

PATROL DIVISION

In 2021 the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office reimplemented the bicycle unit. The primary goal of bicycle deputies is to allow the community to have more face to face contact with law enforcement. By utilizing bicycles, deputies are able to interact organically with citizens as they bike through neighborhoods and parks. The bicycle deputies are highly visible and easily approachable to the public, which promotes interaction, communication, and community policing. Bicycle patrol officers can be deployed in many police functions. They can be used to patrol residential neighborhoods, business, entertainment, and shopping districts during their regular scheduled shifts. Bicycle officers can patrol in high crime areas, work crowd control, and assist in undercover and stealth operations. In addition, police bicycle officers ride in special events, malls, parking lots, city parks, etc., or other areas as dictated by large attendance or when defined by intelligence.
