FORD EXP: You command.

EXP may be the best equipped car you've ever driven. The racing black

instrument cluster includes tachometer (redlined at 6,000 rpm), speedometer with trip odometer, fuel and engine temperature gauges. The sports steering wheel rim is fully wrapped in soft vinyl for that "command feel."

Stalk controls mounted on the side of the steering column are fingertip close. One combines turn signals, horn, headlamp high beam controls. The other, windshield washer and intermittent wipers that let you regulate

the sweeps.

In each door is a handy map pocket to stow small travel items. High-back bucket seats fully recline to 15 separate positions. Color-keyed deluxe belts have "tension relievers" for freedom of movement.

A roof-mounted grab handle assists passengers in or out.

A console is between the seats. It displays ammeter and oil pressure gauges plus warning lights to signal "door ajar" and windshield washer

"low fluid level".

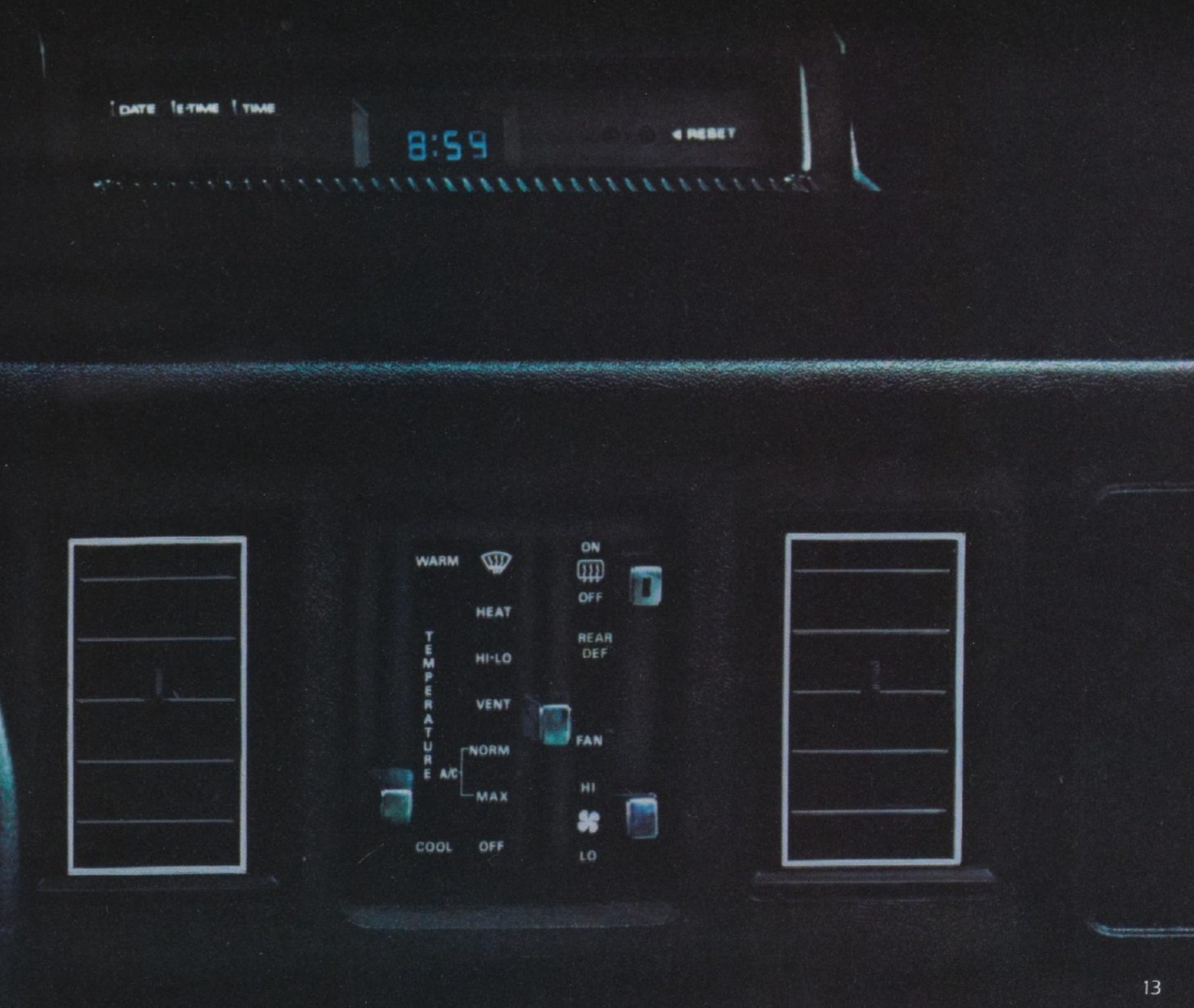
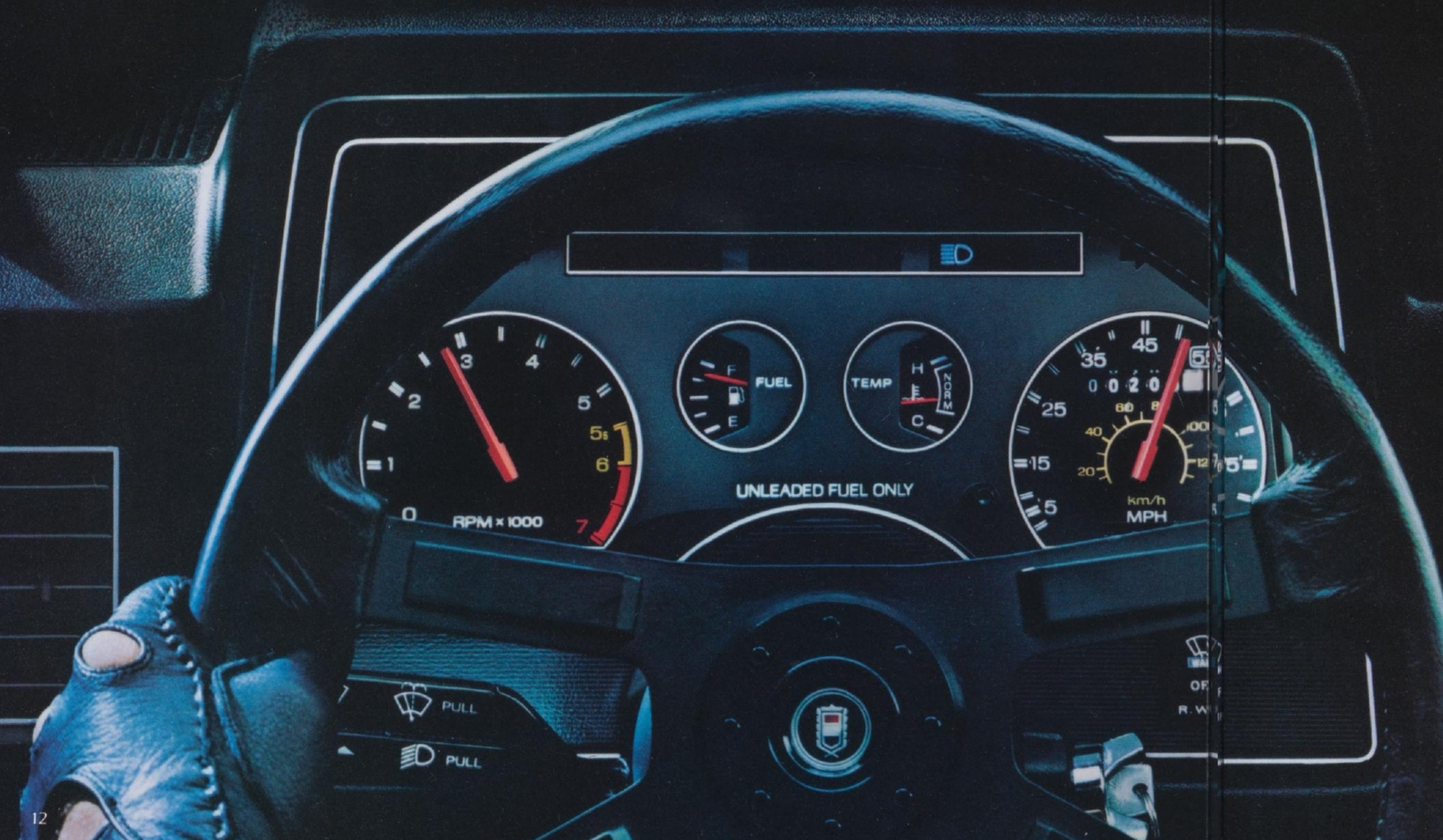
Centered in the instrument panel is an electronic digital clock (optional) for time, date and elapsed time of any trip. Below is the standard

