Edward VIII collection comes up for sale

An extensive collection of Edward VIII memorabilia amassed over 55 years has been put up for sale by its owner.

Collector and numismatic dealer Richard Lobel hopes a museum will come forward to purchase the archive and place it on public display.

Lobel first became fascinated by Edward VIII, who abdicated in 1936 to marry the divorced American socialite Wallis Simpson, at the age of 13.

He made his first related purchase when he was 24.

"I am a romantic and I thought the story was just fantastic," said Lobel, who came to the UK in 1968 having established his business Coincraft in 1955. "I have never collected coins as I felt it is not



fair to my customers. So I picked Edward VIII.

"I want to sell now as I will be 79 on my next birthday and I would like to see it go to a museum – somewhere it can be displayed and added to. I spent 50 years putting it together and I would like it to live on."

asking price of £6.5m.

The collection ranges from the announcement of Edward's birth in 1894 in George V's handwriting to Edward's 1936 daybook where the word 'Finis' is written on the day of the abdication.

Lobel bought at auction and through private sales. Among

his 'best buys' was the archives of the Chateau de Cande where the couple were married in June 1937 and items bought at Spink's 2010 sale of the collection of Joseph S Giordano (author of *Portraits of a Prince*) which included medals and coins. Lobel said he bought 198 of the 250 lots and weeks later bought another large chunk at a sale at Morton & Eden.

Lobel added: "I am one of very few people in the world who has ever actually owned Edward VIII British coins and that got me listed in the Guinness Book of World Records. Those coins have long been sold, but my collection contains some extremely rare pulls from his original coinage dies."

He will continue to add to his collection until he agrees a sale.

A £65,000 price reflects considerable appeal of stumpwork mirror frame

A small collection of 17th century stumpwork offered at Lindsay Burns in Perth was topped by this japanned and needlework mirror frame.

Modestly estimated at £1000-2000, it was hammered down at £65,000 (plus 24% buyer's premium) at the April 25 sale.

It was consigned by a local Perthshire family and had been collected by the vendor's late mother-in-law who had purchased her four stumpwork items at auctions in the 1970s and 80s.

Auctioneer Nick Burns said 12 phone lines were booked in, plus commission bids, with a UK phone buyer ultimately successful.

Condition, subject matter and a date contributed to its appeal. The embroidered decoration includes a female figure holding a hawk, possibly Catherine of Braganza, and on the opposite side, a male figure, probably depicting Charles II. However, it is dated 1652 – some years before the Restoration.

This bell came by family descent from Lady Elizabeth Germain to Col Sir Joseph Weld, Lulworth, Dorset (d.1992) and then to the present owner.

A small group of coronation bells survive today, of which the earliest example is thought to have been used at the coronation of Charles II in 1660.

A similar George II bell with a later baluster handle added in c.1740 sold at Christie's for \pm 11,000 in November

2009 as part of the property of the Duke of Kent.

Canopy bearer

At the coronation of George II, held on October 11, 1727, the Canopy of State was carried by the members of parliament of the Cinque Ports – a right established during the reign of Edward I.

It was in his position as MP for Dover that George Berkeley (d.1746) was appointed as a canopy bearer. Roland Arkell

Lewis Carroll's 'child friends' pics

A series of photographs taken by Charles Lutwidge Dodgson (1832-98) – aka Lewis Carroll – has sold for £94,400 as part of a timed online auction at Sworders.

The eight images of one of the Victorian author's child friends came from a descendant of the sitter: Alexandra 'Xie' Rhoda Kitchin (1864-1925).

A French dealer was the buyer of all eight photographs, bidding hammer prices of between £10,000-16,550 each.

Xie was a favourite photographic subject of Dodgson, who depicted her around 50 times, from age four until just before her 16th birthday. She was the daughter of Rev George William Kitchin (1827-1912), one of Dodgson's colleagues at Christ Church, Oxford, who later



became the Dean of Winchester and Durham. Her mother was Alice Maud Taylor, second daughter of Bridges Taylor, the British consul in Denmark.

The works, all albumen prints mostly laid down on card, are well known to collectors. They assume a tableau format, showing the sitter in different costumes: asleep on a sofa, with a bucket and spade, wearing a fur hat and cape, dressed as a queen or as 'a Chinaman'. This image of Xie, at her youngest aged perhaps four or five, was one of the more artistic. of the drama played out in the child's imagination.


The prints, which were estimated at around £1000 each as part of Sworders' Books and Maps sale from April 14-23, came for sale from the Rev Kitchin's great grandchildren. Their late mother Elizabeth had sold around 10 similar photographs at Sotheby's in the late 1980s but these new discoveries were, said Sworders director Luke Macdonald, "found in an envelope at the back of a safe while the family home in Essex was being cleared".

Since the 1930s, biographers and scholars have questioned Dodgson's intentions when taking these pictures and the relationship he had with his young subjects. Of about 3000 photographs the *Alice in Wonderland* author made in his life, just over half are of children.

At the time, the camera was still a relatively new technology, and Dodgson was an early and capable enthusiast. He found no shortage of friends who wanted him to make likenesses of their children. In a biography of his uncle, Dodgson's nephew Stuart Collingwood referred to them as his 'child friends'.

Later authors painted Dodgson, who never married, as a more sinister figure although no evidence has emerged to support it.

Alexandra Kitchin went on to marry Arthur Cardew, a civil servant and gifted amateur musician. They had six children. Unlike Alice Liddell, Isa Bowman and other Dodgson 'child friends', Xie never published reminiscences of him.

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Pick of the week

Support band turned out to be The Sex Pistols

This rare rock and pop poster advertises a performance by 'Bazooka Joe' with 'Support Band' at the common room of St Martin's Art School on November 6, 1975. Entrance was 50p.

As revealed only on the day, the support act would be Malcolm McLaren's new group The Sex Pistols and this was to be their debut performance.

The poster itself was designed by Bazooka Joe band member Stuart Goddard, later better known as Adam Ant.

He printed them by hand (the red and blue colours a reference to the wrappers of Bazooka Joe bubble gum wrappers) and it is thought just four were made. This example offered at entertainment specialist Omega Auctions in Merseyside on April 25 is the first to come to market thus far.

The vendor, an unnamed member of the Bazooka Joe line-up, remembers: "We were told there would be a support, but not told the name. When the band turned up with McClaren we found out they were called The Sex Pistols and this was their first ever gig.

"They told us their van had broken down on their

way to the gig and didn't have their amps or drums. they only had a guitar and a bass, and asked if they could borrow ours to which we said yes."

The events of the night are part of Punk folklore. "Numerous articles have been written about this gig." said the vendor. "A fight broke out between us because we pulled the plug on the Pistols as they were playing so badly and trashing our equipment. A bit of argybargy followed."

What price this 20 x 12in (50 x 30cm) piece of music history? Estimated at £5000-10,000, it took £28,000 (plus 24% buyer's premium).

In January 2021 Omega sold an original listing poster for the Sex Pistols' ill-fated 1976 Anarchy tour.

On the bill were the Damned, Johnny Thunders & The Heartbreakers (ex New York Dolls) and special quests The Clash.

The tour, to promote the new single Anarchy in the UK, started two days after the infamous TV interview with Bill Grundy.

The 19-date tour turned into a series of cancellations as scared local councils banned shows from go-

ing on in all but three venues plus four rearranged gigs. The poster doubled top estimate at £7000, going to an international buyer.

Roman bust heads back to Germany

A Roman bust discovered in a US charity shop and bought for just \$34.99 will be repatriated to Germany.

The sculpture was purchased in charity shop Goodwill in Austin, Texas, in 2018 by local art collector Laura Young.

She spotted the portrait bust had age and tried to track down information about it, speaking with experts at the University of Texas as well as from several auction houses.

Following months of research and meetings, the sculpture was identified by Sotheby's consultant Jörg Deterling who helped to connect Young with the German authorities.

It was finally authenticated by the Bavarian Administration of the State-Owned Palaces,



Gardens, and Lakes as having once belonged in the collection of King Ludwig I of Bavaria.

Dating to the c.lst century BC to early 1st century AD, it may portray the son of Pompey the Great (106-48BC), Sextus Pompey.

For the past year the bust has been on display in the San Antonio Museum of Art until May 21 when it will begin its journey back to Germany and return to the Pompejanum, (or Pompeiianum, an idealised replica of a Roman villa) in Aschaffenburg, Bavaria, which was created in 1840-48 by Ludwig I of Bavaria.

Hammer to fall at **Mercury auction**

From stage costumes, handwritten lyrics and guitars to Victorian paintings, a Faberge clock and Japanese art, the private collection of Queen frontman Freddie Mercury (1946-91) is to be offered in a series of auctions.

Sotheby's will fill its 16,000 sq ft London gallery space with more than 1500 items which will be on display from August 4 to September 5 (with parts of the collection on tour in New York, Los Angeles and Hong Kong in June) ahead of six

dedicated sales in September.

The memorabilia and artworks are being sold by Mary Austin, former girlfriend and one of Mercury's closest friends, who was left his collection and home in Kensington. For the past 30 years his home, Garden Lodge in Kensington, London, has remained almost entirely as Mercury left it, looked after by Austin. She will be donating a portion of the proceeds of the sale to both the Mercury Phoenix Trust and the Elton John Aids Foundation.

Among the lots to be offered are handwritten lyrics to some of Queen's most famous songs including Mercury's



whisky sale at Christie's in 1989. He has also been at Christie's, McTear's and Bonhams.

The first sale is in October.

Six First Folios on King Street stage

Christie's will host a nonselling exhibition, Shakespeare's First Folio: The First Four Hundred Years, bringing together six copies. The group will be on display at Christie's King Street from May 2-26.

Widely considered the most important literary publication in the English language, the First Folio contains 36 plays, 18 of which may have otherwise been lost to history. Assembled seven years after Shakespeare's death by his colleagues John Heminges and Henry Condell, among the works saved are *Macbeth, Twelfth Night, All's Well* that Ends Well, Measure for Measure and Julius Caesar.

