Safety

Prevention is the best protection against crime

Activity down slightly

During the month of December, there were 35 reported incidents, 11 less than in November. There were 13 incident free-days. Meadows Safety Patrol issued 93 citations for various violations such as illegally parked vehicles, garbage violations, and open garage doors.

Jewelry stolen while homeowners were at church

On Sunday, December 2, a resident of Hadfield Greene reported that he and his wife went out to attend an 8:30 am church service and upon returning home discovered his wife's jewelry was missing from the night stand. There were no signs of forced entry into the home. The Sarasota County Sheriff's Office was notified and responded to file a report.

GPS stolen from unlocked car

On Monday, December 17, a resident of Harpers Croft reported that at approximately 7:45 pm, a man was standing near the complainant's car, which was left unlocked. When the complainant opened the door to go outside, the subject ran across the parking lot. On further inspection, the complaint noticed a GPS was missing from the dashboard. The resident did not want to file a Sheriff's report.

Grinches try to steal Christmas lights at neighborhood entrance

On Saturday, December 22, a resident of Winslow Beacon reported seeing a group of subjects in a pickup truck removing Christmas lights from the shrubbery at the entrance to Winslow Beacon. A resident yelled at the individuals who then jumped into their truck and sped off. The Safety officer on duty was already on Glebe Farm Road at the time and just missed them by seconds. In the short time it took for the officer to arrive, the truck and occupants were already gone from the area. The complainant reported four sets of lights were damaged at an approximate value of \$40.00. The incident was reported to the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office.

Mailboxes vandalized

On Saturday, December 22 at 7:00 am, the on-duty Safety officer observed several mailboxes in the 4700 block of Ringwood Meadow that appeared to have been purposely struck with some type of object. One box was knocked completely off of its post.

GPS goes missing from unlocked car

On Saturday, December 22, a resident of Willow Links reported that a GPS was missing from inside the car. It is not known where or when the theft occurred. The report does not mention whether there was damage to the vehicle or if it was locked at the time. The resident did not want to file a Sheriff's report.

If you are a victim of a crime... report it!

When we reviewed the above incidents at the January Safety Meeting, the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention officer pointed out to the Committee how important it is to report any and all incidents to the Sheriff's Office—no matter how small or insignificant you may think it is.

Often when officers make unrelated arrests, they recover stolen property. If they can't identify who owns a stolen item, they cannot return it to the rightful owners. So, off it goes to the evidence room to sit for who knows how long.



Don't let that happen to you. Our Safety Patrol usually is the first on the scene of a reported crime in The Meadows. They assess the situation professionally and determine if the Sheriff's Office needs to be called. And, they will always advise the resident to call if warranted.

But, it is up to <u>YOU</u>, as the resident to make that call!

Don't feel embarrassed to make the call, and don't feel as though you will be a burden to the police. This is part of the job they do. When law enforcement has all the necessary information, it helps them do a better job. Believe me, the Sheriff's Office prefers to make a call to a victim of a past crime to tell them they recovered their stolen property. They like to deliver good news, too! Let's hope theft doesn't happen to you, but if it does, just make the call!

Friendly solicitors may not be so friendly

The Safety Patrol was advised that teams of solicitors were dropped off at communities like The Meadows to canvass the neighborhood homes. Solicitors go door-to-door in attempts to acquire subscriptions to various magazines and newspapers. The reports we receive identify them as personable young people who are persuasive in their sales pitches.

What you should remember is that we are actually targets and these solicitors are out to take us for what they can. They can sweet talk you into a long-term subscription faster than you can say, "I don't think I need that magazine." Here are some things you should remember if your doorbell rings and one of these smiling faces is standing there:

- The Meadows is a deedrestricted community—that's one of
 the reasons we chose to live here. And,
 no soliciting is allowed. Solicitors
 ignore our right to privacy by coming
 to The Meadows, and you should
 politely say, "no thank you," and close
 the door—then, call Meadows Safety
 Patrol to report the incident. They will
 come and handle the situation.
- It's never a good idea to enter into a legal agreement with anybody who randomly shows up at your door. If you didn't call the individual, then he (or she) is ignoring your right to privacy and looking to take money from you.
- You can always get a better deal on just about anything if you shop around for it yourself. This technique has worked for us all our lives, and it hasn't changed since we got older. Remember the old adage, "If it's too good to be true, then it probably isn't" (true, that is)!

