Bidders battle to take tondo to 208-times top estimate

A small round drawing of the Madonna and Child created a stir at Ryedale Auctioneers in North Yorkshire, writes Alex Capon.

Catalogued as 'after the antique',

it was pitched at £50-100 but fetched £20,800 (plus 21% buyer's premium) after a fervent competition broke out between UK. Italian and French bidders. The pen and ink sketch

measured 6in (15cm) in diameter. Although its frame had some damage, it was in good condition overall. It

LAPADA fair to make 2023 comeback

The LAPADA Art & Antiques Fair in Berkeley Square, London, will return next year.


The trade association's flagship event last ran in 2019. Suspended during the years of lockdown, it was cancelled earlier this year in the face of rising costs.

However, following a new partnership backed by Stable Events, the event is now set to run in autumn 2023.

Details including exhibitor names, firm dates and sponsors and are still to follow. A new steering committee is to be put in place, but crucially the scale of the event is set to match its pre-lockdown identity. More than 100 dealers are expected to stand.

Freya Simms, LAPADA CEO, said: "We know how much both dealers and collectors have missed this annual event and we are thrilled to have partnered with

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Rare survivor: Sydney Cove medallion sells

Wedgwood design was made from clay found when the First Fleet landed

One of the few remaining Sydney Cove medallions in private hands has sold for £36,000 (plus 26% buyer's premium) at auction in Edinburgh.

The 2½in (5.7cm) pottery roundel marking the beginning of European settlement in Australia was made at Wedgwood's Etruria factory in 1789 using clay collected by the First Fleet. It came for sale at the Five Centuries sale at Lyon & Turnbull in Edinburgh on November 16 from a private UK collection with an estimate of £30,000-50,000.

It was in November 1788 that Captain Arthur Phillip, commander of the First Fleet and first Governor of New South Wales, had written to Sir Joseph Banks, president of the Royal Society, to inform him that he had found white clay "in great plenty, a few feet below the surface" in the Sydney Cove area.

Banks directed the samples of the clay to his friend and fellow Lunar Society member Josiah Wedgwood and by March 12, 1790, had received a package in return.

Wedgwood's accompanying letter read: "I have the pleasure of acquainting you, that the clay from Sydney Cove, which you did me the honour of submitting to my examination, is an excellent material for pottery, and may certainly be made the basis of a valuable manufacture for our infant

colony there. Of the species of ware which may be produced from it, you will have some idea from the medallions I have sent for your inspection."

The medallions were produced to a design drawn by Henry Webber and modelled by William Hackwood. The bas relief scene dated *Etruria 1789* depicts Hope, encouraging Peace, Art and Labour, an allegory for the prosperity of

the new settlement, while to the reverse is the impressed inscription Made by Iosiah Wedgwood of Clay from Sydney Cove.

Roundels from a first batch were sent on the 'Second Fleet' to Governor Phillip to be distributed at his discretion, with a second batch completed by November 1789.

It is unknown how many were produced although the total production has been estimated at around two dozen. Survivors range in colour from pale biscuit to a dark brown

The owner of the L&T medallion purchased it in 2019 as part of a group lot in a regional saleroom. Subsequent research led them to discover its historical importance. Bids came from the UK, Australia and US, with the medallion selling online to an international bidder.

Eleven others are known in UK and Australian museums: five in the Mitchell State Library, New South Wales and one each in the British Museum, the Lady Lever Art Gallery, the Potteries Museum and Art Gallery, the National Museum of Australia, Canberra; the Sydney Living Museums Corporation and the Silent World Foundation.

Another, sold by an Australian dealer a decade ago, is understood to be in a private collection.

Hampstead dealers fight antiques centre closure plan

A group of dealers in north London is hoping to have more time to save their local antiques centre.

Traders at Hampstead Antique & Craft Emporium were told at the end of October that the centre will close on January 7 and they have until January 6 to clear their stock.

Around 25 traders are affected. Dealer Alexandra Porter began a petition to fight the market closing and it already has more than 600 signatures.

Camden councillor Linda

more time to find a sympathetic buyer. Porter said local MP Tulip Siddiq is giving the campaign her full support.

If the plan were successful, then the landlord would need to contact the council when they wished to sell the market. Camden would then notify the interested community group who would then have a sixmonth moratorium period giving them a chance to bid for the property.

Porter said: "With the market recognised as an ACV, we could work with the

landlord to find an empathetic buyer that would keep the property as an antiques market with our traders."

She said the public could support the ACV application by signing the online petition Save Hampstead Emporium and by "writing testimonies about the antique market's importance to them and its special place in the heart of the community". She added: "Our message to the landlord is that the antique market is irreplaceable, a very valuable community asset embedded in the heart of Hampstead since the late 60s, and the property should continue its use as a market for the benefit of future generations."

No plans announced

The emporium, on the corner of Heath Street and Perrins Court, is a former Victorian stables and has been trading as an antiques centre since at least 1967.

However, the owner of the building, landlord Staplepine, said the centre will definitely close on January 7 but it made no comment on plans for the cite.

Bidders detect Dutch influence as mystery tondo soars way beyond estimate

came to auction from a 90-year-old private vendor from Fraserburgh in Scotland. She had inherited it many decades ago from her great-aunt who apparently had been a lady-in-waiting for Lady Buchanan.

A number of parties recognised the style and composition of the diminutive drawing as late 16th or early 17th century Netherlandish Mannerist.

Although the tondo format is normally associated with Florentine paintings, it also appeared occasionally in both other Italian and northern European drawings during this period. Among the possible names suggested by trade sources were Joachim Wtewael (1566-1638), Hendrick Goltzius (1558-1617), Abraham Bloemaert (1566-1651) and Jan Harmensz Muller (1571-1628), although the first two were deemed more likely candidates.

The bidding on November 3-5 caused a good deal of excitement in the Kirkbymoorside saleroom, not least for the elderly vendor who was sat in the room. It eventually came down to a battle between a UK dealer and a French buyer bidding online via thesaleroom.com before being knocked down to the latter.

It is now likely that the drawing will be researched and restored and it will be interesting to see if it reemerges in due course with a full attribution.

Beswick shire horse gallops to an £11,300 top price

A record for Beswick pottery was set in Stoke-on-Trent this month when a rare variant of one of the factory's best-known models sold at £11,300 (plus 20% buyer's premium).

In the collectable ceramics market colour can count for a lot. The familiar model of the shire hose mare, designed by Arthur Gredington in 1940 and in production right up until 1999, was sold in the thousands in the typical colourways of brown or pale grey and will today typically bring £20-30. But should this figure (model 818) be found in other hues (there are supposedly 11 different colourways), the price can increase 100-fold or more.

Back in June 2017 a very rare model in a Strawberry Roan colourway took £6600 at Potteries Auctions, which sold another in Iron Grey for £5700 in 2021. The firm has also sold examples in Skewbald (£4400 in November 2020), Piebald (£1900 in November 2017), Chestnut (£1100 in November 2017) and Rocking Horse Grey (£1000 in September 2010).

The Fine Art sale at Potteries Auctions



on November 10 included a version of model 818 in Painted Gloss White.

Just a few of these are known. Although its only polychrome details are to the head, the fetlocks and a braided mane, it is thought that creating the white colour was an expensive and lengthy process. Specialist Bill Buckley said it came in with a herd of a dozen other horses from a private vendor from Chester with a guide

of £1000-2000. "I did think it would fetch considerably more as the 818 model is extremely collectable," he said. "I wasn't aware another had been sold at auction before although I was told one turned up on eBay about 10 years ago. The buyer is from the UK and there were at least two UK disappointed underbidders."

The previous auction high for Beswick was the £9500 bid at Bonhams in 2003 for one of four known casts of the Spirit of Whitfield. Modelled in 1987 by Graham Tongue, it depicts a pit pony called *Kruger* who retired from the Chatterley Whitfield colliery in 1931. Another was sold at Peter Wilson of Nantwich in May 2005 for £8500.

Despite the soft underbelly of the collectable ceramics market, impressive sums have been paid of late for rarities. In July, Potteries Auctions set a new record for any Doulton figure when a Bunnykins trial group, *Celebration Time*, made in 1998 in anticipation of the Millennium was sold to an Australian collector at £35,500.

Stable Events not only to return the fair to its former glory, but to deliver something even better - watch this space."

Stable Events, a member of luxury group Walpole, is owner of *The Game Fair* and other events such as *The Northern Shooting Show*.

Last year LAPADA launched a partnership with the organisation, taking out a section of *The Game Fair* where its members stalled out. It returned to the event this summer.

The return of LAPADA is good news for dealers keen for more London-centric dealer events.

Although the *Chelsea* Antiques Fair was scrapped recently, *The Open Art Fair* is set to return next April 19-23.

To be or not to be a portrait of the Bard, that is the question surrounding this £10m work

A 1608 portrait by Robert Peake (c.1551-1619) long believed to depict William Shakespeare (1564-1616) has gone on the market for £10m.

The 20 x 18in (51 x 45.5cm) oil on canvas, on sale from an anonymous source by private treaty, is claimed to be the only signed and dated picture of the playwright created in his lifetime. Inscribed in gold at the top of the picture are Peake's *RP* signature mark, the date and the sitter's age of 44 – Shakespeare's own in 1608.

It last appeared on the open market in 1975 when it went under the hammer at Christie's during the sale of contents at Swinton Hall, Masham in Yorkshire (at which time the signature was obscured by the position of the inner frame and the painting was ascribed to 'Van Somer'). It has since been in private ownership, coming to its current owner in 2014.

An inner frame, thought to date to the late 18th or early 19th century, asserts the sitter's



identity as Shakespeare.

But could it really be the

What does seem certain is that this is a period picture created and owned by those with links to the poet.

In 2016 the picture was examined by The Courtauld Institute. The inner frame was removed, uncovering the *RP* mark. The report concluded that the work is a period picture with minor restoration,

suggesting that it had been kept in the same location for many years. It was subsequently cleaned.

Further research efforts were led by Duncan Phillips, an art and antiques writer, researcher, PR

professional and dealer, who has compiled a dossier that aims to support the identity of the sitter as Shakespeare.

In the world of alleged Shakespeare 'portraiture', evidence is scant. Art history is littered with posthumous portraits, misidentifications, forgeries and hopeful attributions.

Notable exceptions are the Droeshout portrait, an engraving used as the title-page

of the First Folio, published in 1623. This likeness was praised by Ben Johnson in the Folio's introductory poem.

Also, a funerary monument in Stratford-upon-Avon is believed to have been commissioned by Shakespeare's son-in-law within six years of his death.

Otherwise, all images of the Bard are linked to him through circumstantial – if scholarly – evidence and surmise, including the National Portrait Gallery's Chandos portrait.

Supporting evidence

Outside scholars have yet to weigh in on the Peake portrait. However, supporting evidence for it hangs on several points.

Shakespeare and Peake were linked by their shared geography and their professions. Peake worked for the Office of Revels in the building where several of Shakespeare's plays were rehearsed and performed during the same years. Both men were also based around Holborn Conduit. Martin Droeshout, who made the First

Folio image, had works printed by William Peake, Robert's son. In the portrait itself, similarities in the dress and left eye have been compared between the Droeshout and Peake portraits.

Finally, the portrait seems to have long resided with the Danby family, owners of Swinton Hall, where the painting hung until 1975.

The lives of the 16th century Danbys and Shakespeare overlapped at points, though the picture is thought to have been added to the family collection by William Danby (1752-1833), who enlarged the family's painting collection and seems to have been a Shakespeare enthusiast. A number of frames were made during his ownership of the house in 1795. The inner frame of the Peake portrait may have been among them.