Only a third of the First Folios that were originally printed survive, it is thought, with many of the 232 copies held in museums.

Christie's has assembled the



six examples from a variety of sources. They include a copy on loan from the University of London (which is the earliest documented First Folio in America) from Senate House Libraries, the Arundel Castle copy (courtesy of the Duke of Norfolk and one of only five complete copies in private hands) and others from private collections in the UK.

Submariner owned by a heroic ship's diver

A 1963 Rolex Submariner 5513 that was featured on the BBC's *Antiques Roadshow* last year is to be offered for auction at TW Gaze in Diss on May 11.

It remained with the same owner, Simon FL Barnett, until his recent death. He wore it continuously during sterling service in the Royal Navy and the Metropolitan Police and it can be seen on his wrist in countless photographs taken over the decades, whether on duty at work or relaxing with his family.

In 1964 the watch was bought new in Singapore for \pm 70, while he was deployed as an aircraft handler and ship's diver aboard the aircraft carrier HMS *Victorious*. A little later he had his young bride's name, Dawn, engraved on the back.

When Victorious returned to Plymouth in July 1965, import duty had to be paid on the Rolex, totalling £11 and two shillings.

In April 1966, Barnett qualified as a search and rescue diver in the Fleet Air Arm. In August that year, he was deployed aboard aircraft carrier HMS *Hermes*. In 1967, during an 11-day period in the Mediterranean, there were two catastrophic aircraft accidents during which two pilots and an observer were killed.

Barnett was heavily involved in the the rescue and retrieval missions, at one point having to be rescued himself from the crash site, having nearly drowned in his attempts to free a trapped helicopter pilot from his capsized submerged craft. TW Gaze says the watch has only been serviced twice (in

1980 and 2021) and has never been polished.

The original bracelet strap was replaced after damage but remains with the watch. It will be offered with a collection of photographs, newspaper cuttings, letters, log-book entries, and records of commendations awarded to Barnett.

The estimate in Norfolk is £30,000-45,000.

Royal collectables

Our in-depth special feature on royal memorabilia kicks off with a look at the market for 'Coronation Furniture' produced for the big day since 1902. *Luke Honey* reports. A selection of hammer highlights, previews and dealer stories follows, collated by the overall *ATG* team



In the months following the late queen's funeral and the run-up to the coronation this month, both collectors and dealers have been showing heightened interest in 'Coronation Furniture': the chairs and stools used by (and sold to) the guests at the four 20th century coronations.

Prices – at least for the later George VI and Elizabeth II examples – are rising.

Specific manufacture

Edward VII's coronation (1902) reflected Britain's status as a great imperial power. Invitations ran to 8000 guests – so, for the first time, chairs and stools were manufactured specifically for the coronation.

The design of the Edward VII chairs (by Glenisters of High Wycombe) is in a practical Arts & Crafts style, loosely based on rustic chairs of the early 19th century, with rush seats and double stretchers.

Unlike the George V chair, the royal cypher (*ER VII* and crown) and 'coronation' stamps are visible on the back seat rail.

Stools, likewise, are in a simple rustic style. Surprisingly, chairs can still be acquired at auction for prices well below £100 (with a chair selling for £20 at Moore Allen & Innocent last November). As ever, provenance is key: a chair from the estate of the late Lady Lucan secured £980 at Holloway's in 2018, against an estimate of £300-400.

Typical style

In contrast, the chairs made for the

coronation of George V (1911) are in a typically Edwardian 'Chippendale' style. Sometimes described as

'rare', George V chairs appear to be scarce – at least when catalogued as 'coronation chairs'. Although we can assume the manufacture of several thousand chairs (there were 6000 guests), it is possible that some are passing through auction unnoticed: sold as nondescript side-chairs in the Chippendale style, especially as the coronation stamps (found on the inside, or underside, of the seat rail) are easy to miss.

Still, there are bargains to be found (even when catalogued correctly by the auctioneers).

A chair sold for £48 at Aldridges of Bath in April 2022, for example.

The George V stools, again, are in a simple rustic style: a pair by

Thomas Glenister & Co sold for £110 at Piers Motley in March.

As with the reign of Edward VIII, the origin of his supposed coronation chairs remains controversial, with the assumption that Edward Barnsley (the Cotswolds furniture maker) designed the chairs for a slimmeddown coronation set for May 1937.

Yet, so far, no evidence of



Invitations ran to 8000 guests - so, for the first time chairs and stools were manufactured specifically Barnsley's involvement has come to light. At the same time, chairs have surfaced with a George V stamp, proving a design pre-dating Edward VIII's accession in January 1936. Secondly, chairs have turned up with Air Ministry and Elizabeth II coronation stamps, suggesting a more general Ministry of Works design – later used as extra seating for the 1953 coronation.

A set of six chairs (with the crucial *GR V* and *ER* stamps, catalogued accurately by Mallams, Oxford) fetched £2800 (estimate: £3000-5000) in December 2020.

Regal in feel

The chairs and stools for the coronation of George VI (1937) are in a Tudorbethan 'Farthingale' pattern, upholstered in blue velvet for the coronation of George VI (fading over time to sea green) and then reproduced in royal blue (with the queen's embroidered cypher) for Elizabeth II (1953).

As George VI had only a few months to plan his coronation, this may be the original design for the cancelled Edward VIII ceremony.

Significantly, the George VI chair and stool are regal in feel – reflecting the monarchy's need to rebrand itself for radio, cinema newsreel, and later the televisual age.

And prices are on the move: in November, a decent George VI coronation chair made a respectable £850 at Roseberys, against an estimate of £300-500, while an Elizabeth II chair and stool (from the estate of General Sir Frederick Pile, Bt) fetched £1700 at Dreweatts in 2021. More recently, an Elizabeth II chair, with a provenance confirming its use by HRH The Duchess of Kent, achieved a healthy £2800 at JS Fine Art in September 2022.

Slick marketing

Another sought-after piece is the 'Red Chair', created by Lord Snowdon for the Prince of Wales' investiture at Carnarvon Castle in 1969, with the help of the Ministry of Works' brutalist designer, John Pound, and stage designer Carl Toms.


Made by disabled people at the Remploy Factory in south Wales, the chair featured in a slick marketing brochure and was offered for sale (after the event) flat-packed, boxedand ready to go.

Although the Ministry of Works commissioned 4600 chairs for the ceremony, examples in immaculate condition command a premium. In February, Canterbury Auction Galleries sold a chair for £360, with another chair taking a buoyant £1200 (estimate: £260-280) at Dreweatts in January.

Canny investment?

At the same time, the relatively unknown Silver Jubilee Chair (1977) – a limited edition replica of the peer's coronation chair – may prove to be a sound investment for canny buyers. Last November, a chair sold for £210 at Reeman Dansie.

Dreweatts will offer 'coronation furniture' in its May 16 auction (see p21). Also see Sarah Colegrave dealer preview on p22.

Dressed to impress with a tassel

The dress tassels pictured here came to auction from the archives of Henry Newbery & Co. Established in 1782, the company claims to be the 'oldest interior design company in the world'.

The firm says: "It was the artist and teacher Henry Newbery who really put the company on the global map back in 1872 when he inherited it from his late uncle. It was the perfect time to take this already age-old company and transform it into the power house of interior design.

"Newbery was a colourful character and when he became the headmaster at The Glasgow School of Art, he was very careful to keep his passion as a teacher and artist away from the business of the day. From the weaving looms to the tapestry frames and the assembly benches to the long rope twisting walks, Henry Newbery & Co have created collections of decorative trimmings for palaces, theatres, stately houses, hotels, offices and beautiful homes throughout the world for over two centuries."

From 'The Household'

Henry Newbery & Co has been by Royal Appointment since 1955. According to **Sloane Street Auctions (25% buyer's premium)** of Chelsea which offered the tassels on March 1 both estimated at £1000-2000, they were found "in a box of archive trim titled 'Stuart, Tudor & Hanover' given to Henry Newbery & Co in 1946 by 'The Household', assumed to be the Royal Household "due to the longstanding connection with the Royal Household". The archive was sent by the curator of Hampton Court Palace.

The oldest example dating to c.1598 was given to Queen Elizabeth I and depicted in several portraits of her, reputed to have been presented as a birthday gift anonymously. "Note the love knot," the cataloguer remarked. It made £3500.

The other dress tassel sold for £2600 was worn by King Charles I from 1626 until his execution in January 1649 on the sleeve of his under ceremonial jacket. It comprised wooden moulds adorned with silver twist and silver braid, silver pressed sequins, silver wire, and linen cord. Charles I dress tassel (**left**), **£2600** at Sloane Street Auctions, and an Elizabeth II example, **£3500**.

Does it count as 'pre-loved'?

The reminder of earlier pomp and ceremony from a coronation came courtesy of Gloucestershire auction house **Dominic Winter (20% buyer's premium)** on March 9. A set of coronation robes belonging to Lord and Lady Cross, 1901 and later, was consigned from the Cross family, by direct descent.

The lot estimated at £1000-1500 comprised a viscount's crimson velvet robe and silver gilt coronet hallmarked *R&S Garrard*, 1901, and a viscountess' crimson velvet kirtle and mantle, and a silver gilt coronet hallmarked *Edward Barnard*, 1936.

The robe and coronet were worn by Richard Assheton Cross, 1st Viscount Cross (1823-1914), at the coronation of Edward VII in 1902 and possibly again at the coronation of George V in 1911. Both sets of robes and coronets were worn at the coronation of George VI in 1937, by the 3rd Viscount, Assheton Henry Cross (1920-2004), when he was only 17, and his mother, Maud Evelyn Cross (1889-1976), the 3rd Viscount having inherited the title as a minor aged 12.

