## Home for the Holidays effort brings crowd

Agencies come up with list of 15 to 20 potential tenants

It was standing room only in the Monongalia County Commission chamber Friday morning as some 50 people gathered around an ambitious goal — get-

ting the homeless into housing by Christmas.

The effort, dubbed Home for the Holidays, has set out to place as many as 15 individuals or households into housing using rent assistance and case management provided by the West Virginia Coalition to End Homelessness and assistance of all kinds by everybody else — be it locating furniture or stocking the fridge.

A dozen or more social ser-

vice agencies and nonprofits were represented, as were addiction and recovery services, downtown business owners, various law enforcement agencies, Morgantown City Council, the Monongalia County Commission and, maybe most importantly, landlords.

The effort was spearheaded by Rachael Coen of WVCEH and Monongalia County Commission President Tom Bloom.

“I’m in awe,” Bloom said of the

crowd. “I can do certain things, but I can’t do them without you. I look around this room ... we’re going to get this freaking thing done.”

By the end of the meeting, which lasted about an hour and 15 minutes, there were commitments for eight apartments from various property owners and a list of 15-20 potential tenants compiled by representatives of the social service agencies.

Additionally, Alexis McMillen,

of the Community Housing Action Partnership, said a subgroup that included city councilors, law enforcement and business owners identified four areas of focus:

- Identifying who is actually homeless or at risk of being homeless versus those simply loitering downtown.

- Engaging in a concerted, strategic public relations campaign aimed at informing the

## Libera seeks to empower women in West Virginia

Listeners at nonprofit also connect people with resources

Libera means freedom. It’s also the name of a nonprofit that aims to empower West Virginia women and teens to live in freedom, according to its founder Karen Haring.

Libera was inspired by the state’s motto, *Montani semper liberi*, Haring said. “I wanted to help our state be free,” she said.

Haring decided to start Libera after talking to a therapist to try to help other people after she found two people she knew following their suicide attempts and realized that she had unhealthy patterns in her life.

So, she gathered some like-minded women and came up with Libera.

The nonprofit’s listeners listen to a woman’s or teen girl’s problems without judgment, help identify the lies and barriers in her life and then connect her to resources to help overcome those issues, Haring said.

Haring started working with Libera full-time in January 2016, and its two buses have traveled to every county in the state.

Many of its 40 or so lis-

teners were so impacted by the program, they decided they wanted to join after being helped, Haring said.

One example is 54-year-old Alexis, a listener who told her story to The Dominion Post on the condition that she not be identified.

“It was completely overwhelming as to what it disclosed in my life about things that I wasn’t even aware of,” Alexis said of her first half-day Libera session. “Dysfunctional relationships pretty much from my childhood, with my own sons, friends, workplace, pretty much every relationship in my life was not healthy.”

Alexis was in a marriage where she was abused financially, physically and emotionally, she said.

One day, shortly after making a large purchase, her husband quit his well-paying job because “he was tired of working,” she said. That left Alexis working three jobs for years to make ends meet.

“In your gut you know it’s wrong but because of my generation and because of beliefs I had followed my entire life, I was under the impression I was still doing the right thing,” she said.

Since becoming a listener, Alexis has been able to help some women in similar situations.

“It’s so much easier to disclose and feel free about a time in your life not being

### WVU Medicine begins to evaluate candidates for kidney transplants

WVU Medicine is evaluating kidney transplant candidates as it moves closer toward becoming the first medical center in West Virginia to perform multi-organ transplants.

The medical center performed its first heart transplant earlier this month on a 61-year-old Ohio man and completed at least one more heart transplant since.

Kidney transplants could be underway possibly by the first quarter of next year, said Michael Shullo,

Pharm.D., WVU Medicine associate vice president of transplant services.

In late October, WVU Medicine said it received approval from the United Network for Organ Sharing — the private nonprofit scientific and educational organization that administers the Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network in the U.S. — to perform kidney transplants. UNOS approved WVU Medicine for heart transplants in September.

The idea behind offering heart and now kidney transplants is to keep residents in state and to encourage them to seek medical care.

As of Friday, there were 268 West Virginians on the national kidney transplant list, Shullo said. And the need for kidneys is critical.

“West Virginia has one of the high-

est rates of hypertension and diabetes in the country," said Dr. Lynsey Biondi, physician director of transplantation and surgical director of kidney transplant at WVU Medicine, explaining these are the two largest causes of kidney failure. Other causes of kidney failure include cancer, injury, autoimmune diseases, genetic diseases and chemotherapy.

Shullo and Biondi said the decision to perform kidney — and heart — transplants in Morgantown is not to compete with Pittsburgh health care giants, UPMC and Allegheny General Hospital, or transplant centers in any of the contiguous states.

"People deserve health care," Biondi said.

The Charleston Area Medical Center has performed kidney transplants since 1987. The bulk of CAMC's patients come from the southern part of the state. WVU Medicine's kidney patients, meanwhile, come from north and central West Virginia.

According to UNOS, as well as the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network, more than 670,000 people in the U.S. have end-stage renal failure. There are also more than 100,000 people waiting for a kidney transplant, but only around 21,000 kidneys become available.

Transforming WVU Medicine into a center for kidney and heart trans-

plants was a goal of CEO Albert Wright when he arrived in Morgantown five years ago, Shullo said.

**Pre-surgery tests and other matters**

Before undergoing a kidney transplant, numerous medical tests need to be done, and can take several months to complete, according to the National Kidney Foundation. These tests include blood work, tissue typing, dental exam, electrocardiogram, echocardiogram, chest X-rays, cancer screening, colonoscopy, prostate exam for men and gynecological exam for women.

In addition, the transplant candidate will meet with some or all members of the transplant team, which could include the surgeons, social workers, dietitians and financial

coordinators.

"Transplantation is the ultimate team sport," said Shullo, who was recruited from UPMC to develop and oversee WVU Medicine's transplant program. Biondi was recruited from Florida.

"We've had to decline some top-notch talent," Shullo said.

Ideally, Biondi said as many as 60 kidney transplants could eventually be performed at WVU Medicine each year. She said it will take a while before the 60 mark is reached.

"We're going to be starting small at first," Biondi said.

Kidneys used for transplant surgery come either from a living or deceased donor. In most cases, the organ is placed into a patient within 24 hours. Biondi said.

Kidneys from living donors tend to last 15 to 20 years, nearly double that from a deceased donor, the National Kidney Foundation said. People may wait as much as five years for a deceased donor kidney.

Cost of a kidney transplant can run anywhere from \$80,000 to \$100,000, Biondi said. By comparison, hemodialysis costs Medicare an average of \$90,000 per patient annually in the United States, according to the Kidney Project at the University of California at San Francisco. Sessions are usually three times a week and last anywhere from three to five hours.

Shullo said WVU Medicine has no plans to transplant other organs such as livers and pancreases. Instead, because of the need in West Virginia, it was decided to focus on the heart and kidney.

"Patients who previously spent several hours each week undergoing dialysis treatments get that time back to spend with their families and do the things they love to do," Biondi said. "We get to give patients their lives back and families their loved ones back. There's no greater honor than that."

**Pence works to reassure Kurdish allies in surprise trip to Iraq**

IRBIL, Iraq — Vice President Mike Pence worked to reassure the United States' Kurdish allies in an unannounced trip to Iraq on Saturday, the highest-level American trip since President Donald Trump ordered a pull-back of U.S. forces in Syria two months ago.

Pence landed in Irbil, capital of Iraq's semiautonomous Kurdish region, to meet with Iraqi Kurdistan President Nechirvan Barzani.

The visit was meant to hearten the United States'

regional partners in the fight against the Islamic State group after the U.S. pulled troops from northern Syria, leaving America's Kurdish allies there to face a bloody cross-border Turkish assault last month.

Asked by reporters if the U.S. was facing a sense of betrayal from Iraqi and Syrian Kurdish allies over Trump's actions in Syria, Pence said both groups, including Syrian Kurdish forces "who fought alongside us," had no doubts about the U.S. commitment to them. "It's unchanging," Pence said.

When domestic violence kills: Mass women's protest in Paris

PARIS — Tens of thousands of protesters marched through Paris on Saturday to demand a national wake-up call and more government investment to prevent deadly domestic violence against women.

A wave of purple flags and signs snaked from the Place de l'Opera through eastern Paris amid an unprecedented public campaign to decry violence against women — and to honor 130 women activists say have been killed in France this year by a current or former partner.

France has among the highest rates in Europe of domestic violence, in part because of poor police response to reports of abuse.

The protest came on the U.N.'s International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and is aimed at pressuring the French government

before it unveils new measures Monday to tackle the problem.

The measures are expected to include seizing firearms from people suspected of domestic violence and prioritizing police training so they won't brush off women's complaints as a private affair.

employed or otherwise occupied is critical, Mike Alexander said. Otherwise, the apartment becomes a hangout spot and neighbors get annoyed.

Alexander is one of the property owners willing to make apartments available. He said that willingness is borne partly of a desire to help and partly because, "I have empty units and this is guaranteed rent."

"I have rented to tenants before through social agencies. It didn't go as well as I'd hoped, typically. This seems to have a bit more backing and more guarantees," he said, later adding,

"It's pragmatic, but I also tend to have a soft heart for people. I like to give back to my community. I have limited ways I can do that, and this is one."

Rent assistance through WVCEH can be provided for up to one year, but will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Ideally, the assistance will get a tenant into the apartment and continue while they work with case managers to become self-supported.

Coen said WVCEH also has funds available to cover any damages to the apartments.

All told, Bloom said, the various volunteers and

agencies need to surround these individuals to create a personalized housing plan that will give them the best chance at success.

Morgantown Police Officer Matthew Starsick walks the beat downtown every day, giving him a unique perspective on the scope and complexity of the problems the group hopes to tackle.

Starsick said success is possible, but it's going to take everyone pulling in the same direction.

"The only way we're going to get this done is together," he said.

Egypt unveils animal mummies of lion cubs, crocodiles, birds

SAQQARA, Egypt — Egypt's Ministry of Antiquities on Saturday revealed details on recently discovered animal mummies, saying they include two lion cubs as well as several crocodiles, birds and cats.

Items from the new find were displayed at a

makeshift exhibition at the famed Step Pyramid of Djoser in Saqqara, south of Cairo, near where mummies and other artifacts have been found in a vast necropolis.

OK and it just gives other people peace, I believe, if somebody else has walked the same walk," she said.

Haring said Libera is for every woman and teen girl because everyone has struggles in their life, even if they are small, and the program is about helping women realize they aren't alone.

Once they realize that, the women start supporting and empowering each other even outside of Libera sessions, Haring said.

Libera has affected every relationship in Alexis' life, helping attune her to others and even picking up on struggles in every-

day interactions, she said. "So, when I say it's affected every interaction in my life, I truly believe that it has," she said.

Listeners undergo training because not many people are naturally good at listening, Haring said. One day of training teaches listening skills, what to do in a crisis and mandatory reporting for minors in abusive situations. A second day of training covers mental health first aid.

# DOH explains snow and ice removal plans

Tailored to each district for max effectiveness

Throughout the winter season, an informed public is vital to making the West Virginia Division of Highways' Snow Removal and Ice Control program a success, said Highways Commissioner Byrd White.

"A clear understanding of our operational procedures is beneficial to both the DOH and to the public," White said.

According to White, during times of inclement weather, the primary goal of the DOH is to provide the traveling public with safe, passable routes.

Jimmy Wriston, deputy state highways commissioner, indicated that advanced planning is critical to the effectiveness of the SRIC program and several factors are used to determine how

resources are allotted.

DOH personnel spend considerable time preparing for the winter season before the first snow falls. Pre-winter SRIC plans for each of the 55 counties in the state are generated specifically for each district with ultimate approval through the Central Office in Charleston.

These plans are tailored for fighting snow and ice based on the particular conditions affecting each district. Preparation also includes taking inventory of

equipment and material, assigning tasks for crews and equipment and performing dry runs of the process.

The severity of a winter storm and the priority of the routes dictate SRIC operations. The State of West Virginia is responsible for maintaining roughly 35,000 miles of roadway, which makes prioritizing a necessity in the SRIC program.

During a winter storm, crews concentrate on "first priority" routes, which typically include interstates, Appalachian Corridors and routes that connect urban centers.

"The highway system and travel patterns vary in each county; therefore, it is necessary to prioritize based on each county's needs," Wriston said.

Along with route priority, the type of roadway surface also con-

trols the type of treatment applied. Gravel roads are treated with sand or cinders, whereas chemicals are applied to asphalt and concrete surfaces. The chemicals would damage a gravel or tar-and-chip road.

"Also, during back-to-back storm events, crews are required to stay on priority one routes before plowing the secondary routes," White said. "The result may be that persons living along secondary routes could see a delay of 24 to 48 hours before trucks can make it out to some areas."

"We thought that this time of year, we can do something like a charity day. We haven't done anything for adults, and this was something different."

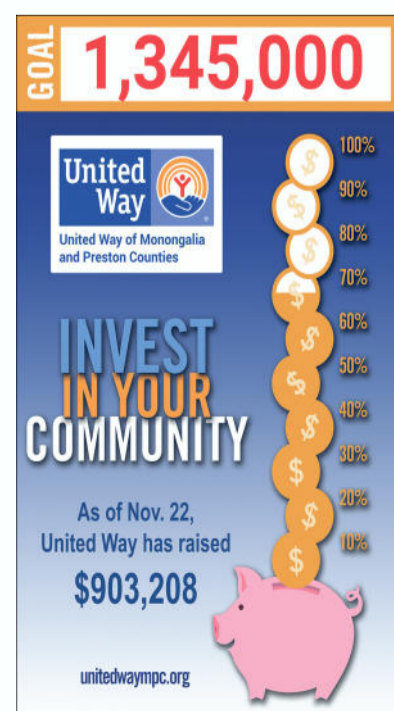
Appointments are already booked for 21 individuals, who will be seen between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Wednesday.

### Group keeps Appalachian square dancing alive

HUNTINGTON — Couples were promenading, swinging and do-si-doing at Heritage Farm Museum & Village in Huntington.

It was the last gathering of the year Nov. 16 for participants with the Huntington Old Time Dance and Music group. The group gets together regularly to square dance to traditional Appalachian and bluegrass music, complete with a caller who prompts people into different dance formations.

Before the night was finished, people performed moves to “dive for the oyster and dig for the clam,” “chase the rabbit and chase the squirrel” and “put the bird and crow in the cage.”

The group started about two years ago as an effort to

keep the tradition of square dancing alive, which has its roots in Appalachian culture. The music and dancing predates recorded music, said Dennis Bills, HOTDAM president.

“What we’re trying to do is promote that old-time sound of dance music, and there’s no better way to do it than square dancing,” Bills said.

Bills said the group meets every month, excluding December and the summer months, to dance together and learn new moves.

Each dance features a different band and caller, and the dances usually attract up to 70 people. The Nov. 16 dance featured music from Dave Bing, Danny Arthur, Tim Bing, Scott Rucker and Tim Corbett, with calling by Tony

Minsky from Glenville.

Bills said the dances are for everyone and all ages, including experienced square dancers and people “with two left feet.”

Chase Smith and Zara Harold have been square dancing partners for about eight years. They were leading a square of eight people into different formations and twists.

“A lot of people might be nervous since they’ve never done square dancing before, but the caller walks you through everything you have to do before the dance,” Smith said. “People should come out and learn so eventually you will know how to do it and it will be like walking on air.”

The group’s next square dance will be in January.

# Giuliani had direct line to Pompeo as Ukraine smear unfolded, documents show

Rudy Giuliani was given direct access to Secretary of State Mike Pompeo as a shadow effort to smear the American ambassador to Ukraine and dig up dirt on Democrats unfolded, a trove of newly released government documents revealed.

Pompeo talked with Giuliani March 26 and March 29 as President Trump's personal lawyer worked to undermine then-Ambassador Marie Yovanovitch, according to the State Department documents, which were released in response to a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit.

The documents do not reveal what Giuliani and Pompeo discussed, limiting their importance. But they do show that Trump's personal secretary facilitated the calls, suggesting Giu-

liani had the president's backing to bring Pompeo into his plans.

Austin Evers, executive director of American Oversight, the group that obtained the documents, said they show "a clear paper trail from Rudy Giuliani to the Oval Office to Secretary Pompeo."

Last week, Yovanovitch told House impeachment investigators she felt "kneecapped" by a "smear campaign" Giuliani led against her. She was ousted from her post in Ukraine in May.

The documents released late Friday also include a report that appears to summarize a Jan. 23, 2019, interview with Ukraine's former prosecutor general, Victor Shokin. The summary said Giuliani and two business associates, Lev Parnas and Igor Fruman, were present.

Parnas and Fruman

were arrested last month on a four-count indictment that includes charges of conspiracy, making false statements to the Federal Election Commission and falsification of records. The men had key roles in Giuliani's efforts to launch a Ukrainian corruption investigation against Democratic presidential contender Joe Biden and his son, Hunter.

In the document, Shokin claims he was removed from his position under pressure from Biden.

A second memo appears to be a summary of an interview with Yuri Lutsenko, also a former prosecutor general of Ukraine, conducted in the presence of Giuliani, Parnas and Fruman. Lutsenko is quoted as raising questions about compensation that Hunter Biden received from the Ukrainian oil company Burisma.

Officials reach spending agreement

WASHINGTON — Negotiations on a package of spending bills to fund the federal government have produced a key breakthrough, though considerably more work is needed to wrap up the long-delayed measures.

Top lawmakers of the House and Senate Appropriations committees on Saturday confirmed an agreement on allocations for each of the 12 spending bills, a step that allows negotiations on the \$1.4 trillion budget bundle to begin in earnest to try to pass the measures by a Dec. 20 deadline.

The measures would fill in the details on this summer's hard-won budget and debt deal.

The talks come as the Democratic-controlled House is driving toward impeaching President Donald Trump, whose demands for billions of dollars more for additional wall construction along the U.S.-Mexico border have slowed the process.

Harvard-Yale game delayed by protest

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — Protesters wearing the colors of both Harvard and Yale staged a sit-in at mid-field of Yale Bowl during halftime of the 136th edition of the annual football rivalry known as The

Game. Most left after about an hour when they were escorted off by police; about two dozen who remained were told by police they were under arrest.

A few dozen protesters initially trickled onto the field as the Yale band finished performing its half-time routine. They held up banners asking the schools' presidents to divest from the fossil fuel industry, while other signs raised issues of Puerto Rican debt and the treatment of the Uighurs.

Largely of college age but with a few older protesters mixed in, the group chanted: "Hey Hey! Ho Ho! Fossil fuels have got to go!" One banner read "This is an emergency."

**Cathy Long dies; won her husband's U.S. House seat after his death in 1985**

Cathy Long, a Louisiana Democrat who won her husband's U.S. House seat after his sudden death in 1985 and served one term, has died. She was 95.

She died Saturday in Chevy Chase, Md. The cause was dementia, her family said.

Long beat three competitors with 56% of the vote in 1985, with a 2-1 margin over the second-place finisher for the seat held for a total of 16 years by Gillis Long. The district covered 15 central Louisiana parishes, including Baton Rouge, the state capital.

"It was a challenging time. She had two weeks to decide whether or not to run for his seat," her son George Long, who was 30 at the time, said in a phone interview Saturday.

"Our dad had just died, and people were giving her campaign contributions," said his sister, Janis Long. She said U.S. Rep. Lindy Boggs, D-La., who had won her husband's seat after his plane disappeared in Alaska in 1972, encouraged Cathy Long to run.

Gillis Long was first elected to Congress in 1962 and then lost in the next election before being voted back into office in 1972, holding the seat for seven straight terms.

Cathy Long already had experience in politics, working early on for a U.S. senator from Oregon and a U.S. representative from Ohio, and later campaigning and giving speeches for her husband, as well as advising him.

"I don't have to start from scratch. I already know how Congress works," she told The Associated Press in 1985.

George Long described her as one of the last moderates elected from the area.

"I was glad she decided not to run for re-election," he said. "The tide was turning."

Mary Catherine Small

was born in Dayton, Ohio. She joined the Navy at age 20 during World War II, serving at a Navy hospital in Corpus Christi, Texas.

The Longs met at Louisiana State University, where both enrolled after the war. They married in 1947.

George Long noted that one of their mother's early campaign experiences was riding around the state with former Gov. Earl K. Long — her husband's cousin — while he was running for Congress. Earl Long won a Democratic primary runoff and was preparing to run unopposed in the general election when he died in 1960. His death prompted Gillis Long to move the family back to Louisiana to establish residency so he could run for the seat in 1962, George Long said.

Cathy Long also campaigned for the Equal Rights Amendment, her children said.

The siblings recalled their mother as an adventurous spirit who loved scuba diving, fishing trips and even tried parasailing when she was about 60. She also was a giving person who worked in the 1960s to promote the Special Olympics and more recently fed homeless people and tutored reading at a Washington, D.C., neighborhood organization called Miriam's Kitchen, they said.

Janis Long said her mother asked for 90th birthday gifts of donations to Miriam's Kitchen, which received about \$12,000.

The family said in their obituary that they plan to "cast ashes into the Potomac River on Easter, in the Mississippi River on Mardi Gras, and in the Caribbean Sea near San Pedro, Belize, where she loved to fish and scuba dive."

A memorial service is planned Dec. 7 at All Souls Church Unitarian in Washington.

**German police to eye 900 men's DNA seeking girl's killer**

BERLIN — German police asked about 900 men Saturday to have their DNA tested to help solve the gruesome killing of an 11-year-old girl from the western city of Grevenbroich some 23 years ago.

The girl, Claudia Ruf, was kidnapped, raped and choked to death by an anonymous murderer in 1996 in a case that shocked the country and was highly publicized at the time. Her body was found in Euskirchen, 43 miles south of Grevenbroich.

The 900 men, who were between 14 and 70 years old at the time of Ruf's killing, have received invitations for a saliva swab test to have their DNA identified. Police officers earlier this month went from home to home to hand over invitations and to answer questions. They also had a stand on the church square in Grevenbroich's Hemmerden district to inform residents about the mass DNA test.

They explained that

DNA traces of the perpetrator were found on the body of the girl and that they're hoping the mass test will lead them to the murderer. Obviously not all 900 men are suspects, police said.

While it is unlikely that the actual murderer will come forward to offer DNA, investigators hope that a relative may come for testing and through those DNA results related to those found on the girl's body lead them to the perpetrator, police explained to residents.

The men were invited to come to testing at a local elementary school this and next weekend. Police said after the tests have been taken, all DNA that doesn't come up as a match in the genetic analysis will be deleted.

The Rheinische Post reported that at 10 a.m. Saturday morning, the first men were already lining up outside the elementary school to get tested.