With a £10m price tag, the picture is unlikely to land in a national museum. However, the owner has indicated a wish that it will stay in the country.

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Plea for professional body to boost standard of condition reports

Forensic and scientific expertise recommended

A group of specialists has put forward proposals for a professional body that would seek to improve the standard of condition reports and verification across the art and antiques sector.

The Association for Analysts in Art and Antiques (AAAA) was discussed on November 14 at a conference organised by Art Loss Register (ALR) at The Apothecaries' Hall in London.

Prof Andrew Shortland, director of Cranfield Forensic Institute, proposed the creation of a professional body and recommended ways it could be put together. He told the 90-plus delegates that the group would include vetted members who would abide by a series of rules and ethic codes.

Full disclosure

ALR chairman Julian Radcliffe said both ALR and the TEFAF vetting committee supported the idea.

He said scientific and forensic experts need to work together with the art and antiques trade to improve standards in relation to condition reports and verification of art and objects. "The way forward is to move from the scenario of caveat emptor to the insurance way of working with full disclosure," he added. "If we move to that, we will have a much healthier art trade."

Radcliffe made a plea for more transparency in the market. "Dealers

and auction houses should reveal everything they know. [Lack of information on condition and authenticity] is one of the many reasons some people do not buy or collect. They do not collect as they don't trust the art trade."

Quality counts

Speaker Jennifer Mass, president of Scientific Analysis of Fine Art (SAFA) and a vetter at *TEFAF New York*, warned of the pitfalls of buying a work of art without a full condition report and recommended that a solution is for clients to "rely on a team of experts who have proper credentials in the relevant fields. Accreditation helps."

She added: "We need to educate the public about what quality science looks like... I would vote for an accreditation system."

Art dealer, historian and presenter Bendor Grosvenor provided a word of caution, however. His view is that everybody, from the expert, the connoisseur and the AI tool can, and do, make mistakes and that verifying an artwork is never straightforward.

He said: "There are biases wherever we look. I don't think we should rely on any one thing as we all have weaknesses in the system. Can we establish authenticity? Not always, and not all the time. Sometimes we have to accept that 'probably by Leonardo' (when referring to the infamous *Salvator Mundi*) is the best we can ever do."

TEFAF Maastricht Showcase expands

TEFAF Maastricht is expanding its Showcase section to include 10 galleries next year.

The event, which returns to its traditional spring dates (March 11-19), features 268 dealers, including 13 newcomers and those in the Showcase.

This section of the annual event is devoted to younger galleries, giving them a chance to stand at a major international fair. Previously the section was limited to five or six exhibitors.


Next year's Showcase galleries are still being selected. Former members include Galerie Mendes of Paris, Runjeet Singh of London, Galerie Lowet de Wotrenge of Antwerp and ArtAncient of London.

In the main fair, exhibitor numbers

will be up on this year when a shortened summer edition clashed with *Masterpiece* in London. Firms such as MacConnal-Mason and The Maas Gallery which skipped the last staging are back for next year.

Among the newcomers is a UK dealership, Prahlad Bubbar, specialising in Indian and Islamic art. The others are: Aicon (US), Berardi Galleria d'Arte (Italy), Tim van Laere Gallery (Belgium), Frides Laméris Glass & Antiques (Netherlands), Galerie Mendes (France), Patrick & Ondine Mestdagh (Belgium), PKM Gallery (South Korea), Rosenberg & Co (US), Templon (France), Caterina Tognon (Italy) and Univers du Bronze (France).

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Why a second-hand buy is a first-class acquisition

Is buying second-hand set for an unprecedented period of growth?

Chattels auctioneers and dealers stalling out at fairs and markets will certainly hope so and a number of trends and recent announcements suggest that it might well be.

With the COP27 climate summit this month keeping sustainability top of many people's minds, the environmental benefits of not buying new are gradually seeping into consumers' consciousness. Almost threefifths of people (58%) now know that buying second-hand furniture is greener than buying new, up from 53% three years ago, according to a recent survey of UK consumers by ATG's parent company Auction Technology Group.

The survey found that 44% of people are more likely to buy second-hand now than they were three years ago, with a further 43% saying they are just as likely. Respondents said that the top two reasons for buying second-hand are saving money and awareness of it being more environmentally-friendly (see graph below right).

The impact of sustainable buying as a reason to purchase used items was found to be more important to women and young people.

Younger buyers

Indeed, the rise in interest in secondary market items may well bring new clients from a mong the younger demographics.

The survey found that 18-25s are the most likely to buy used clothes, jewellery and watches and 25-44-year-olds are more likely to buy collectables and furniture second hand than any other age group.

The current cost of living crisis may also encourage some consumers to look even more actively at the wide range of second-hand good available at

auctions and showground fairs.

A report published this month by Wrap (the Waste and Resources Action Programme, a climate action charity) found that if all home furniture in the UK that is suitable for reuse were resold rather than discarded then UK households buying these items – instead of new furniture – would collectively save £2.37bn a year. For clothing the saving would be even higher at £4.51bn a year.

Gift options

At this time of year shoppers are also increasingly considering second-hand items as presents – encouraging news for auction houses holding Christmas-themed sales and for antiques markets taking place in the coming weeks.

The latest monthly snapshot of spending by Barclaycard, which accounts for half of debit and credit card transactions, found that 50% of consumers were planning measures such as buying second-hand as a way of keeping their seasonal spending under control.

"Consumers are adopting a restrained approach to festivities, looking for preloved gifts and setting spending limits to manage their costs," said Esme Harwood, a director at Barclaycard.

Similarly, a survey by eBay found that 38% of consumers will be shopping for second-hand or refurbished products this Black Friday (November 25). The online marketplace said it will promote only refurbished and pre-loved deals for Black Friday this year.

Dealers and auctioneers seeking to promote the environmental benefits of buying second-hand to their clients are welcome to use the data published last year by Auction Technology Group (see box right) which quantifies the carbon emissions saved when purchasing popular items used rather than new.

Just how green is it to buy second-hand these days? A study conducted by Small World Consulting on behalf of *Antiques Trade Gazette* parent company Auction Technology Group set out to provide the answer.

Looking at a sample of items sold on thesaleroom.com, the consultants estimated the carbon emissions saved compared with purchasing similar items new.

Unlike some second-hand items such as cars, furniture has no in-use emissions and all of its embodied emissions from its original manufacture can be assumed to have already been 'written off' by the person who first bought the product. Thus, for example, the buyer of a standard wardrobe or dining table might save an estimated $460 \text{kg} - \text{nearly half a tonne} - \text{ of } \text{CO}_2 \text{ emissions compared with buying a similar one new as that}$

amount is about what it would take to manufacture the latter.


Given the annual carbon footprint of a person in the UK (which includes all their consumption and travel) is estimated to be about 13 tonnes*, saving almost half a tonne in one purchase by buying a dining table second-hand is a significant contribution to reducing personal carbon emissions. The emissions involved in manufacturing a new mechanical wristwatch are even higher, meaning that buying a used watch can save around 0.8 tonnes of CO₂ emissions.





Buyer secures a strongbox at last

An elaborate 17th century burr walnut coffre-fort (or strongbox) has been sold by Alexander George Antiques.

The coffre-fort had gone under the hammer at Woolley & Wallis in June this year, catalogued as a Franco-Flemish. These strongboxes are European in concept and many were made on the continent.

However, according to dealer Mark Pargeter (of Alexander George Antiques), the drawer construction suggested that it was an English work of the Charles II period. Pargeter said the quality of the workmanship meant it could be the work of one of two hands, and tracing the records, one name turned up as having a history of creating coffre-forts for clients: the Dutch or Flemish cabinetmaker Gerrit Jensen (fl.1667-d.1715), who worked in London.

The c.1675 chest, measuring 20in (51cm) wide, is decorated entirely in burr walnut veneers and adorned with thick foliate gilt brass mounts and strapwork. There is a gilt brass clasp opening on a push-spring release to reveal a crossbanded interior lined in cascading book-matched figured walnut with two

drop-down compartments, each concealing its original hidden box. Within the strongbox, a series of moving drawers and panels lead to ever more concealed compartments.

For the buyer, a UK client new to the gallery, it was the mechanics rather than the maker that appealed.

"I wanted a coffre-fort of this type because when I was about 12 I used to go and view one repeatedly," said the buyer, who wished to remain anonymous. "It was in a museum on the outskirts of Edinburgh called Lauriston Castle. The staff used to open it for me so that I could examine it thoroughly. I decided that one day I'd have one of my own, but I wanted a really good one and now that's just what I have."

The attribution to Jensen places it in a small

but significant group. The royal cabinetmaker to successive monarchs from James II to Queen Anne, his output was prodigious. Bills surviving in royal accounts are numerous but few firmly attributed pieces remain.

His first recorded customer, Charles Stuart, 3rd Duke of Richmond, paid £10 for a table, stands and strong box.

Jensen later supplied a walnut-veneered strongbox to Colonel James Graham of Levens Hall, Cumbria in 1688. The example in question is most closely related to a strongbox in Ham House in Surrey, which is made in kingwood but with identical hardware.

The chest at Alexander George Antiques sold for £26,800. Frances Allitt

W&H Peacock is back in St Neots

Bedfordshire auction house W&H Peacock is returning to Cambridgeshire after revamping its St Neots premises.

Following years of planning and months of building works it will re-open on November 30 for a first sale on December 1.

The venue on New Street in St Neots has been closed since April to allow for works that included upgrading a Victorian barn and adding a new building, creating two salerooms, a first floor café, display areas and facilities.

The site will hold two weekly auctions every Thursday comprising more than 1000 lots, as well as occasional specialist sales, valuation days and events throughout the year.

Beckmann could make German high

A Max Beckmann (1884-1950) self-portrait being offered at Grisebach in Berlin could set a German auction record for an artwork.

Selbstbildnis Gelb-Rosa (Self-Portrait in Yellow and Pink), an oil on canvas from 1943, is described by the saleroom as "a

masterpiece of international rank". The firm also stated that no comparable artwork has been offered on the German auction market since 1945.

It is guided at €20m-30m on December 1, the highest pitch for any artwork ever offered at a German auction.

Measuring 3ft lin × 22in (95 × 56cm), it was created by Beckmann during his exile in the Netherlands after he fled the Nazi regime.

He gave it to his wife Quappi and it remained with the Beckmann family for more than 40 years until later entering a Swiss private collection, from where it has been consigned to auction for the first time.

Beckmann self-portraits have made notable prices before, most prominently *Self Portrait with Trumpet* that sold for \$20.5m (£14.2m) at Sotheby's New York in 2001 and *Self-Portrait with Crystal Ball* that fetched \$15m (£7.92m) at the same saleroom in 2005.

Capital Gains Tax change hits antiques

Chancellor Jeremy Hunt has significantly reduced the capital gains tax allowance (CGT) in the UK government's Autumn Statement. The tax-free allowance will be reduced from £12,300 per year to £6000 from April 2023 and then to just £3000 from April 2024.

CGT – a tax on the profit made on the disposal of assets – is payable when people sell or gift certain items worth more than £6000 such as antiques or art. Individuals in the basic income tax band pay 10% on their gains (18% on gains realised with a residential property) while higher and additional rate taxpayers pay 20% on gains and 28% on

residential property. The decision to cut the tax-free allowance could lead to a decline in the number of disposals during unfavourable conditions or encourage sales before the new rates come in next year.

Messner buys Mount Everest 1953 memorabilia group

Memorabilia from the first successful ascent of Mount Everest in 1953 has been bought by Italian mountaineer, explorer, and author Reinhold Messner.

