport, visa and health requirements applicable to UK Citizens is set out in our literature. However, such requirements are subject to change and you must check current requirements before departure. Many countries require that passengers' passports are valid for at least six months after the completion of their journey, and/or contains blank pages (for visas). Please visit www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice for advice by country. Some destinations also require visas and additional documentation and you should contact the Embassy or Consulate of the country which you are planning to visit in good time before you travel. Further information is available from Visa Central (http://visacentral.co.uk/), You should also contact your medical advisor or a specialist vaccination centre for details of the measures you will need to take prior to departure. All children should travel on full passports. It is your responsibility to obtain all documents required for your holiday, including passports, visas, heath certificates and international driving licenses, to ensure that these are in proper order and to take them with you. We recommend that if you are travelling with a child that does not share your surname, in order to minimise the possibility of disruption to your travel plans, you travel with documentation that proves your relationship to the child as well as documentation that proves you have permission to travel with them. The Company cannot be held responsible should you or any member of your travelling party be denied entry to a country due to non-compliance with these requirements. Please consult the travel advice produced by the government of your home jurisdiction, as well as that of the government who issued the passport and/or visa you intend to travel under for further details. We will not be liable to make any refund or pay compensation if you or any member of your party is unable to proceed with the holiday as planned because of incorrect or missing personal documents, or any other failure to meet passport, visa or immigration requirements.

(f) Approximately 7 days before departure you will receive your flight tickets together with other information concerning your holiday. Please ensure that you check the names and flight timings on your tickets carefully and contact us immediately if you have any queries. The correct timings, using the 24 hour clock system, may have been adjusted since you received your Confirmation Invoice.

(g) You are responsible for checking-in for flights at the correct time and for presenting yourself to take up all pre-booked components of your holiday. The Company cannot accept responsibility for clients missing flights as a result of late checkins and no credit or refunds will be given if you fail to take up any component of your holiday. No credit or refunds will be given for lost, mislaid or destroyed travel documents.

(h) Most people go on holiday for rest and relaxation, so if in our reasonable opinion or that of any airline pilot, hotel manager, tour leader or other person in authority, your behaviour is causing danger, damage to property or persistently affecting the enjoyment of others, we reserve the right to terminate your holiday. Should this happen no refund or compensation would be paid.

(i) If you lose any personal items whilst on holiday, please obtain a written report from the police, to help with any insurance claim upon your return.

(j) You are responsible for the costs of any damage to the accommodation and/or any extra charges incurred with our suppliers during your holiday. Should you fail to make such payment at the time the charges and/or costs are incurred, you will be liable to reimburse us for these and you authorise the Company to automatically debit your credit card to the value instructed by the supplier for any such costs and/or charges.

6. INSURANCE

We cannot emphasise enough the importance of purchasing comprehensive travel insurance prior to date of travel. This insurance should be commensurate to the value of your booking, and cover cancellation and curtailment, all medical expenses including evacuation/repatriation, personal baggage, personal liability, death and permanent disability and travel document insurance. If you suffer from a disability or medical condition, you should disclose this to insurers. For those who participate in sports and activities whilst on holiday that have been organised and arranged independently of us, it should be understood that participation is at the individual's own risk and it is your responsibility to obtain the relevant insurance. Note that special insurance may be required if you intend to scuba dive or undertake any other dangerous or sports activities. Please keep your insurance details with you whilst on holiday.

Special Requirement for Select Luxury Expedition Cruises

Due to the remote locations, Abercrombie & Kent requires proof of a minimum of \$100,000 per person in emergency evacuation/repatriation insurance for all Antarctica, Arctic and Kimberley cruises. We require proof of coverage. Please note emergency evacuation insurance provides for covering the cost associated with emergency evacuation and repatriation up to the limits of the respective policy; however, it does not guarantee the timing, method or mode of such evacuation and repatriation, which is subject to weather, location and other conditions or variables outside of Abercrombie & Kent's control.