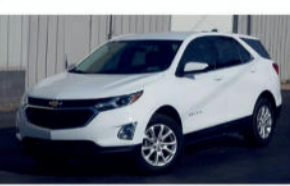

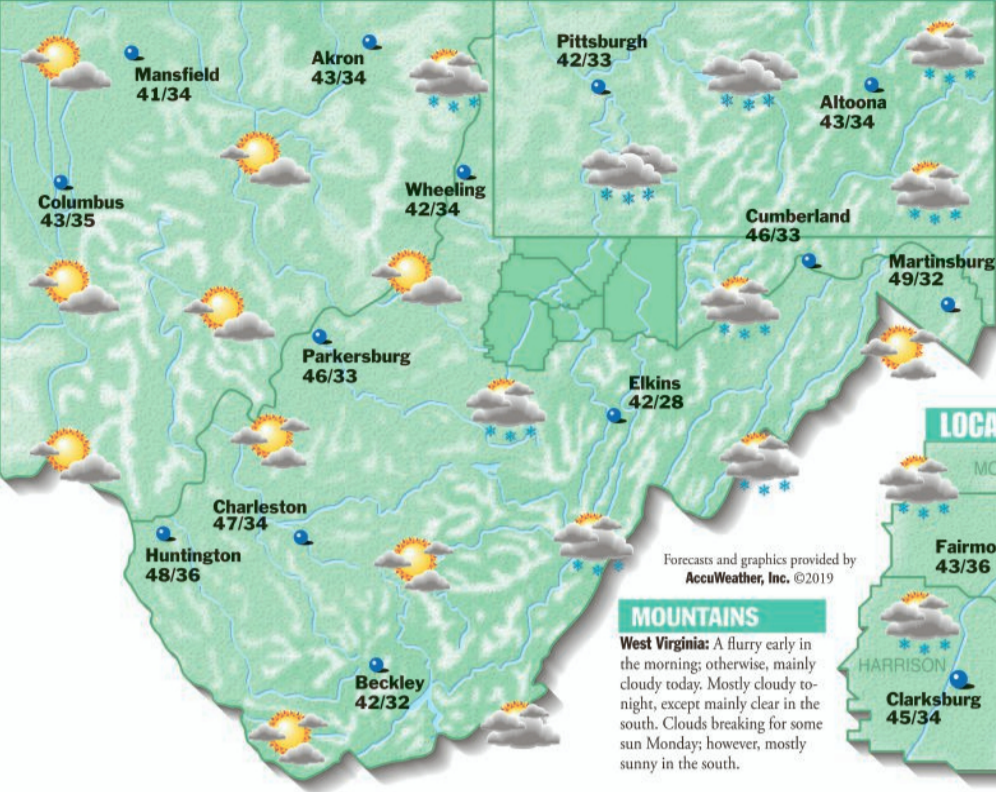

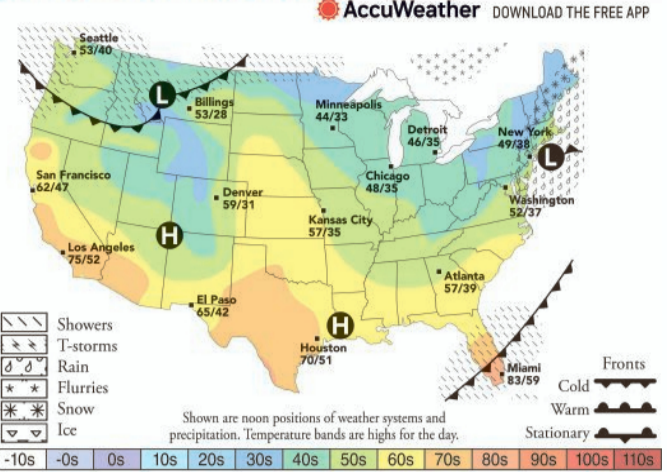

## Hubbard sets career highs, leads Cowboys over WVU

Here's something else to add to the conversation for Chuba Hubbard's Heisman Trophy chances: The nation's rushing leader is a solid receiver, too.

Hubbard set career highs with seven catches for 88 yards Saturday in No. 22 Oklahoma State's 20-13 win over West Virginia.

Oh, and the sophomore also surpassed 100 yards rushing for the ninth consecutive game to push his total to 1,832 yards.

"In the second half, we just started riding Chuba," Oklahoma State coach Mike Gundy said.

Hubbard and quarterback Dru Brown, who threw two touchdown passes in his first start, generated just enough offense for the Cowboys (8-3, 5-3 Big 12, No. 21 CFP), who

won their fourth straight.

Hubbard entered the game with 82 receiving yards all season and Gundy had emphasized earlier in the week he didn't throw to Hubbard that often out of fear of injury.

But Gundy said West Virginia took away Hubbard's effectiveness on the ground early.

"It forced us into throwing the ball to him some, more so than him running," Gundy said. "It worked out good for us."

Hubbard ran 46 yards with a screen pass to set up Oklahoma State's first touchdown.

"Chuba, he's the real deal," said West Virginia coach Neal Brown. "I knew coming in he's a great player. I leave the game, he's a great

HUNTINGTON — The West Virginia men's soccer team is heading south to face in-state rival No. 11-seed Marshall in the second round of the NCAA tournament.

The Mountaineers (10-8-2) enter the match after defeating Butler in spectacular fashion 5-1 on Thursday in Indianapolis, Ind. The first round saw 21 WVU shots and 15 shots on goal, greatly outweighing Butler which had six shots and two shots on goal.

Starters Rodrigo Robles Grajera and Josh DiMatteo each had three shots on

goal and two goals in the match, while Andre Muriel Albino added the fifth off the bench.

The Herd (15-2-3) earned a bye in the first round and enters on a five-win streak capped with a 1-0 double-overtime win over Charlotte in the Conference USA championship.

Marshall nets 2.20 goals and takes 12.8 shots per game. Additionally, Marshall has outscored opponents 44-15. The Herd is led by Milo Yosef with 25 points (11 goals, 3 assists) and Jamil Roberts with 22 points (6 goals, 10 assists). Goalkeeper Paulo Pita holds a 0.72 goals against average, allowing 15 goals and saving 64 shots. He has not missed a game this year.

Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. at Hoops Family Field. The game will be broadcast on ESPN3.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — The Mountaineers can hang their postseason success on a full-team effort, but it's Alina Stahl who's been punching WVU's ticket into the higher rounds.

Stahl netted the golden goal in second overtime Friday night, avoiding a round of penalty kicks and sending West Virginia (12-7-2) onto the Sweet 16. It marked her third goal in the NCAA tournament after posting two on Georgetown in the first round.

But it wasn't Stahl's game-winner that was the best highlight Friday. Rather, it was the clutch performance of Washington State en route to upset No. 1-seed Virginia, 3-2.

Virginia would tie the game once more as soon as the second half opened, but MacKenzie Frimpong-Ellertson netted the game-winner in the 81st minute.

In total, the Cougars and Cavaliers nearly matched in shots (WSU 15, UVA 16) and shots on goal (8-9). The win marks Washington State's second-straight upset after knocking off Memphis.

Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. at Klockner Stadium.

# Powell scores 25 to lead Seton Hall

NEWARK, N.J. — Myles Powell yelled “smile a little bit” to Seton Hall coach Kevin Willard as the star player was on his way out of the media room.

No chance. Powell scored 23 points and Jared Rhoden had 10 points and 12 rebounds, leading No. 13 Seton Hall to an 87-51 victory over winless Florida A&M on Saturday.

The Pirates pulled away from the Rattlers after a sleepy week of practice and a shaky start, and Willard wasn't pleased with his team's performance in front of a crowd of 9,656 at the Prudential Center.

“We had a great crowd coming for a 12 o'clock game,” he said. “We kind of slept walked through 20 minutes of a game. Our kids play hard, they're fun to watch, but you can't come out and sleepwalk when people come out and watch it. It's unacceptable.”

Quincy McKnight had 14 points and five assists for Seton Hall (4-1), which led by 18 before carrying a 36-24 advantage into the break.

Willard is “just saying that as the team that we want to be that we got to practice to get better, not just to get through it,” Powell said, “and he said all week that's all we were doing, was just trying to get through practice and just get it over with. He said it shows today.”

“The score — I don't feel as

After Nasir Core scored to trim Seton Hall's lead to 47-38 with 13:57 left, the Pirates responded with a 15-1 run. Powell made a layup to make it 62-39 with 9:25 remaining.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Pre-

cious Achiuwa scored 25 points and grabbed 11 rebounds as 16th-ranked Memphis held off Mississippi for its third consecutive victory without heralded freshman center James Wiseman.

D.J. Jeffries dunked with a second left for Memphis, then Blake Hinson beat the buzzer with a 3 for the final margin as the Tigers avoided blowing a 16-point lead.

Memphis (5-1) snapped a three-game streak by Ole Miss (4-1) in this series.

Penny Hardaway has the youngest team in the country, according to KenPom.com. He still has the No. 1 recruiting class even with Wiseman sitting out an NCAA-mandated

12-game suspension for what college sports' governing body ruled were impermissible benefits from 2017 when the Memphis coach was overseeing a local high school team.

Jeffries finished with 23 points for Memphis, Tyler Harris had 15 and Alex Lomax 14.

Ole Miss (4-1) had won its first four games by double digits all at home, and coach Kermit Davis has three starters back from his NCAA Tournament team last season.

Breerin Tyree led Ole Miss with 24 points. KJ Buffen had a team-high 13 before fouling out, and Hinson had 15.

Achiuwa also was a five-star recruit like Wiseman. He scored five of the final seven baskets before the break to close the first half with a 45-38 lead. Then the 6-foot-9 forward scored the first seven of the second half as the Tigers pushed their lead to 54-43 on a dunk by Jeffries with 15:57 to go.

The Tigers led 64-48 on a putback by Achiuwa with 11:19 left.

Ole Miss responded with a 17-6 run to turn a runaway into a thrilling finish, with Tyree hitting a pair of free throws with 4:22 left to pull Ole Miss within 70-65.

Jeffries dunked with 3:30 to go when he was called for taunting, and Tyree made both free throws as Ole Miss pulled to within 75-69.

**Russian track president resigns**

The president of the Russian track and field federation resigned on Saturday, two days after he was accused of obstructing an anti-doping investigation involving fake medical documents. Eight months before the Olympics in Tokyo, Russia is facing a double threat on doping-linked charges, including another case centered on alleged tampering with lab data provided to the World Anti-Doping Agency. Track federation president Dmitry Shlyakhtin stepped down at an emergency federation conference in Moscow. He was already provisionally suspended pending a hearing on the charges from the Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU).

**Illinois high school sued over football hazing**

A former player is suing his northern Illinois high school, its football coaches, administrators and a former teammate over alleged hazing, including an incident in which he and other players were forced to run naked across a field. The players were suspended after taking part in an October 2018 “Oreo Run,” in which students ran across a football field with cookies wedged in their rear ends. The plaintiff, who is identified in the lawsuit as “John Doe,” was also assaulted by a teammate who later pleaded guilty to misdemeanor battery.

**Celtics' Smart unhappy with response to fan incident**

The NBA is investigating an incident between Boston guard Marcus Smart and a fan in Denver, after the Celtics guard said he heard a derogatory comment and was unhappy with the way that he believed security in the arena responded to the matter. Smart said a fan told him to “get on your knees” after he pursued a loose ball along the sideline. Smart said one of his feet got tangled in frame of a courtside chair, and while he was trying to free himself he heard the comment.

# Patchwork Steelers' offense scrambling

PITTSBURGH — Benny Snell Jr., Tevin Jones and Johnny Holton have been on the field in games together before. But that was in August, when their main goal was proving they deserved spots on the Pittsburgh Steelers' 53-man roster.

The stakes will be higher on Sunday in Cincinnati, when they'll be part of a patched together offense scrambling to stay in contention.

Snell, a rookie running back, will be available for the first time since knee surgery following a win over Miami on Oct. 28. Jones will make his second appearance after getting bumped up from the

practice squad this month. Holton, who made the team as a special teams' ace and has caught all of 12 passes across five seasons, is the veteran in a group that includes Deon Cain, a rookie signed off the Indianapolis practice squad last week-end.

Not exactly what the Steelers (5-5) had in mind in September, before a massive spate of injuries jumbled the depth chart. Running back James Conner and wide receiver JuJu Smith-Schuster — both Pro Bowlers a year ago — are out against the winless Bengals (0-10) after getting hurt in a loss to Cleveland last week.

The five receivers quarterback Mason Rudolph figures to have at his disposal in

Cincinnati have combined for 89 catches for 1,316 yards in their respective careers. The three running backs — Snell, Jaylen Samuels and Trey Edmunds — have run

for 622 yards and two touchdowns in the NFL. Conner piled up 973 yards rushing and 12 scores last season.

"The situation is unique," Edmunds said. "We

all know that but we have to find out a way to make it work."

Receivers James Washington and rookie Diontae Johnson, who expects to play after recovering from a concussion sustained against the Browns, give quarterback Mason Rudolph at least a small sense of stability following a poor performance in which he threw four interceptions and clashed with Cleveland defensive end Myles Garrett.

The headlines the fight created overshadowed Pittsburgh's very real, very acute issues moving the ball. The Steelers have struggled to do much of anything against the Browns and have scored three offensive touchdowns in three games.

It only puts more pressure on offensive coordinator Randy Fichtner, who is trying to find a balance between staying aggressive while trying to be careful to not ask whoever is available to do something they're not ready to do.

Even if they've only been in town a week.

Cain received a crash course on the playbook after Pittsburgh signed him last Saturday and he spent a considerable amount of post-practice time trying to develop some kind of rapport with Rudolph. On Sunday he might walk into a huddle that includes Jones, who caught the first two passes of his career last week against Cleveland.

## Tales of November

My early bowhunts are filled with memories that have lasted a lifetime. My first day gun hunting for deer in Pennsylvania, in November, is as vivid to me today as it was 66 years ago. As dawn broke on a snow-covered landscape, I was hunkered down by a log in northern Pennsylvania. My dad was close by, and five minutes before legal shooting time a big 8-point buck appeared 20 yards in front of me.

I double checked my watch, and hoped he'd stay there for another five minutes. I'd heard several gun shots from other hunters, but I knew the legal shooting time, and obviously my father knew as well. The buck left, but 10 minutes later a small spike stood in the same spot. My shot was true and there would be meat in our family freezer.

That was in 1953 and getting a buck was my focus. Hundreds of deer hunting days have passed since that time. I soon switched to bowhunting full time and hundreds of adventures followed in many states, all the Canadian Provinces and the world. During the ensuing years, I came to realize that although the final goal was a harvest, learning new cultures, meeting new friends and being in fantastic places made the experience.

I remember my early days in Morgantown, driving to bowhunt in Canaan Valley. Two graduate students in mining engineering, Dave Maynard and Jimmy Hamlin, exposed me to the valley and we hunted together many times. Jimmy would later die in the 1984 Wilberg Mine Fire in Price, Utah.

There were few deer here, but many in Canaan, so with my pet collie, Dancer, I'd drive there after my Friday WVU classes, camp out and bowhunt all day Saturday. I remember storing my tent, camp stove,

water and fry pan in a hollow log near the campsite. A mouse-chewed hole or two in my old tent didn't cause a problem. But what memories I had there: Seeing my first bobcat in the wild, then there were the albino gray squirrel, ravens, lots of ruffed grouse and even some good deer harvested.

Over the years, I learned a lot about deer, and realized early on that November was a special time to hunt. Yes, that's the mating season and, for bowhunters, it opens up a myriad of things one can do to get bucks in range. And "in range" for most of us means 20 yards or less. During the rut, bucks might respond to calling. In fact, in 1978 I called deer for the first time on a bowhunt to Canaan and "grunted" in and harvested with my recurve a big 8-point buck.

I'd also learned to make scrapes, places where does visit and bucks come to find those does and also learn what other bucks are in the area. For bucks, and does, the rut is all about breeding. On some days, it gets a bit frantic with bucks chasing does. The evidence can easily be seen along our highways, as rutting deer get hit by cars.

Those November days widened into states that harbored big bucks: Ohio, Illinois, Iowa, Nebraska and Kansas (my favorite). Nov. 5-11 found me again in Protection, Kan., the best big-deer country I've ever seen. The memories keep piling up there, but aging is taking its toll on this old hunter. Yes, I still use my bow, and yes, it is getting harder to go, but the challenge, and the fantastic morning sunrises and, yes, the occasional big deer, keeps me going. My hunter readers can relate and others may not. But since that first deer at age 13, the harvest goal has dwindled, replaced by the experience and the adventure. I love November.

Baylor in Big 12 title game after downing Texas

WACO, Texas — Charlie Brewer accounted for 296 yards and two touchdowns and No. 13 Baylor wrapped up a spot in the Big 12 championship game with a 24-10 victory over Texas on Saturday, a week after the Bears missed a chance to do so with their first loss of the season.

The Bears (10-1, 7-1 Big 12, No. 14 CFP) have their sixth 10-win season, and fifth since 2011. This one comes just two years after the school's only 11-loss season in coach Matt Rhule's debut when he took over in the aftermath of a sprawling sexual assault scandal that led to two-time Big 12 champion coach Art Briles getting fired 3 1/2 years ago.

Texas (6-5, 4-4) lost for the third time in four games, ending its long-shot bid to get back to the Big 12 title game for the second year in a row.

Brewer, the junior quarterback from Austin whose dad and grandfather played for Texas, completed 16 of 25 passes for 221 yards with a touchdown, and ran 18 times

for 75 yards and another score. But he left the game for good with 11 1/2 minutes remaining after taking a helmet-to-helmet hit when being tackled at the end of a 5-yard run.

On his 1-run touchdown run in the third quarter, Brewer hopped onto the back of offensive lineman Khalil Keith when crossing the goal line. Brewer later threw a 12-yard TD pass to Denzel Mims to make it 21-3.

Mims had seven catches for 125 yards, all when Brewer was still in the game.

Iowa State 41, Kansas 31

AMES, Iowa — Brock Purdy threw for 372 yards and four TDs and Iowa State rallied to beat Kansas 41-31 on Saturday and clinch its third straight winning season.

La'Michael Pettway had 96 yards receiving and two touchdowns for the Cyclones

(7-4, 5-3 Big 12), who've now compiled three consecutive winning years just twice in the modern era.

Iowa State, under coach Earle Bruce, won eight games each in 1976, 1977 and 1978 before Bruce bolted for Ohio State.

But the Cyclones nearly blew it against the league's last-place team as a 24-point favorite.

Kansas (3-8, 1-7) scored two touchdowns in just 77 seconds late in the third quarter, the second coming after Purdy threw an interception, to jump ahead 24-21.

Purdy responded with a 24-yard TD pass to Hall and a five-yard touchdown run with 5:10 left to put Iowa State back on top 34-31.

After stopping Kansas on fourth down at the Iowa State 37, Purdy found Sean Shaw on 4th and goal from the four to seal the win with 1:09 to go.

Carter Stanley threw for 328 yards and three TDs for Kansas, and Pooka Williams ran for 154 yards.

Ohio State still undefeated after rolling past Penn State

COLUMBUS, Ohio — J.K. Dobbins rushed for 157 yards and two touchdowns and No. 2 Ohio State locked up the Big Ten East title Saturday, surviving its first real test of the season with a 28-17 victory over No. 9 Penn State.

The Buckeyes held on after Penn State (9-2, 7-2 Big Ten) took advantage of two second-half turnovers to climb back into the game in the third quarter after going down 21-0.

The Buckeyes (10-0, 8-0 Big Ten) were clinging to a 21-17 lead early in the fourth quarter when Justin Fields threw a 28-yard touchdown pass to Chris Olive to create some breathing room.

(4) Georgia 19 (24) Texas A&M 13

ATHENS, Ga. — George Pickens scored Georgia's only touchdown, Rodrigo Blankenship booted four field goals and the defense stymied Texas A&M, leading the No. 4 Bulldogs to a lackluster victory over the 24th-ranked Aggies.

Georgia (10-1, 7-1 Southeastern Conference, No. 4 CFP) wrapped up its con-

ference schedule and stayed on course to make a run at the College Football Playoff.

(5) Alabama 66 Western Carolina 3

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Mac Jones passed for 275 yards and three touchdowns in little more than a half and No. 5 Alabama began life without Tua Tagovailoa with a romp over FCS Western Carolina.

With Tagovailoa watching much of the game from a cart behind the bench, the Crimson Tide (10-1) treated its injured quarterback to a one-sided show against the Catamounts (3-9). Alabama is ranked fifth in the College Football Playoff rankings and hoping to somehow make the field despite failing to win the SEC West.

(11) Minnesota 38 Northwestern 22

EVANSTON, Ill. — Tanner Morgan led No. 11 Minnesota to scores on its first three possessions and finished with four touchdown passes, and the Gophers bounced back from their first loss of the season with a win over Northwestern.

The Gophers (10-1, 7-1

AUBURN, Ala. — Auburn's defense held Samford to 114 yards and forced four turnovers, Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored twice, and the No. 16 Tigers tuned up for the Iron Bowl with a victory at rain-drenched Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn forced and recovered a fumble on a fourth-and-4 on Samford's opening drive, the first of three turnovers and a trio of three-and-outs across Samford's first six possessions.

For the game, the Tigers also had 13 tackles for loss and held Samford to 2 yards per play.

(19) Iowa 19, Illinois 10

IOWA CITY, Iowa — Nate Stanley threw for 308 yards and Keith Duncan kicked four field goals to set a new Big Ten single-season mark

as No. 19 Iowa shut down Illinois.

The Hawkeyes also forced three turnovers against the team that came into the game leading the nation in turnover margin.

BOONE, N.C. — Darrynton Evans ran for 154 yards and three second-half touchdowns and No. 23 Appalachian State avoided another home upset with a big second half to beat Texas State.

Zac Thomas threw for 174 yards and two touchdowns to help the Mountaineers (10-1, 6-1 Sun Belt) improve to 30-6 at home since becoming an FBS team in 2014.

Hokies shut out Pitt; Marshall falls

BLACKSBURG, Va. — Hendon Hooker threw for 153 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 25 Virginia Tech to a 28-0 victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday.

Hooker threw touchdown passes to Tré Turner and Damon Hazelton, and Virginia Tech's defense scored on a fumble return, as the Hokies (8-3, 5-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) notched their sixth win in their past seven games.

The Virginia Tech win sets up a showdown next weekend with rival Virginia, with the victor claiming the ACC's Coastal Division and an ACC championship game berth on Dec. 7.

Pittsburgh (7-4, 4-3 ACC) finished with a season-low 177 yards. Kenny Pickett completed 10 of 26 passes for 103 yards.

Hooker's 71-yard pass to Tayvion Robinson led to James Mitchell's 1-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, giving the Hokies a 7-0 lead. Moments later, Norell Pollard returned a Pickett fumble 7 yards for a touchdown that pushed the lead to 14.

Virginia Tech essentially put the game away with Hooker's 3-yard touchdown to Turner with 45 seconds left in the first half.

Hooker completed 10 of 13 passes in moving to 6-0 as the starting quarterback.

Charlotte 24 Marshall 13

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Victor Tucker scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns, and Charlotte is bowl eligible for the first time with its victory over Marshall.

The 49ers (6-5, 4-3 Conference USA) have won four straight conference games for their program-best sixth win.

Tucker ran into the end zone from the 5 on a jet sweep to give Charlotte a 17-13 lead with 10:47 to play. Charlotte's Nafees Lyon intercepted an Isaiah Green pass with about seven minutes left. Chris Reynolds then led the 49ers on an 11-play, 62-yard drive capped by his 25-yard TD pass to Tucker with 48 seconds remaining.