It sold within estimate at £12,000 (plus 25% buyer's premium) at a Hansons auction in Teddington, London, on October 29. The archive was amassed and owned for decades by Tom Stobart (1914-80), official cameraman on the 1953 expedition.

The items, which included an Everest Expedition food packet signed by John Hunt, who led the expedition, and fellow mountaineers Tenzing Norgay and Edmund Hillary, will now go on display at The Messner Mountain Museum in northern Italy.

Messner was the first person (with Peter Habeler) to climb

Mount Everest without the aid of oxygen, in May 1978, 25 years after the Hillary and Tenzing conquest. Two years later Messner made the first solo ascent.

The seller was Tom's son Patrick, 77, a company director from Nottingham. Tom, a British cameraman, filmmaker and author, captured the footage to create *The Conquest of Everest*, a film of the event. He received an OBE for his efforts.

The collection sold also included a painting of the Wheel of Life given to him by a Tibetan Buddhist monastery on the slopes of Everest and carried throughout the expedition; an original letter of invitation to meet members of

the Everest Expedition at London Airport, dated June 30, 1953; black and white photos; a pickaxe Tom used during a Tibetan hunt for the Abominable Snowman in 1954; and camera equipment.

'The Day the Music Died' poster sets record

The only known poster from 'The Day the Music Died' became the most expensive concert poster when it sold for a premium-inclusive \$447,000 (\$379,500) at Heritage Auctions of Dallas on November 11.

It is dated February 3, 1959, when Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens and the Big Bopper, JP Richardson, were on their way to a show at the Moorhead Armory, Minnesota, as part of the *Winter Dance Party* tour. Their single-engine Beechcraft Bonanza plane crashed into a corn field near Clear Lake, Iowa, and were all killed.

According to Heritage, it is the only known poster from a concert that incredibly was not cancelled on 'The Day the Music Died', as Don McLean famously called it in his *American Pie* song.

Heritage said the poster originally had been fixed to a telephone pole in advance of the 12th stop on the tour but fell to the ground. There are no pinholes, only the residue of the sticky material used to keep it in place. The maintenance man who found it placed the poster in a closet, face down, and forgot about it for 50 years. When he died his son sold it and the poster has gone through a poster dealer and another owner since.

The price beat the previous record hammer price of \$220,000 (£169,400), or \$275,000 with premium, previously held by a Beatles 1966 Shea Stadium concert poster, which sold also at Heritage on April 18.

It was the second time a *Winter Dance Party* poster had been offered through Heritage. In April 2020, a previously unseen

cardboard (not paper) poster from the January 25, 1959, show at the Kato Ballroom in Mankato, Minnesota, sold for a premium-inclusive \$125,000 (£101,250).

It had been thought that just five Winter Dance Party posters survive: three printed with dates before the crash and two after. The New York Met has an example for the performance in Fort Dodge, four days before the plane crash.



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Sex appeal: Iranian erotic poem

Sixteenth century single folio manuscript displays orgiastic spree in graphic detail

Objects that shed light on a previously neglected area of study are warmly welcomed by the judges of the annual *Asian Art in London* awards.

And this year that element of novelty was provided by a rare example of late 16th century Iranian erotica. South London auction house Roseberys (25% buyer's premium) had found this single folio manuscript of the collected works (*Kulliyat*) of the 13th century Persian poet and mystic, Sa'di of Shiraz in the collection of costume designer Anthony Powell (1935-2021).

The subject matter was not for everyone. The poem, which comprises 70 couplets, recounts the story of a young man who, seeking a divorce from his wife, embarks on an orgiastic spree with both the male and female members of her family. Elements of the narrative including

some creative sexual acts are pictured in this folio.

Domenico Ingenito, a professor of Persian literature at the University of California, helped with the cataloguing for this folio which was offered for sale as part of the Antiquities, Indian & Islamic Arts sale on October 28. He noted that Sa'di's obscene works have been little-studied and visual representations of such bawdy verses are extremely rare in Persian art, at least before the 17th century.

Stylistic features of this painting suggest that it was produced in Shiraz between the 1560s and the 1570s. Financial gain does not always follow academic importance but here, estimated at £3000-5000, the hammer price was £16,000.

Powerful tile pattern

Nonetheless, that was not the top price of the West Norwood sale.


That was the unexpected £88,000 bid for a rare 16th century tile from Ottoman Syria.

Around 12in (29cm) across and painted in black under a transparent blue glaze, it is decorated with one of the most recognisable Ottoman

decorative motifs: the *çintamani* pattern. Pairs of wavy lines and groups of three dots represent the pelts of the striped tiger and spotted leopard that came to evoke strength and power.

Tiles of this design were used c.1550-1600 in the decoration of various private apartments in the Topkapi palace in Istanbul. This example was also from the Powell estate and came with an estimate of £3000-4000.

Guided at £2000-2500 but sold at £12,000 was a Sikh embroidered square shawl or *amlikar rumal* depicting scenes from the life of

Iskander (Alexander the Great). Woven in pashmina and embroidered in wool in Kashmir in the first quarter of the 20th century, it replicates a famous shawl now in the Government Museum and Art Gallery in Chandigarh that was made for Maharaja Gulab Singh (r.1846-57) from Jammu and Kashmir and dated 1852

These embroidered pictorial shawls are thought to have been exhibition or presentation pieces rather than for wearing.

Plenty of bidding also came for a Chinese copy of Juz 19 of the Qur'an from the mid-16th century. Penned with five lines of black sini script to the page and an illuminated double page frontispiece in a typical Yunnan style, the colophon statement in red script on the last folio reads: It was copied by Shams al-Din ibn Musa al-Sini in the month of Safar of the year 953 AH (1546 AD) in the city of Yunnan one of the Chinese cities which has been honoured and blessed by Islam.

The leather binding with a blind tooled Islamic and Chinese influenced design was thought to be the original.

Part of a UK collection formed in the 1960s-70s, it brought £16,000 (estimate £1000-1500). ■

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Iranian incense burner helps to fuel 'white glove' sale

Chiswick Auctions (25% buyer's premium) was another of the London salerooms that held a designated sale in Islamic week – also on October 28.

A private single-owner collection focusing on the arts of Iran was offered in the morning session. It was the fourth tranche of this assemblage offered and all of the 89 lots found buyers – the second 'white glove' sale in Beatrice Campi's career since she founded the department in 2018.

Some fine pieces of metalwork were led by a 9in (22cm) incense burner in the form of a lion made in eastern Iran or Afghanistan in the 11th or 12th century.

Such zoomorphic openwork bronze incense burners are perhaps the best-known metalwork creations of the Seljuk period in Iran although only a handful of complete period examples are known. They would doubtless command six-figure sums. This example had cost a small fortune when sold in France a generation ago, but it is now understood to be a composite. While the body is period, the head and neck are a later addition.

However, this was amply reflected in the guide of £3000-5000 and it sold for £9000.

Written word

The importance of the written word in Islamic culture is often embodied in the sumptuous writing implements made for calligraphers.

A large Seljuk silver and copperinlaid bronze inkwell made in the 12th or 13th century is a particularly good example of a type that comes for sale with relative frequency and perhaps a royal commission. The decorative scheme includes the signs of the Zodiac, roundels with courtly subjects and three inscriptions from the maker reading *Amal-e al-Naqqash al-Khademin Amal-e Zaki* – translated as 'the work of the courtly painter, Zaki Bani or Raki Bani'.

The estimate was an affordable £800-1200 and it sold at £4200.

A moulded Timurid funerary tile with copper lustre decoration, probably made in Kashan in the late 15th or early 16th century, sheds light on a complex chapter of Iranian history which follows the Mongol invasion.

Production of the lustre wares which had flourished in Iran from the 12th to the 14th centuries had slowly resumed and kilns were rebuilt. Funerary tiles of the Timurid period are often inscribed with Persian verses commemorating the deceased, and in this case, provide factual details such as the name of the deceased (Mir Muhammad) and date of their death (three days before Nouruz). Once part of the well-known collection of Arthur Sackler (1913-87), and a published piece, it fetched £3000.

More numerous – and less academic – are the 19th century polychrome-painted pottery tiles produced in Tehran, Isfahan and Shiraz during the Qajar period. These have waxed and waned in the market across the past two decades but those with unusual subject matter remain highly desirable.

The finely painted example here in cobalt blue, manganese purple, and turquoise with five princely figures kneeling in a landscape below four

outsize birds was estimated at £800-1200 and it sold at £4200.

Qajar period arts, once dismissed as lacking academic rigour by Western collectors and unpopular in Iran after the revolution, were largely unfashionable when this collection was formed from the 1980s. Today, however, they are currently riding a wave of reappraisal and appreciation.

"The market can now receive them with the same enthusiasms with which they were collected," commented Campi.

The calligraphic highlight of this collection, which fetched £7000, were two composite Qajar muraqqa album pages with examples of the 'Six Scripts' of Arabic calligraphy.

These 'cut and paste' albums made up of admired examples of historic calligraphy and illumination were popular from the 16th century onwards: these specific examples include verses, prayers and qasida from the 15th to the 19th century, testifying to the endurance and success of this art form through the ages.

The final tranche of this collection that will be offered in April.

Calligraphy creations

The mixed-owner afternoon sale comprised objects from the vast geographic extent of the Islamic and Indian lands, including a group of 1000-year-old Qur'an vellum folios from the early years of Islam.

Together they show the evolution of calligraphy from the mature Kufic Abbasid style to the hybrid form of the so-called New Script, laying the ground for the development of the modern script in use today.

One of the earliest folios in the group was from a manuscript on vellum written in north Africa or the western Islamic world as early as the 9th-10th century.

The style of most of these Kufic folios tended to be strikingly simple with each folio containing just a few lines of text. The focus was simply on the written word and the austerity and beauty of the Kufic script itself, with discreet verse markers in green or gold and red dots for the vocalisation as the only embellishment

Here the 14 lines of text from the Sura al- Anbiya stand out for





the elegant use of *mashq* or *keshide* (extensions of the horizontal letters) that is used for aesthetic effect. Probably penned at one of the wealthiest Fatimid or Spanish Umayyad courts, it got away at the top estimate of £7000.

There was a full five minutes of bidding from £200 up to £5000 for a miniature brass book and case, a personal devotional object produced in India in the 19th century.

Engraved in Arabic across five flat sheets of brass, each just 3½ x 3in (9 x 7cm), are the key verses from the Qur'an – the al-Fatiha susa, the Yasin, the Throne Verse – and charts containing the names of Allah. It was incomplete but at least two bidders were aware of its significance, and perhaps the patron for which it was made.

Among a strong selection of Indian paintings was an illustration from a *Rasika Priya* series, the epic story of love, longing and regret, painted in Mandi c.1810-20. The scene of Radha and Krishna in an intimate embrace on a moonlit terrace is attributable to influential Guler court painter Sajnu.

This illustration, bursting with

lively incidental detail (two women look down on the couple and gossip) was purchased from the private collection of Francisco Garcia in New York and came for sale from a US collection. It had a guide of £4000-6000 and brought £10,000.

bracelets - £4500.

The auction house referenced a similar folio attributed to Sajnu sold at Sotheby's New York in 2016 for \$42,000.

Ganesha sculpture

A fine example of north Indian medieval sandstone sculpture depicting the Hindu elephantheaded god Ganesha took £12,000. The sculpture – that found plenty of admirers when displayed in the window of Chiswick's new saleroom – was possibly once part of a stele or architectural niche carved in the 12th or 13th century Mathura.

It shows the bejewelled 'Remover of Obstacles' standing with a floral medallion as halo, six of his arms and hands still intact. Provenance is important in this market and this piece was understood to have been purchased by the uncle of the vendor at Spink in the 1970s. An old

inventory sticker reads The Roland-Geist Collection, Gift of George Roland.

