a loop front bumper and massive rear bumper that gives your Fury a lean, low look . . . Hideaway headlamps . . . color-keyed body side protection moldings . . . and a new lane changer turn signal—the slightest pressure on the lever will activate it; after you've changed lanes, release the lever and the light goes off.



Sport Fury GT & S/23

**Simply showing your stripes doesn't make it.
Having something to show for your stripes makes it.**

A popular misconception these days is that a couple of racing stripes on a car make it a hot performer. The secret is to look behind the warpaint.

Our Sport Fury GT and S/23 models have the stripes—in force.

Dual hood runners in either white, black or burnt orange. And reflective "Strobe Stripes" on the side and rear deck lid.

To back them up, our GT can be ordered with an optional 440 6-barrel engine. That ought to take away a fleet of trophies from the local sanctioned drag strip. The GT's standard 410 Super Commando 4-barrel isn't much tamer.

We also gave the GT a heavy-duty suspension system

with heavy-duty brakes. Big H70 x 15" tires. A 3.23:1 axle ratio 12.76:1 is optional. Road wheels. And chrome-plated dual exhaust tips. All standard.

The S/23 features our proven 318 V-8 engine, torsion-bar suspension, front anti-sway bar, fiberglass-bolted tires, our road-hugging wide stance, and Plymouth's reputation for making it.

The instruments are floodlit so they're easy to read and reach. They'll remind you of aircraft instrumentation.

Both cars come with the cloth-and-vinyl or all-vinyl bench seat with fold-down center armrest. But may we suggest our optional all-vinyl buckets as an added performance touch.

Basically, these are our performance Furies. But if you want more, be our guest.

All vinyl interior with folding armrest

Add options like: 3-speed Torqueflite automatic transmission (standard on the GT). Disc brakes. A simulated wood-grain steering wheel.

Aircraft-type instrument panel

If buckets are your style, a console is available. An AM/FM stereo so you can keep tabs on the underground beat.

To top it all off, a Brougham medallion is mounted on the side of the roof right behind

the rear passenger window. It's not available on the standard 2-door hardtop.

We make both 6- and 8-cylinder models. The standard Six being that noted gas station-hater—our 225 cubic incher.

If you're looking for a little more power, check our 318 V-8. It runs on regular and the mileage will surprise you. Pleasantly.

As a matter of fact, you can go as high as our optional 383 2-barrel and still be on regular gas.

Other optional equipment that you can select for your Fury includes a remote control outside mirror, AM push-button radio, fender-mounted turn signals, sporty wheel covers, bumper guards, TorqueFlite automatic transmission, power steering and brakes.

Interiors are simple but handily spartan. A cloth-and-vinyl

bench is standard for the Fury II, with a tough all-vinyl seat on the Fury I.

The floodlit instrument panel is also standard. As are our uni-body construction, torsion-bar suspension and a wide choice of acrylic enamel colors applied over our 7-step dip-and-spray anti-rust treatment.

Other standard features: Fiberglass-belted tires. Torsion-bar suspension. An anti-theft, column-mounted ignition switch. A lane changer turn signal. Concealed wipers.



C. Vinyl Roof. Add an elegant note of distinction to your Fury with a vinyl top. Available in six selections: black, antique green, white and champagne plus you can choose the Tortoise Grain or the new Gator Grain materials.

D. Fury Wheel Covers. Make Fury personally yours. Add sporty wheel covers. A plus in good looks.

E. Rallye Wheels. Road wheel's feature stainless steel trim rings, chrome-plated center covers, and exposed

chrome-wheel nuts. Great for enthusiasts.

F. Power Disc Brakes. Help to assure yourself of safer, surer, fade-free stops with power disc brakes.

G. Chrysler Airtemp Air Conditioning. Cleans, dehumidifies, and cools the air quietly and efficiently. With Auto-Temp control you can set it at any temperature between 65 and 85 and forget it. Its total temperature control means total comfort, winter or summer.

H. Fender Skirts. Custom fitted fender skirts will give your Fury a more rakish look.

I. Turn Indicators. Twin turn indicators are distinctively integrated into the hood styling of your Fury.

J. Time-Delay Ignition Switch And Headlamp Switch Lights. A beam of light is directed at the column-mounted ignition when you open the door and remains on after the door

is closed, then shuts itself off. A second light illuminates the headlamp switch. Ends nighttime hit-and-miss hunting for the ignition and headlamp switch. (Part of light package.)

K. TorqueFlite Transmission: If you prefer your transmission on the automatic side, select smooth-shifting Torqueflite. Console or steering column mounted. Your choice.

L. Auto-Speed Control. Accelerate to the speed you choose, then press the button on the end of the turn signal lever, automatically that speed is maintained. A touch on the brake disengages the speed control, twist

shocks and brakes. Deluxe seat belt package. Trailer-towing package. Rear window defogger.




The 225 Slant Six uses regular gas sparingly, and delivers a full 145 horsepower. With it you get a 46 amp/hr. battery and a silenced air cleaner. Ask for TorqueFlite automatic transmission and you'll get a 10% inch torque converter. Plenty of power. Inexpensive upkeep.



The standard 318 V-8. It's 230 horsepower and 2-barrel carburetor deliver plenty of go, and on regular gas. It features a silenced air cleaner with preheat feature, and a transistorized voltage regulator, new for 1970.



The Commando 383 V-8 (2-barrel). You get power to spare. At 4400 rpm it delivers a solid 290 horsepower, and has a low-restriction exhaust system. An 11 inch clutch comes with manual transmission. With TorqueFlite automatic you get an 11 1/4 inch torque converter.



The Super Commando 440 V-8 has four barrels and 330 horsepower. Silenced air cleaner, 59 amp/hr. battery and dual exhausts with a sound that says "make way."

If the Sport Fury GT is your choice, and if you want extra power for any sanctioned events, ask about the **Special 440**. With three 2-V Holley carburetors and special design throughout, this engine has the guts to do whatever you want. If you can handle it, get it.