Tucker had five catches for 121 yards. Reynolds threw for 166 yards and two interceptions and added 145 yards on the ground, including a 15-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

Benny LeMay added 100 yards rushing to surpass 3,000 in his career at Charlotte.

Athletic director Shane Lyons even warned last summer what could happen this season.

"We do have to be patient," Lyons said in January. "We live in a world that wants instant gratification, but college football is very, very tough. We play in a very tough conference in the Big 12. We lost five guys in the NFL draft, and probably should have had more chosen than that. Those guys are hard to replace. We're

young and we're inexperienced, but still we have some great players. It's a matter of them coming together as a group and playing together."

It was going to take time for coach Neal Brown to get his footing, and most are willing to let that happen. But for the 2019 WVU seniors, that future vision did not include them. As this season went along, a bowl game looked less and less likely, but a win at Kansas State last week reinvigorated the idea, but with that off a table, especially with a

loss on a their last game playing on Mountaineer Field, Brown feels a touch of sorrow.

"I just hate it for them," WVU coach Neal Brown said of his seniors. "There's a lot of guys who have played well this year, but obviously, their senior years haven't gone the way they wanted to, but they have played a significant role and have played their best football. I met with all of them [Friday] and I told them, 'Listen, I appreciate you guys. You didn't ask for us to come in here as a staff or some of the adver-

sity that's hit us this year, whether it's attrition or being young, or stuff like that — you didn't ask for that."

"But to your credit, you showed up and did the work."

Offensive lineman Colton McKivitz, who started his 46th-straight game Saturday, played in his first game in 2016, the season-opener against Missouri. Yodny Cajuste went down with a torn ACL and McKivitz stepped in, and the rest, as they say, is history. Part of a 10-win team in 2016 and the 2018 team

that helped compete for a Big 12 title until the last week of the season, this isn't the way McKivitz wanted to go out, but he understands the process.

From the time Brown arrived on campus, it was clear McKivitz was one the new coaches could lean on inside the locker room to help the transition go as smooth as possible. And for him, that's a pretty good legacy to leave behind.

"It may not have been a change that we wanted to happen our senior year, but I've had multiple talks

with coach Brown about the future and what this group is building," McKivitz said. "We may not see the fruits of our labor now, but in a few years, hopefully, the end goal is bringing something special here, and I think that's the way it's going to go."

Brown agreed, believing this senior class will have a long-term impact.

"They set a standard here, and unfortunately, they're not going to see the fruits of it, but they will be paid off down the road," he said.

player."

Hubbard said it doesn't matter how he gets the ball. "I just try my best to get first downs and score," he said. "I was just trying to do my job and make something happen."

Hubbard ran 26 times for 106 yards, far below his 173-yard average, but he ran for 47 yards on two key second-half drives that helped Oklahoma State take control.

Dru Brown marched Oklahoma State the length of the field early in the fourth quarter, hitting Dillon Stoner with a 2-yard scoring pass for a 17-13 lead.

"I was really proud of Dru, the way he took care of the ball and didn't turn it over," Gundy said.

West Virginia (4-7, 2-6) didn't have as much luck inside the red zone.

The Mountaineers couldn't convert on three plays from the 1-yard line in the second quarter and they twice had to settle for short field goals.

Leddie Brown converted a fourth-and-1 from the Oklahoma State 18 with 2:37 left in the game. But Jarret Doege threw three incomplections, the Mountaineers turned the ball over on downs and Oklahoma State

"Just too many missed opportunities. That sums it up," Brown said. "Credit them. They made enough plays at the end of the game."

Doege finished 28 of 38 for 307 yards in his second start since taking over for Austin Kendall, including a 34-yard scoring toss in the second quarter to his roommate, George Campbell. Seven of Campbell's 19 receptions this season have gone for touchdowns.

Oklahoma State: The

Cowboys were outgained 333-285 but managed to make the most of it. Dru Brown, a graduate transfer from Hawaii, completed 22 of 29 passes for 196 yards in place of the injured Spencer Sanders.

West Virginia: The Mountaineers lost for the sixth time in seven games and their bowl hopes are over. A defense that looked impressive against Hubbard in the first half gave him just enough room to break free after halftime and the offense was limited to 128 yards and three points after halftime.

# MISSED OPPORTUNITIES

## Recurring offensive woes haunt WVU in loss to Oklahoma State

West Virginia coach Neal Brown knows he's been beating the same drum all season, but the same mistakes continued to haunt the Mountaineers' offense Saturday against No. 22 Oklahoma State.

"I think the story of the game came down to the issues that we had all year," he said. "They are the issues that haunted us today — our lack of ability to run the football, we didn't score touchdowns in the red zone and we had critical drops. I think we had four drops in the second half. Some of those were competitive catches, but you have to make those to win games and we didn't do it."

"As a staff, we have to get better and we have to do a better job in those areas."

Two of the most glaring drops were on WVU's last two drives. The first was by senior George Campbell, who's come on strong toward the end of the season. On a 3rd-and-5

from the WVU 11, quarterback Jarret Doege was able to roll out of a crowded pocket and find an open Campbell, but Campbell flat out dropped it with room to run.

"It was all me — not concentrating," Campbell said. "I looked up the field before I took the ball in. Drops always suck, but for me, that was a crucial moment. It was a big play for us to make, and I didn't make it."

T.J. Simmons had another critical drop, though contested, on WVU's last stand on its final drive. Facing a 3rd-and-12 at the OSU 19, Simmons' catch would have made it a manageable 4th down attempt.

In the running game, the Mountaineers averaged just 1.2 yards per carry (22 for 26 yards). The interior of the offensive line — guards Michael Brown and James Gmitter, and center Chase Behrnt — struggled with the Cowboys' 3-man front.

As for red zone woes, WVU got inside the Oklahoma State 20-yard

line three times but didn't score a touchdown. Two ended in field goals and the final drive of the game was a turnover on downs.

### 'His shin was down'

West Virginia receiver Sam James and his teammates certainly thought he scored a touchdown in the second quarter.

The only problem is, none of the officials thought the same.

James caught a Doege pass across the middle, and as James scooted toward the end zone, he was dragged down just before reaching the goal line. Both officials signaled him down at the 1-yard line, but on replay, it appeared James was able to keep his knee elevated off the ground as he rolled into the end zone, but the side of his ankle and his shin scraped the turf.

Following a booth review, though, the ruling on the field stood, but the Mountaineers had it 1st-and-goal from the 1. Disaster struck soon after, as two quarterback steaks

with Doege failed, followed by a false start by left guard Michael Brown.

Then at the 6-yard line, Doege was pressured on 3rd down and threw a pass short as it skipped in, which forced the Mountaineers to kick a field goal.

What appeared to be seven points ended up just being three, and Brown wasn't totally satisfied with the explanation he got from the officiating crew as to why James' catch wasn't a touchdown.

"I don't really understand it," Brown said. "I thought he was in, I thought the replay showed he was in. Since they called him down, I don't think if the replay was inconclusive. It was something about they thought his shin was down. I didn't see it that way."

"I don't know. I've got to talk to (Big 12 Coordinator of Officials) Greg Burks and get a clear understanding of that."

GROUP RELEASES NAUGHTY TOY LIST

A consumer safety group is targeting a Nerf dart gun and slime on their annual list of toys to avoid this holiday season. World Against Toys Causing Harm said the Nerf Ultra One gun, which is billed as firing soft darts up to 120 feet, shoots the projectiles with enough force to potentially cause eye injuries. It also notes that Nickelodeon's Frozen Treats Slime includes dessert-scented versions of the goo even as it warns the products are made of harmful chemicals and shouldn't be eaten. The Toy Association, a toy industry trade group that represents most of the toy makers named on the list, dismissed the annual list as misleading.



COTY KEEPS UP WITH THE KARDASHIANS

CoverGirl owner Coty is adding Kylie Jenner's beauty business to its family of cosmetic and hair products. The luxury and beauty company is paying \$600 million for a 51% stake in Kylie Jenner, part of the "Keeping Up with the Kardashians" reality show family, founded the company in 2015. The 22-year-old will still be the face of the brand and remain involved in creating new products. Coty hopes that the celebrity-backed business can help boost its sales and connect with younger shoppers under 35. The company's other brands include Max Factor makeup and Sally Hansen nail polish, which have been around for decades.



YOGURT'S CULTURAL SHIFT

Yogurt's appeal has been slipping for years and analysts expect the industry's sales to continue slipping in 2019 and beyond. U.S. sales of yogurt and yogurt drinks peaked at nearly \$9 billion in 2015. In 2019, they're expected to hit \$8.2 billion, down 3.6% from 2018, according to market research company Mintel. Sales are expected to fall another 10% to \$7.4 billion by 2024. A Mintel survey released this month showed that people are going elsewhere for some of their probiotic fix. The survey showed that 30% of people who bought yogurt in the past three months also bought high-protein foods or probiotic foods instead of yogurt.

Company Spotlight Nordstrom bucks the trend

Ring it up. Nordstrom shares surged Friday after it reported profit for the latest quarter that topped analysts' expectations. Wall Street is split on whether it can continue. Nordstrom's report was a rare bit of encouraging news for a department-store retailer, as shoppers continue to head online for their purchases earlier in the week when worries were rising about instead of the mall. In the last week, Kohl's and Macy's



both cut their profit forecasts. Nordstrom is not immune to those pressures. Sales are sinking at its mall-based stores, and it was strength in its lower-priced Nordstrom Rack stores that helped drive the results. InsiderQ&A Helping the aged avoid fraud



Michele Kryger, Head of elder and vulnerable client care unit, AIG

Retirements are growing longer than ever, which means more decades to pay for — and more decades to avoid getting scammed out of your savings. The financial and investment industries have noticed how often their elderly clients are targeted by fraudsters, unscrupulous family members and others. Michele Kryger, who started the elder and vulnerable client care unit at AIG, recently talked about how seniors can protect themselves.

What kinds of scams were you seeing that showed a need for this kind of unit?

One of the very early cases we had involved an elderly client who requested a \$72,000 withdrawal. It was unusual for the client, so his financial adviser decided to go out and meet at his home. When he talked to the client, the client indicated that he was going to come into a large sum of money, and he'd be able to replenish his account pretty soon. But first, he needed to pay this upfront sum. That's a red flag.

And then his wife said, "Hey, we won the lottery! And by the way, why are we getting called by some foreigner?" We tried to convince the client not to take the \$72,000 out. We reached out to adult protective services, who also tried to talk him out of it. But then he submitted a request again a few days later, and it took coordination between the financial adviser, the daughter and us to make sure that he did stop the withdrawal. And he never did send that money out. So we were able to prevent a \$72,000 loss.

What can people do to protect themselves?

Two types of protection are very helpful: To have a trusted contact who's different than your power of attorney provides a check and balance.

Power of attorney means?

Power of attorney is somebody that an individual selects to manage their finances, health or different types of activities.

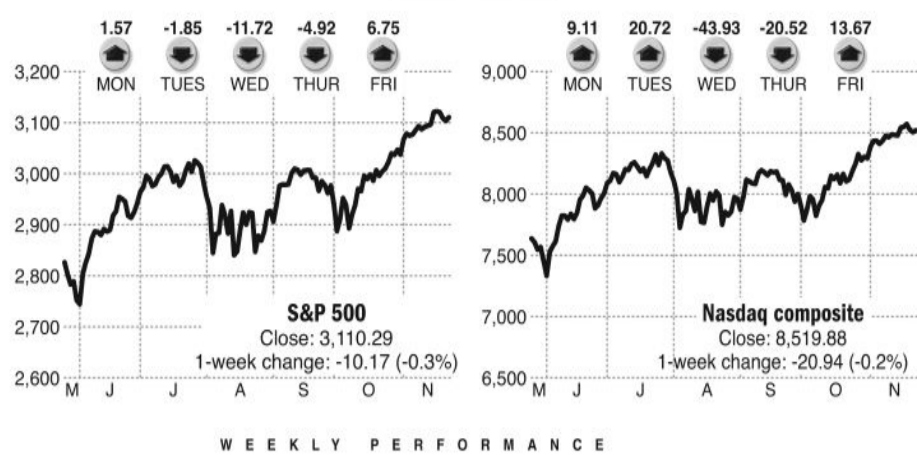
What we like is where you have a power of attorney that identifies two attorneys-in-fact who have to act jointly on behalf of the client. We've had withdrawal requests come in from one of the attorneys-in-fact that seems unusual, and we take a look at the case and say, "Hey, we can't accept this. It needs to be signed by both." Oftentimes, it hasn't come back, which means we may have prevented some loss for our client.

**Quick Fix Job loss basics**

What to do if you lose your job

Losing your job can be disorienting. The average length of unemployment is almost 22 weeks, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, so it's important to quickly adapt your finances to your new normal.

Here are some steps to help find your financial footing.

**1 Unemployment** Contact your state's unemployment office the day you lose your job. You can usually file an unemployment claim online. The process can take a few weeks, so don't delay.

**2 Savings** Take stock of your savings. Factor in severance or payouts for unused vacation days, which will help you stretch your reserves. Resist the urge to cash out a 401(k). Between taxes, penalties and lost retirement earnings, that's an expensive move.

**3 Budget** Switch to a bare-bones budget as soon as you lose your job, says Bruce McClary with the National Foundation for Credit Counseling. Cut out gym memberships, ride shares, cable and streaming services. You can readjust your spending once you find employment.

**4 Creditors** Contact lenders, utility companies and credit card issuers that you owe money. Some may

let you lower or suspend payments. Don't forget student loans. You may be able to temporarily suspend repayment through deferment, or lower the amount due each month.

**5 Prioritize** You may need to make some hard decisions. The top priority is paying rent, keeping the lights on and putting food on the table, says Scott Newhouse, a certified financial planner in Thousand Oaks, California. Debt comes next. McClary says to prioritize collateralized loans, like your mortgage or auto loan, where you might lose that item if you do not pay. Continue to make at least the minimum payment on credit cards for as long as possible.

**6 Health care** Often, you'll have coverage at least until the end of the month, but you'll need something to bridge the gap until your next gig. Get on a partner's, spouse's or your parents' plan (if you are under age 26). Job loss is considered a "qualifying event," meaning you can get health insurance outside of the annual open enrollment period.

You can also search for a new plan through the health insurance marketplace. Or you can continue coverage through your former employer via COBRA insurance.

## Hospital cost transparency good 1st step

Shining a spotlight on opaque hospital billing structures may not be a miracle cure for the rising cost of health care. But medical cost transparency is worth pursuing on principle, alone.

No one would buy a car without knowing the sticker price. Few would hire a house painter without getting an estimate — or several — first. Yet, hospital patients usually don't learn the cost of their medical care until after they've been treated and receive a bill.

A new Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services rule could change all that by demanding price transparency of every U.S. hospital. By January 2021, the federal agency will require hospitals to disclose charges for every service they provide, including cash discounts and rates negotiated with third-party payers, such as insurance companies. Additionally, they'll be required to publish plain-language estimated costs for all associated charges for 300 "shoppable" services, such as joint replacements and other common treatments.

The intent is to enable patients to make informed decisions and to promote competition between providers. However, some hospital groups are objecting, saying the new rule will confuse patients rather than clarify potential out-of-pocket expenses. They suggest costs could actually increase by making it more difficult for providers to negotiate with insurers. They argue providers could just as easily decide to raise rates to meet competitors' charges as they could decide to lower them to remain competitive. Four major provider associations — the American Hospital Association, Association of American Medical Colleges, Children's Hospital Association and the Federation of American Hospitals — announced they will sue CMS to stop implementation of the new rule.

Certainly, pricing information should be user-friendly, says the leader of the Washington Health Alliance, a nonprofit organization that shares the data on health care quality and value.

Launched last year, WAHealthCare-Compare.com aggregates hospital, clinic, dental and prescription claims and eligibility data from the state's All-Payer Claims Database. Researchers, policymakers and state agencies can tap into the robust pool of data to identify potential system improvements. Patients can look up quality data and average costs for dozens of common services, and generate an estimate of their out-of-pocket expenses based on their insurance plan.

The CMS rule appears to dramatically expand the transparency already available in Washington, both in amount of data to be published and by expanding it to other states. The change won't be a panacea, but it will be an important step. Whether a critical mass of health-care consumers will "shop around" for a hospital the way they do a car or contractor — many more factors go into medical decision-making — understanding the drivers of health care costs is a necessary first step toward reining in runaway costs.

## Sam and Nancy: different speakers

**TIMES CHANGE,** norms change, politicians with different standards come and go, and it's all for the better, except maybe not, especially when you are talking about two Democratic speakers of the U.S. House of Representatives. They're interesting comparisons, Sam Rayburn of years ago and Nancy Pelosi of today, and maybe what's different about them gives us insight into our own times.

Known by friends as "Mr. Sam," Rayburn was raised in meager circumstances on a Texas cotton farm and decided as a boy that he wanted to be a politician. He started out as a teacher, became a state legislator, got a law degree and turned up as a representative in Washington in 1913, hanging around until 1961.

Despite a couple of interruptions, he was speaker for 17 years, a record, and that was no accident. He stayed mostly behind the scenes, working politely and persuasively with others, mastered the content of just about every bill and found ways to get hugely important things done, such as supplying electricity to rural America.

He wouldn't take a nickel from anybody for anything. While a state legislator, he was also a member of a law firm that represented a railroad paying handsome fees. The legislature dealt with railroad issues, and even though there was no legal impediment, Rayburn said no fee for me, please.

When he died, he had \$15,000 in the bank.

Pelosi, whose father was a congressman and mayor of Baltimore, climbed her way up in San Francisco politics, made it to the House and became its first woman speaker.

This year, she became speaker again, and every now and then has seemed lost in her leadership, still a liberal, ad hominem dogmatist but unclear on whether to keep House procedures reasonable or mystifying to some of us observers. She has worn a coat of righteousness in saying, for instance, that Trump belongs in prison, but her righteousness seems a bit fit.

By way of example, let's go back to 2008 when the House was considering a popular bill that would stop Visa from charging vendors swipe fees and bringing home stacks of moolah. Pelosi was speaker and exempt from laws prohibiting insider trading, and her husband got a chance to buy Visa stocks in an initial public offering, making quite a bit of money over time. A Visa political action committee gave Nancy Pelosi \$1,000 to help her reelection. She had a meeting with Visa executives. The bill did not make it to a vote and was in fact stalled for two years.

Pelosi's husband has been highly successful in the real estate and venture capital business, and the two have had maybe eight adventures in initial public offerings, it is reported.

Their worth is estimated at \$29 million.

## A rare show of bipartisan support for 5G technology

**AMAZINGLY, THE SENATE** just sent a bipartisan request to the White House.

In a hopeful if small sign that there are matters of state that Republicans and Democrats can still agree on, a coalition of senators is arguing that the United States is at serious risk of losing the international race to get 5G wireless technology.

This could constitute a major national security threat, the senators argued in a letter to Peter O'Brien, national security adviser to President Trump.

China is by all reports surging ahead in this area. At the end of October the Communist Party said that 5G — one of its key priorities — is already up and running for a number of commercial enterprises and that its 50 major cities will have 5G by the end of the year. By contrast, Verizon, which launched its 5G network about seven months ago, says it has 5G operating in 18 cities now and hopes to have it in 30 cities by the end of 2019. The downside is that such ultrafast speeds are available mostly on streets and sidewalks — not inside buildings. Not inside your typical Starbucks, for example. Plenty of lattes but not enough millimeter waves.

China reportedly has outspent the United States on developing 5G by \$24 billion since 2015. Some think the real figure is in the hundreds of billions.

So, fellow citizens, why should we care?

Your 4G wireless capability may suit you just fine, but 5G is the next generation high-speed internet service and needs a lot of expensive infrastructure. If Chinese companies dominate in this area, many think the U.S. could suffer a catastrophic loss of security and economic dominance.

China's plan to spend \$400

billion to upgrade to 5G wireless. If that happens, the United States might never catch up, some U.S. analysts think. 5G is 100 times faster than 4G. 5G puts through a command 400 times faster than the blink of an eye. A movie download could take seconds, not minutes. Games would be played much faster. More importantly, a self-driving car would be programmed to act much faster and much more safely, and industrial equipment without 5G would be quickly outmoded.

Then, of course, computer commands to access massive amounts of government data and to missiles or spacecraft could make the dominant country indomitable. That could become a national emergency if the United States is not that country.

In a letter first obtained by The Wall Street Journal, the group of senators told the White House: "While we appreciate the progress being made within and across (federal) departments and agencies, we are concerned that their respective approaches are not informed by a coherent national strategy. In our view, the current national level approach to 5G comprises a dispersed coalition of common concern, rather than a coordinated, interagency activity."

The White House did not immediately respond, although Trump has said he wants 5G to be a national priority. One reason is that rural

voters, who voted for Trump in 2016, tend to have slower internet connections than urban voters. As we all know, Trump is very eager to be reelected in 2020.

However, there is a vicious, fractious and worrisome disconnect among federal agencies, all of which seem to have different 5G plans and strategies and competing demands for spectrum allocation — which agency gets the most access to 5G. The person who was supposed to be coordinating abruptly quit.

The Federal Communications Commission wants 5G but is stuck on which ones of several proposals to choose. The FCC chairman, Ajit Pai, said he backs a proposed merger by Sprint and T-Mobile on the theory that such a company would have the resources to push 5G faster. But a number of state attorneys general have filed an antitrust lawsuit against the merger on grounds that it would not be beneficial to American cellphone users.

Meanwhile, China is determined to be first, which would give its businesses — and government — a huge leg up. Many analysts think who wins the global 5G race is far more important than whether the U.S. or China "wins" the current trade war.

There was supposed to be a national report on where the U.S. is on the 5G competition due out last summer. But it has yet to be released by the White House, which seems to be tied up with infighting and impeachment.

Essentially, both Republicans and Democrats in Congress are throwing up their hands in frustration with the now-public message to the White House: Get your act together, guys.

# Bill Clinton testified, so must Trump

President Donald Trump has gone back and forth about the value and appropriateness of answering investigators' questions in writing.

When special counsel Robert Mueller sought to question Trump in 2018 during the investigation into Russian interference in the 2016 election, Trump's lawyers not only denied a request for a face-to-face interrogation, but also limited the scope of the questions they would allow the president to address.

Then earlier this month, when the whistleblower volunteered to answer questions in writing from Republican congressmen who remain obsessed with the completely irrelevant matter of the whistleblower's identity, Trump raged on Twitter, "He must be brought forward to testify. Written answers not acceptable!"

Trump seemed to reverse himself again Monday when he tweeted, "I like the idea," to Democratic House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's suggestion that he testify in writing. Trump wrote that he would "strongly consider it!"

You may recall, as I do, that President Bill Clinton testified in person, under oath, twice back in 1998 in proceedings related to the inquiry into his extramarital sexual behavior.

Clinton fought the first subpoena in court, arguing that the responsibilities of a sitting president are too important and the principle of separation of powers too vital to allow the courts to compel him to testify in the lawsuit brought by Paula Jones. But in *Jones v. Clinton*, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled unanimously against Clinton, finding that a president "is subject to the same laws that apply to all citizens."