Both sets reappeared at Queen Elizabeth Il's coronation in 1953, used by the 3rd Viscount and his wife Patricia Mary Cross (1928-2014). The lot took **£7000**.

Day to remember in the saleroom Kate Day, known as the 'Queen's Milliner', made £2100. They included a circular gold brooch,

hats for Queen Elizabeth II even before her coronation and continued afterwards. Her designs were pivotal to Elizabeth's early,

elegant style and were seen at many events and royal visits. She was the only milliner to receive a Royal Warrant in the young queen's first year.

Day was one of three milliners whose creations were worn during the royal visit to Australia in 1954.

A collection of items related to Day came up for auction at Honiton, Devon, saleroom **Chilcotts (21% buyer's premium)** on March 11 estimated together at £600-800. They sold at £2100. They included a circular gold brooch, the centre monogrammed E II R, surmounted with an enamelled crown and decorated with a pearl set ribboned bow. A gift to thank Day for her designs, it was still in its original red leather presentation case from the Crown Jewellers of the time, Collingwood.

She worked out of a discreet studio in Mount Street, Mayfair; while she did not have a shop front, she did have the Royal Warrant sign and another, stating *By Appointment to HM Queen Elizabeth II, Milliners* in gold lettering, which were displayed inside the premises. Both were included in the collection.

Hartnell designs for a princess

A group of signed drawings by royal fashion designer Norman Hartnell (1901-79) was offered at **Richard Winterton (22% buyer's premium)** in Staffordshire on February 15.

Hartnell was particularly well known for dressing Queen Elizabeth II and the Queen Mother. These nine drawings include sketches for the queen and Princess Margaret.



Catalogued across four lots, they featured these two signed pencil, watercolour and gouache drawings (**above**) measuring 14 x 10in (35.5 x 25.5cm) titled *Specially designed for HRH The Princess Margaret*.

One is of a black dress and jacket with two fabric swatches pinned to the top left corner, the other a 1950s full skirt dress in claret with blue embellished elbow length cuffs. *Delivered* is pencilled on the former and the latter is inscribed *Reject 11*. Estimated at £150-250, they sold for **£260**.

Also going to an online buyer, this time for £160 (guide £80-120) was a signed pencil and watercolour design titled *Specially designed for: H.M.THE - QUEEN* (probably Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother). It depicted a peach and brown/fur-trimmed dress and coat with matching hat, bag, gloves and shoes, inscribed *No 3* to the top left corner.

Queen Victoria watercolours snapped up by royal trust...

A sketch book filled with drawings by Queen Victoria will be joining more than 4000 pieces of her art at the Royal Collection Trust, St James' Palace, London. It was due to be offered in the Charterhouse auction in Sherborne, Dorset, on March 2-3, with an estimate of £10,000-15,000.

However, the family that owned the sketches came to an arrangement with the trust before the sale.

Found when clearing a family property, it dates from 1885. On the book cover is her monogram under a crown and on the inside it is inscribed *On board the steamer Le Petit Parisien on the Lac de Bourget Ap*[ril] *11 1885* and on its pages are numerous pencil and watercolour drawings of dogs, train and continental journeys, mountains and lakes, and a view at Frogmore, Windsor, dated July 1886.

A family member of the sketch book owners, Leta Smith, worked as a royal archivist in Windsor Castle from 1924-57.

She was awarded various medals for her service, including an MVO (Member of the Victorian Order) presented to her by Queen Elizabeth II, which were also set to be included in the auction.

...while oils sell in London auction

Two still-life oil paintings by Queen Victoria believed to date back to the second half of the 19th century were found among family heirlooms in a Surrey cottage.

One features purple irises in a green vase, the other a vibrant mix of pink, yellow, orange and white blooms in a blue vase resting on yellow fabric.

Pitched at £8000-10,000 each at **Hansons London** (25% buyer's premium) in Teddington on January 28, the irises example (far left) took £9500 while the mixed flowers (left) went at £10,000. Both measured 2ft 7in x 13in (80 x 33cm).

The paintings are thought to have been bought at an Isle of Wight auction in 1944.

Chris Kirkham, associate director of Hansons London, said: "The royal items were purchased decades ago by the seller's grandfather. He lived on the Isle of Wight and we understand he acquired them at a sale which offered items relating to Osborne House, the queen's holiday home on the island. Both paintings bear letters of provenance on the reverse.

"The isle is home to Carisbrooke Castle Museum. It was founded in 1898 by Princess Beatrice, Queen Victoria's youngest daughter. The princess died in 1944 and a sale of some items took place around that time."

The letters, dated October 1945, state: "With reference to the two pictures said to have been painted by Queen Victoria, which you bought at the Carisbrooke sale. I have since seen Lord Carisbrooke and he says there is no doubt that they were in fact painted by the late Queen Victoria."

The lord was Alexander Mountbatten, 1st Marquess of Carisbrooke, the last surviving grandson of Victoria. He was born Prince Alexander Albert of Battenberg in 1886 and died in 1960 at the age of 73.

Pins were a personal gift

Cotswold saleroom **Kinghams (23% buyer's premium)** offered a series of four stick pins gifted by Queen Victoria.

They came from the estate of the late Sir Alfred Mordaunt Egerton (1843-1908) and the gold enamel stickpin pin was presented by Victoria to him on her 80th birthday. It was engraved *24th May 1899*, the special date.

Sir Alfred was a high-ranking English soldier and courtier who in 1878 married the Hon Mary Georgina Ormsby-Gore who was lady in waiting to the Duchess of Connaught.

The pins were estimated at £400-600 but the Moreton-in-Marsh auction house was hopeful for more given the "considerable interest from collectors in Queen Victoria memorabilia and the fact the pins were a personal gift with solid provenance". On February 24, in the Fine Jewellery, Watches & Designer Goods auction, they did indeed do better, selling for £1600.



Married for 25 years

Alex Styles (1922-2017) was in 1966 given a glowing accolade in *The Times*: "Many think he is the finest designer of hand-made silver in England."

His main career began in 1947, becoming a staff designer for the Goldsmiths and Silversmiths Company. In 1952 Styles joined Garrard & Co when the two companies merged. His lengthy career with Garrard ended only when he retired in 1987 (the same year a major retrospective of his work was held at Goldsmiths' Hall).

According to styles-silver.co.uk, in 1953 he was responsible for a "fine bowl with lion and unicorn handles to commemorate the coronation and the following year designed his first mace, for St Ives Town Council. Over the next few decades he would design numerous pieces of regalia including mayoral badges that are still in use all over the world."

It adds: "In 1969 the people of Caernarvon commissioned a four-piece coffee set to be presented to HRH The Prince of Wales on his investiture."

Shown **above right** is a Garrards silver limited edition commemorative model of Queen Elizabeth II and The Duke of Edinburgh for their silver wedding anniversary (1947-72) by Styles, signed with facsimile signature.

Numbered 8/12, the height including base is 11½ in (29cm). Estimated at £800-1200 in the **Mitchells (25% buyer's premium)** auction in Cockermouth, Cumbria, on March 22, it made **£1600**.









50 Year Collection of **King Edward VIII** The Finest Collection in Private Hands

This collection comes in two parts, ephemera and medallic portraits.

The ephemera collection is the finest in the world after the one held by the royal family. It begins with Edward's birth announcement (1894) in George V's handwriting and ends with his 1936 daybook entry 'Finis' on the day of the abdication. Also included is the entire archive of photographs and letters from the chateau in France where the Duke and Duchess of Windsor were married, and even baby hairs from Edward's head, kept by his nanny. Letters, photos and correspondence from his travels over many years and from many countries. The scope is outstanding.

Much of the collection has been catalogued.

The medallic collection is the result of 50 years' work assembling and amalgamating purchases from all over the world. It starts in 1897 with Edward in the famous 'four generation portrait'. It includes the unique silver medallion that Queen Victoria gave Edward on her jubilee in 1897, and the unique example of the only British war medal ever issued with Edward. It formed the basis for Joseph Giordno's book, *Portraits of a Prince.*

This collection would be of interest to a museum or a specialist collector. It contains some extremely rare pulls from original Edward VIII coinage dies, swords, paintings, busts, china and much more - it is for sale for £6,500,000

Live it up in mock Tudor

A doublet and hose worn by the Earl of Abergavenny at the coronation of George IV in 1821 came to auction in Nottinghamshire.

The coronation was one of most extravagant and costly coronations in English history - more than 20 times the cost of the previous event in 1761. Peers of all ages were required to appear in Westminster Abbey in a 'Tudor Romantic' themed ivory silk and silver gilt-braided costume.

This example, offered at Mellors & Kirk (28.8% buyer's premium inc VAT) on April 19, was made for Henry Nevill, 2nd Earl of Abergavenny (1755-1843), and was inherited through the Nevill family to the current vendor at the three-day auction.

At the sight of the glittering costume of the peers in Westminster Abbey, Sir Walter Scott is reported to have described the scene as "gay and gorgeous and antique dress which floated before the eye" Nevill's costume sold for £1600.

Pioneering photographer

Pictured **right** is a signed photo-portrait of the 20-year-old future Queen Elizabeth II and her then 15-year-old younger sister, Princess Margaret. It appeared on a Christmas card of 1946 that sold to an online buyer for

£1350 at Halls (22/12% buyer's premium) of Shrewsbury on March 9 against an estimate of £400-600.

The card has gilt *E* and *M* initials, each surmounted by a crown, on the cover. It is signed twice by the two princesses, below the photograph and below the Christmas wishes.

The photograph was taken by Dorothy Wilding on May 27, 1946. Wilding (1893-1976) was the first woman to be made royal photographer, working at the 1937 coronation of King George VI.

She was later granted the first official photographic sitting of the new sovereign



when Elizabeth II came to the throne. It took place on February 26 1952, just 20 days after the accession, to create portraits to use as the basis for her image on new coins, banknotes and stamps (Wilding had previously photographed George VI for use on currency and stamps).