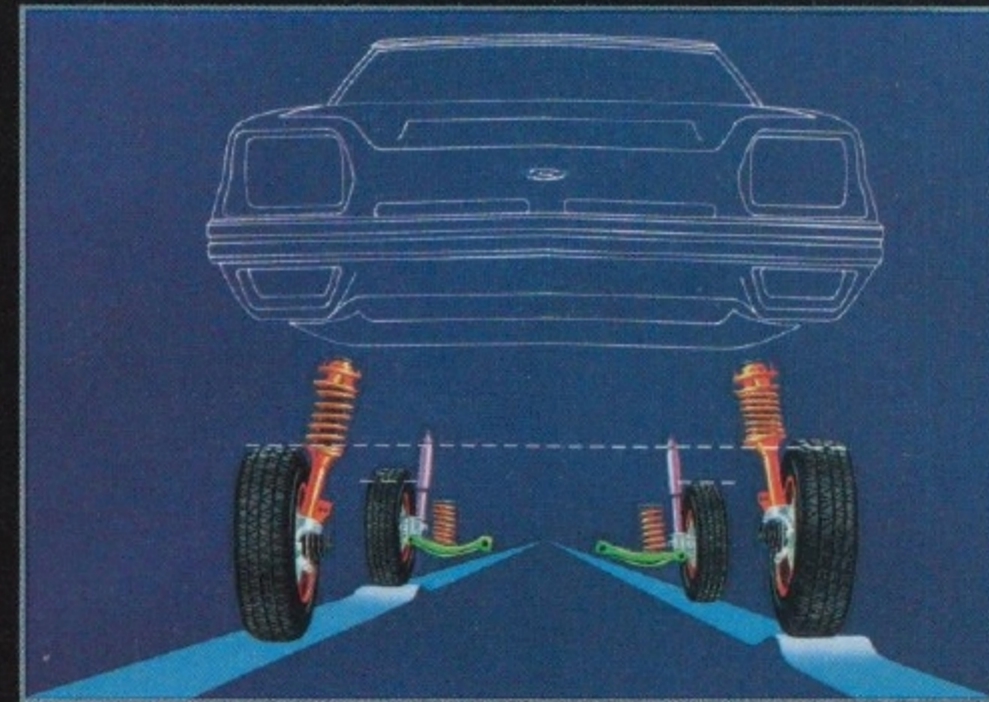
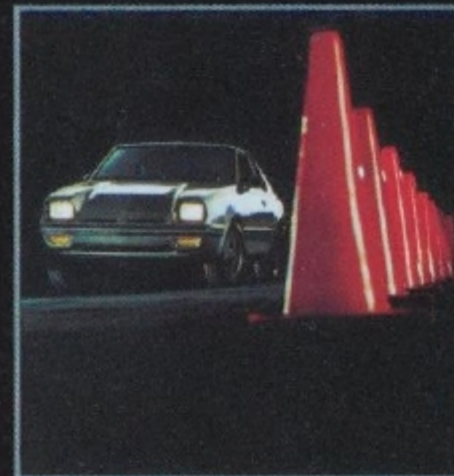
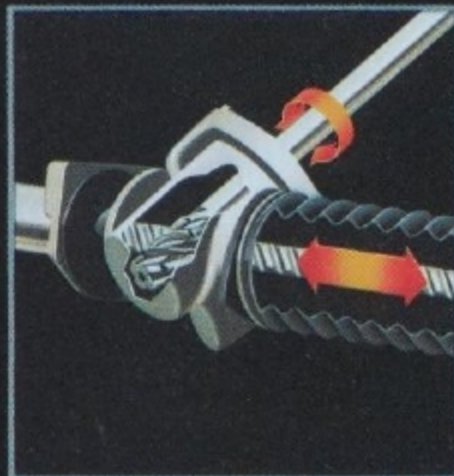
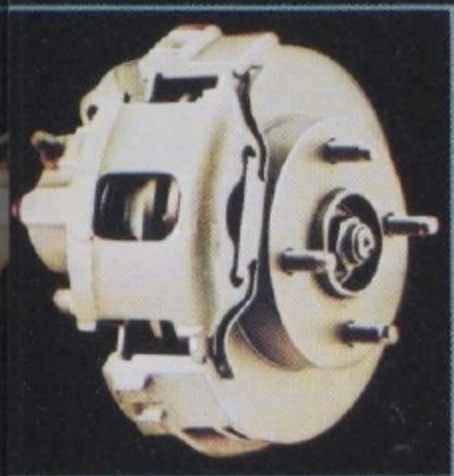
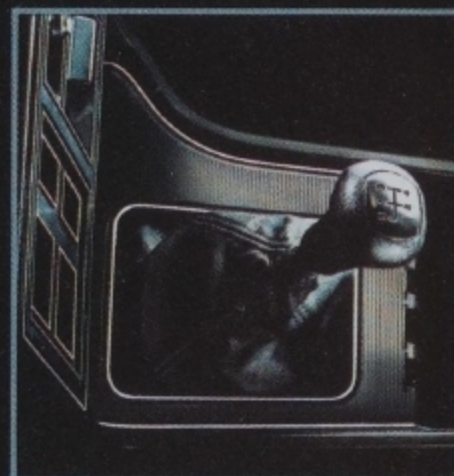