He then sat for a deposition in January 1998.

Six months later, special prosecutor Kenneth Starr subpoenaed Clinton to appear before the grand jury investigating whether Clinton had had a sexual relationship with a former White House intern and then lied about that fact during his deposition in the Jones case.

At first, Clinton indicated he would fight the subpoena. Clinton could and arguably should have declared the whole exercise a ridiculous sham and told Starr to go take a flying leap at a rolling doughnut.

But those were different times.

These days, Republicans are standing shoulder to shoulder with the defiant Trump, cheering him on as he derides the investigation into his alleged efforts to squeeze Ukraine into trying to dig up dirt on his Democratic political rival Joe Biden and attempts to block those with firsthand knowledge of that effort from testifying.

But in the summer of 1998, elected Democrats all across the country pressured Clinton to cooperate with Starr, lest the tawdry scandal hurt the party at the polls that November. So Clinton agreed to testify under oath again that August. The line everyone remembers from that event: "It depends on what the meaning of the word 'is' is."

And of course the justification for Clinton's subsequent impeachment offered by indignant Republicans and conservative commentators ended up being not that Clinton had sex with an intern. Oh no. It was that he'd lied under oath. Never mind the circumstances, motivation or materiality of his falsehoods. He had sworn to tell the truth! The rule of law was in shambles!

Why is it today up to Trump whether or not he testifies before the committee?

Because the once indignant Republicans and conservative guardians of law aren't demanding he do so, despite the comparative gravity of the charges against him.

And because Democrats in Congress have shown no stomach or patience for the court fight necessary to try to force him to. Trump himself has already said it best: "He must be brought forward to testify. Written answers not acceptable!"

## Fees for electric vehicles are fair

A letter writer Sunday (Nov. 17) provides an interesting insight about the new fees/taxes on electric and hybrid vehicles. Because the coal and wind needed to power the vehicles is generated in West Virginia, these new vehicles benefit the state of West Virginia economically. This certainly should be taken into account by lawmakers.

The first response to any tax affecting us is viscerally negative. Plus, in an age of distrust in lawmakers, we can imagine smoke-filled rooms where the decisions are made — sans the smoke, of course.

However, simple observation and science says otherwise. Damage to the roads is done by moisture, heat and settling of the ground, compounded by the weight and speeds of the cars and trucks traveling them.

For typical yearly commuting and weekend trips of 13,500 miles per year, the owner has to buy 450 gallons of gas per year. At \$0.36 tax per gallon of gas, the total paid per year is \$162.

So, yes, West Virginia may be hurting itself with a high fee for electric vehicles, but some fee is necessary out of fairness.

## Drug-testing welfare recipients not helping

Federal assistance programs have always been a hot topic, especially when discussing where taxpayers' monies are being allocated. One legislative solution passed in several states has been drug-testing welfare recipients. Approximately 15 states have passed laws requiring drug-testing for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). The question becomes, does this solution save taxpayer's money or is it costing more and spending it in inappropriate ways?

The stigma surrounding substance use and those who receive welfare has never been positive nor accurate. Media depicts those who receive welfare to be predominantly low class, substance abusers, have delinquent children, and downright just too lazy to get a job and take care of themselves. The reality is the exact opposite. Almost half of the families that receive TANF are from the middle class. Unbeknownst to the media, families that are receiving welfare are fighting to get ahead and provide the best life for themselves. There is no evidence suggesting that substance abuse is higher in those who receive welfare ben-

efits.

When West Virginia implemented Senate Bill 6 (SB6) in 2016, 798 tests were administered with only 83 being positive. Within that year alone, this cost the state approximately \$50,172, which could be translated to \$604 per positive test. This resulted in 50% more money being spent on TANF due to the drug tests. Additionally, the costs reported were only a snapshot of the actual drug tests and did not include the man-hours for administrating and documenting the drug tests. These numbers help to illustrate a low cost-to-benefit ratio.

While the money being spent on this new program is alarming and something to be upset about, it does not capture the bigger picture of how SB 6 affects those living in West Virginia. West Virginia is in the top nine states with the highest percentages of citizens on SNAP or food stamps. SB 6 single-handedly targets a majority of those living in West Virginia.

Another issue to consider with SB 6 and bills similar, is that there is no follow-up treatment for those who test positive for substances. Yet, most states have consequences for positive tests, such as losing assistance altogether. The same states that are punishing those who are struggling with substance use missed the mark to provide a plan on how to help those who test positive. This further stigmatizes substance use in general and fails to help those in need even more. Not to mention that there is no evidence that drug testing welfare recipients will prevent substance use.

Bills like SB 6 are not helping West Virginia to save money or assist with decreasing the opioid epidemic. Requiring drug tests for welfare recipients not only feeds into the negative stigma surrounding substance use, but it also puts a negative connotation on those seeking assistance. We must do better to help one another.

# Longview Power: clean carbon energy model

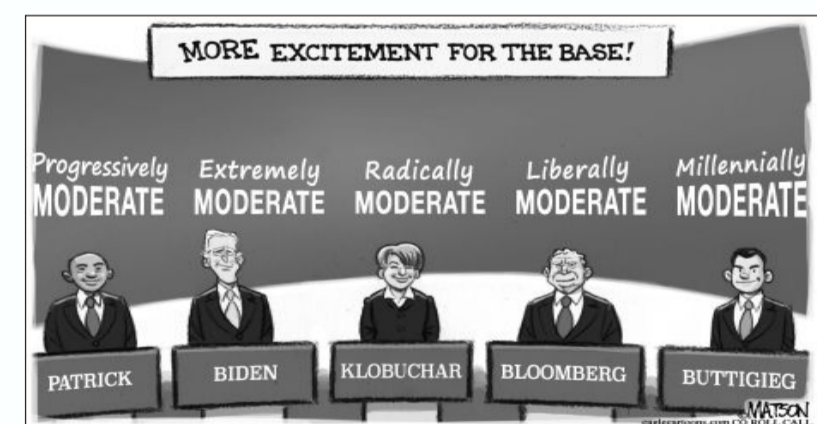
As the old saying goes, "a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush."

In West Virginia we talk a lot about the coming petrochemical renaissance that will utilize our natural gas resources to power new chemical, plastics and manufacturing businesses while creating thousands of jobs in the process. I am optimistic this will happen, but we haven't been able to flush those "birds" out of the bush just yet.

West Virginia does, however, have "one in the hand" right now with our company's proposal to develop the Longview Power Clean Energy Center project and we'd appreciate your support for incremental positive change towards a cleaner, cost effective and reliable West Virginia energy production industry.

Longview Power, located just outside Morgantown, has filed application for a siting certificate with the West Virginia Public Service Commission for the construction and operation of a wholesale electric generating facility comprised of a 1,200-megawatt (MW) gas-fired combined-cycle power plant and a 70-MW, utility grade solar installation.

This is in addition and to be constructed adjacent to Longview's 710 MW supercritical coal-fired power plant which generates electricity more cleanly, efficiently and at more competitive rates than nearly all other



fossil fuel generators in North America.

The new project, to be constructed using union labor, will cost \$1.1 billion, create 5,000 direct and indirect jobs during construction, and employee compensation will exceed \$360 million. The facility will pay an additional \$2 million annually in PILOT and tax payments to Monongalia County, over and above the \$3 million currently generated by the coal plant.

The new project is needed to provide clean, affordable power to our region for decades to come. Additionally, the project just makes sense when you look at what's happening in the energy marketplace.

Consider that more than 25 new gas-fired electric generation facilities have been built in and around the Mid-Atlantic in the last five years, and four more are under construction. Unfortunately, none of those have been

built in West Virginia.

Additionally, the development of new gas wells in West Virginia, and the jobs that go with them, are flat or declining. That's occurring because we have too much gas going unused in the local market and a lack of completed pipeline infrastructure to transport it to regions that need it. The Longview Power Clean Energy Center, once operational, will utilize approximately 59 billion cubic feet annually of natural gas produced right here in our region.

And, make no mistake, the demand for renewable energy is growing dramatically and the technology to harness it is rapidly improving. The 70 MW utility grade solar facility will use over 185,000 solar panels on 300 acres. It will be the largest solar generation facility in West Virginia and one of the largest in Appalachia. The solar installation will be constructed on our property in both

Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

In commenting on the project, U.S. Sen. Shelley Moore Capito, offered, "[The project] is the perfect example of how our state continues to contribute to our national all-of-the-above energy strategy." U.S. Sen. Joe Manchin, said, "I have always supported an all-of-the-above energy policy and am confident West Virginia workers will achieve this at Longview." And, Gov. Justice stated, "I've said many times that we need to be an 'all-in' energy state here in West Virginia."

This project will be a first-of-its-kind, global model for clean fossil and renewable energy generation. Our operations will keep coal miners and gas workers employed while significantly expanding our state's renewable portfolio.

Unfortunately, even though this will be one of the cleanest power facilities in the world, some extreme environmental organizations are working to prohibit development of the project. They have made it their mission to eradicate any and all fossil-fuel based electricity generation and to prevent new facilities from being built.

West Virginia has the bird in its hand right now, and we intend to make the Longview Power Clean Energy Center a reality that West Virginia can be proud of.

# Smooth sailing

## How to make holiday travel easier

### Which Thanksgiving foods you can and cannot take on a flight

Maybe your in-laws aren't such great cooks. Or you've run out of ways to disguise the fact that the Brussels sprouts casserole that's a staple at family gatherings is worse than vile. One solution: Fly your holiday dinner with you.

Can you do that in a carry-on? Yes, but with some restrictions.

Remember, you can't carry a steamer trunk on an airplane. Carry-ons must adhere to your airline's size limitations, so check there first. And, of course, consider whether you want your luggage to smell like Thanksgiving for the rest of the year.

Then consider whether the contents of your dinner are allowed.

What is cleared for takeoff in your carry-on: Turkey, dry stuffing, casseroles and desserts such as pies.

What's not: More than 3.4 ounces of any liquid, which must be packed in a like-sized container. If it's more than that, it must go in your checked luggage.

The general rule, the Transportation Security Administration said, is if you can "spill it, spread it, spray it, pump it or pour it," and it's more than 3.4 ounces, it should be packed in a checked bag. You must carry items of 3.4 ounces or less in a 1-quart plastic bag if you're taking it in a carry-on bag.

#### Turkey

Finding a good deal on a bird or one that meets your stringent requirements is perhaps one of the biggest challenges of the holiday season. If you've found the one, of course you want to take it with you. Cooking it ahead of time is the easier option, although you can take it

uncooked if you follow TSA's instructions, which urge packing it in ice or solidly frozen ice packs. (Slushy ice will be a non-starter.) You may use dry ice but not more than 5 pounds, and the container must be properly vented, TSA said.

#### Vegetables and fruit dishes

If you can't imagine a holiday meal without homemade green bean casserole and mashed potatoes, there is good news: TSA allows fresh and cooked vegetables and fruits on flights from most locations. But if you are traveling from Hawaii, Puerto Rico or the U.S. Virgin Islands, you may run into some regulatory issues. Laws generally prohibit the transport of most fresh fruits and vegetables — except those that have United

Some simple pre-departure tasks are crucial to a happy homecoming. These include: Tidying up, putting your mail on hold, stocking up on frozen or non-

perishable food (or scheduling a grocery delivery for when you get home), unplugging appliances, turning off the water supply, putting fresh sheets on the beds and giving a spare key to a friend.

"It's awful to come home to a cold and messy home," said Amy Panos, home editor of Better Homes and Gardens. "It's definitely worth it to clean up before you go. Think about what you want to come home to .... Take out the trash, and if there's food in the fridge or on the counter that will

### Officials: Don't plug into public USB charging stations at airports, malls

If your cellphone battery is running low, don't plug it into a USB charging station at the airport or mall, officials are warning consumers as the busy holiday season gets under way.

Those convenient USB charging stations in public places could be loaded with malware by criminals looking to steal your money and identity, warned the Los Angeles district attorney in a recent Twitter post.

This growing cyber threat, known as Juice Jacking, poses serious risks to smartphones, tablets and computers. In as little as one minute, a virus can be

transferred to unsuspecting users' devices. Then, the virus begins exporting sensitive data and passwords directly to the scammers.

Instead, use your own charging cord to plug directly into an electrical outlet, experts say.

The warning comes as a record number of travelers get ready to hit the road for Thanksgiving and hot-foot it to malls to buy holiday gifts.

Here's how the scam works: A computer is concealed within the charging kiosk or on cables left plugged in that are programmed to automatically pair with smartphones when they are plugged in.

spoil before you get back, get rid of it.”

Jacqui Gifford, editor in chief of Travel and Leisure, said she travels about once a month and has set routines before each trip.

Some tips from the experts:

**Tidy up:** Take out the trash and dispose of perishable foods, Panos says. Make sure your home looks neat and welcoming.

**Make it welcoming:** Make sure you have groceries on hand to make an easy meal when you return, said Gifford, who suggests things like frozen foods or pasta with sauce as easy fixes for the travel-weary and hungry. Panos said it's also nice to have fresh-made beds waiting for you when you get home.

**Safeguard your home:** Program your lights to turn on and off at regular intervals. Have your mail and

subscriptions placed on hold so things don't accumulate at your front door, tipping off potential thieves that you're away. Reinforce sliding glass doors, lock all doors and windows, and leave your car in the driveway, Panos and Gifford say. You might consider waiting until you're home to post your travel pictures on social media, so you're not advertising to the world that you're away and your home is empty, Gifford says. Letting your neighbors know that you'll be away is also a good idea, says Panos, so they can keep an eye on things while you're gone.

**Shut things down:** Turn off the main water switch if you've got finicky plumbing, said Gifford, and put together a checklist of things that need to be turned off or unplugged. Set your thermostat lower before you go and, if possible, program it to heat up again right before you get back, suggests Panos. “The

last thing I do before heading out the door is to unplug all my electric items. It's good for your pocketbook because it saves energy, and can save your electrical items in case there's a power surge. It's also good for the environment,” Gifford said.

**Leave a key:** Give a spare key to a friend or neighbor, in case you realize on your way to the airport that you forgot to turn something off or need something checked on, Gifford said.

**Consider extra security measures:** In addition to the more basic pre-departure steps, there are other precautions to consider.

“Make sure your itinerary is left with a friend or neighbor not going on the trip, so someone knows where you are in the world and how to reach you. It's also a good idea to leave a copy of your passport and credit cards with a family member, and also

bring a copy with you that you can keep separately from your documents in case they're stolen,” Gifford said.

If you travel frequently with children or someone with health issues, supplemental travel insurance may be a good idea, she

said: “One in 30 trips ends in a medical emergency and, particularly if you travel a lot, that extra sense of security is worth it.”

The rogue computer can then freely access all the information stored on electronic devices, from passwords to emails, to address books to photos to text messages. It can even do a full backup of your phone, all of which can be accessed wirelessly by the crooks.

“A free charge could end up draining your bank account,” said Deputy District Attorney Luke Sisak in a video posted to the Los Angeles County’s website.

Instead, Sisak suggests playing it safe by plugging into an AC power outlet with your own charging cord or using a portable charger. Also, adding a passcode or enabling the fingerprint scanner or face ID will help foil an attack.

States Department of Agriculture’s stamp of approval — from these locations because of the risk of “spreading invasive plant pests.” Travelers from Hawaii, Puerto Rico or the U.S. Virgin Islands can check out USDA’s traveler information webpage to learn what they can or cannot bring.

**Gravy**

Travelers interested in showing off their version of this rich sauce at the dinner table or carrying leftovers on their flight home can carry gravy in a 3.4-ounce (or smaller) container. If you would like to carry more than this dollop, carefully secure it in an airtight plastic container, wrap it in plastic and pack it in your checked baggage.

**Stuffing**

The turkey may be the star of the show, but stuffing isn't far behind. You can take the dressing in your carry-on luggage, inside or outside the bird, as long as it's dry. If it's super moist, you are better off packing it in your checked bag.

**Cranberry sauce**

Beloved cranberry sauce can be transported in your carry-on luggage in a 3.4-ounce bottle. That's a pretty small serving for a crowd, so if you want to snag more of your mother's leftover cranberry sauce, secure it carefully in a plastic tub and pack it in your checked bag.

**Pumpkin pie**

TSA gives pumpkin pie the green light. You can pack it as a carry-on or in checked luggage. In case your flight is delayed, keep a fork handy.

A: Dearest T, Listen to me carefully. Stop reading this article right now and call this number 1-800-273-8255. That is the National Suicide Prevention Hotline.

Welcome back, T. I hope your conversation with them was helpful. They are holy and helpful healers. Let me prayerfully share with you some of what I know Tommy would have said to you if you were able to contact him.

Let me begin with what Tommy believed. Christ loves you the way you are right now. Christ did not come to heal happy people. He came to heal broken people. By taking your own life you are turning your back on Christ's love and for someone who "mightily maintains" your Christianity, that ought not to be possible.

Let me add the most simple and obvious reasons for you to choose life. You want to die now but you might want to live tomorrow and killing yourself ends the chances for you to change your mind. The decision to live and not take your own life is a daily decision. If you were addicted to drugs, you would be encouraged to be sober and straight one day at a time. You can choose to live the same way.

I am sure your burdens are real but so are your blessings. Spend five minutes listing all the miserable things you have to deal with, and *then* spend five minutes listing your blessings. You have a fractious family, but you have a family. You did not mention any outstanding health issues. I don't mean to be harsh with you in any way but let me ask you, "Who gave you the idea that your life would be easy every day?" Life is messy but it is always a gift. A big messy, glorious gift.

Finally, I want you to give thanks for your pain. Your pain comes from loving someone deeply. That is life's greatest blessing, but the fact remains that we are all mortal and that committing oneself to love also means that you have committed yourself to be in agony when the love is ended by death. Pain is the price we pay for love. You knew that when you fell in love with your wife. Now the bill for that love is coming due. You are a broken, despairing man but you are one lucky man.

Go out to a soup kitchen now and feed some food to people who are sleeping in the dust. Then your blessings will rise from the depths of your grief and lighten your life. Find another church and a community of faith, and most of all talk to the people at the suicide hotline and do what they say.

## EX-ETIQUETTE

### Boyfriend at holiday causes tension

**Q: I have been divorced three times. There were extenuating circumstances with each one, from infidelity to simply not caring for my child, but the truth remains, I have been divorced three times. My oldest daughter, who is now well into her 30s, saw it all and makes it very difficult for me to date. She dislikes everyone for some reason and with the holidays coming up, I feel like I'm juggling family members. I'm in my 60s, and I'd like to invite my "boyfriend" to Thanksgiving, but I'm sure my daughter will make a scene. What's good ex-etiquette?**

A: It's time for your daughter to grow up. I understand that kids and parents may not like each other's choices in partners, but ultimately, it's not their choice. Making it difficult to interact with a parent or child's new partner puts family members in the position of having to choose — or dread interaction. Both make the holidays unbearable.

Good ex-etiquette dictates if you want to be around a family member for Thanksgiving, but you hate his or her partner, you don't badmouth (ex-etiquette rule No. 3), you are not spiteful or hold grudges (ex-etiquette rules 5 and 6), you use empathy in your interactions (ex-etiquette rule No. 7), you are honest (Ex-etiquette rule No. 8), you respect the host or hostess (rule No. 9), and you look for the compromise (ex-etiquette rule No. 10). Nowhere does it say you should be self-righteous, resentful, rude, judgmental or give someone a hard time just because you don't approve of their presence. If you want to be around the family member, rejoice in their company. Treating their choice of partner rudely accomplishes nothing and makes what little time

you have with the beloved family member uncomfortable. The mature approach is to figure out the best way to use your time with the family member, not let your animosity for a partner choice interfere with celebration.

What if there is a legitimate reason behind the complaint? The choice of partner uses foul language or has a drinking or drug problem and acts inappropriately around the children in attendance? In that case, a heart-to-heart with the family member prior to the visit in the name of the children who will be present would be appropriate, but not because you just plain don't like their choice. "I understand you will most likely want to bring Louise, but please ask her to monitor her drinking. It makes us all very uncomfortable if she gets drunk — particularly around the kids."

Then, if the behavior continues, said partner is not respecting the host or hostess' home (ex-etiquette rule No. 9). That is a basis on which to ask the family member to leave their choice at home.

What if, as in your case, a guest (your daughter) is acting disrespectfully to another guest in your home? If this behavior is based purely on whim, not on the new partner's poor behavior, then your daughter would be the one who would be acting disrespectfully. Make your boundaries clear or the behavior will continue.

Often, when parents take a stand, the child feels as if the parent is choosing their partner over them, when that is not the case. The parent is choosing good behavior, period. And, that's good ex-etiquette.

### Control and influence are different

**Q: I have a 14-year-old son, and I think it's high time to start preparing him for the future. We want to ensure that he's on the right career path, whether that means going to college, trade school, or something else after he graduates high school. Granted, he's only a freshman, but I'm concerned that he doesn't seem to have much direction. How do I steer him toward the right career choice?**

A: Excellent question — one that brings up the ongoing struggle we parents have to reconcile the difference between control and influence.

Of course, we want our kids to succeed in everything they do, from getting good grades to finding the right life partner to landing the perfect job. When our kids are young, we're pretty much in control and we've got a huge amount of influence. As they get older, they take on more and more control over their own lives. We still have influence, but a little less every day. And by the time they're around your son's age, we have almost no control at all, and whatever influence we still have is much more powerful if we wait until we're asked to help rather than offering unsolicited advice (which a lot of teens and young adults will see as an attempt to control them anyway).

So my question to you is, "What's motivating you to worry about your son's future?" Be honest here. Most parents who plan their children's career choices mean well, but some subtly or not-so-subtly try to push the kids down paths they wish they would have taken themselves. The fact that you're open to college, trade school, or other options is a good sign that you're not trying to live your life through your son. But tread lightly when it comes to

offering opinions. The more you push, the more resentful he'll be — and the less likely he'll be to do what you think is best for him. It's his life. He'll have to live with the choices he makes. Fortunately, he's young, so if those choices don't work out, he's got plenty of time to make new ones.

Okay, here's a dirty little secret: Whether — or in which direction — you push your son, won't matter much in the long run. How many adults do you know who are working in the same job they started when they finished school? Most of us jump from job to job, career to career, endlessly searching for that perfect fit, a new challenge, or something else. Your son will most likely do the same thing; working in one career until it's no longer interesting or he can't advance any higher, then it'll be time for a change. That might sound unstable to you, but it'll help your son grow as a person, learn new skills, and keep moving forward.

Instead of trying to steer your son towards something, why not see where his own internal GPS is guiding him? What's he interested in, passionate about, good at? The old adage that if you find a job you love, you'll never have to work a day in your life, is dead right. Sure, a nice paycheck is a great thing, but if what you have to do to earn that paycheck stifles your creativity, crushes your soul, and makes you miserable, what's the point? So rather than set your son on some particular path, help him find the one he's meant to be on. Then, stand back and watch him soar.