Inside jobs

The Safety Committee looks over every reported crime that occurs here in the Meadows and tries to look for ways to help stop crime from occurring to residents in the first place. Sometimes there are instances of property stolen from homes when the owners are out, the doors and windows are locked, and there is no sign of forced entry. Yet, the owners return and can't find a piece of jewelry or suddenly notice that money or other valuables are missing.



Could a "cat burglar" be working the Meadows? Not likely—that's the stuff of TV and movies. So how could that watch or ring just disappear?

Consider this likely scenario. You previously let a workman, contractor, or home health care person into your home at some time and didn't keep an eye on them. And, you left valuables out in plain view or just for your personal convenience of easy access.

Unfortunately, this temptation makes for easy pickin's for a stranger not likely to be back anytime soon. That Rolex watch or those diamond earrings you wear only on special occasions won't be missed until you go to put it on.

You can't supervise everyone who is working or performing a service inside your homes and, frankly, it is annoying to the workers if you are peering over their shoulders all the time. So what is the solution? Just secure or move a jewelry box to another room away from the room being worked on.

You wouldn't leave your wallet or watch on the table at a restaurant while you go to the restroom—so don't leave the temptation out in the open inside your own home either.

Your medicine cabinet could be a source of drugs

The above holds true for the medications you keep in the bathroom medicine cabinet. When service workers ask to use the bathroom, they close and lock the door. You can't see if they are going through your medicine cabinet looking for prescription drugs they can steal. Follow the old theory about an "ounce of prevention ..." Move all your medications to your master bathroom. When guests or a service workers ask to use your bathroom, direct them to the guest bath, where only the essentials are kept. Doing so removes any temptation or opportunity to steal your prescription medication.


What's Happening?

It's a busy season with changes and things going on

Jay Brady replaces Mark Schaefer who retires this month

With Operations Services Administrator Mark Schaefer's retirement announcement last fall (see story on page 16), the MCA needed to find a suitable replacement. I recently told President Ginny Coveney and the MCA Board that I will be eligible for Social Security next month and that Mark's replacement should be someone who has the right background and experience to do Mark's job which is complex in itself—as well as learn as much as possible about our operations in order to train as a possible replacement for me a few years down the road.



We found just the right person in **Jay Brady**. Jay has a professional planning background that comes with political, business, and personal connections. He was the Planning Director for the Town of Longboat Key when I was the Public Works Director during the 1980s and has worked for both the city and county of Sarasota. Jay was the Executive Director of the Gulf Coast Builders Exchange for many years and was a columnist for the Gulf Coast Business Review. Jay is experienced in code enforcement, which is the public equivalent to deed restrictions. He will be very helpful with our relations to our neighbors and our connections to our elected officials.

Doggy bags available for convenience—not endless supply for dog walkers

We get our bags from the same supplier in Ohio that furnishes bags to the *Herald-Tribune*. We were fortunate to have an employee about 11 years ago whose brother was an executive in the circulation department with the *New York Times* Company in Atlanta. Through him, we were connected with

the bag manufacturer, and we have been able to acquire the bags at a much better price than on the open market.

We have seen some people take extra bags, for future walks perhaps or even when it appears they may be leaving for the summer. Please be courteous to your fellow residents and only take the bags that you need at the time.

Volunteer to help at the Benderson Park Regattas

For the fifth year in a "row," there will be a series of rowing regattas at Nathan Benderson Aquatic Park, our neighbor to the east. The 2012 regattas reached unprecedented levels of success, bringing millions of dollars in revenue to Sarasota County and filling motels and restaurants during each event.