9. Pair of navratna gem-encrusted gold and champleve enamel arm

It had previously gone unsold with a reserve of £7000 at a saleroom on the south coast of England but here sold to a European collector of Hindu sculpture well above estimate.

The Indian lot used by Chiswick Auctions as its main promotional image during Asian Art in London was a pair of gem-encrusted gold and champleve enamel arm bracelets (bazubands). Expected to bring £5000-7000, they sold at £4500.

The nine gemstones featured (ruby, pearl, coral, garnet, blue sapphire, cat's eye, yellow topaz, emerald and diamond) are the so-called *navratna* gems that represent the nine celestial bodies of Hindu astrology. Carefully arranged to follow cosmological rules, each panel is centred by a ruby: the gem of the solar deity Surya.

A favourite adornment of the Mughal court, this pair was made in Jaipur in the first half of the 19th century and has survived in excellent condition.



Mirror reflects Hope design

Estimated at £800-1200, this Regency giltwood and ebonised convex wall mirror sold at £12,500 at Toovey's (24.5% buyer's premium) of Washington, West Sussex, on November 3

These come for sale with some frequency, but this example was a good size at 4ft 7in (1.38m) high and of note for its design that was close to the work of Dutch and British interior decorator Thomas Hope (1769-1831).

Particularly admired was the apron with its central mask head issuing winged leopard heads. Detailed photographs supplied by the auction house suggested it will need some significant restoration before it is returned to its former glory.

'For Emperor John' Lennon

This German brown leather and plated metal hip flask has the inscription Fur Kaiser John Zu Seinem Geburtstag 9. Okt 1960 Von Stu, which translates as 'For Emperor John on his Birthday 9 Oct 1960, By Stu'.

Adhered to the back is a paper inscription detailing its history: it had been a gift from Stuart Sutcliffe to John Lennon on his 20th birthday while The Beatles were playing in Hamburg.

It was during the Beatles' Hamburg era (August 1960 to December 1962), that the band played over 250 nights

with Sutcliffe playing bass for the band before he left to pursue an art career. He died in 1962.

Lennon later re-gifted the flask to Geoff Mohammed, one of his friends from art college, who sold the flask during the mid-1960s.

It came to auction at entertainment memorabilia specialist Prop Store (25% buyer's premium) in Rickmansworth on November 3-6.

The estimate was £4000-6000 but it found a buyer via thesaleroom.com at £18,000.

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Traditional can suit modern taste

Picture specialist hails 'very encouraging' multi-estimate prices for old-school landscapes

A clutch of good-quality traditional landscapes exceeded hopes at Exeter saleroom Bearnes Hampton & Littlewood (25% buyer's premium).

The October II auction included a pair of wooded landscapes in oils attributed to John White Abbott (1763-1851) and four mountain views by Alfred Heaton Cooper (1864-1929) with both lots selling for multiestimate sums.

Abbott, a local surgeon and apothecary who became a keen amateur painter primarily known for his watercolours, is believed to have painted the wooded landscapes at the Devon estate Fordlands, which he inherited in 1825.

The pair came from a private house and had previously sold at Sotheby's in 1958 catalogued as by the artist. Estimated at £400-600, they were knocked down to an online bidder from London at £2400.

BH&L picture specialist Charlotte Russell described the oils as "very finely handled and quite special up close" and "the sort of paintings you continue to return to for another look, with real atmosphere about them".

She added: "Even though they are oils, they are still quite characteristic of White Abbott's oeuvre which includes many similarly well-observed, fairly moody studies of these sorts of 'looming' trees, which seem to have been a subject he returned to often. A similar study, also in oil, is in the Tate collection."

The four mountain views by

Heaton Cooper, including a 19 x 13in (49 x 34cm) watercolour of an upland wooded river scene, were offered in a single lot estimated at just £120-160. Consigned from a deceased estate and with competitive bidding across all platforms, they sold online for £2900 to a buyer in the Lake District

"The watercolours were also well preserved, with very striking colouring, which really does add to the appeal of watercolours as they sometimes lose some of that initial vibrancy," said Russell.

Heaton Cooper, who studied under George Clausen, travelled widely in Europe, living for a short stint in Norway before settling in the Lake District where he sold his Cumbrian landscapes to tourists. Although the scenes at BH&L were unidentified, the location of the buyer suggests a particular connection.

After the sale, Russell said: "It was very encouraging to see that the market for good-quality traditional landscapes is still so buoyant."



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Buyers thrill to 3D

Modern and Contemporary art collectors are increasingly willing to consider sculpture, creating a strong and dynamic market, as *Alex Capon* reports

When it comes to Modern and Contemporary sales, sculpture has been making its presence felt more heavily over the last five to 10 years.

If you pick up an auction catalogue from a recent sale in this sector and compare it to an equivalent one from over a decade ago, not only will you see more sculpture lots on offer in what was previously a market more heavily tilted towards paintings, but also their contribution by value to many of these events has increased by an even greater amount.

Among the recent sales reflecting this was Lyon & Turnbull's (26%/25% buyer's premium) latest Modern Made sale at Mall Galleries in London on October 28.

Sculptures played a prominent role with a number of bringing either strong bidding contests or high prices, or both.

L&T's head of sale Philip Smith said: "The current state of the market is strong and dynamic, and has been growing in stature over the last decade, benefiting from changing tastes including the popularity of sculpture parks.

"Our own sales, such as Modern Made, reflect this growing appreciation, and the importance of three-dimensional art is reflected in the strong prices we are achieving for Modern British, European and American sculpture when presented in the right context. We're passionate about growing this field and area of expertise."


More mini Mitoraj

Collectors of sculptures tend to judge individual lots based on form, patination and how much the subject 'resonates' or stands out in a modern interior (or exterior in terms of outdoor sculpture).

One of the lots bringing competition at L&T was a bronze titled *Argos* by the Polish sculptor **Igor Mitoraj (1944-2014)**.

Part of an edition of eight from 1987, it was an example from a series of works depicting figures with bandaged heads that was a key part of his oeuvre. One of the most famous is *Testa Addormentata* from 1983 which is on public display outside West Wintergarden in London's Canary Wharf.

The figure at L&T was much smaller, measuring 15½in (40cm) high, and was a diminutive sculpture by the standards of Mitoraj who tended to work on a monumental scale.



But, even still, the lot seemed to sum up many of the reasons buyers are currently keen to plant their money into modern sculpture: it was an eyecatching work that exemplified what his obituary in *The Guardian* referred to as his 'accessible and enigmatic' approach.

It also had an appeal as a credible investment. Mitoraj, who studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Kraków but left for France in 1968 and later moved to Italy, has a strong following in his homeland (in 2012 he received the Commander's Cross of the Order of Polonia Restituta, one of Poland's highest orders), but he also established a reputation in the UK and elsewhere in Europe.

In the UK he exhibited works including at the British Museum, the Yorkshire Sculpture Park near Wakefield and Chatsworth House in Derbyshire.

He described his works as "not concerned with recreating what has already been done but simply an attempt to shape into familiar forms the drama of life" – which seems to sit well with the modern zeitgeist. This is among the reasons his prices have risen over recent times, even though his prolific output means that the supply is plentiful.

Mitoraj's *Argos* sculptures have emerged at auction before, including one that fetched \$30,000 (£19,015) at Sotheby's New York in 2012.

At L&T the estimate was set at £10,000-15,000 and, after attracting interest from a number of parties, was knocked down at £28,000 to a European dealer. The sum was the highest so far for this edition and, while not huge judging by Mitoraj's highest prices (which can reach six figures for his large-scale bronzes), was a good price for a work on this smaller scale.

Paolozzi seven up

The L&T auction also featured seven sculptural works by Sir Eduardo Paolozzi (1924-2005), six of which sold for a hammer total of £55,900.

All bar one had formerly been part of the collection of British furniture and interior designer Zeev Aram who died in March last year.

The great variety of Paolozzi's three-dimensional output means prices for the Scottish pop art pioneer's sculptures fall across a wide range. Here a classical foot and hand, both cast in plaster, were offered separately with guides of £600-800 but sold for £800 and £1000 respectively.

Requiring a higher bid to secure it was a small untitled abstract sculpture that was believed to be unique. Dating from c.1967-9, the polished bronze form measured 11½in (30cm) high including the wooden base and was stamped with the Noack Berlin foundry mark. It was an unusual work to

emerge – most of his many sculptures consist of Paolozzi's trademark combination of machinery and humanoid forms – although one small untitled metal abstract with a vague similarity to the current work did appear at Sotheby's in 2005, selling at £3000.

While it cannot have been an easy work to estimate, L&T's pitch proved accurate when, against predictions of £3000-5000, it sold at £4400 to a UK private buyer.

The top-selling Paolozzi lot was a later work but again highly unusual in the artist's canon. *Sculptor's Chair* from 1987 was an extraordinary construction made from numerous materials: beech, birch plywood, rope, linen, nylon cord, metal hooks and nails. It even featured miniature Christmas cracker plastic tools contained within one of the panelled wooden boxes.

Paolozzi stated: "It is a chair, it is a toolbox, I made it from orange crates. The backrest hangs on the wall to make shelves. The boxes pull out for a bed."

It was commissioned by Zeev Aram for the show that celebrated the 23rd anniversary exhibition of his company Aram Designs (other works by artists such as Peter Blake, Allen Jones, Norman Foster and Jasper Morrison also featured). In the catalogue for that exhibition

Paolozzi wrote that he intended the basic wooden forms to have "an improvised look" that was a nod to the early still life constructions of Picasso or Rodchenko.

Although an atypical production, the fact that it was a highly personal work – as well as a statement piece, or certainly a talking point at least – meant it drew considerable interest against the £8000-12,000 estimate.

After an eager contest, it was knocked down at £24,000 to a UK buyer.

Two to three dimensions

Some good action also came the week before among the 20 sculptures on offer at **Dreweatts'** (25% buyer's premium) Modern and Contemporary art auction on October 19.

Head of sale Francesca Whitham said: "The market for Modern and Contemporary sculpture has been on an upwards trajectory over the last five to 10 years.

"Confidence has continued to grow among collectors to push the boundaries of opportunity by extending their collecting habits past pictures into three-dimensional, tangible objects which complement their collection and tastes."

One work that exemplified these trends was a small bronze titled *Poldhu* by British abstract sculptor **Denis Mitchell (1912-93)**.

The St Ives sculptor has witnessed a rise in demand not unlike that of fellow proponent of Cornish abstraction Dame Barbara Hepworth (1903-75), albeit further down the price scale.

The 6¼in (17cm) circular form on a slate base here was part of an edition of seven from 1980.

The title refers to an area in south Cornwall near the Lizard Peninsula which has a sweeping cove and green fields beyond. It is now a popular beach sought out by tourists in the summer.

Artprice records just one sale at auction of this edition: an example that fetched £7500 at Bonhams in 2013. The vendor had purchased this one from London dealership Flowers Gallery in 2016 and here it was estimated at £4000-6000.

After bringing decent interest it sold at £8000 to a UK private buyer.

The price, although lower than the 2013 sum when taking inflation into account, was the second highest for one of Mitchell's sculptures on this scale. The highest remains the £11,000 for *Variations on a Theme No. II*, part of an edition of nine, that sold at David Lay last December.

Epstein's Dolores

An earlier bronze at the auction that also sold to a private buyer was a cast of **Jacob Epstein**'s (1880-1959) Fourth Portrait of Dolores which took £4200. It was estimated at £4000-6000.