### Why is my cat attacking my lovely smelling husband?

**Q: I read an article about cats going crazy with certain smells. My cat bites my husband after showering. We know that he smells his body wash on him because it's pretty strong, but just wondered why.**

**He uses Old Spice and Irish Spring body washes. Just curious! — Sheila Warner**

A: There are three reasons your cat might be attacking your freshly washed and perfumed husband.

The first is that your cat is psychotic, but all cats are a little bit, so I'm not even going to consider that one. The other reasons are that the cat really loves the smell or he really hates it.

Cats have extremely sensitive noses and they put them to good use. A cat with a stuffy, non-functioning nose would be a very sad cat indeed. Their sense of smell helps them to understand the world around them, from familiar and comforting smells to those that put them on high alert. Those scents help them to identify people, places, objects and even food.

Just like humans, there are certain smells they like and

those that they don't. The question is, does your cat like the smell of your husband or not.

There's no telling what a cat might find pleasant and what they don't, which is the same with humans. Your cat might really enjoy the odor of Old Spice and Irish Spring and is responding to it like catnip. He might want to run his claws through it, inhale deeply and otherwise absorb the scent. Like catnip, it might give him a sense of euphoria.

On the other paw, he might hate it. Most cats don't like citrus scents; which means you

can use them to discourage your cat from getting into certain places. Usually, a cat that doesn't like a scent stays far away from it, but your cat might really love your husband and is trying to save him from those dastardly aromas, which to the cat might be threatening.

My strong suspicion is that your cat is attracted to those aromas and gets carried away. I've had two cats that love the scent of olives. They wouldn't eat them, but they would attack my hands if I'd been cooking with them. They would start out licking and purring, but

grow to biting and scratching.

If your cat is like one in three that doesn't get a buzz from catnip, that might mean he has other scents that give him pleasure.

**Q: I watered my lawn last night and the ants, wanting rain, decided to swarm this morning.**

**We've been enjoying a fantastic avian air show as the birds snatch ants on the wing. Sorry, I'm not a birder, so I can't name all of the birds that came by but they ranged from hummingbirds and tits to jays and mockingbirds. — M. Bugge**

A: What a delight, for you and the birds. I imagine the ants would have a different perspective.

I love seeing nature at work and play. True, it's not always pretty, but it's always interesting and usually entertaining.

Birds rely on much more than our backyard feeders, and they eat a lot of insects. As for the ants, they probably came to the surface not in search of water, but to escape from it. Life can be daunting for underground insects when it rains or the soil is saturated.

### How to combat issues regarding night vision

**Q: I think I may be having more trouble adapting to the dark. It seems other people are more sure of where steps or curbs are than me. What could cause this?**

A: There are two kinds of "night vision problems" — one as you describe, and the other dealing with glare from oncoming headlights. The second form is commonly associated with early cataracts, and can be helped with "glare free" or "antireflective" lenses in your glasses.

The symptoms you describe can be indicative of early problems beginning within your retina, especially if you are over age 50. We have two kinds of vision receptors in our retina: One for bright-light,

color vision, and one for low-light, black-and-white vision.

These second kind, called "rods," appear to be first affected in early stage macular degeneration. In fact, a new technology is available now to actually measure your dark adaptation level — giving us a much earlier warning of vision damage coming. Research

shows this change in dark adaptation may precede physical damage we can see in the back of your eyes by as much as four years.

While there is no cure for macular degeneration yet, we can prescribe nutritional supplements to increase protection within your retina, and to decrease the risk of developing the "wet" or leaking/bleeding form of macular degeneration. And typically, we would also increase your retinal protection from ultraviolet radiation and blue light as well.

Lastly, we have a simple genetic risk test that will provide your risk levels over the coming ten years, and tell us which supplements should be beneficial and which may

worsen your vision.

Your eye doctor can easily determine if cataracts are developing within your eyes, and treatment discussed as needed. This new dark adaptation test, called ADx, has opened the door for better detection at a much earlier stage when macular disease is starting.

Certainly, many already know if there is age-related macular degeneration, or AMD, in their family and want to take preventive steps as soon as possible. Knowing if this growing vision disorder may be threatening your sight, and knowing what supplements can help or hurt, is critical for preserving your sight during your lifetime.

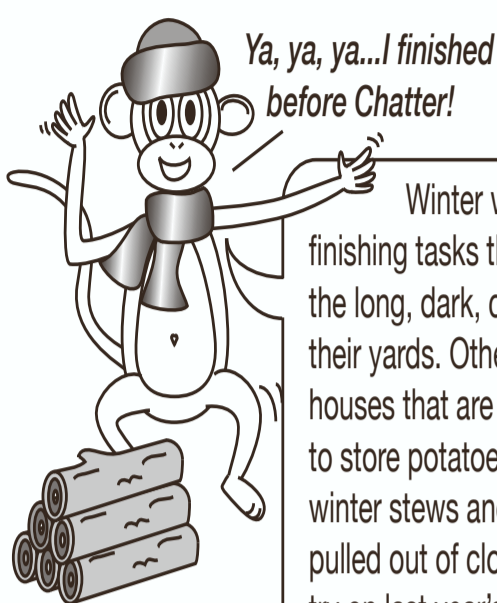

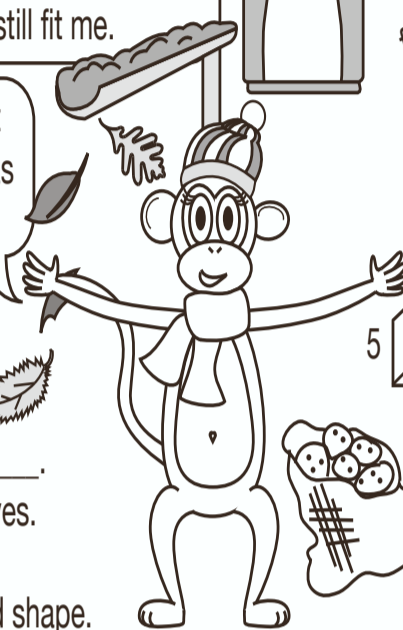

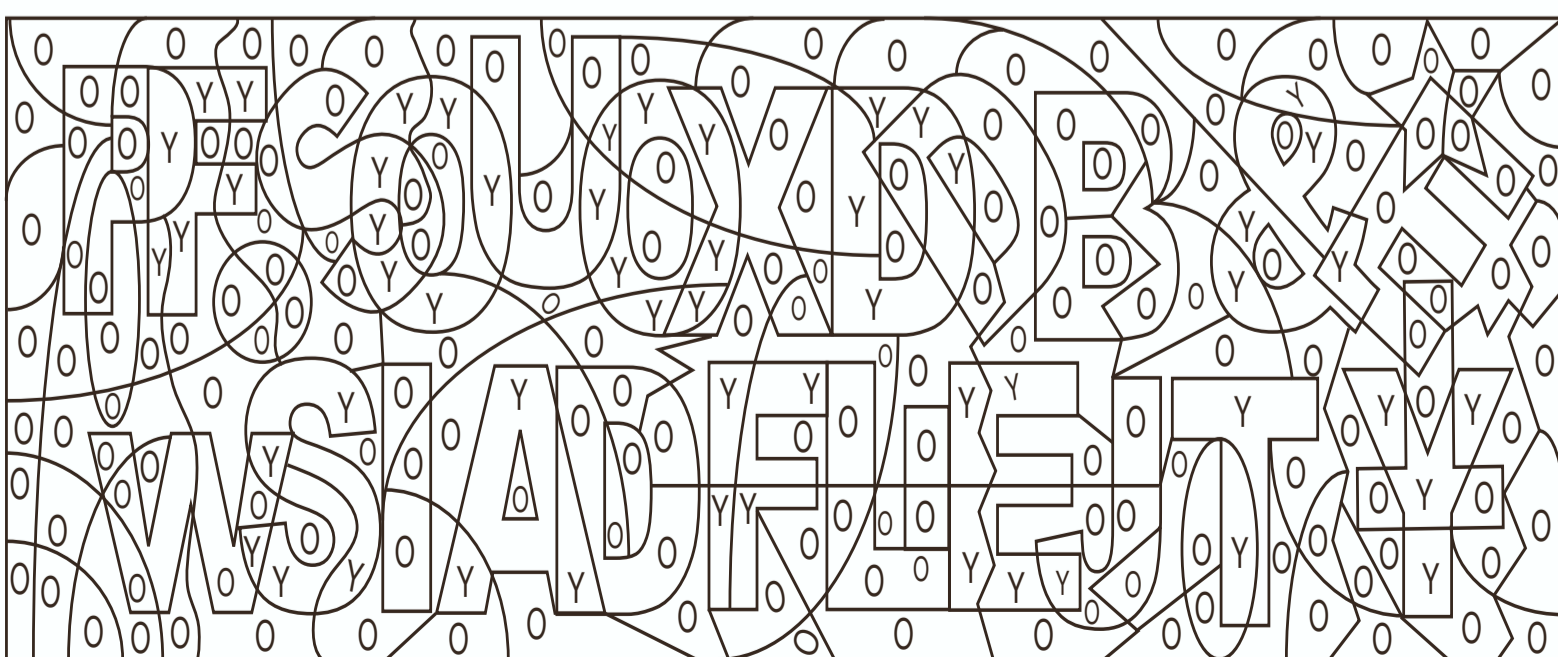
- gather acorns so they have a large amount of food stored.

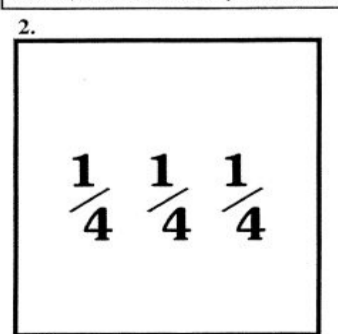
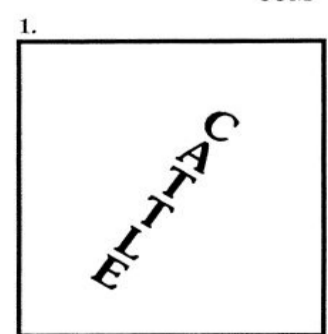

## Table's new star? The relaxed and versatile dinner bowl

Dinner menus are now crowded with mixed greens bowls, savory stews and casseroles, which can create a quandary when it's time to set the table.

Should you use regular salad plates? (A little small.) Regular dinner plates? (A little flat.) Regular soup bowls? (A little big.)

Thus was born the dinner bowl, a plate/bowl hybrid. It's generally the diameter of a standard dinner plate, but with some curved lip to contain all the delectable broths, juices or errant morsels.

New York-based Peter Kayaian, who is part of sweetgreens' culinary operations team, says more restaurants have begun using dinner bowls because of their versatility.

"Almost any type of dish can go into a shallow bowl — pasta, salad, side dish. Plates aren't

cheap, so being able to have one type of plate instead of three or four is a plus for cash-strapped restaurateurs," he says.

"It's also just the trend for plating right now. Gone are the days of the oversize white plates with a small portion in the middle. The shallow bowl allows for some creative plating, with the tall curved rim as a good medium for swooshed sauces and purees."

Craig Norton, director of operations for the Prince George Hotel in Halifax, Nova Scotia, also sees a move away from the standard white plate: "It's too formal. Bowls are more relaxed." He said pottery with earthy tones and rippled texture are more in keeping with what the dishes hold, whether that's in restaurant dining rooms, take-away spots or back at home.

"It's all about the new comfort food — a fusion of cuisines. You can layer flavors, textures, cul-

tures, leftovers and fridge contents into a culinary adventure, all in one bowl," he said.

A bonus feature of these capacious containers is that when they're not corralling rice, rigatoni or rocket, they make lovely dishes for bunches of grapes or a batch of fresh-baked cookies.

And there are lots of well-priced options.

Food 52 calls its smooth, snowy porcelain bowl "the lovechild of a plate and a bowl." West Elm's version has a slightly curvy rim, giving it an organic look. Williams-Sonoma's has a classic black trim.

World Market offers a set of four pristine white porcelain dishes, a deal at under \$20. For those ready to try some color, the retailer has a set of handmade stoneware dinner bowls in uber-trendy blush pink. Or for al fresco gatherings, perhaps the foursome of bamboo bowls, in a midcentury-modern palette of

teal, pink, cream and blush.

British designer Aaron Probyn's low-profile porcelain bowl plates come as sets of four; in six hand-glazed hues including navy and 2020's hot color, light green, at Crate & Barrel.

Another pretty color story — this one's midnight, daybreak, fog and moon — is at Year & Day; the bowls are made of hardy Portuguese clay and can handle the freezer, oven, microwave and dishwasher.

Stoneware in earthy hues with a nice speckled finish can be found at Target, from Project 62.

At Food 52, there's the Caracere collection of French porcelain plates in rustic white, turmeric or moss, created in collaboration with designer Noe Duchaufour-Lawrance. Also at this retailer, you'll find terracotta and white bowls from Fortessa, in a user-friendly melamine that looks like stoneware.

Antiques appraisers are not licensed like real estate appraisers, but there are art appreciation courses in universities, degrees in fine art and appraisal associations that require members to pass tests. Some work in an art gallery, auction company or museum and learn to appraise through experience.

A treasure can be found in a house sale, resale shop or charity auction; however, the White House had an eglomise desk that was a reproduction. The Ford museum bought a fake 1620 "Brewster" chair made deliberately to fool a museum "expert" in 1969. And sometimes a real treasure is thought to be a reproduction.

A pair of marble busts made by Jean-Antoine Houdon (1741-1828) were exhibited in Paris in 1789. They were bought in Paris in 1926 by an American diplomat, mentioned in a reference library in 1932 and passed down in the family of the American diplomat. They were "lost" until a Cottone auction in 2019. The pair sold for \$1.475 million. Where had they been?

The last record was in a 2000 house sale run by a New York auction house that had an appraiser who did not realize that they were busts by Houdon. The 11-inch-tall busts are signed and dated, 1788 and 1789. One is Jean-Jacques Rousseau, the other Georges-Louis Leclerc, Comte de Buffon. The busts must have been in the diplo-

mat's house and then a relative's for 77 years after the collector who bought them in Paris died in 1941.

**Q.** We recently had a family member pass away who was a collector of Mary Gregory. Before I give this glassware away, can you tell me if there is a demand for it. If so, about what price range collectors are paying?

**A.** Mary Gregory glass is colored glass or clear glass decorated with white figures. It wasn't made by a woman named Mary Gregory, as is sometimes believed. The first glass known as Mary Gregory was made in Bohemia about 1870. Figures were usually children at play. Similar glass is made today in the United States and other countries. Children standing, not playing, were not pictured until after the 1950s. It was thought Mary Gregory worked at the Boston and Sandwich Glass Company but that's not true. Westmoreland Glass Co. began making the first Mary Gregory-type decorations on American glassware in 1957. The pieces had simpler designs, less enamel paint and more modern shapes. Bohemia, France, Italy, Germany,

Switzerland and England also made this glassware. It is popular with collectors and sells at low prices. Pieces sell at auction and online for under \$20 to a few

hundred dollars. A blue decanter was \$12, a cranberry sugar and creamer set was \$100, and a 17 1/2-inch cranberry glass vase was \$600.

**Q.** My mother-in-law gave me a porcelain hatpin holder with eight hatpins in 1947. It's about 5 inches high and has two poppies painted on it. The

bottom is marked with a star above a wreath with the initials "RS" inside it and "Germany" below. I want to pass it on to my granddaughter. How old is it? What is the value?

**A.** Hatpin holders were made when hatpins were fashionable from about 1860 to 1920. The pins were six to 12 inches long and were used to hold a large hat on top of a woman's hair. The pin tops were made of porcelain, glass, gold, silver, rhinestones, gemstones and other materials and are collected today. Your hatpin holder was made by the Reinhold Schlegelmilch Porcelain Factory, which started in Suhl, Germany, in 1869. The company had a branch in Tillowitz and moved its operations there in 1932.

# How to avoid the pitfalls in homeowners insurance

Whether you're buying a first home or are a decades-long owner, adequately insuring your home is crucial. Yet, according to real estate data provider CoreLogic, in 2017 about one in four homes were underinsured by at least 20%.

A policy that covers less than 80% of your home's replacement value is risky. Many policies have an "insurance to value" clause that stipulates coverage must be a minimum amount; 80% is common. If you file a claim and it is determined you're underinsured by 20%, your claim could be prorated, meaning only paid in part. You don't want to have to chip in \$100,000 to rebuild your \$500,000 house.

So, consider these steps. Focus on the cost to rebuild. You probably know what your home's current value is. But when it comes

to insurance, the market value of your home isn't what matters. It's the cost to rebuild. That might be less than market value, if land values are high where you live. Or it could be more than the market value if, say, you recently plowed a lot into high-end renovations.

Replacement cost is based on current building costs in your area. (A charming older house may cost more to rebuild.) An insurance agent can provide the local cost to rebuild per square foot. If you know a good local contractor who deals with new construction, ask for estimates. If you have high-end finishes, consider increasing your square-footage cost estimate. Another option is to hire an appraiser. Or try costto-build.net and dwelling-cost.com.

Don't settle for "actual cash value" coverage. A policy spells out how the

insurer will figure out what you're entitled to in a claim. Actual cash value (ACV) coverage will disappear. It pays you based on the depreciated value of your home and possessions. So, let's say a fallen tree puts a big hole in your roof that's 20 years old. An ACV policy pays to replace a 20-year-old roof. That's a lot less than what the roofer charges for a new roof.

Replacement value is the way to go. In fact, you should consider extended replacement cost coverage, where your payout can be up to 125% of the policy's value.

Insure your possessions for replacement value, too. You don't want a check that only pays to replace a 10-year-old couch.

Policies often limit coverage for possessions at somewhere between 50% and 70% of the policy value. And there are limits on valuables. A standard policy may limit jewelry cov-

erage to \$2,000. If, after careful inventory, you decide that's not enough, consider policy tweaks to increase coverage.

Disaster prep: Do you really want to roll the dice? Damage from floods, high winds and earthquakes isn't covered by a standard policy, or may come with different terms.

For instance, in some states an insurance policy has a separate deductible for hurricane and wind/hail damage. A standard deductible is typically \$500 to \$1,000, but hurricane deductibles are typically a percentage of your policy's value, like 5%, so a \$300,000 policy could include a \$15,000 deductible for hurricane-related damage.

Earthquake deductibles can be 10% to 15%. Separate policies for these events may be required.

Flood insurance is mandatory in clearly defined flood zones, but

recent storms make clear that millions more homes are vulnerable. Yet most homeowners don't have flood coverage.

Some private insurers offer flood insurance. The more common route is to buy through the federal flood insurance program managed by FEMA. Premiums vary, but at the high end the annual cost in 2019 is less than \$500.

Consider an umbrella liability policy. A standard homeowner's policy typically provides up to \$100,000 in liability coverage if you are responsible for an accident inside or outside your home. It can also provide coverage if you are sued. You can supplement this with an umbrella policy that buys peace of mind cheaply: \$1 million of protection typically costs less than \$400 a year.

Shop around. If you own a car, check with your auto insurer. When you bundle policies you can qualify for

a premium discount of up to 20%. Do a broader search, too. Not in a DIY mood? An independent insurance agent will shop different insurers. The Independent Insurance Agents & Brokers of America has a free search tool for finding local agents. Or comparison shop at sites such as insure.com. Consumer Reports' home insurance buying guide has ratings for 15 national insurers.

Reduce your premium, not your coverage. Opting for a higher deductible — say, \$1,000 vs. \$500 — will reduce your premium. Besides, it's smart to avoid the temptation to make small claims, as sometimes insurers raise the premiums at renewal for policyholders who make small claims. Ask about other discounts, such as for installing a home security system.

## Bay Area millennial homeownership dreams shrinking

Staring down home prices that in the Bay Area and elsewhere have soared into the millions, more millennials are expecting to rent forever.

That's especially true in and around San Jose, San Francisco and Oakland.

More than 18% of millennials — currently between the ages of 23 and 38 — in the San Jose metro area are planning to always rent, according to a new report from Apartment List. In the San Francisco area, which covers Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo, and Marin counties, 17.1% expect to rent for their entire lives.

While fewer millennial renters in the country as a whole — 12.3% — are expecting to make rent payments forever, the percentage who are abandoning the long-held ideal of homeownership is growing. A year ago, just 10.7% said they would always rent.

Affordability — or the lack thereof — stands out as the biggest factor behind the numbers. Almost half of millennial renters have no down payment saved, with just 13% having more than \$10,000 put away. In the Bay Area, a

young person would need to have more than \$200,000 to put a traditional 20% down on many properties.

Delma Hernandez would love to buy a home in San Jose someday.

"That's always been my dream," the 26-year-old said.

But now, Hernandez said, "that dream doesn't seem realistic."

Hernandez, who belongs to the San Jose Renters' Rights Coalition, is especially worried that with companies like Google deciding to build large office complexes in the city, home prices will go up even more.

Millennials also point to bad credit and student loan debt as key obstacles to homeownership. In addition, the level of financial support some young people expect from their families is declining. And as a stark reminder of the power of generational wealth to shape communities, millennials who already make more than \$100,000 expect far more help than those making less money.

Hernandez has been living with her family, helping them put away money for their own down payment even as she and her partner of nine years dream of finally moving

into an apartment together. Although she opted to attend community college for two years in part to keep costs low, she estimates she has about a decade before she'll be able to pay off student loans for two years at Mills College in Oakland.

So, as the report notes, "poorer millennials who cannot afford to buy a home today may have more trouble building wealth in the long run, may be incapable of providing financial assistance to their children, and so forth."

According to Apartment List's estimate, just a quarter of millennial renters will be able to afford a 10% down payment on a median-priced home in the next five years. Only 13% will be able to afford to put 20% down. If student debt obligations were erased — as some Democratic presidential candidates have proposed — that figure would rise to 38% and north of 50% in metro areas like Minneapolis and Houston, where the job market is good but housing remains relatively affordable.

In San Francisco, just 21% of millennials are expected to be able to put 10% down on a median-priced starter home in the

area within the next five years. The same is true in Los Angeles, with the figure climbing to just 24% in San Diego. According to recent data from real estate data firms CoreLogic and DQNews, the median home price in San Francisco is \$1.48 million.

Among millennial renters who anticipate buying a home eventually, 33% say they are not ready to settle down yet. Some 70% say they cannot afford to buy now. And among those who do not anticipate ever buying, 40% say they prefer the flexibility of renting. Most point to finances. In other words, as the report points out, "More millennials still rent because they have to rather than because they want to."

Ultimately, opportunities for millennials to become homeowners have not increased in the last year, even as older generations are increasingly picking up property after a decade of declining homeownership rates. And in the Bay Area especially, where millennials do still dream of homeownership, they don't see it happening locally.

"It'll just be certain people who will be able to stay here in San Jose with a certain income," Hernandez said. "I see a culture shift happening."

## Real estate Q&A: Why can't we leave a work truck overnight in our driveway?

**Q: We recently received a fine for parking my spouse's work truck on our driveway overnight. The pickup is in great shape and is not an eyesore. It is our house; why can't we park on our own driveway? — Jennifer**

A: As a homeowner, you have to follow many levels of rules in how you maintain and use your property.