Wilding is also renowned for her 1923 Jazz Age portrait Frieze, of The Midnight Follies performers in the cabaret at the London Metropole hotel. She had a studio in London by the age of 21 and opened another in New York. An exhibition of her work with 130 photographs is taking place in Gloucester, her home town, until May 23.

Drum role

This drum major's uniform is from the era of Queen Elizabeth II in the second half of the 20th century, as indicated by the big, gilded-thread monogram E II R under the crown. Made of burgundy velvet, it features a black velvet collar and sleeves almost completely covered with gold bands, and is about 3ft (93cm) in height.

The uniform emerged not in a UK auction but at Czerny (25% buyer's premium inc tax) in Sarzana, Italy. Guided at €800-1200, it took €3900.



Get your teeth into this

Cheffins' (29.4% buyer's premium inc VAT) Library Sale of April 27 included a Buckingham Palace note-card scribbled on with pencil drawings by a young Queen Elizabeth II and Princess Margaret.

The pair did the drawings probably c.1938-39 while visiting their dentist Mr Aldred. The card was left in the waiting room and has since been copied for the Royal Archives.

It was estimated at £1000-1500 but did rather better - selling for a whopping £9000.




Letters reveal heartbreak

A collection of 32 letters and cards written by Diana, Princess of Wales to two friends came for sale at Lay's (18% buyer's premium) in Penzance as part of an Antiques & Interiors sale on February 16.

Sold in individual lots, they were penned by Diana to Susie and Tarek Kassem, whom she first met in August 1995. The Kassems have kept some of their more personal and confidential letters but the content of the Lay's items do touch on the enormous stress Diana experienced during periods of very public heartbreak.

They had estimates of between £800-1200 to £5000-10,000 with the proceeds


going to charities. The lots sold well over their guides, with one of the top prices, £26,000, paid for the signed letter shown above dated December 17, 1996, handwritten in ink two sides on Diana's personal cream and burgundy Kensington Palace notepaper. This Art Deco sapphire and diamond brooch, c.1925, cased by Collingwood, was a gift to Princess Margaret from her grandmother Queen Mary, on her confirmation on April 15, 1946, when the princess was aged 15.

Being sold by a collector, it will be offered at Noonans of Mayfair in the auction of Jewellery, Watches and Objects of Vertu on June 13 with an estimate of **£8000-12,000**.

Also included in the sale is a white Honiton lace fan, c.1900, formerly the property of Princess Margaret and also given as a gift from her grandmother, in 1939. The lace fan was made to order by Queen Mary in 1904, for Victoria Mary, Princess of Wales, for the St Louis Exhibition in the US. The fan is guided at £1000-2000.

Frances Noble, associate director, and head of jewellery at Noonans says: "During the years of the Second World War, the two princesses Elizabeth and Margaret took part in royal pantomimes at Christmas,





performed at Windsor Castle, helping to build morale during the dark years of the war. The first was held in 1941. Photographs of the sisters in the 1943 Aladdin show Margaret holding the lace fan in her role as Princess Roxana, with her sister taking the lead role of Aladdin

"The idea to stage the royal pantomimes came after the two princesses appeared in a concert with children from the Royal School to aid the war effort. Funds from the shows went towards the Royal Household Wool Fund which provided comforts for the troops."

Both the brooch and fan were formerly sold at Christie's auction, Property from the Collection of Her Royal Highness, The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, exactly 17 years ago to the day of the Noonans auction. Last of Henry's six wives and spared death or divorce

Sotheby's Coronation Sale ending on May 4 is a crosscategory collection of manuscripts, jewellery, artwork and objects relating to the British monarchy, past and present.

Among the highlights is the copy of the Declaration of Breda as reported in ATG No 2589. Billed as "the most important royal document ever to come to auction", the manuscript that restored the monarchy after Oliver Cromwell's death is estimated at £400,000-600,000.

The Declaration of Breda outlined the terms on which the exiled king could return to Britain, laying the foundations for the shape of the future monarchy.

Another significant document at the same sale is a letter from Katherine Parr announcing her marriage to Henry VIII in 1543 (pictured left). Addressed to her brother William, it is estimated at £15,000-20,000. Henry died in 1547. ▶ sothebys.com

Queen Mother caught in sculpture form for the final time

Dreweatts of Newbury will offer a selection of royal-related works in its Interiors sale on May 16.

Among the highlights is the last sculpture of HM Queen Elizabeth,

the Queen Mother (1900-2002), before her death, which was created by Martin Jennings (b.1957), the sculptor designing the new coins featuring King Charles III. The bust was one of two that Jennings created of the Queen

Mother in 1998. One of them was commissioned by the Friends of St Paul's Cathedral on the occasion of her upcoming 100th birthday and was unveiled by the Princess Royal in 2000. It now sits on permanent display in the OBE chapel at St Paul's Cathedral. The other is the example offered here.

Jennings' creation of the busts involved a total of seven sittings with the Queen Mother at Clarence House and they were initially modelled in plaster for ease of transport, before being later cast in bronze.

She is naturalistically modelled wearing her favourite Greville tiara (created in 1921 for British society hostess

and philanthropist Margaret Greville DBE by jeweller Lucien Hirtz, at Boucheron and bequeathed to the Queen Mother on her death in 1942. It is now often worn by HM the Queen Consort). In the portrait bust it was worn alongside a matching necklace and earrings above flowing robes, which were held in place by a brooch.

Jennings is known for many notable public works, such as a statue of the Crimean War nurse Mary Seacole in front of St Thomas' Hospital in London and George Orwell outside BBC Broadcasting House.

Heads you win a coin set

The final proof coin set bearing Queen Victoria's portrait was issued by the Royal Mint in two sets in 1893. The smaller six-coin set contains a silver crown, half crown, florin, shilling, sixpence and threepence with a 10-coin set including four gold coins (a five pounds piece, two pounds piece, sovereign and half sovereign).

Engraver Thomas Brock (1847-1922) was given the task of producing what would become known as the 'widow head', 'veiled head' or 'old head' bust of the monarch. His initials *TB* appear in relief in the field



below the shoulder.

Records at the Royal Mint suggest a total of 773 of the larger sets were issued but, in a strong market for the best-preserved English gold coins, it is not unusual for a good example to bring more than $\pounds 20,000 -$ a tenfold increase on what it might have made at the turn of the 21st century. The condition of the $\pounds 5$ piece – the most valuable single coin in the set – is

key.

The set (**above**) offered by **Adam Partridge (20% buyer's premium)** in Macclesfield on April 13 came with a letter dated 1976 from a numismatist in Blackburn offering it for sale at £1250. Some of the elements were good rather than pristine but, estimated at £3000-5000, it took **£40,000**.

Two complete 1893 proof sets were offered by Roseberys in London last November as part of an 85-lot consignment from the Schroder merchant banking family. Estimated at £2000-3000, they took £90,000 and £75,000.

'From Edward to Wallis'

A 1920s-30s platinum and 18ct gold french diamond and emerald bracelet bracelet and a ring said to have been given by Edward VIII to Wallis Simpson sold for **£42,000** (guide £25,000-35,000) at Belfast auction house **Bloomfield (15% buyer's premium)** on April 24.

The vendor's grandmother, Esther McCreery, was in the early part of the 20th



century living in Hillsboro, California. However, during the Second World War she became involved in liaison with/for the US Embassy in the Bahamas, when she became very friendly with Simpson and the former king and they were known regularly to be drinking together.

Bloomfield says McCreery purchased the bracelet

and ring from Simpson. "After the war when McCreery returned to California, a gentleman from England had contacted her to see if he could purchase the items so they could be back where they belong, but she refused."



Spoon served a princess

This medical spoon bears the crest and inscription *The Princess Sophia* (the 12th child of George III and Queen Charlotte). The George IV spoon by maker C Eley is marked for London 1825 and is estimated at **£500-600** at John Nicholson's May 19 sale in Fernhurst, Hampshire.



The May 18 sale of Jewellery, Watches & Silver at Dawsons in Maidenhead includes this pair of silver sauce tureens by William Bateman for Rundell, Bridge & Co, London 1837.

Engraved with the royal cypher, they are part of the huge service ordered by William IV and Adelaide of Saxe-Meiningen, the queen consort, from royal goldsmith Rundell, Bridge & Co.

Collectively the service, supplied across the 1830s, weighed close to 10,000oz. Pieces were engraved with the king's cipher, the queen's cipher, or both.

The many elements of the service have been dispersed since it was sold as a single lot at Christie's May 1898 sale of 'Old English Silver plate'. The catalogue description at the time mentions 168 dinner plates, 30 soup plates, a circular bread basket, four wine coolers, two pairs of soup tureens, six sauce tureens, and various meat and serving dishes.

These particular sauce tureens, estimated at **£10,000-15,000**, were acquired by Sir Lewis Richardson who owned Harrington House, now The Russian Embassy, at 13 Kensington Palace Gardens, and have passed through descent to the current owner.

The Richardsons were a prominent trading family in South Africa, instrumental in Port Elizabeth's rise as an economic force in the late 19th and early 20th century.

Royal collectables

Charles at age five failed to be popular

Numismatic dealer **Daniel Fearon** has sold a group of bronzed galvano medals depicting Charles (then nearly five years old), The Duke of Edinburgh and Princess Margaret to the British Museum's department of coins and medals just ahead of this year's coronation.

The medal of Charles was intended to be a speculative issue by Messrs John Pinches at the time of Queen Elizabeth's coronation in 1953. The company used several portraits of the queen on the various medals it had been commissioned to strike but, it would seem, there was little commercial interest in a medal of Prince Charles.

The child portrait is not signed but Fearon believes it almost certainly to be the work of Leslie Ernest Pinches (1903-80). While no actual medals were struck, a couple of trial pieces came on the market in 1987-88, when the Pinches Archive was sold in two auctions at Glendining & Co.