The head study was conceived in 1923 – the fourth of six studies made by Epstein of the famous artist's model known as Dolores (her real name was Norine Fournier Lattimore).

One example from this fourth edition had made £8000 at Sotheby's in 2016 but this one had some rubbing, loss and glue residue to the marble base and the head was free-standing rather than 'floating' on a support as was the case with the Sotheby's version.

Nevertheless, examples of this work do not appear at auction very often and it fetched the second-highest sum for the edition according to Artprice.



Enwonwu (1917-94) have become a valuable proposition.

Two recent examples by the influential Nigerian artist demonstrated this when they appeared at **Roseberys' (25% buyer's premium)** Modern British & 20th Century Art in south London on October 11.

They came to auction having been given by the artist to a member of the vendor's family and both had plaques to the base giving the title.

Both were wooden carvings for which Enwonwu had created a smooth surface to emphasise the sinuous forms and exude a sense of motion.

First up was *Woman and Afele*, measured 22in (56cm) high. It surpassed a £10,000-15,000 estimate and was knocked down at £30,000.

The following lot, Female Form II, was a bit larger at 2ft 3in (69cm) high. Against the same pitch, it took £34,000.

Double buy

Both lots sold to the same London-based specialist collector, with the sums fetched, while some way off the six-figure prices made by Enwonwu's larger sculptures, looking strong for works of this size.

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

Betjeman and Lowry immortalised in bronze

Two sculptures of well-known 20th century British cultural figures drew attention at different regional sales recently.

A small bronze by Martin Jennings (b.1957) of the poet Sir John Betjeman was offered at Dreweatts (25% buyer's premium) in Newbury on October 19.

It was a reduced model of his larger-than-life version which has stood in St Pancras station since the opening of the Eurostar terminal in 2007 (it measures over 8ft high).

The founder of The Victorian Society, Betjeman was passionate about the railways and Victorian architecture and he campaigned to save the station from demolition in the 1960s.

Building a rapport

Speaking about the process behind creating the statue, Jennings said: "Part of my intention was to make a triangular relationship between sculpture, poetry and architecture, so that the figure is directly related to the building."

As part of this approach, Betjeman's coat-tail in the sculpture was designed to emulate the shape of the station's Barlow train shed roof.

The 16 x 5¾in (41 x 15cm) high figure in Newbury, which was signed and stamped to the base, was one of an edition of 20 released by Pangolin Editions.

Works by Jennings are almost exclusively sold on the primary market currently and few have ever appeared at auction. A small bronze model of fellow poet Philip Larkin though did appear at Mallams of Oxford in 2015, making £800.

The auction house plumped for a £2000-3000 estimate but, after a good competition, it was eventually knocked down at £6000 to a UK private buyer.

Head of sale Francesca Whitham said: "The price achieved for the piece by Jennings was particularly exciting, being a contemporary artist on the secondary market. The work was sold alongside the announcement that Jennings was commissioned to design the royal mint depicting King Charles III; this certainly raised the profile of the artist and press around the sculpture."

Lowry gets ahead

Meanwhile, the Tennants (22% buyer's premium) sale of Modern & Contemporary Art on October

15 featured a head study of artist LS Lowry.

The bronze by **Samuel Tonkiss (1909-92)**, which measured 13in (33cm) high (including the base), was formerly owned by a lady from the north west of England.

It was part of an edition of 36 produced in 1975 and modelled on an earlier Lowry head sculpted by Tonkiss in 1971 which is in the National Portrait Gallery.

Tonkiss was born in Shropshire and later worked as a journalist in Todmorden in West Yorkshire (he was editor of the *Todmorden News and* Advertiser for 21 years). Encouraged by the local artist and writer William Holt and sculptor Dante Alberti, at the age of 50 he started creating clay sculptures and produced a series of portrait busts, many of which were cast in small limited editions such as this.

With his head studies admired for their resemblance and sensitivity, he was 'never out of work' and, as well as Lowry, Tonkiss was commissioned to produced bronzes of the likes of the Duke of Edinburgh, Sir Edward Elgar, Bertrand Russell, John Cockcroft and even Nikita Kruschev (a head for the Soviet Embassy in London).

Examples of the Lowry bronze have appeared at auction on at least a dozen occasions with the highest sum so far being the £3000 for an example which appeared at Sotheby's back in 2000.

Here the estimate was set at £700-1000 and it was knocked down at £2200 to a private client from the north of England. This was the joint-second-highest price for the edition according to Artprice – another version made the same hammer price at Bonhams in 2019.

Wells took steps to a varied career

A British subject born in Rio de Janeiro, **Reginald Fairfax Wells (1877-1951)** studied sculpture at the South Kensington School of Art in the 1890s and then studio pottery at Camberwell School of Arts and Crafts.

Today considered one of the first true studio potters working on an entirely independent basis, he was also variously a sculptor, aircraft manufacturer and architect.

This diminutive bronze of a child learning to walk, titled *First Steps*, is a 4in (11cm) model first illustrated in the *Studio Yearbook* 1903 and again at the *Sixth Exhibition of the International Society of Sculptors, Painters and Gravers* in London, 1906.

Signed in the cast and applied with a Valsuani foundry mark, it proved something of a sleeper when offered with a guide of £100-150 at **Southgate Auction Rooms (24% buyer's premium)** in north London on October 24. It made £1700 – a similar sum to a cast of this model with a mid-brown patination sold for £1800 at Lyon & Turnbull in Edinburgh in November 2020.

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Bugatti for better and Wurst

Rembrandt Bugatti (1884-1916) is well

known as an animalier sculptor creating studies of exotic animals that he observed in the zoos at Antwerp and at the Jardin des Plantes in Paris.

This particular bronze has a more personal slant. It depicts the artist's bassett hound. Wurst. The lost wax cast by Hebrard, numbered four in an edition of five from a model created in 1906, is signed and measures 10in (25cm) high x 21in (53cm) wide.

Estimated at **€30,000-50,000** in a

sale held by Beausssant Lefèvre (28% buyer's premium inc VAT) at Drouot in on October 21, it leapfrogged that guideline to sell for €235,000 (£204,350).

Pomodoro in the round

This 1966 work by the Italian sculptor **Arnaldo** Pomodoro (b.1926) will feature in Koller's Post War and Contemporary sale on December 1 in Zurich.

SFERA is an 11in (27cm) diameter golden patinated bronze sphere with a polished exterior partly opened to reveal carved individual mechanical-like elements. The sculpture, which comes from a Swiss private collection, has the incised signature, title, date and number Arnaldo Pomodoro SFERA 1966 - 1/2 on the pleixiglass base. Estimate SFr150,000-200,000.

Chadwick proved his mettle

A welding course was to have a lasting effect on the artistic development of the British sculptor Lynn Chadwick (1914-2003).

He had trained as a draughtsman and after the war he worked as a designer of textiles, furniture and stands for trade fairs, before devoting himself to creating works of art.

The knowledge he acquired at the welding school of the British Oxygen Company enabled him to produce his first welded sculptures in 1951.

He soon attracted the interest of international art experts, taking part at the Venice Biennale on several occasions, winning the international prize for sculpture there in 1956.



In the early 1970s, he set up his own bronze foundry at his country residence in Gloucestershire. Among the works he created there were the life-sized Sitting Figures II, an abstract, almost cubist bronze couple which he cast in an edition of six in 1979-80.

On December 1 Grisebach in Berlin is looking for a buyer for number five of the series. In contrast to other related pieces, where the seated couple are connected by a bench, these 6ft 4in (1.93m) high figures are seated independently from another. They have the characteristic geometric heads of most of Chadwick's figures: the man's head is rectangular, the woman's triangular.

Estimate **€800,000-1.2m**.

Filled to the brim with books

First part of a collection which covered the walls and cellar of two whole flats


Brought up in Bath and first inspired by architectural studies during a family visit to northern Italy, Derek Gibson (1936-2021) – who instead went on to become an eminent cardiologist – was also a musician, collector, traveller and authority on all sorts of subjects, from early engineering to Biggles.

Always wanting to find out everything he could about any new enthusiasm, he lined the walls of two flats, along with the cellar of one of them, with bookshelves and books

"Not for him Google. He was surrounded by all he needed to know...," said the auction house Forum (25/20/12.5% buyer's premium) of south London, which offered a Part 1 selection of works from Gibson's library on October 20 (a selection of highlights is shown here).

1. John Rocque's great, 24-sheet *Plan of the Cities of London and Westminster...*, a second edition of c.1749 – **£47,000** at Forum.

2. Seen here are the handsome, now rebacked contemporary mottled calf binding bearing the arms of Louis XIV of a copy of the first and only edition of Jules Hardouin-Mansart's *L'Eglise des Invalides* of c.1680, overlain by one of the work's 14 etched and engraved plates and plans, four of them double-page and eight folding. They illustrate sections of the chapel and were used to calculate estimates of the materials needed for its construction, which was completed in 1691. It sold at £6000.

3. The panelled calf binding, now lacking the brass clasps to the lower cover and rebacked to preserve the original, compartmented backstrip, of a 1475, second Venetian edition of St Augustine's *De civitate dei* – a work which both Luther and Calvin determined to be a foundation work of Protestantism. Once part of Joost Ritman's 'Bibliotheca Philosophica Hermetica', it sold for **£13,000**.

4. Sold at **£5500** was a scrap album of c.1828 that contained some 60 caricatures by William Heath and others. Seen here is a comic comment on fashion fads by William Heath, 'A Correct View of the New Machine for Winding Up the Ladies'.

5. A spread from a 1794 first (in a modern binding) of Humphrey Repton's *Sketches and Hints on Landscape Gardening...* at £12,000.

6. Billed as an 18th century cartographic masterpiece, Joseph Daniel von Huber's 24-part, bird's-eye perspective plan of Vienna – one whose richly inked impressions lend the image a three-dimensional feel – was completed in 1778. It made £12,000.

7. Dating from 1830, and illustrated with engraved and lithographed plates and plans, one of the first edition copies of Sir John Soane's Description of the House and Museum on the North Side of Lincoln's-Inn-Fields that were privately printed for presentation was sold at £5500. It was inscribed for Sir Charles Flint, Private Secretary to the Duke of Wellington and Under Secretary of

State for Ireland.

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Agricultural library bears fruit

The Glaisdale Library, offered at auction on September 30 by Tennants (22% buyer's premium), was the collection of Martin Henry Burtt, a well-known figure in the Yorkshire and indeed national agricultural worlds.

At his farm on the North York Moors he was renowned for his innovative and forward-thinking approach. He was the first to own a Charolais bull and the first to bring in Texel sheep, both of which are now firmly established on the region's farms.

And for several decades Burtt was also a familiar face in auction houses and on the premises of book dealers and, indeed, binders.

Some of the much-loved treasures that filled his bookshelves. many of them from distinguished and noble collections, are noted and illustrated here.

Markham work

Sold at £2500 was a volume in a rebacked calf binding that contained a 1635 second edition of Gervase Markham's The English Husbandman. It was one that brought together for the first time the two original parts and included in the latter, with separate title and pagination, a treatise on angling and cockfighting called 'The Pleasure of Princes...'

Bid to £1600 was a 1658 first of Adolphus Speed's Adam Out of Eden, or... the advancement of husbandry, one of whose more curious inclusions was a discussion on opium traps for deer.

In a 19th century binding, a 1606, second English edition of Charles

Estienne and Jean Liebault's Maison Rustique, or the Country

Farme, a work that also contains a section on game hunting and falconry, realised £1300.

A copy of the 1616, third English edition of that work, the first to be edited by Gervase Markham, sold a little over high estimate at £800.

Bound as one volume were first editions of the two small quarto issues of John Houghton's Collection of Letters for the Improvement of Husbandry and Trade.