The rules range from the federal government down to your community association, with every level in between seemingly having their say.

The purpose of these rules so to maintain the residential character of your community. Different areas have been designated, or zoned, for specific uses. This way, industrial parks are not mixed in with homes.

Work vehicles are often a cause of concern. Many people who work with their trucks need to park them at home, while their neighbors do not want large,

dirty or damaged vehicles ruining the residential feel of their community. These restrictions do not apply to commercial vehicles used by tradespeople while they are performing their job, only to parking overnight.

In most areas, you are allowed to keep one work vehicle at your house as long as it is out of sight, such as in a garage or around the side of your house.

However, many community associations have even more stringent rules, often banning all commercial vehicles from the community outside of set hours.

While it can be frustrating, these rules are unlikely to change because the vast majority of people who do not own a commercial vehicle do not want them in their neighborhood.

Your best bet is to keep your pickup truck in a garage. If this is not possible, you can find vehicle storage and commercial parking lots near most communities with a quick internet search.

## U.S. home sales rose 1.9% last month, lifted by lower rates

WASHINGTON — Americans took advantage of lower mortgage rates and purchased more homes in October, though sales were held back by a shortage of available properties.

The National Association of Realtors said Thursday that sales of existing homes rose 1.9% last month to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 5.46 million. That's 4.6% higher than a year ago, suggesting that lower borrowing costs are bolstering the housing market.

Still, the data shows a mixed picture. Housing, including home construction, has picked up this year and fueled economic growth in the July-September quarter for the first time in nearly two years. Economists expect it will boost growth in the current quarter as well.

At the same time, sales have been constrained by a decline in the number of homes for sale.

With the unemployment rate near a 50-year low and wages rising modestly, plenty of Americans are looking to buy. That is pushing up prices. Sales remain below the level reached in 2017 of 5.5 million.

Homes are particularly scarce at lower price points, with sales in the past year falling 11% among houses priced below \$100,000, which consists mostly of condos. Sales also slipped in

the \$100,000 to \$250,000 price range. They rose in the \$250,000 to \$1 million range, and fell among homes priced above \$1 million.

Odetta Kushi, deputy chief economist at First American Financial, a title insurance company, said those figures indicate that most home sales are occurring among higher-income earners who already own homes and are trading up.

"That leaves the first-time home buyers out of the mix," she said. NAR's data showed that in October, first-time buyers made up just 31% of sales, below longer-run averages.

But increased home construction should boost overall inventory and provide more options for younger buyers, Kushi said. That should support sales in the coming months.

Home construction jumped 3.8% in October and builders also secured more permits for single-family home and apartment construction, a positive sign for future building.

The number of homes on the market fell 2.7% in October from the previous month, leaving just 1.77 million available houses. That's the fewest since March and would last just 3.9 months at the current pace of sales. A healthy level of inventory is typically at about six months.

## Does it make sense to pay off your mortgage early?

When you own a home, the thought of a mortgage hanging over your head for decades can be daunting for many people — and it's natural to want to pay off your mortgage as soon as possible.

But before you decide to use an inheritance, raise or your savings to pay off your mortgage, (or even before you decide to make extra payments), it's important to take a step back and determine whether it really makes financial sense for you.

In some cases, the amount you save on interest when you pay off your mortgage early might not exceed what you would earn if you put the money to work elsewhere. On the other hand, sometimes it's not about the return on other investments and more about peace of mind or freeing up cash flow for other opportunities.

Here's what you need to know as you decide whether to pay off your mortgage early.

### Will other investments beat paying off a mortgage early?

The biggest consideration is whether to pay off your mortgage or invest. What if, instead of putting money into getting rid of the mortgage early, you invested the cash elsewhere?

"Sadly, the math tells us, it's almost always better to invest in other places than in your mortgage," says Richard Bowen, CPA and owner of Bowen Account-

ing in Bakersfield, California. Many mortgages today have rates of 3.5 percent to 5.5 percent, so if paying off your mortgage early leads to a return equal to your interest rate, that return is somewhat lackluster. Compare that to the annualized return for the S&P 500 — roughly 10 percent over the last 90 years.

Additionally, Bowen points out, you could take the cash you'd use to pay off your mortgage early and leverage it into buying a cash-flow-positive property like multi-family real estate or single-family homes that have the potential to offer higher long-term returns.

"The thing is, no one can give you a guarantee on an investment," Bowen cautions. "You can put your money in the stock market and lose it. You can put your money in real estate and it doesn't perform as well as you expected it to."

Any choice is a risk, however. Even after paying off your mortgage early, real estate prices could plunge, leaving you with a potential loss. Carefully consider which risks you're willing to take. You might be better off not paying your mortgage off early.

### Will all your cash be tied up in the mortgage?

Before taking a large chunk of your wealth and using it to pay off your mortgage early, don't forget to look at liquidity. Your home is considered a non-liquid asset because it can take months — or longer — to sell the

property and access the capital. "If you start paying down your mortgage too fast, you risk depleting your liquidity," says Amanda Thomas, a client advisor at Mission Wealth. "The kind of liquidity you have is important, too. You don't want too much cash tied up in retirement funds because you can get slammed with fees if you have to withdraw early."

One approach is to have an emergency fund, as well as assets, like stocks, mutual funds, U.S. Treasuries, bonds and marketable securities available in a taxable investment account. That way, in addition to having money tied up in tax-advantaged retirement accounts and your home, you still have some liquid cash or other investments that are easy to convert to cash in a pinch.

Bowen suggests maintaining a cushion that protects you for at least six months before you consider using a large chunk of your liquidity to retire your mortgage early.

### How will you use the money if you don't pay off your mortgage early?

Next, be realistic about what you're likely to do with that money if you don't use it to pay off your mortgage early. If you don't put that money toward making extra mortgage payments, will you actually use it to get ahead?

Bowen points out that it might make sense to put the money into paying off the mortgage early if you struggle with keeping money in the bank.

## Such Sweet Sorrow

### Volkswagen Beetle Gets Special Sendoff As It Departs

Although I was born in 1980, a full 42 years after the first Volkswagen rolled off the assembly line in Nazi Germany, I can't help but feel a twinge of nostalgia as I write this.

It's the end of the line for the Volkswagen Beetle.

After more than 80 years of production, one of the world's most distinctive and memorable cars is about to disappear.

Like many contemporary small cars, the compact, two-door Beetle is falling victim to changing times. Spacious, family-friendly SUVs and crossovers are in style, and fun-to-drive compact cars are out, including adorably quirky ones like this.

The fact that the Beetle lasted this long is remarkable. The original Type 1 Beetle — the one kids call a "slug bug" when it drives by with its buzzy, air-cooled engine perched over the rear axle — resulted in 21 million sales before it finally ceased production in 2003.

The replacement New Beetle, with its more conventional water-cooled, front-engine layout and familiar bubble shape, had a remarkably good two-decade run of its own starting in 1999.

All good things must end, though, which is how I find

myself behind the wheel of a Beetle called the Final Edition.

For a car with a long history of fun and goofy special editions, from the striped GSR to the more recent version with pink paint and a hashtag for its name — #pinkbeetle — Volkswagen easily could have done something outlandish for this car's last hurrah.

Instead, the changes are minimal and tasteful.

There's a script "Beetle" badge where the "Turbo" normally goes on the

go-fast models, plus 18-inch wheels and a nice level of standard equipment, including a punchy Fender-branded sound system.

The real selling point, though, is something a badge can't convey: a sense of nostalgia for millions of people who have memories of VW bugs.

I loaded a hippie-tinged playlist while putting the top down on my convertible tester, remembering all the times a Beetle has played a role in my life.

I remembered driving

several New Beetle testers through the years, each one putting a smile on my face as those same '60s tunes blared on the sound system.

I remembered teaching my teenage girl to drive a manual transmission in a Beetle.

I remembered the time my friend David was driving in front of me in his old, beloved, rust-red Beetle and swerved to miss a dog in the road, then rolled the car into a ditch right in front of me in the late 1990s. He climbed out of the wreckage

and yelled, "My MiniDisc player didn't skip!"

While my entire life represents just a sliver of this car's long history, I still have enough emotional baggage around it to feel slightly teary-eyed while driving the Final Edition.

Yes, the reasons its sales have tapered off are all obvious. The cabin feels a bit cheap and dated. The back seat can seem small and annoying to access. Its powertrain isn't as miserly as hybrids or forward-looking as electric cars.

## The proper way to jump a car; does brake fluid really need flushed so often?

**Q: I appreciated your caution on connecting the negative to a grounding point when using jumper cables. A self-proclaimed family "expert" stated it is safe to connect it to the battery as long as you do the negative first. Can you comment on this theory please? Would that be safe, or not?**

— A.K., Chicago

**A:** Often, self-proclaimed experts have been awarded the title by dummies. Here is the proper way to do a jumpstart:

1. Connect the positive (red) cable to the donor car.
2. Connect the positive (red) cable to the recipient car.

3. Connect the negative (black) cable to the recipient car away from the battery.

4. Connect the negative (black) cable to the donor car away from the battery.

Connecting both clamps to the battery risks a spark and explosion from any hydrogen gas coming from the battery. That's not safe.

**Q: A few decades ago, maybe less, you would hear of people dying of carbon monoxide inhalation as a result of sitting in closed cars in winter with the engine running. Is this still a problem? What about sitting in closed cars with the A/C running?**

— N.T., Walnutport, Pa.

**A:** Sitting inside the car while the engine is running is not

unsafe. But sitting in an enclosed area like a garage is dangerous. With the advent of push button start/stop making key removal unnecessary, forgetful drivers are leaving their cars running. Since most cars are also very quiet, that clue is also fading away. We have CO detectors in our house. You should, too.

**Q: During my last oil change at the dealer the service rep said I needed to have my brake fluid flushed on my 2013 Camry. They claim this is required every 30,000 miles to avoid rust in the line. I never heard of this on any car I've owned, and I am 76 years old. Is this legit or another way to nickel-and-dime me? Cost is over \$125 each time.**

— B.S., Ingleside, Ill.

**A:** Although changing the brake fluid periodically is a fine prophylactic measure, it is not mandated by most carmakers — especially every 30,000 miles. There are test strips available to test for residual copper in the brake fluid which would indicate that it is time to change.

**Q: My car's check engine light came on with a code P2097 diagnosis. The code was cleared but it was suggested that I may be a "digital driver" and that there is no fix for this concern. After being told what a "digital driver" was, there is in no way, shape or form, am I that type of driver. A week later and the same scenario again. They clear the code and tell me**

**to keep bringing it in whenever it comes back on. My question is, what do you think of this "digital driver" nonsense?**

— B.N., Chicago

**A:** According to the Urban Dictionary, "A car driver who resists the analog world, proving a curve is a sequence of straight lines, and that incessant acceleration mixed with braking approximates a smooth highway speed. Most often found by locating the guy with car-sick passengers. 'That drive back from the bar with Leo nearly made me hurl — he's such a digital driver! Nearly killed the hula girl on the dash.'" Basically, it is somebody who is constantly tapping the gas and brake. I know such a person.

## Don't undersell self during work review

**Q: It is annual review time, and I am overdue for a promotion. As I do my self-assessment, I wonder about the best way to position my value while I write up my submission. I don't like to look braggish so am worried that I undersell myself.**

— Kim, 39, finance analyst

A: Start with a list of contributions you have made over the past year. This may not be as easy as it sounds. For one thing, memories fade, and for another, it sounds like you may tend to underestimate the value you bring.

To get a jump-start, try working backward through your most recent projects. Make a much longer list than you'll actually share, just to build momentum. Refer to your calendar, looking at meetings you had and people you engaged with.

Then enrich the story of what happened in each situation.

You might start with a simple statement: I completed Analysis X. Go on to explain why this mattered. How did it help someone?

Keep the business perspective front and center. Be sure you know your company's goals so that you can make statements like, "By completing Analysis X, I enabled the team to reach its goal on one of our company's key revenue objectives."

Your statements about your value should lead the reader to conclude that you already are performing at a higher level.

When you write up your self-review, you can use the business perspective and the future-looking perspective to frame your input.

Bring in the voice of your customer. Do you have quotes you could take from thank-you e-mails or other feedback from internal or external clients? Use them sparingly, perhaps only alluding to the direct positive feedback you have received, but be ready to share them in more detail.

Use strong, direct language. Avoid passive phrasing, and employ action verbs that communicate your integral role.

Get feedback on your draft from someone who understands your work. In particular, ask them to point out gaps and push you to courageously own the value you bring.

Once your content is complete, get a good polish on it. If you are given a format, make sure that everything is perfect — no typos or format inconsistencies. This may sound trivial but it sends a message.

If you can create your own format, adopt a layout that you think best represents the value you bring. In fact, you may want to create a one-page "Kim's contributions" document to bring to your actual review.

Prepare for the review itself. Write talking points that provide a brief summary of your year and practice them out loud. This will help you be more fluent when the time comes without being overly rehearsed.

Finally, own it. Remind yourself throughout this process that you are a valuable employee and that you bring your best to your job.

## U.S. economy has the jobs, but not the workers

A long time ago, in a land far, far away, there were forecasts that the economy could grow at a sustained 3% rate. That time, unfortunately, was as recent as a year ago and the land was the United States.

Even though the economy did post several quarters of 3% growth between mid-2017 and mid-2018, it has slowed since and that strong pace now looks like a pipe dream.

Can we get back there? It is hard to see how.

The economy, like any business, can expand in basically two ways. The first is by the use of additional workers to increase output. That can be viewed as the "brute force approach" to growth. Firms bring on more employees and they produce more.

The second way is for workers to become more efficient. Economists call that productivity, which is the amount of output each employee creates. If firms can find ways to get workers to produce more, then they become more efficient.

Consequently, the ability of an economy to grow over time is limited by the ability to hire more workers and/or by the rate of productivity gains. The overall growth rate is

determined by how much each expands.

So, how fast will we grow?

Let's start with the labor side. Currently, the supply of available labor is extremely limited. Indeed, the unemployment rate is the lowest it has been in 66 years. That is really saying something.

But with so few people out of work, it keeps getting harder for firms to find suitable employees. Job gains, while still decent, have been trending downward, in no small part because the number of job openings exceeds the number of people unemployed. The workers are just not there.

So, how do you get more workers? The most obvious way is for people who have been out of the workforce to come back in. Yet despite the huge number of available positions, the labor force participation rate has risen only modestly over the last four years.

The problem is there is a tug-of-war occurring. While younger and discouraged workers are entering the labor market, baby boomers are bailing out. The changing demographics make it hard to grow the labor supply.

What about bringing back in all those so-called discouraged workers, people who have given up

hope finding jobs? Well, that pool is shrinking rapidly. The numbers are down 11% in the last year and nearly 28% in five years.

There are other ways to expand the army of potential workers. Immigration is one, but that is limited right now. Another is to relax drug and background checks, but doing that could create issues for employers.

The economy is largely in a trap: It has the jobs but not the workers to fill them.

Which brings us to the productivity side. To increase efficiency, firms need to pair workers with improving technology. And that is where investment comes in.

One of the strongest arguments for the tax bill was that by reducing the cost of capital spending, firms would increase investment. And that would, hopefully, create a surge in productivity and growth.

So, how did that work out? Not particularly well.

Yes, private nonresidential investment soared in the six months after the tax bill was passed. But then, capital spending on structures, machinery and equipment started to fade. Only purchases of software continued to expand at a robust pace.

Unfortunately, that short spurt in spending on new, more efficient capital has had a downside. With labor limited, only productivity gains could support strong growth. And while output per worker increased temporarily, the recent data are distressing.

Productivity actually declined in the third quarter of 2019, the largest drop in almost four years. Over the past three years, there were only three quarters of solid gains. The annual increases for the past two years are running at about the same pace as they did in the decade before the tax cuts were passed.

So, let's summarize: The economy expands by increasing the use of labor and through gains in efficiency. Worker shortages and changing demographics are limiting the availability of labor and, despite massive tax incentives, capital spending has slumped, restraining productivity growth.

For the economy, it is "back to the future." The outlook is for moderate, or more likely sluggish, growth. So, if you enjoyed the conditions in the seven years after the Great Recession ended, you will love what is coming. If you thought that activity was substandard, you could be in for another extended period of disappointing growth.

We've got about \$70,000 in student loan debt, and we're trying to get everything paid off. Both our cell phones are pretty old, and I'd like to get a new one that costs \$350 so we can have really good pictures of the baby. My job is the only income we have right now, and I'm making \$45,000 before taxes. Is this a silly thing to do in our situation?

Dear Jamie,  
This is an important question. It's not important because \$350 is a big deal in the grand scheme of things, it's important because you're making a judgment call as to what you're focusing on and what you value.

If you're focusing on your husband finishing school, so his income goes up and you're trying to get out of debt, that's fine. I love it when people are willing to work their tails off to have better lives. But if that's your focus, and at the same time you're trying to rationalize buying something you don't really need, that's a bad thing. You don't need a new cell phone for a camera, especially if the camera is the only reason you're buying it. You can find decent digital cameras everywhere these days for \$50 or less.

I understand the joy that goes along with having a child. I have three kids, and we were absolutely ecstatic each and every time one was born. And, of course, we wanted good photos of them all. But right now, I think you're trying to rationalize a phone upgrade based on the emotion of your value system, that's a tendency you need to break. This is a test, Jamie. What you're talking about here is a luxury, not a necessity. Rationalization is one of the prime causes of overspending.

Please understand, I'm not picking on you and I don't mean to be harsh. We've all flunked this test at times. But this is an important moment where your judgment and values are concerned. It's your call, but you really don't need to blow \$350 on a new phone right now.

## Building owners sue Chicago over fair workweek law

CHICAGO — A group representing Chicago building owners and managers is suing the city over legislation designed to give workers more predictable schedules, claiming the law gives unions too much bargaining power.

The Building Owners and Managers Association, which represents 239 Chicago commercial office, institutional and public buildings plus 169 companies that provide building services, filed the lawsuit Friday in Chicago federal court, alleging the city's fair workweek ordinance violates federal collective bargaining rules.

The ordinance, approved by the City Council this summer and set to take effect next July, requires certain employers to give their workers at least 10 days' notice of their schedules — eventually it will rise to 14 days — and compensate them for last-minute changes. It is meant

to protect employees against unpredictable work hours that make it difficult for them to plan for child care, go to school, work a second job or have confidence that their paychecks will cover their bills.

Employers and unions must waive the fair workweek protections in any new collective bargaining agreements, or the protections will apply. In its lawsuit, the trade group alleges that provision violates the National Labor Relations Act by giving unions an extra bargaining chip.

The suit also claims violations of federal and state equal protection laws because Chicago's ordinance applies only to certain employers and industries. Building services, health care, hotels, manufacturing, restaurants, retail and warehouses services must abide by it, but not "construction, banking, finance, telecommunications, professional services, government, education, insurance, printing,

and publishing, to name a few," the suit says.

The association represents building management in labor negotiations with unions representing janitorial, engineering and security service workers. Its member buildings employ some 5,000 union workers.

"We didn't initially set out to file a lawsuit," the group said in a statement. "BOMA/Chicago voiced multiple objections to the ordinance on behalf of our members and even offered language during the legislative process. It became clear City Council was selectively targeting only certain industries with a standard that clearly favors one party over the other."

The trade group says the law should not apply to employees whose work under collective bargaining agreements.

The office of Mayor Lori Lightfoot, in a statement, stood behind the ordinance, which was first introduced when Rahm

Emanuel was mayor.

"Under the leadership of Mayor Lightfoot, Chicago has passed some of the most expansive scheduling legislation in the nation to help improve working conditions for tens of thousands of hard-working Chicagoans," spokeswoman Lauren Huffman said in a statement. "While we can't comment on pending litigation, the administration is committed to ensuring a successful implementation of the Fair Workweek legislation next year as part of our commitment to better supporting working families across the city."

Chicago is among a growing group of cities to adopt fair workweek ordinances and is not the first to have it challenged in court. New York City, whose law requires employers to finalize work schedules at least three weeks in advance for fast food restaurants and three days in advance for retailers, was sued last year.

# Parents created businesses so their adult children with disabilities could have jobs

The families of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities have been at the forefront of every movement to advance their loved ones' rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

They've fought for help to care for them outside of institutional settings. They've demanded that they receive an appropriate public education. And they've pushed for jobs that both accommodate neurodiversity and tap into its gifts.

Frustrated by how elusive employment remains (there's an 85% unemployment rate among adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities), some parents declare,

"We're not waiting any more." And they launch businesses so their children will know the dignity, stability, and pride that comes with having a job.

Here are three family-founded companies that give neurodivergent people a chance to participate in the American workforce.

## Baker Industries

In 1980, Charles and Louise "Weezie" Baker opened a small direct-mail business in their garage that would provide jobs for their son, Justin, and other adults with disabilities.

Today, about 200 people a year are employed at Baker Industries, a nonprofit workforce-development program with locations in Malvern and Kensington.

They perform light industrial work: packaging, assembling, kitting, shrink-wrapping, and mailing for over 80 companies across the Philadelphia region.

In addition, employees can participate in workshops, coaching, and training designed to help them achieve career potential. Each year, 25 to 35 employees move on from Baker to other jobs in the mainstream economy.

"Our program makes a real difference in reducing poverty and strengthening families and communities," said Baker's president, Rich Bevan, noting that over 80% of Baker's workers are low-income.

Jimmy Paulits, 28, lives in Berwyn with his father and has been working for two years at Baker, where he's fascinated by the equipment.

"My job is great, and my favorite thing here involves using the shrink-wrapper and the conveyor," said Paulits. Prior to this job, he worked for Handi Crafters in Thorndale, a "sheltered workshop" that serves a wide range of adults with disabilities and offers clinical support on-site. But Paulits wanted to work in a standard production environment, he said.

Baker provides full- and part-time work at the federal minimum wage. In recent years, the company has begun offering workforce integration for other hard-to-employ adults,

like those with criminal convictions or substance-use disorders. Employees do not need federal funding to be eligible to work at Baker.

"Combining these diverse populations into one effective team demonstrates for employers the flexibility and adaptability of individuals to successfully integrate into a regular work community," said Bevan.

A good job is foundational to reducing recidivism, he added, creating financial stability, promoting recovery, and providing acceptance and community for vulnerable adults.

"We also find that putting together adults with cognitive and learning disabilities with parolees and recovering addicts leads to some incredible mentoring," Bevan said. "They learn empathy for each other along with learning how to work in a mainstream environment."

## Classic Rock Auto Detail

Classic Rock opened in June in Richboro, the brainchild of Brian Damiani and Michael Fitzgerald, who both have sons with autism (Cole Damiani is 31, and Shawn Fitzgerald is 22). The young men needed work after aging out of high school programs that had supported them.

"We hire only special-needs adults, then we train them in auto detailing and handwashing, waxing — the works," said Damiani, who befriended Fitzgerald when they were running

baseball and hockey leagues for their kids.

Although the Fair Labor Standards Act allows employers to pay less than minimum wage to certain workers with disabilities, the special-needs employees of Classic Rock Auto Detail earn the full federal minimum wage, Damiani said.