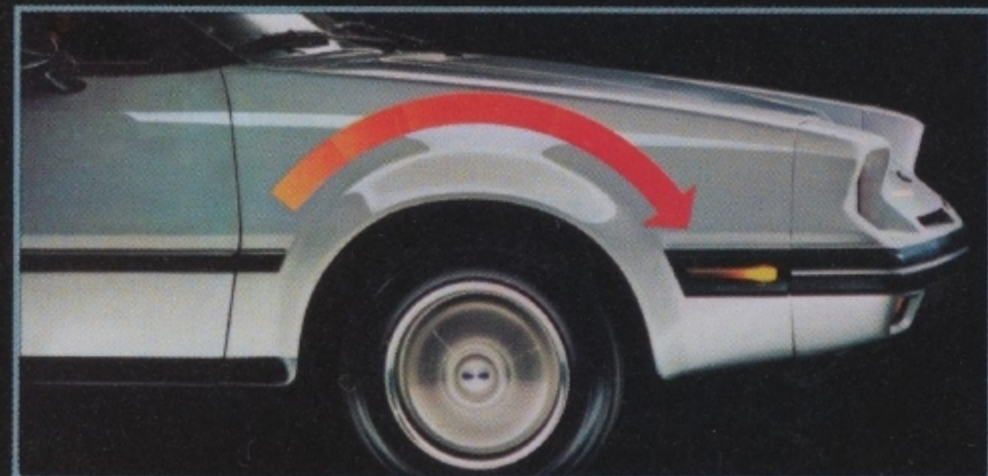
pushbutton AM radio with dual front speakers (may be deleted for credit). A convenient header-mounted dome lamp/map light that swings down and pivots is part of

