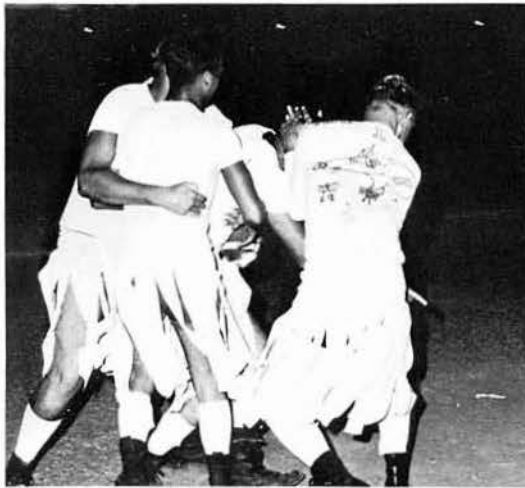
The Intra-company softball season had many exciting games and the race for first place ran throughout the final week of play. Delta Company took home the trophies.

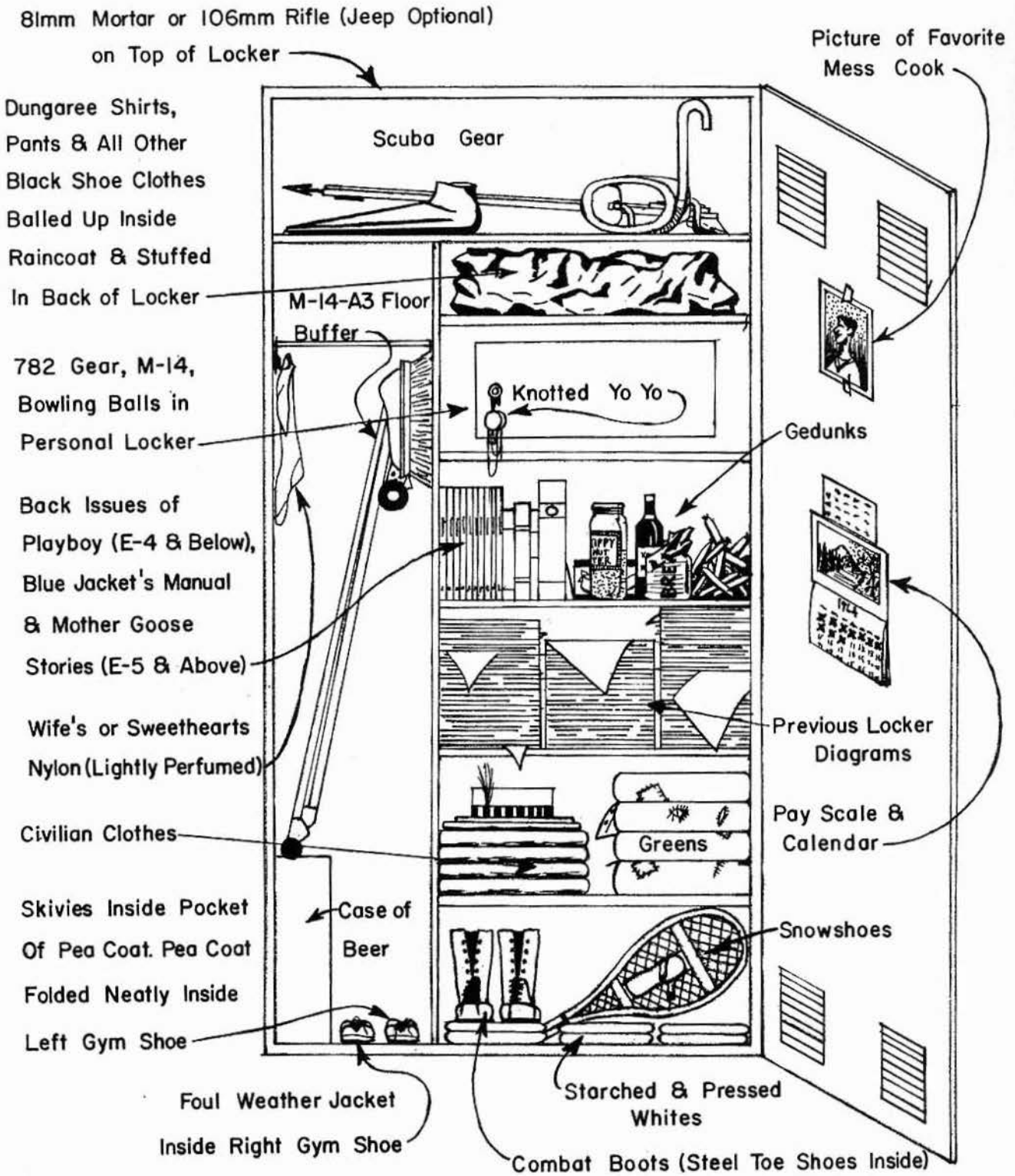

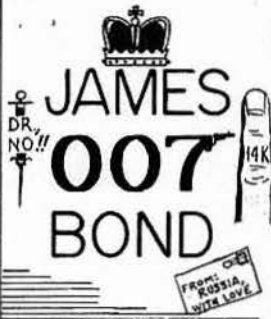
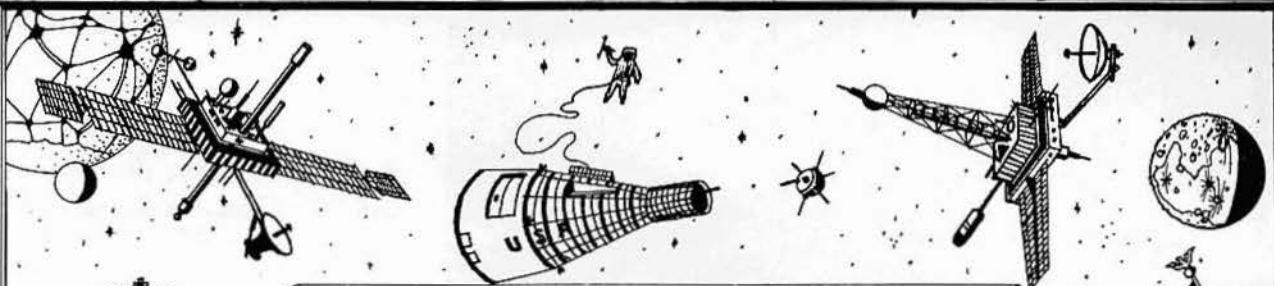


NEW REVISED M.C.B.#1 LOCKER DIAGRAM

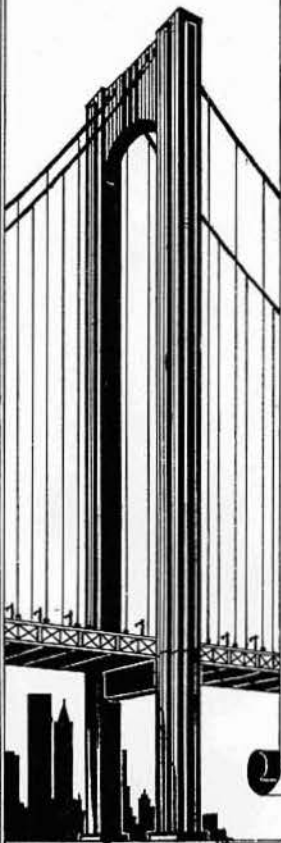