Since June, employees have worked on more than 110 cars at Classic Rock (where prices range from \$20-\$25 for hand-wash service, more for inside-outside detailing). The company's slogan — "Attention to detail that could make a grown man cry" — is an homage to the Rolling Stones hit "Start Me Up," which popularized a version of the phrase.

The song is a classic, and this shop aims to be one, too.

## Crafters for Life

Mike and Terri Grant created Crafters For Life LLC in May 2015 to create and sell products produced by neurodivergent employees, who also help handle branding, marketing, e-commerce, retail sales, and sourcing of materials. The company offers its merchandise online and at retailers such as Monkeys Uncle at 21 E. State St., Doylestown. It has also partnered with existing nonprofits that run adult day programs to incorporate the company's crafts program.

"We started the company for our son, Dylan, who has autism, after real-

izing that job opportunities for him would be scarce," said Mike Grant. "Our goal was to generate a paying job for him and others with special needs, doing something that's real."

The concept sprang out of Dylan's autistic support class at Council Rock School District in Bucks County. In 2014, speech language pathologist Joanne Curry and autistic-support teacher Cemantha Giulian oversaw a project in which students made their own crafts and sold them. The project was such a success that the Grants spun it into Crafters For Life.

"We still work closely with those teachers and have provided inventory for a number of holiday sales in the area," Grant said.

Adult workers at Crafters For Life are paid an hourly wage to make items like coasters, key chains, scarves, paintings, and eye pillows. The company also fills orders for weddings, birthdays, and corporate events.

Crafters for Life accepts financial donations, said Grant, but "quite frankly we would prefer that you purchase products from our online store and help us to spread the word."

Nonetheless, he added, donors can be assured that donations fund supplies, infrastructure costs, marketing and "everything we need to build Crafters For Life to generate jobs upon graduation," he said. "Lots and lots of jobs."

# Scholarships target doctors in Arizona underserved areas

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — University of Arizona's medical school announced Friday that it will give free tuition to some students who commit to working as primary care doctors in underserved areas, an effort to improve access to health care in areas where it's most lacking.

Nearly 100 students will get scholarships on campuses in Phoenix and Tucson, the UA Colleges of Medicine said. For each year of tuition waived, they'll have to commit to working in an underserved area after their residency for one year.

The scholarships are funded with part of an \$8

million state funding plan approved earlier this year. The rest of that money will allow growth from 80 to 100 medical students at UA's Phoenix campus.

State and federal governments have looked to a wide variety of grants, scholarships, loan forgiveness and other initiatives to seek out doctors willing to work in underserved areas and support them financially. An aging population and projected physician retirements have fueled concerns that the U.S. will face a growing shortage of providers — a problem felt hardest in lower-income areas.

Physician groups say high debt burdens discourage new doctors from work-

ing in primary care in rural or urban underserved areas, which tend to come with lower salaries than jobs in specialties or wealthy areas. Debt concerns discourage some would-be doctors from even applying to medical school, Dr. Michael Dake, senior vice president of UA Health Sciences, said in a news release.

The scholarships will be available only to UA students who qualify as Arizona residents. Eligible post-residency specializations include family medicine, general internal medicine, geriatrics, pediatrics, psychiatry, and obstetrics and gynecology. Eligible underserved areas are designated by the fed-

eral government based on having too few doctors, high infant mortality rates, high poverty or a large elderly population.

UA medical school tuition for Arizona residents is about \$33,000 per year. Medical school is four years.

Arizona's physician training capacity has grown in recent years with the opening of the UA's Phoenix campus and schools run by the Mayo Clinic in Scottsdale, A.T. Still University in Mesa and Midwestern University in Glendale. Nebraska-based Creighton University is building a health sciences campus that will include a medical school in midtown Phoenix.

# Isolated Iceland newly vulnerable to computer scams

REYKJAVIK, Iceland (AP) — "Hi, I hope you are not busy?"

The treasurer of the Icelandic soccer club Afturelding got the email from his manager late in the afternoon, soon before banks were about to close. The words "Sent from my iPhone" were at the bottom, suggesting urgency, and through a series of exchanges, the manager asked that a quick payment be made.

It was a scam, perpetrated from someone posing as the club manager - and part of a sudden rush of online fraud that is catching Icelanders unprepared.

Online apps have now become good at translating the country's complex language, a version of Old Norse spoken only by about 400,000 people. And the government has lifted limits on money transfers out of the country that had been imposed since the financial crisis. The combination over the past two years has attracted scammers to target a population that has not developed the same habits of caution about online fraud as other such wealthy, high-tech countries.

"The trick is always the same, but the Icelandic gets better and better," said Audur Thorsteinsdóttir, manager of The Icelandic Youth Association, an umbrella organization regularly warning member clubs against fraud emails.

Large and small enterprises, from vehicle inspection companies to residents' associations, have been shaken this year by someone posing as the CEO or chairman seeking a swift payment. By using Google

Translate or Microsoft's Translator - the two apps that can translate Icelandic - the criminals were able to sound credible, police say.

Known as "CEO fraud" - when criminals pose as high-ranking executives after thoroughly researching the company structure - the scams did not exist at Icelandic workplaces in the early days of online translators. Software offered poor, often comically inaccurate, results: Icelandic for "youth" for example, was translated as meaning "Youtube." The apps have since improved.

"The text has the kind of errors Google Translate makes," such as awkward capitalization and syntax, said police detective Dadi Gunnarsson. "But it reads remarkably well, and that fools many."

Recent scams have amounted to the largest thefts the island nation has ever seen. Geothermal energy company HS Orka recently lost \$1.5 million and a total of \$13 million has been lost to foreign scammers over the past twelve months, the police estimate.

In another case, a series of promoted ads on social media promised to explain how to bounce back from bankruptcy. The link brought users to a website mimicking a respected business paper, with its trademark pink background. It was a bitcoin scheme meant to defraud.

Icelandic was introduced to Google Translate in 2009, earlier than many other more widely spoken languages as a Reykjavik-born employee at the tech company wanted his mother tongue included as soon as possible. Dozens of

students and faculty at Reykjavik University volunteered to help Google gather samples for voice recognition.

Still, the translations were incomplete and spotty for many years.

"The learning curve has been steep for Iceland," said Morten Tandle, director of the Nordic Financial Cert, a Norway-based organization coordinating cyber security responses between large companies in the region.

Experts say that as artificial intelligence improved, translation apps only really became good enough at Icelandic around 2018.

That was just months after the government removed limits on the amount of money that could be transferred out of the country that had been imposed since the financial crisis over a decade ago.

It was like foreign scammers had been waiting for the day, police said.

Cases of online fraud began piling up, with the number this year about six times higher than the year before, according to Landsbankinn, a large commercial bank. Victims rarely get their money back.

In most countries, Tandle said, people learn to be cautious online because someone around them has been scammed or hurt by messages with malicious software. The country's isolation from such trends until recently made its sudden exposure all the more painful.

The rule of thumb, experts advise, is to always respond to financial inquiries through a different medium, like replying to

an email with a phone call.

Icelanders pride themselves on their sense of community and have one of the highest levels of "social trust" in surveys measuring people's belief in each other and in honesty and integrity.

"Social trust is the desired quality of every society," said Gunnar Helgi Kristinnsson, a politics professor at the University of Iceland. "It makes the economy more dynamic, democracy stronger and people happier and healthier - in academic literature nothing bad is ever associated with healthy trust."

Yet police and cybersecurity experts note that online scammers successfully exploit it and are urging more caution.

"Digitalization of finance and public service needs to be followed by more awareness," said Jarno Linnell, a professor in cybersecurity at the Aalto University in Finland. "We should approach the internet like driving: Always on the alert."

Kristján Ásgeirsson, a fishing industry entrepreneur known as Fiskikóngurinn, "the King of Fish," made a splash in local media recently speaking about the shame and distrust he felt after falling for a scam.

Ásgeirsson received an email from what appeared to be a trusted American business associate asking for the next invoice to be paid to a separate account for tax purposes. Someone had hacked Ásgeirsson's inbox and was posing as his contact under a false email address. He lost \$68,000 and only discovered the scam weeks later.

## Family ties: 'The Conners' shines despite the loss of its matriarch

It's impressive that "The Conners" even exists. Its road has been long, starting with the original "Roseanne" premiere in 1988 — that series ran for nine well-rated seasons and is now considered one of the most popular sitcoms of all time. Next came the 2018 revival, which shocked and excited fans, and did quite well itself. Add that revival's sudden cancellation and yet another revival/spinoff, and it's all enough to give longtime fans of the Conner family whiplash.

More than a year after a racist tweet triggered the firing of the original show's star and namesake, Roseanne Barr, the latest iteration of the show, "The Conners," is well into its second season on ABC, and it's achieving both critical and ratings success. These would be gold-star results for any show on the

air, but given the history and circumstances of this particular series, these achievements come as a pleasant surprise for both reviewers and audiences. You can watch a new episode of "The Conners" on Tuesday, Nov. 26, on ABC.

One of America's favorite families is carrying on without its matriarch, and viewers are all in. It seemed impossible to do, but "The Conners" has continued to deliver the familiar highs and lows of blue-collar family life, and is doing so just as well as it did before Barr's departure. Its success is due to a combination of factors: top-notch writing, the familiar, talented cast, fan loyalty and even the current political climate. But overall, it's the ability of "The Conners" to deliver touching, relatable episodes that don't shy away from the difficult moments in life that make it so irresistible.

Grief has been one of the most prevalent themes in the first and second seasons of the series — understand-

able considering the show starts off with the family getting the news of Roseanne's death, followed by the shocking revelation that she died of an opioid overdose. She'd been scoring pills from multiple sources and hiding her addiction from her family — certainly a timely storyline considering the opioid crisis that continues to plague our society. Roseanne's sister, Jackie (Laurie Metcalf, "Lady Bird," 2018), her husband, Dan (John Goodman, "The Righteous Gemstones"), and their children, Darlene (Sara Gilbert, "The Talk"), Becky (Lecy Goranson, "Buck Run," 2019) and D.J. (Michael Fishman, "Undrafted," 2016), pull together to help one another get through the tragedy, which has a lasting effect on each of their lives.

But life is not slowed by death, and the Conner family's lives continue with as much comedy and drama as ever. Executive producer Bruce Helford said,

"These characters needed to be allowed to move on and grow," and that's what they're doing. The show takes the daily struggles of Middle America and puts them on screen, managing to both show respect and make it funny — a delicate balancing act. In an interview with Parade, Sara Gilbert said, "Our show has never really been overtly political in that we never take an issue in the news and hit it head-on. It's more: How do the things that are happening in our country affect our family? What happens if you don't have great health care? What happens if you can't break the cycle of poverty? What happens if you get pregnant too young?"

"The Conners" continues to illustrate the debates and conversations happening across America in a personal and accessible way, and Season 2 is just as topical, touching and hilarious as the first. For instance, we've seen Dan try to move past the death of his spouse with the help of potential partner and childhood friend Louise (Katey Segal, "Sons of Anarchy"). All the while, he struggles to reconcile his conservative views with the deep love

he has for his Ziggy Stardust-loving, gay grandson Mark (Ames McNamara, "At Home With Amy Sedaris"), and tries to give fatherly advice to Darlene, who is trying to juggle two romantic relationships at the same time. It really is the beautiful mess we've always known the Conner family to be, in all its sitcom glory.

The road from "Roseanne" to "The Conners" seems like a messy one, but if you push all the media mess aside, it's really just the story of a complicated woman and the difficult, relatable road her family must now travel without her. "The Conners" doesn't feel less full or less familiar without Barr. If anything, the sitcom that has always been both scrutinized and celebrated for its ability to push tough conversations has now stumbled into more material. "The Conners" is what it is because the showrunners and the cast were smart enough to harness that energy and successfully apply it in a new way, one that plays as honestly and imperfectly as any other situation the Conner family has been confronted with. A new episode of "The Conners" airs Tuesday, Nov. 26, on ABC.

It's finally here. After days — no, weeks — of meal planning and holiday scheduling, it's time to have a seat and savor a beautifully prepared meal that celebrates the harvest season and the heartwarming ties of kinship.

Once you're done, and if you're not dashing out to check out early Black Friday sales, gather the family and settle in for a chat, a post-turkey nap or some family-friendly TV viewing, courtesy of Food Network.

Since Thanksgiving marks the official start of the holiday season, Food Network is ready to slip into a different festive mood, and it hopes you will be, too.

Its newest holiday-themed tournament, "Santa's Baking Blizzard," will premiere Thursday, Nov. 28, which gives the four-part event just enough time to wrap up before Christmas.

If you think it's a little too soon to be talking about Christmas, keep in mind that Thanksgiving came a little later this year (the latest was in 1865, when Andrew Johnson proclaimed the first Thursday in December as a day of thanksgiving).

"Holiday Baking Championship" and "Christmas Cookie Challenge" both premiered on Nov. 4 to (presumably) get you inspired as we head into the bake sale and holiday party season. # Opry anniversary: Dolly Parton special to air this week on NBC

**Opry anniversary:** She's a living legend who has written more than 3,000 songs, earned 47 Grammy nominations and received at least one nomination for each of the EGOT (Emmy, Grammy, Oscar, Tony) awards.

Last month, Dolly Parton celebrated her 50-year anniversary with the Grand Ole Opry with two performances at the revered venue. If you couldn't make it to one (or both) of the sold-out shows, give thanks for NBC this week: the network has combined the two sets into one TV special titled "Dolly Parton: 50 Years at the Grand Ole Opry." It airs Tuesday, Nov. 26.

The musical celebration brings you all the highlights of this golden anniversary, including all-star tributes, interviews and cover performances from veteran artists such as Emmylou Harris, Toby Keith, Lady Antebellum, Dierks Bentley and Hank Williams Jr.

Parton also performs some of her greatest hits, such as "Jolene," which has been recorded more times than any other Parton-penned song; "I Will Always Love You," which was famously (and beautifully) covered by the late Whitney Houston in 1992; and Parton's personal favorite, "Coat of Many Colors."

Another big hit is "9 to 5," the Grammy-winning/Oscar-nominated theme to the 1980 film of the same name that marked the singer's big-screen debut. The workplace comedy turns 40 next year, and while a planned sequel won't be moving forward, the "9 to 5" musical is still going strong in London's West End, where David Hasselhoff will soon step into the role of the villainous boss.

As for the NBC special, it should offer fans a nice retrospective of a career that already spans five decades and is still going strong. In fact, Parton, 73, seems as busy as ever. She co-hosted the CMA Awards earlier this month and she's at the center of the podcast "Dolly Parton's America." There's also her brand-new Netflix anthology series, "Heartstrings," which features stories based on Parton's famous songs. And to cap off a busy 2019, the singer has a cameo in the holiday film "Christmas at Dollywood," airing Dec. 8 on Hallmark Channel.

**Good role:** Showtime's highest-rated series has made a

power move that will boost its star power.

The CBS-owned cable network recently announced that Julianna Margulies ("The Good Wife") has signed on for a recurring role in "Billions," which will return for a fifth season in spring 2020.

The award-winning actress — she has won three Emmys, a Golden Globe and eight SAG Awards — will appear in several episodes as Catherine Brant, a bestselling author and an Ivy League sociology professor. And while few other details are known about her character, you can be sure Margulies will more than hold her own on this viciously funny show.

Margulies' most recent TV projects were National Geographic's Ebola-themed miniseries "The Hot Zone" and AMC's "Dietland," which was canceled after a single low-rated series. And while there had been talk of reprising her "Good Wife" role on the "The Good Fight," Margulies balked after CBS offered her a guest-star salary and she spoke out against the gender pay gap.

Margulies isn't the only new addition to Showtime's fictional world of big-time powerbrokers. Corey Stoll, who earned a Golden Globe nomination for his turn as Congressman Peter Russo in "House of Cards," has also signed on for a season-long arc. Stoll will recur as business titan Michael Prince from small-town Indiana.

The two stars will star alongside series regulars Paul Giamatti ("Sideways", 2004), Damian Lewis ("Band of Brothers"), Asia Kate Dillon ("Orange Is the New Black") and Maggie Siff ("Sons of Anarchy").

**'Mayans' coming back:** FX has added another season of "Mayans M.C." to its future lineup, but it subtracted one of the show's creators.

The Disney-owned cable network has officially renewed the "Sons of Anarchy" spinoff, which has been averaging 4.6 million weekly viewers across all platforms (broadcast and digital). The series, which stars JD Pardo ("The Twilight Saga: Breaking Dawn – Part 2", 2012), Clayton Cardenas ("S.W.A.T.") and Edward James Olmos ("Stand and Deliver," 1988), is set in the same fictional universe as its parent series, but the focus has shifted from SAMCRO to the Mayans chapter operating near the U.S./Mexico border.

It was also announced that Elgin James will serve as sole showrunner when Season 3 of "Mayans M.C." revs up in fall 2020.

Until recently, James shared creator and executive producer credits with Kurt Sutter, who created parent series "Sons of Anarchy." (Sutter is also married to series star Katey Sagal, who played club matriarch, Gemma.)

But Sutter was ousted from "Mayans M.C." in October, just a few weeks shy of its Nov. 5 season finale, with FX citing complaints about on-set behavior. In an interview with Deadline, Sutter also admitted that relations with FX's corporate parent had become strained.

So what does this mean for TV's famous motorcycle outlaws? "Mayans M.C." is still in experienced hands, especially since Sutter had favored a more "hands off" approach this season to encourage others to step up (although that reportedly contributed to his early exit).

As for the status of Sutter's overall deal with 21st Century Fox TV, it's probably complicated right now. Plans for his proposed "Sons of Anarchy" prequel, titled "First Nine," are up in the air since FX/Disney owns the property, and that means Sutter can't shop it around. But since his overall deal with the studio is (to date) still intact, you can't blame Sutter's fans — and there are many — for holding out hope that both sides could still work something out.

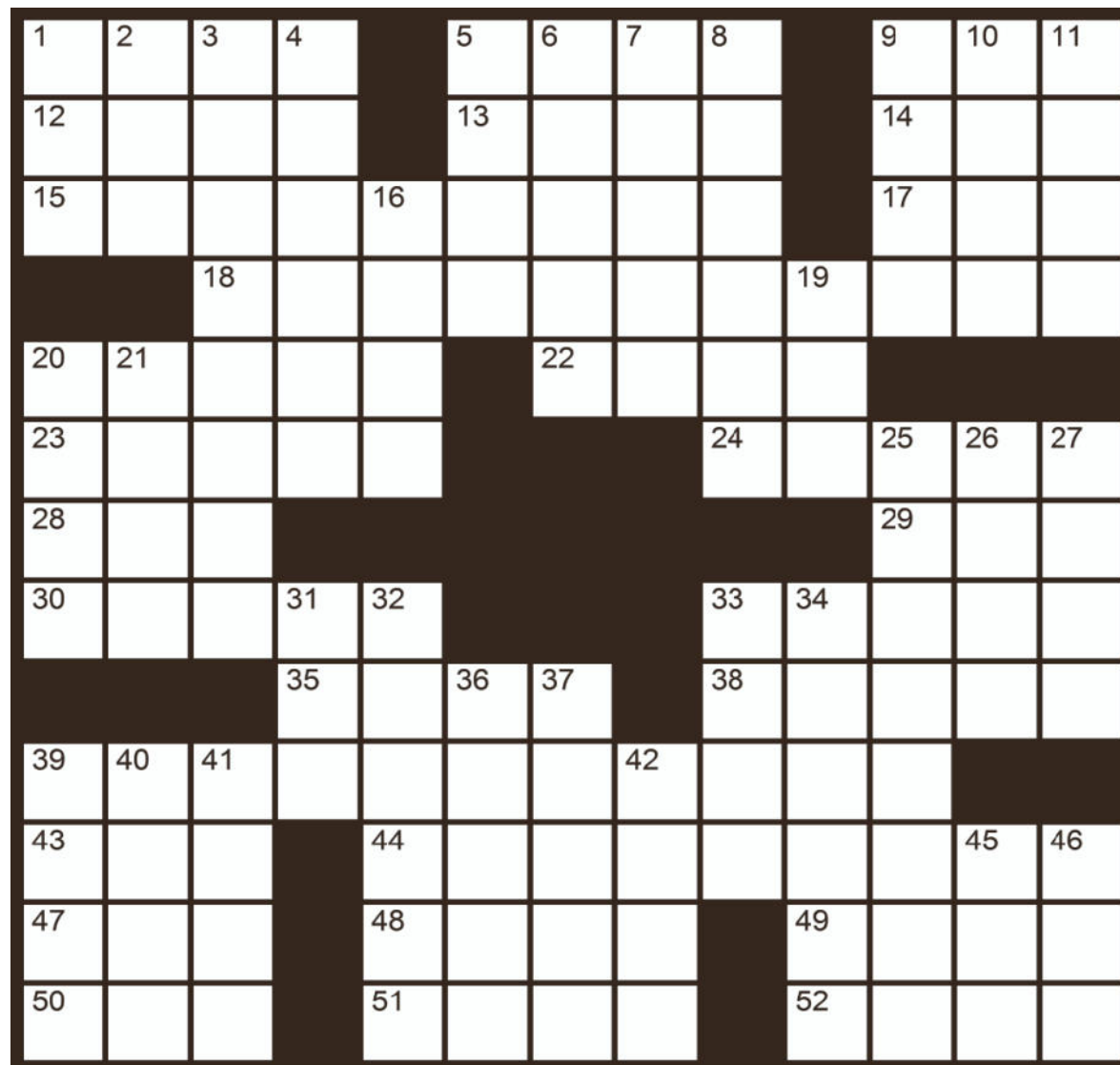

## Avoid these scams

Online and phone scams are on the rise. Thanks to the advent of new technological tools, scammers are getting more sophisticated with their methods of taking advantage of vulnerable populations.

Here are a few red flags to help you spot telemarketing scams, according to the Federal Trade Commission.

- You've been specially selected (for this offer).
- You'll get a free bonus if you buy our product.
- You've won one of five valuable prizes.
- You've won big money in a foreign lottery.
- This investment is low risk and provides a higher return than you can get anywhere else.
- You have to make up your mind right away.
- You trust me, right?
- You don't need to check our company with anyone.
- We'll just put the shipping and handling charges on your credit card.

### WHO IS AT RISK?

Many scammers target deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals who use a video relay service. Placing a video phone call, the scammers claim to be from the IRS and provide fake names and badges. Scammers get creative with their calls, addressing their victims in their native language, if applicable, or even threatening them with arrest or deportation if they don't supply specific information, usually bank account numbers or Social Security numbers scammers can use to defraud victims.

### HOW TO REPORT PHONE SCAMS

You can play a big part in shutting down future phone scans by reporting them to the FTC or Federal Communications Commission. Here's how: Report telephone scams to the Federal Trade Commission, either online at [www.ftc.gov](http://www.ftc.gov) or by phone at (877) 382-4357.

- Report all robocalls and unwanted telemarketing calls to the Do Not Call Registry.
- Report caller ID spoofing to the FCC either online at [www.fcc.gov](http://www.fcc.gov) or by phone at 888-225-5322.