Because of this success and the potential to have one of the top rowing facilities in the world, the Sarasota county commission voted to fund the construction of remaining features of the facility on an annual basis with "tourist taxes." Subsequently, the Commission approved the site plan for the facility.

Last year, The Meadows was well represented at each of the regattas with volunteers, filling all kinds of jobs, inside and outside. We hope to provide a good number again this year.

We have such a good relationship with the county commissioners and Benderson Development, and our participation will keep that relationship going during future development phases of the park.

Take care that contractor equipment does not damage sidewalks

A few years ago, we had a case where a contractor was trimming trees on a condominium property in proximity to the MCA sidewalk. The heavy trucks and machines cracked a number of slabs. The contractor repaired the damage at his expense, but all or part of the damage could have been avoided if some care or different equipment had been used.

If you plan to have work done around your own or another's property, please take a good look at the job and work site. Think about the equipment to be used, and talk to your contractor about the possibilities. It could save you headaches and money to work some of these details out in advance.

Watch for road hazards

We have yard crews, garbage trucks, delivery trucks, walkers, bikers, joggers, and roller bladers using our roads as well as people who park there during the day. And, sometimes we have to weave our way down the streets of The Meadows.

It's unreasonable to ask truck drivers park in driveways of single-family homes, but we require drivers who park on MCA streets to place an orange cone at the rear of their trucks. Please ask your yard crew or other contractors like roofers, pool services, and so forth to comply with the rules.

We ask that walkers, roller bladers, and joggers use the sidewalks. Most of them do. I have been surprised, however, many times by people walking or jogging in the road, and I have heard the same from others. So, please use the sidewalk when you can. Bikers are allowed to use the street, but are encouraged to use

the pathways as often as they can. If you ride in the street you must obey traffic laws. When you're on one of the walkways, please use your required bell to warn pedestrians and golf carts, who are required to yield to bikes but often don't. Be prepared; don't rely on walkers and carts to yield.

Most importantly, drive slowly and carefully on our streets. Your safety and the safety of others depend on it.

Fire Department offers free blood pressure checks

One of the many services offered by Sarasota County is providing blood pressure checks. You can go to any fire station and, according to the Fire Marshall, paramedics will take your blood pressure and give you a written report. This service is especially helpful if you need regular checks for certain medical procedures. Call 861-5000 and ask for the fire department to ensure paramedics are available.



With the proceeds from record sales at our November Craft Sale, we were able to make generous contributions to three local charities. At the January 10 meeting of the MCA Board of Directors, **Helene DiPuma**, Craft Group Chair, presented checks to Baby Basics representatives Gwen Bos and Elizabeth Wildhack and to Joining Our Youth (JOY) cofounder Tish FitzGerald. A check will be mailed to the third charity, All Faiths Food Bank, which was unable to send a representative to the meeting.

It's gratifying to be able to assist these creative local charities that are making a real difference in our community.

Baby Basics is an all-volunteer group that provides diapers and kindness to families of the working poor who do not receive government assistance

Maria's family is typical of the nearly 100 Sarasota families that Baby Basics, now in its fifth year, has served. Once a month, Maria and her preschooler and baby trek across Sarasota by bus to reach Baby Basics where diapers are distributed. Even though her husband is employed, low wages make an adequate supply of diapers, at \$45 a month, out of reach without Baby Basics. When Maria heard that the "diaper ladies" are volunteers, her eyebrows shot up in surprise to learn that strangers cared about her family. Of course, with the caring support from the diaper ladies, Maria and her children were not strangers long and their smiles were ample payment for volunteers' hours.

JOY provides a 52-item Housekeeping Starter Kit with linens, kitchenware, cleaning supplies, a tool kit, bicycles, and bus passes for transportation. Participants also choose clothes at JOY's Trendy Threads boutique and are matched with trainedmentors who meet with them weekly.