Dating from the years 1681-84, they present all 16 published parts of what amounted to the first known trade and agricultural periodical one of which included an essay on bread by John Evelyn. That lot sold at £1900.


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



Onslows' 38th winter auction of vintage posters on November 25 includes a scarce Second World War propaganda poster known worldwide as the Blonde Bombshell. This was the first of three posters designed by Abram Games to promote joining the Auxiliary Territorial Service.

Deemed to be overly glamorous and therefore provocative, the government banned this poster after its issue in 1941, replacing it with a plain photographic poster depicting a serving member of the ATS. The second design came in 1942 and was considered 'too Soviet' by Winston Churchill. The third appeared in 1943 employing a statuesque yet

sober style which met with the official seal of approval. Estimate £5000-6000.

It was produced at a turbulent moment in British political history shortly after the Act of Settlement secured the Protestant succession and parliamentary system of government. Parliament, split between the strong Tory majority and the Whigs, had been prorogued in June but by September the king was being pressed with calling an election - the second in one year.

This admission ticket to the Coronation of George IV on July 19. 1821, is guided at **£300-600** as part of the timed online Books and Works on Paper sale at Southgate Auction Rooms in London that closes on November 30.

Originally scheduled for August 1, 1820, the ceremony at Westminster Abbey had been postponed due to the parliamentary proceedings of George's estranged wife Caroline of Brunswick.

In accordance with George's lavish personal tastes, the coronation was the most extravagant ever staged with

a total cost of £238,000. Caroline was turned away at the door and died two weeks later.

A similar ticket to the Coronation banquet (the last of its type) held at Westminster Hall is estimated at £250-500.

This medieval ring will be offered by Mayfair saleroom Noonans on November 29, estimated at £30,000-40,000.

This ring is in "almost perfect condition", says Noonans, and has an inverted diamond set into the raised bezel so that it comes to a point. The hoop is composed of two neatly entwined bands symbolising the union of the couple. Inside the band is an inscription in French ieo vos tien foi tenes le moy ('I hold your faith, hold mine'). It was found by a metal detectorist in a Dorset field. The location was acquired by Henry de Broc (or de la Brook) from

Reginald de Mohun (1206-58), feudal baron of Dunster in Somerset, who had inherited this land from his first wife Hawise Fleming, daughter and heiress of William Fleming. It then passed by descent through the Brook family, coming into the possession of the wealthy landowner Sir Thomas Brook (c.1355-1418).



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Tragic times brought inspiration

Ahead of home front exhibition dealer says the war transformed often mundane art styles

by Frances Allitt

The cover of **Sim Fine Art**'s latest catalogue of British wartime pictures is devoted to *These Laid the World Away*, an oil painting by Anna Zinkeisen (1901-76).

The catalogue and accompanying exhibition, running from November 28 to December 8 at The Gallery in Shepherd Market, is devoted to the home front – though Zinkeisen's painting is distinctly otherworldly.

In the allegorical scene, an anonymous soldier is supported in a Christ-like pose by an androgynous figure. He sits astride a forming mushroom cloud while scenes of war and grief carry on in the background.

Zinkeisen, a Scottish artist, completed many commissions during the Second World War working for the Order of St John at St Mary's Hospital in Paddington as a casualty nurse as well as a medical artist. However, this picture was not one of her official works, but a personal response to the war.

Dealer Andrew Sim says: "One of the things that strikes me about the artists involved [in the show] is that the war brought out the best in them. A good example of this is my cover piece by Anna Zinkeisen, whose pre-war work consisted of rather vapid society portraits and daft mock-Regency frippery, but who was transformed by the war into a serious artist"

He calls it "one of the most powerful reflections on the futility of war that I know". For him, it is arguably her masterpiece.

Factory settings


In focusing on wartime efforts in Britain, the catalogue delves into some unusual settings. A series by Henry Rushbury (1889-1968) depicts a magnesite factory with vast purpose-built tanks and the complex workings of a crushing plant as well as other factory and mining scenes.

Elsewhere in the catalogue are more familiar pictures of the British home front. Two of these are by Roland Vivian Pitchforth (1895-1982), whom Sim argues also did the best work of his career during the War

One of the things that strikes me about the artists involved is that the war brought out the best in them during a six-month salaried role with the Ministry of Information. The resulting watercolours, most of which are now in the Imperial War Museum, are large and vivid, though after the war, Sim says, Pitchforth's compositions became "unrecognisably colourless and empty".

Other scenes include factory interiors, a paratrooper crashlanding in an ornamental pond, and a still-life of an air raid warden's equipment.

This year marks the 13th annual edition of Sim's *Holding the Line* series.

Pictures of Britain at war have an enduring interest for both private buyers and museums/public collections – The catalogues have resulted in a string of sales to major institutions including the Tate, Science Museum, National Portrait Gallery, Imperial War Museum, National Maritime Museum and RAF Museum.

Most recently, the Canadian War Museum purchased a triptych of oils titled the *Artillery Barrage* by Ronald Barr, a British First World War artist to emigrated to Canada.

Sim's catalogues are extensively researched and colourfully written, providing stories and background to intrigue those keen to learn instead of (or as well as) buy.

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Super sampler selection in Oxfordshire

Oxfordshire dealership Witney Antiques' latest exhibition features early example of band samplers. The show runs until November 26 offering more than 75 examples of these long, thin needlework pieces made in the 17th and early 18th centuries.

Among the highlights is an 8in x 2ft 5½in (21 x 75cm) sampler by Ann Fisher dated 1693.

Worked on unbleached linen in coloured silks, it has been framed to show off part of the brightly coloured, unfaded back. Five bands of uppercase alphabets, six floral bands and several lines of verse are among the stitching found in various techniques: cross, satin, running and button hole among others.

Fisher was one of at least seven daughters and this sampler belongs to a group of integrated band samplers worked by girls whose families were associated with the Devonshire

London buying trip led

to Venice Expecting to collect a bureau advertised

on marketplace Gumtree, a dealer spotted two 18th century Venetian scenes leaning against a wall in the home he visited.

After buying the bureau, dealer Steven Fyfe of **Spencelayhs** of Cambridgeshire had come for, he then negotiated the purchase of the two very dusty oil

He said: "I attended a property in Belgravia to collect a 19th century William and Mary-style walnut bureau on stand which was advertised online, and after enquiring if they had any other items that they were considering selling I was quite shocked to see these two pictures.

"Immediately the oils stood out as mid-18th century. I then was told that in fact the paintings once belonged to the sellers' ancestor, the British illustrator and landscapist Cecil Gordon Lawson (1849-82) who resided at 15 Cheyne Walk, London, and was a neighbour and friend to Gabriel Charles Dante Rossetti."

The paintings, relined in the 19th century by picture restorer George Morrill (c.1812-65), are two views of Venice's Grand Canal.

Fyfe studied the pictures and completed his own research, eventually attributing the works to a follower of The Master of The Langmatt Foundation Views, an artist now known to be Apollonio Domenichini

(Domenichini was known as the 'Master of the Langmatt Foundation Views' after the artist's seven views of Venice in the Langmatt Foundation, Zurich.)

Spencelayhs will now offer the pictures for £36,000. And of course the 19th century bureau is also for sale - at a price

Fyfe added: "To find the bureau on Gumtree is fab but the fact it led me to these fantastic artworks just shows you what's still out there.'



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Delivering the goods

With Christmas deadlines coming up fast – not to mention the overall challenges of Brexit, ever-rising costs and environmental concerns – shipping and packing is a big factor to consider when making purchases, *Laura Chesters* reports

Panic buying gifts on Christmas Eve afternoon is not possible when you are buying online but internet shoppers still need to make sure that what they are acquiring will make it to the intended recipient in time for the big day.

Royal Mail has already published its last posting dates ahead of the Christmas rush, with December 19 the last day for second class post and December 21 for first. Last-minute buyers can wait as late as Friday, December 23, if they are willing to stump up for 'Special Delivery Guaranteed'. But would you want to risk it?

Savvy shoppers shouldn't take risks, James Simmons, marketing manager for delivery firm Mail Boxes Etc, says. "With the festive season fast approaching, many people are looking to the auction sector for quirky, retro and one-of-a-kind Christmas gifts, and it's never too soon to secure the right thing.

"With postal strikes continuing to threaten deliveries in the coming weeks, it's not a good idea to take any risks with shipping."

Jeremy Parnham at Postit4me concurs: "In the

run-up to the Christmas period, when the global logistics networks are under maximum pressure, it is crucial to plan ahead and work out the best service for you.

"The advice is always to check last posting days, carrier options and expected transit times with your posting partner. If your items are being delivered outside the UK you should also discuss local holidays and customs thresholds and make sure that you include a recipient contact details as failure to do so may delay final mile delivery."

Many of the delivery firms have noticed increased demand already.

Graeme Rhodes, head of marketing at Pack & Send UK, says: "With exchange rates currently making UK art and antiques good value for international buyers and collectors it is no surprise that we are increasingly seeing shipping requests for pieces to be delivered as Christmas gifts. There are also several seasonal fairs and exhibitions that stimulate higher demand at this time of year as well. But we have visibility of the demand on favoured shipping routes and typical customs lead times to help plan crucial 'last sending' days for time-sensitive Christmas deliveries."

Plan ahead

For auction houses, the run-up to Christmas is not necessarily busier than any other time, but planning ahead is still key.

Alexandra Whittaker, communications and PR manager at Birmingham auction house Fellows, says: "Most weeks we sell upwards of 1000 lots of which we post out around 95% quickly and for





free. It's worth noting that Christmas isn't any busier for us than any other time of the year.

"But in terms of preparing our buyers, we make sure that we plan our last auction of the year to take place before the final postage days of the year and communicate the dates with them through our marketing channels. This means that if someone pays promptly, they should receive their purchases before Christmas.

"We process invoices the evening the auction finishes so many will pay overnight and receive their parcels in two days. This is, of course, dependent on reliable service from the Royal Mail and other service providers."

Fellows employs a full time shipping coordinator and the team works together with a customer service and dispatch assistant.

Whittaker adds: "As a company, we have invested heavily in our infrastructure and systems to make our shipping process seamless."

With a month until Christmas there is no great urgency yet, but do not be complacent if you want that special item to arrive in time.

How rising challenges can be overcome

Since Britain left the EU on January 31, 2020, and the transition period ended on December 31 that year, the way goods are moved between the UK and the EU has changed – costing more money and time.

When once a simple trip in a van could be completed with very little hassle for a dealer, now the planning involved has meant many traders are reducing the number of trips they make.

The cost of shipping has doubled, the time it takes to complete the forms is now many hours rather than 40 minutes or so and the administrative burden is causing increasing headaches. Many dealers are still able to complete buying trips themselves (or travelling with their stock to fairs) but it has taken a lot of extra time and resource to understand the new requirements.

So will prices reduce, even if the admin does not? The price of shipping is expected to remain high and even increase further. Edouard Gouin, co-founder and CEO of Convelio, says: "Covid brought a period of high freight prices due to higher demand and lower capacity. While we're seeing the beginning of a decrease in air freight prices, courier and sea freight prices remain significantly higher than pre-Covid. Capacity has still not returned to pre-Covid levels and general courier companies are expected to increase their prices by 7-8% in 2023."

However, there was one reprieve during 2022: the rule requiring a customs declaration to be made in advance of import (known as an 'entry summary declaration' or ENS, concerning the safety and security of goods) has been delayed and will now not be needed until the end of 2023 (the UK government is due to publish a new target operating model of border controls soon).