7. AIRLINES & OTHER SUPPLIERS

(a) As between you and the suppliers of the transport, accommodation and other components making up your holiday, the conditions of the supplier will apply. These conditions may be subject to international Conventions which limit and/or restrict the suppliers' liability. (Copies are available on request - please allow 28 days). Under EU law you have rights in some circumstances to refunds and/or compensation from your airline

in cases of denied boarding, cancellation or delay to flights. Full details of these rights will be publicised at EU airports, and will also be available from your airline. Reimbursement in these cases is the responsibility of the airline and will not automatically entitle you to refund of your holiday cost from the Company. Your rights to compensation from the Company is set out in clause 2(g). If your airline does not acknowledge your rights, you should complain to the Civil Aviation Authority at www.caa.co.uk/

(b) Transport timings are provided by the carrier concerned and are subject to such matters as weather conditions, maintenance requirements, the ability of passengers to check-in on time and, in the case of flights, to air traffic control restrictions. Accordingly, the times of flights and other forms of transport are estimates only and cannot be guaranteed.

(c) As airlines regularly overbook, we recommend that you check in on-line as soon as you are notified by the airline that check-in in savailable or 24 hours before departure. If you do not check-in online or are unable to, we recommend that you arrive at the airport 3 hours prior to departure as airlines have been known to re-allocate seats in the event of late arrivals. The Company is unable to check you in and it is your responsibility to ensure that you are checked in within the appropriate time. The Company is not responsible or liable if you are downgraded an airline class as a result of the airline overbooking the class in which you are booked. Seat reservations are at the discretion of the airline and may be changed at any time without notice.

(d) The majority of airlines have introduced a total smoking ban on most or all of their flights. Please ask before booking if this information is important to you.

(e) Some activities carry inherent risks and if you are participating in such activities you may be asked to sign an additional form by the local supplier. In rare cases beginners may have to take lessons at a charge before being permitted to use hotel equipment otherwise offered free.

8. EXCURSIONS

Please note that when you book an excursion locally you contract with the local company providing that excursion and not the Company. The Company has no legal liability for anything that goes wrong on such an excursion and any claim which you might have arising out of the excursion will be against the relevant local company and subject to the local company's terms and conditions. The Company will, at its discretion offer advice, guidance and assistance if you or any member of your party suffer death, illness or injury arising out of an activity which does not form part of your holiday with the Company, or an excursion arranged locally. Where legal action is contemplated and you want the Company's assistance, you must obtain the Company's written consent prior to commencement of proceedings. The Company's consent will be given subject to you undertaking to assign any costs, or benefits received and any relevant insurance policy to the Company. We limit the cost of the Company's assistance to you or any member of your party to £5,000.

9. DATA PROTECTION

(a) In order to process your booking and to ensure that your travel arrangements run smoothly and meet your requirements, we need to use the information you provide such as your name, and address, any special needs/dietary requirements etc. We take full responsibility for ensuring that proper security measures are in place to protect your information. We must pass the information not to the relevant suppliers of your travel arrangements such as airlines, hotels, transport companies and so on. The information may also be provided to security or credit checking companies, public authorities such as customs and immigration if required by them, or as required by law. Additionally, where your holiday is outside the European Economic Area (EEA), controls on data protection in your destination may not be as strong as the legal requirements in this country. We will not however, pass any information on to any person not responsible for part of your travel arrangements. This applies to any sensitive information that you give to us such as details of any disabilities, or dietary/religious requirements. If, however, we cannot pass this information to the relevant suppliers, whether in the EEA or not, we cannot accept your booking. In making a booking, you consent to this information being passed on to the relevant persons. Please note that where information is also held by your travel agent, this is subject to your agents own data protection policy. You are entitled to a copy of your information held by us. If you would like to see this please contact the Company during normal working hours.