The price paid by the British Museum for the three medals was under £1000

Other highlights include a William IV cut-glass sceptre surmounted by a cross pattée, hallmarked William Neal, London 1833, and a collection of silverware by Robert Hennell (1741-1811). grey-harris.co.uk

Among a group of stick pins (pictured) is a c.1902 Edward VII royal presentation gold and enamel stickpin set with diamonds and a white gold *E* monogram over the numeral VII in yellow gold (pictured centre). Contained in an original fitted case of Garrard & Co, it is priced at **£1750**.

Two more at Petworth...

Sarah Colegrave Fine Art, a regular at the *Petworth Park Antiques & Fine Art Fair* (May 19-21), will bring a chair from the investiture of the Price of Wales in 1969.

The chairs, made for Prince Charles on July 1, 1969, were designed by Lord Snowdon (Anthony Armstrong-Jones) for seating guests inside Caernarfon Castle. It is priced **from £1200**.





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London as seen before big blaze

View of the city ahead of the Great Fire was attributed to a Dutch artist who produced several panoramas

Three works by Dutch and Flemish painters – a dramatic cityscape and two works on paper – were among the lots catching the eye at the latest Old Masters, British & European Paintings sale at Woolley & Wallis (25% buyer's premium) in Salisbury.

The cityscape was a vista showing London before the Great Fire of 1666. The 2ft x 3ft (6l x 9lcm) oil on canvas was attributed to Thomas Wyck (1616-77), a Dutch painter from Haarlem who specialised in interior scenes as well as Italianate paintings of shipping and seaports.

He is thought to have studied under Adriaen van Ostade (1610-85) and likely went to Italy as a young man.

In his later career Wyck produced at least two dozen paintings portraying alchemists at work, two of which are now in Ham House, another in the Fitzwilliam Museum and seven held by the Wellcome Collection.

A similar work holds the artist's auction record: An Alchemist at Work in a Vaulted Room, with a Woman Seated that sold for 351,825 Dutch guilders (£106,425) at Christie's Amsterdam in 1998.

Wyck (also referred to as 'Thomas Wijck') had two spells in London.

The first was from c.1663-68 where he produced a number of impressive panoramas. They include a fine view of London from Southwark, showing St Paul's Cathedral and London Bridge, which

Cathedral and London Bridge, which is in the Devonshire Collection at Chatsworth House.

The second was from c.1673-74, when he came to England with his son, the painter Jan Wyck (1645-1702) who would come to specialise in baroque landscapes as well as military and naval scenes. The two artists were based for a time at Ham House, receiving patronage from the Duke and Duchess of Lauderdale.

The work offered in Salisbury on March 8 depicted a view looking north across the Thames with the Old Palace of Westminster, including St Stephen's Chapel which then served as the chamber of the House of Commons, visible in the distance alongside Westminster Hall and

The artist and his painter son were based for a time at Ham House, receiving patronage from the Duke and Duchess of Lauderdale Westminster Abbey. To the right hand side is the Palace of Whitehall with Banqueting House prominent.

View of the Thames at Westminster on Lord Mayor's Day was seemingly painted during Wyck's first spell in England.

The river is shown packed with vessels including Livery Company barges with their guild banners on display. In the centre of the work, firing a salute as the flotilla passes, is a royal yacht, possibly the *Royal Escape* on which Charles II had taken passage to escape parliamentarian forces during the civil war.

An impressive picture in a good size with an added historical element, it was not only a rare example of a cityscape by the artist (such works come up less frequently than his interiors), but contemporaneous vistas showing London from before the Great Fire are not often available.

This example had previously been owned by the insurance firm Willis Group and had sold at Bonhams' sale of the corporate collection in 2008 (ATG was unable to confirm the price). Consigned here from a private collection, it was estimated at £15,000-20,000 and, after generating a decent contest, was knocked down at £38,000 to the UK trade.

Considering that the previous auction high for a Thomas Wyck cityscape was a view of London ablaze during the Great Fire itself that made £29,890 at Sotheby's back in 1991, the price here looked pretty strong.

Private sources

The two works on paper that attracted strong interest at Woolley & Wallis both came from private sources and sold to European collectors.

A small oil on paper of two figures in a larder was catalogued as 'circle of Frans Snyders (1579-1657)' and estimated at just £200-300. Executed 'en brunaille' (meaning it was painted in different shades of brown), it also depicted a fish, swan, cabbage and a sheep's head.

Snyders, a highly skilled Flemish painter who was a close friend of Rubens, produced plenty of hunting and market scenes but he is sometimes said to have mastered the painting of dead animals in particular.

He is known to have produced a number of larder scenes and this $6\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{3}{4}$ in (16 x 27cm) sketch had certain stylistic similarities to his recorded brown ink drawings on this theme.

The 'come-and-buy-me' estimate meant it was always likely to attract strong levels of interest and, on the day, it was knocked down at £14,000 after a fervent bidding competition. This price represented a good sum even for a fully attributed Snyders sketch – standing comfortably in the top 10 recorded auction prices for works on paper by the artist according to Artprice.

A bidding battle also broke out for



Webb depicts majesty of Greenwich Palace in smaller form

Born into a family of artists, James Webb (c.1825-95) became a prolific painter primarily of landscapes, seascapes and river scenes depicting locations around England and Wales as well as the Netherlands, France, Italy and southern Spain.

His father was the marine and coastal painter Archibald Webb (c.1792-1883) and his elder brother was Byron Webb (1831-67), who specialised in hunting and animal pictures.

Webb is thought to have studied under his father but, as his career progressed, he became more influenced by Romantic painters including leading lights such as JMW Turner.

His large-scale and atmospheric compositions, for which he frequently took liberties with the topography for dramatic effect, were certainly popular in their day. They were also financially rewarding – enabling him to invest considerable amounts in the stockmarket which, at one point, made him fantastically wealthy (although later losses and mortgage liabilities meant he had to file for bankruptcy).



Webb's views of London are a notable part of his oeuvre. A finely composed view of Old Kew Bridge is now in the Museum of London while, back in 1991, a sweeping view of St Paul's Cathedral from across the Thames set a record £25,000 when it sold Christie's.

But while the artist's market has sagged somewhat since those stronger days, as is the case with many 19th century painters, a boost **Left:** *Greenwich, Kent* by James Webb, **£7000** at Gorringe's.

came back in January this year when a large-scale painting titled *The Majesty* of *Greenwich* made \$65,000 (£52,731) at Sotheby's New York. It was the fourth-highest price recorded for Webb according to Artprice.

More recently, a smaller painting of Greenwich emerged at Gorringe's (25% buyer's premium) on March 13. Showing Greenwich Palace from a different angle, the $13\frac{1}{2} \times 19\frac{3}{4}$ in (34 x 50cm) oil on panel was signed and inscribed by the artist on the back with the date 1879-80.

Pitched at £400-600 in the Lewes sale, it always looked likely to generate competition and it was eventually knocked down at £7000 via thesaleroom.com.

While *The Majesty of Greenwich* picture was a different proposition on account of being almost three times the size and a much more ambitious composition, a more comparable picture was a view of the City of London, about a third larger than the current work, that made £13,000 at Sotheby's in 2000.

a chalk drawing by the Dutch artist Abraham Jansz Begeyn (1637-97). The $10\frac{1}{2}$ x $14\frac{1}{2}$ in (27 x 37cm) sketch depicted an avenue of trees and was signed to the lower left.

The artist was born in Leiden and travelled widely around the Netherlands and Germany (he also spent some time in England), producing a range of landscapes, topographical works and still lifes.

Towards the tail-end of his career he became court painter to Frederick III of Brandenburg (later Frederick I of Prussia) but died in Berlin when he fell from scaffolding as he was working.

While his paintings can make strong five-figure sums at auction, his drawings are much rarer on the market and have little track record in the saleroom. Estimated at £200-400, this example established a new benchmark when it drew considerable interest and was knocked down at £7500.

Koerner temple

The top lot of the Woolley & Wallis sale was a later work by a German artist: an evocative view of an ancient Egyptian temple by Ernst Koerner (1846-1927).

The artist became captivated with Egypt after a trip in 1873 and the detailed architectural depictions he produced, often showing a falling sunset, became his best-known works – especially those of famous excavations that were taking place at the time.

Along with his views of other sites in Turkey and Middle East, they remain his most commercial

Turner and Wilkie turn up at auction

Drawing four phone bidders plus online interest, a rediscovered early watercolour of Chepstow Castle by JMW Turner (1775-1851) led Cheffins' latest fine art sale.

Estimated at $\pounds 30,000-50,000$ at the auction in Cambridge on March 22-23, it was knocked down at $\pounds 75,000$ to one of the phones.

Regional high

While Turner's later works on paper depicting views of Switzerland, Germany and Venice can make substantially more, especially those rendered with swirling effects of light and colour, this was seemingly the highest price for an earlier example ever sold at a UK auction outside London.

It outsold a watercolour showing the mouth of the river Avon that made £40,000 at Tennants in 2013. The Chepstow picture was previously recorded but its whereabouts were unknown.

It came to the Cambridge saleroom from a London vendor descended from George Cock Gibson (1896-1989) in whose family it had been since at least 1956.

Following its consignment, its earlier provenance was traced back to Dr Thomas Monro, one of the artist's most important patrons.

The 12¼ x 16½ in (31 x 42cm) watercolour shows the castle overlooking a wooden bridge across the Wye. It was executed by a 19-year-old Turner shortly after a tour of Wales.

Signed and dated 1794, it was one of 16 scenes commissioned for John Walker's *Copper-Plate Magazine* between 1794-98 – the first time Turner was asked to supply a set of topographical views for a publication.

Unfinished portrait

Another 'missing' picture generating interest at Cheffins was a portrait by **Sir David Wilkie (1785-1841)** which had been untraced since the early 20th century.

