

Back to Dusty Roads with Bill Wynne 1934 Plymouth 4 Door

My father Harold Wynne either bought the car or was given the car by a friend in Haddonfield who wanted to clean out their garage. I took the tow truck and brought it home. Dad intended to restore the Plymouth but he passed on, then my brother and I owned the car but my brother passed-on. I have now owned the car for about 20 years so I guess I better buy some good red polish for it soon. The photo included

with the article shows Valerie and I with the car at the Gloucester County College Car Show in 1991, sponsored by The South Jersey Region.

The Plymouth won the prestigious South Jersey Region's "Rusty Bucket Award" designed and assembled by our own Norman Locke. Frank Heiss also donated a stamped alignment shim for this award.

In 1987 Plymouth Owner's Club voted the 1934 Plymouth as the best style Plymouth. That year, Plymouth sold their one millionth car. By-the-way Ma Perkins of radio fame posed for a photo with a 1936 Plymouth. Also, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt had a 1933 Plymouth convertible.

If your new Plymouth had a Philco AM radio you were able to hear President Franklin Roosevelt's "Fireside Chat."

The Plymouth's name was suggested by Joe Fraiser of later Kaiser/Fraiser fame. When it came to accessories,

Plymouth offered two different sets of luggage, a hat box, and a cigar lighter. Most people smoked because they thought it made them look classy. There was also a form fit bolt-on trunk available for sedans and a fold-up outside luggage rack. Up front there was a Valchrome front grill, it resembled chrome.

You could opt for a painted or chrome grill. Three hot water heaters were available in the 1934 along with a canvas or metal tire cover. You were able to pick from three types of clocks. They were a 30 hour mirror clock with pull string wind-up, one fit in the glove box lid and the other was a header board clock.

The model PE Plymouth had an independent, coil-spring front suspension. 1934 was the second year for Plymouth's 6 cylinder engine, but actually it was borrowed from the 1930 DeSoto. It had 77 hp or 82 hp with aluminum cylinder head. It had a water by-pass and thermostat for fast warm-ups. It had a free-wheeling transmission control on the dash. The engine had louvered opening doors on the hood for cooling the engine.

This year Plymouth had a unique bent ignition key. The same key was for the spare tire and the door.

The all steel body of the 1934 Plymouth cured the swelling and sagging of the doors. The roof insert was made with wood frame, chicken wire and padding. It was topped with a water-proof material.


Back to Dusty Roads (Continued)

Inside the sedan there is a luggage compartment behind the rear seat. The dashboard is done with polished maple in the PE Series and the bottom of the dash is black. Special colors for fenders and tire covers were available for \$10.

The PE Model had roll-down or push-out vent windows. Skirted fenders and wheel shields were fashionable. Duel windshield wipers were another accessory. The Wheel shields were only \$9 or painted for \$10. This was the first Plymouth with a ship emblem.

The 1934 Plymouth had 4 suicide doors for quick exit at any speed.

You might say it was first class in the low-price field.