(b) The information you are required to provide may include debit/ credit card details. As set out above, we take full responsibility for ensuring that proper security measures are in place to protect this information. In accordance with applicable legal, regulatory and business requirements this information will be securely deleted as soon as it is no longer required. However, it is necessary for the Company to retain your debit/credit card details for a reasonable period of time after the conclusion of you holiday, and you consent to such retention, in the event that any costs referred to in clause 5(j) above are incurred and you fail to settle these directly with the supplier, in order that the Company can debit your card for the relevant amount. This will be reviewed on a regular basis to ensure that the information is not kept longer than is strictly necessary for the purposes set out above. 10. ILLNESS AND DISABILITY

If you or any member of your party suffer from a disability or other medical condition please tell us before you book. Abercrombie & Kent is happy to give you advice and to try to assist you in choosing a holiday that will meet your requirements. Air travel can cause problems for some people with circulatory or bronchial problems, such as deep vein thrombosis. It is inadvisable for anyone with high blood pressure or respiratory problems to visit high altitudes. You should consult your doctor for advice before you book and in

good time before your departure. The suppliers of some activities on journeys may require a minimum age or minimum/maximum height or weight to participate. Some active elements have been incorporated into select itineraries. To enjoy the journeys as intended, a minimum level of fitness is required. A&K will require prior notice if any participant has any physical or other condition or disability that would prevent them from participating in active elements of any journey and/or could create a hazard to himself or herself or to other members of the group. Specific journeys have conditions that may require a guest produce a doctor's certificate to A&K prior to travel. A&K will make reasonable efforts to accommodate a disability-related request for accommodation. However, if A&K, in its sole discretion, is unable to properly accommodate the need of the person(s) concerned or believes that health and safety may be compromised, A&K reserves the right to refuse participation. The guest represents that neither he nor she nor anyone travelling with him or her has any physical or other condition or disability that could create a hazard to himself or herself or other members of the tour. A&K also reserves the right to remove from the trip, at the guest's own expense, anyone whose physical condition or conduct negatively impacts the enjoyment of the other guests or disrupts the tour. Due to ship restrictions, women who will be six (6) months or more pregnant at any time during the cruise are not permitted to travel on Expedition Cruises.

11. IF YOU HAVE A PROBLEM

(a) If you are unhappy with any aspect of the Company's arrangements while you are on holiday, you must address your complaint immediately to the Company's local representative (or, if none, to the Company by contacting the Duty Manager on +44 207 998 4141) and to the management of the hotel or other supplier whose services are involved. They will do their best to rectify the situation. It is unreasonable to take no action whilst on holiday, but then to write a letter of complaint upon return. If the problem cannot be resolved locally and you wish to complain, full details must be sent to the Company in writing to arrive within 30 days of your return. We will do our best to investigate and reply to you within 28 days of receipt of your letter. Failure to take either of these steps will deny the Company the opportunity to resolve the problem immediately and/or investigate it properly. In consequence, this may affect your rights under this contract.

(b) In the rare event of a dispute which cannot be amicably settled, you may (if you wish) use ABTA's approved Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) scheme, available through www.abta.com which, though devised by arrangement with the Association of British Travel Agents, is administered quite independently by the Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution (CEDR). The scheme (details of which will be supplied on request) provides for a simple and inexpensive method of arbitration on documents alone, with restricted liability on holidaymakers in respect of costs. The scheme does not apply to claims for an amount greater than £5,000 per person or £25,000 per party, neither does it apply to claims which are solely or mainly in respect of physical injury, illness, nervous shock, death or their consequences. The scheme can, however, deal with compensation claims which include an element of minor injury or illness subject to a limit of £1,500 on the amount the arbitrator can award per person in respect of this element. Application for arbitration under this scheme must be made within 18 months of the date of return from the holiday otherwise it will only be available if we agree, but the ABTA Code does not require such agreement from us. For injury and illness claims, you can request the ABTA Mediation Procedure and we have the option to agree to mediation.