All Faiths Food Bank and its partner agencies provide more than 88,000 meals a week in Sarasota and Desoto Counties

Most of these meals go to lowincome working families, the elderly, and children. All Faiths has also developed innovative distribution strategies and education programs for nutrition and health. The BackPack Kids program sends backpacks filled with food for the weekend home with kids who might not eat otherwise. Kids Café provides evening meals for kids in after-school programs. And, the Mobile Cupboard brings food directly to under-served neighborhoods. These services are coupled with nutrition education programs and food resources for special populations—like the elderly, veterans, and individuals on medically restricted diets—to provide a comprehensive resource.

Restrictions

Basic rules to observe and respect...

By Bill Hoegel—Chairperson

The following are a few rules that we, as residents living in The Meadows, must follow. The rules apply to both owners and renters, whether they live in single-family homes, villas, or condominiums. These rules also apply to guests of residents. With your cooperation, we can keep The Meadows a great place to live.

Pedestrians and joggers must use pathways in The Meadows

All pedestrians are expected to use Meadows pathways rather than roadways, which are designated for automobile use. When you use the pathways, you must always yield to bicycles.

For safety reasons, you are not allowed to walk, jog, rollerblade, or bike on The Meadows Country Club's private golf courses and cart paths.

Owners are responsible for the physical control and behavior of their pets and for disposal of waste

Florida law requires that pets be vaccinated against rabies. You must leash your pets at all times when they are outside your residence.

You must remove all pet droppings and deposit it in waste containers located along pathways or dispose of it at your own home. The MCA does not permit pet behavior that becomes a nuisance to other residents.

Feeding most Florida wildlife is illegal—feeding any Meadows wildlife is not permitted

For your own protection, do not feed the wildlife living in The Meadows. The Meadows is home to numerous wild animals—among them, alligators, turtles, fish, herons, egrets, ducks, and Sandhill cranes. When humans feed these animals, some may become aggressive and learn to depend on handouts.

It is also against the law in Florida to feed certain wild animals, including alligators, Sandhill cranes, egrets, herons, and most aquatic birds.

Fishing and picnicking in designated areas OKAY—swimming and boating are NOT OKAY

Fishing in ponds or lakes is limited to residents and guests accompanied by the resident. A



December 2012 real estate activity down from December 2011

The number of sales in The Meadows for the month of December ended at 16 with a median price of \$115,500 and average price of \$146,059, which was lower than November 2012 and December 2011—both of which had 19 sales. December was an indication of the activity for the entire year of 2012 in The Meadows real estate market.

Consider last year—the adjustment year that was in the process of changing from a depressed to a more normal real \$291,244 with Just and the MHOA!

estate market. And, as we knew, this transition wasn't going to happen in just a few months. The big facilitator was the decreasing inventory, which will be the leading driver in 2013 since low inventory leads to price increases.

As the table below indicates, December was a good month for sales, but, it wasn't a great month for prices in The Meadows. As a matter of fact, 2012 wasn't the greatest for the county but the listing supply was 4.9 months, a very low figure (December 2011 was 4.8 months when real estate sales started gaining strength and showed signs of recovery).

Let's compare sales in The Meadows by categories of condos (garden homes), villas, townhomes, and single-family homes for the period 2011 to 2012. The number of sales in 2012 was up 9 percent over 2011 sales. The median sale price of total sales was down 3 percent. And, the average was up 4 percent for 2012. The median price of condos (\$109,500) was up less than 1 percent and the average price, up 1 percent for 2012. The median price of villas and townhomes (\$160,000) for 2012 was down less than 2 percent and averaged less than 1 percent. Detached houses had a median price of \$238,950, which was down 1 percent from 2011.

The biggest improvement for 2012 was the average sale price of single-family detached houses at \$291,244, which was up 16 percent over 2011!