Depicting Andrew Christie (1788-1821) of Pitlessie, Fife, the 2ft 5in x 2ft (75 x 62cm) oil on canvas was unfinished because the sitter travelled to India where he died before it could be completed. Wilkie's finished portrait of the sitter's non-identical twin brother, Charles Christie, is now in the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

The portrait in Cambridge was first recorded by the artist's biographer Allan Cunningham (1784-1842) shortly after Wilkie's death but its location was unknown until it came to Cheffins from a vendor descended from Captain John Aitken (1863-1924), who bought it at London dealer Agnew & Son in 1905. Aitken himself was a descendant of the sitter's sister.

Giving an insight into Wilkie's early style and working methods, the picture was deemed a rare opportunity to acquire a striking and academically significant portrait by the Scottish artist.

With the work to be included in the forthcoming catalogue raisonné of Sir David Wilkie's works by Hamish Miles (it is currently being edited), it was estimated at £10,000-15,000 but drew good interest, selling at £24,000.

The price was among the highest sums at auction for the artist in the last 10 years.



Temple view takes top price

pictures. The auction record for an individual work by Koerner remains the \notin 90,000 (£71,045) for a view of the ruins of Baalbek Temple in Lebanon that sold at Dorotheum in Austria in 2014.

The 3ft 4in x 4ft 11in (1.01 x

Signed and dated 1888, it had plenty of appeal – not least the subject matter, the handling of both the architecture and evening light, and also the presence of figures to foreground and middle-ground – and it demonstrated how the artist's market it not just the preserve of European buyers.

Estimated at £30,000-50,000, it was knocked down at £40,000 to a Middle Eastern collector.



Famous tiger burns bright - despite being a copy

A later but good copy of George Stubbs' (1724-1806) famous painting *Portrait of The Royal Tiger* earned its stripes when it emerged at **Bellmans'** (25% buyer's premium) latest Old Master, British and European Paintings auction on March 28.

Stubbs painted three versions of the work in the 1760-70s, all showing the tiger in the same pose but on different scales.

Stubbs trio

The first was commissioned by the 4th Duke of Marlborough and remains in the private apartments at Blenheim Palace.

Another, the largest of the three, was previously part of the Portman collection and sold for £2.9m at Christie's back in 1995 (it got away under estimate but was a then-record for Stubbs). The third and smallest picture is now part of the Paul Mellon Collection and hangs at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts.

The 2ft 7in x 3ft 10in (78cm x



1.17m) oil on canvas was closest in size to the version at Blenheim but around 10% smaller. It also seemed to follow the Blenheim version in terms of the tiger's features and the composition of the foliage and background. Thought to date from the 19th century, the Bellmans' catalogue described it as 'an excellent copy'. It came to auction from a vendor whose great-great-grandfather purchased it in c.1900.

In terms of its condition, it

had been relined and had areas of retouching visible under UV light (it had been sent by the vendor's father to restorer Arthur Ackermann & Peter Johnson in the 1990s).

However, despite craquelure and opaque varnish, the catalogue concluded that 'the work appears very presentable and is in 'ready to hang' condition'.

While copies such as this are often slightly tricky to estimate, Bellmans plugged for a £10,000-15,000 pitch, a level which was not regarded as either undercooked or unattainable.

It attracted decent interest and, coming down to a battle between two London dealers, it was eventually knocked down at £38,000.

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
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Auction Reports Books and works on paper

Story of the start of slave trade abolition in Britain

Work published in 1808 is one of the highlights of a wide-ranging sale held in Gloucestershire

Thomas Clarkson (1760-46) devoted much of his life to fighting for the abolition of slavery and toured the country assembling evidence, interviewing some 20,000 sailors it is said, and acquiring equipment used on the slave ships.

He persuaded William Wilberforce (1759-1833) to take up the cause in Parliament and in 1807 the Slave Trade Act was passed, banning the transportation of slaves in British ships.

Eventually, the Slavery Abolition Act of 1833 abolished slavery in most parts of the British Empire – the bill being passed just three days before Wilberforce died.

Clarkson's work The History of the Rise, Progress, and Accomplishment of the Abolition of the African slave-trade, by the British Parliament was published in two octavo volumes in 1808 by Longman, Hurst, Rees & Orme, and illustrated with just three engraved plates. Two them were folding.

The copy sold for £1900 in an April 5 sale held by **Dominic Winter (20/24% buyer's premium)** showed some scattered spotting and browning (mostly to the plates). Bound in contemporary half calf and rebacked to preserve the original morocco title and volume number labels, it bears the armorial bookplate of the Earl of Selborne.

Two for one

Other highlights in the South Cerney auction included a volume that in a now broken 18th century binding brought together 1676 copies of John Speed's *Theatre of the Empire of Great Britaine...* and *The Prospect of the Most Famous Parts of the World.* It sold for a mid-estimate £24,000.

A selection of stand-out lots from the sale is shown on these pages.

The 500th and final edition of a very special Endymion

Illustrator John Buckland-Wright's own specially bound and annotated copy of the 1947, Golden Cockerel Press edition of John Keats' *Endymion* topped a March 16 sale held by **Chiswick Auctions (25/12% buyer's premium)**.

Sold at £48,000, this example in the original vellum gilt binding by Sangorski & Sutcliffe was the 500th and last copy of that edition. As well as the standard 58 wood-engraved plates, it featured 82 original pencil drawings, among them rejected designs for its illustrations, bound in at the end.

There was some browning and foxing to a few pages, but this very special copy was also accompanied by a separate box containing some 300 other examples of the engravings in various states. **Funeral procession**

Bid to £12,500 in the west London sale was an 1821 watercolour sketch by Emeric Essex Vidal, an English naval officer and artist, which depicts the original funeral procession of Napoleon on St Helena. Bonaparte's body was much later returned to France for a state funeral.

The watercolour sold in London was one specially made by Vidal for John Wilson Croker, an Irish-born lawyer, statesman, writer and collector with a special interest in the French Revolution. A large number of valuable documents that Croker acquired are now in the British Museum collections.

A collection of paintings depicting wellknown scenes of 1950s Middlesbrough by Kenneth Gribble (1925-95), who had a strong affinity to the town and region throughout his career, is being offered as part of an art sale at Elstob Auctioneers of Ripon.

A number of familiar landmarks are featured in the 13 paintings including the Transporter Bridge, Empire Theatre and the Dorman Museum, as well as views of Thistle Street, Market Street, Buxton Street and Borough Road.

The paintings were collected over a number of years by a Middlesbrough couple with many being bought directly from the artist himself.

The collection is now being sold as individual lots, with price estimates ranging from £40-60 for a pair of charcoal sketches up to **£500-700** for an oil on canvas of Buxton Street, signed and dated 1952 (shown here). The timed online sale runs until May 7.

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Asian Art Chinese works of art previews

UK still holds its own despite overseas focus

Once the centre of the Asian art trade, and still the repository for some of the most knowledgeable dealers on the subject, the London market has weakened in recent years.

Christie's no longer holds auctions of Asian art in the UK (it continues to source material here for sale in Paris, New York and Hong Kong) and this year Sotheby's May offering is missing a live event.

Sotheby's conducts four online only sales: one for Japanese arms and armour (closing on May 10), another for Japanese woodblock prints (May 10), more Chinese works of art from the comprehensive collection formed by Dr Wou Kiuan (May 17) and a sale titled China 5000 Years (May 19). However, it would be wrong to talk too much of decline. While it is true that the major sales of Chinese works of art are now held in New York and Hong Kong, the UK still holds its own.

This spring Bonhams embraces the London market with four live sales and, as has become the norm, there is plenty going on in the regions too. Travel outside Mayfair and St James and you will discover a host of sales and – in this season's crop – a healthy selection of well-provenanced pieces of obvious quality and some notable discoveries.

A selection of highlights appears across the following pages. *Roland Arkell*

Xuande imperial appeal

Dreweatts' Chinese Ceramics & Works of Art & Japanese, Indian & Islamic Ceramics & Works of Art sale on May 17-18 includes a very rare Xuande (1426-35) mark and period cloisonné 'pomegranate' box and cover.

It comes from the collection of the late Major Edward Copleston Radcliffe (1898-1967), having been acquired at Sotheby's in London in 1946 and then displayed at the National Gallery of South Africa's *Chinese Exhibition* in Cape Town in 1953.

It is one of just five known examples and seemingly the only one to remain in private hands.

Dr Yingwen Tao, specialist in Chinese and Asian art at Dreweatts, believes all were made by the same craftsman for the emperor. "There is every indication that all five were made in the same imperial

workshop as crucially all are doubly marked with an incised Xuande six-character reign mark on the underside of the box and the interior of the cover. They also all have similar designs and are uniform in size [5in/12cm in diameter]."

Mark Newstead, director of Asian ceramics and works of art at Dreweatts, found the piece among other Chinese works of art still displayed in a cabinet in the attic of a family home as it had been when Major Radcliffe (pictured **below**) died in 1967.

"When I first inspected the piece, it looked too good to be true as 99.9% of Xuande marked pieces are later copies," he said. "It is one of the most copied marks of all time and is found on



s one of the most copied marks of all time and is found on pieces from the 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th centuries. I assumed it was made in the 16th or early 17th century and it was only when we were able to compare it with the example at Fenton House that we started to believe it could be a 'lost' example of this rare group."

The making of cloisonné enamel in the early Ming period was strictly regulated by the palace eunuchs, who operated under the auspices of the Yuyongjian, a subdivision of the Neifu, 'The Inner Treasury', responsible for supplies to the Imperial Household.

This box has a printed estimate of **£6,000-10,000** although Dreweatts now believes that is "now looking extremely modest, even in its slightly damaged condition."

Ming ritual water vessel

The sale of Asian Art at Chiswick Auctions on May 19 is led by this rare example of Ming dynasty cloisonné. The 15th or 16th century bronze and enamel ritual water vessel or *kundika* comes for sale from a private collection in

France with a provenance to Robert Rousset (1901-82), an employee of the Compagnie de la Chine et des Indes. It is guided at £30.000-40.000.

