Characteristics

- → Large, chunky sparrow with a stout beak, and medium-length tail
- → Length: 15-19 cm
- → Weight: 26-44 g
- → Wingspan: 26.7-29 cm
- → Not sexually dimorphic
- → The four Western subspecies of Fox Sparrow mainly a gray or sooty brown color

Behavior

- → Can be seen hopping on the ground foraging for seeds and insects by scratching fallen leaves
- → In spring, males defend nesting territory by singing
- → Nests built by females on ground under dense, low shrubs
- → Migrate from high elevation areas in the summer to lower elevation in the winter

Habitat

- → Each subspecies have vegetation preference
- → Red Fox Sparrows prefer scrubby woods and forest edges
- → Sooty Fox Sparrows are found in deciduous thickets near streams
- → Large-billed Fox Sparrows prefer high elevation brushy fields
- → Slate-colored Fox Sparrows favor dense riparian

Diet

- → Mainly eat insects, spiders, millipedes, mollusks, seeds, fruits, or plant buds
- → Eat a more balanced diet of plants and insects in migration and winter

Zzyzx-Specific Information


- → Slate-colored Fox Sparrow are a non-breeding winter resident
- → Red and Sooty Fox Sparrows are rarely seen
- → Thick-billed Fox Sparrows migrate through Zzyzx
- → Often seen with other sparrow species

Conservation Status

- → IUCN Status for all subspecies: Least concern, stable
- → Populations have declined
- → Logging and forest fires have increased their habitat in the West

Did you know?!

- → The oldest fossils of fox sparrow found were from the Pleistocene Era, which was 11,000 years ago
- → Fox sparrow parents will lure predators and humans away from young by pretending to have a broken wing, and chirping