By comparison, Sarasota County had a good year in 2012. December sales were up 14% over the same month in 2011 with a median sale price of \$165,150 (up 15% over December 2011). The listing supply for December was 4.2 months. Sarasota County ended the year with a 9% gain in sales (10,262) over 2011. The median sale price for Sarasota County in 2012, which was up 13% over the 2011 median of \$135,175. The average sale price of single detached houses in the county in 2012 ended at \$258,605, up 9 percent over 2011 (not as impressive as The Meadow's 16 percent increase to \$291,244 with the same factors).





If you haven't visited our Website lately, now is a good time to do so-we update information every month. So, if you want to stay current with The Meadoword while you are away during the summer or just want to read a back issue, you can find it online. Here's how to do it:

- 1. Visit our Website at *http://* www.themeadowssarasota.org.
 - 2. Click **The Meadoword** in

the navigation panel on the left of the page, and, like magic, The Meadoword page appears.

3. Click the *Meadoword* Icon on the top right of the page to open the most recently published issue (usually updated about the first of the month of publication). To read the issue, scroll down the page or click a thumbnail on the left to go to a specific page.

The Meadoword is saved as an Adobe Portable Document (PDF) file. To open and view an issue, you must have the Adobe Acrobat Reader installed on your computer. You can download the latest version of the Reader free at http://www.adobe.com.

Back issues of The Meadoword are archived through 2008. To read an archived issue, scroll down the page (about half way) to the archive. 2012 issues appear as links; issues prior to 2012, in the drop-down list. To view an issue, click the issue in the list.





What's that name again? **Hampstead Heath**

Hampstead holds a rich and affluent history

Hampstead, also known as Hampstead Village, is actually an affluent area of London near Charing Cross. It's part of the inner London Borough of Camden, known for its intellectual, liberal, artistic, musician, and literary associations. It also includes a large hilly park called Hampstead Heath—one of the highest points in London, covering 790 acres.

Hampstead remained a quiet Saxon farming village for centuries; the name Hampstead derives from the Anglo-Saxon words "ham" and "stede," meaning "homestead." Its history traces back to the 17th Century (although some records are found as early as 986 AD in a grant to St. Peter's monastery at Westminister by King Ethelred the Unready) when wealthy people settled in the area to escape the

1665 London plague and 1666 London fire. The region developed as more and more came to live away from London's noise and filth, yet near its amenities.

Hampstead Wells which boasted the medicinal qualities of chalybeate waters (water with iron), remained fashionable until the late 1800s when it met competition from other London spas. Today, just a water fountain remains.

Several grand houses were built in Hampstead—the Fenton House in 1693, the Burgh House in 1702 (now a museum), and Kenwood House (built in 1616 and rebuilt in the 1760s for the First Earl of Mansfield). The Vale of Health was developed in 1800 on the reclaimed land of Hatches Bottom Marsh.

Gas lights replaced oil lamps in

1824, and the first railway station in 1852 helped grow the area by making it easier to live in Hampstead and commute to work in London. By the late 19th Century, Hampstead was an affluent London suburb; it became part of the county of London in 1889 and the Metropolitan Borough of Hampstead in 1899.

Hampstead is also the historical home of many famous people. John Keats (1795-1821) wrote his poem Ode to a Nightingale in the garden of Wentworth Place—now called Keats House. Writer D. H. Lawrence (1885-1930) lived in the Vale of Health, writer Katherine Mansfield (1881-1923, best known for The Garden Party, The Daughters of the Late Colonel, and The Fly) resided at 17 East Heath Road, and writer John Galsworthy (1867-1933), who authored The Forsyte Saga.







Famous artist John Constable and controversial psychiatrist Sigmund Freud (whose house is now a museum) also called Hampstead home. But, the most infamous person to reside in Hampstead was Ruth Blakely—the last woman executed in Britain, who was hanged July 13, 1955 for shooting her lover David Blakely outside the Magdala Pub in South Hill Park.