Following Indian prototypes, *kundika* were used by monks to wash their mouths after meals. Filled through the hinged spout with purified water, the contents were sprinkled out of the top. The polychrome lotus scroll decoration to this example is a common ornament on Chinese cloisonné of this period and especially appropriate for a vessel connected with Buddhist ritual. The gilt underside is incised with the protective visvavajra motif. **© chiswickauctions.co.uk**

Bannermen fly high

Bonhams' flagship sale of Fine Chinese Art in Bond Street on May 18 includes a rare Qianlong period ink on silk court painting. Dated by the inscription to the Wushen year, corresponding to 1788, the subject is the bannerman and 'national hero' Teldence.

Drawn from a cross section of society, bannermen were the Qing dynasty's military elite. This portrait was number five of a series commissioned after victory in Taiwan against Ming-loyalist rebels in the years 1787-88. Teldence (who appears to have died during the campaign) wears a peacock feather in his black fur-trimmed winter hat, an imperial gift bestowed only to officers who had distinguished themselves on the battlefield.

A total of 50 imperial bannerman paintings were

housed in the Ziguange (Hall of Purple Splendour), located in the West Garden of the palace in Beijing. This example, estimated at **£200,000-300,000**, comes for sale from an English private collection. According to the owner, the painting was gifted to her late husband in the 1970s.

As previously reported, Bonhams is also holding a sale on May 17 titled Bronze and Brush featuring classic bronzes and modern paintings from the dealer Michael Goedhuis.

Journey through history

Sotheby's conducts a timed online sale from May 10-17 titled A Journey Through China's History: The Dr Wou Kiuan Collection.

Wou's years of collecting fortuitously coincided with an abundant availability of exceptional Chinese art on the London market. From the mid-1950s to the late 60s, he formed a collection of well over 1000 works in multiple categories of Chinese art from Neolithic utilitarian vessels to late Qing porcelain.

Pictured here are two Daoguang (1821-50) mark and period dragon dishes; one in iron-red and underglaze-blue, the other in green enamel. They are guided at **£3000-5000** each and, like all lots in the sale, will be offered without reserve.

The May sale will be the first of three online dispersals of the collection, following on from three live auctions last year. (>> sothebys.com

Guanyin on hand



This rare 2ft 7in (78cm) high white marble stele depicting the Buddhist goddess Guanyin predates was carved in the Northern Qi dynasty, (550-577AD), around the time of the Sutton Hoo hoard.

Dealers' Diary



Six weeks of special female focus

London dealership stages extensive exhibition and series of events celebrating women in the arts in general

by Frances Allitt

The next exhibition at **Bowman Sculpture** capitalises on the curent demand for the work of female artists in spectacular fashion.

The Power of She: A Tribute to Women in the Arts is a six-week long festival of female creativity with two women at the helm: the St James's gallery's director Mica Bowman and independent curator and dealer Marie-Claudine Llamas of Guerin Projects.

Running from May 4-June 16 in London, the show coincides with Dulwich Picture Gallery's exhibition on Berthe Morisot, the Barbican's show on Alice Neel and the unveiling of the Tate Britain rehang, in which half the contemporary artists represented are set to be women.

It is no secret that major institutions are desperate for female artists to populate their shows and permanent collections, and private buyers are following suit.

Major attractions

Among the 14 artists represented in *The Power* of She are Camille Claudel (1864-1943), Barbara Hepworth (1903-75), Elizabeth Frink (1930-93), Joanna Allen and Lily Lewis, most of them major names to attract serious buyers. The earliest entry is an 18th century painting attributed to Sarah Hoadly (1676-1743).

At its heart it is a traditional show, bringing together primarily sculpture and painting with some mixed media.

Speaking to *ATG* shortly before the show was hung, Llamas said: "We're excited about putting the works up. It always makes the show more explicit and understandable.

That's the generosity of curation, the works speak for themselves."

What Llamas and Bowman would like the works to convey is something meaningful about the history of women's identities and how female artists have impacted the world. To help with this aim, they have widened the scope of the usual gallery show.

Sculptor Emily Young, who has long been represented by the gallery, has created a new work out of lapis lazuli for inclusion.

But, Bowman says, "we're celebrating women in the arts in general".

The art of performance

Along with the usual assortment of talks and panel discussions, the gallery will host performances by female DJs, musicians and Natascha Mair, prima ballerina of the English National Ballet. Pink Diesel, a female-founded rosé wine, is sponsoring the show and there will be a dinner for women in investment banking.

Bowman joined the family

business in 2019. She describes her work at the gallery, launched by her parents in 1993, as "expanding the Contemporary side and jazzing up the 19th century side". Robert Bowman, her father, still heads the dealership, but for this show, Mica is in the spotlight.

Still, the exhibition is not a left turn for the business. Though the gallery is best known for its trade in works by Auguste Rodin, its recent stand-out sales also include those by women such as Claudel, Young, Germaine Richier and Hanneke Beaumont. > bowmansculpture.com > mc-llamas.com

Galloway closes gallery space

Asian art specialist Francesca Galloway has left her Dover Street, London, premises of 16 years as she considers new directions for the business and other interests.

She is one of many dealers who found the need for gallery space was less pressing during the years of lockdown. She spent the time largely in her Suffolk home and realised that business was just as good.

"It was a nice place to work but it sort of outgrew its usefulness. Even 10 years ago if we had been ruthless with ourselves, we would have realised we didn't need a shopfront," Galloway tells *ATG*.

As her lease came to an end last month, she prepared to move to a one-room office space in Holland Park. Before she left, however, she used the gallery for a passion project: photographing her 20th century Haute Couture collection, which has been 30 years in the making.

As well as buying French haute couture she has invested in British street fashion. The photoshoot was an eight-person job and the first plan is to publish the collection.

However, Indian and Islamic art remains central to the business, and Galloway has already embarked on a Mughal painting exhibition and catalogue for 2024. She says that she hopes to work on selling more collections, and that while she plans to host future exhibitions in gallery spaces, she also hopes to explore more possibilities around online exhibitions and trading.

Meanwhile, Christine Ramphal, director of the gallery throughout the Dover Street years, also left last month.

Galloway says: "Christine is the best colleague I've ever worked with. She's creative, intelligent, loyal. She was absolutely instrumental to my business. But you need new challenges. I hope we will collaborate in the future. She has my full support and my best wishes."

Galloway has taken on Catherine Davidson.

1 When and how did you get your start?

October 1, 1979. I arrived in the UK in March 1975 and had to work for somebody else for four years until having permission to start a business. I emptied my flat of all the disparate small things accumulated during that time and rented a 1 x 1.5m booth at the Hypermarket in Kensington High Street.

Two years later I moved to Grays and another two years after that I opened my first and only shop off Kensington Church Street, almost opposite Marchant. It closed in June 1999 as the market changed. Since then, I have participated in fairs mainly in the US as well as Hong Kong and Beijing.

2 What is your area of focus?

For the first 30 years it was Chinese export porcelain. For the last 10 it has been Chinese taste pieces. The switch was prompted above all by the introduction of a 15% import duty in the US on Chinese antiques, later reduced to 7.5%. That was coupled with an easing of interest in Chinese export porcelain all over the world.

3 What is one great discovery you've made?

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

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



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Rhapsodic about Bohemian glass

Two vases sold in German auction houses underline encouraging demand for such styles

by Jonathan Franks

Judging by recent results, there has been a resurgence of interest in products from the Bohemian glass manufacture of Lötz Wwe (Loetz widow).

The company was founded in 1840, but only after Max von Spaun, the founder's grandson, took over the running of the company in 1879, did it achieve international fame.

In the run-up to the 1900 world exhibition in Paris, Spaun commissioned numerous renowned designers with the production of innovative creations, incorporating the iridescent décor that was to make Lötz famous throughout the world.

Among the artists he employed was the painter Franz Hofstoetter who created several works for the *Exposition Universelle*, one of which became the star lot at **Dr Fischer (28% buyer's premium)** in Heilbronn on March 17-18.

Like numerous pieces of Lötz glass in the sale, the 10in (25cm) high vase with multicoloured vertical threads



and leaf-patterns came from the Salzburg collector Christian Clausen.

It was well documented and in recent decades had been shown at exhibitions at important museums, including the Corning Museum of Glass in the US.

International collectors pushed the price to €55,000 (£48,670),

You've got the lion look

The design of a sofa and two corresponding chairs on offer at **Hargesheimer** (28% buyer's premium) in Düsseldorf on March 9 could never be described as restrained. With their ebonised and partly gilt x-frame legs, crescent-shaped backs and gilded lion heads they were certainly eye-catchers.

The ensemble with its 5ft 7in (1.7m) wide sofa was catalogued as Austrian, presumably Vienna, from c.1780-1800 and was in the sales catalogue with a very modest guide of \pounds 2500.

Bidders from home and abroad had hoped for a bargain, but in the event, the German buyer on the phone was taken to $\leq 24,000 (\pounds 21,400)$ before he could claim his prize.

Moser design

Major interest emerged for another vase created by a famous designer that was sold by **Metz (28% buyer's premium)** in Heidelberg on March 24-25.

Two years later he designed the 7in (19cm) high iridescent vase in Heidelberg which was produced by Lötz for the Viennese company Bakalowits & Söhne.

The most unusual feature of the vase was the three drop-like feet affixed to the side of the vessel.

It was offered without reserve and several Austrian dealers and collectors joined in the hectic bidding. They were, however, finally outpaced by a German collector whose closing bid was €33,000 (£29,200).

Until his death in 2022, the musicologist and collector Rudolf Ewerhart lived in Wassenach, some 20 miles to the west of Koblenz.

On March 18, **Galerie Moenius (26% buyer's premium)**, which holds sales in Germany and Switzerland, dispersed his extensive collection of musical instruments in his residence, an 18th century patrician house in the centre of Wassenach.