# Asset realignment with multiple trusts

As we wrap up our series on trusts, we focus on realigning your assets after trust creation. Realignment involves updating asset ownership and beneficiaries. Last month, we discussed common roadblocks encountered when realigning your assets. Another common concern is that realigning will overcomplicate your existing finances, especially if you need multiple trusts. In reality, the goal of asset realignment is to simplify and streamline your estate for the future.

Let's say you have just signed a revocable living trust to avoid probate, an irrevocable trust to build asset protection from Medicaid, and a retirement trust to extend the distributions timeframe for beneficiaries. You've taken an important first step, but these trusts do not accomplish your goals if they are empty or are not properly designated! Neglecting to realign even one asset can adversely affect your entire plan.

For instance, if you do not fund your car to the revocable living trust, your loved ones will incur the time and expense of probate for that vehicle. Unlike many other states, there is not a small estate exception in West Virginia, so even settling an estate with the only asset being a vehicle can take months. If you do not work with a real estate attorney to transfer your home to your irrevocable trust, it may be exposed probate and potentially estate recovery. Estate recovery is the process where if you received nursing home Medicaid during your lifetime, the state may put a lien on your home after your death for up to the amount they paid for your care.

Checking and savings accounts you use on a daily basis are usually retitled into the revocable living trust. Depending on your goals, other non-qualified accounts may be retitled to

the revocable or the irrevocable trust. If you have accounts that have been dormant or no longer serve a purpose, realignment is a great time to consolidate and simplify.

Keep in mind that CDs and annuities may have surrender penalties to access funds before the maturity date. Be sure to discuss your bank's policy on retitling CDs to the irrevocable trust.

Your IRA is handled differently than other accounts. If you have a retirement trust, you will update the beneficiary of the account to name your retirement trust as initial or contingent after your spouse. Remember, realigning qualified retirement accounts to any other trust would likely cause unintended tax consequences!

You also don't want to forget about your whole life insurance policies. Because they have cash value unlike group and term policies, they are countable for Medicaid purposes. In order to build protection, you will update the owner and beneficiary to name the irrevocable trust.

Keep in mind that every time you add new assets to an irrevocable trust, the start date of the five-year protection resets for all assets in the trust, so it is important to complete the realignment process promptly. If you inherit or purchase new assets, it is always a good idea to talk to your attorney about how those accounts should be titled so that you do not affect your lookback.

There are openings for all three days.

This program is for caregivers who need a break from the loved ones they are caring for. Bring your loved ones to church, and they will be taken care of while you deal with other responsibilities. Two registered nurses are on duty and willing to answer any questions. There are also several volunteers helping with those in the program.

## Monthly rates

One day each week: \$120 per month  
Two days each week: \$240 per month  
Three days each week: \$360 per month

Payment at the beginning of each month is appreciated, but it can also be made in two payments. There are times when the program closes, including legal holidays, when the church building is closed, when there is a school closing, Easter week, Christmas week and New Year's week. The program will begin on time during two-hour school delays, unless weather or dangerous roads dictate otherwise.

# Ready for winter?

## Snyder Motor & Towing shares tips on how to prepare your vehicle for winter

**F**or seniors, preparation is the key to winter safety – not only in the home but also on the road.

One of the first things winter driving brings to mind is having the antifreeze checked.

Doug Snyder from Snyder Motor and Towing said antifreeze is not the only fluid that should be checked before winter. Snyder said all of the other fluids should be checked as well. “Cold weather affects all of the fluids in your vehicle,” he said.

Before winter sets in, have your oil checked. It tends to thicken as the weather gets colder.

“You should also check the condition of your tires,” Snyder said. “Have them replaced if necessary.” Think about switching to snow tires. This will improve traction.

He said windshield wipers should be a priority. If they are damaged or old, they too should be replaced.

“Fill your windshield washer reservoir with windshield washer fluid. Water doesn’t work during winter because it freezes,” Snyder said.

He said to make sure battery posts and connections are corrosion-free and the battery has all of the fluid it needs.

“Examine belts and hoses for wear and tear. Make sure all of your lights are in good working order,” Snyder said.

Getting your vehicle ready for winter is only part of being winter-safe.

“Check the weather before you leave home. Have a shovel, warm clothing, an ice scraper, bottled water, a flash light and some rock salt, sand or kitty litter on hand for use in emergencies,” Snyder said.

Snyder’s wife, Danie, said before going out during extreme weather call ahead and make sure the doctor’s office, grocery store or other businesses you plan to visit are open.

"Use the weather to plan your trips," Doug said. "A lot of people get in trouble over munchie runs. I often get called to pull them out of the ditch."

He said, if you become stranded during a storm make sure your muffler tail pipe is clear of snow, and leave a crack in the window if you are letting your

vehicle run to keep warm.

## Modifications can make driving safer for seniors

Driving provides an almost unrivaled level of independence. The ability to travel beyond a neighborhood or even one's hometown without a chaperone is probably what excites new drivers so much and makes them eager to get their licenses and cars. Senior drivers also may define their independence by their ability to drive. Few things diminish senior dignity and independence faster than losing the ability to drive.

Despite popular misconceptions, seniors are some of the safest drivers around. The experts at Hartford Auto Insurance indicate that the number of accidents involving older drivers actually decreases as age increases. It's the risk factors like medical conditions, medication usage and reduced physical function that increase the risk for accidents and injuries involving older drivers. Thanks to technology and some other well-designed devices, seniors may be able to continue driving longer than the aging drivers of years past.

The AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, a nonprofit research and education association, says roughly 90 percent of seniors don't take advantage of simple, often inexpensive features that can greatly improve safety and extend their time behind the wheel. Here are some considerations.

- **Cushions and seat pads:** Cushions do more than just alleviate hip and back pain while sitting. Cushions and pads can raise drivers up and improve their line of sight over the dashboard. Swivel pads can make it easier to enter and exit the car as well.

- **Adaptive cruise control:** This feature can adjust speed automatically to maintain a consistent space between vehicles.

- **Adaptive headlights:** These headlights, also known as steerable headlights, can improve visibility by changing the direction of the light beam with the movement of the steering wheel.

- **Pedal extenders:** Extenders help short drivers reach the pedals while maintaining a safe distance from the steering wheel and potential airbag deployment.

- **Hand controls:** Whether one has sensory changes in the feet from surgery or a medical condition, adaptive hand controls can move the "pedals" up to the steering column.

- **Blind spot warning and other sensors:** Today's cars can be equipped with any number of sensors that can detect oncoming traffic, cars to the left or right of the vehicle, items or cars behind the vehicle when reversing, and even if the vehicle has drifted out of the lane. These are all great safety features for any driver, but may be especially helpful to seniors.

- **Parking assist:** Parking assist technology can steer the vehicle into a space with little input from the driver.

- **Voice control:** Avoiding distractions and keeping hands on the wheel is enhanced by voice controls, which can be set up to do things like turn on the radio or adjust climate control.

- **Convex mirrors:** Special mirrors increase the field of vision.

Seniors have many tools available to make driving safer and more comfortable, which can prolong their years behind the wheel.

# Get a great night's sleep



Research shows that one of the most important things for our overall health, especially as we age, is a good night's sleep. Following a normal sleep schedule is crucial to keeping your body on track in terms of concentration, memory function and immune system.

Basically, when you fall out of your sleep routine, your health pays for it. ## SLEEP DEPRIVATION

As we age, our body produces lower levels of growth hormones. This can cause a decrease in slow wave, or deep sleep. When this happens you produce less melatonin, leading to fragmented sleep and more frequent wake-ups during the night hours. These are normal parts of grow-

ing older, but by keeping a strict sleep routine and listening to your body when it's tired, you can help stave off these potential effects.

## SLEEP APNEA

Untreated sleep disorders, like sleep apnea, can put a person at risk for cardiovascular disease, headaches and other issues. If you or someone you love experience snoring on a regular basis and it can be heard from another room, or make gasping noises during your sleep, these are serious signs of sleep apnea. Check with your physician to see what kinds of tests they offer for determining if you have a sleep disorder.

## IMPROVE YOUR SLEEP

Here are a few tips from the National Sleep Foundation to get a better night's sleep:

- Use low-wattage bulbs and turn off the TV and computer at least one hour before bed.
- Make sure your bedroom is quiet, dark and cool.
- Move bedroom clocks out of view to prevent disruptions to your sleep.
- Adjust your bedtime to match when you feel like going to bed, even if that's earlier than it used to be.

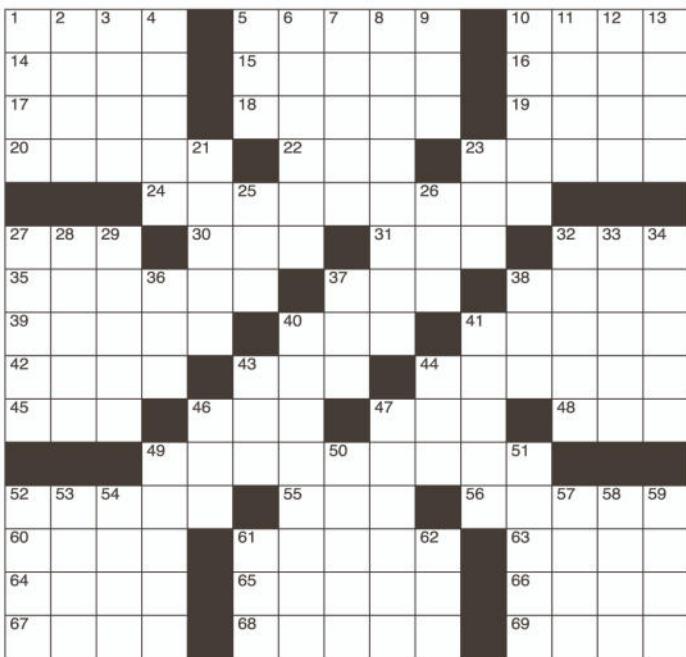

# Food pantry manager discusses her rewarding job

Senior Doris Michaels said she loves her job. Michaels is the food pantry manager at the Catholic Charities Raymond Wolfe Center in Kingwood.

"The people here are wonderful to work with. They are like family," she said. "Alix (Evans) is a good listener and boss. I love working with her. She is very involved with the community."

Michaels said her job has brought her a new perspective about those in need.

"Until I started here I didn't realize how many people the food pantry served," she said. "On a good day we have more than 30 people who come in for food."

Michaels said she has one volunteer who helps her four days a week. She said her job requires her to take freezer temperatures, stock shelves and keep the food pantry clean.

"We rotate the meats and the stuff on the shelves to make sure the dates are good and nothing has expired," Michaels said.

She said some of the food given out comes from twice-a-week donations from Walmart. Michaels said Pizza Hut also donates to the pantry.

"We get an order from Gassaway (Mountaineer Food Bank) once a month. We have several volunteers who help on that day," Michaels said. Mountaineer Food Bank provides free USDA foods. It also provides food the pantry can purchase at a reduced rate.

"People can come in once a month for food," she said. "If someone runs out of food, we can give them an emergency USDA order."

Michaels said the Raymond Wolfe Center also gives out donated coats, gloves, hats and clothing.

"Meeting the people and getting to know them makes it worth coming to work," she said. "Doing something that helps both the community and those in need is rewarding. Sometimes I even get a hug."

Sargasso's fresh, innovative cuisine is a perfect gift to anyone on your list or yourself.

The restaurant can also be the perfect locale for your holiday get together.

Interim General Manager Adam Herrick said Sargasso is well-known for its New American Cuisine.

"We kind of have a level of fine dining attached to that as well," he said.

"We offer a lot of different things from

difference countries as well," Herrick said. "But it's more like under the guise of New American Cuisine."

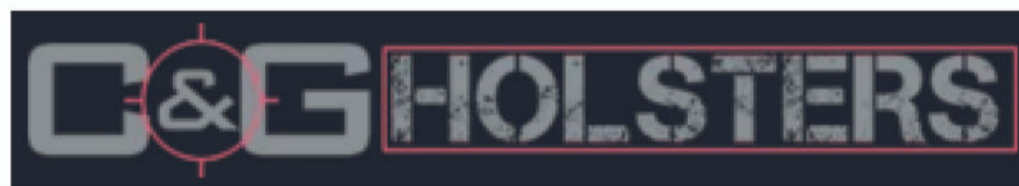

Remember Christmas shopping, P.A.? You know: Pre-Amazon. Sure, you do.

You still have the scar (and the gait) from when that determined grandma and her shopping cart from Hades took out your Achilles tendon in the Barbie aisle.

Yep, with online, it's a different consumer environment these days.

Or, we don't want to shop for that certain person on our list at all, she said.

That means the whole deal is unpleasant, Yarrow said. And what do you do when faced with something that's unpleasant?

Right.

You put it off for as long as you can, in that time-honored art of passive-aggressive rebellion known as procrastination.

For people you really want to buy for, she said, get yourself a plan and don't wait until Dec. 24.

Draw on your personal connection with someone to give a gift that really is special.

While you're at it, tactfully extract from your list that person for whom you'd prefer not to shop, the psychologist said.

Or, you could just do like Ronnie Cain — and buy a lot of extension cords.

For 37 years now (and twinkling) the Westover man has been transforming his yard — and the yards of his neighbors, with their Yule-blessings — into a high-wattage, Christmas wonderland.

Every holiday, he lights 200,000 bulbs or better, in the display that runs right up until Dec. 23.

Think Walt Disney World, he says. With the high-beams on.

And never mind those blown transformers and melted power lines. He's a retired electrician, with the blessing of

Christmas dinner for him and his family is the last evening of that year's display.

# Video games have always been hot gift ideas for all ages during the holidays

Video games are the leading form of entertainment in America, with 164 million adult gamers, a gamer in 75% of American homes and \$43.4 billion in sales in 2018, according to the Entertainment Software Association.

So, there's a good chance you already know what to buy for a gamer on your shopping list, but if not, here's a handy guide of what's new, what's popular and what's old-but-no-doubt fun. Also, is it really old if you're experiencing it for the first time?

## The systems

There are three current generation consoles. The Xbox One, PlayStation 4 and Nintendo Switch. The Switch is by far the newest console, launching in 2017.

There are two versions of the Switch. The Switch Lite, which released in September, is a true handheld device, replacing the 3DS and moving all of Nintendo's game development onto the same platform, Cartridges Galore manager Andy Carter said. There is also the base version of the Switch that can hook into a TV or be taken on the go.

The Xbox and PS4 are both nearing 6-years-old and new iterations of both have been announced for the 2020 holiday season.

However, just because the systems are near the end of their lives doesn't mean you can't enjoy them.

"I wouldn't say that the PS4 and Xbox One are obsolete," Carter said. "Yes, the new systems are coming next holiday but

that means you can expect a lot of really good value on those systems now with full libraries of games."

## New games

According to Carter, some of the most popular recent games include:

- Luigi's Mansion 3, for the Switch. This is an action-adventure game with Mario's brother as its star. It's set in a large hotel and each floor has a different theme. The game has a Ghostbusters vibe, as Luigi's primary defense against the numerous ghosts he faces is the backpack vacuum Poltergust G-00.

- Call of Duty: Modern Warfare, for the PS4, Xbox One and PC. This is a first-person shooter. The latest installment in a long line of Call of Duty games, the name is a throwback to developer Infinity Ward's 2007 hit and turning point in the franchise, Call of Duty 4: Modern Warfare. The game has a single player campaign and the signature multiplayer.

- The Legend of Zelda: Link's Awakening, for the Switch. The Legend of Zelda: Link's Awakening is a remake of and shares a name with the fourth installment in the Zelda series. The original title was the first Zelda to appear on a handheld device and launched on the Gameboy in 1993.

- Pokemon Sword and Pokemon Shield, for the Switch. Pokemon Sword and Shield are the latest two titles in the highest grossing media franchise of all time. The series is also the second best-selling franchise of all time, behind only Mario. Players pick one of three starter Pokemon and then travel the continent

with their new friend, battling others and vying for the title of Champion.

Sword and Shield largely feature the same Pokemon, but there are a few unique to each game. Unless you're buying for a hardcore fanatic or have two kids, either version will suffice, Carter said.

- Death Stranding, for the PS4, Xbox One and PC. This is the first title to come out of Kojima Productions and the mind of world famous Hideo Kojima after the company became independent of Konami in 2015. Kojima is responsible for the Metal Gear Solid Series.

- The yearly sports games, FIFA 20, NBA 2K20 and Madden NFL 20, for the PS4, Xbox One, Switch and PC. Not much changes year-to-year, but if you're shopping for a sports gamer, the latest title is a must.

- Star Wars Jedi: Fallen Order, for the PS4, Xbox One and PC. Star Wars Jedi: Fallen Order is a third-person action-adventure game developed by Respawn Entertainment, the makers of the Titanfall franchise.

Players control Cal Kestis, a Padawan who never finished his training and is on the run from the Empire's forces. Players can explore multiple worlds and fight enemies using both force skills and a lightsaber as they try to complete Kestis' training and rebuild the Jedi Order.

- Deadly Premonition, for the Switch.

"It's a bit of a niche title but I love that one and I always recommend it," Carter said. "It's kind of along the vein of if you love Twin Peaks, you're gonna love this."

He described it as a "strange horror" game. It was previously available on the

PS3 and Xbox 360.

## Retro

Retro is always popular and the Atari, the first home video game system, is trending right now, Carter said. Of course, Morgantown has always been a Nintendo 64 town, and the system continues to be popular.

Nintendo systems are a good place to start shopping for a young gamer because they'll know the characters, even if they don't recognize the games themselves, Carter said. Mario is the most recognized character in the world.

Retro consoles also offer a great way to relive the experiences of childhood with a friend or sibling or share your childhood with your kids, Carter said.

## Fortnite

The game is so popular it deserves its own section. It should be noted that this game, which pits 100 players against each other in a fight to the last man standing is free to play.

The only thing players can purchase in Fortnite are cosmetic items that change the look of either the player's avatar or their accessories.

## Other stuff

- Make sure you have the proper charging cables, batteries and other accessories needed, Carter warned.

- Gift cards make good stocking stuffers

# Mon County has an array of shopping options for all your holiday needs

Monongalia County offers shoppers a variety of stores throughout the area to satisfy all their holiday needs.

## University Town Centre

The University Town Centre, located just off Interstate 79 at exit 153, has a number of options for holiday shoppers with name-brand stores. Major retailers at the strip center include Wal-Mart and Target, both of which also offer grocery items.

Other large retailers and mainstays of the Granville retail center include Dick's Sporting Goods, Ashley Homestore, a standalone Barnes & Noble and Best Buy, as well as A.C. Moore Arts & Crafts, Bed Bath & Beyond, Lane Bryant, Shoe Dept., Petco and Old Navy.

One major change shoppers will notice at the venue this year is that Dress Barn is closing. The last day for the store, which is running a clearance sale, is Dec. 26.

"They will remain open up until Christmas and then closing," said Marcus Nidiffer, University Town Centre's leasing agent.

## Morgantown Mall

Morgantown Mall, a mainstay of local holiday shopping since it opened in 1991, still offers a variety of shopping choices with such well-known retailers as JCPenney, which has a Sephora inside.

Other big retailers at the mall include Hibbett Sports, Victoria's Secret, Christopher & Banks, Bath & Body Works and American Eagle Outfitters.

Like many enclosed shopping malls, however, the mall has struggled with ten-

ants. Sears, once the country's largest retailer and a familiar mall fixture, closed its Morgantown location last year following its bankruptcy.

Forever 21, a clothing store that caters to children and young adults, filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection in September.

As part of its bankruptcy reorganization, a number of stores are closing, including the Morgantown Mall location. That store is currently running a clearance sale.

## The Gateway

Shoppers at The Gateway can buy supplies and make a special Christmas gift with supplies from Hobby Lobby. Or, you can buy outdoor gear from Sportman's Warehouse, or a Harley at Triple S. Harley-Davidson.

Cliff Sutherland, one of the developers of The Gateway, located off Exit 155 of Interstate 79, and an owner of Triple S, said the development welcomes Joe Romeo's I-79 Honda this year and three more parcels have been sold and will open in 2020.

"We do believe holiday sales will be strong due to the economy and the uniqueness of the businesses located within The Gateway," Sutherland said in an email.

Other tenants at The Gateway include Arais Agencies, BFS Foods, Burger King, Candlewood Suites, Dairy Queen, H&R Block, LaQunita Inn & Suites, Little Caesars, Mon Health Wedgewood Primary CARE, Once Upon A Child, PARCS Mountaineer Indian, PARCS Can-Am Polaris Slingshot. The Greene Turtle Sports Bar and Grille, and Tim Horton's.

## Downtown Morgantown

A big array of shopping options is in downtown Morgantown, where a number of small Mom-and-Pop stores offer everything from coins to antiques to guitars, to handcrafted goods and even CBD items. The area has become a destination for niche shoppers.

Retailers include Appalachian Galley on Spruce Street. Here, you can buy handmade gifts from West Virginian artisans or get a special picture framed. Other retailers include Hoot and Howl, a gift shop on Walnut Street; Old Stone House Gift Shop on Chestnut Street; Pinocchio's Books and Toys, Tanner's Alley Leather Design Studio and Spencer & Kuehn Fine Jewelry Studio, all on High Street

## Suncrest Towne Centre

With retailers such as Chico's, Plow & Hearth, and Jos. A. Bank, Suncrest Towne Centre is a popular retail option for shoppers.

Within the last two months, the shopping venue has become the home of McFly Outdoors, an outdoor recreational goods stores with locations in Bridgeport, Harrison County, and Horner in Lewis County.

McFly, which sells fishing gear, hunting and camping gear, and pet supplies, took over 7,166 square feet of space between Massullo's Cleaners and Sun Tan City, said Christopher Wilbert of Premier Commercial Real Estate Services LLC, the leasing agent for Suncrest.

Also new to Suncrest is Lavish Bridal & Prom Boutique, which opened at 525 Suncrest Towne Centre. And Get Fit Juices and Shakes, which also has a location at Fort Pierpont, opened a second location between Plow & Hearth and Jos. A. Bank.

## Seneca Center

Seneca Center, at m709 Beechurst Ave., is a distinctive center for shopping that also showcases local history. Brick-lined walls and worn wooden floors in the former glass factory greet visitors as they wind their way through the assortment of specialty shops.

Enjoy shopping at a number of shops that offer everything from women's apparel and accessories, and jewelry, to florals and decor. Shops display handmade wooden products, fountains, fireplaces, fire pits and other items for the home. There are also personal items like bath and body products and a tea shop.

## WestRidge Commons

While it won't be a shopping option this holiday season, Bass Pro Shops, which owns Cabela's, will open its first location in West Virginia at Morgantown. Officials from Bass Pro Shops have not said when the store will open.

"We are currently set to begin construction on over 380,000 square feet of new-to-market retail in just a few months - Spring 2020 - and will open that retail in spring and summer of 2021," said Holly Childs, WestRidge's director of Business Development & External Relations in an email. "Those will be our first retail tenants, although development will be ongoing and is projected to be excess of 500,000 square feet by the end of 2022."

In June, Menards, a home improvement store that also offers groceries and pet supplies, said it plans to open a store at WestRidge in 2021. This will be the chain's first location in West Virginia.