Thank you to all the donors who participated in December's blood drive. It was a huge success. Because of the large turnout, we had several donors who had to wait some time, and I appreciate everyone's patience. Since February is usually our heaviest volume drive, I requested a second bus for the February 7 drive so the donating process can go smoothly.

I received the following information from the blood bank, and I am sharing it with our readers to emphasize the importance of donating blood... especially now.

The supply of both O Negative and O Positive, A, and B blood types has fallen to critically low levels at this time, and Suncoast Communities Blood Bank (SCBB) is appealing to the public for help. Anyone with these blood types is encouraged to donate blood to help restore the levels needed for scheduled surgeries, therapies, and emergency transfusions.

This year's flu outbreak, one of the worst in 10 years according to experts, is the major cause of this blood shortage. Children, the elderly, and individuals with compromised immune systems from cancer treatment and other primary illnesses are most susceptible to flu-related complications that increase the need for blood products. Conversely, the pool of healthy blood donors has been diminished because of the widespread impact of the flu in our community.

I look forward to seeing all my regular donors as well as new donors, who are always welcome and much needed. If you are a new donor, you will need to bring a picture ID with you when you donate blood. Thank you again for your support. I look forward to seeing you Thursday, February 7, 7:00 am to 1:00 pm.





Growing up in the small farming town of Ballsville, Virginia, there were more African-American families than white ones—but even as a child, Lillian Lincoln Lambert recognized that skin color was not the only difference. White farmers owned the best land while men like her father raised tobacco on smaller plots and struggled to provide for their families. Lillian's parents, however, had hope and worked hard—traits they passed along to their daughter.

Her mother was unusual for her time: she had graduated from college, becoming a school teacher until family responsibilities took over, and she became a part-time cook and cleaner in the homes of others. Still, she encouraged Lillian to read and study hard, hoping that her youngest child might follow in her footsteps. Neither of them knew much about loans or scholarships; as third in her high school graduation class, both thought Lillian had missed her chance to go to college. Lillian, however, was growing more confident and was anxious to 'spread her wings."

With several family members living in New York City, Lillian moved in with her cousins, Rema and Rudy, and began work as a maid at a resort on Long Island. By the end of the summer, she found a series of jobs in the city using her typing skills, but soon realized they did not pay enough, so she returned to work as a maid—all the while thinking that "there must be more than this in my future."

After two years, she reluctantly returned home, where her Aunt Alberta suggested she go to Washington, DC, where she might find better opportunities.

Lillian moved in with her aunt's friend, Marie, and began another clerical job—this one requiring a long commute each day. Again, Marie helped by suggesting that Lillian take the Civil Service exam; soon she was working as a typist at the Veterans Administration, doing well, but still looking to find her real path to success. She also began to appreciate the importance of networking and the

assistance from others, as well as her renewed religious faith to her search for success.

During a chance meeting at a party, she learned about the DC Teachers College; she applied as a part-time student, carrying a full load of classes in addition to her day job. It was an intense schedule, but Lillian had a goal and was used to hard work.

When an opportunity and promotion opened with the Peace Corps, Lillian took it, relishing the chance to learn more about other cultures and thinking she might enjoy field work abroad. Still, she knew that her life would be better with a college degree, and after a long talk with her cousin, Rudy, she applied for financial aid at Howard University. Her manager at the Peace Corps arranged a schedule of work around Lillian's program of classes. After one semester, with the support of her manager, she truly became a full-time student.

Once again, her eagerness and dedication was attracting help from others. A course titled "Introduction to Business" brought her to the attention of the instructor Professor H. Naylor

Fitzhugh, who became a major influence in her life. He encouraged her to major in business and later apply to Harvard Business School, where he had graduated. Although she had never considered it, he told her "People see things in yourself that you don't."

Following her Howard graduation, cum laude in 1966, Lillian took her Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), but weak math skills meant she had to try a second time. It was disappointing, but not a defeat. She worked at NASA in Houston, then back to a job at *The Washington Post* in DC—all the while studying.