the optional Light Group. Also part of this option: courtesy lights in the engine compartment, glove box and ashtray as well as those activated by the doors, plus a buzzer to remind you if headlamps are left on.

Day/night rearview mirror, with a flip, can soften annoying headlamp glare. Other amenities include remote control sport mirrors (RH mirror optional), an inside hood release, electric hatch-back release (optional),

wrapover door trim panels, luxury carpeting, passenger's visor vanity mirror, electric rear window defroster, and deluxe sound insulation package. Complete command is standard.





FORD EXP: Engineered by people who love to drive.

While Ford engineers, all over the world, are dedicated to building better cars, they especially like to build cars that are fun to drive. It's natural. They love to drive themselves.

In EXP, Ford engineers produced a car that has a fun-to-drive way with the road while still answering the transportation needs of the 80's.

1.6 liter CVH 4-cylinder engine — a remarkably efficient design. The engine, with its hemispherical heads and sculptured piston crowns, was selected to provide excellent fuel

economy and good power output at low emissions levels.

Front wheel drive puts the weight up front for better all-around traction, especially on slippery surfaces.

Standard 4-speed manual transaxle features a wide ratio selection and an overdrive

fourth gear for excellent fuel economy at cruising speeds. Other features include: single-rail shift mechanism requiring no adjustment; closed end case construction to prevent oil leaks; and use of automatic transmission fluid for improved shift feel and fuel economy.

Optional 3-speed split-torque automatic transaxle is designed to increase fuel economy by eliminating most of the power loss that occurs through hydraulic slippage in the torque converter. A unique "splitter gear" (patented by Ford) transmits 62% of the torque mechanically in second gear and 93% in third gear.

Front disc brakes are power-assisted. They feature Ford's pin slider-type caliper mountings (rather than conventional VEE slider-type).

High-strength steel. Used in many key areas to reduce weight. This steel, with other strong weight-efficient materials, helps

EXP achieve high mileage without sacrificing solid construction.

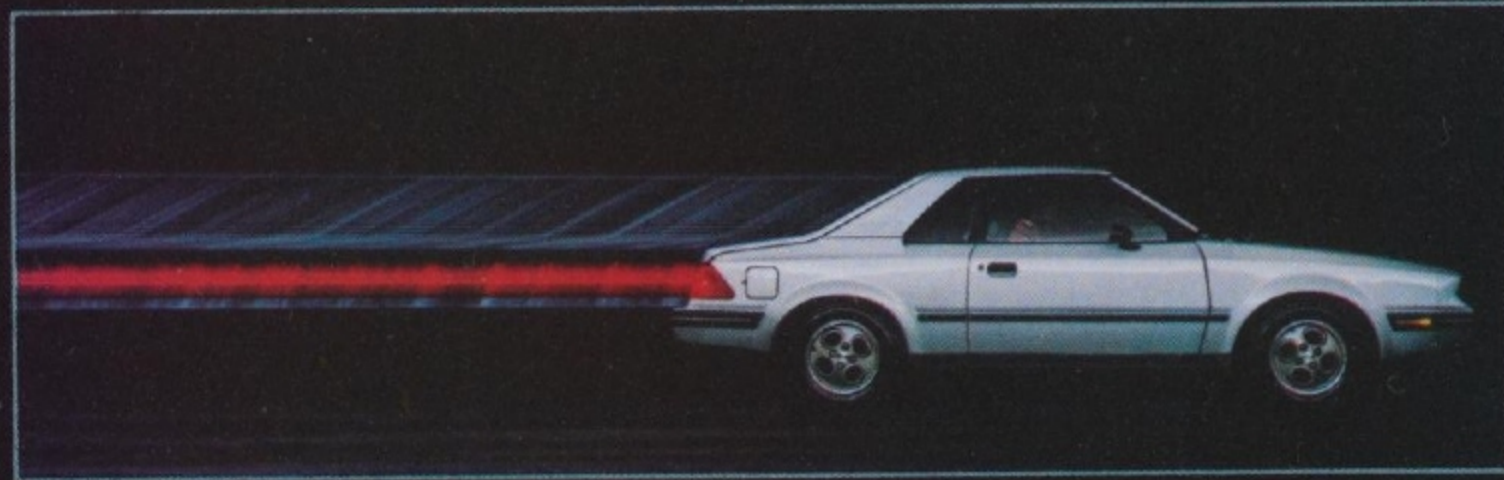
Rack and pinion steering. A more direct linkage between steering wheel and front wheels. Result: precise steering response.