But it is still difficult to navigate and the changes have impacted both the low and high end of the spectrum of

More EU red tape

Among the swathe of new EU regulation is the requirement from March 1 next year to be more specific when filling out customs forms on packages sent to Europe. The new requirement for a Harmonized System tariff code on customs forms for all EU-bound goods means vague item descriptions on customs forms such as 'artwork' or 'antiques' will no longer be acceptable. More detailed descriptions will be required.

art and antiques shipping. It is no surprise that many buyers (private collectors or dealers) are turning to logistics firms for help.

Jeremy Parnham at Postit4me, which works with 100 delivery companies worldwide, says: "The last couple of years has thrown up a number of significant challenges for both businesses wanting to ship items internationally or customers overseas wishing to buy from the UK. Brexit, Covid, the introduction of the EU's Import One Stop Shop [for VAT see link at atg.news/IOSS], the US exit from the Universal Postal Union and the war in Ukraine driving up fuel costs have all impacted on the access to and cost of viable delivery solutions."

Parnham adds: "Having access to a comprehensive choice of carrier options is key to being able to offer reliable and cost-effective cross border delivery. It offers alternatives where carriers are too expensive, not available or the shipment type dictates a different approach. A customer in one country may prefer to use UPS over DHL because their experience of customs and clearance has seemed smoother. In another country the preference may be DHL or FEDEX for similar reasons, so being able to offer customer the choice of carrier would seem sensible."

Duncan Hypher of Mailboxes Etc agrees and says logistics firms are also able to "reassure buyers who have concerns about how Brexit has affected exports from the UK to EU countries. We also do a lot of consolidation work. Dealers or collectors can bid and buy at any number of sales throughout the UK and we will collate and consolidate customer purchases to simplify the process and provide a single logistics solution."

Even if it is tougher for UK customers, there are others potentially benefiting. Graeme Rhodes, head of marketing at Pack & Send, says: "Although rising fuel, packing material and freight prices have undoubtedly increased costs for secure bespoke shipments, the movement in the value of the pound to dollar has countered this for many international buyers and we have seen overall volumes of international shipments of quality art and antiques from the UK increase."

And where there is will there is a way.

Gouin adds: "Our offices in Paris, London and New York have provided us with insight into how the landscape has changed for art businesses since Brexit was finalised almost three years ago. Our global shipments, auction house and individual clients all continue to grow in terms of order numbers and average shipment size.

"There is still market confidence despite the end of frictionless borders for the UK-EU art market."

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Online art buying fuels business growth

The pandemic forced more buyers online and the trend has continued.

Delivery and logistics firms have all noted the continuation of the increase in demand for delivery for remote buyers from auctions and dealers.

James Simmons, marketing manager for delivery firm Mail Boxes Etc, said: "The art and antiques market has been transformed by the explosion of online channels, fuelled to a large extent by the impact of Covid-19.

"The growth we've seen in the sector is both significant and sustained. If our business in bespoke collect, pack and ship for art and antiques is a micro-barometer of the market, we can say that growth will continue in 2023."

Mail Boxes Etc's Auction Logistics delivery service operates from 150 specialist 'collect pack and ship' centres and it has more than 300 auction houses and close to 2000 art and antique specialists as customers around the UK.

Logistics firm Pack & Send has also seen a significant rise in demand. Graeme Rhodes, head of marketing at the firm, says: "The growth in online sales has contributed to the expansion of our network of specialist service centres in the UK as buyers and sellers of unique, valuable and fragile pieces are increasingly looking for an end-to-end packing and shipping service – especially if

they are unable to physically visit the seller and are often in another country."

Pack & Send, an Australian firm that expanded into the UK in 2009, now has 20 service centres while Postit4me has also been expanding and just opened a new hub in Stoke-on-Trent to cover the Midlands and north-west England to cope with increased demand.

Although the online buying trend has continued there are subtle changes. Duncan Hypher, business development manager at Mail Boxes Etc, says: "Whereas last year there was a bit of a feeding frenzy and the feeling was that anything would sell, this year some lots are remaining unsold as people become more

selective," he says. "In effect, although sales have grown in general, the preference for better quality items is back to where it was before the pandemic."

The expectations of customers has also changed with more pressure for a more efficient service.

Edouard Gouin, co-founder and CEO of Convelio, a logistics firm that collects, packs and ships artworks and valuable antiques around the UK and internationally, said: "More and more art world businesses of all sizes are seeing an increased demand from their own clients for logistical efficiency, particularly when buying online. Over the past two years, an accelerating number of UK galleries, auction houses and art fairs are requiring increased efficiency."

And the growth is not just in the UK and Europe. Gouin adds: "Alongside our UK and EU operations, our largest and fastest growing market is the US and our most popular route is between France and the UK to the US.

"We have found our US clients to be highly engaged in the benefits of technology in the art market. As the 'phygital' era continues and the demographics of buyers are younger and hence more tech-savvy, clients everywhere are trying to provide a strong digital experience simultaneous to the experience in their bricks-and-mortar locations."

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Reused, sustainable - but needs packaging

Opinion by Dr Peter Cannon-Brookes, art historian and formerly keeper of art at Birmingham Museum and at the National Museum of Wales.

How is the art and antiques trade to respond to the gloomy predictions discussed at the recent Cop27 in Egypt November 6-18)?

The World Meteorogical Organisation (WMO) has been unequivocal in its prediction of catastrophic climate change, while, in Britain, the Parliamentary Joint Committee on National Security Strategy has published dire forebodings with regard to the impact of climate change on our critical national infrastructure if we continue to miss net zero climate targets due to rising pollution.

On the face of it the art, and particularly the antiques, trade is in large measure the beneficiary of the growing enthusiasm for 'pre-loved' goods. By definition, all historic art and antiques are second-hand and thus impose very small carbon footprints.

The carbon footprint of pre-loved goods themselves is negligible, but their marketing, packing and transport remain a potent source of atmospheric pollution.

For the art and antiques trade the immediate focus must be on reducing the huge quantities of single-use plastics currently used, and the use of extravagant wooden packing cases so-constructed as to prevent their dismantling and the re-use of their constituent materials.

These concerns need to be addressed in the context of unnecessarily rapid transport and

delivery. Public awareness of the acute financial pressures being exerted on packing and transport budgets for major international loan exhibitions has been alerted by the threatened cancellation of the Guido Reni exhibition scheduled for summer 2023 in the Prado Madrid.

By developing imaginative fresh approaches to packing and by consolidating transportation thus leading to more eco-friendly collection and delivery schedules, huge reductions in carbon emissions can be achieved as well as lower operating costs. 'Just-in-time' transport should be outlawed and all packing materials should be chosen to be re-usable, not twice but many times.

I recall, in Birmingham, an elderly sales assistant in a distinguished stationery shop telling me that when he first entered the firm the first job in the morning was to carefully untie the string



and unpack incoming goods, smoothing out the packing paper ready for re-use. May the Good Lord deliver us from the horrors of bubble wrap with adhesive tape applied to the wrong side.

Changing environment

The art and antiques sector is already regarded as 'green' due to the items in question having been 'reused' and 'recycled' rather than created new each time.

But there is pressure to become greener still. There are various ways to try, from carbon offset schemes to reducing waste.

A big focus is reducing the impact of shipping and delivery – how the items are moved and how they are packed. In terms of packaging there are plenty of more environmentally friendly options such as paper packaging and stiff recycled brown paper as a filler, choosing biodegradable and recycled versions of bubblewrap, biodegradable clingwrap and consider furniture blankets made of recycled material and try to reuse as much of the delivery packaging as possible.

One group doing their bit to promote the ways to be greener is the Gallery Climate Coalition (GCC), a not-for-profit group founded by London-based gallerists and professionals working in the arts launched in October 2020.

It now has more than 800 members including institutions, artists, fairs, auction houses, commercial galleries as well as a wide range of individual professionals from more than 40 countries. It is celebrating its two-year milestone with a new scheme called Active Membership. The category is intended to celebrate members who are taking proactive steps towards implementing sustainable practices in line

with its guidelines. These members will have: completed a GCC CO_2 online report or audit within the last two years, established and maintained a 'Green Team' and published an environmental responsibility statement.

Serious steps

GCC member, logistics firm Convelio, produces its own emissions report. CEO Edouard Gouin added: "We're taking meaningful action here, and we released our first sustainability report to set the groundwork for how we improve. We have partnered with a developer to design a tool that measures and offsets our carbon emissions."

Earlier this year Christie's (also a member of GCC) began trialling moving artworks by sea rather than air with storage and logistics firm Crozier. It has been running a monthly container service for the transportation of

artworks between London and New York and between London and Hong Kong.

Christie's said the London to Hong Kong service is working well and it plans to make changes to the London to New York route into 2023 to mirror the sales and fair schedules to make it more relevant to demand. A spokesperson said: "We are working closely with Crozier, our suppliers and GCC to increase volume sea freight and awareness of the benefits of the service both in terms of cost and emissions."

Christie's has also increased its use of re-usable crates and has been testing new products available on the market. It recently tested a new Rokbox lite option and has now placed an order for New York, London, Paris and Milan.

Greg Bradley of Bradley's Furniture Carriers said: "We have moved to sustainable packaging such as biodegradable shredded wood packing and we are manufacturing our own wooden crates that can be reused."

He said the crates have QR codes for the recipient to scan for instructions of how to uncrate and reuse. The firm also works with auction house Sworders to offer a sustainable shipping quote for overseas sea freight deliveries.

Efforts are being made but the global nature of art fairs, museum shows and the amount of packaging involved in sending delicate expensive items around the world means the high-end fine art market is still a long way from being truly 'green'.

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Ship or not to ship? A general courier vs an art specialist? An insurer's point of view on one of the biggest dealer costs

with Ecclesiastical Insurance

Shipping is one of the largest annual costs for art and antique dealers so it's no surprise that many look for the most cost-effective method of shipping to get orders to excited clients.

Although cheaper than fine art shippers, insurers often warn against use of couriers for high-value items because by far the largest volume of insurance claims come not from dramatic theft or breakage on display, but during transit.

I've seen numerous claims from clients using couriers to send art and antiques where items have arrived cracked, scratched or with surfaces imprinted with dreaded bubble-wrap marks created by the gases in bubbles. Worse, an astonishing number of couriered items simply never arrive.

If you purchase one-off insurance via the courier you might get the cost of your item back from them after a lengthy investigation, after which your client is still without their piece.

When in the business of trading unique and irreplaceable items, however, your stock is not like other retailer's stock and the value of the item can

By Jane Byde, a fine art and heritage underwriter be less important than keeping the item itself safe.

It's true that specialist fine art shippers can be a more costly transport solution for art works, but there are several good reasons insurers favour them:

- staff trained and experienced in the handling
- bespoke packaging including flight cases or crates with mouldings, wedges and acid-free fillers
- speed and reliability including special arrangements at customs
- smaller vans with air-ride suspension, effective for protecting fragile items

New entrants to the antiques market or those with particularly tight budgets may be reluctant to buy annual specialist insurance because they fear being forced to use fine art shippers or don't know the benefits of what they are buying.

The best solution here is to use a specialist broker. They will ensure you get a policy with a quality insurer that uses fine art loss-adjusters.

A specialist fine art insurance policy will usually still offer low-level coverage for items couriered up to a limit of, for example, £20,000-30,000, and you will have a better chance of a no-quibble claim payment in the unfortunate event

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Collectors who enjoy the crack

Single-owner group of mostly silver egg cups spanning two centuries opens a French auction

Ringing the changes on the collectable categories of silver smallwork was the Lachmann collection of egg cups which opened the silver auction held by Ader (28% buyer's premium inc VAT) in Paris on October 20.