In the fall of 1967, Lillian was accepted at Harvard—one of just 18 women in her class.

In June 1968, she met and married Roy Lincoln, who worked at the NLRB. The couple lived in Maryland during the summer while Lillian worked as a marketing analyst intern at Humble Oil.

In the fall she was back at Harvard while Roy remained in Maryland.
Lillian learned more about herself and the impact the turbulent '60s had on American life in general. When she

graduated in 1969, Lillian became the first black woman at Harvard to do so! In 2003, Harvard chose her to receive the prestigious Alumni Achievement Award—the first woman *and* the first black woman to receive this honor. She was on her way to garnering many more "firsts" in her career!

When she began work after graduation, she describes the experience as being like "a game of chutes and ladders." Some were in government, others in non-profits, even one as a stockbroker, but they were not always long-lasting or predictable. It was many years after graduation that she learned from other women classmates that they, too, found success elusive in the corporate world. As mothers, they also faced the familiar challenge of childcare versus job.

For Lillian, a fall-term teaching position at Bowie State College appeared to be the answer. Then a telephone call from a former colleague suggested that Lillian become a summer "consultant" for [the colleague's] father's cleaning business. It wasn't long before Lillian's many skills were put to the test with great success, and she was offered a full-time position. When she told her boss she felt obligated to fulfill her contract with Bowie, he agreed to work out a schedule to allow her to do both jobs.

With one infant daughter and a second on the way, it was wild even with household help. After one hectic year, she left teaching and for the next three years, applied herself to learning everything about the cleaning business. When it was suggested that she open her own janitorial services company, she decided to give it a try, converting her garage into an office. Centennial One was ready to go in October 1976. Her first contracts were with government agencies through the SBA; she eventually expanded into the private sector, a wise decision since the company outgrew the requirements of the SBA.

After four years in business, she received Maryland's "Small Business Person of the Year" Award in 1981.

In 1995, she assumed the presidency of the Building Service Contractors Association International—the first woman to serve in that office. In 25 years, Centennial One grew to a \$20 million dollar company employing 1200 people, who flourished under the employee initiatives that Lillian established.

But, the business consumed her. When she married **John Lambert** in 1999, she wanted to spend more time with him and their blended family, so in 200, she sold her company.

Now the couple divides their time between Mechanicsville, Virginia, and The Meadows, where they have owned since 2001. Lillian introduced John to golf, and both are enthusiastic players at The Meadows Country Club, where Lillian has been active in the 18-hole

LGA. Currently, she is a candidate for the TMCC Board of Directors.

During her business career Lillian was always ready to help other black women, recognizing they were not just a minority by color, but often because of the lack of opportunities available to all women. She spoke out, encouraging others to become entrepreneurs, and became a popular lecturer and role model. Locally, she has urged middle school students to work hard, go to college, and never give up. Her 2010 book, The Road to Someplace Better, describes the ways she met her own educational and career challenges to become successful. Perhaps her own words say it best "....build a life from the inside out rather than from the outside in, and your life journey will be its own reward."

More than \$5,000 worth of tools stolen from maintenance

Thieves stole thousands of dollars of hand tools in January from three Goodwill Industries Manasota maintenance trucks. The intruders cut through the fence and broke into the trucks parked in the organization's facilities parking lot in Sarasota.

Bob Rosinsky, president of Goodwill Manasota, says the tools were not insured for theft and the organization is now facing a budget increase of more than \$5,000 to replenish the tools and repair the trucks. He condemns the act as 'unconscionable" against a servicebased industry that strikes at the community that Goodwill serves. "We're all victims of this crime," he says. "These thieves are preying on the good will of the Sarasota-Manatee community by stealing from a nonprofit that helps thousands of disadvantaged people in our community."

Columbus' Historical Ships **Scheduled To Sail Into Manatee County**

In fourteen hundred ninety-two Columbus sailed the ocean blue... and landed in The Americas quite by accident; he was sailing to Japan.

His fleet of ships included the Nina, Pinta, and Santa Maria. Replicas of two of these ships will dock at Regatta Pointe Marina, from April 4 through April 15, in Palmetto along their tour of the West Coast.

The Nina and the Pinta are full-size replicated versions of the ancient ships sailed by Christopher Columbus' in his search of the "New World." These floating museums are historically accurate ships and tributes to the voyage that set the course of Western society.

Columbus sailed the Nina (rumor has it, Nina was his favorite ship) across the Atlantic on his three voyages to the new world, beginning in 1492, more than 25,000 miles. The original ship was last heard of in 1501. Its replica is the most historically accurate ship built.

The Pinta's replica was built in Brazil to accompany the Nina in her travels.

The ships, which will be open to the public from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm daily during their visit, are sailed by the Columbus Foundation of the British Virgin Islands. Come tour the vessels and see for yourself how it must have felt living in such tight quarters during the estimated two months-plus it took to cross during the historical voyages. Admission, \$8.

The Regatta Pointe Marina is located just across from downtown Bradenton on the Manatee River, immediately north of the Historic Green Bridge.



Pine Street

My family moved often when I was a child. We moved so often that I can't remember the number of houses where we lived. It felt like we lived in some kind of a Parade of Homes.

In the 1930s when I was three, we moved to Pine Street in Meadville, Pennsylvania, a small town of 18,000 people located 30 miles south of Erie. Meadville's downtown was built on the flood plain of French Creek to take advantage of the flat land. The railroad station, high school, and the oak and elm-filled town park, complete with bandstand for summer concerts, were there on the flat land where the streets began.

Like the other streets of
Meadville, Pine Street soon climbed
into the hills. Lined with comfortable
middle-class two- and three-bedroom
homes, the street ran past the new
Talon Fastener Plant. Known by
natives as the "Hookless," Talon
Fasteners were becoming the closure
of choice on men's trousers and
"zippers replacing buttons" sheltered
Meadville from the depression
gripping the nation.

Our home was one block from

the end of Pine Street just before the paved streets ended. My best friend, Arthur Spoor, lived across the street in a big red-brick house with a front porch, where we spent many days pretending to be in school under the stern eye of his sister, Ester. Ester took the task of bringing education to her younger charges very seriously. In fact, I can't remember ever having a sterner teacher since.

There was a maple tree in the front yard that Mr. Spoor was always pruning and shaping. His garden was a thing of beauty. Each line of lettuce, carrots, and beans was sowed following a taut string and when they came up, the rows of vegetables were as straight and true as any I have ever seen since.

In the corner of the yard was a small grape arbor that had an overhead trellis where vines formed a shady canopy from the summer sun. Mr. Spoor had a large white crock with tubing or something where Arthur told me his dad made his own wine from the grapes. There were always a few bottles on the shelves inside the fruit cellar.

location, Cummington, Massachusetts, in the foothills of the Berkshires and were sliding along deep into the woods and meadows. Step, glide, step, glide I went—almost like ice-skating but on pre-groomed parallel trails. I learned that I shouldn't have worn a heavy winter jacket because after five minutes, my body was very hot and sweaty.

I glided on pristine white snow, glistening like diamonds in the early morning sunlight. It was heaven!


Then I came to a curve followed by a downhill run. Going downhill on skinny cross-country skis was exhilarating, but required agility and balance that I didn't have. Turning quickly at the bottom, I tottered on my left ski with my right leg flying out of the tracks before I fell hard on my side.

My arms and legs cried out in pain.

But, after a half day of gorgeous skiing, we reached a meadow. The quiet of the woods and meadow enveloped me in a sense of peace and wonder. The only sounds were the shush of our skis and an occasional twig snapped by a squirrel scampering about. It was so beautiful and serene that I felt compelled to recite Frost's *Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening*.

Whose woods are these? I think I know.