All-season P-metric steel-belted radial tires have European wrap-around tread design for traction. P-metric radials allow increased inflation pressure, have low rolling resistance tread compounds contributing to fuel economy.

Four-wheel independent suspension. A sophisticated system for precise handling characteristics. Consists of MacPherson struts and stabilizer bar up front, with modified MacPherson struts mounted independently at rear wheels to absorb bumps and jolts individually.

Aerodynamic design efficiency — an important factor in EXP's high fuel economy. Sloping hood, wedge-shaped front end, low silhouette, refined molding details make EXP as aerodynamic as it looks. Along with other advanced air flow management techniques, these design features account for a remarkably low air drag coefficient that enables EXP to slice easily through the air.

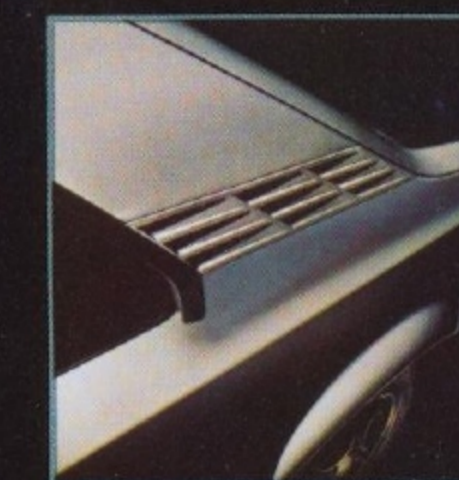
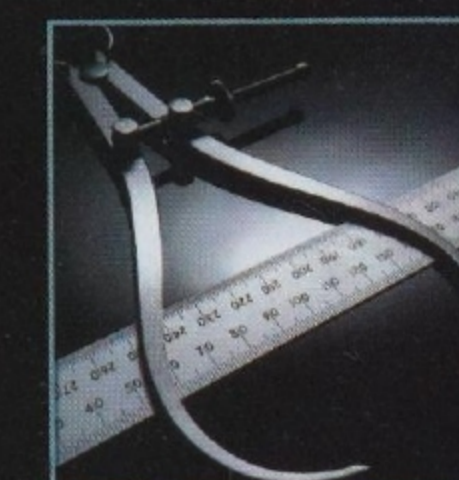

Estimates. EPA estimates were not available at the time this catalog was released for publication. EXP, however, is expected to post high miles-per-gallon ratings. Consult your Ford Dealer for the latest EPA information.

Ford Limited

Corrosion Perforation Warranty. EXP, like all new model Ford cars sold in the 50 United States, is covered by Ford Motor Company's 3-year, unlimited mileage corrosion perforation warranty. Under this warranty any part which, in normal use, rusts through from corrosion within three years of retail delivery or first use will be repaired or replaced free of charge by the selling dealer after inspection by a Ford representative.

Exhaust system components or parts which develop corrosion perforation as a result of accidents or other damage are not covered.

Ford EXP Maintenance Schedule. Ford wants to reduce both

the frequency and cost of scheduled maintenance on its cars to an absolute minimum. And, compared to just a few years ago, we've made substantial progress. For example, in 1973, an engine oil change was called for each 4,000 miles. In 1981, EXP oil changes are recommended at 10,000-mile intervals. Other recommended maintenance intervals for EXP: 30,000 miles between spark plug changes; 30,000 miles between air filter replacements; 30,000 miles or 30 months between engine coolant replacements. EXP has a chassis lubed for life,

self-adjusting brakes and clutch, maintenance-free battery, and more.