Just over 60 examples were on offer, mostly in silver, spanning the early 18th century through to the mid 20th and charting a range of designs employed over the years for these small pieces of tableware, some of them straightforwardly utilitarian, others whimsical or ingenious.

Most found a buyer with prices ranging from a high of €3200 down to a couple of examples that sold for less than €100.



- 1. Topping the list in the Lachmann collection offered at Ader was this 4in (10cm) high chalice shaped egg cup made in Paris in the first half of the 18th century. The bowl, which is decorated with slender lanceotate leaves, is set on a slender baluster-shaped stem and a circular gadrooned base which is engraved with the initials NG. It sold for €3200 (£2780) against a €2000-2500 estimate.
- 2. Two later 18th century silver basket frame egg cups of a form known as à vannerie, each with a moveable cup. The example on the left, Paris 1780-81, measuring 1½in (3.5cm) high, sold for €1200 (£1045). The slightly

larger example on the right, Paris 1784-85, which is engraved with an armorial, made **€800 (£695)**.

- 3. A 2in (5.24cm) high egg cup with a blue glass liner set in a silver tripod based frame of neoclassical design with three hoofed feet, dating from c.1780. With marks for the Parisian master goldsmith Bernard Georgeon, (received in 1779), it sold for €500 (£435).
- **4.** A 2% in (7cm) high late 19th century silver egg cup from Paris made by Tallois & Mayence. The cup, with a gilt interior, is engraved with a medallion monogrammed *CG* set on three hen's feet joined to the bowl by leafy

terminals. Estimated at a modest €60-80, it was bid to €200 (£175).

- 5. A 3in (7.5cm) high French silver egg cup from c.1900 (no goldsmith's mark), the bowl formed as half a broken egg shell with a chick emerging from the side set on a tree trunk stem with a round foliate decorated base. It took €350 (£305).
- 6. Art Nouveau egg cup made from chromed metal fashioned as artichoke stem with the globe forming the cup set on curled leaf, 3¼in (8.5cm) high, mark of Pierre-François Queille, sold for €350 (£305).

Flemish tapestry hunted down after wartime wrongs

A rare early l6th century Flemish tapestry that was part of an impressive imperial commission is coming up for sale in France in early December.

The wool and silk tapestry is large at 32ft 9in long x 10ft high (10 x 3.05m) but is only part of a set of eight weavings that measured more than 100 metres in total and took several years to complete.

The set, which depicts imperial hunting scenes in the forest of Soignes near Brussels, was ordered along with other tapestries by the Habsburg Emperor Maximilian I (1459-1519) from the Tournai ateliers in Flanders.

It was possibly destined for the gallery of the Castle of Wels in Austria.

Payment to the Tournai weaver Arnould Poissonnier is recorded as taking place in 1510.

This section, which represents

only 10% of the complete design, shows the emperor and members of his family and court engaged in hunting in the forest accompanied by their horses, dogs and birds of prey with the nearby castle of Bouchout depicted at the top left.

It gives a picture of the accoutrements and fashions of the nobility in the late 15th and early 16th century as well as depicting a wealth of spring flora and fauna.

It will be offered for sale by the French auction firm Aguttes in its Haute Epoque auction in Neuilly-sur-Seine on December 9 with an estimate of €800,000-lm.

Ownership tussle

The tapestry passed through various French collections, either by descent or via auction, during the 17th and 18th centuries and also has an interesting later history.

Around 1870 this and another

panel were acquired by Pierre-Edmond Teisserenc de Bort (1814-92), who was the French ambassador tin Vienna 1879-80.

In early 1942 two intermediaries acting for Marshal Goering tried to negotiate a purchase. The owner, who had no intention of disposing of them, sought the help of the administration of Fine Arts which accepted, in mid-June 1942, the classification of the tapestries as historic monuments, which prohibited their leaving the territory.

Under pressure, the owner ended up donating it to the French State at the end of June 1942. Very unhappy with this interference, Goering threatened the Vichy government with reprisals, which considered that it was not possible to keep the tapestries

On the orders of President Laval, the regional prefect who kept the pieces had them handed over to Goering's envoys at the end of July, and an order for the declassification of the tapestries was taken in mid-August 1942 to allow them to leave France.

Given back

After the war, they were found by the Monuments Men. A lengthy trial ended in 1955 with a judgment which recognised that the donation was fictitious, that there had been no sale and that The State was to ensure, at its own expense, that the tapestries be put back in place and that the damage caused by their removal repaired.

One of the tapestries, restored in Austria, was returned in 1961.

The other, the panel to be offered by Aguttes, remained in storage at the Mobilier National in Paris until it was repaired and returned to the heirs in 1967, passing down by descent.

BRAFA returns to early slot in the fairs calendar

BRAFA Art Fair in Brussels has announced its dates for the 2023 edition.

After a summer staging this year, it returns to its traditional late January/early February slot as one of the earliest major fairs in the calendar. The event will run from January 29-February 5 in Halls 3 and 4 of Brussels Expo at the Heysel, where it was first staged in June this year, with around 130 exhibitors.

Nine new exhibitors are joining the fair: four from France (Franck Anelli Fine Art; Galerie Pascal Cuisinier; Galerie Nicolas Bourriand and Librarie Amélie Sourget); three from the Netherlands (Van de Meij Fine Arts; Galerie Van den Bruinhorst and VKD Jewels) plus Ars Antiqua from Italy and New Hope Gallery from Belgium.

The Brussels-Capital region is making

2023 a year devoted to Art Nouveau which is strongly represented in the city.

BRAFA will be highlighting this theme in various ways throughout the fair and a number of exhibitors will be bringing Art Nouveau pieces.

They include Epoque Fine Jewels from Belgium which will be bringing the Art Nouveau peacock tiara/brooch pictured here, a unique piece in gold, silver, diamonds, enamel and opal by the designer Philippe Wolfers (1858-1929).

Dr Lennart Booij Fine Art and Rare Items from the Netherlands will be showing a glazed ceramic vase from c.1889, also shown here, an early work by the French Art Nouveau master Emile Gallé (1846-1904).

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Madonna makes second-highest Bellini sum

A Madonna and Child by the Venetian Renaissance Master Giovanni Bellini (c.1430-1516) and assistant sold in the Old Master paintings auction at Dorotheum (28/25/15% buyer's premium inc VAT) in Vienna for a hammer price of €1.13m (£982,610).

The result on November 9, which was far above the €250,000-350,000 estimate, was paid after a lengthy battle between a room and a phone bidder.

It is the second-highest price at auction for a work by the artist after the £3.1m paid for another Madonna and Child in oil and tempera on panel at Christie's in July 2010 (according to Artprice).

The 2ft 7in x 1ft 11½in (79.5 x 59.5cm) oil on panel transferred onto canvas is related, with variations, to the artist's Madonna Contarini which is in the Accademia in Venice.

Diagnostic investigations undertaken on the work have clarified that the preparatory underdrawing

was most probably executed with the same cartoon as the one used for the Madonna Contarini. It is thought that following this initial phase of transfer, possibly undertaken by an assistant, Bellini then intervened to complete and perfect the design employing parallel diagonal hatching which is typical of his drawing technique.

In the 20th century the painting belonged to the Argentinean collector Achillito Chiesa (1881-1951) until 1927; then the collection of the art dealer and collector Alessandro Contini Bonacossi (1878-1955) and subsequently a private European

Life revealed in terracotta and wood forms

This terracotta sculpture from 1941 by Ossip Zadkine (1890-1967) featured in the Fine Art sale held by Shapiro (25% buyer's premium) in Mamoroneck, New York, on October 15.

Arlequin Couché measures 6in high x 11½in wide (15 x 29cm) including the base. It has a provenance to Wildenstein Gallery, New York; Betty Parsons, New York; a private collection, New York, acquired in the 1950s-60s, thence by descent in the family. The work is recorded in the Zadkine Research Center's catalogue and is accompanied by a digital certificate of authenticity from the Center dated October 20, 2020 (available on request). Estimated at \$8000-12,000, it sold for \$13,000 (£11,610).

Also on offer was the Belgian artist Constant Permeke's (1886-1952) 16in (41cm) high carved wood seated cat which is signed on the side. It made \$8000 (£7140) against an estimate of \$2000-3000.

The frame game in Florida

New York frame maker and restorer Eli Wilner is selling a lifetime collection of 'museum-quality' frames at auction, writes Laura Chesters.

Wilner has been a specialist in period framing for nearly 40 years and has completed more than 15,000 framing projects for collectors and museums.

His collection has been consigned to Florida auction house Helmuth Stone (22/25% buyer's premium) and comprises 2500 original antique examples which Wilner used to make his replica frames.

The first tranche was offered on October 2.

Helmuth Stone's Brandon Stone said: "So far there has been a great show of interest with the sell-through rate of the auction at 90%-plus with buyers from all over the country as well as internationally."

The next tranche will be offered on December 4 and a third is planned for the end of January 2023.



Resale price up to €50,000 Royalty 3% hetween €50 000 01 and €200 000 1% between €200,000.01 and €350,000 0.5% between €350.000.01 and €500.000 0.25% in excess of €500,000 Royalties are also capped so that the total amount of the royalty paid for any single sale of a work cannot exceed €12,500. ARR is exempt of VAT.

Youth of today love a good fair

Neither a dealer nor a collector, I am nonetheless an avid reader of my weekly *ATG* for its wonderful variety of content.



Obituary - Martin Mortimer (1928-2022)

It is with great sadness that I have to report the death of Martin Mortimer on October 1 following a challenging short illness. He passed away peacefully at home aged 94.

Martin began his career in 1948 when he was taken on by Bernard Perret of Delomosne & Son Ltd, dealers in glass and ceramics at that time situated in Campden Hill Road.

The company was well established having been founded in 1905 by Bernard's mother.

Martin quickly made his mark with the discovery of a goblet in the house of his old nanny in Devon. It was being used for wild daffodils, which grew nearby. The goblet was perhaps one of the rarest of all English glasses made by the 16th century glass maker Giacomo Verzelini. It is now in the collections of the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge.


Delomosne was already known for its work with glass chandeliers, Bernard having discovered the maker's mark William Parker when restoring the important suite of chandeliers in the Assembly Rooms in Bath.

Special interest

With a natural mechanical turn of mind and skill with his hands, Martin soon made this his special interest, which culminated with the publication of his book, *The English Glass Chandelier*, in 2000. (A volume referenced by sale rooms and museums all over the world.)

He gave generously of his time serving on the council of the BADA for many years, vice chairman for two of them and as editor of the BADA Journal.

Martin was on the executive committee of the Antique



Dealers' Fair, namely Grosvenor House, and subsequently at Burlington House. He lectured at West Dean College of Art and assessed the work of students studying the conservation of ceramics and glass.

In 1997 he was presented with a Long Service Award by the BADA

He was always particularly helpful with his great knowledge of English glass to young people whether they were starting out in the trade or writing on the subject of glass. The pinnacle of his career came in 2007 when he

was awarded an MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours list 'For services to Antique Glass'.

Wicked sense of humour

Those who knew Martin at all will remember a tall and distinguished looking man with a ready laugh and a wicked sense of humour.

Those who knew him well found him a delightful companion with a wide range of interests. He could write well and was the author of numerous articles on glass and porcelain.

He was a skilled painter in watercolour and muralist in the mould of Whistler. He was a fine gardener and loved early music, especially choral. The church played an important role in his life and he supported his parish church wherever he lived.

In 2009 Martin retired in order to care for his wife Sara whose health was declining. Following her death in 2013, he took himself on holidays where he could follow his passion in architecture. His last few years were marred by failing eyesight which he endured with typical stoicism

He will be greatly missed.