There was no shortage of bidders, who often went way over the odds.

A case in point was an early 19th century fortepiano (*Hammerflügel*), built by Johann Georg Gröber in Innsbruck in c.1815.

Gröber trained as an organ builder in Vienna and was, according to legend, for some time responsible for tuning Beethoven's pianos. From 1806 until his death in 1849, Gröber lived and worked in Innsbruck as a maker of pianofortes.

The elegant instrument in the auction, housed in walnut, was in playable condition and guided at €7000.

Musically minded bidders were prepared to go considerably higher. After prolonged exchanges, an anonymous bidder sealed the deal at €60,000 (£53,095).



Mary medal is one of just two known

To say that a mid-16th century gold medal that was auctioned by **Künker (25% buyer's premium)** in Osnabrück during the sale of March 16-24 is rare would be quite an understatement.

After all, it is one of only two known examples: the other one is in the British Museum.

The undated medal was struck under Queen Mary in c.1554, after a design by Jacopo Nizzola da Trezzo. The Italian sculptor and medalist had been sent to England by the Spanish King Charles, where he created several medals for the royal family.

Mary had acceded to the throne in 1553 and in the following year, she married Charles' son, Philip II. It is thought that this medal was struck in connection with

the wedding. Other copies are known in silver and bronze.

The medal featured here was sold by Christie's in London in December 2000 as part of the collection of Batsheva de Rothschild for £130,250 (including premium), more than six times the estimate.

Prior to that, it is thought to have been part of the collection of Alphonse de Rothschild.

In the meantime, it has passed through several collections and was last on the market in 2019, when it was knocked down in Geneva for SFr800,000.

This time around, the estimate was set at 600,000 but the international buyer was able to secure the medal for 525,000 (£464,000). That was not only

the top price of the sale, but also the highest German auction price for a medal.

US design formed latest type of telegraph tech

This rare US patent model, offered for sale by German 'technical antiques' specialist Auction Team Breker (21.8% buyer's premium), aimed to change the way messages were passed via the telegraph in the mid 19th century.

Instead of the dots and dashes of Samuel Morse's code, words could be typed using a keypad containing the letters of the alphabet plus an ampersand and a question mark.

The original patent tag, dated May 22, 1855, reads *White & White Telegraphic Key Apps* while accompanying literature references the patent and the inventors Leroy S White of Chicopee, Massachusetts, and Lewis White of Hartford, Connecticut.

Tem times the top guide

White & White's device appears not to have caught on, but this finelymade mother-of-pearl, mahogany and brass model was the subject of huge competition in Cologne on March 25. Estimated at €3000-5000, it took €50,000 (£44,000).

Developed in the 1830s and 1840s in the UK and the US, the telegraph revolutionised long-distance communication.

The science was relatively simple. It worked by transmitting simple electrical signals over a wire laid between stations – but the genius was to assign a set of dots and dashes to each letter of the English alphabet that allowed for the transmission of complex messages.

This model was one of many improvements and revisions made to the core technology in the third quarter of the 18th century.

Patented in 1855, this was the year before the founding of the Western Union Telegraphy Company, six years before the first transcontinental telegraph line and more than a decade before the first permanent cable was laid across the Atlantic Ocean.

Maltese bidders write on cue



Maltese furniture rarely makes it to the international auction market, so it was something of a sensation when a finely decorated, mid-18th century writing cabinet came up for sale at **Metz (28% buyer's premium)** in Heidelberg.

Like many of the other pieces in the sale, it was part of the legacy of an aristocratic diplomat, the one-time German ambassador to Hungary in the 1920s.

The intricately inlaid and partly ebonised walnut cabinet caught the eye of several Maltese dealers who were naturally also attracted by the fact that all the pieces in the sale were offered without reserve.

After a long competition, they were left empty-handed because their compatriot, a private collector, outbid them with his final offer of \notin 91,000 (£80,530) on March 24-25.

Coral from the coast of Siciliy

Since the 12th century the Sicilian town of Trapani has been closely connected to the art of coral carving. Thanks to the invention of a particular tool, ideally suited to the material, in the 16th century, the industry thrived.

Antonio Ciminello was a local craftsman and his bulino or burin enabled his colleagues to create intricate sculptures of 'red gold', as the coral from the seas off the west coast of Sicily was known. They developed an international market and prospered well into the 19th century.

An example of late 17th century coral carving is being sold by Hermann Historica in Grassbrunn near Munich in its auction of works of art on May 6.The finely detailed 6½in (17cm) high figure of the Mother of God (Maria Immaculata) stands on a layered bank of mother-of pearl clouds with three winged coral Cherubim at her feet. The rear of the figure is mounted with small squares of mother-of-pearl.

It has a starting price of €9500. Shermann-historica.de

My trail led to south Devon town

Son of prolific artist opens his fine art and antiques business in a location he calls a 'perfect setting'

by Joan Porter

An addition to the businesses on the Ashburton Antiques Trail is **Reuben Lenkiewicz Fine Art & Antiques Gallery**, which is run by the son of the charismatic, renowned and prolific artist Robert Lenkiewicz who died in 2002.

Reuben has opened his gallery in the south Devon town, selling some of his father's paintings and prints as well as antiques and antiquities and work by early English artists.

He also plans a museum dedicated to his father as well as working spaces for artists plus music and art festivals and an antiquarian bookshop.

"I'm thrilled to have opened in Ashburton," said Reuben. "The town has a special connection with things of beauty and I believe it is the perfect setting for a gallery like mine.

"The right setting can make all the difference, just like the right frame around a painting, and Ashburton has lived up to my expectations and more."

The antiques trail was launched in 2019 when dealer Lydia Wood had a Eureka moment in the small town on the edge of the Dartmoor National Park. This signposted all of Ashburton's II antiques and vintage shops including two small antiques centres, **The Shambles** and **East Street Antiques**.

The trail has gone from strength to strength said Wood, who owns **In A Nutshell Antiques** in the town.

"We have managed to get new brown tourist signs installed on the main roads outside Ashburton with

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

Memories of brushes with royalty

In this coronation week, I thought I would share some moments when my path working in the jewellery trade has crossed with that of members of the royal family, including our new king and the late queen.

My life in this business began after I was demobilised – having served three years with the Royal Air Force in Singapore – and returned to England on January 13, 1948.

My brother had been an apprentice pre-war with a then well-known manufacturing jeweller and although I had no previous experience in the trade it seemed obvious to me that I should try my hand at the jeweller's bench.

After about three months I realised that my interest was not in the making but really in the finished articles and assessing their value.

I looked in shop windows, which in those days were mainly stocked with second-hand antique silver and jewellery and started to buy some items, albeit only inexpensive pieces due to my lack of capital.

I was limited as to where I was able to sell as I had to rely on public transport. However, I found that by going to Cutler Street in London's East End on Sunday mornings, I could usually sell three or four items that I had purchased during the week.

I wanted to expand my business and I heard from someone that there was an antiques jewellery dealer and a silver dealer in Portobello Road in Kensington. I made myself known to them and they were happy for me to trade alongside them. I said I could attract more antiques dealers and in so doing over about two years, established Portobello Road Market as a leading market for antique jewellery.

Foreign foray

This experience put me in good stead for being the pioneer for many fairs and exhibitions, both home and overseas, and this put me on the route towards my meeting royalty.

In 1967, I approached the Board of Trade with the proposition of exhibiting jewellery and silver overseas and to obtain government subsidy. This was agreed and an export council would be formed including myself and another dealer.

Through the newly formed Jewellery Trade Centre in Farringdon Road, it was arranged for a contingent of British jewellers to exhibit in an exhibition in New York.

With the help of the government subsidy, we chartered a Boeing 707 which was named the 'Jewellery Trade Clipper' to take us to our first exhibition in the US. I was the only antique jewellery dealer as the rest of the contingent were manufacturing jewellers, one of which is a leading jeweller today.

This was the first of many trips I made to the US, exhibiting in many trade shows and I became very well-known in the trade, supplying many of the major jewellers in the country. I also exhibited at a number of fairs in the UK and Asia.

I was invited to exhibit at the Hong Kong Exhibition Centre when it was officially opened by their Royal Highnesses Prince Charles and Princess Diana, who visited my stand immediately after.

I exhibited at Olympia on many occasions and was chairman of the Vetting Committee and also on the advisory board. In 1991 Princess Margaret visited my stand at the fair and spent quite some time in conversation with me and my wife.

Royal jewels

I have also been in possession of a number of royal-related pieces of jewellery. To name a few: a brooch of the Wings of Victory to Dame Clara-Butt after her performance at Buckingham Palace; Queen Mary's Fabergé parasol handle; a Queen Victoria heart pendant; a George VI cigarette case and a Princess Alexandra bar brooch. The latter three items I still own.

One of the finest royal pieces I had was the complete coronation album of King George V and Queen Mary which included a small circular blue brooch with the insignia crown above an 'M' in diamonds which was manufactured by Child & Child. Only six of these were made.

During my many years in the trade I was made a Freeman of the City of London and owned several shops. At one point I did enter into manufacturing to make highquality reproduction jewellery. I was fortunate to have in my employment a very talented craftsman who could manufacture jewellery to a very high standard.

Antique Jewellery

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One of the finest pieces he manufactured for me was the Benjamin Jewellery book bracelet which was featured in the national press, on television and on Movietone newsreel.

I decided that I would manufacture a unique version of this book bracelet especially for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II for the Silver Jubilee in 1977. I visited Buckingham Palace to present this gift to Her Majesty and during the preamble with the queen's personal secretary, Sir Philip Moore, I commented that the book was quite firm in its closure and would require a certain amount of pressure to release the leaves of the bracelet.

His reply was: "Her Majesty has nimble fingers and is known to have changed a brooch she was wearing while on parade with another one she preferred, completely without notice."