12. GOVERNING LAW

This contract and any matters arising from it are governed by the laws of England and Wales and are subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts of England and Wales.

13. DESCRIPTIONS

A&K reserves the right to modify program itineraries, including arranged sightseeing and featured experts, and substitute accommodations, including vessels, aircraft and trains, at any time due to unforeseen circumstances or circumstances beyond A&K's control. Reasonable efforts will be made to operate itineraries as planned, but alterations may occur after the final titinerary has been issued. Due to the nature of Luxury Expedition Cruises, itineraries are for guidance purposes only and may be adjusted due to unforeseen circumstances including weather, wildlife, ice, medical emergencies and other conditions beyond A&K's control at the sole discretion of the Captain on board.

14. FINANCIAL PROTECTION

We provide financial security for flight-inclusive packages and ATOL protected flights by way of our Air Travel Organiser's Licence number 2881, issued by the Civil Aviation Authority, Gatwick Airport South, West Sussex, RH6 0YR, UK, telephone 0333 103 6350, email: claims@caa.co.uk.

When you buy an ATOL protected product from us you will receive an ATOL Certificate. This lists what is financially protected, where you can get information on what this means for you and who to contact if things go wrong. For further information, visit the ATOL website at www.atol.org.uk. The price of our flight inclusive arrangements includes the amount of £2.50 per person as part of the ATOL Protection Contribution (APC) we pay to the CAA. This charge is included in our advertised prices. Not all holiday or travel services offered and sold by us will be protected by the ATOL Scheme. ATOL protection extends primarily to customers who book and pay in the United Kingdom.

We, or the suppliers identified on your ATOL Certificate, will provide you with the services listed on the ATOL Certificate (or a suitable alternative). In some cases, where neither we nor the supplier are able to do so for reasons of insolvency, an alternative ATOL holder may provide you with the services you have bought (at no extra cost to you). You agree to accept that in those circumstances the alternative ATOL holder will perform those

obligations and you agree to pay any money outstanding to be paid by you under your contract to that alternative ATOL holder. 15. PROMPT ASSISTANCE

If, whilst you are on holiday, you find yourself in difficulty for any reason, we will offer you such prompt assistance as is appropriate in the circumstances. In particular, we will provide you with appropriate information on health services, local authorities and consular assistance, and assistance with distance communications and finding alternative travel arrangements. Where you require assistance which is not owing to any failure by us, our employees or sub-contractors, we will not be liable for the costs of any alternative travel arrangements or other such assistance you require. Any supplier, airline or other transport supplier may however pay for or provide refreshments and/ or appropriate accommodation and you should make a claim directly to them. Subject to the other terms of these Booking Conditions, we will not be liable for any costs, fees or charges you incur in the above circumstances, if you fail to obtain our prior authorisation before making your own travel arrangements. Furthermore, we reserve the right to charge you a fee for our assistance in the event that the difficulty is caused intentionally by you or a member of your party, or otherwise through your or your party's negligence.

16. FORCE MAJEURE

Except where otherwise expressly stated in these Terms and Conditions we will not be liable or pay you compensation if our contractual obligations to you are affected by "Force Majeure". For the purposes of these Booking Conditions, Force Majeure means any event beyond our or our supplier's control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all reasonable measures had been taken. Examples include warfare and acts of terrorism (and threat thereof), civil strife, significant risks to human health such as pandemics, epidemics or the outbreak of serious disease at the travel destination or natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes or weather conditions which make it impossible to travel safely to the travel destination or remain at the travel destination, ice conditions in oceans and level of water in rivers; the act of any government or other national or local authority including port or river authorities, industrial dispute, labour strikes, lock closure, natural or nuclear disaster, fire, chemical or biological disaster, unavoidable technical problems with transport and all similar events outside our or the supplier concerned control.

17. COVID-19 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT
