COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHTS COLLECTION

ON-CALL BULKY ITEM PICKUP

You call, we'll haul. Call Waste Management Customer Service at (510) 613-8710 to schedule free individual pick-ups twice per year, at your convenience.



FOOD SCRAP RECYCLING

All food products, including meat & bones and food soiled paper, such as pizza boxes, paper towels, paper plates, paper napkins & waxed paper containers should be placed into your green waste cart for weekly curbside collection. Do not put any liquid, plastic, glass, metal or Styrofoam products into your green waste cart. For questions about Food Scrap Recycling, call Waste Management (510) 613-8710.



FREE HOLIDAY TREE-CYCLING PICKUP

Trees are picked up curbside during the first two weeks of January on your regular pickup day.

Trees must be cut to less than 5 feet tall. Only clean trees will be picked up: no "snow" flocking, stands or decorations. Flocked trees must be discarded as trash.



FREE BATTERY COLLECTION

Household batteries (AAA, AA, B, C, D & small button batteries), including rechargeable and cell phone batteries, can be recycled. Place batteries in a clear plastic bag, seal shut & place on the top of the recycling cart.



FREE CELL PHONE COLLECTION

Residential customers may now recycle cellular phones. Place old cell phones in a clear plastic bag, seal shut and place on top of the recycling cart.



USED MOTOR OIL & FILTER COLLECTION

Call Waste Management at (510) 613-8710 to request free used motor oil jugs and filter bags. Set out up to 2 jugs and 2 filters curbside for pick up on your regular collection day.

Only WM oil jugs & bags will be accepted for pickup.

Magazines, Newspapers, Office Paper, Cardboard, Junk Mail, Cup Lids, Stickies, Aluminum Cans, Pans & Foil, All Metal Cans, Empty Aerosol Cans, Plastic Bags & Films (bagged together in a clear plastic bag), Glass & Plastic Bottles, Plastic Containers, Plastic To-Go Boxes, Rigid Plastics no larger than 15" in any dimension

All Plastics #1-7. No Styrofoam.
